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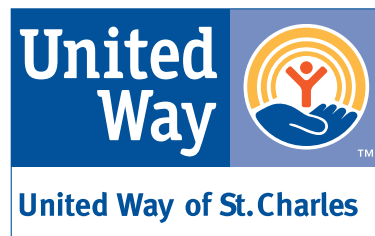

When one local family had the idea to collect money and supplies to help Hurricane Laura victims in Lake Charles, they said they never expected what would happen next – over \$10,000 raised in just five days.

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United Way grapples with fundraising woes in year of increased community needs

As community needs have increased in 2020, United Way of St. Charles has stepped up to meet them.

“We have provided additional food distributions, prescription and grocery delivers to seniors and shut-ins and worked with our school system on tutoring for kids and additional meals for kids,” Executive Director for United Way of St. Charles John Dias said. “I think this community should feel good that their United Way has responded in these tough times.”

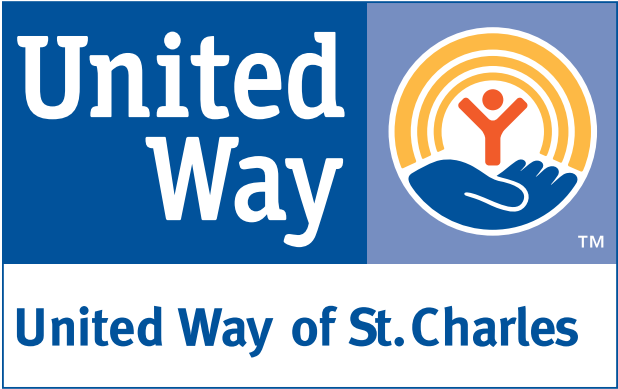
These new initiatives are added to a long list of United Way of St. Charles-funded programs – the organization gives over \$3.8 million in annual funding to its 32 partner agencies and its more than 100 programs throughout the year.

Each year United Way of St. Charles holds a giving campaign to mobilize the power of the community to develop resources that support programs and agencies throughout the year.

“In a normal year, which of course this is far from, about 75 percent of the campaign would be done by the first week of October,” Dias said. “One thing we are seeing this year, and we welcome it, is that companies are pushing back their campaigns until later in the fall in order to be more creative in their planning because of the unique COVID-world we’re in.”

Dias said the main difference in fundraising this year, and what worries him, is the lack of personal contact.

“We are a small, local, almost neighborhood United Way,” he said. “As a result, I have been able to develop an almost one-on-one relationship with our donors over the years, because I get to see our donors regularly at in-person campaign talks in the fall. Unfortunately,



that can’t happen this year. So, we worry that our donors will perceive us a little bit ‘out of sight out of mind.’”

The cancellation of the 2020 Battle for the Paddle was another blow to the organization.

“It’s unfortunate that we can’t have Battle for the Paddle this year - not only because it’s just plain fun - but because it’s a big part of promoting our campaign,” Dias said. “We worry that at a time where needs are up, our fundraising may be down.”

After carefully monitoring developments related to COVID-19 over the last several months, the Battle for the Paddle committee and United Way board of directors unanimously voted to cancel this year’s event.

Battle for the Paddle, the world’s largest jambalaya and gumbo cook-off, serves as the official kick-off for the fundraising campaign. Last year, over 150 teams participated in the cooking competition and over 8,000 attendees sampled unlimited tastings of jambalaya and gumbo while enjoying live music and

supporting United Way of St. Charles.

The 2020 Battle for the Paddle cancellation marks the first time the event has been cancelled in its 19-year history.

Dias said exact numbers aren’t in on the increase of funds needed for this year since the year isn’t over yet, but that the pandemic has overwhelmingly increased the need for assistance.

“I can tell you this ... and this is sad ... not only are we seeing greater need for emergency financial assistance to help people with utility bills for people who have been laid off,” he said, “but we are seeing greater incidence of domestic violence. People are isolated and locked up together in homes for fear of going out, and between the stress of that and economic stress we are seeing, there has been a sad increase in domestic violence and counseling needs.”

If funding dwindles, Dias said, all services would be reduced.

