Residents with any unresolved financial, emotional, or household needs are encouraged to attend walk-in clinics hosted this month in St. Charles Parish.

United Way of St. Charles, in collaboration with the St. Charles Parish Long Term Recovery Group and Rebuild United, has invited World Renew Disaster Response into the community to assess residents’ continuing needs.

“United Way of St. Charles has made a firm commitment to helping our community recover from Hurricane Ida,” Kacy Kernan, UWSC director of community impact, said. “This needs assessment will be a huge help in helping us identify where our most significant needs are.”

Kernan said the data collected by the group will be used by United Way to connect people with resources. Residents are encouraged to bring in paperwork related to any financial or household need.

Walk-in centers will be available in three parish locations from March 21 through April 1.

The clinic at the RPCC United Way Campus, located at 13145 Highway 90 in Boutte, will be open March 21-25 and March 28-31 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and from 9 a.m. to noon on March 26 and April 1.

A center at the St. Rose Community Center, located at 608 Mockingbird Lane, will be available March 21-25 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

The response team will be at the Killona Community Center, located at 201 La Highway 3141, on March 28-31 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. and on April 1 from 9 a.m. to noon.

Two local churches will offer St. Joseph Altars

Mounds of beloved fig cookies and freshly baked breads will be just some of the culinary creations ornately displayed this month when local Catholic parishioners host their church’s annual St. Joseph Altar. The St. Joseph Altar is believed to have originated in Sicily during the Middle Ages. As the legend goes, a long drought and famine caused many Sicilians to die from starvation. People prayed to their patron saint, Joseph, for relief from the famine. When rain came, the people rejoiced and prepared a table with an assortment of foods they harvested. After paying

honor to St. Joseph, they distributed the food to the less fortunate. The act of making an altar fulfills a promise made to St. Joseph for an answered prayer, according to the Archdiocese of New Orleans’ website. The traditional St. Joseph Altar is constructed in the shape of the cross, with three levels honoring the Holy Trinity. A statue or picture of Joseph, often seen holding the baby Jesus, stands at the center of the highest tier with flowers surrounding him. Most often the colors of red, white and green (the colors of the Italian flag)

Des Allemands man cited by LDWF for alleged fishing violations

Dwayne E. Comardelle, 34, was cited by Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries enforcement agents on Feb. 23 in Plaquemines Parish for a second offense of commercially fishing without a commercial fishing license and first offense of commercial fishing without a commercial gear license or commercial vessel license. Agents stopped a vessel being operated by Comardelle on Feb. 17 on the Mississippi River near Buras for a license and creel check. Agents reported to have found a crab crate full of crabs along with other empty crab traps and crabbing equipment on board. “Agents learned that Comardelle did not possess the required commercial fishing, commercial gear and commercial vessel licenses for commercial crabbing,” a LDWF press release stated. “Agents returned the one crate of crabs to the water. After further investigation, agents also learned that Comardelle illegally harvested 2,823 pounds of blue crabs and sold them for \$6,983 earlier in the year.” A second offense of fishing without a commercial fishing license carries up to a \$800 fine and 90 days in jail. Fishing without a commercial gear license or commercial vessel license brings a \$250 to \$500 fine and up to 90 days in jail. Comardelle may also face civil restitution totaling \$4,319 for the replacement value of the illegally harvested crabs. The case will be forwarded to District Attorney Charles Ballay for prosecution. Agents participating in the case are Corporal Thomas Forehand and Senior Agent Austin Landry.

Legal services desk open once more in Hahnville, offering Ida disaster case aid

Along with many of the other service locations impacted by Hurricane Ida, St. Charles Parish’s Access to Justice Center was hit hard. But after several months of repairs, the team is back at its Luling location and offering legal help in disaster cases along with its regular services. The disaster case aid is being offered thanks to funding via United Way of St. Charles and could be a welcome source for several local residents who may be still embroiled in a struggle to secure necessary aid from FEMA or insurance. “Through this grant from United Way, we can help with disaster cases from Hurricane Ida ... we can open cases with legal services for those kinds of issues,” said Rachel Campbell of Louisiana Legal Services, among those who staff the help desk at the Access to Justice Center. “We can help with FEMA applications. If someone doesn’t have a clear title to their home and they need a succession done, we can help with that as well. “Obviously, St. Charles Parish was pretty devastated and a lot of people applied for FEMA. We want people to know we’re open and available to help them.” Through the center, Southeastern Louisiana Legal Services provides free civil legal aid and self-representation information. SLLS is a non-profit law firm offering representation, advocacy and legal education for low-income Louisiana residents.

The center is staffed and open to the public Monday, Wednesday and Thursday from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. It is open by appointment for eligible clients from 2:30 to 4:30 p.m. It closed after Ida in order to deal with significant damage incurred – it took on water, windows caved, and the building had to undergo repairs. Last month, it was ready for a return. While it was closed, the center’s staff were stationed for a time at the parish’s disaster recovery center. “The disaster recovery center is closed at this point, but that doesn’t mean people can’t appeal FEMA decisions if they think it wasn’t a fair call,” Campbell said. Other services provided at the center includes forms provided for divorce and custody cases, child support applications and name changes. While the location’s self-help desk is central to the service, there are attorneys staffed there to help direct visitors to the proper resources, and visitors can apply for additional legal services if what is available at the desk is not applicable to one’s specific need. “For people who don’t have an attorney, I think we fill a pretty big need,” Campbell said. “I think with it being back open, it will be really beneficial for St. Charles Parish.”

has been quite the memorable one.

And it all started rather randomly, he said.

“My dad woke me up and asked, ‘Hey Kevin, how would you like to audition for American Idol?’ I’m half-asleep and said ... ‘sure. OK,’” Gullage said with a laugh.

His father has the know-how to set such a tryout up, to be sure. Tony Gullage is a famed and successful long-time musician who Kevin has had a lifetime of learning from.

Before Kevin could officially earn the right to audition in front of judges Katy Perry, Luke Bryan and Lionel Richie, however, he would have to shine in a virtual audition via ZOOM for Idol producers.

“That was nerve-wracking, to say the least,” Kevin said. “This was me coming off of quarantine, everything with COVID, and my mind was trying to recover from not performing as much as I had been. I was anxious ... honestly, I had a question in my mind of, ‘Do I still have it?’”

Kevin went with “That’s how strong my love is” by Otis Redding for his piece, and the first producer he performed for lifted his confidence.

“He said he loved it,” Kevin said. “He told me, ‘I want you to go into the next round of ZOOM auditions, because you sound great and I like to pick winners.’ That got my confidence right back where it used to be.”

Even when his confidence waned thereafter – a literal hiccup during a follow-up song brought some tension upon himself – his father was there to reassure him and to coach him to keep his eye on the prize.

Soon, Kevin got the answer he was dreaming of.

“It’s hard to describe,” he said. “It was just an amazing feeling.”

The American Idol experience has been just one of several exciting recent developments for Kevin, who recently signed officially with Basin Street Records, a Grammy-Award winning independent record label that has artists like Kermit Ruffins, Henry Butler, Jon Cleary and Davell Crawford in its ranks – heroes of Kevin, who

realized a dream upon putting pen to paper.

He’s made an album – which will be on the Basin Street label. He’s also done the score for an independent movie, “Don’t Talk, Just Listen.” He’ll be performing on

the Disney Cruise line for two months, and in August he’ll travel to Brazil to perform.

These milestones are a result of a lifetime of musical progress and prowess. Kevin began composing his songs in kindergarten and showed an advanced knowledge of rhythm and musical notes for his age. He’s received numerous awards and recognitions, and while Idol will be his first national and international television experience, he has been featured on WWL and WGNO television on the local level.

Despite all of that, he admits the COVID pandemic shook him to his core. Kevin went from performing three nights a week at B.B. King Blues Club in New Orleans, a rarity for a performer his age, and slated for performances in Hong Kong and South Africa, to all of it being scrapped. With members of his band residents of Baton Rouge, any performances turned out to be scarce.

“When you’re 20 years old, and all of your work and your momentum gets halted so abruptly ... it makes you wonder if you’re getting worse by not performing as much, and that scared me,” Kevin said. “It shakes your confidence and makes you question if what you’re doing is ever going to work out. You hear so many no’s in this business ... it’s tough when you lose those opportunities you did receive.”

That feeling is what spurred him to compose the score for “Don’t Talk, Just Listen.”

“I saw a flier for a casting call at Loyola,” he said. “I called them and offered (to compose it) for free. I just needed that outlet ... it’s part of what got me through COVID and through that void place of waiting for people to say that it’s OK to go outside again, to perform again.”

He’s indeed out of the void, and his star is shining brighter than ever.

thinking of it.”

Cooper talked to her sisters – Jamie Hill of Des Allemands and Jodie Matherne of Paradis – and the trio devised a plan to raise money for the family.

“I got with my sisters and we decided to be difference makers,” Cooper said.

Cooper – who runs Lil Sprouts - made a cup and shirt, Hill donated earrings from Handmade By Hill and Matherne donated a keychain from Oh Seaux Magical VIPS. Cooper announced a \$5-a-chance raffle on Facebook for the package of items, with all proceeds benefitting the family.

“I never doubt the love that this community has, but this outpouring has been nothing short of amazing,” Cooper said. “I feel like everyone wants to help the Ukraine, but no one really knows how at this point. So when I opened the door it was just an easy way for our community to share the love.”

The sisters raised nearly \$1,700 for the family.

are displayed.

Most altars have a basket where visitors can place written petitions.

Each food on the altar has some traditional significance. For example, hard-boiled eggs are embedded in baked bread to symbolize the rebirth of spring and the coming of Easter, while bread-crumbs represent the sawdust of the carpenter. Wine recalls the wedding feast at Cana, and the fava bean - which was the only crop that survived the drought - is called the lucky bean.

The St. Joseph Altar tradition began to take local roots in the late 1800s when Sicilian immigrants settled in New Orleans. The altars flourished among the prolific celebrations of Louisiana.

For believers, the annual altar is a way to express gratitude for any sort of fortune in their lives. Because the altars thank St. Joseph for relieving hunger, offerings of food are essential.

“St. Joseph’s Altar is a thanksgiving offered by our parish community in honor of Saint Joseph for the blessings of the previous year,” Father Anthony Odiong of St. Anthony of Padua said. “It is also a plea and a prayer for his protection and favor for the upcoming year.”

St. Charles Borromeo and St. Anthony of Padua are among the local Catholic churches hosting an altar this year.

At St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Church in Destrehan, the annual altar is presented by the St. Joseph Altar Society and will be blessed after the 8:15 a.m. mass on March 19. Live Oak bests Destrehan

Wildcats battling through difficult schedule to prep for postseason, will face Jesuit today

Destrehan struck early in its home game against surging Live Oak, chasing Eagles' starting pitcher Drake Weller after taking a 1-0 lead in the first inning of play. But Live Oak answered immediately, plating three runs in the top of the second to take control of what became a 6-2 Eagles win.

Live Oak (13-2) called upon Renton Childers in relief – and Childers delivered, hurling six innings of two-hit ball and allowing no earned runs. He struck out eight and walked three.

The loss dropped Destrehan to 6-6 in what's been a very challenging early season stretch of games. Destrehan head baseball coach Chris Mire said that's by design – he said the Wildcats must continue to test themselves against the state's best to get ready for the postseason, and the schedule reflects that philosophy.

