Principals. The most exceptional educators are honored in the program, and now Green's mission is to address "anything at all that hinders a student's education."

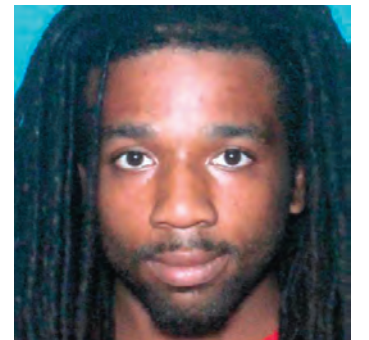

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Chandra Gaudet came to a decision a little more than two years ago to put herself on track for a healthier, better life. It wasn't an easy one to make, however, for more reasons than one.

The Destrehan woman suffers from Sjorgen's, an autoimmune disease that has contributed to high blood pressure, bouts of vertigo and weight gain – before taking on what became a full lifestyle change, she weighed 276 pounds.

"(Sjorgen's) affected all parts of my body," said Gaudet, who compared the disease to lupus. "As far as walking, holding things in my hands, my motor skills ... climbing the stairs was an issue. It made functioning at work difficult. You're sleepy all the time and not motivated to get up."

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School district responds to rash of state cyber attacks

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After a rash of cyberattacks upon several Louisiana school districts, the St. Charles Parish Public School system acted quickly last week in an attempt to head off suffering a similar breach.

The district carried out several state-mandated tasks to prevent the same kind of malware attack that stuck Tangipahoa, Sabine, Morehouse and City of Monroe school districts over the past several weeks, included among those tasks an internet access shutdown on July 30 that lasted into the next day and kept other internet-based systems, like the PowerSchool Parent Portal, down into Aug. 2. For a time, district employees weren't able to receive emails from anyone outside of the school system. The Parent Portal is utilized to submit back-to-school paperwork.

The tasks were necessary, though, because the consequences to falling victim to such an attack would carry much further, a reality recognized by Governor John Bel Edwards when he issued a State of Emergency declaration in response to the issue last week.

The malware attacks reportedly encrypt files within a system

and leave them inaccessible. It leaves, potentially, the only response being to rebuild the system to get things running again as soon as possible. Depending on how deeply infected the system is, says St. Charles Parish schools Director of Informational Technology Services Stephanie Steib, that can be a tall order. “From what I understand, one of the districts had all their data files encrypted, including their backups, leaving them very

little to start with to get back up,” Steib said.

Since the initial instances took place, Steib and other district representatives have been conferencing with the Governor’s cyber security team in an effort to strengthen security measures. Last week’s mandated list of tasks was issued the morning of July 30, with the district left with the option of when to carry out the directives.

“We worked with our Superintendent (Ken Oertling) and our leadership team and decided to go forward with it that day,” Steib said. “We didn’t wait very long.”

That protocol followed several preliminary recommended actions of the state, some the St. Charles district already had in place, others that were put into action following the advisory.

Time was of the essence not only because it could prevent a cyber attack, but it could also potentially immunize the district from one that could already have taken place, in theory – in some cases, this malware can stay dormant on a system for up to three months, Steib said.

While the measures have decreased the chances of being vic-

timized, Steib cautioned that in no way does it mean the district is immune. As technology evolves, so do these attacks and so must defensive measures. “All of it was preventative to put us in the best possible position to defend an attack,” Steib said. “You can never be 100 percent, though. It’s definitely a

Man accused of shooting ATM worker at Boutte Burger King was allegedly involved in crime spree

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Damon Bryant, the Avondale man who in the summer of 2017 was arrested for the armed robbery and shooting of an ATM worker at the drive-thru window of Burger King in Boutte, has been charged by a grand jury in Jefferson Parish with several other armed robberies that took place just before that incident.

Bryant, 21 and of 216 Chapel Lane in Avondale, was charged with involvement in with several restaurant robberies by a Jefferson Parish grand jury. Bryant faces charges there of four counts of armed robbery and a count of carjacking. He pleaded not-guilty.

The armed robbery charges facing Bryant include holdups of a Terrytown Waffle House on July 20, 2017; a woman apparently victimized at gunpoint in a carjacking in Terrytown July 27 of that year; Copeland’s in Elmwood on July 27 and another woman during a July 11 carjacking in Terrytown.

On Aug. 2, 2017, Bryant allegedly shot a man at the drive-thru of Boutte’s Burger King while attempting to rob the man of cash he had with him to replenish ATMs.

He was arrested a day later and charged with attempted first-degree murder and attempted robbery by St. Charles Parish police, but first faces his charges in Jefferson Parish.

