Residents urged to donate after popular fall events cancelled

Alligator Fest, Battle for the Paddle drew thousands to parish

The sights, sounds and tastes of fall will be different in St. Charles Parish this year as two of the most widely anticipated annual events have been cancelled due to the coronavirus pandemic.

United Way of St. Charles announced the cancellation of the 2020 Battle for the Paddle at its August board of directors meeting, and the Rotary Club of St. Charles Parish has also decided to cancel the 2020 Alligator Festival.

“It’s unfortunate that we can’t have Battle for the Paddle this year - not only because it’s just plain fun - but because it’s a big part of promoting our campaign,” Executive Director for United Way of St. Charles John Dias said. “We worry that at a time where needs are up, our fundraising may be down.”

He said after carefully monitoring developments related to COVID-19 over

Marine on the mend following sudden heart failure

A U.S. Marine and Army veteran, Keith Krueger is used to being on the move, making his current plight all the more difficult.

The Luling veteran has worked as a truck driver since 1992 after returning home from active duty in the Army, where he served after an active tenure with the Marines from 1979 to 1982. But now he’s home recovering after suffering heart failure in early August, with complications following the surgery making his attempts to bounce

Prison nearly clear of COVID following July outbreak of 196 cases

Following a significant outbreak of COVID-19 at the Nelson Coleman Correctional Center, St. Charles Parish Sheriff Greg Champagne said the situation has dramatically improved.

This week, Champagne said only two inmates were considered positive and not recovered under CDC guidelines, a significant decline weeks after approximately half of the prison’s population had reportedly tested positive at some point during the outbreak. The number of infected inmates reached as high as 196.

“(The inmates) are quarantined together,” Champagne said. “None have any significant symptoms.”

While the Rotary Club of St. Charles Parish has cancelled the 2020 Alligator Festival, supporters can still join in on some fun on the Friday night of what would have been festival weekend.

The Rotary Club will be hosting the ticketed fundraising event Gatorganza on Sept. 25 from 5 – 8 p.m. The outdoor concert will feature music by Wayne Toups, who is being sponsored by St. Charles Parish Sheriff Greg Champagne.

Gatorganza will take place at the Grand Ridge Golf Club, located at 500 Willowdale Blvd. in Luling.

VIP tickets, priced at \$150, will grant revelers Cypress Room admission, food, open self-serve bar, beer and water. Regular admission is \$75 and includes food, beer and water. Tickets for children (under 12 years old) are \$50.

Pastalaya and alligator sauce piquant will be on the menu, and the event will feature a \$1,000 raffle and silent auction. Liquor and soft drinks will be available for purchase on-site. No outside food or beverages will be allowed.

“Gatorganza was originally planned as a kick-off to the festival, but now we are holding it in lieu of it,” Kelsey Pollock, public relations chair for the Rotary Club of St. Charles Parish, said. “All of the money raised at Gatorganza will help to support the Rotary’s scholarship fund.”

She added all social distancing protocols and safety measures will be enforced.

The Rotary Club of St. Charles Parish was formed in 1978. With a goal of giving back to the community, the

The 3rd annual Tony Waguespack Memorial Catfish Jugline Jamboree will be held later this month. Steve Dufrene said the event is a perfectly fitting tribute to a friend gone too soon.

“We met at a gym in the early 90’s,” Dufrene said. “It was just one of those deals ... an accidental friendship. He was the kind of guy who could make friends with a wall, and I’m a little chatty myself.”

Waguespack was only 45 when he died suddenly from a heart attack while on a hunting trip.

“It was obviously heartbreaking,” Dufrene said. “It was very, very unexpected. I just wanted to do something. This was spawned out of tragedy, but it is something fun and positive.”

