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Baseball coach passes away at 41, remembered as family man

Becky Madere summed it up succinctly. “If you knew Curtis, you loved Curtis,” Madere said. Curtis Boudreaux of Norco was just 41 when he passed away on April 5, leaving behind his wife, Brandy, and 14-year-old son Rhett, as well as countless other family members, friends and others who would echo Madere’s sentiment.

Two days before he died, Boudreaux was brought to the hospital for care after he began experiencing stomach pains. He was diagnosed with pancreatitis, and it progressed rapidly.

Madere, close friends with Boudreaux’s wife since the two were 12 years old, said she received a call at 4 a.m. from the latter and learned Boudreaux had fallen very ill.

“I didn’t know he was in the hospital until she called,” Madere said. “That’s how fast it was. So, I told my stepdad, ‘I have to go, can you get my kids ready for school?’ I got in the car and once I got there, to hear them say there’s nothing else they can do ... it’s heartbreaking, just heartbreaking.”

At the Seafood Pot, crawfish is \$2.49

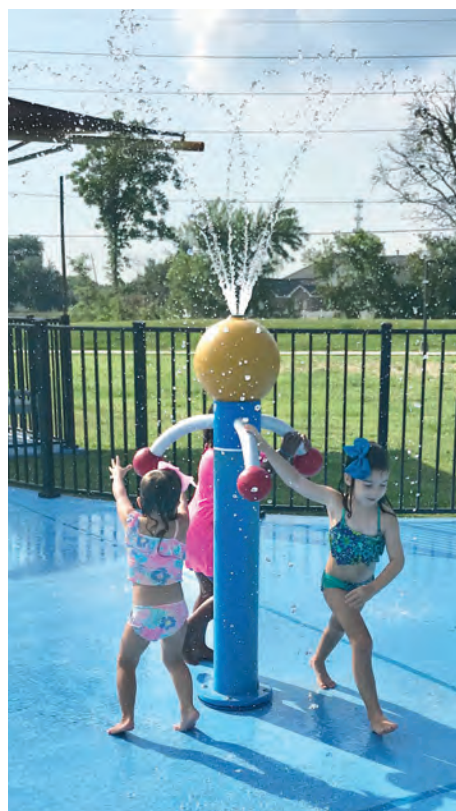

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Luling illustrator sponsoring scholarship for aspiring artists

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Becca Hillburn remembers the doubters she had growing up, and she also remembers the hurdles she had to clear on route to becoming a professional comic artist and, ultimately, a graphic novelist.

And as far as the Luling native is concerned, the more of those obstacles she can help clear for some up and coming artists today, the better.

Hillburn is sponsoring a comics and animation scholarship for underserved art communities called the National Art & Trade Tuition Opportunity (NATTO). It's the third time she's hosted the scholarship. This year's applications are due in by June 30, and is directed toward anyone enrolling in undergraduate or graduate and interested in sequential art (such as comics, storyboard/animation and children's books). The scholarships prizes are \$1,000, \$500 and \$250 for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place, respectively.

Hillburn drew inspiration to back the NATTO scholarship from her experiences as a youth.

"I didn't exactly grow up poor, but our family didn't have money to spare," Hillburn said. "They counted on me getting a TOPS scholarship to pay for college. 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HHS students help the homeless by sleeping in boxes

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Hahnville High School's "Sleep in a Box" event was finally able to take place again this month, and with it came the opportunity for students to learn about the issues homeless people face as well as a chance to raise money for a local charity.

Bodie Dufrene, an HHS English teacher and student council advisor, said this year 34 students participated in the fundraiser. The night raised close to \$300 for Ozanam Inn - a non-profit, direct service agency serving the homeless and underserved of greater New Orleans.

For the event, which was sponsored by the HHS student council, students decorated boxes and then slept in them for one night. During the course of the night, Dufrene said there were presentations related to homelessness statistics and facts, as well as games to engage the students in learning more about the social issue.

The event, which started in 2009, has not taken place for the past couple of years because of the pandemic.

