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Norco woman searching for kidney donor

After her doctor strongly suggested she find a living kidney donor, Sharon Robert had a simple response.

“That’s easier said than done.”

And, of course, it isn’t easy, but it is extremely necessary for the Norco woman, 57, who suffers from Autosomal Dominant Polycystic Kidney Disease, or genetic PKD. It’s an illness that has hit her family hard and has been unrelenting. Those with PKD stand a 50 percent chance of passing it on to a child, but despite that statistic, Robert and each of her four siblings had it passed down from their father, who lost his life to the illness.

“It’s unique. All five of us have it, and that’s not at all

usual with this,” Robert said. “Every time we tell our doctors, all in different cities, they’re perplexed at that.”

The positive for Robert, however, is two of her siblings have gone through successful transplants, her sister now 10 years past the surgery. But there is some sense of urgency to find a donor as soon as possible, as Robert is in Stage 4 of PKD. Stage 5 necessitates dialysis, and that is not a route Robert is comfortable with.

“My father and his siblings don’t have a good history with dialysis ... I saw my father on dialysis, and there are so many problems and complications. The quality of

“We lost everything ... basically everything,” she said. “The kitchen was spared, but the rest of everything was gone.”

Stock said she was faced with an unsettling reality after assessing her insurance policies.

“Unfortunately when I bought the home it was a foreclosure, so the coverage was so low,” she said. “I refinanced during COVID and they didn’t do a walk through and up coverage. My contents

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Doctor who served community for decades hangs up white coat

Dr. Vadakkipalayam Devarajan, affectionately known as Dr. Raj to his patients and colleagues, hung up his white coat this month after serving the St. Charles Parish community for over four decades.

“When somebody lives - maybe some people, maybe more people - have a memory of you,” he said. “I only wish that I’ve been good to leave some good memories ... that’s my wish.”

Dr. Raj was born in India and moved to the New Orleans area in 1976 to attend Tulane University. He moved to St. Charles Parish a couple years later.

“I raised my family here and have been working here from 1978 to now,” he said. “I came here and I’m glad I did. The community has been such a warm, supportive community ... just so gracious.”

After working in different capacities and networks, Dr. Raj has spent the last decade of his career working as an Access Health Louisiana nephrologist helping patients with dialysis options, kidney stones treatment and chronic kidney disease and failure.

The 76-year-old doctor said retirement was more of his family’s idea.

“They want me to smell the roses and I’m going to respect their wishes,” he

Program keeps students ‘on the run’ both physically and mentally

While named “Girls on the Run,” racing to the finish line is only one aspect of this positive youth development program that expanded into St. Charles Parish in 2019.

The goal, above all else, is to inspire young girls in third through eighth grade to be joyful and confident while also giving the opportunity to have fun, make friends, increase physical activity levels and learn important life skills. The program culminates with all area teams participating in a celebratory 5K event to be held in May.

The non-profit organization, which facilitates trained coaches who lead girls through interactive lessons and running activities at school and community sites through Terrebonne, Lafourche, St. Mary and St. Charles parishes, will open registration Jan. 24 for girls on a first come, first served basis. Spring season opens Feb. 24.

“The biggest message of the program is instilling that every girl can do it,” said Aimee Johnson, council director for Girls on the Run. “In our 5K, we don’t care whether you jump, skip or crawl with us, just finish the race and cross that finish-line.”

The 10-week program sees groups of 12 to 15 girls meet with their coaches

at their designated site, usually twice a week. Each coach establishes a lesson plan that teaches about subjects like self-awareness and team-building. That’s done at the beginning of each session – at the end, the running begins.

This program is accessible to all girls regardless of athletic ability or fitness level. Sessions usually last between 75 and 90 minutes and aim to teach critical life skills and behaviors such as how to manage emotions, help others, make intentional decisions, and resolve conflict.

Johnson notes she joined the Girls on the Run team after her daughter signed up and had a positive experience, and she believes in the impact the program has for the better.

“(Louisiana) is the No. 3 ranked state in terms of childhood obesity, inactivity ... I think this is a great program for our state to have,” Johnson said. “It’s about positivity, being confident in yourself ... I love what it teaches the girls.”

The program expanded to St. Charles Parish in 2019, and Albert Cammon Middle School has hosted as the local site. That connection came via Cammon teacher Sally Gaglione, who reached out to inquire about starting a team – and thus, the ACM Heart and Sole team was born, with Gaglione serving as coach.

“She was very passionate about the program and she reached out (about starting a team locally). Now she’s on our board, and she’s one of our greatest helpers,” Johnson said.

The program is not limited to schools, however – a fitness center, community park or many other sites can serve as a host site. Johnson said she hopes to see some other teams sprout up in St. Charles Parish to join Cammon’s.

“You just have to have the coaches and the site approved, and then you have 12-15 girls take part,” Johnson said.

The program’s momentum was stunted by the COVID-19 pandemic, which caused a shutdown for a season, and registration numbers to decline. It was feared another season would be cancelled following Hurricane Ida, but not only was it held, 125 girls registered, all in person, signifying a bounce-back.

“We’re hoping this spring will be even bigger,” Johnson said.

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Norco family in limbo as home destroyed, relief funds denied

It sounds like a simple request, but the reality is that it's been anything but for Norco's Alia Gonzales.

"I just want to rebuild my life," Gonzales said.

Gonzales, her husband and their 13-year-old son recently watched as their home was demolished, part of that rebuilding process after Hurricane Ida rendered the residence – one the family had just renovated after purchasing a few years ago - a total loss. Three trees fell atop the house, their limbs through every room in the home. While Gonzales says she is grateful the family was able to evacuate and avoid unthinkable harm had they stayed, months of stress have accumulated due to what's been a mostly futile attempt to garner financial aid.

"I got on the phone with FEMA right away, and they said, 'Oh, we can send you to Dallas,'" Gonzales recounted of the days following the storm. "Well, we can't do that. We have to stay here – my husband has to work and I have to get started on insurance and everything else ... 'Well, we can't help you.'"

With nowhere to go, the family stayed with a neighbor for two weeks. Attempts to secure a trailer to live in via FEMA dragged, and the couple

made the decision to purchase a trailer themselves.

"I knew (their neighbor) wanted her house back. So, it's like, how long are we going to wait? We need a roof over our head, and we can't stay here much longer."

That temporarily solution secured, other problems needed to be addressed. The family's home insurance would pay what the home was worth, but that garnered approximately half of what the cost would be to demolish and rebuild the home, and it was not a cost they could afford.

That left them with more pleas to FEMA, but Gonzales said she's gotten the runaround for months.

"They deny, deny, deny," Gonzales said. "Finally, they told me, 'Well, you'll need a FEMA inspector to come out.' And yes, please, that's what we've wanted for weeks and weeks."

She said the inspector came out and, after two hours, told them the high likelihood was they would be denied assistance, but to continue appealing. According to Gonzales, FEMA said the issue at hand is it will not duplicate insurance benefits. She added that contrasts with paperwork she received from the inspector, which stated one may be eligible for FEMA assistance if their insurance settlement does not cover all of their disaster needs, but said FEMA claimed that paperwork was not official via the agency.

Thus far, Gonzales said the family has not received a dime of FEMA assistance.

Months of lobbying in vain led the family to go public with their grievance. After a segment highlighting their plight was featured on FOX8, a FEMA agent in Washington, D.C. reached out to her and indicated assistance could be possible, but she would have to make a stronger case and specifically prove that the home needed to be demolished.

"So, the damage report, your inspector, none of that is enough to prove we needed to have it demolished?" Gonzales said. "They said they can't go by pictures. So, what was the point of the inspector?

We had three trees on top of our roof, in front of the house. If that house comes down, then the tree is coming down there right by the trailer.

"I'm trying to give them what they want. But they ask for the same things, over and over and over. Appeal letter, insurance settlement letter, copy of check. This is what I have. This is it. I've done it five times already ... the information doesn't change."

She said she was also asked why the family elected to demolish the home so soon.

"We're almost five months later," she said.

Gonzales said she is waiting to hear back about an SBA loan, and believes that will come through. But she added the family will be in for some tough times ahead, regardless.