"You aren't going to

draw a bad team in the playoffs," Mire said. "We're trying to push ourselves, give our players a chance to learn from mistakes."

He spoke at length to his players after Tuesday's loss, however, making it clear where he expects improvement: it has to start on the practice field.

"We continue to stress how important those things are ... you can't just be up on game day," Mire said. "You have to be locked in at practice and then you really see the improvement."

Offensively, Reid Broussard and Lane Lusk led the way for Live Oak, Broussard scoring twice and doubling while Lusk went 2-for-3 with two RBIs and a walk.

John Carmichael led Destrehan at the plate, going 2-for-3 with a walk. Jonah Haslauer and Cristian Ricks each drove in runs for the Wildcats.

Four pitchers combined to complete the outing for Destrehan, Haslauer earning the bulk of the work in relief. He

went 3.1 innings, allowing four runs (one earned) on three hits.

Destrehan got on the board after Ricks drew a walk with the bases loaded.

Live Oak answered after a mistake by the Wildcats allowed Cam Christ to reach base after a dropped third strike and passed ball. A second error later in the inning brought the tying run home. A short time later, Hayden Everett hit a two-run double to plate Logan Coley and Jeff Swearingen, each of whom reached base earlier in the inning.

The Eagles added a fourth run in the third inning after Lusk singled home Broussard, who drew a leadoff walk. They threatened to push across

another in the fourth, but Destrehan's Noah Simon ended the inning with a diving catch in center field.

"Outside of one game, we've given ourselves a chance each time out," Mire said. "Our guys have fought hard. We created this schedule with the knowledge we may lose some games, but this is about measuring where we are come playoff time."

Simon echoed those thoughts.

"It's been a tough stretch, some really good teams we've gone against," he said. "We have to keep working to try and win every inning and do the job."

Tourney time begins today for NCAA basketball fans, bracket enthusiasts

Today is one of the best sports days of the year – we kick off March Madness, and that means it’s bracket time!

I was on fire last year with one of the better

tourney sheets I’ve ever put together. So, if you’d like to join me on my

inevitable crash landing this time around, I’ll lay it out for you below.

Upsets in the making - I typically like to target unbalanced teams in the opening round for my upset choices. I usually focus more on the weaknesses of the higher seeds than the strength of the lower seeds in this case – I will not pretend to have watched hours of ball featuring the South Dakota State Jackrabbits or the Richmond Spiders, cool as those team mascots may be.

As it turns out, the 12th seeded Spiders and the 13th seeded Jackrabbits ARE actually among my picks here, though, and nobody ever turned down a fun mascot when choosing teams to back in their bracket. Here’s the meat behind this theory, though ...

... translation, the nerd stuff, which let’s face it is why I’m here. Providence rates as the No. 48 team in the country in terms of their adjusted efficiency ratings (via kenpom.

com), which is by far the worst among top 4 seeds in this year’s tournament. I’d forgive that, but with a defensive rating of 80th in the country, you lose me – and perhaps lose to the 13 seeded Jackrabbits. A 13 is sticking your neck out a bit, though I think we won’t be alone in going after Providence.

No. 12 Richmond, though, is actually the taller order. They face Iowa in round one, and Iowa is one of the hottest teams in the country. They just ran through the Big 10 tournament, and have become a trendy pick as a lower seed (5th) with a shot to win it all. And perhaps the biggest point against this is the spread – Iowa is favored by 10.5, a larger gap than we’re used to seeing for a 5-12 matchup. But, like Providence, defense is a question mark. They slot in at 78th, just slightly better than the Friars. Richmond has a fun, clutch point guard in Jacob Gilyard, who’s on the smaller side but that

doesn’t stop him from controlling the game.

Those two picks are probably my riskier stands – there are a lot of lower seeds who could be moving on, but I wouldn’t really call them “upsets” - you have several games where the spread is 1 or 2 with a significant seed gap, like an 11 Virginia Tech and a 6 Texas – Texas is favored by 1, every ESPN analyst said Virginia Tech will win, making me feel like Texas is actually the dog here. Meanwhile, No. 11 seed Michigan starts off the tournament as a favorite over Colorado State.

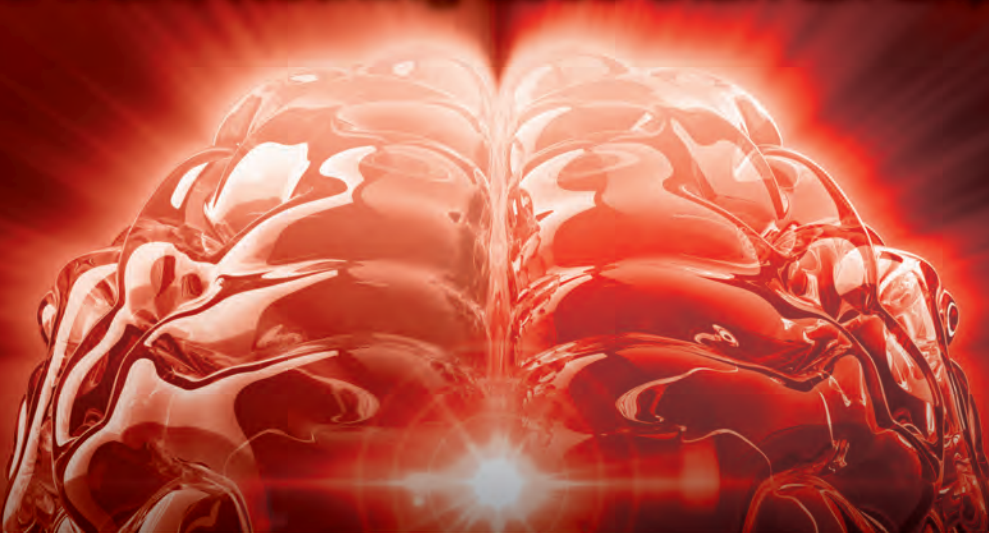
I’m taking Indiana, the Rutgers/Notre Dame winner and Michigan as 11 seeds or lower to move on. Only homerism may stop me from taking Iowa State over You Know Who, that game could go either way. And if you straight up want to call something reckless, No. 14 Yale over No. 3 Purdue is there for the taking. Personally, I’m not taking Yale, but I do

think Purdue is in for a short run here one way or another, so maybe get in early? Eh, I don’t advise it.

Runners -I have Richmond to the Sweet 16 as a result of the aforementioned upsets above – they’d matchup with our beloved Jackrabbits in round two if somehow we land both of these. Michigan joins them there on my bracket – that’s a preseason top 10 team seeded 11th, seems like some value. And while this could also be filed under “upsets,” give me North Carolina over Baylor in round two. You rarely see defending champions go far in the tournament in the season after, and UNC in my opinion is the only 8 or 9 seed with a chance of knocking off a 1 (I’m sure this statement will age well).

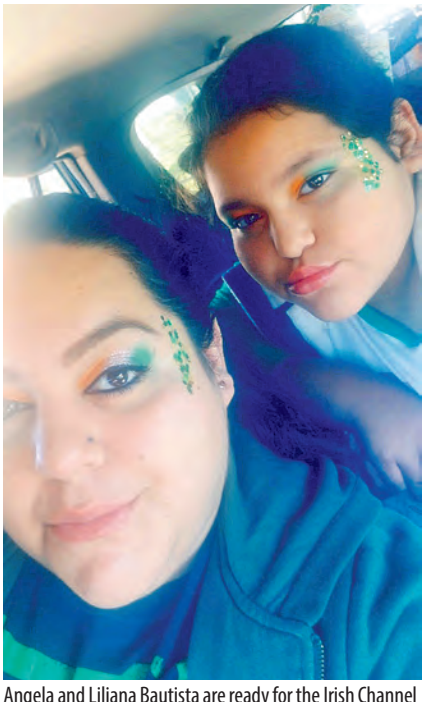

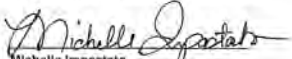

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and effective as of the day of , 2022 by and between ST. CHARLES PARISH acting herein by and through its President, who is duly authorized to act on behalf of said Parish, hereinafter called the OWNER, and All South Consulting Engineers, LLC, a limited liability company acting herein by and through its Contracting Officer, hereinafter called CONSULTANT, duly authorized by corporate resolution attached hereto and made a part hereof. Whereas the Owner desires to employ a professional consulting firm to perform consulting work and services for Automated Water Meter Reading Installation Program Project No. WWKS 106 as described in Ordinance No. 22-3-1 which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

1.0 GENERAL TERMS

The Owner agrees to employ the Consultant and the Consultant agrees to perform professional services required for the project described above. Consultant will conform to the requirements of the Owner and to the standards of the agencies participating with the Owner in the Project. The Consultant will coordinate all work between the Owner and all participating agencies and regulating agencies, if needed. Written authorization to begin different phases of the project will be given to the Consultant by the Owner, including Conceptual, Preliminary Design, Final Design, Bidding Assistance and Construction and Services. The Owner may terminate the Contract by written notification and without cause per Section 11.0 during any phase of the project.

The Consultant shall at all times during this Agreement maintain a valid Louisiana Consulting License and any other applicable licenses necessary for performance of the Project.

All work shall be under the direction of the Owner, and all plans, specifications, etc. shall be submitted to the Owner and all approvals and administration of this contract shall be through the Owner.

2.0 PROJECT

2.1 The Owner hereby contracts with the CONSULTANT to perform all necessary professional services in connection with the project as defined as follows:

Automated Water Meter Reading Installation Program
Projects No. WWKS 106

- 2.2 The Project consist of the scope of services and work as defined in Attachment "A" hereto.
- 2.3 Consultant shall perform all scope of services and work in accordance with the Schedule as defined in Attachment "B" hereto unless otherwise mutually agreed upon by the parties in writing.
- 2.4 The Consultant agrees to comply with all Federal, State, and Local Laws and Ordinances applicable to the scope of services and work or in entering any other agreement with any another party to complete the work.

3.0 SERVICES OF CONSULTANT

- 3.1 Consultant shall provide Owner professional work and services in all phases of the Project to which this Agreement applies and as hereinafter provided to properly plan and execute the work on the project(s) assigned to the Consultant. These services may include but may not be limited to serving as Owner's professional consulting representative for the Project, providing professional consultation and advice, and furnishing customary civil, surveying, geotechnical, structural, mechanical, electrical, instrumentation and control consulting services and construction consulting and inspection.
- 3.2 Services provided by the Consultant shall be performed in accordance with generally accepted professional consulting practice at the time and the place where the services are rendered.
- 3.3 Consultant shall obtain from Owner authorization to proceed in writing for each phase of the Project.
- 3.4 Consultant shall provide minutes of all meetings with St. Charles Parish regarding any phase of the Project.
- 3.5 Consultant shall provide work and services to complete the project, including all necessary services described herein or usually implied as a prerequisite for the performance of the services whether or not specifically mentioned in this agreement, including attendance by the Consultant at project conferences and public hearings.
- 3.6 The Phases of the Project are as defined in Attachment "A".

4.0 OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

- 4.1 Documents including but not limited to plans, specifications, maps, basic survey notes, sketches, charts, computations and all other data prepared or obtained under the terms of this authorization shall become the property of the Owner and shall be made available for Owner's inspection at any time during the Project and, shall be delivered to the Owner prior to termination or final completion of the Contract.
- 4.2 Consultant may retain a set of documents for its files.