When Dufrene decided something had to be done to remember his longtime friend and fellow outdoorsman, he said inspiration was easy to come by after he remembered a jugline jamboree that he hosted in 2014 where Waguespack and his

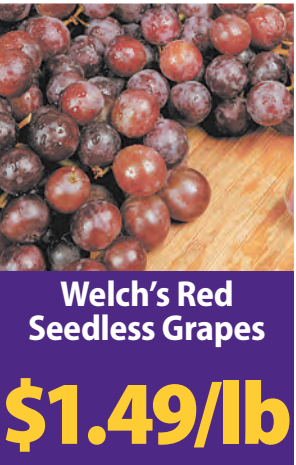

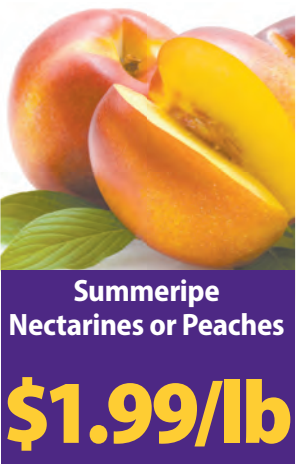

Parish creates citizens’ drainage committee in bid to stop flooding

St. Charles Parish President Matthew Jewell announced the creation of the East Bank and West Bank Citizens’ Drainage Committees this summer, and soon the groups will get to work to develop impactful drainage solutions parish-wide.

The committees will meet monthly to ensure residents have input on future drainage projects and can provide details on known issues. While Hurricane Laura caused a slight delay on the groups’ first meetings, parish officials are working with the committee members now and hope to find a date for everyone to meet soon.

“Residents are keenly aware of drainage and drainage issues, especially issues that threaten their homes,” Jewell said. “It is important to include our residents in this process as we develop long-term solutions to protect residential property and pave the way for future growth.”

Because residents know the drainage in front of their homes better than anyone else and they have the most to lose should flooding reoccur, Jewell said it is important for them to share their observations with local government authorities as plans to improve drainage parish wide are developed.

“The parish depends on our residents to be ‘first-hand’ responders to our drainage problems,” Mary Clulee, councilwoman for District 2, said. “These issues didn’t happen overnight and it will take time to address the increase in drainage needs - especially with the rain volumes we are currently experiencing.”

Jewell and council members nominated committee members to represent the various watersheds within each district.

West Bank committee members include Dustin Zeringue, Barry Roberts, Stanley Roy, Billy Hebert, Billy Woodruff, Russel Tastet and Jerry Hymel.

Mike Weekly, Duane Digoralimo, Bob Dubland, Craig Berry, Dr. Gianna Cohren, Michael Dunn and Walter Pilie make up the East Bank committee.

As the parish works to develop master drainage plans, the committee meetings will provide updates on both capital and in-house projects.

the last several months, the Battle for the Paddle committee and United Way board of directors unanimously voted to cancel this year’s event.

“For the safety and health of those in our community, the best decision for all is to cancel this year’s United Way Battle for the Paddle Cook-Off,” Jerry Stumbo, United Way board president and Valero St. Charles VP and general manager said. “Our community is strong, and we know the support for United Way is on-going.”

Battle for the Paddle, the world’s largest jambalaya and gumbo cook-off, is held annually on the first Thursday in October and serves as the official kick-off for the United Way of St. Charles fundraising campaign.

Last year, more than 150 teams participated in the cooking competition held at the Edward A. Dufresne Community Center in Luling and more than 8,000 attendees sampled unlimited tastings of jambalaya and gumbo while enjoying live music and supporting United Way of St. Charles.

“We reviewed the current CDC and Louisiana Department of Health guidelines, as well as the additional restrictions and requirements from the state, and there is no way for us to safely plan our event at this time,” Tamara Plattsmier, United Way of St. Charles volunteer and events manager, said. “The health and safety of our community are very important to our organization.”

The 2020 Battle for the Paddle cancellation marks the first time the event has been cancelled in its 19-year history. The date for the 2021 Battle for the Paddle has been set for Oct. 7.

Funds raised at Battle for the Paddle are used to support United Way of St. Charles’ 32 partner agencies and 100 plus programs throughout the year. The non-profit gives more than \$3.8 million in annual funding to those agencies and programs.

Rotary Club of St. Charles Parish President Carrie Thomas said the club’s members thought of all the possible ways that the Alligator Festival could still be held this year.

“In the end, with the needed safety measures, the same quality festival would not have been possible,” she said.

The main purpose of the festival is fundraising for the Rotary Scholarship

Program.