"We're gonna struggle ... we're not

rich," said Gonzales, a teacher in Jefferson Parish, while her husband is a delivery driver. "We bought a house we could afford. We can't afford to pay \$300,000 for a house, and it's not that easy to just pick up and go somewhere else."

The Gonzales family set up a GoFundMe (titled "Help the Gonzales family rebuild our home") in hopes of finding some financial relief.

It's all been a cumbersome burden that has followed the family into the new year after a very trying 2021. Last year, Gonzales' mother passed away, while her husband nearly lost his mother after the latter suffered a heart attack. Their home was destroyed and their lives were thrown into limbo.

"2021 was an extremely hard year for us," Gonzales said.

The center is found at the Edward Dufresne Community Center Parking Lot, located 274 Judge Edward Dufresne Parkway in Luling.

St. Charles Parish residents, and residents of all parishes affected by

Hurricane Ida, can continue to visit any open disaster recovery center in Louisiana. To locate a center, check the FEMA app, visit www.FEMA.gov/DRC or call the FEMA Helpline at 800-621-3362. All DRC centers follow COVID-19 precautions, and masks are required for all visitors, employees and volunteers.

life is not good. He died on dialysis. His brother died at an early age, I believe his first time he did dialysis. So, I know, if possible ... out of the two choices (transplant or dialysis), both have problems, but the transplant is better. My doctors all agree on that.”

Robert is on the transplant waiting list, but the timeframe is problematic. Once a two to four year process, these days the wait is estimated to be five to seven years. It’s why Robert was advised to find a living donor on her own.

A kidney is hard to find, and on top of that, it’s hard to ask, Robert admits.

“(Her doctor) explained to me, ‘You’re depriving somebody who wants to do something good.’ So, I started thinking about that and understanding what he said,” Robert said.

But others have also helped get her search started. Her sister’s kidney donor created a webpage, called “A Kidney for Sharon,” which explains her situation, how a living kidney donation works, while also making himself available to speak to a potentially interested donor to share his own experience. Robert’s niece has been spreading the word on Facebook.

“I truly appreciate what they’re doing to help me,” Robert said.

The news she would need a transplant wasn’t a shock for her. With PKD, it’s inevitable, she said.

“I knew it was coming at some point,” Robert said. “So, when I learned that, it felt more like, ‘Well, here it is.’”

Part of her doctor’s reasoning for bringing a sense of urgency to the matter

also stems from Robert’s specific kidney situation – they’re greatly enlarged and could begin to affect other organs.

“They showed us the images ... my kidneys completely take over the front of my body, and some of the back,” she said.

The illness has taken things from her. Robert was a teacher’s assistant at Mimosa Park Elementary School, a position she took ona position she took on after helping out and substituting at St. Charles Borremeo and Sacred Heart, where her children attended. That experience made her realize how much she enjoyed working with the children. She had to resign from the position due to her health.

“It was the best experience ever,” Robert said. “The absolute best school, the best principal, the best co-workers, and I adore the children.”

Getting exercise is also problematic. Even talking a walk can be a struggle.

“I’ve taken tests, and it’s never anything respiratory that’s wrong. It’s the kidneys,” she said.

Through it all, though, she’s kept a positive attitude in the face of her adversity. Robert still has to find a donor, and she knows a transplant will not bring her struggle to an end, as there will be issues to manage thereafter.

She expressed no bitterness, but gratitude instead.

“It’s not a case where, ‘Well, I’m getting a transplant, so I’m all good,’” Robert said. “You can develop other problems afterwards. But it’s still a life-saving procedure, and I’m extremely grateful to have that opportunity.”

... the policy didn't even cover like one-sixth of my contents. Once I talked to insurance and figured out what they were giving me, I knew I needed to make it last."

With the hopes of making insurance money stretch as far as it can, Stock and her 9-year-old son Kael have become a construction crew of sorts as they have worked to demo and now rebuild their Destrehan home. The Stocks are operating under the watchful eye of their supervisor with whom they share a last name – and family tree.

"My dad Gerry Stock has worked in construction and maintenance his whole life," Stock said. "We wouldn't be able to do anything if it wasn't for him teaching us along the way. Once he teaches me how to do it, it's like, 'Come on Kael.' The other day I learned how to run ducts in the attic and cut a hole in the ceiling to put in a vent."

Stock said Kael has found his favorite home improvement step.

"He really likes hitting walls," she said laughing. "He loves to put holes in the wall."

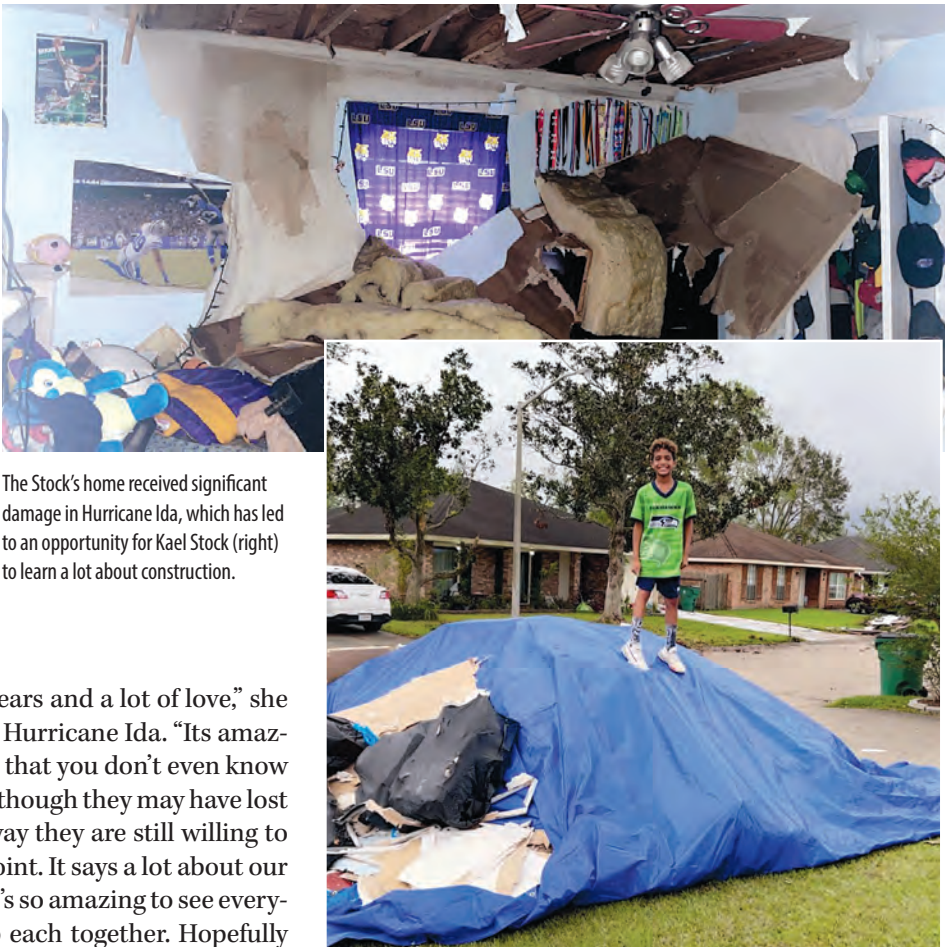
The three generations of family members have been working side by side by side as they tackle the home renovations.

"In the future we'll know how to do it if we ever have to do it again," Stock said of she and Kael. "Its teaching Kael a work ethic and showing him how to take care of

our home ... he's the man of our home. I think that him being able to see me as a woman do the work as well ... I think it'll give him a new appreciation for what women can do."

The mother and son duo are currently living in a trailer in their front yard. In the days following Hurricane Ida, they moved to an apartment in Baton Rouge and Stock enrolled Kael in a school there so she could commute back and forth to St. Charles Parish for work.

"There have been a lot of tears and a lot of love," she said of the months following Hurricane Ida. "Its amazing to see how people - some that you don't even know - are just willing to help even though they may have lost some things and along the way they are still willing to help people at their lowest point. It says a lot about our parish and our community. It's so amazing to see everyone come together and help each other. Hopefully this is a lesson the kids can learn and carry on as well."

Dempsey's new song releasing this week for streaming and download is titled "Beat You There." The song was written after the death of Audrey Maria Higgins, a friend of Dempsey's who was killed as the result of a July 4, 2020 boat crash.

