"My mom's faith has never wavered ... her strength is excellent and her spirits have been great from the beginning," Evans said.

“My wife is a nurse, so I see it first-hand,” he said. “She’s overworked and

Councilman will do pull-up every minute for 24 hours, raising money for pediatric brain cancer

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On the surface, the challenge facing Dick Gibbs this Friday seems like a physical one. In reality, it’s more of an exercise of mental endurance – and most importantly, it’s for a great cause.

Gibbs will be performing a pull-up every minute, on the minute, for 24 consecutive hours as part of a fundraising effort toward the battle against pediatric brain cancer. It comes through a team up with Hogs for the Cause, a non-profit organization that raises money for families with children undergoing treatment for the illness, and money raised is given out as grants to help relieve financial burden. Each year, nearly 100 barbeque cooking teams compete for a

championship, raising money along the way.

The Destrehan man and St. Charles Parish District III Councilman will be live-streaming his efforts on Facebook and supporters can pledge an amount of money to donate per pull-up. Gibbs has no plans to stop on anything short of 1,440 – one for each minute of the day.

“I know I can do the pull-ups. It’s more a matter of patience,” Gibbs said. “I can’t do more than one in a minute, because that’s against the rules. I have to do a pull-up, then wait 58 seconds, do another, and so on every minute until I

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Louisiana’s 2023 New Teacher of the Year returns to DHS to teach

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Jordyn Vicknair, a Montz native, found massive success in her first year of teaching.

After student teaching at East Ascension High School, Vicknair landed a job at the school teaching geometry there for the 2021-2022 school year. The dedication, passion, and teaching style of the 2021 Louisiana State University graduate caught the eye of administrators there, who nominated Vicknair for the Louisiana Department of Education’s 2023 New Teacher of the Year award.

In partnership with Dream Teachers and the Louisiana Association of Principals, the LDOE annually recognizes and celebrates the state’s leading educators through Louisiana’s Educator Awards Programs. These programs provide an opportunity to acknowledge teachers and leaders who are making exceptional gains with students.

After filling out a series of applications and submitting supplemental information, Vicknair found out that she won the award. This year all winners were celebrated at the 16th Annual Cecil J. Picard Educator Awards Gala at the World War II Museum in New Orleans in July.

“I was shocked ... shocked,” Vicknair said. “That first year of teaching is really

just trying to survive and figure out what works and you’re constantly learning, so being picked the winner out of all of the amazing people who were nominated ... I was shocked, but also just really proud of myself to accomplish that in a year. I love teaching. I’m really passionate about it, so being recognized for something that you’re so passionate about was awesome.”

This school year Vicknair is bringing her talents to Destrehan High School, where she is teaching geometry and Algebra I at her alma mater.

“I had a goal to get back here,” she said of DHS. “It was a destination that I wanted to hit. St. Charles Parish is an insanely awesome school parish. It feels great ... this is the community I came from. I know a lot of the people who

make the school as great as it is. I feel really welcomed and supported.”

Vicknair said her goal is to make her second year of teaching as successful as her first year was.

“I had an amazing year at East Ascension,” she said. “My administrators and other teachers were extremely supportive there. They’re the ones that allowed me that space to do the job.”

known as the Bayou Strangler, aired Tuesday. It is now available on various streaming platforms. Dominique is a serial killer and rapist who murdered at least 23 men and boys in Louisiana between 1997 and 2006. Dominique’s victims tended to be teenagers and men aged between 16 and 46. Many, but not all, were homosexual and African-American. Dominique would often meet these men during walks or drives in his pickup truck, as well as in gay bars, luring them with offers of alcohol, drugs, housing, or group sex with his supposed girlfriend.

On Sept. 23, 2008, Dominique was found guilty and sentenced to several terms of life imprisonment

without parole for his crimes. Following his conviction, the FBI reported that Dominique’s case was the most significant serial homicide case in the country over the past 20 years in terms of victim count and duration.

