RESOLUTION

A resolution providing for the incurring of debt and issuance of Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) of Taxable Limited Tax Bonds, Series 2014, of Hospital Service District No. 1 of the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana; prescribing the form, terms and conditions thereof and providing for the payment thereof; awarding such bonds to the purchaser thereof; and providing for other matters in connection therewith.

WHEREAS, pursuant to (i) an election held in Hospital Service District No. 1 of the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana (the "Issuer"), on July 15, 2006, the Issuer was authorized to levy a special tax of two and forty-eight hundredths (2.48) mills (such rate being adjusted from time to time due to reassessment) for the years 2006 through 2015, inclusive, for the purpose of constructing, operating and maintaining hospital facilities within the Issuer, including ambulance service for both the east and west banks of St. Charles Parish; and (ii) an election held on May 3, 2014, the Issuer was authorized to levy a special tax of two and forty-eight hundredths (2.48) mills (such rate being adjusted from time to time due to reassessment) for the years 2016 through 2025, inclusive, for the purpose of constructing, operating and maintaining hospital facilities within the Issuer, including ambulance service for both the east and west banks of St. Charles Parish (collectively, the "Tax"); and

WHEREAS, the Issuer now desires to incur debt and issue its Taxable Limited Tax Bonds, Series 2014, in the principal amount of Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) (the "Bonds"), pursuant to La. R.S. 39:1430 and Chapter 14-A of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority, for the purpose of (i) refunding and extending its outstanding (a) Taxable Limited Tax Bonds, Series 2008A, of which \$425,000 remains unpaid (the "Series 2008A Bonds"), (b) Taxable Limited Tax Bonds, Series 2010, of which \$430,000 remains unpaid (the "Series 2010 Bonds"), and (c) Taxable Limited Tax Bonds, Series 2011, of which \$2,520,000 remains unpaid (the "Series 2011 Bonds"); (ii) constructing, operating and maintaining hospital facilities within said Issuer; and (iii) paying the costs of issuance thereof; and

WHEREAS, as of the date of delivery of the Bonds the Issuer will have no outstanding obligations of any kind or nature payable from or enjoying a lien on the Tax herein pledged other than the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the maturities of the Bonds have been arranged so that the combined principal and interest requirements for any calendar year on the Bonds does not exceed 75% of the revenues estimated to be received by the Issuer in the year 2014 from the levy of the Tax (which is hereby estimated to be at least \$2,985,000); and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Issuer to fix the details necessary with respect to the issuance of the Bonds and to provide for the authorization and issuance thereof; and

WHEREAS, it is the further desire of the Issuer to provide for the sale of the Bonds to Regions Bank, in the City of New Orleans, Louisiana, at the price and in the manner hereinafter provided;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Hospital Service District No. 1 of the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana, acting as the governing authority Hospital Service District No. 1 of the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana, that:

SECTION 1. **Definitions.** As used herein, the following terms shall have the following meanings, unless the context otherwise requires:

"Act" means La. R.S. 39:1430 and Chapter 14-A of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority.

"Bond" means any bond of the Issuer authorized to be issued by this Resolution, whether initially delivered or issued in exchange for, upon transfer of, or in lieu of any bond previously issued.

"Bonds" means the Issuer's Taxable Limited Tax Bonds, Series 2014, authorized by this Resolution, in the total aggregate principal amount of Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000).

"Bond Register" means the records kept by the Paying Agent at its principal corporate office in which registration of the Bonds and transfers of the Bonds shall be made as provided herein.

"Code" means the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

"Executive Officers" means, collectively, the Chairman and the Secretary of the Governing Authority.

"Fiscal Year" means the one-year accounting period beginning August 1 of each calendar year, or such other accounting period as may be designated by the Governing Authority as the fiscal year of the Issuer.

"Governing Authority" means the Board of Commissioners of Hospital Service District No. 1 of the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana.

"Government Securities" means direct obligations of, or obligations the principal of and interest on which are unconditionally guaranteed by the United States of America, which are non-callable prior to their maturity, may be United States Treasury obligations such as the State and Local Government Series and may be in book-entry form.

"Interest Payment Date" means March 1 of each year in which the Bonds are outstanding, commencing March 1, 2015.

"Issuer" means Hospital Service District No. 1 of the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana.