"Not only was she a good friend, but she was also a big supporter of my music," Dempsey said. "She came to every one of my shows and even set up one of the biggest shows I had at the time. So after she passed away, I wanted to do something special for her and her family ... so I wrote this song in her honor."

Dempsey said he's known Higgins for

as long as he can remember.

"I'm not sure exactly when we met. I was just a kid at that time," he said. "We both grew up in Ama and being such a small community, you pretty much get to know everyone around your age. She was a little older than me, so we didn't really hang out all of the time when I was younger. But as we got older, one of my best friends, Blake, started dating her sister and we started doing a lot more things together and got much closer."

Dempsey said Higgins was a great friend.

"She was always willing to help out and never asked for anything in return," he said. "She was just a genuinely good person, and it was impossible not to like her. She was also a really positive person and was always looking to have a good time."

Higgins, Dempsey said, was also a really big supporter of his music when he was just starting out.

"She came to every one of my shows and even set up a show for me at Fat Boys bar in Luling," he said. "At the time, it was the biggest show I'd ever done. The place was packed ... and I owe it all to her."

Dempsey began penning the song the day of Higgins' death.

"I wanted to write it for a few different reasons," he said. "For one, I wanted to do something special for her - to honor her and keep her memory alive because of all the things she had done for me. Also, I was very close to everyone in that boat. I saw first-hand all of the hurt and pain that this family was going through because of this accident, and I wanted to do something special for them to help them cope with her loss and help give them hope that they would see her again. Grief makes it pretty easy to write songs and it also helped me to process all of the things I was feeling at the time."

The song, Dempsey said, was all around a labor of love.

"I've worked really hard on this one," he said. "I actually produced and mixed the song myself ... just me and the guys in my band in my little home studio. The great thing about this song is that anyone who's dealing with losing someone

can relate to it. It's not just meant to be a sad song about loss ... its meant to give people hope as well ... hope that they will see this person again one day."

Caitlin Higgins Comardelle, Higgins' sister, said her favorite line of the song is "We're both headed for the same place anyway ... I just beat you there."

"The first time I heard the song I just cried ... from the first strum of the guitar to the last," Comardelle said. "It's after the second and third time that I listened to it that I heard how hopeful the song is and how proud we are to have this song represent my sister. Audrey wouldn't want us to cry. She would want us to pick ourselves up and keep living our lives and thanks to this song and the support we get from our community, from both people we knew and complete strangers, we are able to do that on most days."

Comardelle said she hopes the song will bring happiness and hope to anyone going through a similar situation.

"The loss of a loved one, especially as sudden and unexpected as the loss of Audrey, is one of the hardest experiences people will ever go through," Comardelle said. "If this song can somehow put a hand on their shoulders and tell them that their loved one is OK and that they'll see each other again ... then I think that is all Will or any of us could ever want."

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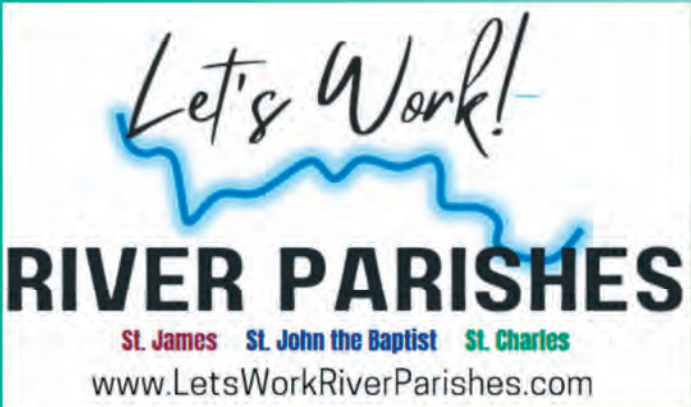
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Wildcats showing to be a force, set for key matchup with ESJ

Rematch with Hahnville looms next week to kick off second round of district play

In year one under head coach Troy Green, Destrehan learned his way of doing things on the basketball court.

In year two, the Wildcats have made a leap.

As Destrehan (18-4) prepares for a key District 7-5A showdown at home Friday night with East St. John, it's already made quite a statement to the prep basketball landscape. The Wildcats have been ranked as high as No. 3 in Class 5A power points, and headed into Tuesday night's game against a powerful Madison Prep squad, the team stood at No. 9.

Though Madison captured the win there, what was a struggling Destrehan program

has turned completely around under Green, who guided his alma mater White Castle to a pair of state championships prior to his arrival at DHS. Destrehan won 13 straight games

at one point this season, and the loss on Tuesday snapped what was a four-game win streak over H.L. Bourgeois, Central Lafourche, Terrebonne and Northside.

The latter of those, a

61-60 victory on Monday in Lake Charles, saw the Wildcats fight back from an 18-point deficit to lead by as many as nine in the fourth quarter. DHS held off Northside's own rally to earn the one-point win, and it's hardly the first time Destrehan has shown an ability to fight back into a game after falling behind significantly – the Wildcats made a similar comeback against Hahnville earlier this month before the Tigers regrouped to nail down the win.

"We made a run ... we kept plugging away in the third quarter and in the fourth quarter, and we made a run," Green said of the Northside win. "To be down 18 at halftime, we came out and pulled it out. We didn't panic. We just continued to play

defense and chugged away, chugged away."

The win showcased the confidence this team has been playing with, a confidence that continues to grow as the wins pile up.

"The main thing was trying to change our mentality as far as defending," Green said of the team's

for us."

Chris Moore has been coming on strong in recent games, Green said. Devin Fourcha and Daniel Blood have also played consistently well on a roster full of contributors.

While Destrehan has learned to win again on the basketball court,

improvement this season. "Playing team basketball. It isn't going to go our way all the time, but if you do the little things correctly – play defense, share the ball, be on time, take charges, just do what you're supposed to do – those things add up. And if you don't do those things, it comes back to hurt you in crucial games. We hang out hat on defense. You shot won't always fall, but the defense can always be there."

That first point, defense, is what the Wildcats hang their hat on. A deep and athletic roster that sees 10 players earn significant playing time night to night allows the Wildcats to go all out with their press, that defense often turns into points at the other end off of turnovers.

Calvin Bullock has been a go-to player for Destrehan. The forward/center has been leading the team in scoring and keys the Wildcats' inside-out philosophy on offense.

"We try to go through him," Green said. "We look to go inside first. He's been playing real steady

Green said this is hardly a team that doesn't know how to handle success.

"When you think about it, the majority of our team is used to having success in football," Green said. "So I don't think it was that hard to get those guys to understand how to win. And when you win, they realize, 'Hey, we can play too.' We just have to go out there and execute, and not get too high or too low."

East St. John presents a major test and challenge on Friday. ESJ brings a record of 21-5 along with them to Destrehan, and more importantly for this particular battle, is an unbeaten 5-0 in district play.

Destrehan is 3-1 in district play thus far, so this game carries a lot of importance for DHS: a second district loss could render them on the outside looking in in regards to the the district championship race.

"They're in the top 10 in 5A," said Green. "That's a very talented team and they're doing a good job over there. Hopefully we can go out, play well and protect our home court."

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Hahnville bests Destrehan to keep surge going

Victory over rival continues to cement breakthrough season for Tigers

Hahnville hoped to get off to a fast start in its district matchup with Destrehan – Ethan Maher ensured the Tigers got just that.

Maher’s goal with just 15 seconds elapsed in Friday’s match set the tone in what became a 5-1 Hahnville victory, spurring the Tigers’ record to 9-6-3 in what’s been a breakout season for the team. Maher’s goal was his first of two on the night. Owen Fontenot also scored two goals while Allen Dugas added another. Each also garnered an assist on the night.

“This game, for us, was all about team effort and heart,” said Maher. “We come out here and hustle our butts off. We struggled a little in the second half and needed to step it back up, and we did that.”

Maher and Chad Breaux are the lone seniors on this Tigers team, which has taken a large step forward after a 2020 season that began promising before a swoon late in the season. This year, the team began 4-0-1, and though it hit a lull after that, Hahnville has regained its form and is unbeaten in its past six matches – 4-0-2.