- 4.3 Reuse of Documents. Any reuse of documents or materials without written authorization or adaptation by Consultant to the specific purpose intended will be at Owner's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Consultant or to Consultant's independent professional associates, subcontractors, and consultants.

- 4.4 No materials, to include but not limited to reports, maps or other documents produced as a result of this Contract, in whole or in part, shall be available to Consultant for copyright purposes. Any such materials produced as a result of this Contract that might be subject to copyright shall be the property of the Owner and all such rights shall belong to the Owner, and the Owner shall be sole and exclusive entity who may exercise such rights.

5.0 SUPPLEMENTARY SERVICES

The Consultant shall provide, when requested in writing by the Owner, supplementary services not included in the basic work and services.

The compensation to the Consultant for the supplemental services, when performed by the Consultant, shall be in the form of a lump sum, billable hours, or "not to exceed" hourly rate which is mutually agreeable to the Owner and the Consultant in writing.

Such supplementary services may include the following:

- A. Soil investigations
B. Laboratory inspection of materials and equipment
C. Right-of-Way, easement and property acquisition surveys, plats, maps and documents
D. Any major revisions for which the Consultant is not responsible, that are authorized by the Owner after the completion and approval of either the preliminary or final plans and specifications
E. Services concerning replacement of any work damaged by fire or other causes during construction
F. Services made necessary by the default of the contractor in the performance of the construction contract
G. Services as an expert witness in connection with court proceedings
H. Traffic consulting if necessary
I. Topographic Survey
J. Preparation of Environmental Assessment documents and/or Environmental Permits
K. If all or part of the work is to be financed by a Federal or State Grant, the Consultant

shall assist the Owner in the preparation of the Grant application and with the Grant Administration, unless otherwise specifically agreed upon previously herein.

6.0 DEFECTIVE WORK

During such visits and on the basis of such observations, Consultant may disapprove of or reject Contractor's work while it is in progress if Consultant believes that such work will not produce a completed Project that conforms generally to the Contract Documents or that it will prejudice the integrity of the design concept of the Project as reflected in the Contract Documents

7.0 NOTICE TO PROCEED

The Owner shall notify the Consultant in writing to undertake the services stated in this Agreement, and the Consultant shall commence the services within ten (10) days after receipt of such notification.

If the Owner desires to divide the Project into various parts, a Notice to Proceed shall be issued for each part, and the Owner and the Consultant shall mutually agree upon the period of time within which services for each part of the Project shall be performed.

The Consultant will be given time extensions for delays beyond their control or for those caused by tardy approvals of work in progress by various official agencies, but no additional compensation shall be allowed for such delays.

8.0 PAYMENTS

8.1 Owner shall pay Consultant for the performance of work and services as outlined in Attachment "C" to this Agreement.

8.2 Payment for Consultant work and services on projects that do not require construction services, such as feasibility studies or drainage studies, shall be made based upon Consultant's estimate of the proportion of the services actually completed at the time of billing and shall be made in partial payments at monthly intervals.

8.3 If the Project, or any portion thereof, is not completed for any reason, the final fee for consulting work and services shall be negotiated between Owner and Contractor. If the final fee for work and services is not mutually agreed upon, either party may elect in writing to submit the dispute to mediation. If mediation is not mutually agreed upon, written notice will be submitted to the other party of the intent to submit the dispute to the 29th Judicial District Court of St. Charles Parish, State of Louisiana.

8.4 If authorized in writing by Owner, for the performance of, or for obtaining from others Additional Services which are not considered normal or customary consulting, the Owner shall pay Consultant based on monthly invoices submitted by the Consultant, within sixty (60) days of receipt of Consultant's invoice. Consultant shall provide written notice to Owner when no services or work have been performed during a given month.

8.5 For Additional Authorized Services provided by the Consultant such as, but not limited to, wetlands permitting, land and right-of-way acquisition, surveying, NPDES and LADEQ permit renewal or acquisition work, etc. Owner shall pay Consultant based on an agreed upon hourly rate(s) between the Owner and Consultant. Payment shall be not-to-exceed based on hourly rates and actual hours worked.

8.6 The following documentation shall be required for payment to Consultant and shall be attached to the monthly invoice.

a. A copy of the Owner's written authorization to perform the service.

b. Timesheets for all hours invoiced.

c. Invoice copies, logs or other substantiation of non-salary expenses.

8.7 For Additional Authorized Services that Consultant acquires from subcontractors and/or subconsultants, Owner shall pay Consultant a fixed sum previously agreed upon by Owner and Consultant, such sum to be established in each case when the scope of the work involved has been determined and before any of the Additional Services are provided. The use of subcontractors and/or subconsultants shall be subject to the provisions set forth in this Agreement. The following documentation shall be required for payment to Consultant and shall be attached to the monthly invoice:

a. A copy of the Owner's written consent for the subcontractor and/or subconsultant to perform the service stating the Owner's and Consultant's agreed upon fixed sum established for the service performed.

b. Evidence that the subcontractor and/or subconsultant is insured as required by this Agreement.

8.8 For Supplementary Services described in Section 5, Owner shall pay Consultant for the fee negotiated at the time the work is assigned by the method stipulated in the contract amendment.

9.0 BUDGET LIMITATIONS

The construction budget for this Project shall be determined by the Owner, and the Consultant shall be advised of the budget limitation in writing by the Owner and the Consultant shall indicate his acceptance of same in writing to the Owner. Any subsequent budget revisions shall be confirmed in writing.

If, at the completion of the Preliminary or Design Phase, the Consultant does not concur with the construction budget, he shall so notify the Owner, and the Consultant and Owner shall mutually agree on a revised construction budget prior to any work on the Design Phase.

If no bid is received within the budget limitation and a redesign of the project if required by the Owner, such redesign shall be accomplished by the Consultant at no additional cost to the Owner, provided, however, if the receipt of bids is, for any reason, delayed beyond a period of six (6) months from the date of the completion of the Design Phase the amount stated as the construction budget shall be adjusted, immediately prior to the time bids are received, by use of a construction cost index acceptable to both parties of this agreement.

10.0 FUNDS

No work shall be authorized until funds are established for each individual task.

11.0 TERMINATION OR SUSPENSION

11.1 This Agreement may be terminated for any reason by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice.

11.2 The Consultant, upon receipt of such notice, shall immediately discontinue all services in connection with the performance of this Agreement and shall proceed to cancel promptly all existing orders and contracts insofar as such orders or contracts are chargeable to this Agreement.

11.3 The Consultant shall, as soon as practicable after receipt of notice of termination, submit a statement showing in detail the services performed and payments received under this Agreement to the date of termination.

11.4 The Owner shall then pay the Consultant promptly that portion of the prescribed fee to which both parties agree.

11.5 Consultant fully acknowledges that no payment will be made for any work performed or expenses incurred after receipt of the termination by either party unless mutually agreed upon in writing.

11.6 Failure to meet agreed delivery dates or authorized extensions are considered substantial failures and breach of this contractual agreement by Consultant.

11.7 This agreement shall automatically terminate upon satisfactory completion of all services and obligations described herein or three (3) years from the date of its execution, whichever event occurs first.

12.0 INSURANCE

12.1 The Consultant shall secure and maintain at his expense such insurance that will protect him and the Owner, from claims under Workmen's Compensation Acts and from claims for bodily injury, death or property damage which may arise from performance of services under this Agreement. Insurance for bodily injury or death shall be in the unencumbered amount of \$1,000,000.00 for one person and not less than \$1,000,000.00 for all injuries and/or deaths resulting from any one occurrence. The insurance for property damage shall be in the unencumbered amount of \$1,000,000.00 for each accident and not less than \$1,000,000.00 aggregate.

12.2 The Consultant shall also secure and maintain at his expense professional liability insurance in the unencumbered sum of \$1,000,000.00.

12.3 All certificates of insurance SHALL BE FURNISHED TO THE OWNER and shall provide that insurance shall not be cancelled without ten (10) days prior written notice to the Owner. The Owner may examine the policies.

12.4 Consultant shall include all subcontractors and/or subconsultants as insured under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates for each. All coverages for subcontractors and/or subconsultants shall be subject to all the requirements stated herein.

12.5 Contractor shall secure and maintain at his expense Comprehensive Automobile Liability - Bodily Injury Liability \$1,000,000 each person: \$1,000,000 each occurrence. Property Damage Liability \$1,000,000 each occurrence. The Comprehensive Automobile Liability policy must have coverage for loading and unloading and must include owned, hired and leased autos.

12.6 St Charles Parish shall be named as an additional insured on general liability insurance policies.

12.7 For all purposes under Louisiana law, the principals of this Contract shall be recognized as the statutory employer of all contract employees as provided in LSA-R.S. 23:1061.

12.8 Insurance policies shall be endorsed to provide for a waiver of subrogation in favor of St. Charles Parish for worker's compensation policies. The certificate of insurance shall reference the waiver of subrogation endorsement.

12.9 The Worker's Compensation Policy Territory Coverage must include Louisiana.

13.0 INDEMNIFICATION

Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless the Owner, its employees, agents and representatives, against any and all claims, demands, suits or judgments for sums of money to any party for loss of life or injury or damages to person or property growing out of, resulting from or by any reason of any negligent act by the Consultant, its employees, agents, servants or representatives, while engaged upon or in connection with the services required or performed hereunder.

14.0 WARRANTY

14.1 Consultant warrants that it will perform its design services with the degree of skill and to the standard of care required of the consulting profession to meet all Federal, State and Local requirements.

14.2 If Consulting Services for project designed by Consultant does not meet those requirements noted herein above, then to the extent that this occurs as a direct result of Consultant's failure to meet the standard of care in its design services, Consultant will indemnify the Parish for Consultant's share of the costs incurred to bring Consulting Services for project to the limitations mandated.

14.3 The obligations expressed in Section 14 above in no way limit the Consultant's obligations expressed elsewhere in this Contract.

15.0 EXCLUSIVE JURISDICTION AND VENUE

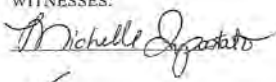

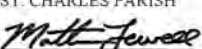
16.0 OTHER

Project Scope:

CONSULTANT shall perform the scope of services described in the following paragraphs.

OWNER would like to convert the existing water meter system that requires meter readers for billing with new automated meter reading system. OWNER estimates approximately 14,000 meters to install. OWNER will provide the meters and any ancillary equipment such as meter boxes. CONSULTANT will develop bid documents to procure a contractor to install the meters and will perform construction management and resident inspection during installation.

Bid Document Development: CONSULTANT will develop a set of bid documents that will include details about what size, type and location of the new meters along with specifications on the type of meters OWNER will provide. OWNER will supply locations through the GIS mapping system and meter sizes from the OWNERS database.

Bid Phase: For this task CONSULTANT will assist Owner in obtaining bids for the project in accordance with State Bid Law requirements. CONSULTANT will prepare contract documents, assist the Owner in advertising for bids, conduct a pre-bid conference, issue addenda as necessary, attend the bid opening, and prepare a recommendation to award for the Owner as part of this phase. In general services provided during the bid phase will be performed in accordance with the EJCDC Standard Agreement between Owner and Engineer and the requirements of Louisiana Bid Law.

System Network Planning and Coordination: For this task CONSULTANT will assist Owner with identification and acquisition of base station and repeater infrastructure sites and provide coordination and assistance during the installation of equipment.

