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Hahnville family loses home in fire, makes harrowing escape

At 6:30 a.m. on March 30, Stacey Trosclair woke up smelling smoke, but wrote that off as likely sugar cane burning nearby.

Two minutes later, the fire alarm in her Hahnville home went off, and when her husband Cory opened the front door, a terrifying vision laid before him.

“Our whole porch was engulfed in flames,” Trosclair said.

She heard Cory yell that the house was on fire. Attempts to put the fire out were unsuccessful and escape was the only option. But the back door was blocked – not a viable exit route.

Worse, the window in Trosclair’s room was jammed shut and the black smoke produced by the fire was pouring in, rendering it impossible to see and very difficult to breathe.

“He threw his arm through the window to break it,” Trosclair said. “He had no choice ... he breaks it with his arm, kicks the window unit out and we

Two River Region facilities, Ochsner Vision Center – Destrehan and Ochsner Performance Training – St. Charles, held ribbon cutting ceremonies last week to mark the opening of these locations. Ochsner Vision Center – Destrehan, located at 13100 River Road, Suite 220, is equipped with an autorefractor allowing for a quick reading for prescription glasses before a complete exam, a pachymeter to measure the thickness of a patient's cornea, a vision center for eyeglasses and contact lenses and three exam rooms with the ability to treat most vision needs. Patients can make appointments to see Ochsner optometry and ophthalmology providers Monday – Friday. Ochsner officials already has expansion plans in mind for the vision center, with enhanced vision services and capabilities planned for the future. These include retinal topography to diagnosis retinal issues and fundus photo equipment to photograph the back of the eye to view the retina, optic nerve head and the macula. Ochsner Performance Training – St.

Charles is located at 105 Plantation Road and offers a strength and conditioning program for individuals from as young as 7 years old to adults. jumped out the trailer.”

The couple’s pets were still inside. Their roommate Jodie saved Bella, one of the small dogs in the home. Firefighters were able to save another, Harley Quinn. But the couple’s cats didn’t make it out – the Trosclairs’ living room was completely destroyed by fire, made worse when the propane tanks underneath the trailer exploded.



“That’s when I took off running,” Trosclair said. “The EMS came and took us to the ambulance. I was crying like crazy for my dogs and cats.”

The Trosclairs and their roommate escaped with minor injuries – Jodie’s sprained MCL and Cory’s stitched arm from the window the most pressing of those. The dogs needed a bit more attention: Harley Quinn went into and out of consciousness several times and had to be put on oxygen before being brought to the vet for treatment.

What isn’t known yet is what started the fire. Trosclair said the fire department has deduced the incident began on the porch for sure, but beyond that nothing is certain.

Trosclair called it one of the most frightening experiences she has been through.

“It was traumatizing for sure,” she said. “It’s been depressing, and our anxiety has been high ... we haven’t been sleeping well. But we’re hanging in there and taking it a day at a time.”

She began a GoFundMe page (titled House Fire) to help with medical and veterinary costs, as well as replacing furniture, appliances and other items lost as the couple starts over.

The good news is that insurance was able to provide enough assistance for the couple to use for a down payment on a used trailer. In the meantime, they have been staying with Trosclair’s parents.

“Everything is replaceable. We’ve started over before and we’ll get through this and overcome again,” Trosclair said.

– as well as many of its landmarks – in his now award-winning work. Last summer, the video game named after and inspired by the east bank St. Charles Parish town took a top honor in the Tribeca Festival’s first-ever games competition, a recognition that honors an unreleased video game for its potential for excellence in art and storytelling through design and artistic mastery.

That honor was achieved many months before the game would become available to the public – which it now is, its release on the game platform Steam coming with numerous strong reviews. The LA Times called it 2022’s best game thus far. PC Gamer called it “a bastion of beautifully evocative storytelling.” According to the Financial Times, “the game is a joyous and sobering voyage along the periphery of the great American left-behind.”

“We’ve been really appreciative of the reception,” Yuts said. “We’ve been hearing so many good things. It’s a pretty niche genre, but it seems like more and more people have been playing it, more people than I was expecting. And a lot of people from the region have been playing as well, which has been great to hear.”

The game takes players through some very recognizable areas for locals. Apple Street and Airline Highway within the game’s namesake, but also areas in New Orleans, Metairie and Kenner – the Esplanade Mall, while not named, stands as a notable landmark in the latter as the “Promenade Mall.”

Players take on the persona of Kay, a woman who has returned to the town she grew up following a family tragedy. Through her adventures, one encounters talking birds, alligators bent on revenge and deranged cultists. The world Yuts and his team, known as Geography of Robots, have built is not a perfect mirror of today’s, nor is it meant as one: this is a dystopian Sci-Fi fantasy world based upon our real one.

“People reach out and talk about the landscapes they’re recognizing in the game,” Yuts said. “(The game) does get rather strange toward the end and it’s pretty interesting to hear them talk about that as well. But it’s a short game. The learning curve is very shallow and I think it’s been kind of a quick and easy way of generating conversation and interaction with people.”

This all started almost 15 years ago. Yuts, now 36, said the genesis actually stems from “a world history project” with a close friend. After Hurricane Katrina, the two were doing archival research about different Louisiana industries. Through that, the two recorded numerous conversations with locals about their lives and the region they live in.

“We drew from that quite a bit,” Yuts said. “We were shooting videos, writing essays, experimenting with different mediums. So, I know how to code a bit. And I put together a little side-scroller game in JavaScript. That kind of ended up being the springboard.”



For many St. Charles Parish residents, topics the game tackles will no doubt be relatable. Flooding and environmental precarity are among the issues touched upon.

“For a lot of people, those are things that have affected them pretty deeply,” Yuts said. “People have written some personal responses that are extremely moving. And that’s been something that will stick with me for the rest of my life.”

Yuts said that once one plays through Norco, they’re beyond the final page of the story: there will be no sequel, as this game was never intended to be part of a larger, expanded universe. But he hasn’t closed the door on potentially returning for a round two of game-making, a decision he and his teammates will have more clarity on come the end of summer, he said.

“It’s incredibly time-consuming ... so I don’t know if I’ll make another game or not. But we’ve talked to people about it, had some discussions. We’ll see how the summer goes, whether it’s a viable option,” Yuts said.

“I can’t overstate my gratitude for everyone who has expressed interest and appreciation (for Norco). It really means the world.”

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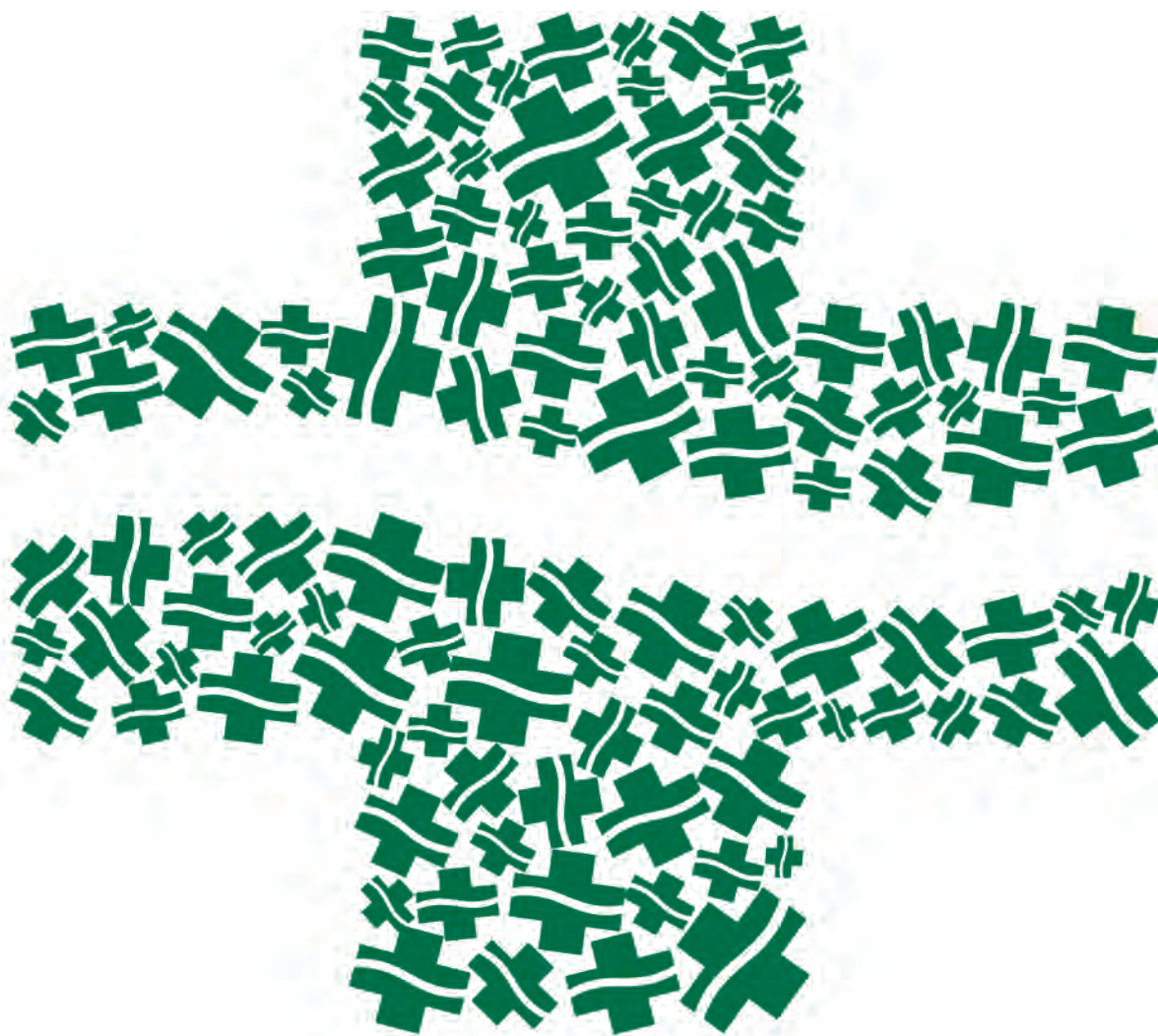

drugs and research now it's 50 plus. If that has any statement as to what your donations go towards then it's priceless ... this money goes to scientific research and allowing my child to have the longest, healthiest life possible."

Amanda said Avery's daily regime includes taking five pills every time she eats – which equates to approximately 600 pills a month.

"She also takes a multivitamin, artificial pancreatic enzymes and a CFTR modulator drug daily," Amanda said. "She also does compressive vest therapy. It's been a great stride thus far, and we have a lifetime to go. Overall she's in good health ... she's a champ about taking the medicine ... it's just a part of who she is."

Each year the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation hosts the Great Stride's event, the foundation's largest national fundraiser, to help raise awareness and fund research for Cystic Fibrosis. This year the event will be held on May 14, and fundraising is open until the end of the year. For more

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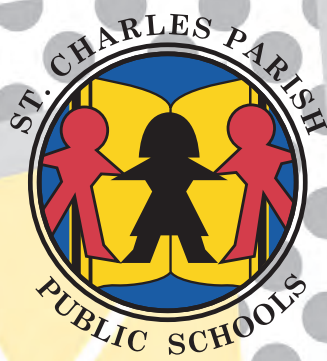
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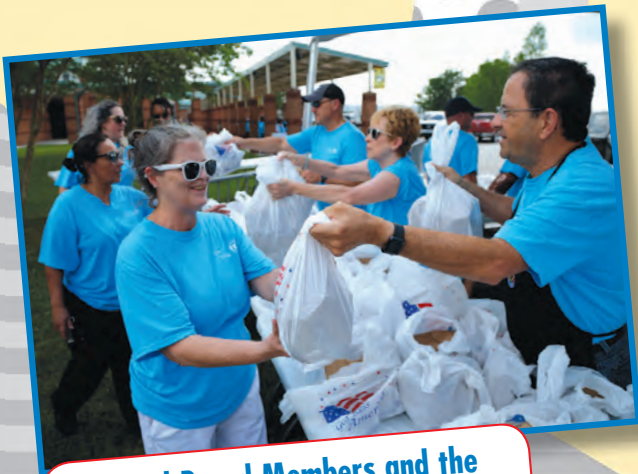

The event made its debut last year, and the format will not change. The event will be held at the Bonnet Carre Spillway Lower Guide Levee Boat Launch, with anglers of all ages invited to participate in categories including bass, bream, catfish, sac-a-lait and miscellaneous.