“I think we’re playing great ... there are a lot of young guys playing, and a couple of freshmen really stepping up,” Maher said. “Chad and I are the seniors and we’ve been trying to really step up our leadership.”

It was one of those freshmen, Fontenot, who took the ball once play began and raced up the sideline and sent a cross to Maher, who lofted the ball high and into the net to give his team a 1-0 lead.

“I got the ball right after kickoff, went up the sideline and played it inside ... (Maher) put it in the back of the net. That was a huge adreneline rush,” Fontenot said. “We wanted to start fast and attack them quick and we went for it right off the kickoff.”

Fontenot doubled the lead with a score of his own to make it 2-0, then added a third goal with four minutes remaining in the first half.

For a freshman experiencing his first

Hahnville/Destrehan rivalry clash, it was as strong a start as one could imagine.

“It was really big, to play in this one and score a couple,” Fontenot said. “I think we have a lot of guys here who have been playing together for awhile. Good friendships, staying positive with our teammates ... there’s just a good chemistry between players.”

Dugas earned a free kick in the ox,

which he booted through to make it a 4-0 advantage.

That score held until late in the second half, when Destrehan’s Max Laumann scored off a rebound in the box to cut the lead to 4-1. But the Tigers turned back two other golden opportunities to score for the Wildcats, who earned two separate free kicks in the box that Hahnville defended well and cleared out.

Just before time expired, Maher finished the night with the Tigers’ fifth and final goal.

Hahnville head coach Matt Oubre called Maher’s goal to start the match a huge momentum boost, and likewise the score to cap the match off a strong way to finish after the team had lost a little footing midway through the second half.

“I think we kept the pressure on from there, didn’t let up the whole half,” Oubre

said. “In the second half a little way in, we made some silly mistakes, some fouls, let Destrehan back into the game. So, it was good to see us finish with that goal. We had a lot of quality chances tonight and that was the difference.”

Oubre said the team’s downturn after its hot start – the Tigers lost four straight and five of six after an unbeaten start – was concerning, but that the team has answered the bell and is discovering itself as the season unfolds.

“We’re figuring out who we exactly are. We’re starting to see that when guys can play with speed and intensity, we’re doing well with that. We still have some tests coming up,” Oubre said.

For Destrehan, 2021 has been a rebuilding season. A team heavy on freshmen and sophomores has gone winless thus far, though the Wildcats showed their willingness to keep battling hard even when trailing significantly on Friday.

“We have an inexperienced team ... but we fight. We don’t give up,” said Destrehan head coach Jhovanny Santamaria. “That’s all I can ask, all I want from them. We’ve been down all year, but these guys never give up. They counter attack. They’re trying to score ... we had three chances tonight, two on dead balls. We’re still learning to put those balls in the net ... but they keep battling and playing.”

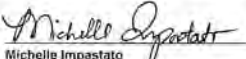

ORDINANCE NO. 22-1-1

An ordinance authorizing the issuance and sale of not exceeding Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000) of Hurricane Recovery Revenue Notes of the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana; and providing for other matters in connection therewith.

WHEREAS, the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana (the "Issuer") desires to incur debt and issue Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000) of Hurricane Recovery Revenue Notes (the "Notes"), in the manner authorized and provided by Section 1430 of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority (the "Act"), for the purpose of (i) paying any costs associated with debris removal or the demolition, rehabilitation, repair, reconstruction, renovation, restoration and improvement of the Issuer's facilities resulting from or related to Hurricane Ida, including purchasing any furnishings, fixtures and equipment incidental or necessary in connection therewith, and (ii) paying the costs of issuance of the Notes; and,

WHEREAS, the Notes shall be secured by and payable from a pledge of all funds or revenues received or to be received by the Issuer to the extent legally available for the payment of debt service on the Notes, provided that no such funds or revenues shall be so included which have been or are in the future legally dedicated and required for purposes inconsistent therewith by the electorate, by the terms of specific grants, by the terms of particular obligations issued or to be issued or by operation of law (such amount being the "Available Funds of the Issuer"); and,

WHEREAS, it is expressly provided that the full faith and credit of the Issuer shall

not be pledged, and there shall be no obligation on the Issuer to levy or increase taxes or other sources of revenue in order to pay debt service on the Notes or to transfer any funds for the payment of debt service that may result in a violation of any law, ruling, regulation, contract or agreement applicable to the Issuer; and,

WHEREAS, the Issuer has no outstanding notes or other obligations of any kind or nature payable from or enjoying a lien on the Available Funds of the Issuer herein pledged; and,

WHEREAS, the State Bond Commission approved the issuance of the Notes at its meeting on November 18, 2021; and,

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Issuer to fix the details necessary with respect to the issuance of the Notes and to provide for the authorization and issuance thereof; and,

WHEREAS, it is the further desire of the Issuer to provide for the sale of the Notes to the Lender (hereinafter defined) at the price and in the manner hereinafter provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the St. Charles Parish Council (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing authority of the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana, that:

SECTION 1. Definitions. The following terms as used in this Ordinance shall have the following respective meanings, such definitions being equally applicable to both the singular and plural sense of any of such terms.

"Act" means Section 1430 of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority.

"Additional Parity Notes" means any additional *pari passu* notes which may hereafter be issued on a parity with the Notes pursuant to Section 8 hereof.

"Agreement" means the agreement to be entered into between the Issuer and the Paying Agent pursuant to this Ordinance.

"Available Funds" means all funds or revenues received or to be received by the Issuer to the extent legally available for the payment of debt service on the Notes, provided that no such funds or revenues shall be so included which have been or are in the future legally dedicated and required for purposes inconsistent therewith by the electorate, by the terms of specific grants, by the terms of particular obligations issued or to be issued or by operation of law.

"Business Day" means a day of the year other than a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday for the Issuer.

"Costs of Issuance" means all items of expense, directly or indirectly payable or reimbursable and related to the authorization, sale and issuance of the Notes, including but not limited to printing costs, costs of preparation and reproduction of documents, filing and recording fees, initial fees and charges of any fiduciary, legal fees and charges, fees and disbursements of consultants and professionals, costs of credit ratings, fees and charges for preparation, execution, transportation and safekeeping of the Notes, costs and expenses of refunding, premiums for the insurance of the payment of the Notes, if any, and any other cost, charge or fee paid or payable by the Issuer in connection with the original issuance of Notes.

"Delivery Date" shall mean the date on which the Lender advances funds for the purchase of the Notes, which is anticipated to be [NOT LATER THAN FEBRUARY 1, 2022].

"Executive Officers" shall mean, collectively, the Parish President of the Issuer and the Secretary and Chair of the Governing Authority.

"Final Maturity" means January 1, 2032.

"Fiscal Year" means the one-year period commencing on January 1 of each year, or such other one-year period as may be designated by the Governing Authority as the fiscal year of the Issuer.

"Governing Authority" means the St. Charles Parish Council.

"Government Securities" means direct obligations of, or obligations the principal of and interest on which are unconditionally guaranteed by the United States of America, which are non-callable prior to their maturity, may be United States Treasury obligations, and may be in book-entry form.

"Interest Payment Date" means each January 1 and July 1 of each year the Notes are outstanding, commencing July 1, 2022.

"Issuer" means the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana.

"Lender" means Regions Commercial Equipment Finance, LLC, Birmingham, Alabama, the original purchaser of the Notes.

"Note" or "Notes" means any or all of the Issuer's Hurricane Recovery Revenue Notes, Series 2022A, authorized by this Ordinance, whether initially delivered or issued in exchange for, upon transfer of, or in lieu of any Note previously issued.

"Note Proceeds Fund" means the special fund of the Issuer to be known as the "Parish of St. Charles Hurricane Recovery Note Proceeds Fund" as created pursuant to Section 2 hereof.

"Note Register" means the records kept by the Paying Agent at its designated office in which registration of the Notes and transfers of the Notes shall be made as provided herein.

"Ordinance" means this ordinance authorizing the issuance of the Notes, as it may be supplemented and amended.