"Outstanding" when used with respect to the Bonds means, as of the date of determination, any Bond theretofore issued and delivered under this Resolution, except:

1. Bonds theretofore canceled by the Paying Agent or delivered to the Paying Agent for cancellation;
2. Bonds for which payment sufficient funds have been theretofore deposited in trust for the owners of such Bonds;
3. Bonds in exchange for or in lieu of which other Bonds have been registered and delivered pursuant to this Resolution;
4. Bonds alleged to have been mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen which have been paid as provided in this Resolution or by law; and
5. Bonds for the payment of the principal of and interest on which money or Government Securities or both are held in trust with the effect specified in this Resolution.

"Outstanding Bonds" means the (i) Taxable Limited Tax Bonds, Series 2008A, (ii) Taxable Limited Tax Bonds, Series 2010, and (iii) Taxable Limited Tax Bonds, Series 2011, of the Issuer.

"Owner" or "Owners" when used with respect to any Bond means the Person in whose name such Bond is registered in the Bond Register.

"Paying Agent" means Regions Corporate Trust, in the City of Baton Rouge, Louisiana, until a successor Paying Agent shall have been appointed pursuant to the applicable provisions of this Resolution and thereafter "Paying Agent" shall mean such successor Paying Agent.

"Person" means any individual, corporation, partnership, joint venture, association, joint-stock company, trust, unincorporated organization or government or any agency or political subdivision thereof.

"Purchaser" means Regions Bank, in the City of New Orleans, Louisiana, the original purchaser of the Bonds.

"Record Date" for the interest payable on any Interest Payment Date means the 15th calendar day of the month next preceding such Interest Payment Date.

"Resolution" means this resolution authorizing the issuance of the Bonds, as it may be supplemented and amended.

"Tax" means the (i) special ad valorem tax of two and forty-eight hundredths (2.48) mills (such rate being adjusted from time to time due to reassessment) for the purpose of constructing, operating and maintaining hospital facilities within the Issuer, including ambulance service for both the east and west banks of St. Charles Parish, which was authorized at an election held in the Issuer on July 15, 2006, to be levied and collected annually in the years 2006 through 2015, inclusive; and (ii) special ad valorem tax of two and forty-eight hundredths (2.48) mills (such rate being adjusted from time to time due to reassessment) for the purpose of constructing, operating and maintaining hospital facilities within the Issuer, including ambulance service for both the east and west banks of St. Charles Parish, which was authorized at an election held in the Issuer on May 3, 2014, to be levied and collected annually in the years 2016 through 2025, inclusive.

SECTION 2. **Authorization of Bonds; Maturities.** Subject to the approval of the State Bond Commission and in compliance with the terms and provisions of the Act and other constitutional and statutory authority, there is hereby authorized the incurring of an indebtedness of Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) for, on behalf of, and in the name of the Issuer, for the purpose of (i) refunding and extending its Outstanding Bonds, (ii) constructing, operating and maintaining hospital facilities within the Issuer, and (iii) paying the costs incurred in connection with the issuance of the Bonds, and to represent said indebtedness this Governing Authority does hereby authorize the issuance of Taxable Limited Tax Bonds, Series 2014, of the Issuer in the principal amount of Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000). The Bonds shall be in fully registered form, shall be dated the date of delivery thereof, shall be initially issued as a single fully registered bond number R-1. The Bonds shall bear interest from the date thereof or from the most recent Interest Payment Date to which interest has been paid or duly provided for, such interest to be payable annually on March 1 of each year, commencing March 1, 2015, at the rate of four and ninety-hundredths percent (4.90%) per annum, said interest to be calculated on the basis of a 360-day year consisting of twelve 30-day months. The principal of Bonds shall mature in installments due on March 1 of the years and in the amounts, as follows:

The principal and interest on the Bonds shall be payable by check mailed to the registered owner of the Bond (determined as of the Record Date prior to such payment date) at the address shown on the registration books kept by the Paying Agent for such purpose, provided that payment of the final installment of principal on the Bonds shall be made only upon presentation and surrender of the Bonds to the Paying Agent.

Each Bond delivered under this Resolution upon transfer of, in exchange for or in lieu of any other Bond shall carry all the rights to interest accrued and unpaid, and to accrue, which were carried by such other Bond, and each such Bond shall bear interest (as herein set forth) so neither gain nor loss in interest shall result from such transfer, exchange or substitution.

No Bond shall be entitled to any right or benefit under this Resolution, or be valid or obligatory for any purpose, unless there appears on such Bond a certificate of registration, substantially in the form provided in this Resolution, executed by the Paying Agent by manual signature.

SECTION 3. **Redemption Provisions.** The principal installments of the Bonds shall be subject to redemption by the Issuer in full or in part, at any time on and after March 1, 2017, at a price of par plus accrued interest. Redemptions shall be applied to the outstanding principal of the Bonds in inverse order of maturity.