“The main message I have tried to share is that even though everyone’s mind is on an epidemic, all of the issues we had before the epidemic are still there,” he said. “Cancer patients still need help to get to treatment, victims of domestic violence still need a safe house, kids whose parents sadly aren’t getting them fed on weekends still need meals on weekends. There are a host of these issues that United Way always worked to assist with before a pandemic. Unfortunately, they are still there.”

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Matthew 25:35 Food Pantry

Matthew 25:35 Ministries was established as an independent 501(c) in 2016. It was birthed out of a mission of St. Charles United Methodist Church.

The ministry now works closely with the church, United Way of St. Charles and Second Harvest Food Services to serve the community and supply shelf food as well as fresh fruits, vegetables, dairy, meats, desserts and bakery items.

Matthew 25:35 has also supplied hurricane supplies, cleaning supplies and sanitation supplies. The ministry has grown during COVID-19 and has gone from feeding 230 people per month to feeding as many as 500 people per month without ever missing a week of distribution.

So far in 2020, Matthew 25:35 has served over 3,100 families from St. Charles Parish, which means they have helped to feed over 11,300 family members.

Drive-through distribution occurs every Wednesday morning from 8:30 a.m. to 11 a.m.

Metro Centers for Community Advocacy

Established in 1986 as a community-based, independent, non-profit 501(c)(3) agency.

Serves victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking and human trafficking in eight southeast Louisiana parishes including Jefferson, Orleans, St. Tammany, St. Bernard, Plaquemines, St. Charles, St. John the Baptist and St. James.

Services include: 24/7 crisis line, emergency shelter, individual and group advocacy, medical advocacy, legal advocacy, safety planning, children's program, career/financial planning and caregiver support.

In 2019, Metro provided services to 529 women, children and men who are survivors of domestic violence, 472 survivors of sexual assault and 664 carryover survivors of sexual assault.



In 2019, Metro received 3095 calls to the crisis line.

Metro is certified by the Louisiana Department of Children and Family Services/Family Violence Prevention and Intervention unit to provide sheltering and services to domestic violence survivors.

Provides therapeutic riding and hippotherapy services to over 40 riders with disabilities per month.

Two recently installed fans mean the temperatures are much more comfortable for riders and horses, as well as volunteers.

On Oct. 3, GNOTRC will celebrate 27 years of therapeutic riding and hippotherapy services to children and adults with disabilities.

A horse's three-dimensional movement is most similar to the human walking gait. Riders who cannot walk or have difficulty walking get normalized input from the horse, helping them with upper body strength, balance, coordination, all while gently stretching tight muscles. For riders with cognitive difficulties, the horse teaches independence and confidence.

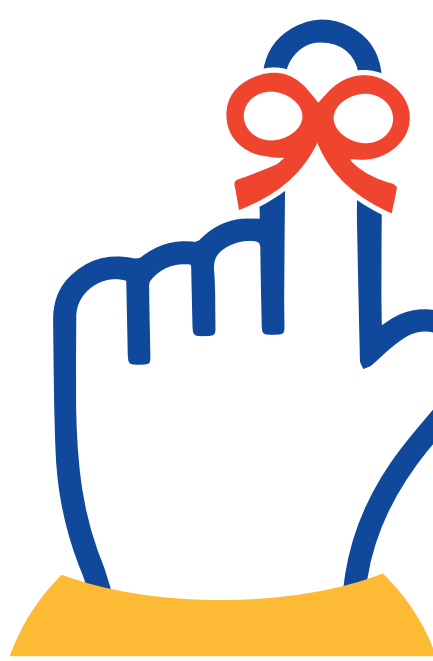
The organization's main objective is to equip and empower the survivor with the necessary tools so that the individual can be able to make informed healthy life choices.