"Outstanding" when used with respect to Notes means, as of the date of determination, all Notes or portions thereof theretofore issued and delivered under this Ordinance, except:

- Notes theretofore canceled by the Paying Agent or delivered to the Paying Agent for cancellation;
- Notes in exchange for or in lieu of which other Notes have been registered and delivered pursuant to this Ordinance;
- Notes alleged to have been mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen which have been paid as provided in this Ordinance or by law; and
- Notes or portions thereof which have actually been paid or for the payment of the principal of and interest on which money or Government Securities or both are held in trust with the effect specified in this Ordinance.

"Owner" or "Owners" when used with respect to any Note means the Person in whose name such Note is registered in the Note Register.

"Paying Agent" means Regions Bank Corporate Trust Department, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, unless and until a successor Paying Agent shall have been appointed pursuant to the applicable provisions of this Ordinance, and thereafter "Paying Agent" shall mean such successor Paying Agent.

"Person" means any individual, corporation, partnership, joint venture, association, joint-stock company, trust, unincorporated organization or government or any agency or political subdivision thereof.

"Principal Payment Date" means January 1 of each year the Notes are Outstanding, commencing January 1, 2024.

"Record Date" for the interest payable on any Interest Payment Date means the 15th calendar day of the month next preceding such Interest Payment Date.

SECTION 2. Authorization of Notes; Maturities. In compliance with the terms and provisions of the Act, there is hereby authorized the incurring of an indebtedness of Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000) for, on behalf of, and in the name of the Issuer, for the purpose of (i) paying any costs associated with debris removal or the demolition, rehabilitation, repair, reconstruction, renovation, restoration and improvement of the Issuer's facilities resulting from or related to Hurricane Ida, including purchasing any furnishings, fixtures and equipment incidental or necessary in connection therewith, and (ii) paying the Costs of Issuance incurred in connection with the issuance thereof, and to represent said indebtedness, this Governing Authority does hereby authorize the issuance of Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000) of Hurricane Recovery Revenue Notes, Series 2022A, of the Issuer.

The Notes shall be initially issued in the form of a single, fully-registered Note numbered AR-1 in the principal amount of \$20,000,000 and shall be dated the Delivery Date. The purchase price shall equal the principal amount of the Notes and shall be advanced by the Lender to the Issuer on the Delivery Date of the Notes and deposited by the Issuer in a special fund of the Issuer to be known as the "Parish of St. Charles Hurricane Recovery Note Proceeds Fund," hereby created, which (a) shall be maintained with a designated depository of the Issuer, and (b) may be, but is not required to be, a separate bank account in the name of the Issuer. The Issuer, in its sole discretion, may choose to deposit additional funds in the Note Proceeds Fund; however, all funds on deposit in the Note Proceeds Fund shall be used solely for the purposes for which the Notes are being issued or for paying principal or interest due on the Notes.

The unpaid principal of the Notes shall bear interest at the interest rate of 3.15% per annum, calculated on the basis of a 360-day year consisting of twelve 30-day months. Interest on the Notes shall accrue from the Delivery Date or from the most recent Interest Payment Date to which interest has been paid or duly provided for and shall be payable on each Interest Payment Date.

The principal of the Notes shall mature in installments on each Principal Payment Date without necessity of notice in the years and in the principal amounts set forth below, subject to adjustment as set forth in Section 3 hereof:

To the extent not previously paid, all principal and interest shall become immediately due and payable by the Issuer to the Owner on the Final Maturity Date.

The installments of principal of the Notes, as they fall due, and interest on the Notes shall be payable by check of the Paying Agent mailed by said Paying Agent to the Owner (determined as of the close of business on the Record Date) at the address shown on the Note Register, except that the payment of the final principal installment on the Final Maturity Date or upon full prepayment shall be made upon presentment and surrender of the Notes to the Paying Agent. Each Note delivered under this Ordinance upon transfer of, in exchange for or in lieu of any other Note shall carry all the rights to interest accrued and unpaid, and to accrue, which were carried by such other Note, and each such Note shall bear interest (as herein set forth) so neither gain nor loss in interest

shall result from such transfer, exchange or substitution.

No Note shall be entitled to any right or benefit under this Ordinance, or be valid or obligatory for any purpose, unless there appears on such Note a certificate of registration, substantially in the form provided in this Ordinance, executed by the Paying Agent by manual signature.

SECTION 3. Prepayment Provisions.

(A) *Initial Optional Prepayment.* On January 1, 2024, the Outstanding principal of the Notes may be prepaid by the Issuer, in whole or in part, at the principal amount then Outstanding plus accrued interest to the date of prepayment. Any partial prepayment on January 1, 2024, shall be applied (i) first, to the principal and interest due on such date, and (ii) then, to reduce on a pro rata basis the remaining principal installments otherwise due pursuant to Section 2 hereof.

Official notice of such call of the Notes or any portion thereof for prepayment pursuant to this Section 3(A) shall be given by the Issuer to the Paying Agent by means

of (i) first class mail, postage prepaid, by notice deposited in the United States mails not less than five (5) days prior to the prepayment date or (ii) electronic transmission not later than five (5) days prior to the prepayment date, and the Paying Agent shall promptly provide notice to the Owners of any portion of the Notes. The Paying Agent shall simultaneously provide a new schedule of principal installments to be due on the Note to the Issuer and the Owners thereof.

(B) *Additional Optional Prepayment.* At any time after January 1, 2024, the Outstanding principal of the Notes may be prepaid by the Issuer, in whole or in part, at the principal amount then Outstanding plus accrued interest to the date of prepayment. Any partial prepayment shall be applied in inverse order of principal installments, unless otherwise consented to by the Owner.

Official notice of such call of any of the Notes or any portion thereof for optional prepayment pursuant to this Section 3(B) shall be given by the Paying Agent by means of (i) first class mail, postage prepaid, by notice deposited in the United States mails not less than five (5) days prior to the prepayment date or (ii) electronic transmission not later than five (5) days prior to the prepayment date.

(C) *Contingent Prepayment.* Any prepayment of the Notes or any portion thereof may be made expressly contingent upon the availability of funds therefor.

SECTION 4. Registration and Transfer. The Issuer shall cause the Note Register to be kept by the Paying Agent. The Notes may be transferred, registered and assigned only on the Note Register, which such registration shall be at the expense of the Issuer, and only by the execution of an assignment form on the Notes being transferred. A new Note or Notes, may, upon request, be delivered by the Paying Agent to the last assignee (the new Owner) in exchange for such transferred and assigned Note or Notes after receipt of the Note(s) to be transferred in proper form. Such new Note or Notes shall be in an authorized denomination of the same maturity and like principal. The Paying Agent shall not be required to issue, register the transfer of, or exchange any Note during a period beginning at the opening of business on a Record Date and ending at the close of business on the Interest Payment Date.

SECTION 5. Form of Notes. The Notes and the endorsements to appear thereon shall be in substantially the forms attached as Exhibit B hereto.

SECTION 6. Execution of Notes. The Notes shall be signed by the Executive Officers for, on behalf of, in the name of and under the corporate seal of the Issuer, which signatures and corporate seal may be either manual or facsimile.

SECTION 7. Pledge and Dedication of Revenues. Pursuant to the Act, the Notes shall be secured by and payable from a pledge and dedication of the Available Funds of the Issuer, and there is hereby irrevocably pledged and dedicated to the payment of the Notes an amount of such Available Funds sufficient to pay the same in principal and interest as they respectively mature. Until the Notes shall have been paid in full in principal and interest, this Governing Authority does hereby obligate the Issuer, itself, and its successors in office to budget annually a sum of money sufficient to pay the Notes and the interest thereon as they respectively mature, including any principal and/or interest theretofore matured and then unpaid, and to levy and collect in each year taxes and to collect other revenues within the limits prescribed by law, sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Notes. Pursuant to Section 1430.1 of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, the pledge of the Available Funds provided for herein shall be valid, binding, and perfected from the time when the pledge is made, and any Available Funds so pledged and hereafter received by the Issuer or any fiduciary shall immediately be subject to the lien of such pledge and security interest without any physical delivery thereof or further act.

