Destrehan native, family of seven loses home to fire

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It could have been far worse for Zephhan Rochelle, yet nothing about his current situation is easy.

On Feb. 19 and at approximately 1 a.m., the Franklinton home of Rochelle and girlfriend Misti Knight caught fire, and would soon be completely consumed by flame. There were nine people inside the residence at the time, including the couple's five children, two friends sleeping over and two pet dogs.

Rochelle and Knight cleared out the residence after becoming aware of the fire, which investigators indicated may have started from the home's fireplace.

St. Gertrude the Great remains open despite huge hurdles

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As places all around St. Charles Parish struggle to find their pre-Hurricane Ida footing, St. Gertrude the Great Catholic Church is no exception. Church attendance has never rebounded from COVID-related closings, and the extreme damage the church buildings and grounds sustained during Hurricane Ida means the Des Allemands place of worship is still without

running water or electricity.

“We do the best we can and we take it week by week,” Father Ray Hymel, the current pastor of St. Gertude, said.

Each week an average of 60 people faithfully show up to the church for services, despite any

Destrehan soybean plant set to increase capacity in renewable fuels deal

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A joint venture between Chevron and Bunge – set to create renewable feedstocks leveraging Bunge’s expertise in oilseed processing and Chevron’s expertise in fuels manufacturing and marketing – will increase capacity at the Bunge’s soybean processing plant in Destrehan.



The company’s Cairo, Illinois plant will also contribute to the venture, with Chevron contributing approximately \$600 million in cash to the project. Plans include approximately doubling the combined capacity of these facilities from 7,000 tons per day by the end of 2024.

The joint venture may also explore opportunities in other renewable feedstocks, as well as in feedstock pretreatment.

“Partnering with Chevron, a global leader in energy, is a significant step forward in building the capability to make

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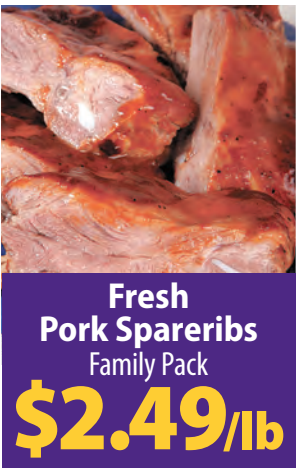
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Residents thrilled to have Mardi Gras parades back in St. Charles

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The music blasted through the air, the dancing was contagious, the colorful throws and costumes unmistakable.

The Carnival was back in Luling. The strong attendance at Saturday’s Krewe of Lul Parade – and a day later as the Krewe of Des Allemands rolled through its namesake – showed residents were more than ready for the good times to roll once more, two years after the last time.



“We’re enjoying ourselves. It’s a beautiful day, there are beautiful women, some wonderful floats and it’s just a great day to come out here and enjoy ourselves,” said James Smith of Luling. “It’s sure nice that it’s back, and everyone’s out here enjoying it.”

The COVID-19 pandemic necessitated the shutdown of last year’s parades in St. Charles Parish, as a rising number of cases led decision makers to discretion. And

the Krewes were missed. “Of course, we understood the situation, under the circumstances,” said Dina Zeevi of Luling. “It really just adds to it this year. It’s like double joy, to have it back and be a part of it all as a spectator. You celebrate the workmanship that goes into making these floats and how they look, the joy of catching the throws. It’s all great.”

There was one common refrain from the parade-goers as to why the event is so popular. “This is a family celebration,” Zeevi said. “It’s always been that way, a family-friendly event, and it’s always a good time. It’s a great crowd, a great experience, and I’m so happy to have that energy back.”

Said Salvador Calcagno of Des Allemands, “Everybody knows each other. Everyone behaves themselves and we all have a good time. We’ve really missed this over the past two years, because of the pandemic, but we’re able to come back together now. I’ve been really looking forward to it.”

Calcagno has been attending the parade since moving to the area in 2005, and said he loves seeing what different kinds of floats and themes will be featured each year.