Bryant observed the victim get cash at a Capital One bank in Elmwood and then followed him to St. Charles Parish intending to rob him, according to the St. Charles Parish Sheriff’s Office.

The victim first stopped at a RaceTrac in Boutte, but their electronic system to accept payment was down and the store could only accept cash. The victim did not have personal cash, so he left to go elsewhere. The victim told detectives he recalled Bryant approaching him at the RaceTrac before he left.

“That apparently skewed (Bryant’s) plan,” said St. Charles Parish Sheriff Greg Champagne following the incident.

That spurred the victim to travel across the street to Burger King, where Bryant allegedly followed. The victim paid for and accepted his food, then stopped to check his order before leaving. That’s when Bryant approached his vehicle and attempted to stop him.

“He got in front of his car and told him to stop,” Champagne said. “The victim attempted to drive away and swerved ... the perpetrator fired his shot. The victim had his arm up in defensive posture.”

Champagne said the bullet struck the victim above the elbow and traveled some distance above his arm. The injury was not life-threatening but apparently caused some tendon and nerve damage.

Before approaching the victim at Burger King, Bryant allegedly parked his vehicle in the parking lot of a nearby IHOP and walked to the Burger King drive-thru on foot, cutting through the yard of the St. Charles Parish schools’ Pupil Appraisal Center.

Following the shooting, the victim drove himself to the nearby LaQuinta Inn hotel, where employees alerted the Sheriff’s Office of the situation.

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Council chair seeks re-election

Chair of the St. Charles Parish Council and District VII, Councilwoman Julia Fisher-Perrier has announced that she will run for another term.

She has been involved on the federal level in shaping the policy that protects our citizens from unaffordable flood insurance premiums.” Our message is being heard, but it can’t end now.” The program is set to expire in September.

Levee protection is top priority in St Charles Parish and the reason Julia decided to run for office. “I knew we were

vulnerable in my district. I played in the woods behind our district as a kid. I knew there was very little protection back there.” Julia currently serves as the chair of the hurricane protection projects committee. Over 18,000 feet of levee has been built under Julia’s tenure which protects Mimosa, Lakewood, Lagattutta and Coronado from flooding. “The Westbank Levee System is finally to a point where our residents have true protection. This is a direct result of the work we’ve done during the time I’ve served, but we still have more to do.”

Julia has taken on various roles since taking office in 2012. She has twice served as chair and vice chair of the council, a member of the Regional Planning Commission, a member of the South Central Planning Commission, executive board member at large on the Police Jury Association of Louisiana, as well as chairman of the association’s Wildlife and Fisheries committee, and President of the United Way of St. Charles. Julia has been instrumental in moving forward recreation projects, most notably the expansion of Rathborne Park and Ashton soccer fields, in addition to roads and drainage projects in her district. “I love St. Charles Parish and everything associated with it. St Charles is deep rooted in my heart and I couldn’t be more proud to be a part of the best parish in the entire state. The work I’ve done in office is driven by the people and there’s still more to do. I’d be honored to continue to do the work of the people for the next 4 years.”

Her new title is executive director of equity and student support at the Central Office.

To Green’s knowledge, her position is a first for the school district,

“My plan is to continue working in the schools to help make them more equitable, making sure every student has what he or she needs to succeed,” she said. Calling it a “visionary mindset,” Green is channeling her enthusiasm about “changing things” into “revising the way we do business.”

It fits with the school district’s theme this year of “Every student matters, Every moment counts.” which is aimed at maximizing the learning experience.

Green said she helped put Albert Cammon school as its principal for

10 years on the map and now she’s charged with doing the same with the district. She did it by growing relationships with the community, which came about by keeping the word “We” rather than “I” in making them work all guided by ensuring every child gets a quality education anywhere in the parish.

“I love education,” she said. “I want to be a part of the intentional excellence for future generations. I believe that educators are called to this work.”

What made her a successful principal was identifying “learning gaps,” which can be as basic as when a preschooler learns their ABCs versus the one who doesn’t learn them, Green said.

the concept, which originated in Mississippi, was proposed by the Sheriff’s Office.

“It sounded great to us,” Oertling said. “We want to educate our children on the police’s role in policing and protection.”

Oertling also praised the School Board for supporting the initiative. Board President Dennis Naquin also had lunch with students.

Champagne emphasized the importance of growing relationships between the schools and community. While DARE officers frequent upper grades, deputies having lunch in the elementary schools will provide an “added safety factor” in lower grades.

“You just never, never know,” the sheriff said of the need for the added presence.

While lunch typically lasts 30 minutes, Champagne said deputies will stay on campus for lunch, as well as circulate at the elementary schools. Deputies are also encouraged to walk

the campus and meet with teachers and students.