Construction Administration: Following the acceptance of bids CONSULTANT will provide construction-phase services for the construction of the project, generally in accordance with the services defined EJCDC Standard Agreement between Owner and Engineer. PROJECT SCOPE
AMENDMENT NO.1 (REVISED PER ORDINANCE 22-3-6)

DES ALLEMANDS BULKHEAD
Project No. (P210601)

The Scope of Work is as follows:

ORIGINAL CONTRACT: The scope involves the design of a new steel sheet pile bulkhead along the bank of Bayou Des Allemands, along both Down the Bayou Road and Up the Bayou Road, approximately a total of 8,700 linear feet. The purpose of this project is to replace the existing timber bulkhead with a more structurally sound and longer lasting steel bulkhead. Over the years the timber bulkhead has deteriorated and become undermined. The project will be completed in phases with Phase I consisting of approximately 1,000 linear feet from a point south of Hwy. 90 Bridge to the Old Hwy. 90 Bridge. The basic services described herein are for Phase I of this project, but the survey and geotechnical portions of the work will be completed for the entire length of project.

AMENDMENT NO.1: The scope involves the design of an emergency steel sheet pile bulkhead to be installed along Down the Bayou Road in Des Allemands, LA. This sheet pile wall installation is necessary as a result of significant damage to the existing timber bulkhead due to Hurricane IDA. The new sheet pile wall will be installed on the outside limits of the existing bulkhead with flowable fill in between the two bulkheads to fill all voids. The new wall will act as a temporary bulkhead until the design is complete for the permanent wall, as described in the original contract scope above.

PART I – BASIC SERVICES

A. PRELIMINARY DESIGN PHASE

After written acceptance by OWNER of the Conceptual Report, selection by OWNER of a recommended solution, and upon written authorization from OWNER, ENGINEER shall:

- a. Prepare Preliminary Design Phase documents consisting of final design criteria, preliminary drawings, and outline specifications. Visit the Site, as needed, to prepare the Preliminary Design Phase documents.
- b. Coordinate all surveys and other investigations (see Additional Services) as may be required to prepare construction plans. Investigations and/or surveys shall locate existing utilities (private and public) affected by the project and shall locate and define such utilities sufficiently in the event that utilities have to be relocated.
- c. Prepare a program of borings and other soil investigations that may be required.
- d. Provide written notice to all utility companies (private and public) about the project and request utility “as-built” information from them.
- e. Advise OWNER if additional reports, data, information, and/or services not already identified in the Conceptual Phase which are necessary and assist OWNER in obtaining such reports, data, information, and/or services.
- f. Based on the information contained in the Preliminary Design Phase documents, prepare a revised opinion of probable Construction Cost.
- g. Obtain and review OWNER’s contract documents and OWNER specifications for inclusion within the final contract, plans and specifications. ENGINEER shall also consult with OWNER in regards to OWNER policies and practices in regard to contract administration and construction management.
- h. Furnish three review copies of the Preliminary Design Phase documents and revised opinion of probable Construction Cost to OWNER as well as submitting electronically to appropriate parties specified by OWNER. ENGINEER’s services under the Preliminary Design Phase will be considered complete on the date when ENGINEER has delivered to OWNER the final Preliminary Design Phase documents and opinion of probable Construction Cost.

B. FINAL DESIGN PHASE

After written acceptance by OWNER of the final Preliminary Design Phase documents and upon written authorization from OWNER, ENGINEER shall:

- a. Prepare Final Drawings and Specifications indicating the scope, extent, and character of the Work to be performed and furnished by CONTRACTOR.
- b. These Drawings shall include locations of all utilities affected, with ownership and rights-of-way where required. The existing and ownership of any existing utilities shall be determined by contacting each utility provider in writing to obtain such records as may be available and information from the survey. Coordinate with said utility companies on the adjustment, relocation, or removal of existing utility lines and structures within the project that are in conflict with the proposed improvements.
- c. Visit the Site as needed to assist in preparing the Final Drawings and Specifications.
- d. Prepare necessary applications for permits for submission for approval of local, state, and federal authorities.
- e. Prepare a detailed Final Cost Estimate.
- f. Furnish for review by OWNER three copies of the Final Drawings, Specifications, and Cost Estimate as well as submitting electronically to appropriate parties specified by OWNER. OWNER shall submit to ENGINEER any comments regarding the furnished items, and any instructions for revisions. ENGINEER’s services under the Final Design Phase will be considered complete on the date when ENGINEER has delivered to OWNER the Final Drawings, Specifications, and Cost Estimate.

C. BID PHASE

After acceptance by OWNER of the Final Drawings, Specifications, the most recent opinion of probable Construction Cost, and upon written authorization by OWNER to proceed, ENGINEER shall:

- a. Assist OWNER in advertising for and obtaining bids or proposals for the Work, assist OWNER in issuing assembled design, contract, and bidding-related documents to prospective CONTRACTORS, and, where applicable, maintain a record of prospective CONTRACTORS to which documents have been issued, pre-bid conferences, if any, and receive and process CONTRACTOR deposits or charges for the issued documents.
- b. Prepare and issue Addenda as appropriate to clarify, correct, or change the issued documents.
- c. Consult with OWNER as to the qualifications of prospective CONTRACTORS. Consult with OWNER as to the qualifications of Subcontractors, suppliers, and other individuals and entities proposed by prospective CONTRACTORS, for those portions of the Work as to which review of qualifications is required by the issued documents.
- d. If the issued documents require, ENGINEER shall evaluate and determine the acceptability of “or equals” and substitute materials and equipment proposed by prospective CONTRACTORS.
- e. Attend the bid opening, prepare bid tabulation sheets and recommendation of award to meet OWNER’s schedule, and assist OWNER in evaluating bids or proposals, assemble final contracts for the Work for execution by OWNER and CONTRACTOR, and in issuing notices of award of such contracts.
- f. The Bid Phase will be considered complete upon commencement of the Construction Phase.

D. CONSTRUCTION PHASE

Upon successful completion of the Bid Phase and upon written authorization from OWNER, ENGINEER shall:

- a. Prepare formal contract documents for the execution of the construction contract.
- b. Pre-Construction Conference: Participate in a pre-construction conference prior to commencement of Work at the Site.
- c. Establish construction monuments, project baseline, and benchmarks as necessary.
- d. Coordinate with owners of utilities for relocation of their facilities to clear the site for construction.
- e. Require and review tests of materials necessary for the project.
- f. Verify and approve CONTRACTOR’s Applications for Payment and schedules (Progress Schedules, Schedule of Submittals, and Schedule of Values) and submit to the OWNER.
- g. Prepare progress reports for the OWNER when requested and coordinate monthly progress meetings between OWNER, CONTRACTOR, ENGINEER, and inspector, as necessary throughout the duration of the project.
- h. Review shop drawings and sampled for conformance with the design concept of the project and for compliance with the result required in the Contract Documents. Evaluate and determine the acceptability of substitute or “or-equal” materials and equipment proposed by CONTRACTOR.
- i. Prepare all necessary documentation required for construction RFIs (Requests for Information/Interpretation), Change Orders, and Work Change Directives.
- j. Attend Council meetings and other meetings necessary to discuss issues associated with the project.
- k. Record Drawings: The ENGINEER shall furnish reproducible “RECORD” drawings, based on information provided by the CONTRACTOR, both printed on full size paper as well as electronically via AutoCAD.
- l. Receive from CONTRACTOR, review, and transmit to OWNER maintenance and operating instructions, schedules, guarantees, bonds, certificates or other evidence of insurance required by the Construction Contract Documents
- m. Make visits to the Site at intervals appropriate to the various stages of construction, as ENGINEER deems necessary, to observe as an experienced and qualified design professional the progress of CONTRACTOR’s executed Work.
- n. Perform Substantial Completion walk through, generate Substantial Completion recommendation and accompanying Punch List. Perform final inspection and make a recommendation for acceptance.
- o. The Construction Phase will commence with the execution of the Notice of Intent to Award for the Project and will terminate upon written recommendation by ENGINEER for final payment to CONTRACTORS.

PART 2 – ADDITIONAL SERVICES

A. SURVEY

ENGINEER shall obtain a contract with a Licensed Professional Surveyor to complete the work as outlined in the scope of survey work the ENGINEER developed in the Preliminary Design Phase of the project. The survey’s purpose is to locate all existing features both manmade and natural features, both above ground and subsurface within the project limits. The survey shall include the following elements:

- 1. Established baselines and temporary benchmarks along the project corridor and specified datums used,
- 2. Utilities as shown after contacting Louisiana One Call,
- 3. Descriptions, locations, depths, and sizes of all pipes within the project,
- 4. Descriptions, locations, diameters of all trees within the project,
- 5. Ground elevations within the project limits to properly develop contours,
- 6. Locations of all buildings, fences, and other structures,
- 7. Cross sections along roadways at 100-foot intervals minimum,
- 8. Cross sections along ditches at 50-foot intervals minimum,
- 9. Locations of all apparent rights-of-way and servitudes.

Survey shall be submitted to the Parish both in PDF and CAD format.

Data Collection and Processing:

- 1. Spatial data collected for projects shall be referenced to the updated NAD83 and NAVD88 reference datums established by NOAA (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration). Monumentation shall be set in an area outside the construction limits so as not to be disturbed during the construction phase. Existing control monumentation located within the vicinity may be used in lieu of setting new monuments. Field observations data must be processed and delivered to the Parish and comply with the specific deliverables requirements defined below.

Project Control:

- 1. Information on project control monuments that are applicable to the survey/project limits shall be provided by contractors, designers, engineers, or surveyors. This documentation should be labeled or clearly defined as Datum and Control.
- 2. Monument documentation must include source documentation such as Report of Survey Mark or NGS (National Geodetic Survey) Data Sheet and should remain in its original format as well as retain its original name as provided by the source. Monument maps may be scanned and the electronic scan treated as the source. PDF is the preferred format for scanned monument maps, although jpg and tif files are also acceptable.
- 3. All existing monuments used in the establishment of the project control network must have documentation as described above.
- 4. The Surveyor shall acquire the elevation and datum of all bench marks to be use in the survey. The elevation used shall be based on the updated NAD83 and NAVD88 reference datums.

Survey Data Deliverables:

- 1. A complete survey package as described below must be submitted by assembling all the appropriate electronic information used to conduct the survey. These documents should indicate the following (where applicable) for project control monuments:
 - a. Designation - the “name” of the mark used.
 - b. CORS Identifier - the mark is either a Continuously Operational Reference Station (CORS) or is associated with one.
 - c. PID - Permanent Identifier
 - d. GEOID – Geoid model used (ex. 12B)
 - e. Epoch – ex. 2010
 - f. Latitude/Longitude – X,Y; Northing/Easting; State Plane Louisiana South FIPS1702 (Feet)
 - g. Orthometric Height – Z (Feet)
 - h. Horizontal Datum – ex. coordinates in North American Datum (NAD 1983)
 - i. Vertical Datum – ex. North American Vertical Datum (NAVD 88) elevation (if measured)
 - j. Horizontal and vertical accuracy
 - k. Units
 - l. Scale factor

B. GEOTECHNICAL INVESTIGATION

ENGINEER shall obtain a contract with a Licensed Louisiana Geotechnical firm to complete the work as outlines in the scope of geotechnical work the ENGINEER developed in the Preliminary Design Phase of the project. The geotechnical investigation purpose is to determine the properties of the soil in the project area. The geotechnical investigation shall include the following elements:

- 1. (1) one to (2) two undisturbed soil borings located within proximity to the project location
- 2. The borings are to be classified and analyzed as necessary in accordance with accepted industry practices for foundation design
- 3. Subsurface exploration data to include soil profile, exploration logs, lab or in-situ test results, and ground water conditions
- 4. Engineering recommendations for design such as pile depth, sheet pile design, etc. and recommendations to be project specific
- 5. The boreholes are to be backfilled and road surfaces patched in accordance with DOTD requirements (Purple book or later).