SECTION 8. Additional Parity Notes. The Issuer shall issue no other notes or obligations of any kind or nature payable from or enjoying a lien on the revenues of the Available Funds having priority over or parity with the Notes, except that Additional Parity Notes may hereafter be issued on a parity with the Notes under any of the following conditions:

- (1) The Notes herein authorized or any part thereof, including the interest thereon, may be refunded, and the refunding notes so issued shall enjoy complete equality of lien with the portion of the Notes which is not refunded, if there be any, and the refunding notes shall continue to enjoy whatever priority of lien over subsequent issues may have been enjoyed by the Notes refunded; provided, however, that if only a portion of the Notes outstanding is so refunded and the refunding notes require total principal and interest payments during any year in excess of the principal and interest which would have been required in such year to pay the Notes refunded thereby, then such Notes may not be refunded without the consent of the Owner of the unrefunded portion of the Notes issued hereunder (provided such consent shall not be required if such refunding notes meet the requirements set forth in clause 2 of this Section).
- (2) Additional Parity Notes may be issued on a parity with the Notes with respect to the Available Funds of the Issuer, provided that the estimated Available Funds of the Issuer in the year in which such Additional Parity Notes are issued are at least 2 times the highest amount of combined principal and interest requirements on the Notes and the Additional Parity Notes in any future year, the Issuer is in full compliance with all covenants and undertakings in connection with the Notes, and the Issuer is not currently delinquent with respect to any payments required to be made in connection therewith.
- (3) The Issuer is expressly authorized to issue one or more series of additional hurricane recovery revenue notes as Additional Parity Notes on a parity with the Notes provided that such notes are issued for the same purpose as the Notes and do not exceed a cumulative principal amount (excluding the Notes) of \$30,000,000.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Issuer may without restriction enter into additional obligations or issue other notes secured by a separately-identified source or sources of revenues that comprise a portion of the Available Funds. Junior and subordinate notes may be issued without restriction.

SECTION 9. Sinking Fund. For the payment of the principal of and the interest on the Notes, there is hereby created a special fund known as "Hurricane Recovery Revenue Notes (2022A) Sinking Fund," said Sinking Fund to be established and maintained with the Paying Agent or the regularly designated fiscal agent bank of the Issuer. The Issuer shall deposit in the Sinking Fund at least two (2) days in advance of the date on which each payment of principal and/or interest on the Notes falls due, funds fully sufficient to promptly pay the maturing principal and/or interest so falling due on such date; provided, however, that if the Issuer does not possess sufficient Available Funds at the time such deposit is required, the Issuer shall (a) deposit all Available Funds it does possess at such time on a *pro rata* basis to the credit of the Sinking Fund and any sinking fund established for the payment of any Additional Parity Notes, and (b) thereafter deposit on a *pro rata* basis to the Sinking Fund and any sinking fund established for the payment of any Additional Parity Notes any and all Available Funds received in the future to the extent necessary to cure such insufficiency. The depository for the Sinking Fund shall transfer from the Sinking Fund to the Paying Agent funds fully sufficient to pay promptly the principal and interest falling due on the Notes on such date.

It shall be specifically understood and agreed, however, and this provision shall be a part of this contract, that after the funds have been budgeted out of the Available Funds for any year sufficient to pay the principal and interest on the Notes and any Additional Parity Notes for that period, then any Available Funds remaining in that year shall be free for expenditure by the Issuer for any lawful purpose.

All moneys deposited with the regularly designated fiscal agent bank or banks of the Issuer or the Paying Agent under the terms of this Ordinance shall constitute sacred funds for the benefit of the Owners of the Notes and shall be secured by said fiduciaries at all times to the full extent thereof in the manner required by law for the securing of deposits of public funds.

All or any part of the moneys in the Sinking Fund shall, at the written request of the Issuer, be invested in accordance with the provisions of the laws of the State of Louisiana.

SECTION 10. Default. Upon the Issuer's (i) failure to timely make any payment due hereunder, or (ii) breach or violation of any covenant contained herein, which breach or violation shall continue for a period of thirty (30) days following written notice thereof from either the Paying Agent or the Owners of a majority of the Outstanding principal amount of the Notes (provided, however, that if such breach or violation is of a type that cannot reasonably be cured within said 30-day period, then such period shall be continued until the earliest such date as such breach or violation may reasonably be cured), then any Owner of such bonds or any trustee appointed to represent such Owners as hereinafter provided, shall be authorized to exercise any remedy afforded such person by law, and further provided that the unpaid principal of the Notes shall thereafter bear interest at the interest rate set forth in Section 2 hereof plus 300 basis points, not to exceed the maximum rate allowed by the laws of the State of Louisiana.

SECTION 11. Application of Proceeds. The Executive Officers are hereby empowered, authorized and directed to do any and all things necessary and incidental to carry out all of the provisions of this Ordinance, to cause the necessary Notes to be printed, to issue, execute and seal the Notes, and to effect delivery thereof as hereinafter provided. The proceeds derived from the sale of the Notes shall be used only for the purpose for which the Notes are issued.

SECTION 12. Notes Legal Obligations. The Notes shall constitute legal, binding and valid obligations of the Issuer and shall be the only representations of the indebtedness as herein authorized and created.

SECTION 13. Ordinance a Contract. The provisions of this Ordinance shall constitute a contract between the Issuer, or its successor, and the Owner or Owners from time to time of the Notes, and any such Owner or Owners may at law or in equity, by suit,

action, mandamus or other proceedings, enforce and compel the performance of all duties required to be performed by this Governing Authority or the Issuer as a result of issuing the Notes.

No material modification or amendment of this Ordinance, or of any Ordinance amendatory hereof or supplemental hereto, may be made without the consent in writing of the Owners of two-thirds (2/3) of the aggregate principal amount of the Notes then Outstanding; provided, however, that no modification or amendment shall permit a change in the maturity provisions of the Notes, or a reduction in the rate of interest thereon, or in the amount of the principal obligation thereof, or affecting the obligation of the Issuer to pay the principal of and the interest on the Notes as the same shall come due from the revenues appropriated, pledged and dedicated to the payment thereof by this Ordinance, or reduce the percentage of the Owners required to consent to any material modification or amendment of this Ordinance, without the consent of the Owners of all of the Outstanding Notes.

SECTION 14. Severability: Application of Subsequently Enacted Laws. In case any one or more of the provisions of this Ordinance or of the Notes shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions of this Ordinance or of the Notes, but this Ordinance and the Notes shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provisions had not been contained therein. Any constitutional or statutory provisions enacted after the date of this Ordinance which validate or make legal any provision of this Ordinance and/or the Notes which would not otherwise be valid or legal, shall be deemed to apply to this Ordinance and to the Notes.

SECTION 15. Recital of Regularity. This Governing Authority having investigated the regularity of the proceedings had in connection with the Notes and having determined the same to be regular, the Notes shall contain the following recital, to-wit:

"It is certified that this Note is authorized by and is issued in conformity with the requirements of the Constitution and statutes of the State of Louisiana."

SECTION 16. Effect of Registration. The Issuer, the Paying Agent, and any agent of either of them may treat the Owner in whose name any Note is registered as the Owner of such Note for the purpose of receiving payment of the principal of and interest on such Note and for all other purposes whatsoever, and to the extent permitted by law, neither the Issuer, the Paying Agent, nor any agent of either of them shall be affected by notice to the contrary.

SECTION 17. Notices to Owners. Wherever this Ordinance provides for notice to Owners of Notes of any event, such notice shall be sufficiently given (unless otherwise herein expressly provided) if in writing and mailed, first-class postage prepaid, to each Owner of such Notes, at the address of such Owner as it appears in the Note Register. In any case where notice to Owners of Notes is given by mail, neither the failure to mail such notice to any particular Owner of Notes, nor any defect in any notice so mailed, shall affect the sufficiency of such notice with respect to all other Notes. Where this Ordinance provides for notice in any manner, such notice may be waived in writing by the Owner or Owners entitled to receive such notice, either before or after the event, and such waiver shall be the equivalent of such notice. Waivers of notice by Owners shall be filed with the Paying Agent, but such filing shall not be a condition precedent to the validity of any action taken in reliance upon such waiver.

SECTION 18. Cancellation of Notes. All Notes surrendered for payment, transfer, exchange or replacement, if surrendered to the Paying Agent, shall be promptly canceled by it and, if surrendered to the Issuer, shall be delivered to the Paying Agent and, if not already canceled, shall be promptly canceled by the Paying Agent. The Issuer may at any time deliver to the Paying Agent for cancellation any Notes previously registered and delivered which the Issuer may have acquired in any manner whatsoever, and all Notes so delivered shall be promptly canceled by the Paying Agent. All canceled Notes held by the Paying Agent shall be disposed of as directed in writing by the Issuer.