Lakewood Elementary Principal Kelli Oertling emphasized the significance of building this relationship, as well as mentoring.

Champagne agreed, adding, he served as a mentor for 10 years.

Student Isharia Joshua, 10, said she established an “instant bond” with the deputy who visited with her class. Joshua said she shared her “secret recipe” for tacos with the deputy at her table.

“I felt safer, but at first I was a little nervous,” she said. “I made a special friend and a special bond.”

Fellow student Reagan Bedi, also 10 years old, said she also felt safer with meeting with deputies.

“I though it was really amazing,” Bedi said. “I felt really safe, because if an intruder came, we have the police there to protect us.”

challenge to stay ahead of it, because you can never be sure what form it will take or where it will come from.”

Ultimately, the greatest defense – or vulnerability – comes down to the district’s employees. Most of these kinds of attacks come from phishing e-mails that can infect a device and/or system once accessed.

Because of this, St. Charles district employees go through training and receive weekly updates as part of the KNOWBE4 program. Emails sent out include security tips and information

on the “scam of the week.” There’s also software included that sends out fake phishing emails to employees, informing the district office who may have clicked on the email and thus, in theory, could fall into such a trap.

“At that point we can contact them and make sure they understand what could happen if that hadn’t been a pretend e-mail,” Steib said. “Phishing e-mails can take a different face and you have new employees coming in, so you have to make sure everyone is aware of what to do.”

herself that she’d find her best self despite it all.

“I made up my mind that this wasn’t going to be me anymore,” she said. “I started walking and I’d push through the pain. I’d go out on the levee and tell myself I could do this ... 10 to 15 minutes every day, then it started to be more.”

She joined United Way’s “Get Fit United” 12 week health program and it took her fitness journey to the next level. She learned how to eat healthy and maximize her workouts.

In all, she’s dropped approximately 80 pounds over the past two years. The effects have been life-changing.

“I feel more confident now, like anything I want to do, I can accomplish,” Gaudet said. “I’d be invited somewhere and didn’t feel comfortable because I didn’t like the way I looked. I walked everywhere with my head down.

“Now, when I walk into a room, I’m proud. I’m more open and can talk more freely. It boosted my confidence level 100 percent.”

The governor and the pirate

No matter your age or at what point you became acquainted with the colorful history of the Bayou State, it is almost certain that you’ve heard the names of William C.C. Claiborne and Jean Lafitte.
Claiborne has a state building and a north Louisiana parish named after him, while Lafitte’s name can be found on a National Park and a small hamlet in Jefferson Parish. However, despite their legendary status, the two clashed in one of the most infamous tales of political power, popularity and influence in the state’s history.
Claiborne was a native Virginian who had become active in politics after moving to the developing new state of Tennessee. Jean Lafitte and his brother Pierre were French-born smugglers who had brought their particular brand of business to the West Indies before settling in Louisiana in 1804. Once ensconced in the state, they set up a base of operations in Barataria Bay and began steadily raiding ships off the coast.
According to Lyle Saxon’s book, Lafitte the Pirate, the brothers’ criminal behavior was well known within New Orleans. But both the citizenry and the authorities were too busy buying their products at bargain prices to worry about the finer points of the law.
However, when an ambitious group of militia attempted to stop the Lafittes from seizing a ship, a gunfight ensued and a soldier was left wounded. Gov. Claiborne, who had already been irked by the blatant lawlessness of the pair, issued a proclamation calling for Lafitte’s and offered a \$500 reward for whoever turned the pirate in.

The next day, Lafitte went into New Orleans for his normal business transactions and did not alter his routine despite the posters all over the city calling for his capture. “The Creoles could not but admire his indifference to danger,” Saxon wrote. “When he was seen perusing the proclamation and smiling, they were amused by his nonchalance.”
On Monday morning, New Orleanians awoke to find new proclamations all over the city next to Claiborne’s. Lafitte had virtually copied the language of his own arrest warrant, but instead offered a \$1,500 reward for whoever would arrest Gov. Claiborne and bring him to Barataria.