"One of the things that we talked about in the educational piece is what the money we raised can do for the people who are impacted by homelessness," Dufrene said. "I did a little bit of digging about what an organization can do with certain amounts of money and I found that there are some organizations that can provide close to 350 meals for people on \$315 and that's close to what we raised. The students were surprised that the money could stretch that far."

Dufrene said the students really seemed to enjoy the event.

"It's fun, but it's also so special seeing that it's for a good cause and that people in Louisiana are benefitting

Third annual Dat Dad's Club tournament to benefit trio of families

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The Annual Dat Dads' Club Golf Tournament has already accomplished much to help those in need over its first two years in play, and as it gears up for its third year proceeds will benefit three more local families facing very difficult battles.

The families of Glenn Singleton, Macy and Mia Wright and Malissa Gore will be the recipients of funds raised via the tournament, which will take place on Friday, April 29 at Grand Ridge Golf Course.

"We've gotten some great feedback so far ... we're shooting for 32 teams this year," said Scott Bordelon of Dat Dads Club. "And we're really glad to be getting back to it after COVID, It's been a little while since the last one and we're hoping for a great turnout."

The club hasn't been able to hold the tourney for the past two years due to COVID-19. Singleton was scheduled to be the beneficiary of a scheduled tourney last October, but that event had to be cancelled.

Maci Wright was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes in June after initially being misdiagnosed, resulting in her spending a week in ICU care. Her sister Mia Wright has been diagnosed with Crohn's disease after being admitted to Children's Hospital in October. Their portion of funds raised will go toward offsetting medical bills that have been accumulating.

Singleton is an Ama resident and has lived in St. Charles Parish all his life. He is in the midst of a battle with gastric stomach cancer and has endured three surgeries. Singleton is a member of the St. Mark's Perpetual Adoration Chapel (where he has volunteered for 13 years) in Ama, has always been active in the community, coaching in local booster clubs and even served on the Dat Dads' Club Committee to select prior beneficiaries.

He is also a historian and an author, combining those passions to educate

younger generations on those who came before.

In particular, Singleton loves to highlight trailblazers in the black community. His book, Crossing Over: A Tribute to Don Raymond chronicles the life and death of former Hahnville High athletic star Don Raymond, the first black four-sport letterman in Louisiana history. Likewise, Singleton's home hosts something of a local landmark in the community: his Muhammed Ali museum, where the walls are adorned with countless photos of "The Greatest of All Time." Singleton, the self-professed number one fan of Ali, shows others the display to teach about Ali's accomplishments.

Gore, a teacher and coach at R.K. Smith Middle School for the past 16 years, was diagnosed with ALS in February, news that came after months of testing.

A dedicated educator, she utilizes technology to be able to continue teaching her students as her mobility and speech ability declines. Upon her diagnosis, friends, co-workers and community members began to rally around her, organizing different fundraisers and pitching in to help her endure the adjustments and changes to her day-to-day life brought on by the illness.

While she is currently mobile, a wheelchair could be necessary by the end of the school year, and tournament funds are being directed to help her address that and other needs.

Team entry for the tourney is \$400 for a team of four. Golfers will enjoy a round of golf, free food and drinks on the course.

Madere began a GoFundMe page (titled Boudreaux Family) to help the Boudreauxs, who suddenly have major questions to answer and hurdles to clear going forward as they mourn the loss of a beloved husband and father.

“They’ve been together since they were 15 ... and it’s just like, what do you do as a mother?” Madere said. “You lose your husband ... it’s so much to take emotionally, and then financially on top of that, losing that income, that’s got to be scary. I just wanted to do my part to do something to help my best friend. I know Curtis and Brandy would do the same were it me in that situation.”

Already, the fundraiser has raised more than \$5,000, with 50-plus donors pitching in.

“I feel like everyone knew Curtis,” Madere said. “And I thank everyone, from the bottom of my heart, who donated and is helping my best friend ... Curtis would do anything for anybody. If you’re having a crawfish boil, Curtis is there. He’s right there making sure everything is taken care of and that you don’t have to worry about anything ... when Curtis was there, he took care of it all. He’s just a great person who loved his wife and his son more than anything in the world.