Dominique was tied to several crimes in St. Charles Parish. His first confirmed victim was 19-year-old David Mitchell, who was picked up while hitchhiking alone from his grandmother’s house. His body was found on July 14, 1997, in a ditch along a highway, near a wooded area in St. Charles Parish.

Dominique’s next two murders took place in the St. Charles Parish. The first was in December 1997, when he strangled 20-year-old Gary Pierre. The second

killing occurred in July 1998, when he killed 38-year-old Larry Ranson.

In 2005 Dominique murdered 28-year-old Alonzo Hogan in St. Charles Parish. Several of his other victims were from St. Charles Parish.

Dominique’s case was unique, Zinna said. Because of the socioeconomic status of many the victims, as well as the fact that many of them were homosexuals like Dominique, there were assumptions made by many regarding the investigation.

“You had the belief among some that law enforcement didn’t care,” Zinna said. “That’s the hardest thing to deal with. Everyone was doing everything they could. We had no information ... no evidence. It went on for nine years.”

Zinna said law enforcement officials from all of the impacted sheriff’s offices worked together early on in the crimes to track the cases and the similarities of the perpetrator.

“We just had a real entangled web there that we were trying to work through,” he said. “But I assure you it’s not because any of us who had these cases didn’t care. It was evident there was some sort of pattern there and we were trying to make a concerted effort in trying to locate the perpetrator. We were sure it was the same individual. It was a major effort on everyone’s part, unfortunately it just took a long time.”

Zinna said the grueling cases were slowed due to sluggish DNA technology at the time, but that opportunities to dive into the case like the one presented by participating in the A&E show are important so that law enforcement representatives can show the care and

compassion that they do feel for the victims and the victim’s families.

Several hours of recorded interviews were conducted with Kindler and Zinna on the case. The filming took place at a bed and breakfast in New Orleans and required both professionals to study the case details for hours.

“It’s important to really always take it at the angle of the number of victims and of course their families and always keeping it front and center of what they endured,” Zinna said. “Just like with any other case, sometimes a lot of things get distorted ... especially with a serial killer’s case. It was good to participate. It gives you an opportunity to really tell your side of the story and let everyone know the stress that is involved in working those types of cases. You’re in the pressure cooker for a long time.”

through dialysis for renal failure. Tomeka, a paraeducator at Harry Hurst Middle School and a resident of New Sarpy, will be taking a leave of absence from the classroom to help her mother through the situation, including providing transportation to and from the hospital. Monday was Tomeka’s last day with her students for the time being. She is her mother’s primary caretaker.

“(Hurst) has been really supportive. Our principal (Dr. David Schexnaydre) asks me about it and always stresses to keep my focus on her being alright,” Tomeka said. “We’ve been seeing how things line up, but right now I have to take off to get her back and forth as needed. I’m an only child ... it’s just me and my mother.”

Tomeka is walking alongside her mother into the latter’s battle, while at the same time the two have been also dealing with Hurricane Ida fallout. Gloria’s home was destroyed by Ida, while Tomeka’s took damage, and the two have been living in a FEMA trailer.

Getting things lined up for Gloria’s upcoming step wasn’t easy, Tomeka said.

“We’ve known about the cancer since May, but the process about getting insurance on that has taken some time,” Tomeka said. “Thursday, though, we went to the doctor, dropped everything off, and from there it kind of took me off guard how soon we were going to start ... but we finally got everything going.”

Tomeka said her mother’s faith in God is helping to guide her through this.

“She’s accepted the Lord as her savior and she is in good spirits,” Tomeka said. “Seeing her in such great spirits is helping me, honestly. It’s hard on me some days. But she is great.”

Though it has just been a temporary return for now, Tomeka said getting back into the classroom since school began last month has provided a welcome distraction at times.

“I love the students,” she said. “You’re always thinking about it, about what’s going on, but being at school with them takes my mind off some of those things going on in everyday life.”

To help pay for supplies, transportation and medical fees, Tomeka began a GoFundMe fundraiser page (titled “My mother”).

She also has preliminary plans ongoing to hold a bake sale fundraiser sometime in the

upcoming weeks. Tomeka is an avid baker – and knows plenty who share her passion for it.