It’s jumping bean season again

Just like the peanut is not really a nut and the pineapple is not an apple, not all ‘beans’ are beans. Perhaps the most remarkable of all the beans-that-are-not-really-beans are Mexican jumping beans which are actually seeds from a deciduous desert-loving shrub (Sebastiania pavoniana) that only grow in some Mexican states (e.g. Sonora and Chihuahua).
Each spring, female moths (Laspeyresia saltitans) deposit their eggs in the shrub’s flowers. Soon, tiny insect larvae hatch from the eggs and burrow into the young flower capsules. There they chomp away inside the

developing seed, leaving the undamaged seed wall as their protective fortress.
Once the invader has carved out a comfortable living space, it begins to construct a web along the inner wall of the seed.
Before long, each ‘bean’ comes to life as the plucky little yellowish-white larva throws itself violently against the walls of its chamber, producing the erratic movements that are characteristic of the jumping bean.
If you have never seen them, the good news is you don’t have to risk life and limb traveling to Mexico and fight the jumping bean-collecting gang lords to gather your own. Fortunately, it’s jumping bean season again and they can be acquired from several Internet sources.
One is Mark Harzdorf who has been

importing and selling jumping beans since 2007.
As pets go, jumping beans aren’t exactly affectionate or trainable, but they won’t soil the carpet or require feeding. And no expensive vet bills, either. They may, however, demand your attention as the brownish-colored, rock-like objects convulse at random intervals producing an erratic clicking sound in their plastic prisons.
Today’s tech-savvy kids unfamiliar with these little marvels of nature may suspect strange electronic contrivance is behind the beans’ movements. They are usually surprised to learn that not only are they witnessing nature at its most mysterious, but that a little fun can still be had even without battery-operated devices.

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Volleyball squads ready to take next step

Tigers, Wildcats bringing back experienced, tested lineups

Hahnville has plenty of reasons to feel optimistic about the upcoming volleyball season — eight of them, specifically.

That's because the Tigers are bringing back eight senior regulars from a team that went 27-15 last season and captured a district championship. Many of those players are entering their third season as starter, after helping Hahnville earn its third straight season with a play-off victory last year.

"We're very excited," said Mendi LeBoeuf. "It's a very large senior class, you don't normally have that many making up the majority of your starting lineup. To see how they've grown to play at the level they are now, it's really awesome to see."

This team won't lack for leadership, for sure.

"It's interesting having so many seniors and kind of nice, because I see them all taking on those leadership roles at different times," LeBoeuf said. "All of them

stepping up during summer league and camp, maturing and interacting with one another ... they're also phenomenal with our younger players. We're accomplishing so much, and I think that's because of these seniors."

Libero Kristen Crutti, middle blockers Raegan Young and Yelah Moses, outside hitters—and twin sisters—Brianna and Chelsea Plaisance, setter Bailey Roux, outside hitter Danae Lorio and defensive specialist Hayley Carmen comprise the team's senior core.

Once Hahnville hits district play, it will attempt to vault a field that includes H.L. Bourgeois, Thibodaux, Central Lafourche and Terrebonne.

Conspicuously absent, of course, is archrival Destrehan, as well as fellow River Parishes rival East St. John—both were moved into a new district that includes Chapelle, Bonnabel and Grace King.

Hahnville and Destrehan will still face off on Sept. 23 at Hahnville in non-district action.

"I don't know when the last time was where we weren't in a district with Destrehan," LeBoeuf said. "It's such a fun matchup. Obviously, we wanted to play one another so we scheduled the game."

The Tigers will play in five tournaments this September, so the team will get plenty of chances to sharpen their skills early.

Of course, the tournament the team is eying the most, ultimately, comes at season's end. LeBoeuf said this group is committed to reaching the Pontchartrain Center for the State Volleyball Tournament.

"That's our major goal, to take Hahnville volleyball back to the Pontchartrain Center. This group feels like that's a realistic goal and they're working so hard to make it happen," LeBoeuf said.

Destrehan head coach Edward Borgstede likes where his team is headed into the season as well. Though four seniors have departed from last year's roster, this team boasts more game experience than its youth would suggest—particularly because the fast-paced Wildcats rotated players liberally the past few seasons.

Borgstede said this season will see a bit of a tighter rotation of regulars, as the team isn't as deep as it has been. But that's also a function of versatility, as he noted senior outside hitter Nijai Smith and sophomore outside hitter Ryley Boyne have the rounded skillset to stay on the floor throughout rotations.

"We feel good about that because they never have to come off of the court," Borgstede said. "They're got such good serve, can pass and can also hit and block. When you have players who can

LSU populating Major League with stars

Bregman, Nola among the elite

The list seemingly grows and grows every year, and it's a fun thing to watch.

It's time once again for my annual look around MLB to see how LSU players are faring. While always well-represented, more Tigers are making an impact as this column has evolved, and of the repeat names, their individual impact on the has almost across the board become that much larger—be it an MVP-level player on arguably the best franchise in baseball, a staff ace and workhorse, a lights out reliever or a leadoff man for the sport's most storied team.

With that, let's dive in.

Alex Bregman – An absolute superstar.