Registration for anglers 12 years old and under is \$5, and \$10 for those 13 years and older. Participants can register online through May 19 and view the rodeo rules through the St. Charles Parish Parks and Recreation website.

Competition begins at daybreak with weigh-in at 1 p.m. and awards and door prizes.

The Fish Dat Rodeo is open to all St. Charles Parish residents and legal Louisiana fishing licensed persons. A Louisiana fishing license is required for anglers 16 and older. All Louisiana fishing regulations apply.

Sixty-four people registered and participated for last year’s event, which had to be delayed for several days due to weather issues. Rain was expected for the rescheduled date as well, but the anglers dodged the rain and the event enjoyed a successful debut.

“We probably have about 35 participants now, with a couple of weeks left to go,” Foret said Monday. “So, we’re above the halfway point already from last year and we’re in great shape to top our number (of participants) from last year. We’d be really excited if we were to hit 100 participants. That would be



awesome in our second year.”

There will be door prizes awarded for contestants, prizes including fishing poles, tackle boxes and ice chests.

There will be an age 12-and-under division specializing in bank fishing, as well as divisions for 17-and-under and 18-and-over.

Foret said the hopes are this event will not only continue on for years to come, but grow bigger and better as time goes on. One reason for that optimism is the West Bank boat launch planned in Des Allemands.

“One day, we’re anticipating we could have this big rodeo, transferred over to that site,” Foret said. “Or you could even see hold Fish Dat as we are, then later on in a year at Des Allemands, and have two rodeos depending on how participation goes. We’re excited about that project.”

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Perrier named new DHS softball head coach

With openings to fill at its softball, girls’ volleyball and girls’ basketball head coaching positions, Destrehan has had a busy time of late, but it now can cross the first of those off of the list, staying in -house to do so.

Craig Perrier Jr. will be the successor to retiring head coach Kenneth Montz, who just completed his final season with the Ladycats after more than a decade on the job. Montz led the Ladycats to the farthest playoff run in program history in 2019, as DHS reached the state quarterfinals, and the team returned to the playoffs in each of the past two seasons under his watch.

Perrier has served as an assistant coach with the Ladycats under Montz for the past 10 years and has been an assistant football and baseball coach as well in his 15 years at Destrehan, his alma mater. In the classroom, he teaches carpentry and is known for extending his efforts out into the community, while teaching his students to do the same.

He re-established the Handyman Crew at Destrehan in 2015, in which carpentry students band together to utilize their collective skills and help people address needs in the community, with one example the crew building wheelchair ramps for the homes of elderly and disabled people in need around the community.

Destrehan went 15-15 in 2022, ultimately falling in a round one battle at Central-Baton Rouge after earning the

No. 27 seed in Class 5A.

Perrier said the news was realization of a dream come true, as this will be his first opportunity to serve as the head coach of a program.

“I’ve known I wanted to be a head coach for years,” Perrier said. “I’m ready to make the tough decisions ... Principal (Jason) Madere came to my house to tell me, said ‘I wanted to tell you in person. Congratulations.’” That felt pretty great.

“So, now, everything falls on me. The good decisions and the bad decisions. No matter which way any of those decisions go, good or bad, every one of them is going to be made toward the betterment of the players and the program.”

Perrier earned the nod out of five finalists who were in consideration.

Though this has long been a goal of his, there was a time he saw nothing resembling a future coaching softball.

“I was coaching baseball at the time, but was stepping away because my son was playing baseball at Hahnville, and I didn’t want to miss that,” Perrier said. “Principal (Stephen) Weber came to me and said, ‘I need a commitment for a year ... I need you to go coach softball for one year.’ And I thought, wow, you’re out of your mind. No way.

“But after a week, that’s all it took ... I realized it was the right decision. I fell in love with the game and I wanted to learn as much as I could. The different scenarios you run into, the fast pace of the game ... it just really grabbed hold of my interest.”

Much as it’s been for years in the classroom, his aim is to help his players not only become better at their craft, but better people as well.

“Just teaching kids to do that through a game,” Perrier said.

Montz is retiring after 30-plus years as a coach and educator. He took the helm of the Ladycats program in 2010 and since that time he has led the program to 200 wins, a mark he hit down the stretch of his final season.

He said his time guiding the team is an experience he wouldn’t trade for the

world.

“It’s been fantastic,” Montz said following a late-season victory over South Lafourche. “I’ve enjoyed every single minute of it here. It’s just time for me to go. I’m pushing 33 years of doing this, and it’s time to go do other things. I wish it could go on, but it’s time.”

“They’re going to win a lot more games. They’ll be in a good situation ... I feel like I’m leaving it in a better situation than when I started, and I’m looking forward to seeing them continue to do good things.”

of the way, the defense stayed within striking distance throughout – the two sides were tied at halftime after defensive coordinator Carey Melvin called a heads-up time out just before time expired, forcing the offense to run one more play which resulted in a turnover on downs, and the extra points to go with it.

The defense found some life, however, on the back of a deflection and interception by defensive lineman Deontre Young, cutting the offense’s lead to six. But the first team was able to clinch the win on Friloux’s run.

Tashawn Butler scored on a 12-yard touchdown run and fellow running back Calvin Smith got loose on a breakaway 35-yard score.

Luquet said he’s eager to see what the offensive unit is capable of in the upcoming season, with a talented stable of backs, an experienced group of receivers and Friloux in his second starting campaign

One area the team must work quickly to develop is along the offensive line, where four new starters must emerge.

“Just seeing how physical they are, how they run block and pass block ... we’ve got a lot of guys rotating in,” Luquet said. “We’re trying to figure out who it’s going to be.”

Dakota Williams, who missed most of last season due to injury, is rehabbed and back to 100 percent, Luquet said, though he was held out of the scrimmage for precautionary reasons.

Defensively, Friloux was impressed with what he saw on the other side, and added there’s still much work to be done for the offense.

“It felt good to get out here,” Friloux said. “We still have a lot to do, though. We played against a really good defense today ... I didn’t think I played too well throughout. We kind of put things together (on the late touchdown drive), things I was looking for to come open, came open, and that was the case on the touchdown over the middle to Josh.”

Luquet said Friday marked a bit of a milestone in the relatively short history of the Burger Bowl – over the six years he’s overseen the scrimmage as a prep head coach, this is the first time the offense had won.

“They’re getting on me, how ‘you paid off the officials,’” Luquet said with a smile. He is usually the offensive playcaller, but he ceded all of that responsibility to his assistants for the Burger Bowl.

For at least the next year, the offense gets the bragging rights from this day – and some of the winner’s swag that goes with it.

“My mom got the trophy for us,” Luquet said, referring to the winner’s trophy with a hamburger adorning the top. “We take a picture with the winning team in front of the scoreboard with it and put it in the locker room ... it’s a chance for the guys to talk a little smack and a lot of fun for everybody.”



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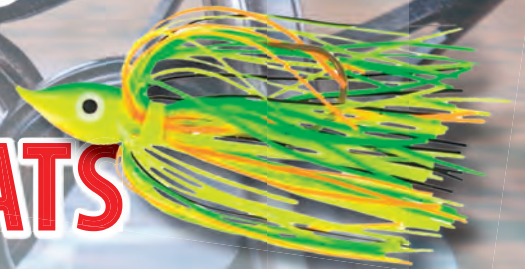


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Planning for St. Charles Parish Library’s summer reading is in full swing

The St. Charles Parish Library’s 2022 summer reading program will officially begin June 1, but planning, prepping and decorating for the popular two-month long celebration is happening now at library branches across the parish.

Library Assistant Director Lauren Campo Pitz said the excitement level of library employees is high about the annual reading program, which runs through July 31.

“For librarians, summer reading is like Christmas if you work in retail,” she said. “It’s our big time of year, and for a lot of our new employees this is their first real summer reading program that’s back to normal.”

While the library system offered reading programs in the summers of 2020 and 2021, many offerings were only offered via curbside pick-up or virtually because of the pandemic.

That is changing this year. “Last year we were still avoiding big events that would draw a big crowd, so we’re really excited about this summer reading program,” Pitz said. “We have some really cool children’s musicians and performers that will be coming - like Roger Day. He did a great virtual performance for us last year, so we’re really excited to have him back in person.”

Pitz said the summer reading program is for all ages. “We have things for tiny children through adults,” she said. “Beanstack makes it easy for families to

read together.” Beanstack is a website – and app – that the library system uses for summer reading participants to log hours read. Participants will win a prize after reading for 360 minutes, and Pitz said the summer program will also feature grand prizes.

Sign up via Beanstack for the summer reading will begin May 16. Anyone interested in the summer reading program but unable to access Beanstack can visit any library branch, Pitz said, for assistance.

The 2022 summer reading program theme is Oceans of Possibilities, and Pitz said the parish’s six library branches are currently being decorated to transport visitors under the sea.

The library system has created a manual that highlights all of the accompanying performers, arts and craft offerings, planetarium programming and more that the summer reading program encompasses. The manual will be available at myscpl.org, and Pitz said a copy will be mailed to each parish home later this month.

Summer reading program kick-off parties, which will include everything from photo areas and scavenger hunts to games and stories, will take place June 1 and 2 across the parish. Yard signs and collectible brag tags will also be available at the parties while supplies last.

On June 1 the Paradis Branch will celebrate from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., the Norco Branch will party from 11 a.m.

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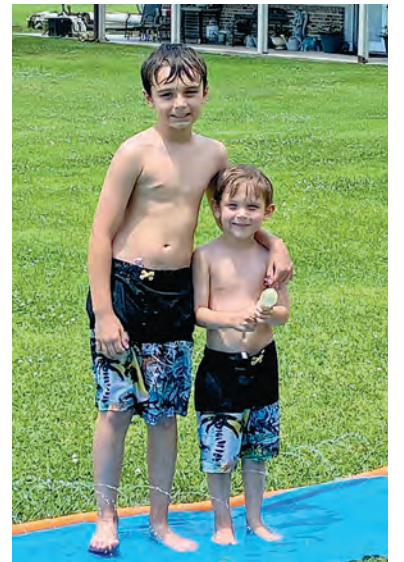

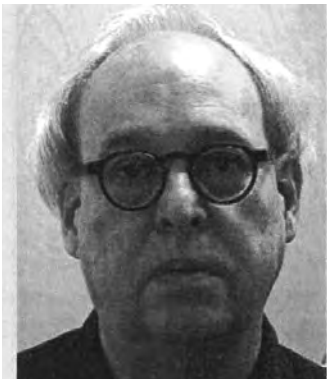

On property where trash and/or debris accumulation is such that it requires heavy equipment, bulldozer, front-end loaders, etc. a fee of forty-three dollars and eighty six cents (\$43.96) per cubic yard will be assessed. An administration fee of \$36.63 may be assessed on each invoice. The fees in this section shall be increased or decreased on February first of each year by a change in CIP applicable to the US cities average group, all urban consumers, all items published by the US Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, for the preceding twelve-month period ending each November. The change shall become effective beginning with the period ending November 30, 2000. The department of finance shall notify the department of planning and zoning in writing annually of the revised fees.

