Among the chefs is one local competitor - Chef Ryan Gaudet of Spahr's Seafood in Des Allemands - vying to take the crown of king of Louisiana Seafood.

"With so many chefs in Louisiana to choose from, it was hard to narrow it down to just twelve competitors," Lt. Gov. Billy Nungesser said. "There is no doubt judging dishes this year will be more difficult than ever before. In Louisiana, good food is just part of what connects us to our diverse heritage and seafood is a big part of that. From recipes passed down through generations to the culinary creations of our state's chefs, seafood has developed a culinary identity for Louisiana unlike

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Driver sentenced after knocking worker off bridge

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Hunter Johnson, 23, of Reserve, was sentenced to 30 years with the Louisiana Department of Corrections for the crime of vehicular homicide, stemming from an incident in March of 2021 in which highway worker Brady Ortego was struck and killed on I-310.

The sentence is a split sentence with 18 years in custody and 12 years of supervision upon release.

In addition, Johnson received a sentence of five years with the Louisiana Department of Corrections for the crime of obstruction of justice. The sentences, which are the result of a plea agreement between the State of Louisiana and the defendant, were ordered to run concurrently to one another. Johnson was remanded to the custody of the Louisiana Department of Corrections immediately following sentencing. He pled guilty to both charges on Feb. 9.

Johnson was arrested on March 12, 2021 following an investigation by the Louisiana State Police into the circumstances surrounding the death of Brady Ortego. Ortego was killed when he was struck in the early morning hours of Jan. 14, 2021 by a vehicle driven by Johnson. Ortego was performing overnight work on I-310 in St. Charles Parish at the time of his death.

Prior to the sentencing, Judge Timothy S. Marcel heard victim impact statements from Ortego’s mother, wife, step-daughter and sister, who each shared their memories of the victim.

“I would first like to express my appreciation to the family of Brady Ortego for their patience and determination in seeing this case through to its just conclusion,” said St. Charles Parish

Alligator hunter bids being accepted through June 30

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Alligator hunters, be on alert. The Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries (LDWF) is currently accepting bids for alligator hunting on Wildlife Management Areas, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers properties and state wildlife refuges for the 2022-2024 alligator harvest seasons through June 30.

Eligible alligator hunters are chosen through a bid system every three years on selected WMAs/Refuges/USACE properties.

A total of 36 alligator hunting opportunities are available for bid on 13 WMAs, one Refuge and

two USACE properties. The number of alligator tags that will be issued to successful bidders in 2022 will range from 10-90 tags depending on the area awarded.

This bidding is done every three years. Annually, the commercial alligator harvest comes in the month of September and October.

“Alligators in Louisiana are not a game species like bass or waterfowl or deer. It’s actually commercial harvest ... the meat is sold for human consumption and the skin is used to be turned

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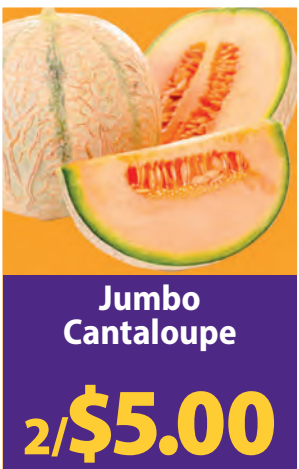
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Food trucks, rock climbing wall highlight informational ‘signing day’ for kindergartners

Organizers said the event will invite families to commit to academic excellence and family fun during their child’s kindergarten year. Participants will have the opportunity to engage in learning stations, as well as sign a commitment letter with their school.

Food trucks, a rock climbing wall and other activities will also be at the event, which will take place Saturday, July 9 from 9 a.m. – 1 p.m. at the SCPPS Professional Learning Center, located at 12727 Hwy 90 in Luling.

The general session will begin at 9 a.m. Patricia Smith, the district’s director of federal programs, said attendees are encouraged to be there at 9 a.m.