Others have different tastes. “There aren’t many motorcycles this year, but that’s



usually my favorite,” Smith said. “I love the trucks, the stuff like that.”

There were plenty of the latter at Lul, and much more. Royalty, floats, festival queens, dance teams, EMS, police and fire departments, parish officials, the Hahnville High ROTC, band, Hi-Steppers and cheerleaders and other marching groups were among those featured at Lul.

Some of the float themes included Ghostbusters, complete with Slimer adorning the front and Mr. Stay Puft manning the side, the Zoo Krewe (Audubon goes Hollywood), a Joe Burrow – or “Burreaux” for the home flavor – tribute, Superheroes with Supergirl, Wonder Woman and the Incredibles among the featured, Safari Krewe, Luling Luau, the New Orleans Saints and St. Charles Parish Strong.

What awaited the drivers and occupants of the processional cars were dozens of students and teachers standing outside in solidarity.

“A lot of them were wearing pink – Kellie’s favorite color,” Kerry said. “There was a ‘We love you Kellie’ sign out front ... it was something to see. It was a lot more than what we were expecting. There was nothing but tears in the cars going by ... it was a great send-off for her ... a final trip to her school.”

Kellie Fletcher Growl died on Feb. 15 at the age of 40. She was a native of Kenner and resident of Luling. She taught for 17 years in the St. Charles Parish School System and most of her teaching years were at Luling Elementary- a place very close to her heart. She leaves behind two children – Gavin and Grace.

Growl fought cancer for the past eight and a half years. She was originally diagnosed in August 2013 with Stage 3b ocular (uveal) melanoma, which is melanoma of the eye’s iris.

“That cancer has a life expectancy of two to three years, and she went eight and a half,” Kerry said. “She was a tough little girl ... tougher than we realized.”

Kerry and his wife Kathy Fletcher said their daughter Kellie was a beautiful child that grew up to be an amazing woman.

“After reading all the tributes and hearing all the stories about Kellie from her family, friends, co-workers and especially her former students, it made us so proud to see how many lives she touched and impacted,” Kerry said. “Kellie’s request was in lieu of flowers, school supplies be donated and the response was tremendous. We were able to fill 54 donated backpacks with numerous assorted school supplies and still have an extremely large amount of supplies that will also be donated to Luling Elementary School – which she was proud to be a part of.”

Kellie’s husband Richard Growl thanked the community for supporting his wife and family during her cancer battle.

“I will say ... I’ve told my family and my children we actually have gotten to witness a true miracle happen right before our eyes with the tremendous outpouring of support this community has shown to us,” he said. “I have plenty

more to say, and plenty people to thank, but I just cannot do it at this time and for that I’m sorry. I just can’t find the words ... that was Kellie’s thing. Thank you all and much love to you all.”

Kellie’s friend Robyn Caillouet Growl said she couldn’t think of a better tribute to Kellie than the school supply drive done at her funeral.

“Kellie every year would buy school supplies for her students who didn’t have them,” she said. “She went to teacher orientation this school year ... her intent was to teach. She was anxious to get back in the classroom.”

Robyn Tregre, Kellie’s sister-in-law, added that Kellie’s love for her students was “immeasurable.”

“Kellie was one of kind. At Luling

Elementary, she was more than an awesome teacher ... she was also a leader,” Dana Dufrene, Kellie’s friend who also taught with her at Luling Elementary, said. “Some of the roles she had were the New Teacher Lead Mentor, a leader of Faculty Fitness, a mentor of the LES Running Club, an active participant on multiple committees to support our School Improvement Plan. Note that these roles were while she was battling cancer. She walked around with unwavering faith that she was here for a reason and that she would fight and endure whatever it took to continue being a mother, wife, daughter, teacher and friend.”

Dufrene said Kellie was a walking miracle at Luling Elementary and

an inspiration to the entire school community.

“I thought I was special to Kellie, but I now know that everyone was special to Kellie Growl,” she said. “She made others feel like they meant the world to her, because they actually did. She baked cakes for others, sent school supplies to new teachers, bought numerous gifts for others, wrote encouraging notes, met for dinners, made time to listen to others and offered well organized solutions to help with problems.”