C. RESIDENT PROJECT REPRESENTATIVE (RPR)

ENGINEER shall furnish a Resident Project Representative (“RPR”), at the request of the OWNER to assist ENGINEER in observing progress and quality of the Work. The RPR may provide full time representation or may provide representation to a lesser degree. RPR is ENGINEER’s representative at the Site and will act as directed by and under the supervision of ENGINEER.

The duties and responsibilities of the RPR are as follows:

- 1. RPR’s dealings in matters pertaining to the Work in general shall be with ENGINEER and CONTRACTOR. RPR’s dealings with Subcontractors shall only be through or with the full knowledge and approval of CONTRACTOR. RPR shall generally communicate with OWNER only with the knowledge of and under the direction of ENGINEER.
- 2. Review the progress schedule, schedule of Shop Drawing and Sample submittals, schedule of values, and other schedules prepared by CONTRACTOR and consult with ENGINEER concerning acceptability of such schedules.
- 3. Attend meetings such as preconstruction conferences, progress meetings, job conferences, and other Project-related meetings.
- 4. Comply with Site safety programs.
- 5. Serve as ENGINEER’s liaison with CONTRACTOR. Assist ENGINEER in serving as OWNER’s liaison with CONTRACTOR when CONTRACTOR’s operations affect OWNER’s On-Site operations.
- 6. Report to ENGINEER whenever RPR believes that any part of the Work is defective under the terms and standards set forth in the Construction Contract Documents and provide recommendations as to whether such Work should be corrected, removed, and replaced, or accepted as provided in the Construction Contract Documents.
- 7. Verify that tests, equipment, and systems start-ups and operating and maintenance training are conducted in the presence of appropriate OWNER’s personnel, and that CONTRACTOR maintains adequate records thereof. Observe, record, and report to ENGINEER appropriate details relative to the test procedures and systems start-ups.
- 8. Prepare a daily report or keep a diary or log book, recording CONTRACTOR’s hours on

the Site, Subcontractors present at the Site, weather conditions, data relative to questions of Change Orders, Field Orders, Work Change Directives, or changed conditions, Site visitors, deliveries of equipment or materials, daily activities, decisions, observations in general, and specific observations in more detail as in the case of observing test procedures; and send copies to ENGINEER.

9. Immediately inform ENGINEER of the occurrence of any Site accidents, emergencies, acts of God endangering the Work, possible force majeure or delay events, damage to property by fire or other causes, or the discovery of any potential differing site condition or Constituent of Concern.
10. Review applications for payment with CONTRACTOR for compliance with the established procedure for their submission and forward with recommendations to ENGINEER, noting particularly the relationship of the payment requested to the schedule of values, Work completed, and materials and equipment delivered at the Site but not incorporated in the Work.
11. Participate in ENGINEER's and OWNER's visits to the Site regarding Substantial Completion, assist in the determination of Substantial Completion, and prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Substantial Completion submit a punch list of observed items requiring completion or correction.
12. Observe whether all items on the final punch list have been completed or corrected and make recommendations to ENGINEER concerning acceptance.
13. Resident Project Representative shall not:

a. Authorize any deviation from the Construction Contract Documents or substitution of materials or equipment (including "or-equal" items).

b. Undertake any of the responsibilities of CONTRACTOR, Subcontractors, or Suppliers.

c. Advise on, issue directions relative to, or assume control over any aspect of the means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures of the Work, by CONTRACTOR.

d. Advise on, issue directions regarding, or assume control over security or safety practices, precautions, and programs in connection with the activities or operations of OWNER or CONTRACTOR.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and effective as of the ____ day of _____, 2022 by and between ST. CHARLES PARISH acting herein by and through its President, who is duly authorized to act on behalf of said Parish, hereinafter called the OWNER, and CRESCENT ENGINEERING & MAPPING, LLC, a corporation and/or limited liability company acting herein by and through its Contracting Officer, hereinafter called CONSULTANT, duly authorized by corporate resolution or certificate of authority attached hereto and made a part hereof. Whereas the Owner desires to employ a professional consulting firm to perform consulting work and services for KING AND HAHN STREET DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS Project No. P220202 as described in Ordinance No. 22-3-7 which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

1.0 GENERAL TERMS

The Owner agrees to employ the Consultant and the Consultant agrees to perform professional services required for the project described above. Consultant will conform to the requirements of the Owner and to the standards of the agencies participating with the Owner in the Project. The Consultant will coordinate all work between the Owner and all participating agencies and regulating agencies, if needed. Written authorization to begin different phases of the project will be given to the Consultant by the Owner, including Conceptual, Preliminary Design, Final Design, Bidding Assistance and Construction and Services. The Owner may terminate the Contract by written notification and without cause per Section 11.0 during any phase of the project.

The Consultant shall at all times during this Agreement maintain a valid Louisiana Consulting License and any other applicable licenses necessary for performance of the Project.

All work shall be under the direction of the Owner, and all plans, specifications, etc. shall be submitted to the Owner and all approvals and administration of this contract shall be through the Owner.

2.0 PROJECT

- 2.1 The Owner hereby contracts with the CONSULTANT to perform all necessary professional services in connection with the project as defined as follows:

KING AND HAHN STREET DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS
Projects No. P220202

- 2.2 The Project consist of the scope of services and work as defined in Attachment "A" hereto.
- 2.3 Consultant shall perform all scope of services and work in accordance with the Schedule as defined in Attachment "B" hereto unless otherwise mutually agreed upon by the parties in writing.

2.4	The Consultant agrees to comply with all Federal, State, and Local Laws and Ordinances applicable to the scope of services and work or in entering any other agreement with any another party to complete the work.
3.0	SERVICES OF CONSULTANT
3.1	Consultant shall provide Owner professional work and services in all phases of the Project to which this Agreement applies and as hereinafter provided to properly plan and execute the work on the project(s) assigned to the Consultant. These services may include but may not be limited to serving as Owner's professional consulting representative for the Project, providing professional consultation and advice, and furnishing customary civil, surveying, geotechnical, structural, mechanical, electrical, instrumentation and control consulting services and construction consulting and inspection.
3.2	Services provided by the Consultant shall be performed in accordance with generally accepted professional consulting practice at the time and the place where the services are rendered.
3.3	Consultant shall obtain from Owner authorization to proceed in writing for each phase of the Project.
3.4	Consultant shall provide minutes of all meetings with St. Charles Parish regarding any phase of the Project.
3.5	Consultant shall provide work and services to complete the project, including all necessary services described herein or usually implied as a prerequisite for the performance of the services whether or not specifically mentioned in this agreement, including attendance by the Consultant at project conferences and public hearings.
3.6	The Phases of the Project are as defined in Attachment "A".
4.0	OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS
4.1	Documents including but not limited to plans, specifications, maps, basic survey notes, sketches, charts, computations and all other data prepared or obtained under the terms of this authorization shall become the property of the Owner and shall be made available for Owner's inspection at any time during the Project and, shall be delivered to the Owner prior to termination or final completion of the Contract.
4.2	Consultant may retain a set of documents for its files.
4.3	Reuse of Documents. Any reuse of documents or materials without written authorization or adaptation by Consultant to the specific purpose intended will be at Owner's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Consultant or to Consultant's independent professional associates, subcontractors, and consultants.
4.4	No materials, to include but not limited to reports, maps or other documents produced as a result of this Contract, in whole or in part, shall be available to Consultant for copyright purposes. Any such materials produced as a result of this Contract that might be subject to copyright shall be the property of the Owner and all such rights shall belong to the Owner, and the Owner shall be sole and exclusive entity who may exercise such rights.
5.0	SUPPLEMENTARY SERVICES
The Consultant shall provide, when requested in writing by the Owner, supplementary services not included in the basic work and services.	
The compensation to the Consultant for the supplemental services, when performed by the Consultant, shall be in the form of a lump sum, billable hours, or "not to exceed" hourly rate which is mutually agreeable to the Owner and the Consultant in writing.	
Such supplementary services may include the following:	
A. Soil investigations	
B. Laboratory inspection of materials and equipment	
C. Right-of-Way, easement and property acquisition surveys, plats, maps and documents	
D. Any major revisions for which the Consultant is not responsible, that are authorized by the Owner after the completion and approval of either the preliminary or final plans and specifications	
E. Services concerning replacement of any work damaged by fire or other causes during construction	
F. Services made necessary by the default of the contractor in the performance of the construction contract	
G. Services as an expert witness in connection with court proceedings	
H. Traffic consulting if necessary	
I. Topographic Survey	
J. Preparation of Environmental Assessment documents and/or Environmental Permits	
K. If all or part of the work is to be financed by a Federal or State Grant, the Consultant shall assist the Owner in the preparation of the Grant application and with the Grant Administration, unless otherwise specifically agreed upon previously herein.	
6.0	DEFECTIVE WORK
During such visits and on the basis of such observations, Consultant may disapprove of or reject Contractor's work while it is in progress if Consultant believes that such work will not produce a completed Project that conforms generally to the Contract Documents or that it will prejudice the integrity of the design concept of the Project as reflected in the Contract Documents	
7.0	NOTICE TO PROCEED
The Owner shall notify the Consultant in writing to undertake the services stated in this Agreement, and the Consultant shall commence the services within ten (10) days after receipt of such notification.	
If the Owner desires to divide the Project into various parts, a Notice to Proceed shall be issued for each part, and the Owner and the Consultant shall mutually agree upon the period of time within which services for each part of the Project shall be performed.	
The Consultant will be given time extensions for delays beyond their control or for those caused by tardy approvals of work in progress by various official agencies, but no additional compensation shall be allowed for such delays.	
8.0	PAYMENTS
8.1	Owner shall pay Consultant for the performance of work and services as outlined in Attachment "C" to this Agreement.
8.2	Payment for Consultant work and services on projects that do not require construction services, such as feasibility studies or drainage studies, shall be made based upon Consultant's estimate of the proportion of the services actually completed at the time of billing and shall be made in partial payments at monthly intervals.
8.3	If the Project, or any portion thereof, is not completed for any reason, the final fee for consulting work and services shall be negotiated between Owner and Contractor. If the final fee for work and services is not mutually agreed upon, either party may elect in writing to submit the dispute to mediation. If mediation is not mutually agreed upon, written notice will be submitted to the other party of the intent to submit the dispute to the 29 th Judicial District Court of St. Charles Parish, State of Louisiana.
8.4	If authorized in writing by Owner, for the performance of, or for obtaining from others Additional Services which are not considered normal or customary consulting, the Owner shall pay Consultant based on monthly invoices submitted by the Consultant, within sixty (60) days of receipt of Consultant's invoice. Consultant shall provide written notice to Owner when no services or work have been performed during a given month.
8.5	For Additional Authorized Services provided by the Consultant such as, but not limited to, wetlands permitting, land and right-of-way acquisition, surveying, NPDES and LADEQ permit renewal or acquisition work, etc. Owner shall pay Consultant based on an agreed upon hourly rate(s) between the Owner and Consultant. Payment shall be not-to-exceed based on hourly rates and actual hours worked.
8.6	The following documentation shall be required for payment to Consultant and shall be attached to the monthly invoice. a. A copy of the Owner's written authorization to perform the service. b. Timesheets for all hours invoiced. c. Invoice copies, logs or other substantiation of non-salary expenses.
8.7	For Additional Authorized Services that Consultant acquires from subcontractors and/or subconsultants, Owner shall pay Consultant a fixed sum previously agreed upon by Owner and Consultant, such sum to be established in each case when the