- The St. Charles Parish Sheriff's Office's TRIAD / Seniors and Lawmen Working Together (SALT) is a program comprised of three branches: Concerned citizens, St. Charles Parish Sheriff's Office and St. Charles Council on Aging and Home Health Agencies.
- These entities come together in a united effort to protect and assist the elderly of our community.
- Goals include assist local law enforcement officials in planning for future needs of a rapidly growing, aging population; assist in the development of programs designed to educate seniors concerning certain facts and myths regarding victimization of the older population; improve the sensitivity of local law enforcement personnel, thereby assisting sheriff's deputies and other lawmen in becoming more effective in their interactions with elderly victims of crime; assist in reducing the fear of crime within targeted senior-populated neighborhoods through St. Charles Parish; assist in the delivery of victim assistance for and by older persons, and expand the roles of senior volunteers within law enforcement agencies.
- TRIAD community meetings are held once a year and also a Senior Day event is planned once a year. These are open to St. Charles Parish seniors aged 60 and over.

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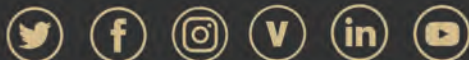

Jason Machulski own the Corner Market in downtown Lake Charles. They stayed for the storm, and Elizabeth and Lauren were talking and Lauren asked what we could do.”

While her dad started planning what to cook, Brittany said she and Lauren, as well as a host of friends and family members, started to organize supplies.

“It just skyrocketed from there,” Brittany said.

After Brittany, who works at St. Charles Parish Hospital, talked to hospital CEO Terrell Neal and the hospital’s volunteer coordinator, information was sent out to all of the hospital employees about how they could assist in the relief efforts.

“People from the hospital donated, and it was sent out to some other Ochsner employees,” Brittany said. “Supplies and money were donated, and I created a Facebook post that I make public and sent out details of what we were looking for.”

People started shipping supplies to the Hyatts through Amazon Prime, Brittany said, adding drop off locations were organized in Luling, Metairie and Kenner.

“It was just crazy,” she said. “There were several moving parts. All of the money went directly to purchase supplies.”

Last week the Hyatts and several friends and family members drove to Lake Charles where the group served 1,500 plate lunches and handed out supplies.

“We loaded a 16-foot Penske truck with all of our supplies and cooking gear,” Brittany said. “My dad cooked out there on site. We served jambalaya, white beans, corn and some bread. We also had cold drinks and homemade desserts.”

The crew set up in downtown Lake Charles, which Brittany said is right in the middle of where all of the workers are.

“I feel like the destruction hasn’t really been covered very well,” she said. “There was glass all in the street and businesses have their whole roofs caved in. There is debris and trees and branches everywhere and street signs down ... there’s also a lack of electricity and running water. Some things were completely destroyed without even having flood water. It was emotional to see because I hadn’t seen a lot of news coverage.”

Brittany said several friends and family members, including her mom Dori Schexnayder and family friend Theresea Matherne, were instrumental in helping to organize everything and executing



the giveaway.

“Anybody that we had come to get food was able to get supplies,” Brittany said, adding the supplies included toothbrushes, toothpaste, tire plugs, tarps, hammers, hand sanitizer, adult diapers, dog treats, coloring books for kids and a bevy of other supplies. “We asked them when they were in line for food if they needed anything and would get it for them while they were getting food.”

Brittany said everyone who received food and supplies were very thankful,

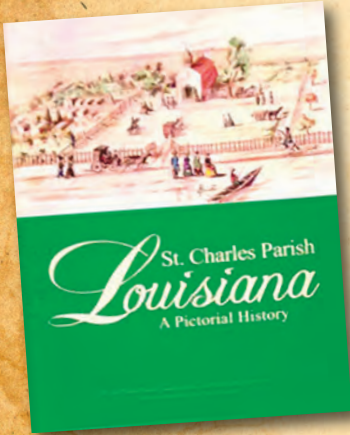
and that a lot of Lake Charles business owners were also out trying to do as much as they could for the community.

“People were there from all backgrounds ... who came from every socioeconomic class ... we were serving workers to people who lost everything,” Brittany said. “It was really nice to see people coming together to serve the greater good ... that was touching.”

25. St. Charles Parish Council Secretary Michelle Impastato said the council has 30 days (after Aug. 25 and before Sept. 24) to fill the vacancy. Pursuant to LA. R.S. 18:602, if the vacancy is not filled within the time specified, the governor will fill the spot.

By parish charter, the council has six months after the appointment of the replacement to hold an election to fill the role permanently.