Official notice of such call for redemption shall be given by means of first class mail, postage prepaid by notice deposited in the United States Mail not less than thirty (30) days prior to the prepayment date addressed to the Owner of each Bond to be prepaid at his address as shown on the registration records of the Paying Agent. In the event a portion of the Bonds is to be prepaid, such Bonds shall be surrendered to the Paying Agent, who shall note the date and amount of such prepayment in the space provided therefor on the Bonds.

SECTION 4. **Registration and Transfer.** The Issuer shall cause the Bond Register to be kept by the Paying Agent. The Bonds may be transferred, registered and assigned only on the Bond Register, and such registration shall be at the expense of the Issuer. A Bond may be assigned by the execution of an assignment form on the Bond or by other instruments of transfer and assignment acceptable to the Paying Agent. A new Bond or Bonds will be delivered by the Paying Agent to the last assignee (the new Owner) in exchange for such transferred and assigned Bonds after receipt of the Bonds to be transferred in proper form. Such new Bond or Bonds shall be in an authorized denomination of the same maturity and like principal. Neither the Issuer nor the Paying Agent shall be required to issue, register, transfer or exchange any Bond during a period (i) beginning at the opening of business on a Record Date and ending at the close of business on the Interest Payment Date or (ii) with respect to Bonds to be redeemed, at the opening of business fifteen (15) days before the date of the mailing of a notice of redemption of such Bonds and ending on the date of such redemption.

SECTION 5. **Form of Bonds.** The Bonds and the endorsements to appear thereon shall be in substantially the following forms, respectively, to-wit:

This Bond represents the entire issue of Taxable Limited Tax Bonds, Series 2014, aggregating in principal the sum of Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) of the Issuer (the "Bonds"), said Bond having been issued by the Issuer pursuant to a resolution adopted by its governing authority on July 23, 2014 (the "Resolution"), for the purpose of (i) refunding and extending the Issuer's outstanding

(a) Taxable Limited Tax Bonds, Series 2008A, (b) Taxable Limited Tax Bonds, Series 2010, and (c) Taxable Limited Tax Bonds, Series 2011 (collectively, the "Outstanding Bonds"), (ii) constructing, operating and maintaining hospital facilities within the Issuer, and (iii) paying the costs incurred in connection with the issuance of the Bonds, under the authority conferred by La. R.S. 39:1430 and Chapter 14-A of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority.

The principal installments of this Bond are subject to redemption by the Issuer in full or in part, at any time on and after March 1, 2017, at a price of par plus accrued interest. Redemptions shall be applied to the outstanding principal of the Bonds in inverse order of maturity. Official notice of such call for redemption shall be given by means of first class mail, postage prepaid by notice deposited in the United States Mail not less than thirty (30) days prior to the prepayment date addressed to the registered owner of this Bond at the address as shown on the registration records of the Paying Agent. In the event a portion of this Bond is to be prepaid, then this Bond shall be surrendered to the Paying Agent, who shall note the date and amount of such prepayment in the schedule of prepayments attached to this Bond.

The Issuer shall cause to be kept at the principal office of the Paying Agent a register (the "Bond Register") in which registration of this Bond and of transfers of this Bond shall be made as provided in the Resolution. This Bond may be transferred, registered and assigned only on the Bond Register, and such registration shall be at the expense of the Issuer. This Bond may be assigned by the execution of the assignment form printed hereon or by other instrument of transfer and assignment acceptable to the Paying Agent. A new Bond will be delivered by the Paying Agent to the last assignee (the new registered owner) in exchange for this transferred and assigned Bond after receipt of this Bond to be transferred in proper form. Such new Bond shall be in an authorized denomination of the same maturity and like principal. Neither the Issuer nor the Paying Agent shall be required to issue, register, transfer or exchange any Bond during a period (i) beginning at the opening of business on the 15th calendar day of the month next preceding an Interest Payment Date and ending at the close of business on the Interest Payment Date or (ii) with respect to principal amount to be redeemed, at the opening of business fifteen (15) days before the date of the mailing of a notice of redemption of such Bond and ending on the date of such redemption.