“Baking’s my happy place,” Tomeka said. “I’ve been in contact with a few of my friends to come on board and help us out ... right now, we’re just hoping for the best. Even after the six weeks (of treatment), we still don’t know what’s going to happen. We’re just hoping and praying that everything works out.”

get to 1,440. I'm really looking forward to it. It's getting pretty popular right now and I'm getting excited for it.” Gibbs is clear on this fact: there will be no skirting of the rules. One pull-up every minute means he can't turn his attention away from his task, take a break or do something else. He will be at the gym for 24 hours.

“I'll be up at 6:30 Friday morning and I'll probably go to sleep about 9 in the morning on Saturday,” Gibbs said.

The spark for this event was first initiated years ago, when the owner of the insurance agency Gibbs serves as Vice President of Sales for, Hartwig Moss Insurance, began to get involved with Hogs for the Cause.

Inspired by the cause, Gibbs followed suit, and began to reach out annually to many friends to ask for donations.

“Every year they gave, generously,” Gibbs said. “It would be \$15,000, \$25,000, \$35,000 donated.

“So, I said you know what? This year, I'm gonna earn it.”

That led to the idea for the pull-up challenge and live stream, and already it has proven a success. As of Sunday, Gibbs said pledged donations have crossed the \$20,000 mark.

“There's nothing worse than seeing a very healthy child get brain cancer and ... you just wonder why,” Gibbs said. “It's near and dear to my heart.”

He's combining his desire to help with another passion of his: fitness.

In the 1980s, Gibbs played football at Nicholls State, and upon his departure, he knew he no longer needed to be at his playing weight of 235 pounds.

“I just started running, and I really liked it,” Gibbs said.

He dropped 55 pounds in six months, and running became a lifelong love of his. He notes that over the past 35 years, there are very, very few days that have passed without his morning run. Over the last 19 years, he's put together quite the streak – he hasn't missed a single day.

“I didn't set out to start a streak of some kind, it's just my routine,” Gibbs said. “You can catch me on the levee every morning. It takes some mental discipline ...



health and vanity are the two main reasons.”

On Friday, however, he has every intention of starting – and finishing – a long streak indeed.

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Manning leads Newman into Tiger Stadium for marquee matchup

Hahnville suffers blow with injury to QB Friloux, Gregson steps into starting role

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Few other buildings around the state can match Tiger Stadium's festive atmosphere for a marquee football game – Friday night that's exactly what will be on display in Boutte as the Newman Greenies, led by Arch Manning, roll into town to take on the Hahnville Tigers.

Manning, the second ranked player on the ESPN 300 list of the nation's top recruits and a Texas commitment, is the son of Cooper Manning and the nephew of Peyton and Eli Manning. The Greenies have been to two consecutive state semifinals in Division III, and 2022 represents the final chance for the Greenies to win it all with Manning at the helm.

A win over Hahnville would be a tremendous start to the kind of magical season Newman is hoping to make a reality. They'll be facing a Tigers program with high hopes of its own – but one that's wounded in the aftermath of last Thursday's 29-0 jamboree loss to Jesuit, a final exhibition score far less concerning than an injury suffered by one of the team's leaders and key players.

Senior quarterback Donovan Friloux suffered a torn ACL, MCL and meniscus as well

as a bruised kneecap in the matchup, and will miss the entirety of the season. In his stead will be junior passer Ryan Gregson, who served as Friloux's backup last year as well. He will undergo surgery in two weeks.

Hahnville head coach Daniel Luquet said Friloux's leadership hasn't diminished in the wake

of the very difficult situation, noting the latter has been spurring on his teammates with one key message: this team's goals a week ago remain its goals today.

"It's important for him to be with his guys, be on the sideline, helping Ryan learn the ways and helping us coach," said Luquet. "He's still the leader of this football team, no matter what cards

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Bruins come to town for DHS in Week 1

Talented Destrehan squad sets sights squarely on Superdome, state championship

After two years at the helm of the Destrehan program, head coach Marcus Scott has coached his team through critical district games, thrilling playoff victories and two semifinal games.