“Decades of support from our community, and 40 years of festival success, have meant that the Scholarship Program will survive even without an Alligator Festival this year,” Alligator Committee Chairman Eric Dishongh said. “On behalf of the festival committee, and the Rotary Club of St. Charles Parish, we’d like to thank the St. Charles Parish community for its years of continuing support and invite everyone to come out next year to our 2021

Alligator Festival Sept. 23 -26.”

While the two organizations stand to lose revenue from the cancelled events, the parish as a whole will also be impacted by the losses.

“I will defer to each organization to provide comment pertaining to the budgetary impacts of each event,” St. Charles Parish Economic Development Director Corey Faucheux said. “However, because the two events are major fundraisers for two very generous and impactful organizations, we are hopeful and strongly encourage residents to continue to donate to each.”

Faucheux said every year the hotel, restaurant and tourism (HRT) classes at the St. Charles Parish Satellite Center conduct an economic impact analysis on the Alligator Festival. Key findings of the 2019 festival estimated that attendance was nearly 13,500 people.

“Over 40 percent of the attendees were not residents of St. Charles Parish,” Faucheux said. “It truly is a tourism draw for the parish.”

Because the average amount spent by each attendee was estimated at \$105, the overall economic impact of the festival is estimated to be just over \$1.4 million.

Faucheux said even though the Alligator Festival is the primary fundraiser for the Rotary Club, there are other non-profit organizations who are vendors at the event and also use it as a fundraiser.

150 boats took to the water for Trump boat parade in Des Allemands

Approximately 150 boats took to the water for a parade in Des Allemands Saturday, many of which displayed flags in support of President Donald Trump, and just about all adorned with the American flag.

The boating and fishing community was one of many around the country to see local residents band together in support of the president over the weekend, and those who participated said it made for a good time for all.

“I thought it was fantastic,” said Jesse Fonseca. “For everyone to come out and show support for our president ... everyone was out cheering on one another and it made for a really great experience.”

Ann Marie Morvant said it was a strong turnout despite the fact there wasn’t much fanfare sought for the event, which largely spread via word of mouth and via Facebook group messaging.

“There were people from both inside and outside the community. As many people as we had here, there were some from the West Bank and others from Chackbay and the Thibodaux area,” Morvant said. “The boats were all beautifully done. We had shrimp boats, to house

boats, to big boats to little boats.” Hungry out on the water? Not a problem. “One person had a barbeque pit right there on his boat, flipping hamburgers. It was a really nice, pleasant time,” Morvant said.

pass through Des Allemands. Those not in the parade were able to enjoy the festivities from outside of their homes. Many of the boats were decorated to make for a patriotic aesthetic. “This was the first one I’ve participated in,” Morvant said. “It looked fun and that’s exactly what it turned out to be. The weather was great and there was no negativity.”

The latter point was a bit of a concern prior to the event. After the announcement of the parade was made public, organizers received some negative feedback from different sources and the decision was made to keep the event smaller and spread the word among locals privately, with political tensions high in the weeks leading into this year’s election.

“It’s very unfortunate and I wish things were different,” Fonseca said. “There’s not a lot of open support nowadays because you don’t know how the people around you may feel.

I was really excited when I heard we were doing this here, though, for a community full of crab fishermen to come out on the water and show our support.”

Said Morvant, “It was so positive. It was

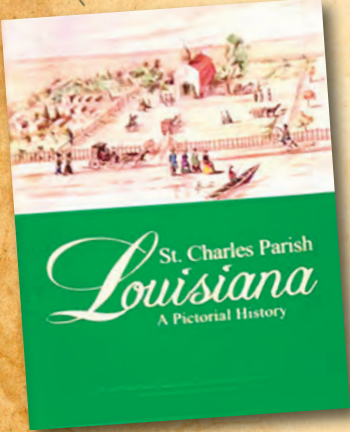

back all the more difficult.

Krueger had a pacemaker successfully installed, but safety rules dictate he would have to miss weeks of work following the procedure – a difficult prospect, as his wife Heather serves as an in-home caretaker for a close friend and disabled New Orleans police officer, free of charge. Thus, the household currently has no source of income.