Bregman was selected No. 2 overall by the Houston Astros in 2015, and he's rewarded that huge investment with an even greater return, arguably the best player on a loaded Astros roster, which is kind of like winning a champion of champions tournament. Bregman was a major part of Houston capturing its first-ever World Series championship in 2017.

He began the week batting .276 this season with a .404 on-base percentage. The past two seasons have

shown the third baseman and shortstop to possess one of the most powerful swings in the majors, his 28 home runs thus far this year just three behind his 31 in 2018. He's also the rare player who draws more walks than he strikes out.

Despite Bregman's high draft selection, like many great competitors he's carried a bit of a chip on his shoulder: when he was at LSU, he chose to wear No. 30 to remind himself of the 30 teams that passed on him in the 2012 MLB Draft, after Bregman became the first-ever high school batter to win USA Baseball's Player of the Year award. With the Astros, he wears No. 2—perhaps a reminder of his hard work paying off. Just 25 years old, it'll likely continue to do so for years to come.

Aaron Nola —The path of a pitcher with major league aspirations is filled with potholes: aside from needing the natural ability to make that leap, health and the capacity to hone a full repertoire can slow those dreams, if not bringing them to a sudden halt.

Not so for Nola, who has not only made it since being selected seventh overall by the Philadelphia Phillies in 2014, but has evolved into a true top of the rotation starter.

play in both the front and back row and not lose anything, it helps with everything. And those two are really, really fast.”

Two other players to watch are senior Mallory Laumann and junior Addison Benefield, both of whom are primed for big years, the coach believes.

If everything comes together, it’ll give the

Wildcats a chance to build upon last year’s playoff success, when Destrehan went on the road to pull off a first round victory over Acadiana before the No. 20 seeded Wildcats fell to No. 4 St. Joseph’s.

And it’ll have to come together quickly, as Borgstede noted he’s put together a tougher schedule than Destrehan faced

last season, noting he felt it was necessary to accumulate power points and lift that playoff seeding. Contenders and traditionally tough programs like Dominican, Newman, Belle Chasse and South Lafourche are on the slate, and DHS will play in five tournaments that Borgstede said represent, as a whole, a step up from tourney fare last year.

He feels confident in this group, though. This senior class was his first group of freshmen after he began coaching at Destrehan. It’s a faster team in terms of footspeed, but it’s also among his tallest teams, with Benefield leading the way there at 6-foot-1.

“I’m as excited as I’ve been before a season,” he said.

Wins aren’t always in a pitcher’s full control, but Nola gives his team a chance for victory in the vast majority of his outings and his results reflect it: his past two years have seen him tally a record of 27-9, one of the highest win percentages in the majors. When he broke into the league, he was thought to be a control artist more than an overpowering strikeout threat, but he’s surpassed those expectations with nearly 10 strikeouts per nine innings over the past three seasons.

Nola had a slower start to this season, but he’s gotten better and better as the year has rolled on, compiling a record of 10-3 with a 3.67 ERA and stands as yet another fabulous LSU product.

D.J. LeMahieu—I’m happy for LeMahieu, who signed with the New York

Yankees in the offseason and absolutely put to sleep the notion that the former Colorado Rockies second baseman’s success was a product of the thin air of Coors Field.

LeMahieu leads off for the powerful Yankees and bats .336, gets on base at a .383 rate, has scored 81 runs and driven in 80. He also has 18 home runs, and altogether is putting together the finest season of his eight year career. The 31-year-old has a .302 career batting average, and topping the .300 mark for more than 1,000 games is a pretty rare feat indeed. Like Bregman, LeMahieu is a key cog in the wheel of a championship contender, and figures to have the opportunity to make his name under a national spotlight for effectively the first time this fall.

Kevin Gausman. – I

can’t give up on Gausman. I haven’t yet, even after the Atlanta Braves did just that a few weeks ago, cutting the free agent to be.

The starting pitcher and former 4th overall pick was a popular pick to break out this season, which was his first full season with the Braves after being traded from Baltimore last season. He finished last year strong in Atlanta, but the wheels fell off this season, injury and ineffectiveness leading to a parting of ways—he has a 6.26 ERA so far this year.

He’s still a flame-thrower, and actually is striking out batters at a career high rate. He joined the Cincinnati Reds, who have done a nice job “fixing” pitchers of late, particularly Sonny Gray and Tanner Roark.

Nick Goody. He’s been

strong in the Cleveland Indians bullpen all season, and could be a big part of an Indians post-season push. Goody was fantastic two years ago before crash landing in 2018, but this season he’s striking out more than 11 batters per nine and boasts a 1.30 ERA. The right-hander seems to have more than found his footing.