But 2022 – knock on wood – will be his first on the Destrehan sideline for a true Week 1 season opener.

Destrehan and the rest of the state had to push back the start of the 2020 season, and in 2021, it was one of many to have to do that again due to Hurricane Ida.

This Friday, however, no compromises should be needed: this will be traditional Friday Night Football at Wildcat Stadium as Bonnabel visits Destrehan.

“The last couple years, it’s been difficult for all of the kids, really, but especially those seniors who are supposed to be guaranteed 10 (regular season) games for their final year, that opportunity to show themselves,” Scott said. “That got cut short. Last year was tough for us and any other teams in this part of the state who were affected by the hurricane. Now we’ve got a chance to play a full schedule, hopefully.

“The kids are excited to play, and I think that goes for kids across the state. This is one of the few sports where you have just one season. A lot of the other sports have play year round, but we have that one season. You practice and prepare so long for it, and once you have a chance to get started, there’s a lot of excitement.”

This is a Destrehan team – and fan-base – with plenty to be excited about. DHS has been to at least the Class 5A semifinals in each of the past three seasons. The Wildcats have a roster boasting several of the state’s most heralded players – and a few of the nation’s best

– and ranks among the favorites for state championship honors.

Due to the aforementioned late start, these teams were scheduled to face off in Week 1 last season but did not play.

Bonnabel went 3-4 last season, besting Grace King, Higgins and Riverdale to earn their wins. The Bruins showed progress from a 2020-21 campaign that saw the program drop its first six games before earning a final week victory to go 1-6.

Guiding the Bruins this season is a new head coach – B.J. Cohen, who played both offensive and defensive line as a veteran of the Arena Football League during his playing days, including time with the New Orleans Voodoo. Cohen played college ball at Marshall, where he was a three-time All-American and teammates with NFL Hall of Famer Randy Moss.

His team is led by quarterback Henry Piedy, who generated over 1,000 yards of offense a year ago and who Scott says is impressive on film. Piedy’s top receiver is a dangerous one in senior Nestor Perez.

“He’s a good player. (Piedy) can make some throws and he’s mobile,” Scott said. “They’ve got capable receivers, quality skill guys. We’ll need to be at our best.”

On defense, two-way linemen Jacoby Reed and James Young combine with linebacker Brandon Lewis to lead the Bruins.

RIDE THE WAVE: Destrehan has several players on the roster committed to play at the next level, and over the past two weeks three players have made their intentions known to make that journey together.

Quarterback Jai Eugene, offensive lineman Landry Cannon and defensive back Kevin Adams all made verbal commitments to play at Tulane, a destination that has been the landing spot for several St. Charles Parish players in recent years. The three Wildcats will be joined by Hahnville wide receiver Dakota Williams, another Wave commitment.

“We’re excited for them,” Scott said. “The main thing for them was making that decision and getting it out of the way, to have a productive senior year and not have that be hanging over them

as a stressful deal. We have a few guys left still making the decision, but we have most of them done.”

CLEANING IT UP: These early weeks of the season are where cohesion is built, and the wrinkles are ironed out. Scott said he wants to see his team keep the number of penalties down – especially the needless ones – be sure tacklers and strong on special teams.

“We had three penalties the other night, and two were dead ball,” Scott said. “So that’s certainly unnecessary. Those are things that we need to cut out early and not make poor choices. If you allow yourself to make those mistakes, you’ll pay the price for them.”

JAMBOREE VICTORY: The Wildcats wrapped up a successful dress rehearsal last week, taking a 20-10 exhibition win at Lutchter that DHS controlled throughout.

Trey Nixon’s 57-yard touchdown reception from Jai Eugene early in the second half put Destrehan up 17 and all but put the Bulldogs away in the first jamboree Destrehan’s played since 2019.

“At first, I was pretty blocked off, but I made a good cut and got a good block from my lineman, and took off,” Nixon said.

Shane Lee and Daniel Blood each scored as well for Destrehan, Blood’s touchdown coming on a pass from Eugene, who finished a sharp night with a pair of touchdown passes.

gameplan how to stop a Newman offense led by one of the nation’s most heralded players.