WHEREAS, as specified in Louisiana Revised Statutes 17:71.1 the St. Charles Parish School Board is required to redraw the boundaries of the voting districts every ten (10) years in accordance with the decennial census; and,

WHEREAS, the Census was taken in 2020, and the population data was released by the Census Bureau in August of 2021; and,

WHEREAS, boundaries of any election district for a new apportionment plan from which members of a school board are elected shall contain whole precincts established by the parish governing authority; and,

WHEREAS, if a school board is unable to comply with applicable law regarding redistricting and reapportionment, including adherence to traditional

redistricting principles, in the creation of its redistricting or reapportionment plan through the use of whole precincts, the school board may, in the creation of its redistricting or reapportionment plan, divide a precinct into portions which are bounded by visible features which are census tabulation boundaries. No such precinct shall be divided into more than two school board districts. No school board district shall contain more than three divided precincts; and,

WHEREAS, the St. Charles Parish School Board has examined, reviewed, and considered various alternative alignments based upon the findings of the United States Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census; and,

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and effective as of the _____ day of _____, 2022 by and between ST. CHARLES PARISH acting herein by and through its President, who is duly authorized to act on behalf of said Parish, hereinafter called the OWNER, and Principal Engineering, Inc., a corporation and/or limited liability company acting herein by and through its Contracting Officer, hereinafter called CONSULTANT, duly authorized by corporate resolution or certificate of authority attached hereto and made a part hereof. Whereas the Owner desires to employ a professional consulting firm to perform consulting work and services for A/E Services for Department of Waterworks East and West Bank Generators and Structure Project No. WWKS 111.

1.0 GENERAL TERMS

The Owner agrees to employ the Consultant and the Consultant agrees to perform professional services required for the project described above. Consultant will conform to the requirements of the Owner and to the standards of the agencies participating with the Owner in the Project. The Consultant will coordinate all work between the Owner and all participating agencies and regulating agencies, if needed. Written authorization to begin different phases of the project will be given to the Consultant by the Owner, including Conceptual, Preliminary Design, Final Design, Bidding Assistance and Construction and Services. The Owner may terminate the Contract by written notification and without cause per Section 11.0 during any phase of the project.

The Consultant shall at all times during this Agreement maintain a valid Louisiana Consulting License and any other applicable licenses necessary for performance of the Project.

All work shall be under the direction of the Owner, and all plans, specifications, etc. shall be submitted to the Owner and all approvals and administration of this contract shall be through the Owner.

2.0 PROJECT

2.1 The Owner hereby contracts with the CONSULTANT to perform all necessary professional services in connection with the project as defined as follows:

A/E Services for Department of Waterworks East and West Bank Generators and Structure
Project No. WWKS 111

2.2 The Project consist of the scope of services and work as defined in Attachment "A" hereto.

2.3 Consultant shall perform all scope of services and work in accordance with the Schedule as defined in Attachment "B" hereto unless otherwise mutually agreed upon by the parties in writing.

2.4 The Consultant agrees to comply with all Federal, State, and Local Laws and Ordinances applicable to the scope of services and work or in entering any other agreement with any another party to complete the work.

3.0 SERVICES OF CONSULTANT

3.1 Consultant shall provide Owner professional work and services in all phases of the Project to which this Agreement applies and as hereinafter provided to properly plan and execute the work on the project(s) assigned to the Consultant. These services may include but may not be limited to serving as Owner's professional consulting representative for the Project, providing professional consultation and advice, and furnishing customary architectural, civil, surveying, geotechnical, structural, mechanical, electrical, instrumentation and control consulting services and construction consulting and inspection.

3.2 Services provided by the Consultant shall be performed in accordance with generally accepted professional consulting practice at the time and the place where the services are rendered.

3.3 Consultant shall obtain from Owner authorization to proceed in writing for each phase of the Project.

3.4 Consultant shall provide minutes of all meetings with St. Charles Parish regarding any phase of the Project.

3.5 Consultant shall provide work and services to complete the project, including all necessary services described herein or usually implied as a prerequisite for the performance of the services whether or not specifically mentioned in this agreement, including attendance by the Consultant at project conferences and public hearings.

3.6 The Phases of the Project are as defined in Attachment "A".

4.0 OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

4.1 Documents including but not limited to plans, specifications, maps, basic survey notes, sketches, charts, computations and all other data prepared or obtained under the terms of this authorization shall become the property of the Owner and shall be made available for Owner's inspection at any time during the Project and, shall be delivered to the Owner prior to termination or final completion of the Contract.

4.2 Consultant may retain a set of documents for its files.

4.3 Reuse of Documents. Any reuse of documents or materials without written authorization or adaptation by Consultant to the specific purpose intended will be at Owner's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Consultant or to Consultant's independent professional associates, subcontractors, and consultants.

4.4 No materials, to include but not limited to reports, maps or other documents produced as a result of this Contract, in whole or in part, shall be available to Consultant for copyright purposes. Any such materials produced as a result of this Contract that might be subject to copyright shall be the property of the Owner and all such rights shall belong to the Owner, and the Owner shall be sole and exclusive entity who may exercise such rights.

5.0 SUPPLEMENTARY SERVICES

The Consultant shall provide, when requested in writing by the Owner, supplementary services not included in the basic work and services.

The compensation to the Consultant for the supplemental services, when performed by the Consultant, shall be in the form of a lump sum, billable hours, or "not to exceed" hourly rate which is mutually agreeable to the Owner and the Consultant in writing.

Such supplementary services may include the following:

- A. Soil investigations
- B. Laboratory inspection of materials and equipment
- C. Right-of-Way, easement and property acquisition surveys, plats, maps and documents
- D. Any major revisions for which the Consultant is not responsible, that are authorized by the Owner after the completion and approval of either the preliminary or final plans and specifications
- E. Services concerning replacement of any work damaged by fire or other causes during construction
- F. Services made necessary by the default of the contractor in the performance of the construction contract
- G. Services as an expert witness in connection with court proceedings
- H. Traffic consulting if necessary
- I. Topographic Survey
- J. Preparation of Environmental Assessment documents and/or Environmental Permits
- K. If all or part of the work is to be financed by a Federal or State Grant, the Consultant shall assist the Owner in the preparation of the Grant application and with the Grant Administration, unless otherwise specifically agreed upon previously herein.

6.0 DEFECTIVE WORK

During such visits and on the basis of such observations, Consultant may disapprove of or reject Contractor's work while it is in progress if Consultant believes that such work will not produce a completed Project that conforms generally to the Contract Documents or that it will prejudice the integrity of the design concept of the Project as reflected in the Contract Documents

7.0 NOTICE TO PROCEED

The Owner shall notify the Consultant in writing to undertake the services stated in this Agreement, and the Consultant shall commence the services within ten (10) days after receipt of such notification.

If the Owner desires to divide the Project into various parts, a Notice to Proceed shall be issued for each part, and the Owner and the Consultant shall mutually agree upon the period of time within which services for each part of the Project shall be performed.

The Consultant will be given time extensions for delays beyond their control or for those caused by tardy approvals of work in progress by various official agencies, but no additional compensation shall be allowed for such delays.

8.0 PAYMENTS

8.1 Owner shall pay Consultant for the performance of work and services as outlined in Attachment "C" to this Agreement.

8.2 Payment for Consultant work and services on projects that do not require construction services, such as feasibility studies or drainage studies, shall be made based upon Consultant's estimate of the proportion of the services actually completed at the time of billing and shall be made in partial payments at monthly intervals.

8.3 If the Project, or any portion thereof, is not completed for any reason, the final fee for consulting work and services shall be negotiated between Owner and Contractor. If the final fee for work and services is not mutually agreed upon, either party may elect in writing to submit the dispute to mediation. If mediation is not mutually agreed upon, written notice will be submitted to the other party of the intent to submit the dispute to the 29th Judicial District Court of St. Charles Parish, State of Louisiana.

8.4 If authorized in writing by Owner, for the performance of, or for obtaining from others Additional Services which are not considered normal or customary consulting, the Owner shall pay Consultant based on monthly invoices submitted by the Consultant, within sixty (60) days of receipt of Consultant's invoice. Consultant shall provide written notice to Owner when no services or work have been performed during a given month.

8.5 For Additional Authorized Services provided by the Consultant such as, but not limited to, wetlands permitting, land and right-of-way acquisition, surveying, NPDES and LADEQ permit renewal or acquisition work, etc. Owner shall pay Consultant based on an agreed upon hourly rate(s) between the Owner and Consultant. Payment shall be not-to-exceed based on hourly rates and actual hours worked.

8.6 The following documentation shall be required for payment to Consultant and shall be attached to the monthly invoice.

a. A copy of the Owner's written authorization to perform the service.

b. Timesheets for all hours invoiced.

c. Invoice copies, logs or other substantiation of non-salary expenses.

8.7 For Additional Authorized Services that Consultant acquires from subcontractors and/or subconsultants, Owner shall pay Consultant a fixed sum previously agreed upon by Owner and Consultant, such sum to be established in each case when the scope of the work involved has been determined and before any of the Additional Services are provided. The use of subcontractors and/or subconsultants shall be subject to the provisions set forth in this Agreement. The following documentation shall be required for payment to Consultant and shall be attached to the monthly invoice:

a. A copy of the Owner's written consent for the subcontractor and/or subconsultant to perform the service stating the Owner's and Consultant's agreed upon fixed sum established for the service performed.

b. Evidence that the subcontractor and/or subconsultant is insured as required by this Agreement.

8.8 For Supplementary Services described in Section 5, Owner shall pay Consultant for the fee negotiated at the time the work is assigned by the method stipulated in the contract amendment.

9.0 BUDGET LIMITATIONS

The construction budget for this Project shall be determined by the Owner, and the Consultant shall be advised of the budget limitation in writing by the Owner and the Consultant shall indicate his acceptance of same in writing to the Owner. Any subsequent budget revisions shall be confirmed in writing.

If, at the completion of the Preliminary or Design Phase, the Consultant does not concur with the construction budget, he shall so notify the Owner, and the Consultant and Owner shall mutually agree on a revised construction budget prior to any work on the Design Phase.

If no bid is received within the budget limitation and a redesign of the project is required by the Owner, such redesign shall be accomplished by the Consultant at no additional cost to the Owner, provided, however, if the receipt of bids is, for any reason, delayed beyond a period of six (6) months from the date of the completion of the Design Phase the amount stated as the construction budget shall be adjusted, immediately prior to the time bids are received, by use of a construction cost index acceptable to both parties of this agreement.

10.0 FUNDS

No work shall be authorized until funds are established for each individual task.

11.0 TERMINATION OR SUSPENSION

11.1 This Agreement may be terminated for any reason by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice.

11.2 The Consultant, upon receipt of such notice, shall immediately discontinue all services in connection with the performance of this Agreement and shall proceed to cancel promptly all existing orders and contracts insofar as such orders or contracts are chargeable to this Agreement.

11.3 The Consultant shall, as soon as practicable after receipt of notice of termination, submit a statement showing in detail the services performed and payments received under this Agreement to the date of termination.

11.4 The Owner shall then pay the Consultant promptly that portion of the prescribed fee to which both parties agree.

11.5 Consultant fully acknowledges that no payment will be made for any work performed or expenses incurred after receipt of the termination by either party unless mutually agreed upon in writing.

11.6 Failure to meet agreed delivery dates or authorized extensions are considered substantial failures and breach of this contractual agreement by Consultant.

11.7 This agreement shall automatically terminate upon satisfactory completion of all services and obligations described herein or three (3) years from the date of its execution, whichever ever event occurs first.

12.0 INSURANCE

12.1 The Consultant shall secure and maintain at his expense such insurance that will protect him and the Owner, from claims under Workmen's Compensation Acts and from claims for bodily injury, death or property damage which may arise from performance of services under this Agreement. Insurance for bodily injury or death shall be in the unencumbered amount of \$1,000,000.00 for one person and not less than \$1,000,000.00 for all injuries and/or deaths resulting from any one occurrence. The insurance for property damage shall be in the unencumbered amount of \$1,000,000.00 for each accident and not less than \$1,000,000.00 aggregate.

12.2 The Consultant shall also secure and maintain at his expense professional liability insurance in the unencumbered sum of \$1,000,000.00.