“This will not take place of open houses at individual schools,” Smith said. “The goal of this event would be that our parents truly feel welcomed into the schools and into our district. We want this to be the first positive experience showing the culture and climate of this district.”

She said the day will focus on very basic things that the district needs families to know in order for their child to be successful in kindergarten. The event will feature break-out sessions tackling many topics, including things parents can do at home to support school learning.

“We want out parents to have a better idea of what our kindergarten experience can be from a parents’ perspective,” Smith said.

District Title I Coordinator Lacey Powers said the We M.A.D.E. organization has stepped in to make this event an even bigger celebration.

“When I first began thinking of this event, I wanted our team to create a day to celebrate our incoming kindergarten students and their families,” Powers said. “I wanted to provide an opportunity to welcome families into St. Charles Parish Public Schools and make them feel comfortable with the schools and learn more about what to expect during that first year in our school system.”

Powers said as a mom of an incoming kindergartener, she wanted an opportunity for her own family and all families to gain some insight and knowledge about the content that would be taught and how to make sure kindergarten students were as prepared as they could be for the first days of school.

any other state. That’s the main reason for events like the Louisiana Seafood Cook-Off. It’s a chance to celebrate the great contribution of our chefs, and our hard-working seafood industry, make in Louisiana that truly Feed Your Soul.”

Born and raised in Thibodaux, Gaudet started cooking at home at the age of 13. He embarked on his 26-year career as a dishwasher at Flanagan’s in Thibodaux, and continued working for other local restaurants around the Lafourche and Terrebonne bayous until he later graduated from the Chef John Folse Culinary Institute at Nicholls State University in 2005. Gaudet apprenticed for several restaurants in the Chicago area, most notably Moto under the late Omar Cantu. He is the people’s choice award winner for the 2015 Louisiana Restaurant Association’s Bayou Chapter Culinary Showcase.

Gaudet is now the Executive Chef for Spahr’s Seafood, managing the operations of three Spahr’s units located in Galliano, Thibodaux, and Des Allemands and also Malt and Burger, an old school drive in burger and shake joint in Thibodaux. His newest venture – a seafood market located next to Spahr’s Des Allemands location – should be open in a few months.

Gaudet said he was honored to be included in this year’s competition – especially since this year’s contest had a record number of applicants.

“I’m humbled that I was selected to compete this year,” he said. “It’s a little prideful to know you made the selection process, because they really do their research in the selection process.”

This year’s Louisiana Seafood Cook-Off is being held on June 7 at the Cajundome Convention Center in Lafayette, the city said to have more restaurants



per capita than any other American city. Many of the restaurants that have helped earn that distinction will be serving samples to spectators as a part of the Taste of EatLafayette, which will take place in conjunction with the Louisiana Seafood Cook-Off. Gaudet said the competition is open to the public.

“It’s an exciting thing to watch,” he said. “It gets pretty intense when the clock starts ticking down ... the most intense part of the competition is the timing aspect of it.”

This is the fourth time Gaudet has participated in the competition – once he was an assistant and this will be the third time he is the lead chef.

“There’s other states out there that have their own unique seafood, but this competition really puts Louisiana on the map,” he said.

Chef Edgar “Dooky” Chase IV and Celeste Chachere, great-granddaughter of Tony Chachere, will be among the judges deciding the 2022 King or Queen of Louisiana Seafood.

To be eligible to compete, a chef must be the executive

chef of a free-standing Louisiana restaurant belonging to the Louisiana Restaurant Association.

In addition to earning the title of King or Queen of Louisiana Seafood, the winner will represent the state at a variety of events including the Great American Seafood Cook-Off, hosted by the Louisiana Seafood Promotion and Marketing Board and held in New Orleans during the Louisiana Restaurant Association Showcase on Aug. 6.