This Bond is secured by an irrevocable pledge and dedication of the funds to be derived by the Issuer from the levy and collection of (i) a special two and forty-eight hundredths (2.48) mills tax (such rate being adjusted from time to time due to reassessment) authorized to be levied in each of the years 2006 and 2015, inclusive, on all the property subject to taxation within the corporate boundaries of the Issuer pursuant to an election held therein on July 15, 2006 and (ii) a special two and forty-eight hundredths (2.48) mills tax (such rate being adjusted from time to time due to reassessment) authorized to be levied in each of the years 2016 through 2025, inclusive, on all the property subject to taxation within the corporate boundaries of the Issuer pursuant to an election held therein on May 3, 2014 (collectively, the "Tax"). For a more complete statement of the Tax revenues from which and conditions under which this Bond is issued, reference is hereby made to the Resolution. The Issuer, in the Resolution, has also entered into certain other covenants and agreements with the registered owner of this Bond, including provisions for the issuance of additional bonds payable from the proceeds of the Tax.

This Bond shall not be valid or become obligatory for any purpose or be entitled to any security or benefit under the Resolution until the certificate of registration hereon shall have been signed by the Paying Agent.

It is certified that this Bond is authorized by and is issued in conformity with the requirements of the Constitution and statutes of this State. It is further certified, recited and declared that all acts, conditions and things required to exist, to happen and to be performed precedent to and in the issuance of this Bond and the issue of which it forms a part to constitute the same legal, binding and valid obligations of the Issuer have existed, have happened and have been performed in due time, form and manner as required by law, and that the indebtedness of the Issuer, including this Bond and statutes of the State of Louisiana.

SECTION 6. **Execution of Bond.** The Bonds shall be signed by the Executive Officers for, on behalf of, in the name of and under the corporate seal of the Issuer, which signatures and corporate seal may be either manual or facsimile. If facsimile signatures are used on the Bonds, then such signatures shall be registered with the Louisiana Secretary of State in the manner required by La. R.S. 39:244.

SECTION 7. **Pledge and Dedication of Revenues.** Pursuant to the Act, the Bonds shall be secured by and payable from an irrevocable pledge and dedication of the avails or proceeds of the Tax. This Governing Authority does hereby obligate itself and its successors in office to impose and collect the Tax annually in each of the years 2014 through 2025, inclusive, as provided in the proposition authorizing the Tax, and does hereby irrevocably and irrevocably dedicate, appropriate and pledge the annual income to be derived from the assessment, levy and collection of the Tax in each of the years 2014 through 2025, inclusive, to the payment of the Bonds, and no further pledge or dedication of the aforesaid Tax shall be made which shall have priority over or parity with the pledge and dedication of the Tax herein made except that parity bonds may be issued in accordance with the provisions of Section 9 hereof.

The Issuer further covenants and agrees that it will not roll-back, reduce or lower the rate of the Tax pursuant to Article VII, Section 23, of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, La. R.S. 47:1705, or any similar laws relating to millage rate adjustments, unless the resulting revenues of the Tax for the year in which the reduction is effective will be at least 1.5 times the highest combined calendar year debt service on the Bonds, including any additional parity bonds, in the then current or any future calendar year.

SECTION 8. **Debt Service Fund.** There will be created and maintained for as long as the Bonds are outstanding a "Debt Service Fund" with Regions Corporate Trust Department (the Region Trust Department"). In accordance with a "Deposit Trust Agreement" between the Issuer, the Purchaser and the Sheriff and Tax Collector of the Parish of St. Charles (the "Tax Collector"), all of the proceeds of the Tax collected by the Tax Collector, will be deposited with the Regions Trust Department as soon as received by the Tax Collector each calendar year, said funds shall be deposited in the Debt Service Fund until there is a sufficient amount on deposit in the Debt Service Fund to pay all of the principal and interest on the Bonds, falling due in that calendar year.

SECTION 9. **Parity Bonds.** The Issuer shall issue no other bonds or obligations of any kind or nature payable from or enjoying a lien on the revenues of the Tax having priority over or parity with the Bonds, except that additional bonds may hereafter be issued on a parity with the Bonds under the following conditions:

- (1) The Bonds herein authorized or any part thereof, including the interest thereon, may be refunded, and the refunding bonds so issued shall enjoy complete equality of lien with the portion of the Bonds which is not refunded, if there be any, and the refunding Bonds shall continue to enjoy whatever priority of lien over subsequent issues may have been enjoyed by the Bonds refunded; provided, however, that if only a portion of the Bonds outstanding are so refunded and the refunding bonds require total principal and interest payments during any year in excess of the principal and interest which would have been required in such year to pay the Bonds refunded thereon, then such Bonds may not be refunded without the consent of the Owner of the unrefunded portion of the Bonds issued hereunder (provided such consent shall not be required if such refunding bonds meet the requirements set forth in clause 2 of this Section).
- (2) Additional bonds may be issued on and enjoy a full and complete parity with the Bonds, with respect to the Tax, provided that the anticipated Tax revenues in the Fiscal Year in which the additional Bonds are to be issued, as reflected in the budget adopted by the Issuer, must be at least 1.5 times the combined principal and interest requirements for any future calendar year on the Bonds and the said additional bonds.
- (3) Junior and subordinate bonds may be issued without restriction.
- (4) The Issuer must be in full compliance with all covenants and undertakings in connection with the Bonds and there must be no delinquencies in payments required to be made in connection therewith.
- (5) The additional bonds must be payable as to principal on March 1st of each year, commencing not more than 2 years from the date thereof, and payable as to interest annually on March 1 or semi-annually on March 1 and September 1 of each year.
- (6) The St. Charles Parish Sheriff shall be furnished a schedule showing all payments of principal and interest and paying agent fees that shall fall due in each year on the Bonds and any parity bonds that may be issued.