Council members were able to nominate people to fill Benedettos’ seat at the Sept. 8 council meeting, and two nominations were brought for consideration - Holly Fonseca, Councilwoman-At-Large for Division B, nominated Beth Billings and Julia Fisher-Perrier, Councilwoman for District VII, nominated Buddy Gary Boe.

Both nominations failed to garner the necessary majority vote.

According to the parish charter, the presiding officer of the council – in this

case Council Chairman Dick Gibbs – can not vote on the appointment unless a tie vote occurs, in which case he would vote to break the tie.

Samantha de Castro, parish communications director, said at least a 5-2 vote is needed for a majority win.

Council members La Sandra Darensbourg Gordon, Marilyn Bellock and Fisher-Perrier voted in favor of Boe, while Fonseca, Mary Clulee, Nicky

Dufrene and Bob Fisher voted in favor of Billings.

“I want to assure residents that I spent a considerable amount of time over the four weeks prior to the meeting vetting interested candidates,” Fonseca said. “Beth really stood out as the best candidate.”

Fonseca said Billings is a former small business owner who has served the community through various roles within

the Republican Party for several years. Locally, she is President of the Republican Women of St. Charles and a member and former Chairwoman of the St. Charles Parish Republican Executive Committee. She also serves on several state committees and is a 2020 Louisiana Elector.

Fisher-Perrier declined to comment on Boe’s nomination.

Boe currently serves as Executive Director of the River Parish Tourist Commission. He is a former Senior Advisor and Communications Director for Louisiana Lt. Gov. Billy Nungesser, as well as former Chief Administrative Officer in St. Charles Parish. He has also held various positions in St. John the Baptist Parish government.

“It is my intention to nominate Beth Billings again at our next meeting on Sept. 21 and my hope that through the process we will reach a consensus and avoid the governor having to make the decision for us,” Fonseca said.

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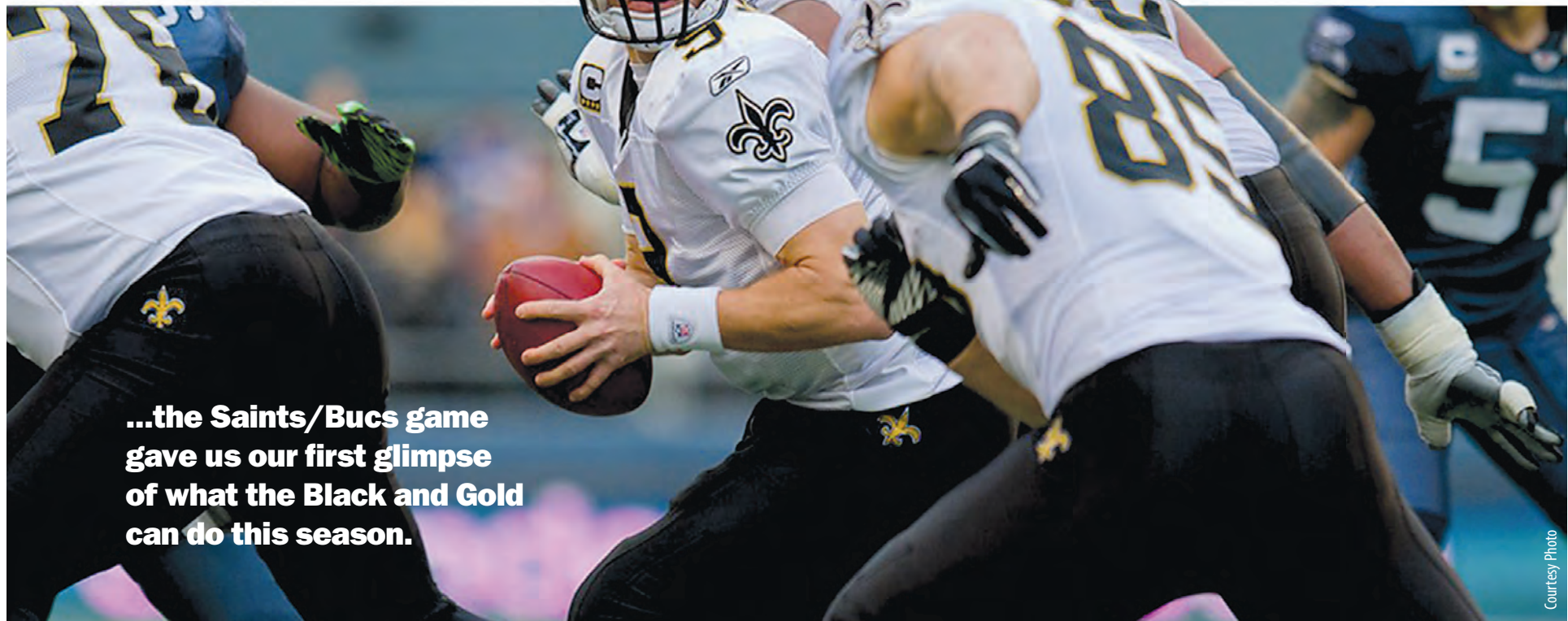