Other chefs that will be competing are Ryan Cashio with LaPlace’s Cajun House & Catering, Amanda Cusey with The Villa Harlequin in Lake Charles, Russell

Davis with Baton Rouge’s Eliza Restaurant & Bar and JED’S Local Louisiana Po’boys, David Dickensauge with Tsunami in Baton Rouge, Ben Fidelak with Mariner’s Restaurant in Natchitoches, Kyle Hudson with Beausoleil Coastal Cuisine in Baton Rouge, Karlos Knott with Bayou Teche Brewing & Cajun Saucer in Arnaudville, Brett Monteleone with Junior’s on Harrison in New Orleans, Amy Sin with Langlois in New Orleans, Joshua Spell with Fezzo’s Seafood Steakhouse & Oyster Bar in Crowley and Grant Wallace with Dickie Brennan’s Steakhouse in New Orleans.

tight to their money and we are not getting the money we need to stay open.

The store's last day of business will be June 27. Liquidation sales are currently being held at the store, which is located at 12715 Highway 90, Ste 160B in Luling.

"We appreciate the community supporting our small business for all of these years," Witmer said.

Several other Sears Hometown locations across the country have recently announced that they are closing. Sears Hometown stores sell a range

District Attorney Joel T. Chaisson II. "This case presented investigatory challenges that required Trooper Lawrence Williams of the Louisiana State Police to utilize many different technological tools prior to seeking a warrant for the arrest of Hunter Johnson.

"The sentence imposed today is the culmination of the exemplary efforts of Trooper Williams, who worked tirelessly to ensure that his investigation was complete so that the right man was apprehended and held accountable, and the meticulous prosecution of the case by Assistant District Attorneys, Mark F. Lopez and J. William Starr. Nothing can bring Brady Ortego back, but I hope that this sentence can give his family the closure and justice that they deserve."

Johnson was arrested and booked in March of 2021 with vehicular homicide, driving under the influence, hit and run, reckless operation and obstruction of justice. He was accused of hitting four construction workers with his truck the night of Jan. 14 on the Hale Boggs Bridge. Ortego fell from the bridge, 150 feet into the Mississippi River, as result of the blow he absorbed.

Johnson's mother and grandmother were each arrested in the weeks

of home appliances, lawn and garden equipment, apparel, mattresses, sporting goods, and tools, among other products.

Sears and Kmart have closed hundreds of stores since it filed bankruptcy in 2018, emerging from Chapter 11 the following year. The newly formed company Transformco acquired Sears Hometown stores in February 2019, which at the time had more than 400 "independently-owned and operated, dealer-managed smaller format stores."

following his arrest on charges of obstruction of justice, for their alleged roles in helping Johnson elude capture for a time.

According to Louisiana State Police, Johnson was injured in the crash and abandoned his vehicle on foot, leaving key evidence at the scene.

Earlier this year, a lawsuit was filed in an Orleans Parish civil court on behalf of Ortego's widow, Adele, and her daughter Kyleigh Brown.

The lawsuit also named Johnson's mother, Pebbles, as a defendant, claiming she picked up her son from near the scene of the accident and proceeded to hide him from law enforcement officers at a nearby hotel. The suit alleges the two hid in order to avoid potential criminal charges and civil litigation. Eyewitnesses said, following the accident, that someone had picked up the driver and brought him for treatment at St. Charles Parish Hospital.

The suit claims Johnson was intoxicated following an extended period of drinking at a Hooter's restaurant. It also claims that Johnson reached out to Adele in the weeks following the accident, doing so via social media, and in doing so inflicted emotional distress upon the widow.

into leather to make products," said Vaughan McDonald of the LDWF. "We've had a suppressed market, largely because of coronavirus, the same way it's affected other commodities. The cash value is quite low, but it's still a commercial harvest in terms of our farm harvest and our wild harvest."

