On June 28 Olivia will have her cleft palate surgery. An open heart surgery should take place later this fall, Guidry said, depending on Olivia's recovery and overall health.

Olivia's list of medical complexities includes but is not limited to having a congenitally corrected transposition of great arteries, bilateral cleft palate with cleft lip, ventricular septal defect, horseshoe kidney, Pierre Robin sequence, obstructive apnea, multiple congenital anomalies, a single ventricle,

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Luling family still grappling with insurance woes 10 months after Hurricane Ida

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This story is part of a series Herald Guide writers will feature focused on the lives of people in St. Charles Parish still recovering from Hurricane Ida.

Like so many others, the Kitchen family of Luling are still reeling in heartache and sorting out the devastating hand that they were delivered by Hurricane Ida.

“I have lost 60 pounds from all the stress,” Daniele Kitchen said. “I don’t sleep and my poor kids who lost all their stuff ask all the time when we will ever get our house back. They want their rooms back ... some normalcy. It’s been almost a year and we are in hurricane season again. How can insurance do this?”

Daniele is currently living in a camper with her husband and two sons, who are 9 and 14.

“My house is mostly gutted - with non-functioning bathrooms, no ceilings and we lost almost all our furniture and belongings,” she said. “The ceilings collapsed and we had lots of water damage throughout. Insurance did

not give us nearly enough money. We started reaching out to them for more money ... they didn’t even give us enough to do the roof.”

The Kitchens eventually hired a public adjuster.

“They fought for a while but didn’t get the insurance company to budge and now we

Four men will be ordained as permanent deacons Saturday

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St. Charles Parish residents Kevin Robicheaux, Paul Ory, Bruce Trigo and Jason Binet will each be ordained as permanent deacons by Archbishop Gregory Aymond on Saturday at 10 a.m. at St. Louis Cathedral.

The four local men are a part of 16 permanent deacons who will be ordained that day. Keeping with the ancient tradition of the Catholic Church, the Second Vatican Council restored the permanent diaconate in 1967 as a permanent order in the hierarchy. It is open to married men over the age of 35.

Permanent deacons, ordained after several years of theological training, may be single or married. They often hold secular jobs, and can baptize, witness marriages, perform funeral and burial services, distribute holy Communion and preach a homily. They cannot celebrate Mass, hear confessions or administer the sacrament of the anointing of the sick.

They are obligated each day to pray the Liturgy of the Hours.

Robicheaux has been married to his wife Erica for 26 years. They have two daughters, Amanda and Amber.

Robicheaux is a graduate of Hahnville High School and Nicholls State University. He taught and coached for 22 years before retiring in 2017, the same year his formation in the diaconate program began.

He is a life-long member of St. Anthony of Padua Parish in Luling, where he serves as an acolyte, and the owner of St. Charles Driving Academy.

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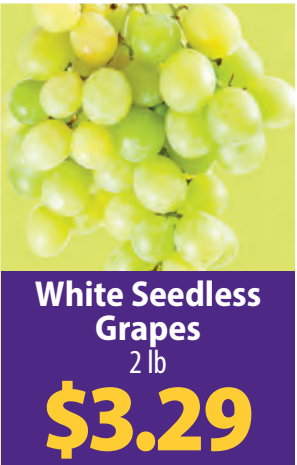
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Child’s tragic loss inspires gifts of Angel Gowns

When Stephanie Parria and her daughter Courtney make Angel Gowns, they never feel alone.

“I never got a chance to meet Layla ... every time I make one of these, I feel like she’s with me,” Parria said.

Courtney Fasola was 27 weeks pregnant when she tragically lost Layla. The day it happened, the hospital Courtney was receiving care at had only gauze to wrap Layla’s body in.

“She said her only regret was not having something better to put her child in ... her wish from that point has been that no mother ever has to go through having to wrap their baby in gauze as their last outfit again,” said Parria, a Des Allemands native. “It’s already a traumatic experience that it made that much worse.”

The experience inspired Fasola and Parria to begin making Angel Gowns to donate to hospitals and parents who have lost a child. The name of their collaboration is Layla’s Angel Baby Gowns, honoring the daughter and granddaughter the family lost far too soon.

This month, the two delivered and donated 10 sets of Angel Gowns to the NICU at North Oaks Hospital in Hammond.

“Courtney asked me if there was anything we could do, and I started re-searching,” Parria said. “I came across

a few sites where people were making Angel Gowns, and I thought that would be a good place for us to turn.”