“It’s zero income. For insurance, we have a \$10,000 deductible, and a lot of out of pocket expenses (toward recovery). On top of that, we still have the usual bills we always have,” Heather said. “We know how lucky we are that it wasn’t worse than it was. The doctor said he should be fine with the pacemaker now. But it’s still a month off of work, and it’s really hard.”

Making the recovery more of a burden for Keith has been a reaction following surgery that saw his legs covered in large blisters and swelling in his stomach and neck.

“His legs were white as Kleenex,” Heather said. “This was the Friday after his surgery. He asked if we should call the doctor on Monday, and I looked at him and told him, ‘I’m calling 911 right now.’”

After several trips to different medical facilities over the ensuing days, there seemed to be no quick fix for the problem. He was told the issue would subside, and was prescribed some medication to help accelerate that process, but Heather said it was still extremely painful for her husband.

There’s no good timing, and we’re so thankful he’s OK, but this happened at the worst possible time.”

A GoFundMe fundraiser (titled Keith’s heart surgery expenses) to help the couple get through the ordeal has raised more than \$1,100.

“We’re so thankful for it,” Heather said. “Everything is a blessing, no matter how much ... someone even donated \$150 and it’s just so unexpected. Half of the people who donated were drivers, the other half were friends, and it means a lot.”

For his part, Keith wants to get back to work, but he still has a bit of time left before that can happen.

“It’s frustrating, but I get it,” he said. “As a truck driver, this isn’t what I’m used to. I’ve got to get through this time and get cleared.”

Keith spends most of his time on the road as a driver; Heather said her husband was at home for just the third time since Christmas last month when he began suffering severe shortness of breath two days following his return. He had a temporary pacemaker put in at first, then two days later had the permanent one inserted.

“We know he’s lucky to be able to still have his job,” Heather said. “It’s just a difficult thing ... with everything going on with lockdowns and shutdowns, and I have my own medical bills as well.”

Champagne said each of the inmates who previously tested positive have surpassed the 14-day symptom free threshold and are now considered recovered. He added the majority of those who tested positive were asymptomatic.

He said no federal offenders are currently positive.

“We continue to quarantine and test all new arrestees,” Champagne said.

Champagne, who recently became the parish’s longest tenured sheriff after being sworn in for his seventh term, added last week that one staff member was under quarantine and was not working pending a test result, with no others positive for COVID.

On July 20, the Sheriff’s Office announced 39 inmates tested positive for COVID-19. Champagne said at the time the vast majority of those cases were asymptomatic, while adding the caveat that asymptomatic carriers made it challenging to test and identify others.

The outbreak occurred despite measures taken to restrict potential contraction and spread of the virus, including the use of quarantine dorms for new arrestees and those testing positive. The staff also performed deep cleaning of all of its housing dorms each day.

Sheriff’s Office spokesman Cpl. James Grimaldi said all inmates are closely monitored and continually screened for symptoms and that any inmates developing advanced symptoms will be immediately transferred to a public hospital or Department of Corrections medical unit.

Additionally, meetings will serve as a platform to garner feedback from residents on the parish’s plans and progress.

“When residents feel involved, the community always does better,” Councilwoman for District 5 Marilyn Bellock said.

Colon cancer now the third leading cause of cancer-related death

According to Dr. Ryan Griffin, a hematologist and oncologist at St. Charles Parish Hospital, there will be an estimated 2,400 new cases of colon cancer diagnosed in Louisiana in 2020.

“Death from colon cancer is the third leading cause of cancer-related death in the United States,” Griffin said. “Louisiana residents, for a variety of reasons, including lifestyle choice and socioeconomic reasons, have higher rates of obesity, alcohol use and meat-rich diets. These things likely lead to an increased risk for colon cancer in Louisiana residents.”

Traditionally, the standard guidelines recommend men and women get their first colon screening at age 50 and then once every 10 years, but there are exceptions.

“Certain people have been recommended to start screening earlier at the age of 45, including African-American men and women,” Griffin said. “Also, patients who have a first-degree relative with colon cancer should get a screening colonoscopy at the age of 40 or 10 years before the age when the first degree relative was diagnosed - whichever is earlier.”