SECTION 19. Mutilated, Destroyed, Lost or Stolen Notes. If (1) any mutilated Note is surrendered to the Paying Agent, or the Issuer and the Paying Agent receive evidence to their satisfaction of the destruction, loss or theft of any Note, and (2) there is delivered to the Issuer and the Paying Agent such security or indemnity as may be required by them to save each of them harmless, then, in the absence of notice to the Issuer or the Paying Agent that such Note has been acquired by a bona fide purchaser, the Issuer shall execute, and upon its request the Paying Agent shall register and deliver, in exchange for or in lieu of any such mutilated, destroyed, lost, or stolen Note, a new Note of the same maturity and of like tenor, interest rate and principal amount, bearing a number not contemporaneously outstanding. In case any such mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen Note has become or is about to become due and payable, the Issuer in its discretion may, instead of issuing a new Note, pay such Note. Upon the issuance of any new Note under this Section, the Issuer may require the payment by the Owner of a sum sufficient to cover any tax or other governmental charge that may be imposed in relation thereto and any other expenses (including the fees and expenses of the Paying Agent) connected therewith. Every new Note issued pursuant to this Section in lieu of any mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen note shall constitute a replacement of the prior obligation of the Issuer, whether or not the mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen Note shall be at any time enforceable by anyone and shall be entitled to all the benefits of this Ordinance equally and ratably with all other Outstanding Notes. Any additional procedures set forth in the Agreement, authorized in this Ordinance, shall also be available with respect to mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen Notes. The provisions of this Section are exclusive and shall preclude (to the extent lawful) all other rights and remedies with respect to the replacement and payment of mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen Notes.

SECTION 20. Discharge of Ordinance; Defeasance. If the Issuer shall pay or cause to be paid, or there shall otherwise be paid to the Owners of all of the Notes, the principal of and interest on the Notes, at the times and in the manner stipulated in this Ordinance, then the pledge of the money, securities, and funds pledged under this Ordinance and all covenants, agreements, and other obligations of the Issuer to the Owner shall thereupon cease, terminate, and become void and be discharged and satisfied, and the Paying Agent shall pay over or deliver all money held by it under this Ordinance to the Issuer.

Notes or interest installments for the payment of which money shall have been set aside and shall be held in trust (through deposit by the Issuer of funds for such payment or otherwise) at the maturity date thereof shall be deemed to have been paid within the meaning and with the effect expressed above in this Section if they are defeased in the manner provided by Chapter 14 of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended.

SECTION 21. Successor Paying Agent; Paying Agent Agreement. The Issuer will at all times maintain a Paying Agent meeting the qualifications hereinafter described for the performance of the duties hereunder for the Notes. The designation of the initial Paying Agent in this Ordinance is hereby confirmed and approved. The Issuer reserves the right to appoint a successor Paying Agent by (a) filing with the Person then performing such function a certified copy of a resolution or ordinance giving notice of the termination of the Agreement and appointing a successor and (b) causing notice to be given to each Owner. Every Paying Agent appointed hereunder shall at all times be a bank or trust company organized and doing business under the laws of the United States of America or of any state, authorized under such laws to exercise trust powers, and subject to supervision or examination by Federal or State authority. The Executive Officers are hereby authorized and directed to execute an appropriate Agreement with the Paying Agent for and on behalf of the Issuer in such form as may be satisfactory to said officers, the signatures of said officers on such Agreement to be conclusive evidence of the due exercise of the authority granted hereunder.

SECTION 22. Disclosure Under SEC Rule 15c2-12. The Issuer will not be required to comply with the continuing disclosure requirements described in Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission [17 CFR §240.15c2-12].

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Issuer expressly agrees to provide to the Lender, or if the Lender is not the Owner of 100% of the Outstanding Notes, then to the Paying Agent:

(A) Its audited financial statements within 210 days after the end of each Fiscal Year, unless a later time for completion has been granted to the Issuer by the Louisiana Legislative Auditor, then when accepted by the Louisiana Legislative Auditor; and

(B) Its annual budget within 30 days of adoption.

The Issuer further agrees to report and post any payment default with respect to the Notes on the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board's EMMA website.

SECTION 23. Publication. A copy of this Ordinance shall be published immediately after its adoption in one issue of the official journal of the Issuer; however, it shall not be necessary to publish any exhibits hereto if the same are available for public inspection and such fact is stated in the publication.

SECTION 24. Award of Notes. The Issuer hereby accepts the offer of the Lender for the Notes, which offer is contained in the term sheet attached as **Exhibit A** hereto, and any Executive Officer is hereby authorized and directed to execute said offer on behalf of the Issuer. As a condition to the delivery of the Notes to the Lender, the Lender will execute a standard letter, acceptable to it and the Issuer, indicating it has conducted its own analysis with respect to the Notes and is extending credit in the form of the Notes as a vehicle for making a commercial loan to the Issuer.

It is expressly noted that the principal amount of the Notes authorized hereunder is less than the maximum principal amount authorized by the term sheet attached as **Exhibit A** hereto.

SECTION 25. Execution of Documents. In connection with the issuance and sale of the Notes, the Executive Officers and the Finance Director are each authorized, empowered and directed to execute on behalf of the Issuer such documents, certificates and instruments as they may deem necessary, upon the advice of bond counsel, to effect the transactions contemplated by this Ordinance, the signatures of the Executive Officers and Finance Director on such documents, certificates and instruments to be conclusive evidence of the due exercise of the authority granted hereunder.

SECTION 26. Headings. The headings of the various sections hereof are inserted for convenience of reference only and shall not control or affect the meaning or construction of any of the provisions hereof.

SECTION 27. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective on the earliest date allowed by the Issuer's Home Rule Charter.

WHEREAS, the streets of Kinler and Paul Frederick between Hackberry Street and Brooklyn Street have experienced street and property flooding over the past two years; and,

WHEREAS, the repeated flooding of these two streets has also damaged the asphalt roadway surfaces, resulting in numerous potholes, base failures and ditch bank failures; and,

WHEREAS, St. Charles Parish Administration desires to repair the existing roadway and upgrade the drainage infrastructure caused by the repeated flooding issues; and,

WHEREAS, the Professional Services Agreement between St. Charles Parish and EJES Inc., describes the details of the proposed services and compensation.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and effective as of the ____ day of _____, 2022 by and between ST. CHARLES PARISH acting herein by and through its President, who is duly authorized to act on behalf of said Parish, hereinafter called the OWNER, and EJES, INC., a corporation and/or limited liability company acting herein by and through its Contracting Officer, hereinafter called CONSULTANT, duly authorized by corporate resolution or certificate of authority attached hereto and made a part hereof. Whereas the Owner desires to employ a professional consulting firm to perform consulting work and services for KINLER AND PAUL FREDERICK ROADWAY AND DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS Project No. (P210704) as described in Ordinance No. 22-1-2 which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

1.0 GENERAL TERMS

The Owner agrees to employ the Consultant and the Consultant agrees to perform professional services required for the project described above. Consultant will conform to the requirements of the Owner and to the standards of the agencies participating with the Owner in the Project. The Consultant will coordinate all work between the Owner and all participating agencies and regulating agencies, if needed. Written authorization to begin different phases of the project will be given to the Consultant by the Owner, including Conceptual, Preliminary Design, Final Design, Bidding Assistance and Construction and Services. The Owner may terminate the Contract by written notification and without cause per Section 11.0 during any phase of the project.

The Consultant shall at all times during this Agreement maintain a valid Louisiana Consulting License and any other applicable licenses necessary for performance of the Project.

All work shall be under the direction of the Owner, and all plans, specifications, etc. shall be submitted to the Owner and all approvals and administration of this contract shall be through the Owner.

2.0 PROJECT

2.1 The Owner hereby contracts with the CONSULTANT to perform all necessary professional services in connection with the project as defined as follows:

KINLER AND PAUL FREDERICK
ROADWAY AND DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS
Project No. (P210704)

2.2 The Project consist of the scope of services and work as defined in Attachment "A" hereto.

2.3 Consultant shall perform all scope of services and work in accordance with the Schedule as defined in Attachment "B" hereto unless otherwise mutually agreed upon by the parties in writing.