As a freshman, Manning became the first 9th grader to start Newman’s season opener in 40 years. He passed for 2,407 yards, 34 touchdowns and was named MaxPreps’ National Freshman of the Year.

He’s only built on that, throwing for 5,731 yards and 72 touchdowns in his first three years of high school football.

In Newman’s 20-13 jamboree win over De La Salle, Manning rushed for a 34-yard touchdown, reminding observers that for all his arm talent, he has plenty of mobility.

“He’s his daddy’s kid, not his uncle’s,” joked Luquet. “He can hurt you (by running). We’ll have to be fundamentally sound and tackle well. We’ve got to be better this time around.”

But that famous Manning arm is still there.

“His release is outstanding. He doesn’t take many hits or sacks,” said Luquet. “He throws balls before the receivers are breaking. They have chemistry, he’s in sync with all of them. He understands football, coverages ... there’s not much you can do to trick him.”

His top target is fellow senior Will Randle, an athletic, big-bodied player who’s ability to positively impact both the passing and running game has him on the Hahnville staff’s radar.

“He’s their X-factor ... just because they do so much with him,” Luquet said. “They put him in the slot, single him up on one side, put him in the backfield and do some lead blocking stuff with him. Like Arch, he understands every single part of the playbook. He makes them tick.”

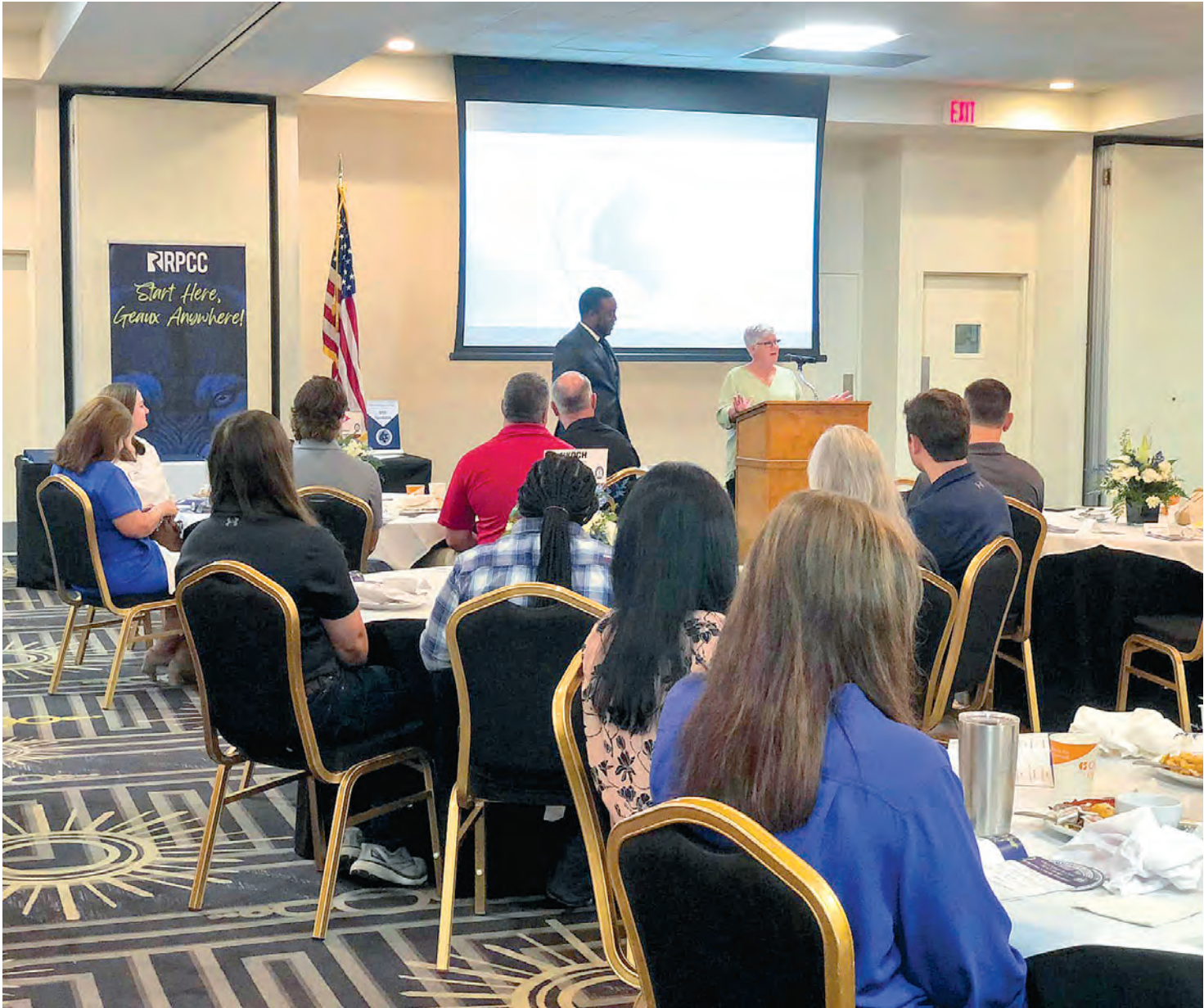

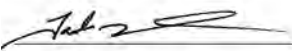

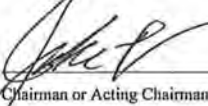

"Government Securities" means direct obligations of, or obligations the principal of and interest on which are unconditionally guaranteed by the United States of America, which are non-callable prior to their maturity, may be United States Treasury obligations such as the State and Local Government Series and may be in book-entry form.

"Interest Payment Date" means March 1 and September 1 of each year, commencing March 1, 2023.

"Issuer" means School District No. 1 of the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana.

"Outstanding" when used with respect to Bonds means, as of the date of determination, all Bonds theretofore issued and delivered under this Resolution, except:

- Any Bond theretofore canceled by the Paying Agent or delivered to the Paying Agent for cancellation;
- Any Bond for which payment sufficient funds or government securities, or both, have been tendered to the Paying Agent or deposited in trust for the owners of such Bond with the effect specified in this Resolution or by law;