scope of the work involved has been determined and before any of the Additional Services are provided. The use of subcontractors and/or subconsultants shall be subject to the provisions set forth in this Agreement. The following documentation shall be required for payment to Consultant and shall be attached to the monthly invoice:	
a. A copy of the Owner's written consent for the subcontractor and/or subconsultant to perform the service stating the Owner's and Consultant's agreed upon fixed sum established for the service performed. b. Evidence that the subcontractor and/or subconsultant is insured as required by this Agreement.	
8.8	For <i>Supplementary Services</i> described in Section 5, Owner shall pay Consultant for the fee negotiated at the time the work is assigned by the method stipulated in the contract amendment.
9.0	BUDGET LIMITATIONS
The construction budget for this Project shall be determined by the Owner, and the Consultant shall be advised of the budget limitation in writing by the Owner and the Consultant shall indicate his acceptance of same in writing to the Owner. Any subsequent budget revisions shall be confirmed in writing.	
If, at the completion of the Preliminary or Design Phase, the Consultant does not concur by the Owner, such redesign shall be accomplished by the Consultant at no additional cost to the Owner, provided, however, if the receipt of bids is, for any reason, delayed beyond a period of six (6) months from the date of the completion of the Design Phase the amount stated as the construction budget shall be adjusted, immediately prior to the time bids are received, by use of a construction cost index acceptable to both parties of this agreement.	
10.0	FUNDS
No work shall be authorized until funds are established for each individual task.	
11.0	TERMINATION OR SUSPENSION
11.1	This Agreement may be terminated for any reason by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice.
11.2	The Consultant, upon receipt of such notice, shall immediately discontinue all services in connection with the performance of this Agreement and shall proceed to cancel promptly all existing orders and contracts insofar as such orders or contracts are chargeable to this Agreement.
11.3	The Consultant shall, as soon as practicable after receipt of notice of termination, submit a statement showing in detail the services performed and payments received under this Agreement to the date of termination.
11.4	The Owner shall then pay the Consultant promptly that portion of the prescribed fee to which both parties agree.
11.5	Consultant fully acknowledges that no payment will be made for any work performed or expenses incurred after receipt of the termination by either party unless mutually agreed upon in writing.
11.6	Failure to meet agreed delivery dates or authorized extensions are considered substantial failures and breach of this contractual agreement by Consultant.
11.7	This agreement shall automatically terminate upon satisfactory completion of all services and obligations described herein or three (3) years from the date of its execution, whichever event occurs first.
12.0	INSURANCE
12.1	The Consultant shall secure and maintain at his expense such insurance that will protect him and the Owner, from claims under Workmen's Compensation Acts and from claims for bodily injury, death or property damage which may arise from performance of services under this Agreement. Insurance for bodily injury or death shall be in the <u>unencumbered</u> amount of <u>\$1,000,000.00</u> for one person and not less than <u>\$1,000,000.00</u> for all injuries and/or deaths resulting from any one occurrence. The insurance for property damage shall be in the <u>unencumbered</u> amount of <u>\$1,000,000.00</u> for each accident and not less than <u>\$1,000,000.00</u> aggregate.
12.2	The Consultant shall also secure and maintain at his expense professional liability insurance in the <u>unencumbered</u> sum of <u>\$1,000,000.00</u> .
12.3	All certificates of insurance SHALL BE FURNISHED TO THE OWNER and shall provide that insurance shall not be cancelled without ten (10) days prior written notice to the Owner. The Owner may examine the policies.
12.4	Consultant shall include all subcontractors and/or subconsultants as insured under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates for each. All coverages for subcontractors and/or subconsultants shall be subject to all the requirements stated herein.
12.5	Contractor shall secure and maintain at his expense Comprehensive Automobile Liability - Bodily Injury Liability \$1,000,000 each person: \$1,000,000 each occurrence. Property Damage Liability \$1,000,000 each occurrence. The Comprehensive Automobile Liability policy must have coverage for loading and unloading and must include owned, hired and leased autos.
12.6	St Charles Parish shall be named as an additional insured on general liability insurance policies.
12.7	For all purposes under Louisiana law, the principals of this Contract shall be recognized as the statutory employer of all contract employees as provided in LSA-R.S. 23:1061.
12.8	Insurance policies shall be endorsed to provide for a waiver of subrogation in favor of St. Charles Parish for worker's compensation policies. The certificate of insurance shall reference the waiver of subrogation endorsement.
12.9	The Worker's Compensation Policy Territory Coverage must include Louisiana.
13.0	INDEMNIFICATION
Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless the Owner, its employees, agents and representatives, against any and all claims, demands, suits or judgments for sums of money to any party for loss of life or injury or damages to person or property growing out of, resulting from or by any reason of any negligent act by the Consultant, its employees, agents, servants or representatives, while engaged upon or in connection with the services required or performed hereunder.	
14.0	WARRANTY
14.1	<u>Consultant</u> warrants that it will perform its design services with the degree of skill and to the standard of care required of the consulting profession to meet all Federal, State and Local requirements.
14.2	If <u>Consulting Services for project</u> designed by <u>Consultant</u> does not meet those requirements noted herein above, then to the extent that this occurs as a direct result of <u>Consultant's</u> failure to meet the standard of care in its design services, <u>Consultant</u> will indemnify the Parish for <u>Consultant's</u> share of the costs incurred to bring <u>Consulting Services for project</u> to the limitations mandated.
14.3	The obligations expressed in Section 14 above in no way limit the Consultant's obligations expressed elsewhere in this Contract.
15.0	EXCLUSIVE JURISDICTION AND VENUE
For all claims arising out of or related to this agreement, CONSULTANT hereby consents and yields to the exclusive jurisdiction and venue of the Twenty-Ninth Judicial District Court for the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana, and expressly waives any (a) pleas of jurisdiction based upon Consultant's residence and (b) right of removal to Federal Court based upon diversity of citizenship.	
16.0	OTHER
This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties. There are no understandings, agreements, or representations, oral or written, not specified withing this Agreement. This Agreement may not be modified, supplemented or amended in any manner, except by written agreement signed by both parties.

PROJECT SCOPE

KING AND HAHN STREET DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS
Project No. (P220202)

Project Scope:

The Project involves improving the drainage system in the area of Julia, King and Hahn Streets in Hahnville, LA by developing a new outfall channel located south of and parallel to Hahn St. from the rear of the SCP West Bank Yard to the outfall canal near the Union Pacific Railroad and connecting said channel via reinforced concrete box culverts (or similar structure) to the drainage systems of Hahn St. and Julia St.

A new drainage structure system is proposed along the east (river side) of King St. to facilitate stormwater runoff from the Julia St. watershed area to the new outfall system. These improvements are generally as shown in the 2021 West Bank Master Drainage Plan by T. Baker Smith, LLC as Priority 1, Improvement Groups 1 & 2 for the Hahnville 1 watershed.

PART 1 - BASIC SERVICES

A. PRELIMINARY DESIGN PHASE

Upon written authorization by OWNER to proceed, the CONSULTANT shall:

1. Perform preliminary, I-D, HEC analysis of proposed solutions and compare hydraulic performance of said solution(s) to the existing Master Drainage Plan (MDP) solutions.
2. Prepare Preliminary Design Phase documents including final design criteria, preliminary drawings (11" x 17"), and a specifications outline. A hydraulic design memorandum may be provided to confirm design parameters, constraints and modeling results based upon the preliminary design. CONSULTANT shall visit the Project site, as needed, to prepare the Preliminary Design Phase documents.
3. Coordinate all surveys and other investigations and/or "Additional services" as may be required to prepare construction plans.
4. Advise OWNER if additional reports, data, information and/or services are necessary for the design of the Project and assist OWNER in obtaining such reports, data, information, or services.
5. After reasonable, but not extensive, research of utility owners and a reasonable effort by the CONSULTANT to determine the presence of utilities within the Project limits, provide written request to utility owners identified in the Project Limits for available utility information.
6. Conduct an Intermediate Preliminary Design meeting with OWNER, if necessary, to review initial design progress and discuss with the OWNER any major changes or alterations which may be necessary.
7. Obtain the OWNER's contract documents and OWNER technical specifications for inclusion within the final contract, plans and specifications. CONSULTANT shall not be responsible for conducting a review nor making edits within OWNER's contract documents beyond the data which is required to be entered by the CONSULTANT. CONSULTANT will consult with the OWNER regarding OWNER policies and practices for construction contract administration, sampling, testing and resident inspection.
8. Based upon the information contained in the Preliminary Design Phase documents, prepare an Opinion of Probable Construction Cost.
9. Furnish three (3) copies of the Preliminary Design Phase documents and revised Opinion of Probable Construction Cost to OWNER as well as electronically to other parties as required by the OWNER. CONSULTANT's services under the Preliminary Design Phase shall be considered complete on the date when the Preliminary Design Phase documents are delivered to the OWNER.
10. During all phases of Basic Services and Additional Services, OWNER shall arrange for and assist with obtaining access for CONSULTANT to enter upon public and private property as required to perform the professional services.

B. FINAL DESIGN PHASE

Upon written acceptance of the Preliminary Design Phase documents by the OWNER, and upon written authorization by OWNER to proceed, the CONSULTANT shall:

1. Prepare Final Drawings and Specifications indicating the scope, extent and character of the Work to be performed and furnished by the CONTRACTOR.
2. Visit the Project site as needed to assist in preparing the Final Drawings and Specifications.
3. Provide technical and design data necessary for the execution of Additional Services.
4. Assist OWNER in consultation with authorities having jurisdiction over the Work and make standard revisions to Drawings and Specifications in response to directives from such authorities, as appropriate and reasonable.
5. Prepare a Final Opinion of Probable Construction Costs.
6. Furnish for review by OWNER, three (3) copies of the Draft Final Drawings (11"x17") and Draft Final Specifications and bidding documents as well as submit electronically to all parties as required by the OWNER. Upon receipt of final written comments from the OWNER, CONSULTANT shall meet with OWNER to discuss and resolve any outstanding comments on Final Drawings and/or Specifications.
7. Revise Final Drawings as per mutually agreed resolution to OWNER's comments and provide three (3) copies of the Final Drawings (22"x34") and Final Specifications including bidding documents, signed, and sealed by CONSULTANT'S Louisiana Licensed Professional Engineer to OWNER.
8. CONSULTANT'S services under the Final Design Phase will be considered complete on the date when CONSULTANT has delivered to OWNER the Final Drawings and Specifications, other assembled Construction Contract Documents, bidding-related documents (or requests for proposals or other construction procurement documents), and any other Final Design Phase deliverables.