2.4 The Consultant agrees to comply with all Federal, State, and Local Laws and Ordinances applicable to the scope of services and work or in entering any other agreement with any another party to complete the work.

3.0 SERVICES OF CONSULTANT

3.1 Consultant shall provide Owner professional work and services in all phases of the Project to which this Agreement applies and as hereinafter provided to properly plan and execute the work on the project(s) assigned to the Consultant. These services may include but may not be limited to serving as Owner's professional consulting representative for the Project, providing professional consultation and advice, and furnishing customary civil, surveying, geotechnical, structural, mechanical, electrical, instrumentation and control consulting services and construction consulting and inspection.

3.2 Services provided by the Consultant shall be performed in accordance with generally accepted professional consulting practice at the time and the place where the services are rendered.

3.3 Consultant shall obtain from Owner authorization to proceed in writing for each phase of the Project.

3.4 Consultant shall provide minutes of all meetings with St. Charles Parish regarding any phase of the Project.

3.5 Consultant shall provide work and services to complete the project, including all necessary services described herein or usually implied as a prerequisite for the performance of the services whether or not specifically mentioned in this agreement, including attendance by the Consultant at project conferences and public hearings.

3.6 The Phases of the Project are as defined in Attachment "A".

4.0 OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

- 4.1 Documents including but not limited to plans, specifications, maps, basic survey notes, sketches, charts, computations and all other data prepared or obtained under the terms of this authorization shall become the property of the Owner and shall be made available for Owner’s inspection at any time during the Project and, shall be delivered to the Owner prior to termination or final completion of the Contract.
- 4.2 Consultant may retain a set of documents for its files.
- 4.3 Reuse of Documents. Any reuse of documents or materials without written authorization or adaptation by Consultant to the specific purpose intended will be at Owner’s sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Consultant or to Consultant’s independent professional associates, subcontractors, and consultants.
- 4.4 No materials, to include but not limited to reports, maps or other documents produced as a result of this Contract, in whole or in part, shall be available to Consultant for copyright purposes. Any such materials produced as a result of this Contract that might be subject to copyright shall be the property of the Owner and all such rights shall belong to the Owner, and the Owner shall be sole and exclusive entity who may exercise such rights.

5.0 SUPPLEMENTARY SERVICES

The Consultant shall provide, when requested in writing by the Owner, supplementary services not included in the basic work and services.

The compensation to the Consultant for the supplemental services, when performed by the Consultant, shall be in the form of a lump sum, billable hours, or “not to exceed” hourly rate which is mutually agreeable to the Owner and the Consultant in writing.

Such supplementary services may include the following:

- A. Soil investigations
- B. Laboratory inspection of materials and equipment
- C. Right-of-Way, easement and property acquisition surveys, plats, maps and documents
- D. Any major revisions for which the Consultant is not responsible, that are authorized by the Owner after the completion and approval of either the preliminary or final plans and specifications
- E. Services concerning replacement of any work damaged by fire or other causes during construction
- F. Services made necessary by the default of the contractor in the performance of the construction contract
- G. Services as an expert witness in connection with court proceedings
- H. Traffic consulting if necessary
- I. Topographic Survey
- J. Preparation of Environmental Assessment documents and/or Environmental Permits
- K. If all or part of the work is to be financed by a Federal or State Grant, the Consultant shall assist the Owner in the preparation of the Grant application and with the Grant Administration, unless otherwise specifically agreed upon previously herein.

6.0 DEFECTIVE WORK

During such visits and on the basis of such observations, Consultant may disapprove or reject Contractor's work while it is in progress if Consultant believes that such work will not produce a completed Project that conforms generally to the Contract Documents or that it will prejudice the integrity of the design concept of the Project as reflected in the Contract Documents

7.0 NOTICE TO PROCEED

The Owner shall notify the Consultant in writing to undertake the services stated in this Agreement, and the Consultant shall commence the services within ten (10) days after receipt of such notification.

If the Owner desires to divide the Project into various parts, a Notice to Proceed shall be issued for each part, and the Owner and the Consultant shall mutually agree upon the period of time within which services for each part of the Project shall be performed.

The Consultant will be given time extensions for delays beyond their control or for those caused by tardy approvals of work in progress by various official agencies, but no additional compensation shall be allowed for such delays.

8.0 PAYMENTS

- 8.1 Owner shall pay Consultant for the performance of work and services as outlined in Attachment “C” to this Agreement.
- 8.2 Payment for Consultant work and services on projects that do not require construction services, such as feasibility studies or drainage studies, shall be made based upon Consultant’s estimate of the proportion of the services actually completed at the time of billing and shall be made in partial payments at monthly intervals.
- 8.3 If the Project, or any portion thereof, is not completed for any reason, the final fee for consulting work and services shall be negotiated between Owner and Contractor. If the final fee for work and services is not mutually agreed upon, either party may elect in writing to submit the dispute to mediation. If mediation is not mutually agreed upon, written notice will be submitted to the other party of the intent to submit the dispute to the 29th Judicial District Court of St. Charles Parish, State of Louisiana.
- 8.4 If authorized in writing by Owner, for the performance of, or for obtaining from others Additional Services which are not considered normal or customary consulting, the Owner shall pay Consultant based on monthly invoices submitted by the Consultant, within sixty (60) days of receipt of Consultant’s invoice. Consultant shall provide written notice to Owner when no services or work have been performed during a given month.
- 8.5 For Additional Authorized Services provided by the Consultant such as, but not limited to, wetlands permitting, land and right-of-way acquisition, surveying, NPDES and LADEQ permit renewal or acquisition work, etc. Owner shall pay Consultant based on an agreed upon hourly rate(s) between the Owner and Consultant. Payment shall be not-to-exceed based on hourly rates and actual hours worked.
- 8.6 The following documentation shall be required for payment to Consultant and shall be attached to the monthly invoice.

a. A copy of the Owner’s written authorization to perform the service.

b. Timesheets for all hours invoiced.

c. Invoice copies, logs or other substantiation of non-salary expenses.
- 8.7 For Additional Authorized Services that Consultant acquires from subcontractors and/or subconsultants, Owner shall pay Consultant a fixed sum previously agreed upon by Owner and Consultant, such sum to be established in each case when the scope of the work involved has been determined and before any of the Additional Services are provided. The use of subcontractors and/or subconsultants shall be subject to the provisions set forth in this Agreement. The following documentation shall be required for payment to Consultant and shall be attached to the monthly invoice:

a. A copy of the Owner’s written consent for the subcontractor and/or subconsultant to perform the service stating the Owner’s and Consultant’s agreed upon fixed sum established for the service performed.

b. Evidence that the subcontractor and/or subconsultant is insured as required by this Agreement.
- 8.8 For *Supplementary Services* described in Section 5, Owner shall pay Consultant for the fee negotiated at the time the work is assigned by the method stipulated in the contract amendment.

9.0 BUDGET LIMITATIONS

The construction budget for this Project shall be determined by the Owner, and the Consultant shall be advised of the budget limitation in writing by the Owner and the Consultant shall indicate his acceptance of same in writing to the Owner. Any subsequent budget revisions shall be confirmed in writing.

If, at the completion of the Preliminary or Design Phase, the Consultant does not concur with the construction budget, he shall so notify the Owner, and the Consultant and Owner shall mutually agree on a revised construction budget prior to any work on the Design Phase.

If no bid is received within the budget limitation and a redesign of the project if required by the Owner, such redesign shall be accomplished by the Consultant at no additional cost to the Owner, provided, however, if the receipt of bids is, for any reason, delayed beyond a period of six (6) months from the date of the completion of the Design Phase the amount stated as the construction budget shall be adjusted, immediately prior to the time bids are received, by use of a construction cost index acceptable to both parties of this agreement.

10.0 FUNDS

No work shall be authorized until funds are established for each individual task.

11.0 TERMINATION OR SUSPENSION

- 11.1 This Agreement may be terminated for any reason by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice.

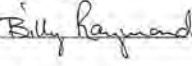

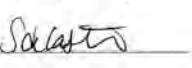