- Any Bond in exchange for or in lieu of which another Bond has been registered and delivered pursuant to this Resolution; and
- Any Bond alleged to have been mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen which may have been paid as provided in this Resolution or by law.

"Owner" or "Owners" when used with respect to any Bond means the Person in whose name such Bond is registered in the Bond Register.

"Paying Agent" shall mean Argent Trust Company in the City of Ruston, Louisiana.

"Person" means any individual, corporation, partnership, joint venture, association, joint-stock company, trust, unincorporated organization or government or any agency or political subdivision thereof.

"Record Date" for the interest payable on any Interest Payment Date means the 15th calendar day of the month next preceding such Interest Payment Date.

"Resolution" means this resolution authorizing the issuance of the Bonds, as it may be supplemented and amended.

"Underwriter" means Crews & Associates, of Little Rock, Arkansas, the original purchaser of the Bonds.

SECTION 2. **Authorization of Bonds; Maturities.** In compliance with the terms and provisions of the Act, there is hereby authorized the incurring of an indebtedness of Fifteen Million Dollars (\$15,000,000) for, on behalf of, and in the name of the Issuer, for the purpose of (i) financing capital expenditures for school purposes for the District, including constructing, acquiring and/or improving schools and related facilities, together with equipment and furnishings therefor, title to which shall be in the public, and (ii) paying the costs of issuance of the Bonds, and to represent said indebtedness, this Governing Authority does hereby authorize the issuance of Fifteen Million Dollars (\$15,000,000) of General Obligation School Bonds, Series 2022, of the Issuer, the Bonds being the first emission of \$35,000,000 of bonds that were authorized at a special election held on April 30, 2022. The Bonds shall be dated the Date of Delivery, shall be numbered consecutively from R-1 upwards, shall mature on March 1 in each of the years and in the principal amounts as shall be set forth in the Bond Purchase Agreement, may be serial bonds or term bonds with mandatory call provisions, as set forth in the Bond Purchase Agreement, and shall mature no later than March 1, 2042. The unpaid principal of the Bonds shall bear interest from the date thereof or from the most recent Interest Payment Date to which interest has been paid or duly provided and shall be payable on each Interest Payment Date.