“In Brandy’s words, he made her life easy. He made sure they had anything they needed or wanted.”

It’s been an extremely difficult time for Brandy

– nearly three months ago, she lost her sister Holly as well.

“It’s such a hard time for them in general. I don’t know what else to do ... I figured this would be somewhat of a help, just to take any stress off of them that I can,” Madere said.

Boudreaux was an alumnus of Destrehan, and an avid outdoorsman. He loved hunting, boiling seafood and hosting parties.

But according to his family and friends, where he was happiest was being on the baseball diamond and coaching his young players. Boudreaux was head coach of the Louisiana Rivercats travel ball squad, coaching players between the ages of 9 and 12 during his time with them.

He won’t soon be forgotten, according to Jackson Doster, a Rivercats player under Boudreaux.

“My favorite memory of Coach Curtis was when he was jumping up and down as the first base coach in Pigeon Forge and he came down on his foot wrong – and just about broke his ankle,” Doster said. “I loved how he would call me his ‘lil buddy’ and how he always had a positive outlook, whether we were up 17-0 or down 0-17.

“I will never forget him because he developed a great team and formed many bonds between a bunch of wild little kids that still stay in touch to this day ... (Boudreaux) greatly influenced my personality and my baseball career.”

live and \$4.49 boiled, and Donnaud said last week that the price is expected to drop as we move past Easter - already, the price of live crawfish has dropped 50 cents per pound in the days since Easter weekend.

“It’s about the same as a normal year,” Donnaud said. “I think (Easter) is a little earlier in the crawfish season than it normally is, which helps with it. The price of everything is elevated these days ... the price of goods in general, the price of gas – which affects this a lot. But the price and the supply of the crawfish is about on par for what it is in a normal year.”

He said supply has particularly ticked up in recent weeks, which he credits to the weather warming up.

“They’ve been catching a lot more,” Donnaud said, adding that’s a reason he expects the post-Easter price drop to go on as it traditionally does. “The supply looks like it’s going up to the point (the price) should come down some.”

Usually, Donnaud enters the season with a pretty good instinct as to what the aforementioned price, supply and demand will look like. The past few years have largely affected that intuition, however.

“Nowadays, the past two years with everything going on, I don’t know what to expect,” he mused. “Different times. It’s been good to get some kind of normalcy. I was surprised and happy for things to work out like it has this year. And down here, people like this tradition. So, it’s good to see people getting back to it and carrying on.”

He said that’s especially so given all of the fallout from Hurricane Ida.

“Some people were affected more than others, of course,” he said. “But I appreciate everybody who’s been coming in ... people are very resilient, and they love their crawfish. It’s a pastime for them.”

Parish communications director Samantha de Castro said. “The recreation team has been working tirelessly to make repairs to all parks, including the Ormond Splash Park, to ensure the safety of our residents.”

The Ormond Splash Park is part of Ormond Community Park, which is located at 1901 Ormond Boulevard in Destrehan. Amenities of the park include multi-purpose fields, playground

It was only after Hillburn’s father passed away that she would have enough money, through inheritance, to pursue a more formal and strident art education as was able to go to SCAD for sequential arts.

For the past decade, Hillburn has been sharing the knowledge she’s gathered from that education, but she also hopes for aspiring upcoming artists to experience the structure of a college program to learn the comic craft, just like she did.

“I was one of them. I realized hosting a scholarship would be a way to help those

aspiring artists. The NATTO scholarship is structured to help artists at any level boost their craft at any college,” Hillburn said.

As to what she’s looking for, it boils down to raw potential: someone exhibiting a spark and the ability to grow – if not necessarily the most technically skilled artist at the moment.

“I’m not looking for the best artist – there’s plenty of scholarships for that,” she said. “When I see some of the stories these new creators are submitting, their personalities are just bursting through.

They have a voice and that passion fuels their art and writing.

“We need more of these creators, and I can’t think of a better way than to help make education accessible to them.”

Applicants are required to write an essay of 500 words and submit a 12-page portfolio. Those interested in applying may do so at nattosoup.com/scholarship.