C. BIDDING OR NEGOTIATING PHASE

Upon written acceptance of the Final Design documents by the OWNER, and upon written authorization by OWNER to proceed, the CONSULTANT shall:

1. Assist OWNER in advertising for and obtaining bids or proposals for the Work, assisting OWNER in issuing assembled design, contract and bidding related documents to prospective CONTRACTORS and maintain a record of prospective CONTRACTORS to which documents have been issued.
2. Receive and process, or assist with thereof, any deposits or charges for plans and specifications from prospective CONTRACTORS.
3. Prepare and issue Addenda, as appropriate, to clarify, correct or change the construction or bidding documents.
4. Attend, conduct (as appropriate) and record minutes of any pre-bid conferences held.
5. Consult with OWNER as to the qualifications of prospective CONTRACTORS.

6. Consult with OWNER as to the qualifications of subcontractors, suppliers, and other individuals and entities proposed by prospective CONTRACTORS, for those portions of the Work as to which review of qualifications is required by the issued documents.
7. If required by the issued documents, evaluate and advise the OWNER as to the acceptability of "or equals" and substitute materials and equipment proposed by prospective CONTRACTORS.
8. Attend the bid opening, prepare bid tabulation sheets to meet OWNER schedule, and assist OWNER in evaluating bids or proposals, assembling final contracts for the Work for execution by OWNER and CONTRACTOR, and in issuing notices of award of such contracts.
9. The Bidding and Negotiating Phase shall be considered complete upon the commencement of the Construction Administration Phase.

D. CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION PHASE

Upon completion of the Bidding and Negotiation Phase, and upon written authorization by the OWNER, the CONSULTANT shall:

1. Schedule, conduct and record minutes of the Pre-Construction Conference with the OWNER and CONTRACTOR, including SUBCONTRACTORS, if applicable.
2. Assist the OWNER in the selection of an independent testing laboratory, if applicable.
3. Maintain and safeguard during the Construction Phase at least one original printed record version of the Construction Contract Documents, including Drawings and Specifications signed and sealed by Engineer of Record and other design professionals in accordance with applicable Laws and Regulations.
4. Receive, review, and determine the acceptability of any and all schedules that CONTRACTOR is required to submit to OWNER, including the Progress Schedule, Schedule of Submittals.
5. Review and recommend to the OWNER for approval or otherwise, the CONTRACTOR's Applications for Payment and Progress Schedule.
6. Make visits to the Site at intervals deemed appropriate by the ENGINEER at various stages of construction to observe as an experienced and qualified design professional, the progress of the CONTRACTOR's executed work. Such visits and observations by ENGINEER, and the Resident Project Representative, if any, are not intended to be exhaustive or to extend to every aspect of the Work or to involve detailed inspections of the Work, but rather are to be limited to general observation of the Work based on ENGINEER's exercise of professional judgment, as assisted by the Resident Project Representative, if any. Based on information obtained during such visits and observations, ENGINEER will determine in general if the Work is proceeding in accordance with the Construction Contract Documents, and ENGINEER shall keep OWNER informed of the progress of the Work.
7. ENGINEER shall not, during such visits or as a result of such observations of the Work, supervise, direct, or have control over the Work, nor shall ENGINEER have authority over or responsibility for the means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of construction selected or used by any Constructor, for security or safety at the Site, for safety precautions and programs incident to any Constructor's work in progress, for the coordination of the Constructors' work or schedules, nor for any failure of any Constructor to comply with Laws and Regulations applicable to furnishing and performing of its work. Accordingly, ENGINEER neither guarantees the performance of any Constructor nor assumes responsibility for any Constructor's failure to furnish or perform the Work, or any portion of the Work, in accordance with the Construction Contract Documents.
8. Reject Work if, on the basis of ENGINEER's observations, ENGINEER believes that such Work is defective under the terms and standards set forth in the Construction Contract Documents. Provide recommendations to OWNER regarding whether Contractor should correct such Work or remove and replace such Work, or whether OWNER should consider accepting such Work as provided in the Construction Contract Documents.
9. Accept from CONTRACTOR submittal of all matters in question concerning the requirements of the Construction Contract Documents, Requests for Information (RFI) or relating to the acceptability of the Work under the Construction Contract Documents. With reasonable promptness, render a written clarification, interpretation, or decision on the issue submitted, or initiate an amendment or supplement to the Construction Contract Documents.
10. Subject to any limitations in the Construction Contract Documents, ENGINEER may prepare and issue Field Orders requiring minor changes in the Work.
11. Recommend Change Orders and Work Change Directives to OWNER, as appropriate, and prepare Change Orders and Work Change Directives as required.
12. Review and approve or take other appropriate action with respect to Shop Drawings, and other required CONTRACTOR submittals, but only for conformance with the information given in the Construction Contract Documents and compatibility with the design concept of the completed Project as a functioning whole as indicated by the Construction Contract Documents. Such reviews and approvals or other action will not extend to means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of construction or to safety precautions and programs incident thereto.
13. Receive from CONTRACTOR, review, and transmit to OWNER maintenance and operating instructions, schedules, guarantees, bonds, certificates or other evidence of insurance required by the Construction Contract Documents, certificates of inspection, tests and approvals, and Shop Drawings, Samples, and other data. Receive from CONTRACTOR, review, and transmit to OWNER the annotated record documents which are to be assembled by CONTRACTOR in accordance with the Construction Contract Documents to obtain final payment. The extent of ENGINEER's review of record documents shall be to check that Contractor has constructed the project according to plans and specifications, and all construction changes are acceptable to the ENGINEER.
14. Promptly after notice from CONTRACTOR that CONTRACTOR considers the entire Work ready for its intended use, in company with OWNER and CONTRACTOR, visit the Site to review the Work and determine the status of completion. Follow the procedures in the Construction Contract regarding the punch list of items to be completed, notice to CONTRACTOR, and issuance of a Certificate of Substantial Completion.
15. Conduct a final visit to the Project to determine if the Work is complete and acceptable so that ENGINEER may recommend, in writing, final payment to CONTRACTOR. Accompanying the recommendation for final payment, ENGINEER shall also provide a notice in writing to OWNER and CONTRACTOR that the Work is acceptable to the best of ENGINEER's knowledge, information, and belief, and based on the extent of the services provided by Engineer under this Agreement.

PART 2 - ADDITIONAL SERVICES

A. TOPOGRAPHIC SURVEYS

CONSULTANT shall perform field survey data collection of topographic and drainage features as well as perform reconnaissance of field conditions for surveying within the project area to an extent of which is necessary for the project's design. The topographic data collection for this project may include but is not limited to: general topographic transects, roadway centerline and edge elevations and/or cross sections, cross sections of roadside ditches and outfalls, invert and size data of drainage structures and catch basins, topographic surveys of driveways, survey of above-ground utility features, survey of sanitary sewer manholes and general groundline sections of areas where new ditches or drainage structures are proposed.

The limits of the topographic surveys shall include the following areas:

- Beginning at approximate address 639 Hahn St., Hahnville, LA and proceeding south for a distance of approximately 150 feet by 100 feet wide, then turn 90 degrees right and proceed southwesterly for approximately 6,250 feet in length by approximately 150' wide through virgin, wooded terrain primarily on the John Melancon tract (now or formerly), including approximate location of water pipeline and appurtenances;
- Beginning at the rear of Hahn St. at the existing gate and proceeding northeasterly for approximately 500 feet in length by approximately 80' wide, centered on Hahn St.;
- Beginning at the intersection of Hahn & King St., proceeding northwesterly for a distance of approximately 1,025 feet by approximately 30' left of centerline to 50' right of centerline of King St., including structure Finish Floor Elevations;
- Beginning at the intersection of Julia & King St. proceeding northeasterly for approximately 500' to the intersection of Julia St. & Gum St. by 70 feet wide centered on Julia St.;
- As directed by CONSULTANT engineering staff: Major drainage inverts and channel flowlines located generally along Sycamore St., Maple St. and Pine St. between Julia St. and Oak St. as well as along Sycamore St. south of Hahn St. to determine limits of overall watershed and subsurface network for Hahn and Julia St. systems.

- The drainage outfalls of the area near Sunset Ct. will be surveyed for determination if these systems will be tied into the project.

Survey data will be collected using RTK GPS and conventional total station methods and will be projected in state plane coordinates, Louisiana South, NAD 83 and based upon NAVD 88 vertical datum, Geoid 18, as determined by GPS observation. If SCP has available and current control monumentation in the area, surveys will be based upon said control network.

Temporary Bench Marks and Primary Control Points to be used for construction will be established within the project area. CONSULTANT will initiate a LA One Call prior to beginning survey work and will attempt to contact utility owners to mark lines in the field. No guarantee can be made that all utilities which exist will be collected within the topographic surveys.

Subsurface Utility Engineering (SUE) will be utilized for major utility crossings in the area of the intersection of King St. and Hahn St. and will be limited to sewer and water mains. Potholing of these lines will be conducted once the approximate crossing location of the proposed drainage structures is known and SUE services will be limited to these test holes. The scope of services shall be in accordance with providing Subsurface Utility Engineering Quality Level A services in accordance with C/ASCE Standard 38-02: Standard Guidelines for the Collection and Depiction of Existing Subsurface Utility Data

Quality Level A - Locating/Test Holes: Test holes shall be completed as described above. The Consultant shall use minimally intrusive excavation techniques, which ensure the safety of the excavation, the integrity of the utility line to be measured, and that of other lines which may be encountered during excavation. The excavation shall be by means of air-assisted and/or water-assisted vacuum excavation equipment manufactured specifically for the purpose.

Excavation of Test Holes:

1. Clear the test hole area of surface debris.
2. In paved areas, neatly cut and remove existing pavement, which cut shall not exceed 225 square inches (0.15 square meters) unless otherwise approved.
3. Excavate the test hole. The nominal diameter of the test hole shall not exceed 15 inches (375 mm) unless otherwise approved.
4. Expose the utility only to the extent required for identification and data collection purposes.
5. Avoid damage to lines, wrapping, coatings, cathodic protection or other protective coverings and features.
6. Hand-dig as needed to supplement excavation and to ensure safety.
7. Revise the test hole location as necessary to positively expose the utility.
8. Store excavated material for re-use or disposal at an approved location near the project, as appropriate.

Collection, Recording, and Presentation of Data: Measure and/or record the following information on an appropriately formatted test hole data sheet that has been sealed and dated by the CONSULTANT's Engineer.

1. Difference in elevation of top and/or bottom of the utility and the above ground mark to a vertical accuracy of +/- 0.05 feet (15 mm).
2. Field sketch showing horizontal location referenced to a minimum of two (2) swing ties to physical structures existing in the field.
3. Approximate centerline bearing of utility line.
4. Outside diameter of pipe, width of duct banks, and configuration of multi-conduit systems.
5. Utility structure material composition, when reasonably ascertainable.
6. Other pertinent information as is reasonably ascertainable from test hole.
7. Site Restoration:
 - a. Replace bedding material around exposed utility lines.
 - b. Backfill and compact the excavation in a manner acceptable to owner. Re-use excavated material with appropriate compaction.
 - c. As applicable, provide permanent pavement restoration within the limits of the original cut using materials, compaction, and pavement thickness similar or equal to that found.
 - d. For excavations in unpaved areas, restore disturbed area as nearly as practicable to pre-existing conditions.
 - e. Furnish and install permanent surface marker (e.g., P.K. nail, peg, steel pin, or hub) directly above the centerline of the utility.