12.3 All certificates of insurance SHALL BE FURNISHED TO THE OWNER and shall provide that insurance shall not be cancelled without ten (10) days prior written notice to the Owner. The Owner may examine the policies.

12.4 Consultant shall include all subcontractors and/or subconsultants as insured under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates for each. All coverages for subcontractors and/or subconsultants shall be subject to all the requirements stated herein.

12.5 Contractor shall secure and maintain at his expense Comprehensive Automobile Liability - Bodily Injury Liability \$1,000,000 each person; \$1,000,000 each occurrence. Property Damage Liability \$1,000,000 each occurrence. The Comprehensive Automobile Liability policy must have coverage for loading and unloading and must include owned, hired and leased autos.

12.6 St Charles Parish shall be named as an additional insured on general liability insurance policies.

12.7 For all purposes under Louisiana law, the principals of this Contract shall be recognized as the statutory employer of all contract employees as provided in LSA-R.S. 23:1061.

12.8 Insurance policies shall be endorsed to provide for a waiver of subrogation in favor of St. Charles Parish for worker's compensation policies. The certificate of insurance shall reference the waiver of subrogation endorsement.

12.9 The Worker's Compensation Policy Territory Coverage must include Louisiana.

13.0 INDEMNIFICATION

Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless the Owner, its employees, agents and representatives, against any and all claims, demands, suits or judgments for sums of money to any party for loss of life or injury or damages to person or property growing out of, resulting from or by any reason of any negligent act by the Consultant, its employees, agents, servants or representatives, while engaged upon or in connection with the services required or performed hereunder.

14.0 WARRANTY

14.1 Consultant warrants that it will perform its design services with the degree of skill and to the standard of care required of the consulting profession to meet all Federal, State and Local requirements.

14.2 If Consulting Services for project designed by Consultant does not meet those requirements noted herein above, then to the extent that this occurs as a direct result of Consultant's failure to meet the standard of care in its design services, Consultant will indemnify the Parish for Consultant's share of the costs incurred to bring Consulting Services for project to the limitations mandated.

14.3 The obligations expressed in Section 14 above in no way limit the Consultant's obligations expressed elsewhere in this Contract.

15.0 EXCLUSIVE JURISDICTION AND VENUE

For all claims arising out of or related to this agreement, CONSULTANT hereby consents and yields to the exclusive jurisdiction and venue of the Twenty-Ninth Judicial District Court for the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana, and expressly waives any (a) pleas of jurisdiction based upon Consultant's residence and (b) right of removal to Federal Court based upon diversity of citizenship.

16.0 COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL AND STATE LAWS

CONSULTANT further agrees to comply with all federal and state laws, including those identified in Attachment "D".

17.0 OTHER

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties. There are no understandings, agreements, or representations, oral or written, not specified within this Agreement. This Agreement may not be modified, supplemented or amended in any manner, except by written agreement signed by both parties.

PROJECT SCOPE:

CONSULTANT shall perform the scope of services described in the following paragraphs.

CONSULTANT shall provide professional architectural and engineering services for the following scope of work:

EAST BANK:
The project objective is to size and replace an existing generator at the East Bank WTP with (2) smaller generators (500KW each) and connecting each to operate in parallel. Replace existing automatic transfer switch with new paralleling switchgear. This option will allow the plant to operate only (1) generator when working at a normal load. It would allow the single generator to operate at a much more efficient load. The (2) generators could alternate operation thus extended the life of each unit. It would also allow for routine maintenance to have (1) generator offline and not be without backup. The paralleling feature would allow weekly operation and testing of the generators that would sync with the utility and not create a "blink" in power. The typical 5-8 second blink in power creates a quick start/stop of the pumps and occasionally creates maintenance problem with piping and valves due to water hammer; therefore, this option allows plant managers a more efficient operation. In addition, the project includes the design of a metal building cover with associated foundation, slab, and site runoff considerations.

WEST BANK:
The project included the replacement of the existing generator with (2) smaller units (preliminary estimate is 350KW each) and to connect to existing automatic transfer switches. The design services are based on the site visit and discussion with plant operators. The design scope will include electrical details and specifications for replacement of the existing generator and is outlined briefly by the following: (1) Electrical service and relative panels, two MCCs, and motors will be reviewed for load study; (2) Coordination will be required with plant operators to determine which motors are no longer being used and which motors operate in sequence or simultaneously; (3) Evaluation of two existing automatic transfer switches; (4) Evaluation of existing main electrical service switchgear; (5) Replacement or Upgrade of two existing ATS and (6) Sizing of two generators to be operated in parallel and properly operate the plant under "real" load conditions. Generators will be sized such that (1) generator will operate plant under normal load conditions. During emergency or higher volume operations, the 2nd generator will operate in parallel. The use of dual generators will allow for more efficient load conditions and allow for maintenance and/or alternating use of each generator unit.

BASIC SERVICES:

The CONSULTANT shall provide all basic services required to complete the project including all necessary services described herein or usually implied as a prerequisite for performance of the services whether or not specifically mentioned in this agreement, including attendance by the CONSULTANT at project conferences and public hearings.

A. PRELIMINARY DESIGN PHASE:

1. Coordinate all topographic surveys and other investigations as may be required to prepare construction plans. Investigations and/or surveys shall locate existing utilities (private and public) affected by the project and shall locate and define such utilities sufficiently to enable proper plans to be made to modify such utilities to fit the project.

2. Prepare a program of borings and other soil investigations that may be required for proper design.

3. Plot information obtained from surveyor on proper plan.

4. Prepare preliminary layouts and sketches as required to develop design criteria.

5. Prepare a preliminary cost estimate outlining all expected items of work and current unit prices for these items.

6. Assist the OWNER with the preparation of State and Federal Grant applications.

7. Provide written notice to all utility companies (private and public) about the project and request utility "as-built" information from them.

B. DESIGN PHASE:

1. Prepare detailed construction plans, specifications, and contract documents. These plans are to include locations of all utilities affected, and ownership and taking lines of rights-of-way where required. The existence and ownership of any existing utilities shall be determined by contacting

Contractors are not to exclude from participation in, deny the benefits of, or subject to discrimination under any program or activity, any person in the United States on the grounds of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, national origin, disability, or veteran status; nor discriminate on the basis of age under the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, or with respect to an otherwise qualified handicapped individual as provided in Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, or on the basis of religion, except that any exemption from such prohibition against discrimination on the basis of religion as provided in the Civil Rights Act of 1964, or Title VI and VII of the Act of April 11, 1968, shall also apply.

COMPLIANCE WITH REPORTING REQUIREMENTS (2 CFR 200.327-329) – Applies to all contracts - In the event of a declared emergency, Contractors are subject to FEMA and/or GOHSEP reporting requirements, i.e. program performance, financial and progress reports. Contractor shall complete and submit all reports, in such form and according to such schedule as may be required by the Owner / Agency.

BYRD ANTI-LOBBYING AMENDMENT (2 CFR 200 Appendix II (I)) – Applies to all contracts - Contractor that apply or bid for a contract must certify that it will not and has not used any Federal funds to influence an employee or member of Congress in obtaining any Federal Award.

ACCESS TO RECORDS (2 CFR 200.336) – Applies to all contracts - The State of Louisiana, the Federal agency providing the assistance for this contract, the Comptroller General of the United States, St. Charles Parish, or any of their duly authorized representatives, shall have access to any books, documents, papers, and records of the Contractor which are directly pertinent to this specific contract, for the purpose of audits, examinations, and making excerpts and transcriptions. All records connected with this contract will be maintained in a central location by the Contractor and St. Charles Parish, respectively, for a period of three (3) years from the date of the submission of the grantee's final expenditure report.

RETENTION OF RECORDS (2 CFR 200.333) – Applies to all contracts - In the event of a declared emergency, contractor shall retain all required records for three years after the termination date of the contract and all other pending matters are closed.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY – Appendix II(H) – Applies to all contracts - Contractor agrees to comply with mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency which are contained in the state energy conservation plant (LA RS 40:1730.49) issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (Public Law 94-163, as amended).

PROHIBITIONS OF AWARDS TO DEBARRED AND SUSPENDED PARTIES (2 CFR 200 Appendix II (J)) – Applies to all contracts - The Contractor represents and warrants that it and its Subcontractors are not debarred, suspended, or placed in ineligibility status under the provisions of the provisions of E.O.s 12549 and 12689. To ascertain whether a Contractor or Subcontractor has been excluded from participating in a contract or subcontract receiving Federal financial assistance, a search of the Excluded Parties List System can be conducted using the System for Award Management provided by the General Services Administration at <https://www.sam.gov>.

The Contractor must notify the Owner in the event of it and its Subcontractors being debarred, suspended, or declared ineligible by any department or agency of the Federal Government, or upon receipt of a notice of a proposed debarment or suspension, either prior to or after execution of a contract.

Upon notice of debarment, suspension, or declaration of ineligibility, the Contractor and/or its Subcontractors is/are ineligible to enter into contracts with the Owner, any department, or agency of the Federal Government. The Owner reserves the right to review cause for said debarment, suspension, or declaration of ineligibility, and to terminate this contract according to the terms of this section.

PROCUREMENT OF RECOVERED MATERIALS (2 CFR 200 Appendix II (J) See 200.322) – Applies to all contracts - The Contractor and its Subcontractors will comply with Section 6002 of the Solid Waste Disposal Act, as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA). The requirements of Section 6002 include procuring only items designated in the guidelines of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) at 40 CFR Part 247 that contain the highest percentage of recovered materials practicable, consistent with maintaining a satisfactory level of competition, where the Contractor purchases \$10,000 or more worth of one of these items during the course of the fiscal year or where the cost of such items or of functionally equivalent items purchased during the preceding fiscal year was \$10,000 or more; procuring solid waste management services in a manner that maximizes energy and resource recovery; and establishing an affirmative procurement program for the procurement of recovered material identified in the EPA guidelines.

TERMINATION FOR CAUSE AND CONVENIENCE (2 CFR 200 Appendix II(B)) – Applies to all contracts in excess of \$10,000.00 - If, through any cause, the Contractor shall fail to fulfill in a timely and proper manner his obligations under this contract, or if the Contractor shall violate any of the covenants, agreements, or stipulations of this contract, the Owner shall thereupon have the right to terminate this contract by giving written notice to the Contractor of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof, at least five (5) days before the effective date of such termination. In such event, all finished or unfinished documents, data, studies, surveys, drawings, maps, models, photographs, and reports prepared by the Contractor under this contract shall, at the option of the Owner, become the Owner's property and the Contractor shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any work satisfactorily completed hereunder. Notwithstanding the above, the Contractor shall not be relieved of liability to the Owner for damages sustained by the Owner by virtue of any breach of the contract by the Contractor, and the Owner may withhold any payments to the Contractor for the purpose of set-off until such time as the exact amount of damages due the Owner from the Contractor is determined. The Owner may terminate this contract at any time by giving at least ten (10) days notice in writing to the Contractor. If the contract is terminated by the Owner as provided herein, the Contractor will be paid for the time provided and expenses incurred up to the termination date.

ADMINISTRATIVE AND LEGAL REMEDIES FOR VIOLATION OR BREACH OF CONTRACT (2 CFR 200 Appendix II (A)) – Applies to all contracts in excess of the Simplified Acquisition Threshold (SAT = \$250,000 as of 8/31/2020) - Any violation or breach of terms of this contract on the part of the Contractor or the Contractor's subcontractors may result in the suspension or termination of this contract or such other action that may be necessary to enforce the rights of the parties of this contract. The duties and obligations imposed by the contract documents and the rights and remedies available thereunder shall be in addition to and not a limitation of any duties, obligations, rights and remedies otherwise imposed or available by law.