SECTION 10. **Budget and Financial Statements.** As long as the Bonds are outstanding and unpaid in principal or interest, the Issuer shall prepare and adopt a budget at the beginning of each Fiscal Year and furnish the Purchaser a copy of such budget within 60 days after its adoption. The Issuer shall cause an annual audit of its financial statements to be made by an independent firm of certified public accountants in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 8 of Title 24 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and upon completion, but in no event later than 180 days after the close of the applicable Fiscal Year, the Issuer shall file a copy of such audited financial statements with the Owner.

SECTION 11. Application of Proceeds. The Executive Officers are hereby empowered, authorized and directed to do any and all things necessary and incidental to carry out all of the provisions of this Resolution, to cause the Bonds to be prepared or printed, to issue, execute and seal the Bonds, and to effect delivery thereof as hereinafter provided.

SECTION 12. Bonds Legal Obligations. The Bonds shall constitute legal, binding and valid obligations of the Issuer, and shall be the only representation of the indebtedness as herein authorized and created.

SECTION 13. Resolution a Contract. The provisions of this Resolution shall constitute a contract between the Issuer, or its successor, and the Owners from time to time of the Bonds and any such Owners may at law or in equity, by suit, action, mandamus or other proceedings, enforce and compel the performance of all duties required to be performed by the Governing Authority or the Issuer as a result of issuing the Bonds.

SECTION 14. Amendment to Resolution. No material modification or amendment to this Resolution, or of any Resolution amendatory hereto or supplemental hereto, may be made without the consent in writing of the Owners of two-thirds (2/3) of the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds then outstanding; provided, however, that no modification or amendment shall permit a change in the maturity of the Bonds, or a reduction in the rate of interest thereon, or in the amount of the principal obligation thereof, or affecting the obligation of the Issuer to pay the principal of and the interest on the Bonds as the same shall come due from the Tax revenues pledged and dedicated to the payment thereof by this Resolution, or reduce the percentage of the Owners required to consent to any material modification or amendment of this Resolution, without the consent of the Owners of the Bonds.

SECTION 15. Severability; Application of Subsequently Enacted Laws. In case any one or more of the provisions of this Resolution or of the Bonds shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions of this Resolution or of the Bonds, but this Resolution and the Bonds shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provisions had not been contained therein.

SECTION 16. Recital of Regularity. This Governing Authority having investigated the regularity of the proceedings had in connection with the Bonds herein authorized and having determined the same to be regular, the Bonds shall contain the following recital, to-wit:

"It is certified that this Bond is authorized by and is issued in conformity with the requirements of the Constitution and statutes of this State."

SECTION 17. Effect of Registration. The Issuer, the Paying Agent, and any agent of either of them may treat the Owner in whose name the Bonds are registered as the Owner of such Bonds for the purpose of receiving payment of the principal and interest on such Bonds and for all other purposes whatsoever, and to the extent permitted by law, neither the Issuer, the Paying Agent, nor any agent of either of them shall be affected by notice to the contrary.

SECTION 18. Notices to Owners. Whenever this Resolution provides for notice to Owners of Bonds of any event, such notice shall be sufficiently given (unless otherwise herein expressly provided) if in writing and mailed, first-class postage prepaid, to each Owner of such Bonds, at the address of such Owner as it appears in the Bond Register. In any case where notice to Owners of Bonds is given by mail, neither the failure to mail such notice to any particular Owner of Bonds, nor any defect in any notice so mailed, shall affect the sufficiency of such notice with respect to any other Bonds.