Jacoby Jones. Detroit is in full-rebuilding mode, but Jones has at times shown to be a bright spot, with 11 home runs this season while playing the outfield for the Tigers. Sadly, a season ending injury capped his 2019, as the team announced this week.

Austin Nola. Nola’s made an impact since his call-up with the Mariners. He’s played 35 games this season, mostly at catcher, and batted .317 with four

home runs and 10 RBIs. The 29 year old has battled in the minors for years and thus far has made the most of his chance.

Will Harris. Old reliable. At 34, we know who and what Harris is in the majors, and that’s a consistently effective threat out of the bullpen who’s capable of dominance in any given year. This is one of those years, as the righty boasts a 1.67 ERA out of the Astros’ pen, with 39 strikeouts and a 3-1 record in 43 innings. We’ll see him in the playoffs, as he follows names like Verlander, Greinke and Cole (man, that’s unfair!).

For RSVP volunteers Maddie Fabre and Ronnie Theriot, the act of helping others takes on deeper meaning.

“It makes me proud I’m able to do that,” said Fabre, 77, of Luling. “I’m healthy enough to work those hours and replace other people having surgeries or who are sick” at the St. Charles Parish Hospital’s Lagniappe Gift Shop in Luling.

A retired kindergarten teacher, she has been at what she calls her “second home” for 12 years.

“I’m a people person,” Fabre said. “I just like being here with other people. Otherwise, I’d be staying at home not doing much of anything other than taking care of my house and whatever.”

It’s her way of giving back to the community she loves so much.

Whatever profits are made at the shop go back to the hospital for the patients.

“We’re a nonprofit organization,” she said. “We have bake sales with just volunteers who do this. We give two scholarships each to Destrehan and Hahnville high schools’ graduating seniors.”

Although Fabre is a native of Lafayette, St. Charles Parish is her home.

“I’m helping people of the parish and enjoy giving back to the community,” she said.

Having worked as a kindergarten teacher for 25 years at Luling Elementary, Fabre has a longtime sense of working in the parish toward giving to people and working with the children and people of the parish.

In the 12 years Fabre’s been an RSVP volunteer, she’s clocked 7,700 volunteer hours as of Dec. 18, 2018. She’s also been involved in Girl Scouts and serving on committees at Holy Family Catholic Church.

Fabre, like Theriot, is a volunteer with RSVP (Retired and Senior Volunteer Program) and both say volunteers help make many things happen.

For Theriot, volunteering means helping the Special Olympics and his son, Kurt with an intellectual disability, and he also ranks among RSVP’s top volunteers. The Special Olympics is a volunteer-based organization.

“It was a desire on our part to get my son involved,” he said. “When we first moved here, we lived in Destrehan and kids would come over to play basketball with Kurt and from there he could play.”

It convinced Theriot his son could play in the game so they got more involved to help get him in the game.

“We didn’t know how big it would get,” he said of Special Olympics. “It just gives you a very warm feeling to see children with disabilities excel in their abilities – and beyond.”

 - The Contractor could not remove the concrete channel reducers (Contract Item 005) as shown on the removal instruction from the UV equipment manufacturer. The Contractor used jackhammers, saws, cranes, and heavy-duty wreckers in an attempt to chisel out, cut out and/or lift out the concrete channel reducer. The channel reducer consisted of a high-strength epoxy grout which could not be easily broken out with a standard jackhammer or saw cut using standard concrete saws. The Contractor attempted to pull the channel reducer out as one-piece using cranes and heavy-duty wreckers. However, the Contractor could not overcome the weight of the channel reducer and resistance due the channel reducer being cast-in-place against the walls and floor of the UV channel. The Contractor could not successfully remove the channel reducer using these methods. In order to remove the concrete channel reducer, the Contractor hired a subcontractor to wire saw cut the concrete channel reducer out of the UV trough. Wire saw cutting allowed the Contractor to cut the channel reducer off of the UV channel floor and walls. Furthermore, the Contractor wire saw cut the channel reducer into smaller, more manageable sections that could be lifted out by a crane and/or heavy-duty wrecker. As a result of the difficulties experienced during the removal of the channel reducer, the Contractor requested sixteen additional calendar days for wire saw cutting and removal of the channel reducer.
 - The original design of the effluent pipe configuration required three 90-degree bends. The original design configuration kept all aboveground sections of pipe within the chain link security fence. St. Charles Parish requested the configuration of the effluent piping be revised to reduce the number of bends in the piping. As a result, a longer section of pipe was required to make the tie-in. Additional pipe supports were added to support the longer run of pipe. One pipe support was installed on the existing concrete slab, and the second pipe support was installed on a new concrete pad located outside of the security fence.
- Revise Work Item Quantities
 - During construction, the Contractor was unable to locate an awning manufacture/installer that could provide an awning in accordance with the Plans and Specifications. The Contractor provided an alternative awning that was acceptable to St. Charles Parish and the Engineer. The awning consisted of pre-fabricated galvanized steel framing and painted roof panel sections. The awning meets the 130 mile-per-hour design wind speed. The use of a pre-fabricated steel awning resulted in a cost savings compared to the bid cost for the awning as originally specified.
 - The original design of the effluent pipe configuration required three 90-degree bends. The original design configuration kept all aboveground sections of pipe within the chain link security fence. St. Charles Parish requested the configuration of the effluent piping be revised to reduce the number of bends in the piping. As a result, a longer section of pipe was required to make the tie-in. Therefore, increasing the cost to the project.
 - The original design of the effluent pipe configuration required three 90-degree bends. The original design configuration kept all aboveground sections of pipe within the chain link security fence. St. Charles Parish requested the configuration of the effluent piping be revised to reduce the number of bends in the piping. As a result, one 90-degree bend was removed. Therefore, decreasing the cost to the project.