CONTRACT WORK HOURS AND SAFETY STANDARDS ACT (2 CFR 200 Appendix II(E)) – Applies to all construction contracts greater than \$100,000.00 where mechanics and laborers are employed - Contractor shall be in compliance with section 40 U.S.C. 3702 and 3704 of the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 5). Under 40 U.S.C. 3702 of the Act, each contractor must be

each utility provider in writing to obtain such records as may be available and information from the topographic survey conducted by the CONSULTANT. At the earliest time at which the state of completion of the plans will allow an effective review of the design work, sufficient sets of plans and specifications shall be furnished the OWNER for examination. Upon receipt by the CONSULTANT of comments by the OWNER, the CONSULTANT shall revise and complete the plans.

2. Prepare necessary applications for permits for submission to and approval of local, state, and federal authorities.
3. Prepare a detailed Final Cost Estimate.
4. Coordinate with proper utility companies the adjustment, relocation or removal of existing utility lines and structures within the project that are in conflict with the proposed improvements.

C. BIDDING PHASE:

1. Assist the OWNER in obtaining bids, attend bid opening, make tabulation and analysis of bids received, make recommendations and render assistance in award of contracts.
2. Furnish sufficient sets of plans and specifications for the bid process.
3. Prepare and distribute all necessary addenda.

D. CONSTRUCTION PHASE:

1. Prepare formal contract documents for the execution of the construction contract.
2. Provide a competent Project Engineer or Architect, as applicable, and such assistants as may be required to administer the construction contract and to observe and inspect the materials and construction procedures at the site of the work as it progresses. This shall not include the furnishing of inspection services but shall include periodic job visits as are necessary.
3. The CONSULTANT is not responsible for construction means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures, or for safety precautions and programs in connection with the work, except as may be expressly indicated in the Plans and Specifications prepared by the CONSULTANT.
4. Establish construction monuments, project baseline, and benchmarks as necessary.
5. Coordinate with owners of utilities for relocation of their facilities to clear the site for construction.
6. Require and review tests of materials necessary for the project.
7. Determine contract pay quantities, including necessary materials checking.
8. Verify and approve contractor's pay estimates and submit same to OWNER.
9. Prepare progress reports for the OWNER when requested.
10. Prepare detailed drawings as necessary to supplement the construction drawings.
11. Review shop drawings and samples for conformance with the design concept of the project and for compliance with the result required in the contract documents.
12. Perform final inspection and make a recommendation for acceptance.
13. Verify and approve Testing Laboratory pay estimates and submit same to OWNER.
14. Prepare all necessary documentation required for construction change orders.
15. Prepare written recommendation for all required changes to plans and specifications during construction.
16. Attend Council meetings and other meetings as necessary to discuss issues associated with the project.

E. RECORD DRAWINGS:

The CONSULTANT shall furnish "RECORD" drawings, based on information provided by the contractor, on CD in both ACAD and PDF formats. The CONSULTANT shall also furnish 3 sets of full-size plots/copies of "RECORD" drawings.

SUPPLEMENTAL SERVICES:

A. PERMITTING PHASE:

CONSULTANT shall obtain all necessary permits required for the construction and installation of the new generators and new structure.

B. TOPOGRAPHIC SURVEYING:

CONSULTANT shall perform a topographic survey to site the improvements and obtain all existing utility and elevations necessary for the project.

C. GEOTECHNICAL ENGINEERING:

CONSULTANT shall obtain a soil boring and prepare a geotechnical report to determine soil capacities and foundation recommendations for the new structure.

D. RESIDENT PROJECT REPRESENTATIVE (RPR):

CONSULTANT will use an experienced Resident Inspector on staff that will be available to be onsite for the duration of construction should the OWNER request this service. The inspector will provide detailed descriptions and photos of construction progress to Owner per Owner's delivery schedule. Resident Inspection Services will be performed per the EJCDC's "Duties, Responsibilities and Limitations of Authority of the Resident Project Representative".

BASIC SERVICES:

Basic Service A/E Fees are established utilizing the State of Louisiana Facility Planning and Control (FP&C) 2021 Fee Formula/Curve, Attached as Attachment C-1. The estimate of probable construction cost is \$2.7M. An interpolation of the FP&C Curve for the estimate of probable construction cost establishes a Basic Services Fee percentage of 8.05%. The Total Basic Services Fee is therefore, \$2,700,000 x .0805 = \$217,350. The Basic Services Fee is a Lump Sum (LS) fee payable upon a percentage complete of each phase of the project through construction:

For performance of supplemental services, the Owner shall authorize and pay the CONSULTANT a not-to-exceed fee, based on the hourly rates attached as Attachment C-2 and actual time worked and direct expenses incurred or if performed by sub-consultant, equal to the actual amount invoiced time 1.10 up to the amount of the contract not-to-exceed.

required to compute the wages of every mechanic and laborer on the basis of a standard work week of 40 hours. Work in excess of the standard work week is permissible provided that the worker is compensated at a rate of not less than one and a half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of 40 hours in the work week. The requirements of 40 U.S.C. 3704 are applicable to construction work and provide that no laborer or mechanic must be required to work in surroundings or under working conditions which are unsanitary, hazardous or dangerous. These requirements do not apply to the purchases of supplies or materials or articles ordinarily available on the open market, or contracts for transportation or transmission of intelligence.

CLEAN AIR ACT AND THE FEDERAL WATER POLLUTION CONTROL (CLEAN WATER) ACT (2 CFR 200 Appendix II (G)) – Applies to all contracts greater than or equal to \$150,000 - Contractor shall be in compliance with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7401-7671q) and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act as amended (33 U.S.C. 1251-1387). 2. Unless an exception in paragraph (c) of this clause applies, the contractor and its subcontractors may not use grant, cooperative agreement, loan, or loan guarantee funds from the Federal Emergency Management Agency to:

i. Procure or obtain any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology of any system;

ii. Enter into, extend, or renew a contract to procure or obtain any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology of any system;

iii. Enter into, extend, or renew contracts with entities that use covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system; or

iv. Provide, as part of its performance of this contract, subcontract, or other contractual instrument, any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system.

(c) Exceptions.

1. This clause does not prohibit contractors from providing—

i. A service that connects to the facilities of a third-party, such as backhaul, roaming, or interconnection arrangements; or

ii. Telecommunications equipment that cannot route or redirect user data traffic or permit visibility into any user data or packets that such equipment transmits or otherwise handles.

2. By necessary implication and regulation, the prohibitions also do not apply to:

i. Covered telecommunications equipment or services that: i. Are not used as a substantial or essential component of any system; and ii. Are not used as critical technology of any system.

ii. Other telecommunications equipment or services that are not considered covered telecommunications equipment or services.

(d) Reporting requirement.

1. In the event the contractor identifies covered telecommunications equipment or services used as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system, during contract performance, or the contractor is notified of such by a subcontractor at any tier or by any other source, the contractor shall report the information in paragraph (d)(2) of this clause to the recipient or subrecipient, unless elsewhere in this contract are established procedures for reporting the information.

2. The Contractor shall report the following information pursuant to paragraph (d)(1) of this clause:

i. Within one business day from the date of such identification or notification: The contract number; the order number(s), if applicable; supplier name; supplier unique entity identifier (if known); supplier Commercial and Government Entity (CAGE) code (if known); brand; model number (original equipment manufacturer number, manufacturer part number, or wholesaler number); item description; and any readily available information about mitigation actions undertaken or recommended.

ii. Within 10 business days of submitting the information in paragraph (d)(2)(i) of this clause: Any further available information about mitigation actions undertaken or recommended. In addition, the contractor shall describe the efforts it undertook to prevent use or submission of covered telecommunications equipment or services, and any additional efforts that will be incorporated to prevent future use or submission of covered telecommunications equipment or services.

(e) Subcontracts. The Contractor shall insert the substance of this clause, including this paragraph (e), in all subcontracts and other contractual instruments."

DOMESTIC PREFERENCE FOR PROCUREMENTS (2 C.F.R. § 200.322) - Applies to all contracts and purchase orders for work or products - As appropriate, and to the extent consistent with law, the contractor should, to the greatest extent practicable, provide a preference for the purchase, acquisition, or use of goods, products, or materials produced in the United States. This includes, but is not limited to iron, aluminum, steel, cement, and other manufactured products. For purposes of this clause: Produced in the United States means, for iron and steel products, that all manufacturing processes, from the initial melting stage through the application of coatings, occurred in the United States.

WHEREAS, the Parish desires to construct a new lift station and pressure manifold to transfer wastewater from the Luling Pond to the adjacent wetlands; and,

WHEREAS, the Parish also desires to add an UV disinfection unit to eliminate traditional chlorine disinfection; and,

WHEREAS, the modeling/conceptual phase will develop the requirements for further design under an amended agreement; and,

WHEREAS, the Professional Services Agreement between St. Charles Parish and McKim & Creed, Inc. describes the details of the proposed services and compensation.

THE ST. CHARLES PARISH COUNCIL HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION I. That the Professional Services Agreement between St. Charles Parish and McKim & Creed, Inc., to perform engineering services as required by the Department of Wastewater for the Luling Pond Lift Station and Upgrades Project (Project No. S211204), in the lump sum amount of \$29,565.71, is hereby approved and accepted.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and effective as of the ____ day of _____, 2022 by and between ST. CHARLES PARISH acting herein by and through its President, who is duly authorized to act on behalf of said Parish, hereinafter called the OWNER, and MCKIM & CREED, INC., a corporation and/or limited liability company acting herein by and through its Contracting Officer, hereinafter called CONSULTANT, duly authorized by corporate resolution or certificate of authority attached hereto and made a part hereof. Whereas the Owner desires to employ a professional consulting firm to perform consulting work and services for LULING POND LIFT STATION AND UPGRADES Project No. S211204 as described in Ordinance No. 22-5-9 which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

1.0 GENERAL TERMS

The Owner agrees to employ the Consultant and the Consultant agrees to perform professional services required for the project described above. Consultant will conform to the requirements of the Owner and to the standards of the agencies participating with the Owner in the Project. The Consultant will coordinate all work between the Owner and all participating agencies and regulating agencies, if needed. Written authorization to begin different phases of the project will be given to the Consultant by the Owner, including Conceptual, Preliminary Design, Final Design, Bidding Assistance and Construction and Services. The Owner may terminate the Contract by written notification and without cause per Section 11.0 during any phase of the project.

The Consultant shall at all times during this Agreement maintain a valid Louisiana Consulting License and any other applicable licenses necessary for performance of the Project.

All work shall be under the direction of the Owner, and all plans, specifications, etc. shall be submitted to the Owner and all approvals and administration of this contract shall be through the Owner.

2.0 PROJECT

2.1 The Owner hereby contracts with the CONSULTANT to perform all necessary professional services in connection with the project as defined as follows:

LULING POND LIFT STATION AND UPGRADES
Project No. S211204

2.2 The Project consist of the scope of services and work as defined in Attachment "A" hereto.

2.3 Consultant shall perform all scope of services and work in accordance with the Schedule as defined in Attachment "B" hereto unless otherwise mutually agreed upon by the parties in writing.

2.4 The Consultant agrees to comply with all Federal, State, and Local Laws and Ordinances applicable to the scope of services and work or in entering any other agreement with any another party to complete the work.

3.0 SERVICES OF CONSULTANT

3.1 Consultant shall provide Owner professional work and services in all phases of the Project to which this Agreement applies and as hereinafter provided to properly plan and execute the work on the project(s) assigned to the Consultant. These services may include but may not be limited to serving as Owner's professional consulting representative for the Project, providing professional consultation and advice, and furnishing customary civil, surveying, geotechnical, structural, mechanical, electrical, instrumentation and control consulting services and construction consulting and inspection.

3.2 Services provided by the Consultant shall be performed in accordance with generally accepted professional consulting practice at the time and the place where the services are rendered.

3.3 Consultant shall obtain from Owner authorization to proceed in writing for each phase of the Project.

3.4 Consultant shall provide minutes of all meetings with St. Charles Parish regarding any phase of the Project.

3.5 Consultant shall provide work and services to complete the project, including all necessary services described herein or usually implied as a prerequisite for the performance of the services whether or not specifically mentioned in this agreement, including attendance by the Consultant at project conferences and public hearings.