SECTION 19. Cancellation of Bonds. Any Bonds surrendered for payment, transfer, exchange or replacement, if surrendered to the Paying Agent, shall be promptly canceled by it and, if surrendered to the Issuer, shall be delivered to the Paying Agent and, if not already canceled, shall be promptly canceled by the Paying Agent. The Issuer may at any time deliver to the Paying Agent for cancellation any Bonds previously registered and delivered which the Issuer may have acquired in any manner whatsoever, and any Bonds so delivered shall be promptly canceled by the Paying Agent. Any canceled Bonds held by the Paying Agent shall be disposed of as directed in writing by the Issuer.

SECTION 20. Mutilated, Destroyed, Lost or Stolen Bonds. If (1) any mutilated Bonds are surrendered to the Paying Agent, or the Issuer or the Paying Agent receive evidence to their satisfaction of the destruction, loss or theft of any Bonds, and (2) there is delivered to the Issuer and the Paying Agent such security or indemnity as may be required by them to save each of them harmless, then, in the absence of notice to the Issuer or the Paying Agent that such Bonds have been acquired by a bona fide purchaser, the Issuer shall execute, and upon its request the Paying Agent shall register and deliver, in exchange for or in lieu of any such mutilated, destroyed, lost, or stolen Bonds, a new Bond of the same maturity and of like tenor, interest rate and principal amount, bearing a number not contemporaneously outstanding. In case any such mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen Bonds have become or is about to become due and payable, the Issuer in its discretion may, instead of issuing a new Bond, pay such Bond. Upon the issuance of any new Bond under this Section, the Issuer may require the payment by the Owner of a sum sufficient to cover any tax or other governmental charge that may be imposed in relation thereto and any other expenses (including the fees and expenses of the Paying Agent) connected therewith.

SECTION 21. Discharge of Resolution, Defeasance. If the Issuer shall pay or cause to be paid, or there shall otherwise be paid to the Owner, the principal of and interest on the Bonds, at the times and in the manner stipulated in this Resolution, then the pledge of the money, securities, and funds pledged under this Resolution and all covenants, agreements, and other obligations of the Issuer to the Owner shall thereupon cease, terminate, and become void and be discharged and satisfied, and the Paying Agent shall pay over or deliver all money held by it under this Resolution to the Issuer.

Bonds or interest installments for the payment of which money shall have been set aside and shall be held in trust (through deposit by the Issuer of funds for such payment or otherwise) at the maturity date thereof shall be deemed to have been paid within the meaning and with the effect expressed above in this Section if they are defeased in the manner provided by Chapter 14 of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended.

SECTION 22. Successor Paying Agent; Paying Agent Agreement. The Issuer will at all times maintain a Paying Agent meeting the qualifications hereinafter described for the performance of the duties hereunder for the Bonds. The designation of the initial Paying Agent in this Resolution is hereby confirmed and approved. The Issuer reserves the right to appoint a successor Paying Agent by (a) filing with the Person then performing such function a certified copy of a resolution giving notice of the termination of the Agreement and appointing a successor and (b) causing notice to be given to each Owner. Every Paying Agent appointed hereunder shall at all times be a bank or trust company organized and doing business under the laws of the United States of America or any state, authorized under such laws to exercise trust powers, and subject to supervision or examination by Federal or State authority. The Executive Officers are hereby authorized and directed to execute an appropriate Agreement with the Paying Agent for and on behalf of the Issuer in such form as may be satisfactory to said officers, the signatures of said officers on such Agreement to be conclusive evidence of the due exercise of the authority granted hereunder.

SECTION 23. Bonds are not "Qualified Tax-Exempt Obligations". The Bonds are not designated as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" within the meaning of Section 265(b)(3)(B) of the Code.

SECTION 24. Disclosure Under SEC Rule 15c2-12. It is recognized that the Issuer will not be required to comply with the continuing disclosure requirements described in the Rule 15c2-12(b) of the Securities and Exchange Commission [17 CFR §240.15c2-12(b)], because:

- (a) the Bonds are not being purchased by a broker, dealer or municipal securities dealer acting as an underwriter in a primary offering of municipal securities, and
(b) the Bonds are being sold to only one financial institution (i.e., no more than thirty-five persons), which (i) has such knowledge and experience in financial business matters and is capable of evaluating the merits and risks of the prospective investment in the Bonds and (ii) is not purchasing the Bonds for more than one account or with a view to distributing the Bonds.

SECTION 25. Publication. A copy of this Resolution shall be published immediately in one (1) issue of the official journal of the Issuer. For a period of thirty (30) days from the date of such publication any person in interest shall have the right to contest the legality of this resolution or of the Bonds and the provisions securing the Bonds. After the expiration of said thirty (30) days, no one shall have any right of action to contest the validity of the Bonds or the provisions of this resolution, and the Bonds shall be conclusively presumed to be legal, and no court shall thereafter have authority to inquire into such matters.