Danny Fletcher, one of Kellie’s brothers, said Kellie was an inspiration to everyone.

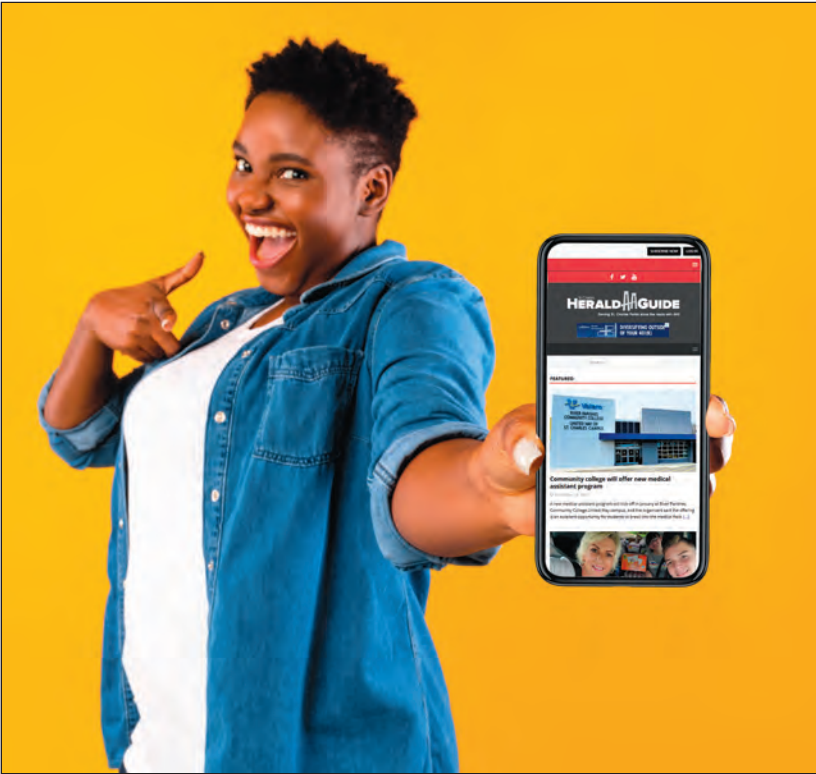
“Throughout her fight, she never let it stop her from focusing on helping others,” he said. “The support her family received the last few weeks has been wonderful. The donations of school supplies, and the comments from those that she has touched, have been amazing to read. Kellie was a true hero.”

Darryl Fletcher, another of Kellie’s brothers, said his sister leaves behind an amazing legacy.

“Kellie grew up with three older brothers who were supposed to be strong and protect her,” he said. “What we learned during her courageous battle the last eight plus years, is that she was stronger than all of her brothers. Stronger in her faith. Stronger in her kindness to others. Stronger in her fight.”

To honor their daughter, the Fletchers have setup the Kellie Fletcher Growl Scholarship Fund. Kerry said the fund will be used to help current and former Luling Elementary students who are dealing with family hardships.

Southern University, Rochelle and his family are starting over.

“I think they’re still getting over the shock of everything,” said Paige Rochelle, Zephan’s sister. “Beyond that, you’re also still trying to figure out even where to begin, what’s important ... and then you’re finding a place to call home again. You’ve lost all of your things, and a lot of important things among them, and how do you get it back? It’s a long process.”

That process is lengthened when the possessions of seven people are lost along with a home.

“All of their clothes, their shoes, and things you don’t even think about like bookbags or other things for school ... you’re doing all of that while trying to go back to work again. It’s not the easiest thing to have to take care of all at once,” Paige said.

It was also more than just a house for Knight – she grew up in that house, later returning to it to make a home for herself and her four sons.

Her siblings created a GoFundMe page (titled House fire and family in need) to raise money to help the family. Paige noted the Rochelle family has also been doing the same through Venmo and said anyone donating through either method would be helping a great deal. As of Monday, the GoFundMe had raised nearly \$4,000.