Return of NFL, Saints brought comfort rare in 2020

We needed that.

Or at the very least, I know I did. ‘That,’ in this case, refers to the return of football, and not a second too soon.

We’ve suffered through months of social and economic upheaval. We’ve had to question our minute to minute activities in the name of protecting not just our own health, but also that of those around us. There’s division, violence, worry and anger ... storms, fires and earthquakes that leap out of nowhere ... and many days it may feel like the world we live in is a completely different entity than the one we lived in seven months ago.

But for one day, life finally felt normal for this football fan.

Well, fine ... almost.

After all, we all enjoyed that hurricane red alert in the wee hours of Sunday morning. Nothing like a dose of panic to jolt you from your peaceful slumber. And certainly, the news of evacuation

orders and a strengthening storm did what it could to keep me at least somewhat tethered to the reality of 2020.

But the pigskin commanded the bulk of my attention, and with no preseason to gauge, the Saints/Bucs game gave us our first glimpse of what the Black and Gold can do this season. New Orleans rolled to victory and kept control of the score for all but the game’s very early stages. Some thoughts ...

The Good:

The secondary has improved - Janoris Jenkins made perhaps the most important play of the day with his Pick 6 of Tom Brady, and it shined light on one of the team’s most important upgrades from last season. Jenkins was a very good cornerback with the New York Giants, but he clashed with the coaching staff and actually joined the Saints at the end of last season. Paired with Marshon Lattimore, the two could represent the most talented pair of Saints

cornerbacks since Jabari Greer and Keenan Lewis. Malcolm Jenkins is back in the mix and Chauncey Gardner-Johnson is more seasoned after a strong rookie year. While Tampa had a healthy point total, the Saints’ defense made critical stops throughout the game to keep the Bucs from truly threatening.

Weapons galore - New Orleans has had a simple formula offensively over the past three seasons.

Maul teams up front and establish the run, while focusing the lion’s share of the passing attack through Michael Thomas and Alvin Kamara. It was very successful, though against some better defenses the team’s lack of secondary receivers sometimes limited production.

Last season, however, Jared Cook began to really click with Drew Brees around midseason. Now

the team has added another serious weapon to the mix in Emmanuel Sanders. And Taysom Hill is becoming more and more of an X-Factor. Covering all will be a serious challenge for anyone.

The pass rush. Tom Brady hit the deck three times and was intercepted twice. Pressure busts pipes.

The Worries:

Let’s not panic on Drew Brees ... but ... - He’s arguably the most accurate passer the NFL has ever seen, after all. It’s just that Sunday provided no evidence of that.

That signature marksmanship was as scattershot as I can ever remember Sunday, be it overshooting a swing pass, throwing behind a crossing receiver or leaving a ball too short of the 1st down marker. It’s usually notable when you see one such mistake from Brees in a game, let alone several. He stepped up and led his team to a win regardless, and it’s hard to argue anyone has earned

more benefit of the doubt than Brees has.

That said, were this the 28-year-old Brees, this isn’t even a concern. Bad game, bounce back next week. But it’ll bear watching as we move forward, because Brees in his 40s is going to have to overcome diminishing arm strength more and more. His experience, his mind and his pinpoint touch has enabled him to remain elite as this process has gone on. But one day, he won’t be. The Saints will need more from Brees moving forward.