SECTION 26. Award of Bonds. The offer to purchase the Bonds of Regions Bank, in the City of New Orleans, Louisiana, is hereby ratified and approved, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit "A" hereto.

SECTION 27. Deposit Trust Agreement. The Executive Officers are hereby authorized to enter into and execute the Deposit Trust Agreement (the "Agreement") in substantially the form set forth hereto as Exhibit "B" with such additions, deletions or corrections as they determine, with the approval of bond counsel, are necessary to carry out the intent thereof.

SECTION 28. Section Headings. The headings of the various sections hereof are inserted for convenience of reference only and shall not control or affect the meaning or construction of any of the provisions hereof.

SECTION 29. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective immediately.

Repayment: Principal and interest annually, on March 1 of the years 2015 through 2024, inclusive. Any outstanding principal balance and accrued interest will be due on the Maturity Date. Repayment schedule outlined on Exhibit "A".
Prepayment: Accelerated repayment is permitted for the first 3 years of the facility.
Collateral: Pledge and Assignment of the 2.48 mill Maintenance & Operations Tax Revenue effective for the years 2015 through 2024, inclusive (the "Tax").
Parity Debt: The Issuer may issue additional debt payable from the Tax on parity with the Bonds, provided, however, that the anticipated annual Tax revenues for the year in which the additional debt is being issued is at least 1.50x the highest combined debt service on all debt payable from the Tax.
Annual Financial Statements & Reporting: Until all amounts owed to the Bank with respect to the Bonds are paid in full, annual audited financial statements of the Issuer shall be made available no later than 180 days after the applicable fiscal year-end of the Issuer. Upon acceptance of a commitment, any fees incurred by the Bank shall be reimbursed by the Issuer, whether or not the financing closes.

Paying Agent Fees: Regions Bank Corporate Trust, Paying Agent Fee \$1,250 per year
Governing Law: Louisiana

The Bank's obligations under this commitment are conditioned upon the fulfillment, to the Bank's satisfaction, of each term and condition referenced by the commitment unless waived by the Bank in writing.

DEPOSIT TRUST AGREEMENT

This DEPOSIT TRUST AGREEMENT, by and between HOSPITAL SERVICE DISTRICT NO. 1 OF THE PARISH OF ST. CHARLES, STATE OF LOUISIANA (the "District"), appearing herein through the hereinafter named officers: HON. GREGORY C. CHAMPAGNE, SHERIFF AND TAX COLLECTOR OF THE PARISH OF ST. CHARLES, STATE OF LOUISIANA (the "Sheriff"); and REGIONS CORPORATE TRUST DEPARTMENT, in the City of Baton Rouge, Louisiana, a banking association duly authorized to exercise trust powers, as trustee (the "Trustee"), appearing herein through the hereinafter named officers; who did declare that they do together enter into and make this Deposit Trust Agreement, which shall be dated for convenience as of 7/3/2014, upon the following terms:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the District currently has sold and will soon deliver Taxable Limited Tax Bonds, Series 2014 (the, "Bonds") payable from a 2.48 mill ad valorem tax authorized to be levied in the years 2014 and 2015 by virtue of an election held in said District on July 15, 2006, and a 2.48 mill ad valorem tax authorized to be levied in the years 2016 through 2025, inclusive, by virtue of an election held in said District on May 3, 2014, (collectively the, "Tax"); and

WHEREAS, the District has obligated itself to levy the Tax for the full term of their authorizations (subject to being adjusted from time to time due to reassessment) or until the Bonds are paid in principal and interest; and

WHEREAS, after all deductions required by law have been made by the Sheriff, the parties hereto wish to place in trust all Tax revenues from each year's Tax levy as received until the Trustee shall have received an amount equal to the debt service on the Bonds and any parity bonds, and all paying agent fees for the year following the levy of the Tax; and

WHEREAS, the original Bonds will consist of a single certificate and the original owner will be Regions Bank of New Orleans, Louisiana;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth and in order to insure the prompt and orderly payment of the Bonds in principal and interest, the parties hereto agree as follows:

SECTION 1. There shall be immediately established with the Trustee a special trust fund (the "Debt Service Fund") to be held in the custody of the Trustee.