“I think they’re doing better now (emotionally),” Paige said. “Especially with how many people have stepped up so far to help them, I know that means a lot to them. That’s got them in a better spot, now. It’s just going to take time.”

While the road to normalcy in a new home may be a long one, things did break right for the family in the most critical way. With the fire breaking out in the early morning hours, there was no guarantee anyone – let alone everyone – would be able to make it out.

“The two of them saved everyone,” Paige said. “The stuff, the house, those can be replaced, but (the family) can’t be.”

She added the situation might raise awareness of what can happen when the seasons change and potentially create a fire hazard most people don’t consider, one that can be guarded against by cleaning

the fireplace and chimney.

Moisture and creosote travel up a chimney as heat and smoke rise. In very cold weather, those things cool and build up on the inside of a chimney and decrease its efficiency. When those by-products are ignited, they can cause a chimney to overheat and fail – and that can cause a fire.

“After all of this happened, I saw some other news reports about house fires, and they said with the weather changing and the cool air that this can happen,” Paige said. “And that not cleaning your chimney can lead to a house fire. We’re not sure if that’s what happened to them, but it’s something to consider that most people don’t think about. I haven’t cleaned mine in forever. It never really crossed my mind before, but it will now.”

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Man charged with gross littering after storm debris was found near Bonnet Carre Spillway

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A Harvey man was recently cited by the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries for allegedly dumping an entire roll-off bin of storm debris onto CC Road in St. Charles Parish.

Agents cited Anthony Hills, 35, for gross littering on Feb. 17 following an extensive investigation. According to LDWF officials, agents received information on Feb. 2 regarding an illegally discarded load of storm debris off CC Road near the Bonnet Carré Spillway.

“After further investigation, agents determined the load originated from the St. John Parish Public Works dumpster yard,” Adam Einck of LDWF said.

“Public works personnel assisted agents with obtaining logbook information and surveillance footage. Agents then identified the contracted disposal company responsible for the removal and disposition of the public waste in the yard and observed Hills as the operator of the waste truck in the footage.”

Einck said after agents made contact with Hills, he admitted to dumping the bin from his disposal truck.

Gross littering brings up to a \$900 fine and 16 hours of community service in a litter abatement program.

Sgt. Kyle Wagner and Cpl. Jeffrey Farmer are the LDWF investigating

agents for the case, and the matter will be forwarded to the office of St. Charles Parish District Attorney Joel Chaisson for prosecution.

an unusual offering in size and allow residents to have horses and stables.”

There are five lots available, and prices range from \$445-475,000. Water and electric will be available to each parcel, while each owner will be responsible for their own private water/sewer treatment plants. Allemand said there is a 100’ servitude that runs along the levee which allows the parish access and the lot owners access to the water. No permanent structures can be built on that levee.

The property now being sold was inherited by the family of Margaret Graham Smith. Smith’s nephew and niece Cecil Sumners and Edith Sandoz are overseeing the sales, and said the land opportunity is unique.

“I believe there is a market for larger lots in St. Charles Parish,” Sumners said. “With the bulk of lots sold in the parish being half acre or less, many without trees- I think there are prospective customers who want and are looking for something much larger and a special place to raise a family away from the hustle and bustle of metro New Orleans, wanting privacy and solitude that comes from the larger parcels”.

Sandoz agrees.

“It gives people a choice – it is a missing land-type availability in St. Charles Parish,” she said.

Smith acquired the property in 1948. In the mid 1950’s Allemand said people who fished in the Bayou Gauche area for a living approached their Smith about

developing a small subdivision for them to live, and thus Smith Green Acres was built.

Matthew, Mark, and Luke were the first streets established, along with First and Second Streets. The original lots were one acre, and in most cases were financed by Smith.

In 2004 the family developed the Ranchette concept along Grand Bayou Road with two acre lots. After those lots sold well, four more lots were added to the string of Ranchettes in 2020. Those quick sales opened up the need for larger properties.