In 2020, Hillburn published her second graphic novel, 7” Kara. The book showcased not only Hillburn’s artistic and storytelling talents, but also her home

parish, as the story is set in Hahnville . The book – second in the series about the character – is about a girl who is just seven inches tall and the very different world experiences she comes across as result.

Hillburn teaches comics and water-color through the St. Charles Parish library system, while she also utilizes YouTube and a blog to share her wisdom.

Johnson said the CARE Center also collaborated with the Satellite Center’s digital media and interactive media classes during the planning and execution of the fundraiser.

“We work with that population and their families, so we just love that partnership so much,” Johnson said.

Since 2014 the CARE Center, which is a United Way St. Charles partner agency, has worked collaboratively with a network of organizations across and beyond the parish to engage, empower and uplift young people and their families through programs that promote strengths, address challenges and guide toward lifelong success.

Johnson said the center’s staff advocates for youth and families, helps them navigate the network of services, coordinates social services across the public and private sectors and refers youth and



families to services and resources based on assessed needs.

“We help over 1,000 community members every year get their needs met by breaking down barriers to access,” she said.

In 2018 the center established their flagship program, CARE Navigator, which is an innovative assessment service for young people and their families. The program is designed to identify and

address health and wellness challenges leading youth to struggle at school, home or in the community. Navigators work with families to assess their strengths and needs, motivate them to recognize where they may need support, and empower them to begin the difficult process of change. Since its launch, CARE Navigator has served over 500 families — a 5-fold increase since the last CARE Affair in 2019.

“While we’re incredibly proud of this growth, we’re already busy setting goals to make an even bigger impact,” Johnson said. “With the help of partners like United Way of St. Charles and the Valero Energy Foundation, the CARE Center is working to deepen our presence across St. Charles Parish in order to connect directly with families in the community.”

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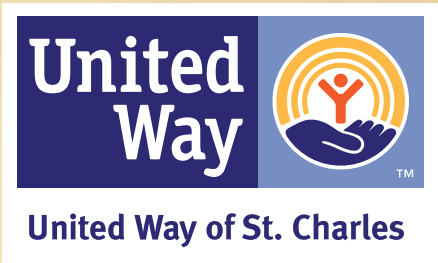
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Wildcats race past Tigers, 8-0

Power surge, shutout propel Destrehan to win over Hahnville

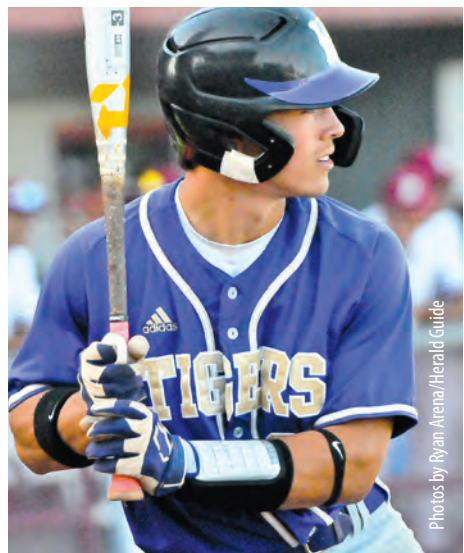
When John Carmichael took the mound for Destrehan Monday against archrival Hahnville, he entered the game having allowed just three earned runs all season – and yet just four wins to show for it.

And when Monday's District 7-5A showdown ended, Carmichael's earned run count stayed at three. His run support didn't stay remotely as constant.

The Destrehan bats exploded for eight runs, highlighted by back-to-back home runs by Shane Lee and Noah Simon, and Carmichael pitched a three-hit shutout as Destrehan felled Hahnville 8-0, creating a three-team sprint to capture 7-5A championship honors – but one Destrehan now controls.

"It was a great team win," said Carmichael. "I was just trying to fill it up and make them put the ball in play, and I know the defense will make plays behind me ... (winning a rivalry game) is why you play the sport. This is fun. Everyone came in locked in and ready ... we were energized today."