CONTRACT

This agreement entered into this 8th day of August, 2019, by Barriere Construction Co., L.L.C., hereinafter called the "Contractor", whose business address is PO Box 1576 (1268 LA 3127) 70039, and the St. Charles Parish, hereinafter called the "Owner".

Owner and Contractor, in consideration of premises and the mutual covenants; consideration and agreement herein contained, agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1

STATEMENT OF WORK

- Contractor shall furnish all labor and materials and perform all of the work required to build, construct and complete in a thorough and workmanlike manner: Road Maintenance 2019, Parish Project No. P160302-6
- The abovementioned work shall be completed in strict accordance with Contract Documents prepared by: Barowka and Bonura Engineers and Consultants, LLC, located at 209 Canal Street, Metairie, Louisiana 70005; (504) 828-0030
- It is recognized by the parties herein that said Contract Documents including by way of example and not of limitation, the Drawings and Specifications dated May 2019, Addenda number(s) 1, the Instruction to Bidders, Supplemental Instructions to Bidders, Louisiana Uniform Public Works Bid Form, General Conditions, Supplementary Conditions (if applicable), any Addenda thereto, impose duties and obligations upon the parties herein, and said parties hereby agree that they shall be bound by said duties and obligations. For these purposes, all of the provisions contained in the aforementioned Contract Documents are incorporated herein by reference with the same force and effect as though said Contract Documents were herein set out in full.
- The Work is generally described as follows: Repair and improvements of existing asphalt streets in St. Charles Parish, Louisiana; including milling and overlaying of asphalt pavement patching, restoration of streets, placement of shoulder material, and all thereto.

ARTICLE 2

ENGINEER

- The Project has been designed by Barowka and Bonura Engineers and Consultants, LLC who is hereinafter called "Engineer" and who will assume all duties and responsibilities and have the rights and authority assigned to Engineer in the Contract Documents in connection with completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

ARTICLE 3

CONTRACT TIME

- The Contractor shall complete all of the Work under the Contract within 90 calendar days from the date stated in the Notice to Proceed.

ARTICLE 4

LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

- Owner and Contractor recognize that the Owner will suffer direct financial loss if Work is not completed within the Contract Time specified plus any extensions thereof allowed in accordance with these General Conditions of this Contract, and therefore, time is of the essence. They also recognize the delays, expense and difficulties involved in proving in a legal proceeding the actual loss suffered by Owner if the Work is not completed on time. Accordingly, instead of requiring any such proof, Contractor and Surety agree to forfeit and pay Owner Five Hundred dollars \$500.00 per day as Liquidated Damages for delay (but not as a penalty). Such Liquidated Damages will be assessed for each calendar day that expires after the Contract Time. This amount represents a reasonable estimate of Owner's expenses for extended delays and the costs associated therein. This provision shall be effective between the parties ipso facto and without demand or putting in default, it being specifically agreed that the Contractor by his mere failure to complete the work on or before the date specified shall be deemed in default.

CONTRACT PRICE

- The Owner will pay and the Contractor will accept in full consideration for the performance of the Contract the sum of:

Contract price is firm and subject only to modification by written Change Order agreed to and signed by both parties and the Engineer and approved by the St. Charles Parish Council.