“Aunt Margaret would love to know that people will continue to be able to enjoy the beauty of the area,” Sandoz said.

temperature-controlled place to gather. That number is nearly half of pre-COVID attendance.

Sheena Candies, who helps to organize events and fundraisers for the church, said she and others have been meeting – sometimes with an Archdiocese of New Orleans representative and sometimes without – to brainstorm about ways to make the church more viable.

“Right before the storm our insurance company was changed and the deductible is high,” she said. “We’re waiting to see if FEMA will cover anything. The Archdiocese is not helping us rebuild at this time due to their bankruptcy.



Right now we have two masses a week ... Saturday afternoon and Sunday afternoon. Attendance is down but we are not behind on payments.”

Candies said Archdiocese officials have encouraged St. Gertrude parishioners to think outside the box about fundraising opportunities. Due to COVID and Hurricane Ida, 2022 marks the third year the church has not been able to have its traditional three-day Catfish Festival, which was easily its largest fundraiser. Candies said she is currently looking for a location to have craft fairs that would benefit the church.

“Anytime I have ever done any fundraiser or show or anything ... people show up and help,” Candies said.

Hymel said the Archdiocese has told him and St. Gertrude parishioners that the church will soon undergo a feasibility study to determine whether it is feasible for it to continue as a church parish.

“I truly appreciate the core parishioners for their faithfulness, love and dedication to their church parish,” he said. “God is definitely seeing that faithfulness.”

changes at scale to help reduce carbon in our own and our customers’ value chains,” Bunge CEO Greg Heckman said. “I am confident that our shared networks, global footprint and expertise is the right partnership to build a successful long-term and low-cost enterprise that will help meet the demand for next

generation, renewable fuels.”

Under the agreements, Bunge will operate the facilities while Chevron will have purchase rights for the oil to use as a renewable feedstock to manufacture transportation fuels with lower lifecycle carbon intensity.

“Chevron expects to create the

capacity to produce 100,000 barrels per day of renewable diesel and sustainable aviation fuel by 2030,” Mark Nelson, executive vice president of Downstream and Chemicals for Chevron, said. “By taking this first step in securing a predictable supply of renewable feedstocks in partnership with Bunge, we are positioning

ourselves to meet that goal and supply our transportation customers with lower lifecycle carbon intensity fuels.”



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DHS wins 1st playoff game since 2011, falls in round 2

Days after notching the program's first playoff victory since 2011, Destrehan's season came to an end on the road at the hands of 2021's Class 5A state runner-up.

No. 8 seed and host Natchitoches Central bested the Wildcats 65-51 in the second round of the 5A playoffs Tuesday night. NCHS advanced to the state quarterfinals with the victory, where it will meet defending state champion Zachary in a rematch of last season's 5A championship game.

Natchitoches Central (24-6) has won 10 of its past 11 games.

For Destrehan (26-6) it brought to a close a true breakout season under head coach Troy Green in Green's second season with the program. Destrehan did not qualify for the playoffs last season, but earned a No. 9 seed and district championship honors in a season highlighted by a 14-game winning streak.

DESTREHAN 74, ST. AMANT 61 - Destrehan swarmed defensively, jumping passing lanes, blocking shots and turning loose its transition game, time and time again.

Basketball may be a 5-on-5 encounter, but at times there seemed to be 8, 10 or 12 Wildcats patrolling on the defensive end Friday night, as the No. 9 seeded hosts turned back No. 24 St. Amant, 74-61, in the Class 5A opening round playoff game between the teams - and in the process, captured the Wildcats' first playoff win in more than a decade.

"The good thing is, these kids don't remember that, know how long it's been," said Destrehan head coach Troy Green, who earned his first playoff win with Destrehan in his second year with the

team. "We wanted it. We played a good team. I didn't think that was a true No. 24 seed. We came in, we executed, and at the end, we made some free throws."

The Wildcats were faced with defending a versatile offense that spreads the floor with shooters - and a Gators team that had bested multiple teams among Destrehan's District 7-5A rivals. DHS was up to the test.