Angel Gowns are infant burial gowns made to comfort bereaved families who have lost a child. These gowns are often made from wedding dresses, and Layla’s gowns are much the same, made from wedding dresses, formal gowns and other dress wear that have been donated to make angel boy and girl burial outfits.

Parria and Fasola include thoughtfully filled memory boxes with the gowns, and offered those to hospitals, birthing centers, funeral homes and directly to grieving families free of charge.

The package includes an angel outfit for the baby, a bunting or a wrap, a tiny blanket, a tiny hat, a card for the parents, and also keepsakes including mommy and me matching bracelets, angel wings or a heart made from the same material as the angel gown, a pouch for the keepsakes and a tiny toy for the “angel.”

The two have donated to several hospitals, including Ochsner locations and Children’s Hospital, and have even sent packages to out of state hospitals. Local volunteers have also helped Layla’s Angel Gowns expand its reach

A private label cane syrup and raw sugar are among the new and exclusive offerings of the Destrehan Plantation Gift Shop, and plans are now in the works for a cookbook accompaniment to the cane syrup.

Joshua Pardo is in his third month as the gift shop manager, and said he is excited about the opportunity to learn more about the region and add new offerings to the shop.

“I could not be more excited to work at Destrehan Plantation and play a part in preserving Louisiana’s rich history,” he said. “I have come to find St. Charles Parish as very special, historic and charming. I’ve got big plans for the shop, with new and exciting merchandise hitting the shelves every month.”

Pardo said he started brainstorming about fresh offerings he could bring in to the shop to sell when he took over operations in March.

“One of the first things I thought of that was a cane syrup and raw sugar ... not only to tie better to the experience but to make things feel fresh in the store” he said.

He immediately dove into the process to bring the cane syrup to the shop via a private label.

“It developed rather quickly. It was a labor of love, but it has definitely become one of our leading sellers for sure,” he said. “I love Louisiana’s local sugar cane industry and found this to be a great way to tie the past with the present ... it is absolutely delicious.”

The syrup can be used for everything from baking and barbequing to stirring in your coffee, Pardo said.

Next came the raw sugar product. Now Pardo said he is planning for a

cookbook to accompany the line.

“It’s in the early development,” he said of the book. “We’re compiling recipes and would give credit to everyone. We want it to reflect the history of the plantation and information about sugar and cane syrup.”

Pardo said he hopes to continue to grow the gift shop’s private label product line, as well as continue to expand the shop’s line of local favorites.

an abnormal brain MRI, asplenia, tricuspid valve atresia, total anomalous pulmonary venous connection, CHARGE syndrome, chronic otitis media and sensorineural hearing loss of both ears.

Miller said they adopted their son Easton a few years ago, and after the couple got engaged they found out they were pregnant with their first baby.

“We found out that our daughter would have many medical issues just a few weeks before she was born,” he said. “We knew at 17 weeks about her cleft lip, but then we learned she had a heart defect and they thought she was missing a kidney.”

Miller, Guidry and Easton moved to St. Charles Parish from Jennings in 2020 after Olivia was born so that they could be closer to the hospital she was in. Olivia underwent her first surgery at just 7 weeks old, and spent 101 days in the NICU before she was able to live at home.

Hurricane Ida briefly displaced the family, but Guidry said they are back living in their Luling home.

To help offset medical expenses, the family is raising funds through the sale of custom T-shirts. The shirts are available for purchase by visiting www.customink.com, clicking on the “Fundraising” table and searching “Olivia Jane’s Journey.”

There is also an option on the site to donate additional money to the family. The T-shirt sales will end at the beginning of July, but Guidry said she is researching

options to open up another shirt order and to offer kids’ shirt sizes.

Guidry said the level of support from people – many of them strangers – in St. Charles Parish has been overwhelming.

“The outpouring of support and love from the community has been one of the things getting us through,” Guidry said. “It’s amazing ... it really is. When she was born we had a big support system with our close family and friends, but to see strangers and people that we don’t even know support us is really amazing. When she was born we said she would move mountains.”

friend Heather. “She lived here all her life before that ... right here in Paradis.”

On May 12 James, a Navy veteran, was severely burned by a flash fire. He was flown to and stayed for five days at the Blocker Burn Unit in Galveston, Texas. Matherne said 100 percent of all benefit’s donations will be given to the family.

“I had Heather on the phone today and she was literally upset because she feels guilty for taking the help, but I keep telling her, ‘You help everybody else and we’re just doing this in turn because I would call you at the drop of a hat and you would drive from Texas to be here,’” Matherne said. “James is out of work and that could be up to six months. He can’t go into the sunlight with his new skin ... well the doctor said from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. But he works outside that means he can’t work.”