The Bonds shall bear interest at a rate or rates of interest (not exceeding 6.00% per annum) and shall be sold at such prices as shall be set forth in the Bond Purchase Agreement.

The principal of the Bonds, upon maturity or redemption, shall be payable at the corporate trust office of the Paying Agent upon presentation and surrender thereof, and interest on the Bonds shall be payable by check mailed by the Paying Agent to the Owner (determined as of the close of business on the Record Date) at the address shown on the Bond Register. Each Bond delivered under this Resolution upon transfer of, in exchange for or in lieu of any other Bond shall carry all the rights to interest accrued and unpaid, and to accrue, which were carried by such other Bond, and each such Bond shall bear interest (as herein set forth) so neither gain nor loss in interest shall result from such transfer, exchange or substitution.

During any period after the initial delivery of the Bonds in book-entry-only form when the Bonds are delivered in multiple certificates form, upon request of a registered owner of at least \$1,000,000 in principal amount of Bonds outstanding, all payments of principal and interest on the Bonds will be made by wire transfer in immediately available funds to an account designated by such registered owner; CUSIP number identification with appropriate dollar amounts for each CUSIP number will accompany all payments of principal and interest, whether by check or by wire transfer.

No Bond shall be entitled to any right or benefit under this Resolution, or be valid or obligatory for any purpose, unless there appears on such Bond a certificate of registration substantially in the form provided in this Resolution, executed by the Paying Agent by manual signature.

SECTION 3. **Book-Entry Registration of Bonds.** The Bonds shall be initially issued in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee for The Depository Trust Company ("DTC"), as registered owner of the Bonds, and held in the custody of DTC. The Secretary of the Issuer or any other officer of the Issuer is authorized to execute and deliver a Letter of Representation to DTC on behalf of the Issuer with respect to the issuance of the Bonds in "book-entry only" format. The Paying Agent is hereby directed to execute said Letter of Representation. The terms and provisions of said Letter of Representation shall govern in the event of any inconsistency between the provisions of this Resolution and said Letter of Representation. Initially, a single certificate will be issued and delivered to DTC for each maturity of the Bonds. The Beneficial Owners will not receive physical delivery of Bond certificates except as provided herein. Beneficial Owners are expected to receive a written confirmation of their purchase providing details of each Bond acquired. For so long as DTC shall continue to serve as securities depository for the Bonds as provided herein, all transfers of beneficial ownership interest will be made by book-entry only, and no investor or other party purchasing, selling or otherwise transferring beneficial ownership of Bonds is to receive, hold or deliver any Bond certificate.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, while the Bonds are issued in book-entry-only form, the payment of principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds may be payable by the Paying Agent by wire transfer to DTC in accordance with the Letter of Representation.

For every transfer and exchange of the Bonds, the Beneficial Owner may be charged a sum sufficient to cover such Beneficial Owner's allocable share of any tax, fee or other governmental charge that may be imposed in relation thereto.

Bond certificates are required to be delivered to and registered in the name of the Beneficial Owner under the following circumstances:

- (a) DTC determines to discontinue providing its service with respect to the Bonds. Such a determination may be made at any time by giving 30 days' notice to the Issuer and the Paying Agent and discharging its responsibilities with respect thereto under applicable law; or
- (b) The Issuer determines that continuation of the system of book-entry transfer through DTC (or a successor securities depository) is not in the best interests of the Issuer and/or the Beneficial Owners.

The Issuer and the Paying Agent will recognize DTC or its nominee as the Bondholder for all purposes, including notices and voting.

Neither the Issuer or the Paying Agent are responsible for the performance by DTC of any of its obligations, including, without limitation, the payment of moneys received by DTC, the forwarding of notices received by DTC or the giving of any consent or proxy *in lieu* of consent.