DHS (18-12, 7-2) emerged from the game with two district losses while HHS (15-17, 7-3) and Terrebonne each had three, with the Wildcats' remaining district battles coming against both teams. Destrehan was set for its second game against Hahnville on Wednesday, after press time (check Heraldguide.com for results from that contest following its conclusion). Were DHS to win out, it would seal the outright district championship; other scenarios including two or even three-team ties atop the league to

end the season.

"We've been preaching that all week, that if we close this thing out, go 1-0 over each of the next few games, we can win district, and that's the goal," said Destrehan head baseball coach Chris Mire. "But nothing is gonna be easy. We're gonna go to Hahnville on Wednesday, and they're gonna be ready. That's a very proud program ... they're going to respond after today. It wasn't their best day and we know we've got our work cut out for us."

"But I also feel like we're locked in and we're ready."

But on Monday, Lee, Simon and Carmichael led the way for one of Destrehan's most complete efforts of the season. Simon went 2-for-3 with two RBIs and a run scored and Lee went 1-for-3 with three RBIs and a run scored, both efforts including a home run. Carmichael went the complete game, striking out eight and walking none. Jonah Haslauer also had a strong day at the plate, going 1-for-1 with two walks, two runs scored and two RBIs.

For Hahnville, Talan Theriot, Colin Galland and Donovan Friloux each collected hits. Landon Cortez took the loss

on the mound, going four innings.

But it was Simon's glove – and arm – that made the day's first major impact. Hahnville threatened in the top of the second inning after Galland and Babin got on with one out. Carmichael recorded a strikeout next, but then Friloux singled to centerfield and Galland raced around third with an eye on scoring.

Simon secured the ball and uncorked a throw to home, where Jayse Degruy tagged Galland out to end the inning and the threat.

"He's amazing," Carmichael said of Simon. "A ball gets hit to him with two outs and you just know you can start walking to the dugout, because he's going to make the play. He has a cannon."

Cortez and Carmichael each nailed down 1-2-3 innings before Destrehan locked in at the plate in the bottom of the third, plating five runs to take control of the game.

Gage Harding singled and Cole Moran walked to lead off the inning. Cortez logged a strikeout, but Haslauer socked a double to right field to bring home the days first runs, putting DHS up 2-0.

With two outs, Lee walked to the plate

and on a 2-2 count, he launched a rocket over the right field wall to make it a 4-0 game.

"When I got to the plate, I was just thinking I've got to bust this game open," Lee said. "Something just told me you've got to put this one over, and I did it ... it felt good. As soon as I hit it, I knew it was gone."

Simon came up next for an encore and was just as impressive, sending a fastball over the centerfield wall for a solo shot to make it 5-0.

"(Cortez) actually made a pretty good pitch with two strikes, a changeup ... Shane went down and got it, and he's just so strong that he lifted it out," Mire said. "I think after that a weight was lifted off the team. We got that first big knock, then Noah followed up with a pretty big knock itself, another home run, back-to-back."

"With Shane in the four-hole and Noah behind him, it gives us two really good hitters with a high baseball IQ that can do a lot of potential damage."

In the fourth inning, Destrehan added to the lead after Moran, Haslauer and Carmichael loaded the bases with one out. Lee came up to bat and was hit by a pitch, forcing in another run to make it 6-0. Ditto for Simon, making it 7-0. Keston Granier's sacrifice fly made it 8-0, more than enough for Carmichael and the defense to protect the rest of the way.

For a Destrehan team that's relied heavily on pitching and defense for much of the season, the offensive power surge was notable and could bode good things for the coming weeks. A tweak to the lineup has coincided with an uptick in offensive production of late, as Granier was recently moved up to the six-hole, a spot that's seemingly agreed quite well with the senior.

"He's been a really big difference-maker over the last three or four games, coming up with some big hits," Mire said. "He's kind of taken off ... he's confident, he's relaxed and he's really starting to see the ball ... it's stretching our lineup and making us even stronger."

Hahnville head coach David Baudry said falling behind a pitcher like Carmichael isn't remotely a comfortable place to be, and that it put the Tigers in a tough spot.