Matherne is helping to organize the benefit with several of Heather’s friends, including Marcie Naquin.

“They’re good people,” Naquin said of the Applebys. “They’re always there to help. She was always helping

with fundraisers here. We’re just trying to get the word out so we can make as much as we can and sell as much as we can.”

Naquin said Heather worked at Dots Diner and Grumpys in Paradis for years.

“She’s like a fixture in Paradis,” Naquin said of Heather. “She goes out of her way for anyone and everyone ... she’d give you the shirt off of her back. I can personally say she was there for me in some of the worst times of my life. That’s why I feel like we need to get out and help her.”

Naquin said since the family moved to Texas they have faced several hardships, including taking care of sick family members.

“We should know in the next month or so,” Connie said.

Love said his goal now is Berlin, and he used that as a motivator during his competition in Orlando.

“I told myself, if I win this, I’m going to Berlin,” Love said. “But no matter what, a silver and a bronze, a 4th place ... I’m proud of that.”

He enjoyed his time out of the pool as well.

“That was my first time at Disney. I’d never been to the Magic Kingdom ... that was a dream come true,” Love said. “I really, really loved it there.”

Love was diagnosed with autism as a young child. He was non-verbal until he was approximately 5, but has come so far since then – he now does public speaking and advocates for people with intellectual disabilities. He began swimming with the local chapter of the Special Olympics program at the age of 6, and by 8 he was competing.

collection of 58 Louisiana athletes competing in the games from June 6 to 11. Five thousand, five hundred athletes in all took part in this year’s games, drawing competitors from all 50 states and the Caribbean.

Love took silver in the 4x50 yard free relay and bronze in the 50-yard butterfly. He also took fourth place in the 100-yard freestyle – despite competing while feeling under the weather that day.

The difference between Love and the 4x50 relay champion was approximately a 100th of a second.

“It felt amazing,” Love said. “The entire experience was amazing. I made some friends from Hawaii, Texas, Nevada ... meeting new people was exciting. I was ready to go there, and ready to fight, but also kept an open mind to meeting new people. And it was a blast.

“It was very emotional and overwhelming at the same time ... I felt

pride, joy, excitement and that all of the sacrifices and hard work finally came together.”

Connie Love, Michael’s mother, got to watch her son earn multiple medals, and she couldn’t be prouder.

“He was swimming every day, two to three hours a day, and working out at the gym for the three months prior to making the trip,” Connie said. “As a team, we brought home 15 medals, and Mikey was a big part of that ... we’re so very proud of him, and it’s not over yet.”

It’s indeed not over yet, because Love, who called his Orlando run a dream come true, has a chance to make another dream a reality soon. He wants to represent the U.S. at the Special Olympics World Games in Berlin in 2023. That will come down to a drawing later in the year, and Love hopes to hear his name selected. The time trials take place later this year.

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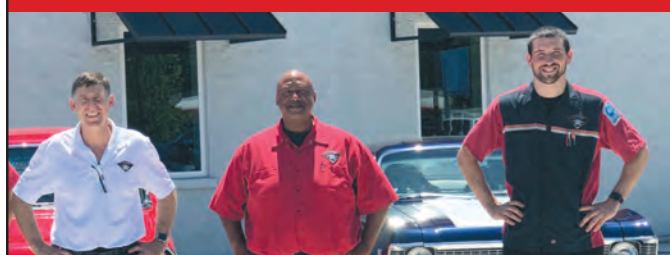