ARTICLE 6

PAYMENT PROCEDURES

- Contractor shall submit Applications for Payment to the Engineer in accordance with Article 15 of the General Conditions. Applications for Payment will be processed by Engineer as provided in the General Conditions.
- Progress Payments. Progress payments will be based upon estimated quantities of contract unit price items or upon estimated percentages of completion of the schedule of lump sum values of labor and materials incorporated into the Work or suitably stored, on the last day of each month or other mutually agreed regular monthly date ending the progress payment period, less retainage.
- Application for Payment Form. The form of the Application for Payment must be suitable to the Owner. The Owner reserves the right to withhold payment until the form of Application for Payment is deemed acceptable by the Owner.
- Retainage. Per Paragraph 15.01.D retainage shall be withheld and payments will be made by the Owner in the payment amount of:
 - Ninety percent (90%) of the approved payment applications for projects with contract of less than \$500,000.00; or
 - Ninety-five percent (95%) of the approved payment applications for projects with contract prices of \$500,000.01 or greater.
- The normal retainage shall not be due the Contractor until after Substantial Completion and expiration of the forty-five (45) day lien period and submission to the Engineer of a clear lien certificate and invoice for retainage.
- Final Payment. Upon the final completion of all Work, the Contractor may request a final inspection and may make a final Application for Payment as provided by Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions.
- Final Acceptance. When Final Acceptance is granted by the Owner, the Owner shall file the certificate with the Recorder of Mortgages for St. Charles Parish.
- At the expiration of the lien period the Contractor shall obtain a certificate from the Recorder of Mortgages of the Parish of St. Charles that the Contract is clear of any liens or privileges, and said certificate shall be presented to the Owner for final payment and release of retainage, less any such sums as may be lawfully withheld under the Contract.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is executed by and between St. Charles Parish, a government entity in the State of Louisiana, created and existing under the laws of the State of Louisiana, (herein called "St. Charles"), and Tauzin Consultants, LLC, (herein called "Consultant").

In consideration of the mutual promises and covenants set forth herein, St. Charles and the Consultant agree to the following terms:

I. Duties and Responsibilities of Consultant

- St. Charles does hereby retain the services of Consultant and Consultant hereby agrees to provide these services to St. Charles all according to the terms set out in this Agreement. The principal duties of Consultant shall be to provide services as follows: securing state and federal permits (when applicable) and state and federal appropriations for a variety of projects including Hurricane Protection levees, new-age infrastructure with emphasis on effective drainage, wastewater, parks and recreation, community needs such as animal control and various economic stimulus projects.
- In providing the services described herein, Consultant shall be available to St. Charles at times mutually agreeable to both parties during the period this Agreement is in effect.

II. Terms of the Agreement

- This Agreement shall be effective for a period of one and one half years (18 months) beginning August 1, 2019. The Agreement may be terminated for cause or upon the death or incapacitating disability of Consultant. In the event of termination, any compensation accrued but unpaid at the time of the termination shall be paid to the Consultant or his assigns.
- This Agreement further contemplates that Consultant shall, from time to time, be called upon to provide special services for St. Charles over and above those specified herein, but yet undefined, which services shall be referred to as "special other services or projects," the details of which shall be set forth in a separate written supplement to this Agreement at the time any "special project" is assigned by St. Charles to Consultant.
- This Agreement may be terminated by either party without cause upon 30 days written notice.

III. Compensation

- Beginning August 1, 2019, St. Charles agrees to pay Consultant a fee of Sixty Thousand (\$60,000.00) dollars per annum for the period this contract is in effect to carry out the terms and conditions of this Agreement for "state" services. The fee shall be paid monthly at the rate of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) dollars per month for services enumerated on a request for payment form approved by St. Charles.
- Additionally, St. Charles agrees to pay Consultant a fee of One Hundred and Twenty Thousand (\$120,000.00) dollars per annum for the period this contract is in effect to carry out the terms and conditions of this Agreement for "federal" services. The fee shall be paid monthly at the rate of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) dollars per month enumerated on the request for payment form approved by St. Charles.
- Consultant is an independent contractor and, therefore, shall not be entitled to any employee benefits of St. Charles.
- Payment to the Consultant shall be by check to Consultant (Tax I.D. Number is 27-3153542). Such payment shall discharge St. Charles of any further obligation with regard to the services performed for which payment has been made.

IV. Confidentiality

Consultant acknowledges that in the course of performing assignments for St. Charles, Consultant will be exposed to confidential, proprietary, educational and administrative information of St. Charles. Any confidential information acquired by the Consultant shall not be disclosed by him to others or used for Consultant's own benefit. The obligations of Consultant under this paragraph shall survive termination of the Agreement provided, that Consultant's

obligation to keep information which (a) was known to Consultant, as evidenced by his written records, prior to the receipt of authoritative disclosures; or (b) hereinafter becomes generally known to the public through no fault of the Consultant.

This Agreement shall be effective on and after August 1, 2019 and shall terminate on January 31, 2021, unless otherwise extended, re-negotiated or terminated for cause.