A common misconception about colon cancer is that only middle-aged or elderly people get it, Griffin said.

According to a study by the American Cancer Society, young adults born in 1990 have double the risk for colon cancer and four times the risk for rectal cancer compare to people born in 1950. While the combined age rate of colorectal cancer diagnoses has dropped since the ‘80s, the rate for diagnosis in adults under 50 has increased.

The study added that while it is unclear why colorectal cancer is increasing among young adults, there are

many possible causes - including obesity, poor diet, lack of exercise, eating a lot of red meat, heavy alcohol consumption and genetics.

Healthy behaviors, Griffin said, such as exercise, limiting alcohol consumption and changing to a more plant-based diet, can help decrease the risk of cancer in general, including colon cancer.

“The best thing you can do to prevent and treat colon cancer is to speak to your primary care doctor about any concerns,” he said. “It’s important to be aware and actively monitor the most common symptoms.”

Those most common symptoms of colon cancer include:

Changes in bowel movements: Monitor any changes that last for over two weeks such as diarrhea, constipation, infrequent bowel movements or a feeling of not completely being able to relieve yourself within a bowel movement.

Rectal bleeding: This includes bleeding from the rectum or blood in the stool. Watch for black colored stool, which can be an indicator of colonic bleeding.

Change in stool color or shape: Look for any differences in your stool from color or shape. Be especially aware of thin pencil-like stools which could be an indicator that a tumor may be causing a partial blockage in the intestines, leading to a change in the shape of the stool.

Abdominal pain: while most people with abdominal pain do not have colon cancer, many people with colorectal cancer have reported feeling cramps or stomach pains.

Know your family history: If anyone in your

immediate family has had colon cancer, especially at a younger age, it is important to let your healthcare provider know so that you can start your colonoscopy at an earlier age.

Notice is hereby given, pursuant to Article IV, Section 21(D)(1) of the Louisiana Constitution, that on August 28, 2020, Entergy Louisiana, LLC ("ELL"), a public utility providing retail electric and gas service throughout the State of Louisiana, filed with the Louisiana Public Service Commission ("LPSC") its Formula Rate Plan ("FRP") Rider Schedule FRP Evaluation Report Compliance Update for Test Year 2019.

The filing reflects an earned return on common equity ("EROE") for the 2019 Evaluation Period/Test Year of 9.66%. As such, no change to Base Rider FRP Revenue is required. While Base Rider FRP Revenue will not change as a result of this filing, overall FRP Revenues will increase by approximately \$96 million. The resulting FRP factors to be applied to the respective ELL rate classes (including Legacy ELL and Legacy EGSL rate classes) effective for customer bills rendered on and after the first billing cycle of September 2020 are as follows:

Except for those rate schedules excluded under ELL Rider Schedule FRP-1, the required FRP factor of 54.9458% is to be applied to each of Legacy ELL's rate classes and the required FRP factor of 53.4631% is to be applied to each of Legacy EGSL's rate classes, both effective for monthly customer bills rendered on and after the first billing cycle of September 2020.

It is estimated that the proposed adjustment in rates will have the following effects upon applicable Legacy ELL customers' typical monthly bills: for a Residential customer using 1,000 kWh the bill would change by approximately \$3.29, from \$95.50 to \$98.79; for a Small General Service customer using 50 kW and 12,500 kWh the bill would change by approximately \$44.69, from \$1,278.20 to \$1,322.89; for a Large General Service customer using 1,000 kW and 500,000 kWh the bill would change by approximately \$1,011.37, from \$32,364.04 to \$33,375.41.

It is estimated that the proposed adjustment in rates will have the following effects upon applicable Legacy EGSL customers' typical monthly bills: for a Residential customer using 1,000 kWh the bill would change by approximately \$1.42, from \$89.14 to \$90.56; for a Small General Service customer using 5,000 kWh the bill would change by approximately \$8.71, from \$529.64 to \$538.35; for a Large General Service customer using 500 kW and 253,500 kWh the bill would change by approximately \$217.54, from \$15,130.20 to \$15,347.74.

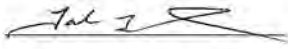