3.6 The Phases of the Project are as defined in Attachment "A".

4.0 OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

4.1 Documents including but not limited to plans, specifications, maps, basic survey notes, sketches, charts, computations and all other data prepared or obtained under the terms of this authorization shall become the property of the Owner and shall be made available for Owner's inspection at any time during the Project and, shall be delivered to the Owner prior to termination or final completion of the Contract.

4.2 Consultant may retain a set of documents for its files.

4.3 Reuse of Documents. Any reuse of documents or materials without written authorization or adaptation by Consultant to the specific purpose intended will be at Owner's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Consultant or to Consultant's independent professional associates, subcontractors, and consultants.

4.4 No materials, to include but not limited to reports, maps or other documents produced as a result of this Contract, in whole or in part, shall be available to Consultant for copyright purposes. Any such materials produced as a result of this Contract that might be subject to copyright shall be the property of the Owner and all such rights shall belong to the Owner, and the Owner shall be sole and exclusive entity who may exercise such rights.

5.0 SUPPLEMENTARY SERVICES

The Consultant shall provide, when requested in writing by the Owner, supplementary services not included in the basic work and services.

The compensation to the Consultant for the supplemental services, when performed by the Consultant, shall be in the form of a lump sum, billable hours, or "not to exceed" hourly rate which is mutually agreeable to the Owner and the Consultant in writing.

Such supplementary services may include the following:

A. Soil investigations
B. Laboratory inspection of materials and equipment
C. Right-of-Way, easement and property acquisition surveys, plats, maps and documents
D. Any major revisions for which the Consultant is not responsible, that are authorized by the Owner after the completion and approval of either the preliminary or final plans and specifications
E. Services concerning replacement of any work damaged by fire or other causes during construction
F. Services made necessary by the default of the contractor in the performance of the construction contract
G. Services as an expert witness in connection with court proceedings
H. Traffic consulting if necessary
I. Topographic Survey
J. Preparation of Environmental Assessment documents and/or Environmental Permits
K. If all or part of the work is to be financed by a Federal or State Grant, the Consultant shall assist the Owner in the preparation of the Grant application and with the Grant Administration, unless otherwise specifically agreed upon previously herein.

6.0 DEFECTIVE WORK

During such visits and on the basis of such observations, Consultant may disapprove of or reject Contractor's work while it is in progress if Consultant believes that such work will not produce a completed Project that conforms generally to the Contract Documents or that it will prejudice the integrity of the design concept of the Project as reflected in the Contract Documents

7.0 NOTICE TO PROCEED

The Owner shall notify the Consultant in writing to undertake the services stated in this Agreement, and the Consultant shall commence the services within ten (10) days after receipt of such notification.

If the Owner desires to divide the Project into various parts, a Notice to Proceed shall be issued for each part, and the Owner and the Consultant shall mutually agree upon the period of time within which services for each part of the Project shall be performed.

The Consultant will be given time extensions for delays beyond their control or for those caused by tardy approvals of work in progress by various official agencies, but no additional compensation shall be allowed for such delays.

8.0 PAYMENTS

8.1 Owner shall pay Consultant for the performance of work and services as outlined in Attachment "C" to this Agreement.

8.2 Payment for Consultant work and services on projects that do not require construction services, such as feasibility studies or drainage studies, shall be made based upon Consultant's estimate of the proportion of the services actually completed at the time of billing and shall be made in partial payments at monthly intervals.

8.3 If the Project, or any portion thereof, is not completed for any reason, the final fee for consulting work and services shall be negotiated between Owner and Contractor. If the final fee for work and services is not mutually agreed upon, either party may elect in writing to submit the dispute to mediation. If mediation is not mutually agreed upon, written notice will be submitted to the other party of the intent to submit the dispute to the 29th Judicial District Court of St. Charles Parish, State of Louisiana.

8.4 If authorized in writing by Owner, for the performance of, or for obtaining from others Additional Services which are not considered normal or customary consulting, the Owner shall pay Consultant based on monthly invoices submitted

by the Consultant, within sixty (60) days of receipt of Consultant's invoice. Consultant shall provide written notice to Owner when no services or work have been performed during a given month.

8.5 For Additional Authorized Services provided by the Consultant such as, but not limited to, wetlands permitting, land and right-of-way acquisition, surveying, NPDES and LADEQ permit renewal or acquisition work, etc. Owner shall pay Consultant based on an agreed upon hourly rate(s) between the Owner and Consultant. Payment shall be not-to-exceed based on hourly rates and actual hours worked.

8.6 The following documentation shall be required for payment to Consultant and shall be attached to the monthly invoice:

a. A copy of the Owner's written authorization to perform the service.
b. Timesheets for all hours invoiced.
c. Invoice copies, logs or other substantiation of non-salary expenses.

8.7 For Additional Authorized Services that Consultant acquires from subcontractors and/or subconsultants, Owner shall pay Consultant a fixed sum previously agreed upon by Owner and Consultant, such sum to be established in each case when the scope of the work involved has been determined and before any of the Additional Services are provided. The use of subcontractors and/or subconsultants shall be subject to the provisions set forth in this Agreement. The following documentation shall be required for payment to Consultant and shall be attached to the monthly invoice:

a. A copy of the Owner's written consent for the subcontractor and/or subconsultant to perform the service stating the Owner's and Consultant's agreed upon fixed sum established for the service performed.
b. Evidence that the subcontractor and/or subconsultant is insured as required by this Agreement.

8.8 For Supplementary Services described in Section 5, Owner shall pay Consultant for the fee negotiated at the time the work is assigned by the method stipulated in the contract amendment.

9.0 BUDGET LIMITATIONS

The construction budget for this Project shall be determined by the Owner, and the Consultant shall be advised of the budget limitation in writing by the Owner and the Consultant shall indicate his acceptance of same in writing to the Owner. Any subsequent budget revisions shall be confirmed in writing.

If, at the completion of the Preliminary or Design Phase, the Consultant does not concur with the construction budget, he shall so notify the Owner, and the Consultant and Owner shall mutually agree on a revised construction budget prior to any work on the Design Phase.

If no bid is received within the budget limitation and a redesign of the project if required by the Owner, such redesign shall be accomplished by the Consultant at no additional cost to the Owner, provided, however, if the receipt of bids is, for any reason, delayed beyond a period of six (6) months from the date of the completion of the Design Phase the amount stated as the construction budget shall be adjusted, immediately prior to the time bids are received, by use of a construction cost index acceptable to both parties of this agreement.

10.0 FUNDS

No work shall be authorized until funds are established for each individual task.

11.0 TERMINATION OR SUSPENSION

11.1 This Agreement may be terminated for any reason by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice.

11.2 The Consultant, upon receipt of such notice, shall immediately discontinue all services in connection with the performance of this Agreement and shall proceed to cancel promptly all existing orders and contracts insofar as such orders or contracts are chargeable to this Agreement.

11.3 The Consultant shall, as soon as practicable after receipt of notice of termination, submit a statement showing in detail the services performed and payments received under this Agreement to the date of termination.

11.4 The Owner shall then pay the Consultant promptly that portion of the prescribed fee to which both parties agree.

11.5 Consultant fully acknowledges that no payment will be made for any work performed or expenses incurred after receipt of the termination by either party unless mutually agreed upon in writing.

11.6 Failure to meet agreed delivery dates or authorized extensions are considered substantial failures and breach of this contractual agreement by Consultant.

11.7 This agreement shall automatically terminate upon satisfactory completion of all services and obligations described herein or three (3) years from the date of its execution, whichever event occurs first.

12.0 INSURANCE

12.1 The Consultant shall secure and maintain at his expense such insurance that will protect him and the Owner, from claims under Workmen's Compensation Acts and from claims for bodily injury, death or property damage which may arise from performance of services under this Agreement. Insurance for bodily injury or death shall be in the unencumbered amount of \$1,000,000.00 for one person and not less than \$1,000,000.00 for all injuries and/or deaths resulting from any one occurrence. The insurance for property damage shall be in the unencumbered amount of \$1,000,000.00 for each accident and not less than \$1,000,000.00 aggregate.

12.2 The Consultant shall also secure and maintain at his expense professional liability insurance in the unencumbered sum of \$1,000,000.00.

12.3 All certificates of insurance SHALL BE FURNISHED TO THE OWNER and shall provide that insurance shall not be cancelled without ten (10) days prior written notice to the Owner. The Owner may examine the policies.

12.4 Consultant shall include all subcontractors and/or subconsultants as insured under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates for each. All coverages for subcontractors and/or subconsultants shall be subject to all the requirements stated herein.

12.5 Contractor shall secure and maintain at his expense Comprehensive Automobile Liability - Bodily Injury Liability \$1,000,000 each person: \$1,000,000 each occurrence. Property Damage Liability \$1,000,000 each occurrence. The Comprehensive Automobile Liability policy must have coverage for loading and unloading and must include owned, hired and leased autos.

12.6 St Charles Parish shall be named as an additional insured on general liability insurance policies.

12.7 For all purposes under Louisiana law, the principals of this Contract shall be recognized as the statutory employer of all contract employees as provided in LSA-R.S. 23:1061.

12.8 Insurance policies shall be endorsed to provide for a waiver of subrogation in favor of St. Charles Parish for worker's compensation policies. The certificate of insurance shall reference the waiver of subrogation endorsement.

12.9 The Worker's Compensation Policy Territory Coverage must include Louisiana.

13.0 INDEMNIFICATION

Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless the Owner, its employees, agents and representatives, against any and all claims, demands, suits or judgments for sums of money to any party for loss of life or injury or damages to person or property growing out of, resulting from or by any reason of any negligent act by the Consultant, its employees, agents, servants or representatives, while engaged upon or in connection with the services required or performed hereunder.

14.0 WARRANTY

14.1 Consultant warrants that it will perform its design services with the degree of skill and to the standard of care required of the consulting profession to meet all Federal, State and Local requirements.

14.2 If Consulting Services for project designed by Consultant does not meet those requirements noted herein above, then to the extent that this occurs as a direct result of Consultant's failure to meet the standard of care in its design services, Consultant will indemnify the Parish for Consultant's share of the costs incurred to bring Consulting Services for project to the limitations mandated.

14.3 The obligations expressed in Section 14 above in no way limit the Consultant's obligations expressed elsewhere in this Contract.

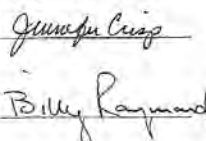
15.0 EXCLUSIVE JURISDICTION AND VENUE

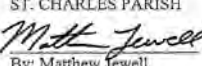

ATTACHMENT "A"
PROJECT SCOPE

LULING POND LIFT STATION AND UPGRADES
Project No. (S211204)

The Scope of Work is as follows:

The scope includes construction of a new lift station and pressure manifold to transfer wastewater from the existing Luling Pond to the adjacent wetlands, addition of UV disinfection to eliminate traditional chlorine disinfection, and replacement of manual valves with automatic valves.

The requirements, configuration, and cost are to be determined in an initial modeling/conceptual phase. Results from the modeling/conceptual phase will serve as the basis of design for the overall project. Upon completion of the modeling/conceptual phase, this Contract will be amended to include Basic Engineering Services.