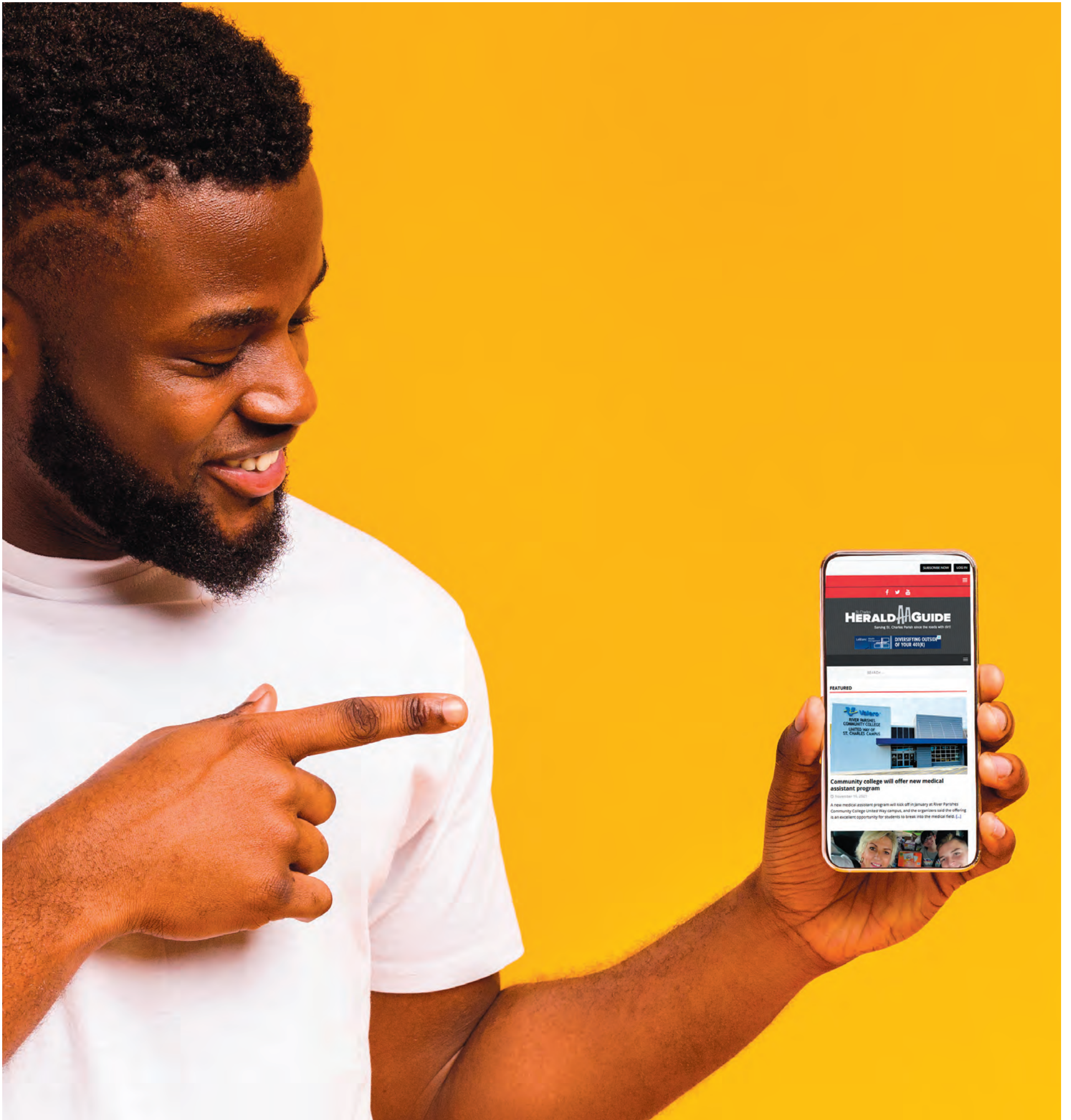

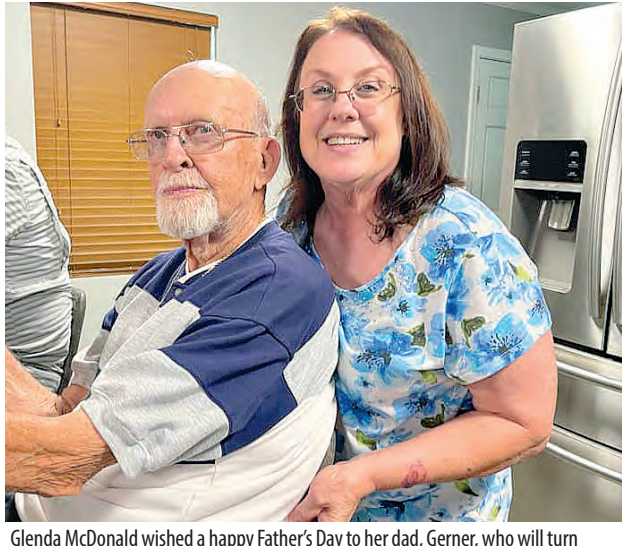

In the event a mini-clean up is required prior to performing the above services, a fee of \$58.61 per mini clean up plus actual disposal fees will be assessed, not to exceed then (10) mini-cleanups per property in violation. On property where trash and/or debris accumulation is such that it requires heavy equipment, bulldozer, front-end loaders, etc. a fee of forty-three dollars and eighty six cents (\$43.96) per cubic yard will be assessed. The change shall become effective beginning with the period ending November 30, 2000. The department of finance shall notify the department of planning and zoning in writing annually of the revised fees.