SECTION 2. On behalf of the District, after making the deductions required by law from the revenues of each year's Tax levy, beginning with the 2014 Tax levy, the Sheriff shall transfer such Tax revenues to the Trustee in the amounts shown for such year representing that year's debt service on the Bonds and the amount of paying agent charges of \$1,250, as shown on the attached Exhibit "A". Thereafter the Sheriff shall transfer the remaining Tax revenues received from such year's Tax levy to the District in accordance with usual procedures and practices. Those Tax revenues to be delivered to the Trustee shall be delivered by check or by wire, and if by check to:

Regions Corporate Trust

SECTION 3. In the event parity bonds are issued in accordance with the provisions of the resolution authorizing the issuance of the Bonds, Trustee shall act as paying agent for such bonds and shall receive an additional annual fee for such services not greater than \$1,250 per year or such greater sum as may be agreed upon by the parties. Trustee shall receive Tax revenues from each year's Tax levy sufficient to pay the debt service on the Bonds and any parity bonds and the additional paying agent charge for the year following the year of the Tax levy in accordance with a schedule of payments that shall be forwarded to the Sheriff by the District. The Trustee shall furnish to the Sheriff any change of address and if the Sheriff chooses for the future to wire such payments, the routing instructions as shall be required by the Sheriff in order to forward each year the required Tax revenues.

SECTION 4. Ownership of the various funds to be deposited with the Trustee shall be in the Trustee, who shall hold such funds for the benefit of, and as agent of, the bondholders of the Bonds in an amount necessary to retire said Bonds and pay all Paying Agent and Trustee fees and for the discharge of the obligations of the District upon the final payment of the Bonds. The responsibility of the Trustee shall be limited to the funds received under this document. In case funds are not sufficient to pay the required debt service amount, the Trustee shall have no obligation nor duty to declare a default, file suit or take any other steps to preserve or protect the bondholders' interests.

SECTION 5. The Trustee shall invest all monies in the Debt Service Fund to the extent reasonable in direct United States Treasury Obligations, the principal and interest of which are guaranteed by the government of the United States, and mutual or trust fund institutions which are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission under the Securities Act of 1933 and the Investment Act of 1940, and which have underlying investments consisting solely of and limited to securities of the United States Government or its agencies and all revenues from such investments shall be used as Tax revenues. On March 2nd of each year, the Trustee shall remit to the District all monies in the Debt Service Fund not required to make the payments set forth in Exhibit "A".

SECTION 6. All uninvested monies shall be secured in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 7. The District and Trustee shall have the right to take all actions available under law or equity to enforce this Agreement or the terms hereof.

SECTION 8. All covenants, promises and agreements in this Agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of the respective successors and assigns of the District and the Trustee, whether so expressed or not.

SECTION 9. This Agreement shall be governed by the applicable laws of the State of Louisiana.

SECTION 10. If any one or more of the covenants or agreements provided in this Agreement on the part of the District or the Trustee to be performed should be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be contrary to law, such covenant or agreement shall be deemed and construed to be severable from the remaining covenants and agreements herein contained and shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Agreement.

SECTION 11. This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, all or any of which shall be regarded for all purposes as one original and shall constitute and be one and the same instrument.

SECTION 12. The Trustee will keep books of record and account in which complete and correct entries shall be made of all transactions relating to the receipts, disbursements, allocations and application of the monies received. Such books shall be available for inspection at reasonable hours and under reasonable conditions by the District.

SECTION 12. The Trustee will keep books of record and account in which complete and correct entries shall be made of all transactions relating to the receipts, disbursements, allocations and application of the monies received. Such books shall be available for inspection at reasonable hours and under reasonable conditions by the District.

SECTION 13. If at any time the Trustee or its legal successor or successors should become unable, through operation of law or otherwise, to act as Trustee hereunder, or if its property and affairs shall be taken under the control of any state or federal court or administrative body because of insolvency or bankruptcy or for any other reason, a vacancy shall forthwith exist in the office of Trustee hereunder. In such event the District, by appropriate order, shall promptly appoint a Trustee to fill such vacancy.

Any successor trustee shall execute, acknowledge and deliver to the District and the Trustee an instrument accepting such appointment hereunder, and the Trustee shall execute and deliver an instrument transferring to such successor trustee, subject to the terms of this Agreement, all the rights, powers and trusts of the Trustee hereunder. Upon the request of any such successor trustee, the District shall execute any and all instruments in writing for more fully and certainly vesting in and confirming to such successor trustee all such rights, powers and duties. The District shall be obligated to notify the Sheriff of the change of Trustee and its address and/or routing information required by the Sheriff for the transmission of the Tax revenues.

SECTION 14. This Agreement may be amended with the consent of the District and the Trustee to correct ambiguities, to strengthen any provision hereof or to sever any provision hereof which is deemed to be illegal or unenforceable.