MODELING/CONCEPTUAL PHASE

Upon written authorization from OWNER, ENGINEER shall:

- a. Consult with OWNER to define and clarify OWNER's requirements for the Project, including design objectives and constraints, permits, capacity and performance requirements, flexibility, expandability, and any budgetary limitations, and identify available data, reports, facilities plans, site evaluations, etc.; required for design.
- b. Identify potential solution(s) to meet OWNER's Project requirements, as needed. Study and evaluate the potential solution(s) to meet OWNER's Project requirements.
- c. Visit the Site, or potential Project sites, as needed, to review existing conditions and facilities.
- d. Develop a scope of work for additional professional services (i.e. survey, geotech, etc.) necessary for design.
- e. Prepare a report (the "Report") which will, as appropriate, contain schematic layouts, sketches, and conceptual design criteria with appropriate exhibits to indicate the agreed-to requirements, considerations involved, and ENGINEER's recommended solution(s). For each recommended solution, ENGINEER will provide the following, to include; but not limited to:
 - 1. Opinion of probable Construction Cost;
 - 2. The estimated total costs of design, professional, and related services to be provided by ENGINEER and its CONSULTANTS;
 - 3. A tabulation of other items and services included within the definition of Total Project Costs.
- f. Furnish three review copies of the Report to OWNER as well as submitting electronically to appropriate parties specified by OWNER. ENGINEER's services under the Conceptual Phase will be considered complete on the date when ENGINEER has delivered to OWNER the final Conceptual Report.

PART 1 – BASIC SERVICES

A. PRELIMINARY DESIGN PHASE

Upon written acceptance by OWNER of the Conceptual Report, selection by OWNER of a recommended solution, and upon written authorization from OWNER, ENGINEER shall:

- a. Prepare Preliminary Design Phase documents consisting of final design criteria, preliminary drawings, and outline specifications. Visit the Site, as needed, to prepare the Preliminary Design Phase documents.
- b. Coordinate all surveys and other investigations (see Additional Services) as may be required to prepare construction plans. Investigations and/or surveys shall locate existing utilities (private and public) affected by the project and shall locate and define such utilities sufficiently in the event that utilities have to be relocated.
- c. Prepare a program of borings and other soil investigations that may be required.
- d. Provide written notice to all utility companies (private and public) about the project and request utility "as-built" information from them.
- e. Advise OWNER if additional reports, data, information, and/or services not already identified in the Conceptual Phase which are necessary and assist OWNER in obtaining such reports, data, information, and/or services.
- f. Based on the information contained in the Preliminary Design Phase documents, prepare a revised opinion of probable Construction Cost.
- g. Obtain and review OWNER's contract documents and OWNER specifications for inclusion within the final contract, plans and specifications. ENGINEER shall also consult with OWNER in regards to OWNER policies and practices in regard to contract administration and construction management.
- h. Furnish three review copies of the Preliminary Design Phase documents and revised opinion of probable Construction Cost to OWNER as well as submitting electronically to appropriate parties specified by OWNER. ENGINEER's services under the Preliminary Design Phase will be considered complete on the date when ENGINEER has delivered to OWNER the final Preliminary Design Phase documents and opinion of probable Construction Cost.

B. FINAL DESIGN PHASE

Upon written acceptance by OWNER of the final Preliminary Design Phase documents and upon written authorization from OWNER, ENGINEER shall:

- a. Prepare Final Drawings and Specifications indicating the scope, extent, and character of the Work to be performed and furnished by CONTRACTOR.
- b. These Drawings shall include locations of all utilities affected, with ownership and rights-of-way where required. The existing and ownership of any existing utilities shall be determined by contacting each utility provider in writing to obtain such records as may be available and information from the survey. Coordinate with said utility companies on the adjustment, relocation, or removal of existing utility lines and structures within the project that are in conflict with the proposed improvements.

- c. Visit the Site as needed to assist in preparing the Final Drawings and Specifications.
- d. Prepare necessary applications for permits for submission for approval of local, state, and federal authorities.
- e. Prepare a detailed Final Cost Estimate.
- f. Furnish for review by OWNER three copies of the Final Drawings, Specifications, and Cost Estimate as well as submitting electronically to appropriate parties specified by OWNER. OWNER shall submit to ENGINEER any comments regarding the furnished items, and any instructions for revisions. ENGINEER's services under the Final Design Phase will be considered complete on the date when ENGINEER has delivered to OWNER the Final Drawings, Specifications, and Cost Estimate.

C. BID PHASE

Upon acceptance by OWNER of the Final Drawings, Specifications, the most recent opinion of probable Construction Cost, and upon written authorization by OWNER to proceed, ENGINEER shall:

- a. Assist OWNER in advertising for and obtaining bids or proposals for the Work, assist OWNER in issuing assembled design, contract, and bidding-related documents to prospective CONTRACTORS, and, where applicable, maintain a record of prospective CONTRACTORS to which documents have been issued, pre-bid conferences, if any, and receive and process CONTRACTOR deposits or charges for the issued documents.
- b. Prepare and issue Addenda as appropriate to clarify, correct, or change the issued documents.
- c. Consult with OWNER as to the qualifications of prospective CONTRACTORS. Consult with OWNER as to the qualifications of Subcontractors, suppliers, and other individuals and entities proposed by prospective CONTRACTORS, for those portions of the Work as to which review of qualifications is required by the issued documents.
- d. If the issued documents require, ENGINEER shall evaluate and determine the acceptability of "or equals" and substitute materials and equipment proposed by prospective CONTRACTORS.
- e. Attend the bid opening, prepare bid tabulation sheets and recommendation of award to meet OWNER's schedule, and assist OWNER in evaluating bids or proposals, assemble final contracts for the Work for execution by OWNER and CONTRACTOR, and in issuing notices of award of such contracts.
- f. The Bid Phase will be considered complete upon commencement of the Construction Phase.

D. CONSTRUCTION PHASE

Upon successful completion of the Bid Phase and upon written authorization from OWNER, ENGINEER shall:

- a. Prepare formal contract documents for the execution of the construction contract.
- b. Pre-Construction Conference: Participate in a pre-construction conference prior to commencement of Work at the Site.
- c. Establish construction monuments, project baseline, and benchmarks as necessary.
- d. Coordinate with owners of utilities for relocation of their facilities to clear the site for construction.
- e. Require and review tests of materials necessary for the project.
- f. Verify and approve CONTRACTOR's Applications for Payment and schedules (Progress Schedules, Schedule of Submittals, and Schedule of Values) and submit to the OWNER.
- g. Prepare progress reports for the OWNER when requested and coordinate monthly progress meetings between OWNER, CONTRACTOR, ENGINEER, and inspector, as necessary throughout the duration of the project.
- h. Review shop drawings and sampled for conformance with the design concept of the project and for compliance with the result required in the Contract Documents. Evaluate and determine the acceptability of substitute or "or-equal" materials and equipment proposed by CONTRACTOR.
- i. Prepare all necessary documentation required for construction RFIs (Requests for Information/Interpretation), Change Orders, and Work Change Directives.
- j. Attend Council meetings and other meetings necessary to discuss issues associated with the project.
- k. Record Drawings: The ENGINEER shall furnish reproducible "RECORD" drawings, based on information provided by the CONTRACTOR, both printed on full size paper as well as electronically via AutoCAD.
- l. Receive from CONTRACTOR, review, and transmit to OWNER maintenance and operating instructions, schedules, guarantees, bonds, certificates or other evidence of insurance required by the Construction Contract Documents.
- m. Make visits to the Site at intervals appropriate to the various stages of construction, as ENGINEER deems necessary, to observe as an experienced and qualified design professional the progress of CONTRACTOR's executed Work.
- n. Perform Substantial Completion walk through, generate Substantial Completion recommendation and accompanying Punch List. Perform final inspection and make a recommendation for acceptance.
- o. The Construction Phase will commence with the execution of the Notice of Intent to Award for the Project and will terminate upon written recommendation by ENGINEER for final payment to CONTRACTORS.

PART 2 – ADDITIONAL SERVICES

A. SURVEY

ENGINEER shall obtain a contract with a Licensed Professional Surveyor to complete the work as outlined in the scope of survey work the ENGINEER developed in the Preliminary Design Phase of the project. The survey's purpose is to locate all existing features both manmade and natural features, both above ground and subsurface within the project limits. The survey shall include the following elements:

- 1. Established baselines and temporary benchmarks along the project corridor and specified datums used,
- 2. Utilities as shown after contacting Louisiana One Call,
- 3. Descriptions, locations, depths, and sizes of all pipes within the project,
- 4. Descriptions, locations, diameters of all trees within the project,
- 5. Ground elevations within the project limits to properly develop contours,
- 6. Locations of all buildings, fences, and other structures,
- 7. Cross sections along roadways at 100-foot intervals minimum,
- 8. Cross sections along ditches at 50-foot intervals minimum,
- 9. Locations of all apparent rights-of-way and servitudes.

Survey shall be submitted to the Parish both in PDF and CAD format.

Data Collection and Processing:

- 1. Spatial data collected for projects shall be referenced to the updated NAD83 and NAVD88 reference datums established by NOAA (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration). Monumentation shall be set in an area outside the construction limits so as not to be disturbed during the construction phase. Existing control monumentation located within the vicinity may be used in lieu of setting new monuments. Field observations data must be processed and delivered to the Parish and comply with the specific deliverables requirements defined below:

Project Control:

- 1. Information on project control monuments that are applicable to the survey/project limits shall be provided by contractors, designers, engineers, or surveyors. This documentation should be labeled or clearly defined as Datum and Control.
- 2. Monument documentation must include source documentation such as Report of Survey Mark or NGS (National Geodetic Survey) Data Sheet and should remain in its original format as well as retain its original name as provided by the source.

- Monument maps may be scanned and the electronic scan treated as the source. PDF is the preferred format for scanned monument maps, although jpg and tif files are also acceptable.
3. All existing monuments used in the establishment of the project control network must have documentation as described above.
4. The Surveyor shall acquire the elevation and datum of all bench marks to be use in the survey. The elevation used shall be based on the updated NAD83 and NAVD88 reference datums.

Survey Data Deliverables:

1. A complete survey package as described below must be submitted by assembling all the appropriate electronic information used to conduct the survey. These documents should indicate the following (where applicable) for project control monuments:
- a. Designation - the "name" of the mark used.
 - b. CORS Identifier - the mark is either a Continuously Operational Reference Station (CORS) or is associated with one.
 - c. PID - Permanent Identifier
 - d. GEOID – Geoid model used (ex. 12B)
 - e. Epoch – ex. 2010
 - f. Latitude/Longitude – X,Y; Northing/Easting; State Plane Louisiana South FIPS1702 (Feet)
 - g. Orthometric Height – Z (Feet)
 - h. Horizontal Datum – ex. coordinates in North American Datum (NAD 1983)
 - i. Vertical Datum – ex. North American Vertical Datum (NAVD 88) elevation (if measured)
 - j. Horizontal and vertical accuracy
 - k. Units
 - l. Scale factor

B. GEOTECHNICAL INVESTIGATION

ENGINEER shall obtain a contract with a Licensed Louisiana Geotechnical firm to complete the work as outlines in the scope of geotechnical work the ENGINEER developed in the Preliminary Design Phase of the project. The geotechnical investigation purpose is to determine the properties of the soil in the project area. The geotechnical investigation shall include the following elements:

- 1. (1) one to (2) two undisturbed soil borings located within proximity to the project location.
- 2. The borings are to be classified and analyzed as necessary in accordance with accepted industry practices for foundation design
- 3. Subsurface exploration data to include soil profile, exploration logs, lab or in-situ test results, and ground water conditions
- 4. Engineering recommendations for design such as pile depth, sheet pile design, etc. and recommendations to be project specific
- 5. The boreholes are to be backfilled and road surfaces patched in accordance with DOTD requirements (Purple book or later).

C. PERMITTING

ENGINEER shall develop permit drawings, applications, supporting information and obtain all permits as required for the project, including, but not limited to, the following:

- 1. Wetland Delineation, submitting for a Jurisdictional Determination of any wetlands
- 2. U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Section 404 permit)
- 3. LA Wildlife & Fisheries (Scenic Rivers permit)
- 4. LA Department of Health (LDH)
- 5. LA Department of Environmental Quality (LDEQ)
- 6. Cultural Resources

ENGINEER shall also attend permit meetings as necessary and address all questions and comments received from any agency to ensure receipt of all necessary approvals.