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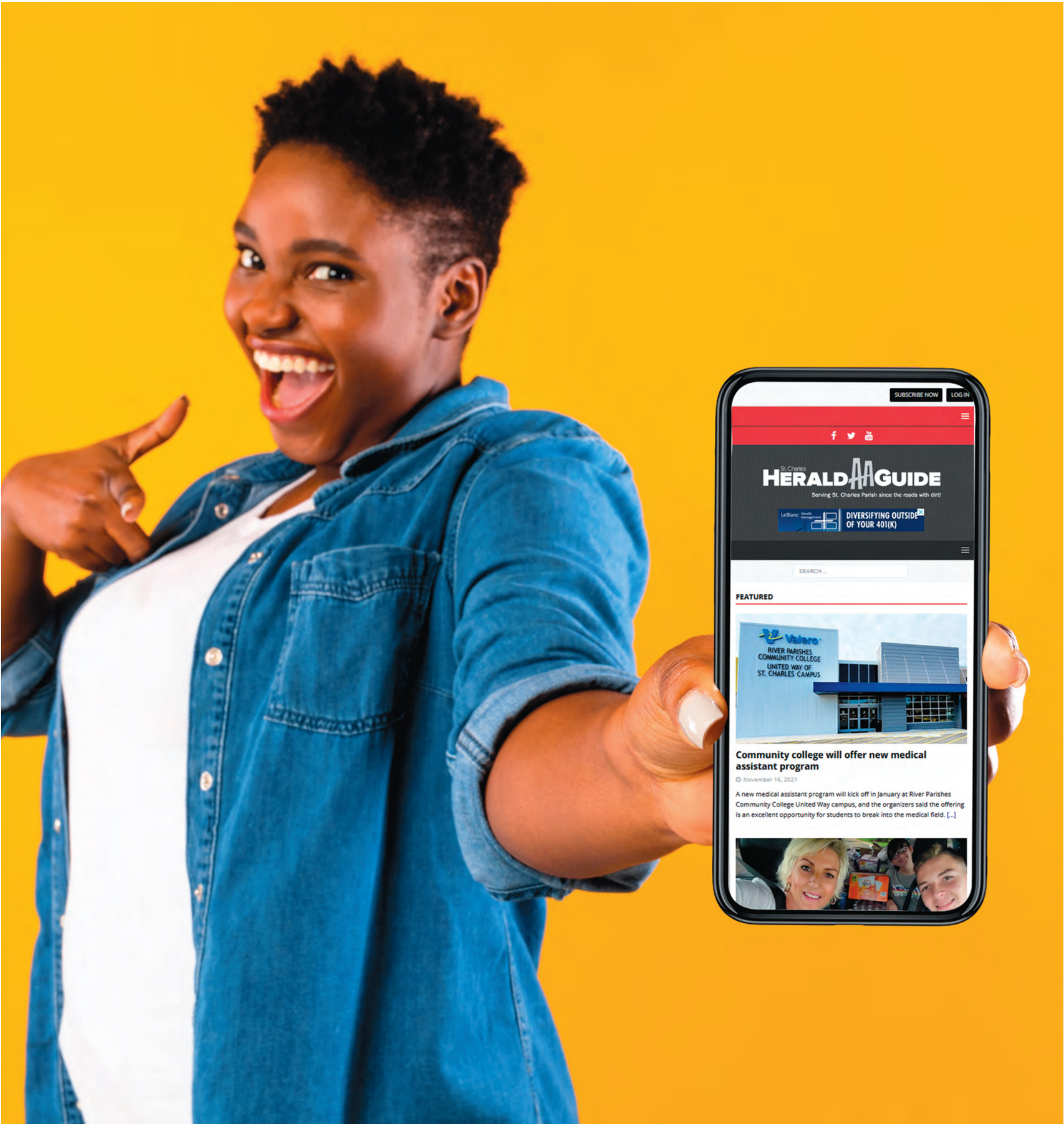
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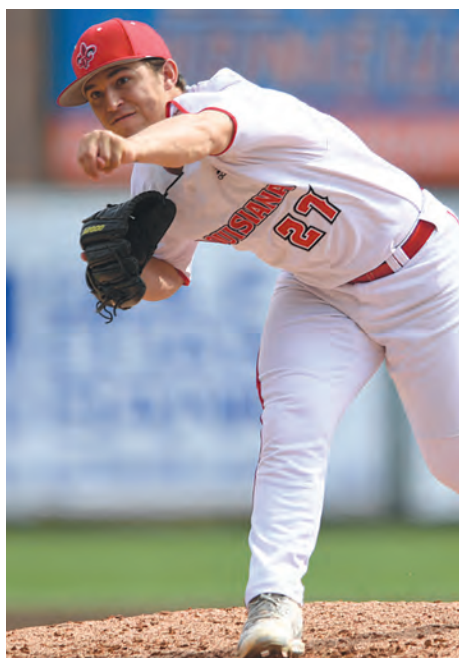