A struggling line - Down a starter with rookie Cesar Ruiz injured, the Saints had a lot of difficulty running the ball and averaged just 2.4 yards per carry. Brees was sacked just once, but he had to get rid of the ball early several times, particularly in the second half once Tampa began dialing up pressure. This is a talented group capable of dominating, but it’ll have to play like it going forward.



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Many local businesses say Phase III won't bring much change

Many local business owners say not much will change at their businesses after Louisiana Gov. John Bel Edwards announced last week that he was moving the state into Phase Three of coronavirus reopening.

This new order, which will expire Oct. 9th and keeps the current state-wide mask mandate in place, states alcohol sales and service for on-premise consumption must end at 10 p.m. everywhere, and other businesses - such as restaurants, churches, salons, spas and gyms - are allowed to open at 75 percent occupancy with social distancing.

All events – including weddings and birthday parties - are limited to 50% capacity, while sporting events are limited to 25 percent capacity and must contain no alcohol sales.

Edwards said bars are to remain closed for on-premise consumption, adding parishes with a positivity rate of 5 percent or lower for two consecutive weeks may opt-in to open bars for on-premise consumption.

St. Charles Parish Director of Communications Samantha de Castro said local officials are awaiting clarification from the state to determine if St Charles Parish meets the 5 percent positivity rate which would permit local bars to open.

April Ball manages Taste of Tokyo, which has had its dining room closed since the beginning of the pandemic.

“We were hoping that Phase III would be more accommodating to our needs, but it really is of no help to us,” she said. “I’m sure other restaurants will see a big benefit but for us personally, it won’t change anything. I don’t know how some restaurants will be able to increase occupancy and still maintain the distancing.”

Ball said the restaurant's staff has been doing things like replacing the floors and revamping the menu during the time of having the dining room closed.

“We had a goal date to reopen before the Phase 3 announcement,” she said. “We haven’t been doing dine-in for a couple of reasons, but one would be the size of our restaurant. We are small ... 50 percent occupancy for us would be about 50 customers, however, the social distancing rules limit us even further because our tables need to be so far apart. Moving into Phase 3 doesn’t help our restaurant at all. The social distancing of tables remains the same and we will therefore not be able to accommodate more customers when we open in October.”

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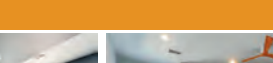

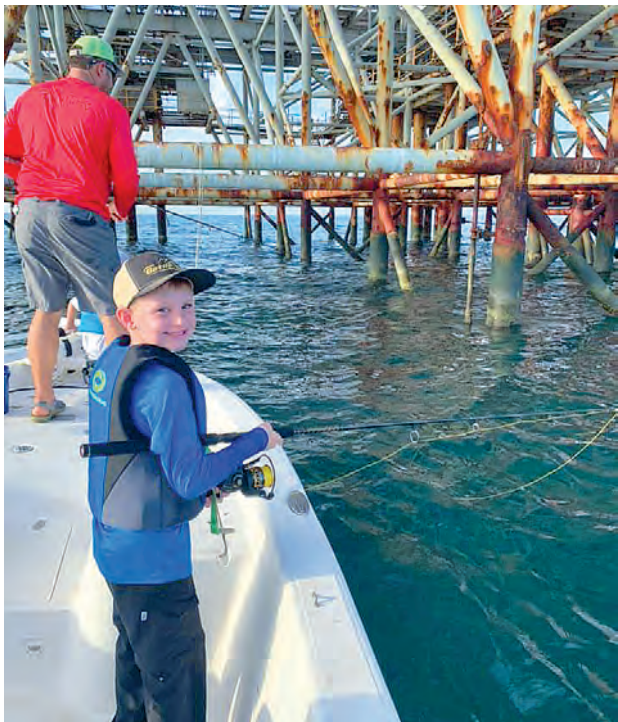

Viet Nguyen, owner of Cajun Kitchen Seafood & Poboys, said the 75% capacity means nothing new for his business either because of the spacing restrictions.

“But business has been steady,” he said. “We show love and dedication for our community, so it’s natural that we get it back.”