"We made pitches and they hit good pitches today," Baudry said. "And when you fall behind a kid like Carmichael who's pounding the middle (of the strike zone), he's giving us nothing for free. You have to earn everything and that's really difficult when you're behind 5-0."

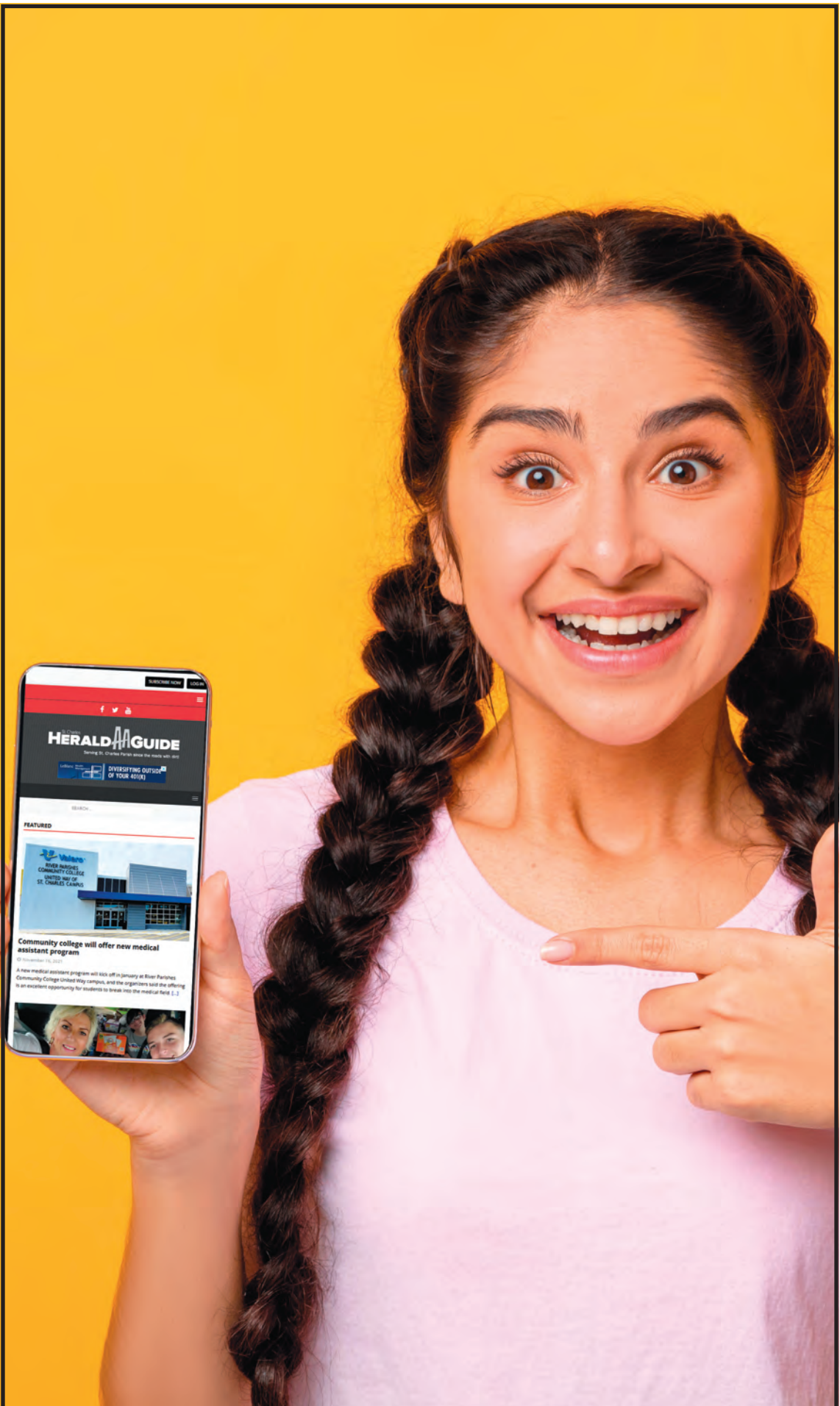