Tigers alum answered adversity to finish sharp at ULL

Senior lefty had doubts about return, left none about skills; helps lead team into NCAA Regional



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Once the ace of the Hahnville High rotation, Austin Perrin is putting the finishing touches on a fine college career at Louisiana-Lafayette – and a fine senior season, one that not that long ago hardly seemed promised.

On Friday, the Cajuns (36-21) will begin NCAA Regional play with a matchup against No. 5 and regional host Texas A&M. It will be the first NCAA tournament game for the program after a six-year hiatus. ULL clinched the Sun Belt tournament conference championship by rallying past Georgia State, 7-6, on Sunday.

Perrin, who Hahnville fans remember as a big game pitcher in his days with

the Tigers, may well be counted on in the coming days to deliver. As it is, he's already shown plenty of fight in his collegiate career.

The lefthander injured his "lat" muscle in a 2019 game against Mississippi State, a bad break that cost him the 2020 season. Beyond that, the injury did not present a clear road to rehab for him at first – he told The Advocate in 2021 that the injury prevented him from lifting his arm at all, and placed doubts in his mind as to if he'd ever have the opportunity to pitch again for the Cajuns.

Those doubts disappeared, or perhaps more accurately, Perrin chased them away through relentless work to get back on the mound.

And get back on the mound he did, with a vengeance. Perrin leapt into his

first action in two seasons as a junior in 2021 and produced a 2.61 ERA and 1.16 WHIP in 38 innings, including seven starts – those numbers represented career best marks, showing no rust from his layoff or ill-effects from the injury. His first seven appearances saw opponents scratch no runs across against him. He helped the Cajuns post a 32-23 record that season.

As a senior this season, he followed that up with another quality campaign. Perrin went 3-0 on the mound in the regular season with a 2.78 ERA and a 1.24 WHIP, starting two games and appearing in 15 total. He struck out 24 batters in 22.2 innings. Highlighting his year was a stretch of seven straight scoreless appearances, including extended efforts against Rice and Appalachian State.

At Hahnville, Perrin was a star and a team leader. As a senior, Perrin earned one of the All-State pitcher slots as he dominated in his final year. His numbers included a 1.45 ERA, a 0.85 WHIP, a 7-3 record and 102 strikeouts in 67.1

Perrin went 3-0 on the mound with a 2.78 ERA and a 1.24 WHIP, with 24 strikeouts in 22.2 innings.

innings. That strikeout count pushed Perrin to 277 for his career, believed to be an all-time Hahnville record. His career ERA was 1.52 and WHIP 0.91;



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Local author pens second book aimed at helping teens

Destrehan native Dr. Christie Cognevich, who graduated as salutatorian of Destrehan High School in 2002, will have her second book published this summer.

Cognevich's second young adult nonfiction book titled - Dealing with Stress: Insights and Tips for Teenagers - will be published in July 2022 by Rowman & Littlefield. Her debut Depression: Insights and Tips for Teenagers was published in the same "Empowering You" mental health series in 2020.