Heather Jackson, owner and lead stylist at Destrehan’s Salon Stylush, said nothing will change for salon employees with increased capacity because stylists are only allowed to take one client at a time and must maintain social

distancing.

“With being smaller salon, it’s hurting us and making us work longer hours and make less money,” she said. “Business has been steady, but with appointments only it’s hard to gain new clients that like the convenience of walking in to see if we can do a haircut. I have stylists that are building a clientele and it’s hard for them to get new people if they cannot take walk-ins.”

Rosmarie Gainey, owner of Atchafalaya Seafood, said 75 percent capacity means her restaurant was able to open five more tables, which means 20 more seats.

“A staff shortage is what is hurting us the most,” she said. “We need employees.”

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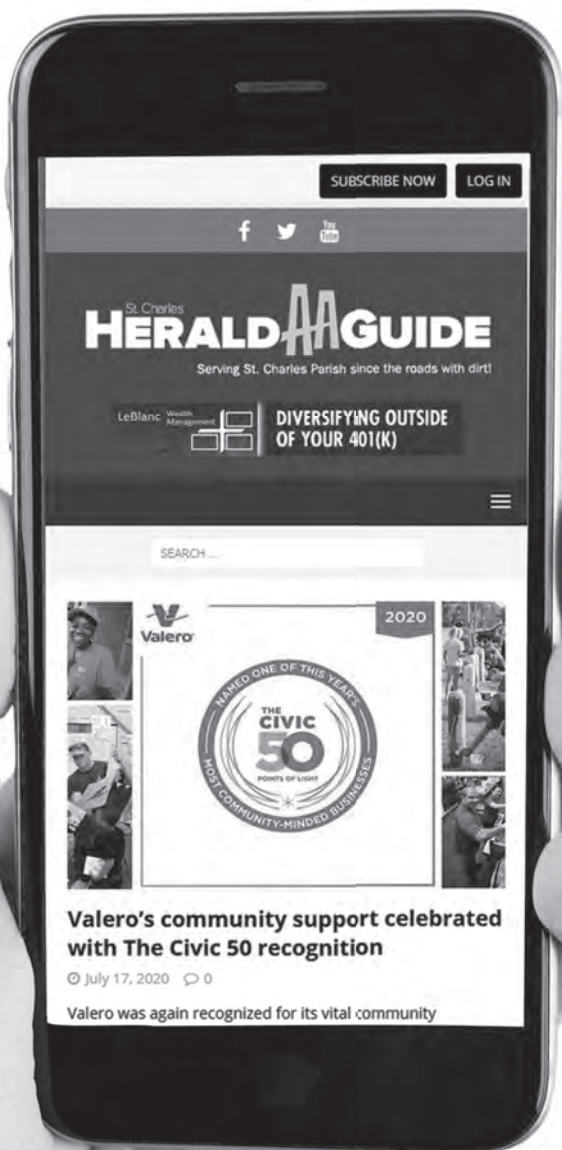

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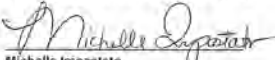

There was found by said count and canvass that (i) there was a total of **2,725** votes cast **IN FAVOR OF** Proposition No. 1 and a total of **986** votes cast **AGAINST** Proposition No. 1, as hereinabove set forth, and that there was a majority of **1,739** votes cast **IN FAVOR OF** Proposition No. 1 as hereinabove set forth, (ii) there was a total of **2,747** votes cast **IN FAVOR OF** Proposition No. 2 and a total of **967** votes cast **AGAINST** Proposition No. 2, as hereinabove set forth, and that there was a majority of **1,780** votes cast **IN FAVOR OF** Proposition No. 2 as hereinabove set forth and (iii) there was a total of **2,438** votes cast **IN FAVOR OF** Proposition No. 3 and a total of **1,272** votes cast **AGAINST** Proposition No. 3, as hereinabove set forth, and that there was a majority of **1,166** votes cast **IN FAVOR OF** Proposition No. 3 as hereinabove set forth.

Therefore, the Governing Authority did declare and proclaim and does hereby declare and proclaim in open and public session that the Propositions as hereinabove set forth were duly **CARRIED** by a majority of the votes cast by the qualified electors voting at the said special election held in the Parish on Saturday, August 15, 2020.