D. RESIDENT PROJECT REPRESENTATIVE (RPR)

ENGINEER shall furnish a Resident Project Representative ("RPR"), at the request of the OWNER to assist ENGINEER in observing progress and quality of the Work. The RPR may provide full time representation or may provide representation to a lesser degree. RPR is ENGINEER's representative at the Site and will act as directed by and under the supervision of ENGINEER.

The duties and responsibilities of the RPR are as follows:

- 1. RPR's dealings in matters pertaining to the Work in general shall be with ENGINEER and CONTRACTOR. RPR's dealings with Subcontractors shall only be through or with the full knowledge and approval of CONTRACTOR. RPR shall generally communicate with OWNER only with the knowledge of and under the direction of ENGINEER.
- 2. Review the progress schedule, schedule of Shop Drawing and Sample submittals, schedule of values, and other schedules prepared by CONTRACTOR and consult with ENGINEER concerning acceptability of such schedules.
- 3. Attend meetings such as preconstruction conferences, progress meetings, job conferences, and other Project-related meetings.
- 4. Comply with Site safety programs.
- 5. Serve as ENGINEER's liaison with CONTRACTOR. Assist ENGINEER in serving as OWNER's liaison with CONTRACTOR when CONTRACTOR's operations affect OWNER's On-Site operations.
- 6. Report to ENGINEER whenever RPR believes that any part of the Work is defective under the terms and standards set forth in the Construction Contract Documents and provide recommendations as to whether such Work should be corrected, removed, and replaced, or accepted as provided in the Construction Contract Documents.
- 7. Verify that tests, equipment, and systems start-ups and operating and maintenance training are conducted in the presence of appropriate OWNER's personnel, and that CONTRACTOR maintains adequate records thereof. Observe, record, and report to ENGINEER appropriate details relative to the test procedures and systems start-ups.
- 8. Prepare a daily report or keep a diary or log book, recording CONTRACTOR's hours on the Site, Subcontractors present at the Site, weather conditions, data relative to questions of Change Orders, Field Orders, Work Change Directives, or changed conditions, Site visitors, deliveries of equipment or materials, daily activities, deviations, observations in general, and specific observations in more detail as in the case of observing test procedures; and send copies to ENGINEER.
- 9. Immediately inform ENGINEER of the occurrence of any Site accidents, emergencies, acts of God endangering the Work, possible force majeure or delay events, damage to property by fire or other causes, or the discovery of any potential differing site condition or Constituent of Concern.
- 10. Review applications for payment with CONTRACTOR for compliance with the established procedure for their submission and forward with recommendations to ENGINEER, noting particularly the relationship of the payment requested to the schedule of values, Work completed, and materials and equipment delivered at the Site but not incorporated in the Work.
- 11. Participate in ENGINEER's and OWNER's visits to the Site regarding Substantial Completion, assist in the determination of Substantial Completion, and prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Substantial Completion submit a punch list of observed items requiring completion or correction.
- 12. Observe whether all items on the final punch list have been completed or corrected and make recommendations to ENGINEER concerning acceptance.
- 13. Resident Project Representative shall not:
 - a. Authorize any deviation from the Construction Contract Documents or substitution of materials or equipment (including "or-equal" items).

- b. Undertake any of the responsibilities of CONTRACTOR, Subcontractors, or Suppliers.
- c. Advise on, issue directions relative to, or assume control over any aspect of the means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures of the Work, by CONTRACTOR.
- d. Advise on, issue directions regarding, or assume control over security or safety practices, precautions, and programs in connection with the activities or operations of OWNER or CONTRACTOR.

SECTION 00500

CONTRACT

This agreement entered into this 4th day of May, 2022, by Hammill Construction, LLC, hereinafter called the "Contractor", whose business address is 108 General Lee, Hahnville, LA 70057, and the St. Charles Parish, hereinafter called the "Owner".

Owner and Contractor, in consideration of premises and the mutual covenants; consideration and agreement herein contained, agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1

STATEMENT OF WORK

- 1.1 Contractor shall furnish all labor and materials and perform the work required to build, construct and complete in a thorough and workmanlike manner in connection with the following:
- Project Name: St. Charles Parish Parks and Recreation East Bank Trailhead Upgrade
Project Number: Not Applicable
- 1.2 The abovementioned work shall be completed in strict accordance with Contract Documents prepared by: Murray Architects, Inc.
- 1.3 It is recognized by the parties herein that said Contract Documents including by way of example and not of limitation, the Drawings and Specifications dated October 5, 2021, Addenda number(s) One and Two, the Instruction to Bidders, Supplemental Instructions to Bidders, Louisiana Uniform Public Works Bid Form, General Conditions, Supplementary Conditions (if applicable), any Addenda thereto, impose duties and obligations upon the parties herein, and said parties thereby agree that they shall be bound by said duties and obligations. For these purposes, all of the provisions contained in the aforementioned Contract Documents are incorporated herein by reference with the same force and effect as though said Contract Documents were herein set out in full.
- 1.4 The Work is generally described as follows: Installation of two pavilions, paint existing bathrooms, install benches, parking bumpers, striping parking lot and as indicated on drawings.

ARTICLE 2

ARCHITECT

- 2.01 The Project has been designed by Murray Architects, Inc. who is hereinafter called "Architect" and who will assume all duties and responsibilities and have the rights and authority assigned to Architect in the Contract Documents in connection with completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

ARTICLE 3

CONTRACT TIME

- 3.01 The Contractor shall complete the Work under the Contract within 120 calendar days from the date stated in the Notice to Proceed.

ARTICLE 4

LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

- 4.01 Owner and Contractor recognize that the Owner will suffer direct financial loss if Work is not completed within the Contract Time specified plus any extensions thereof allowed in accordance with these General Conditions of this Contract, and therefore, time is of the essence. They also recognize the delays, expense and difficulties involved in proving in a legal proceeding the actual loss suffered by Owner if the Work is not completed on time. Accordingly, instead of requiring any such proof, Contractor and Surety agree to forfeit and pay Owner Five Hundred dollars \$500.00 per day as Liquidated Damages for delay (but not as a penalty). Such Liquidated Damages will be assessed for each calendar day that expires after the Contract Time. This amount represents a reasonable estimate of Owner's expenses for extended delays and the costs associated therein. This provision shall be effective between the parties ipso facto and without demand or putting in default, it being specifically agreed that the Contractor by his mere failure to complete the work on or before the date specified shall be deemed in default.

ARTICLE 5

CONTRACT PRICE

- 5.01 The Owner will pay and the Contractor will accept in full consideration for the performance of the Contract the sum of:
- a) (\$170,350.00) One Hundred Seventy Thousand Three Hundred Fifty Dollars based on unit prices specified within this contract document. Contract price is firm and subject only to modification by written Change Order agreed to and signed by both parties and the Engineer and approved by the St. Charles Parish Council.

ARTICLE 6

PAYMENT PROCEDURES

- 6.01 Contractor shall submit Applications for Payment to the Engineer in accordance with Article 15 of the General Conditions. Applications for Payment will be processed by Engineer as provided in the General Conditions.
- 6.02 Progress Payments. Progress payments will be based upon estimated quantities of contract unit price items or upon estimated percentages of completion of the schedule of lump sum values of labor and materials incorporated into the Work or suitably stored, on the last day of each month or other mutually agreed regular monthly date ending the progress payment period, less retainage.
- 6.03 Application for Payment Form. The form of the Application for Payment must be suitable to the Owner. The Owner reserves the right to withhold payment until the form of Application for Payment is deemed acceptable by the Owner.
- 6.04 Retainage. Per Paragraph 15.01.D retainage shall be withheld and payments will be made by the Owner in the payment amount of:
- a) Ninety percent (90%) of the approved payment applications for projects with contract of less than \$500,000.00; or
- b) Ninety-five percent (95%) of the approved payment applications for projects with contract prices of \$500,000.01 or greater.
- 6.05 The normal retainage shall not be due the Contractor until after Substantial Completion and expiration of the forty-five (45) day lien period and submission to the Engineer of a clear lien certificate and invoice for retainage.
- 6.06 Final Payment. Upon the final completion of all Work, the Contractor may request a final inspection and may make a final Application for Payment as provided by Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions.
- 6.07 Final Acceptance. When Final Acceptance is granted by the Owner, the Owner shall file the certificate with the Recorder of Mortgages for St. Charles Parish.
- 6.08 At the expiration of the lien period the Contractor shall obtain a certificate from the Recorder of Mortgages of the Parish of St. Charles that the Contract is clear of any liens or privileges, and said certificate shall be presented to the Owner for final payment and release of retainage, less any such sums as may be lawfully withheld under the Contract.
- 6.09 Claims. Pursuant to La. R.S. 38:2242, when the Owner receives any claim of nonpayment arising out of the Contract, the Owner shall deduct such claim from the Contract Sum. The Contractor, or any interested party, may deposit security, in accordance with La. R.S.

38:2242.2, guaranteeing payment of the claim with the Recorder of Mortgages for St. Charles Parish. When the Owner receives original proof of such guarantee from the Recorder of Mortgages, the claim deduction will be added back to the Contract Sum.

ARTICLE 7

CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIONS

- 7.01 In order to induce Owner to enter into this Agreement, Contractor makes the following representations:
- 7.02 Contractor has familiarized itself with the nature and extent of the Contract Documents, Work, site, locality, and all local conditions and laws and regulations that in any manner may affect cost, progress, performance or finishing of the Work.
- 7.03 Contractor has studied carefully all reports of explorations and tests of subsurface physical conditions and drawings of physical conditions which are identified in the Information Available To Bidders and as provided in the General Conditions.
- 7.04 Contractor has obtained and carefully studied (or assumed responsibility for obtaining and carefully studying) all such examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, reports and studies (in addition to or to supplement those referred to in Paragraph 2 above) which pertain to the subsurface or physical conditions at or contiguous to the site or which otherwise may affect the cost, progress, performance or furnishing of the Work as Contractor considers necessary for the performance or furnishing of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Time and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract Documents. In exercising its responsibility with respect to subsurface conditions and physical conditions at the site, Contractor has or will obtain or perform at no additional cost to the Owner such additional examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, reports, studies, or similar information or data as may be required by Contractor for such purposes.

ARTICLE 8

CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

- 8.01 The following Contract Documents, which comprise the entire Agreement between Owner and Contractor, are all hereby made a part of that Agreement to the same extent as if incorporated herein in full:
- a) Contract (Section 00500)
- b) Performance Bond (Section 00611)
- c) Payment Bond (Section 00610)
- d) Insurance Certificates
- e) Advertisement for Bids (Section 00010)
- f) Louisiana Uniform Public Works Bid Form (Section 00300)
- g) Addenda (Numbers One to Two inclusive)
- h) Contract documents bearing the general title "St. Charles Parish Parks and Recreation East Bank Trailhead Upgrade" dated October 5, 2021.
- i) Drawings, consisting of a cover sheet dated October 5, 2021 and the sheets listed on Drawing St. Charles Parish Parks and Recreation East Bank Trailhead Upgrade; each sheet bearing the following general title:
- j) General Conditions (Section 00700)
- k) Supplementary Conditions (if applicable for compliance purposes) (Section 00800)

There are no Contract Documents other than those listed above in this Article 8. The Contract may only be amended, modified or supplemented as provided for in the General Conditions.

ARTICLE 9

MISCELLANEOUS

- 9.01 No assignment by a party hereto of any rights under or interests in the Contract Documents will be binding on another party hereto without the written consent of the party sought to be bound; and specifically but without limitation, moneys that may become due and moneys that are due may not be assigned without such consent (except to the extent that the effect of this restriction may be limited by law), and, unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under the Contract Documents. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Owner may assign this contract to the State of Louisiana or any political subdivision, municipality, special district or authority thereof without Contractor's consent and without recourse.
- 9.02 Owner and Contractor each binds himself, his partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives to the other party hereto, his partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives in respect to all covenants, agreements and obligations contained in the Contract Documents.