Information gathered shall be shown on a test hole data sheet which shall be sealed by the licensed Professional Engineer in responsible charge of SUE activities and shown on the topographic survey drawings. The x, y, z of the test hole stake and test hole number shall be shown on the drawing. If the utilities or over 10 feet deep they may not be found using our techniques for test holes.

Topographic survey data will be processed using Bentley® MicroStation and Inroads Survey and a master topographic survey file will be developed in a .DGN format. Other formats such as AutoCAD may be made available, however, may not contain all feature code information collected. Survey data including point files, control reports and the AutoCAD file will be provided along with a certification letter signed and sealed by the Louisiana Professional Land Surveyor in charge of survey services. A hard copy survey deliverable shall be provided.

B. PROPERTY SURVEYS & MAPPING

Prior to the beginning of the design phase, the CONSULTANT shall conduct property surveys of the following parcels for consideration in the location of project design features:

Parcel ID # 110300300003, Lot 3 – 711 Hahn St., Hahnville, LA
Parcel ID # 101701300007, Lot 7 & W8 – 639 Hahn St., Hahnville, LA

The property survey shall be conducted for each parcel. Upon completion of the property surveys, the CONSULTANT shall provide an electronic copy of field notes, and electronic test file listing coordinates and descriptions of all found monuments, a PDF copy of all documents (Plats, maps, etc.) used to determine property line locations and a PDF copy of title take-offs used to determine property line locations. The CONSULTANT shall provide an electronic copy of the property survey in Microstation .DGN and .PDF formats showing the project centerline(s) data, all surveyed property lines, property monuments, existing right of ways and all major improvements thereon with ties to the project centerline. The property surveys shall be referenced to the project control network.

Right of Way mapping and/or servitude mapping of project taking areas shall be provided on standard plan sheets showing limits of taking lines, project centerline and major improvements.

A meets and bounds description in English units for each parcel shall also be provided. Title Reports are excluded from this Agreement.

C. SUPPLEMENTAL PERMITTING SURVEYS

As needed during the acquisition of environmental permits, the CONSULTANT shall conduct additional surveys as requested for or in the support of Needs and Alternatives Justification (NAJ) requests, Hydraulic Modification Impact Analysis (HMIA), water quality certificate requests, staking of project limits within wetlands or other requests made by agency analysts which require additional surveying services.

D. GEOTECHNICAL

CONSULTANT shall, or through the use of a subconsultant, a geotechnical investigation shall be conducted onsite and together with laboratory testing, foundation design recommendations and slope stability analyses shall be presented in a geotechnical report for the project, signed and sealed by a Louisiana licensed geotechnical engineer. The geotechnical investigation, analysis and design shall include the following:

- Field exploration consisting of (1) boring near the King St. drainage improvements, (2) borings in the area of the large box culvert proposed near Hahn St., and (2) borings along the length of the outfall channel with one (1) of which near the wastewater treatment plant roadway crossing. Borings shall be a minimum of 24 feet in depth below ground surface or as needed to effectively derive design parameter and analysis.
- Laboratory testing including water content, Atterberg limits, dry unit weights, unconfined compressive strength, grain/particle size analysis and triaxial unconsolidated undrained compression tests, in accordance with acceptable industry practices for the project type.
- Final geotechnical boring logs with field and laboratory data, strata and groundwater
- Backfill and abandonment of bore holes in accordance with all local, state and federal regulations. Refer to the *Construction of Geotechnical Boreholes and Groundwater Monitoring Systems Handbook* for State regulations in the making of boreholes.
- Engineering recommendations for drainage structure foundation design and bedding including lateral earth pressure recommendations for shoring; estimated settlement of proposed drainage structures and mitigation techniques, if necessary, subgrade preparation and other earthwork recommendations
- Slope stability analysis for proposed large open ditch sections

E. ENVIRONMENTAL

CONSULTANT shall develop permit drawings, applications and supporting information and work to acquire the federal, state, and local regulatory permits to conduct the proposed activity, excluding applicable permit submittal fees. A wetland delineation shall also be conducted, and a Jurisdictional Determination sought as part of the USACE Section 404 permitting process.

1. **Wetland Delineation and Jurisdictional Determination:** CONSULTANT, or through the use of a subconsultant, shall conduct a wetland delineation throughout the project limits to determine the presence of jurisdictional wetlands or "other waters of the United States" in accordance with the requirements of the USACE's 1987 Wetland Delineation Manual (Wetlands Research Program Technical Report (Y-87-1) and the USACE's "Regional Supplement to the Corps of Engineers Wetland Delineation Manual: Atlantic and Gulf Coastal Plain Region (Version 2.0)" (ERDC/EL TR-10-20). Upon completion of the wetland report and upon approval of the Client, the report will be transmitted to the USACE New Orleans District, Enforcement Section and requesting a Jurisdictional Determination. CONSULTANT will track the delineation through the approval process.

2. **Permit Drawings, Application Preparation and Submittal:** CONSULTANT will prepare and submit permit applications and accompanying drawings to each appropriate agency. The information used to complete the applications will come from the desktop screening findings, pre-application meeting notes, agency field trip notes, preliminary design details, and topographic data collected by CONSULTANT. Applications and accompanying drawings will be provided to the Client for review and approval. Upon approval by the Client, CONSULTANT will submit the applications to the appropriate agencies.

3. **Permit Tracking & Responses:** Once permits are submitted, CONSULTANT will contact the agency analysts on a regular basis to keep track of the permit processing progress as a means to expedite receipt of permits. CONSULTANT will answer questions about the proposed project or make revisions to the applications as requested by the analysts, once approved by the Client. CONSULTANT will prepare standard requested documents required by the agency analysts. The full spectrum of tasks required during the permit acquisition phase of the project is agency-dependent and difficult to estimate. Once the permits and other clearance letters are received from the agencies, CONSULTANT will submit a "final compliance package" to the client.

Items not included in this scope of work but can be provided via Supplemental Agreement include Cultural Resource & Archeological Surveys, Scenic Streams permit, Wetland Mitigation procurement and assistance, Permittee Responsible Mitigation (PRM) Plans, Threatened & Endangered Species surveys, and agency requests beyond standard requests such as excessive HMIA or NAJ requests.

2. If OWNER authorizes changes in the scope, extent, character, or breadth of the Project or CONSULTANT's services, including accelerating or significantly altering the project schedule, then the time for completion of the CONSULTANT's services and the rates and amounts of compensation payable to the CONSULTANT shall be adjusted equitably.
3. If CONSULTANT fails, through its own fault, to complete the project within the time set forth, as duly adjusted, then OWNER may be entitled, as its sole remedy, to the recovery of direct damages, if any, resulting or arising out of such failure.
4. Unforeseen global, market and economic conditions and/or related volatility otherwise may impact the timely delivery of services under this contract. Should conditions arise which may affect the CONSULTANT's services, the CONSULTANT shall notify the OWNER immediately in writing to discuss equitable schedule adjustments.
5. CONSULTANT shall not be responsible for delays caused by third parties including but not limited to, local, state and federal agencies having jurisdiction over the work, nor shall the CONSULTANT be held responsible for delays to the Project due to permit issuance or access permissions.

RULES FOR REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE
ST CHARLES PARISH ZONING BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

A. MEETING INFORMATION

- The Board will hold regular monthly meetings in the Council Chamber of the Parish Courthouse on the third Thursday of each month.
- A meeting may be scheduled for the fourth Thursday if a holiday or special event would affect attendance on the third Thursday.
- The Chairperson may request a special meeting subject to Section 2-52 of the St. Charles Parish Code of Ordinances and public notice requirements.
- Meetings will be scheduled to start at 6:00 P.M. and should adjourn no later than 10:00 P.M.
- The Board may extend any meeting beyond 10:00 P.M. by a 2/3 vote.
- Any pending business shall be resumed at the start of the next regular meeting.
- Board meetings will be open to the public.
- Board meetings will be televised whenever possible.

B. PRESIDING OFFICERS

- At the first regular meeting of each year, the Board shall elect from among its members a Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson.
- No member shall serve more than two (2) consecutive terms as Chairperson.
- The Chairperson shall preside over all meetings of the Board.
- The Vice-Chairperson of the Board shall preside in the absence of the Chairperson.
- If both the Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson are absent, the Board shall elect an Acting Chairperson.
- The Acting Chairperson shall preside until the Chairperson or Vice-Chairperson returns.
- The Chairperson or the Vice-Chairperson may desire to vacate the chair.
- Any member may be called to the seat by the vacating Chairperson or Vice-Chairperson.
- The appointment of a member called to chair shall not continue beyond adjournment of that meeting.
- The Chairperson or Vice-Chairperson of the Board shall vote on all questions on which the vote is taken by Yeas and Nays.
- The Chairperson shall preserve decorum and order, may speak to points of order in preference to other members, and shall decide all questions or order, subject to an appeal.
- When two or more members request the floor at the same time, the presiding officer shall name the member who is to speak first.
- The Chairperson may, with no objection from the Board, may declare a recess of up to ten (10) minutes at any time.

C. GENERAL BOARD RULES

- The Board shall follow Robert's Rules of Order unless in conflict with the St. Charles Parish Code of Ordinances, Appendix A, Section XIII.
- Board rules take precedence when inconsistencies occur.
- A simple majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum, and a quorum must be present to proceed with Board business.
- When a motion is seconded, it should be stated by the presiding officer.
- No item on the agenda shall be postponed for more than two (2) consecutive meetings.
- The order of business should follow the printed meeting agenda.

- These rules may be repealed or amended by concurrence of a majority of all Board Members and Council resolution.
- These rules will be reviewed at least once every four years.

D. VOTING

- In order to pass a motion, a majority of members present must vote in the affirmative, unless stated otherwise in these rules.
- When the Chair has called for the taking of a vote, all debate on the question shall be deemed concluded.
- While the presiding officer is putting the question, no member shall leave his seat until the roll call is completed.
- Every member present when a question is stated from the Chair shall vote unless a conflict of interest is stated on the record.
- No attempt to influence a Board Member's vote shall be made either in writing or verbally by any fellow Board or other elected person prior to scheduled meetings.
- Votes at final passage of all matters shall be taken by yeas and nays.
- Proxy voting by a Board Member will not be allowed.
- The result of all votes shall be announced by the Chair.
- No vote shall be changed after the Chair has announced the vote unless a Board Member asks to reconsider a vote in accordance with RONR.

E. OFFICIAL MINUTES

- The Official Minutes shall record all transactions of the Board.
- The Official Minutes shall not be considered a verbatim transcript of Board Meetings.
- The names of the Board Members voting for or against each proposed motion shall be entered into the Official Minutes.
- In all cases where a motion is entered in the Official Minutes, the name of the member moving the same shall be entered also.

F. RULES FOR THE PUBLIC

- Board meetings shall be open to the public.
- No person shall be denied the right to address the Board during a public hearing.
- Representatives of an agenda item may address the Board to provide testimony regarding their case, answer questions arising from the public hearing, and answer questions from the Board.
- Anyone addressing the Board shall confine his or her comments to the particular agenda item up for discussion.
- If there is disturbance or disorderly conduct, the presiding officer may clear the Council Chamber.