"Honestly, I sat down to write this book because the timing felt urgent," Cognevich, an educator, said. "History-making events are all colliding right now, and this book addresses coping mechanisms for the huge stress that comes along with our times. During the COVID pandemic, I watched my students trying so hard to connect in a completely unprecedented world where everything turned upside down in the blink of an eye. In just a couple of years, children and adolescents have lived with incredible uncertainty. They've lost loved ones, experienced academic upheaval, and witnessed family upheaval with working from home and lost jobs. Local kids just endured Hurricane Ida. That has added even more layers of traumatic stress to their lives—school disruption, evacuation, home damage."

She added that every day in the news there are more reports about economic crises, war, and school shootings.

"It's a lot for adults to process, much less young people, so these anecdotes and strategies are hopefully helpful and coming at the right time," Cognevich said. "The first thing I hope they get is some peace knowing that there are explanations for the stress responses they're experiencing. They aren't just overreacting or being too sensitive. Our psychological and physiological states are linked; sometimes understanding how stress impacts our physical and mental states can be the key to letting go of some of our shame about how we're feeling. We can't cope with our stress if we can't acknowledge it as valid to begin with. Secondly, I hope they walk away with some strategies for how to cope with the very real stressors they're experiencing."

Cognevich said that stress isn't necessarily a bad thing.

"It is essential for our survival, but learning how to work with it instead of against it is part of our journey," she said. "Learning those skills early in life can have very long-term benefits."

Cognevich earned a BA and MA in English literature from the University of New Orleans and a PhD in English literature from Louisiana State University. She is currently earning an MFA specializing in creative writing for children and young adults from the Vermont College of Fine Arts. She said she is now working on her third book.

"It is very, very different from what I've been publishing," she said. "My first two books are non-fiction, but I'm currently working on a young adult novel. It's a big shift from the research and interviews of non-fiction to plotting out character development in fiction, but I love writing both. The current project is a mystery with a little bit of magic, and it's set in New Orleans. I'm about one-third of the way done with it, but the goal is to finish writing it this year."

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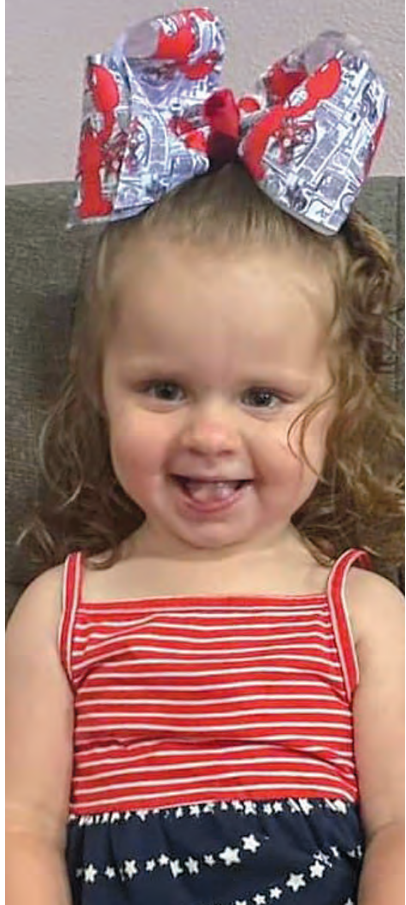

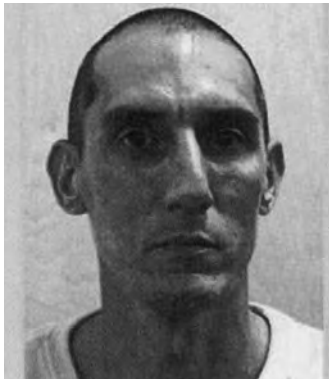

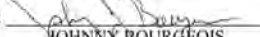