"We came prepared ... we did what our coach taught us to do and got the win," Destrehan's Devin Fourcha said. "Defense is our main focus. Work on the defensive end, get buckets on the offensive end. Before we played them at practice, we ran a little shell drill. We try not to help because we know they have shooters. We know they're gonna let it fly."

Said teammate Jai Thomas, "It feels good ... we've worked so hard at practice. Rebounding, and you've got to start everything at the defensive end ... we want to take this all the way to the 'ship.'"

In addition to the win, Friday represented the first game Destrehan hosted in the playoffs since that 2011 season, and they celebrated that distinction in style.

In the middle of the second quarter, DHS led St. Amant by three - and then ramped up the pressure. Destrehan ended the first half on a 13-2 run and extended that surge into the second half, ultimately outscoring the Gators 18-2 before a Letavian Crockett jumper allowed St. Amant's offense to gain some footing.

Jai Thomas' hot shooting lit the fuse for DHS. He hit back-to-back 3-pointers in the second quarter to give his team a 21-15 lead. Then it was

Devin Fourcha darted into a passing lane to make a steal and then a layup to push Destrehan ahead 27-15. A Davonne Wells pull up jumper, followed by another by Thomas, gave Destrehan a 31-17 lead at half - a near Fourcha basket just before half threatened to extend that advantage to 16, but the play was ruled a charge.

That didn't dampen the run, which was capped by a Thomas jumper from the top of the key, a 3 that made it 36-17.

Back-to-back baskets by Crockett, including a step back 3, got the St. Amant offense stirring. But Fourcha got rolling as well, notching two steals, two layups and an assist to Calvin Bullock for another score. That gave Destrehan a 17-point lead, 42-25.

St. Amant was not interested in going home quietly, though, and fought back

to make this a game. Trace Forbes sank a 3, and Jah'leel Ester hit another to cut the lead to 12. DHS pushed the advantage back to 1, but St. Amant answered with a 10-1 run, a Crockett bucket making it a 56-47 game.

The final minutes of play were lengthy - Destrehan spent a good portion of the fourth killing clock, but from there it became a foul-shooting battle. St. Amant forced a turnover with 2:16 left and Forbes hit another 3, making it an 8-point game.

But that was as close as things would get. Destrehan put things away at the line and held the Gators at bay.

That was significant, as foul shooting has been the Wildcats' Achilles' heel at times this season.

"They did a good job of lengthening the game on us. When it went to that, (making free throws) was what it was about," Green said. "You've got to make them and get out ... we shoot so many. We've played so many games and seen a lot. It's about executing and believing in ourselves."

Thomas scored 18 points to lead Destrehan. Fourcha finished with 15 points and Bullock 11. Jai Eugene scored seven, all coming in the fourth quarter.

Forbes and Crockett each scored 15 points and Ester scored 10 for St. Amant (18-13).

The Destrehan press came up big in this one, and Green said when it came down to tailoring the gameplan for this game, the Wildcats simply did what they do best.

"You always second-guess, think about what the opponent does ... to me, we want to play how we play. That's our strong point and we're gonna use it. We're quick to the ball and that's what we like to do," Green said.

For Hahnville, much of the core group of this team will return next season, with just two seniors departing via graduation. After back-to-back final four runs, this year's team was full of first-time starters and rotation players and Friday night's game was one more learning experience.

"I think the reality is, the kids have to see it first," Jasmine said. "Until they see it, it becomes very difficult, and in the playoffs, you have to be able to see yourself handling that moment ... especially when you have close games, it's hard, and my guys needed to get that experience under their belt."

He added the future is bright for this squad, and praised their ability to fight through adversity throughout the season.

"It's why I really wanted this team to win district, because I know what these guys have battled through," said Jasmine, whose team finished one game behind district co-champions Destrehan and East St. John. "We're young, and we didn't play one game with everyone healthy. So, we asked a lot from them ... of course it's disappointing, because the goal is to be the last team standing, the one holding the state championship trophy. But, as a program, we're gonna keep going."