Whenever during the term of the Bonds the beneficial ownership thereof is determined by a book entry at DTC, the requirements of this Resolution of holding, delivering or transferring the

Bonds shall be deemed modified to require the appropriate person to meet the requirements of DTC as to registering or transferring the book entry to produce the same effect.

If at any time DTC ceases to hold the Bonds, all references herein to DTC shall be of no further force or effect.

SECTION 4. **Redemption Provisions.** Unless otherwise provided in the Bond Purchase Agreement, the Bonds maturing on March 1, 2033, and thereafter, shall be callable for redemption at the option of the Issuer in full or in part at any time on or after March 1, 2032 at the principal amount thereof plus accrued interest thereon from the most recent Interest Payment Date to which interest has been paid or duly provided for.

Official notice of such call of any of the Bonds for redemption will be given by first class mail, postage prepaid by notice deposited in the United States mails, or by accepted means of electronic communication, not less than twenty (20) days prior to the redemption date addressed to the registered owner of each bond to be redeemed at his address as shown on the registration books of the Paying Agent.

The Bonds may further be subject to Mandatory Sinking Fund Redemption or other special redemption provisions as may be set forth in the Bond Purchase Agreement.

SECTION 5. **Registration and Transfer.** The Issuer shall cause the Bond Register to be kept by the Paying Agent. The Bonds may be transferred, registered and assigned only on the Bond Register, and such registration shall be at the expense of the Issuer. A Bond may be assigned by the execution of an assignment form on the Bond or by other instruments of transfer and assignment acceptable to the Paying Agent. A new Bond or Bonds will be delivered by the Paying Agent to the last assignee (the new Owner) in exchange for such transferred and assigned Bonds after receipt of the Bonds to be transferred in proper form. Such new Bond or Bonds shall be in the denomination of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof within a single maturity. Neither the Issuer nor the Paying Agent shall be required to issue, register, transfer or exchange any Bond during a period beginning (i) at the opening of business on a Record Date and ending at the close of business on the Interest Payment Date or (ii) with respect to Bonds to be redeemed, at the opening of business fifteen (15) days before the date of the mailing of a notice of redemption of such Bonds and ending on the date of such redemption.

SECTION 6. **Form of Bonds.** The Bonds and the endorsements to appear thereon shall be in substantially the following form attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.

SECTION 7. **Execution of Bonds.** The Bonds shall be signed by the Executive Officers for, on behalf of, in the name of and under the corporate seal of the Issuer shall be signed by the Secretary of the Governing Authority, which signatures and corporate seal may be either manual or facsimile.

SECTION 8. **Pledge of Full Faith and Credit.** The Bonds shall constitute general obligations of the Issuer, and the full faith and credit of the Issuer is hereby pledged for their payment. This Governing Authority does hereby obligate itself and is bound under the terms and provisions of the Act and other provisions of law to impose and collect annually in excess of all other taxes a tax on all of the property subject to taxation within the territorial limits of the Issuer sufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on the Bonds falling due each year, said tax to be levied and collected by the same officers, in the same manner and at the same time as other taxes are levied and collected within the territorial limits of the Issuer.

SECTION 9. **Sinking Fund.** For the payment of the principal of and the interest on the Bonds, the Issuer will establish a special fund, to be held by the regularly designated fiscal agent of the Issuer (the "Sinking Fund"), into which the Issuer will deposit the proceeds of the aforesaid special tax and no other moneys whatsoever. The depository for the Sinking Fund shall transfer from the Sinking Fund to the Paying Agent at least one (1) day in advance of each Interest Payment Date, funds fully sufficient to pay promptly the principal and interest falling due on such date.

All moneys deposited with the regularly designated fiscal agent bank or banks of the Issuer or the Paying Agent under the terms of this Resolution shall constitute sacred funds for the benefit of the Owners of the Bonds, and shall be secured by said fiduciaries at all times to the full extent thereof in the manner required by law for the securing of deposits of public funds.

All or any part of the moneys in the Sinking Fund shall, at the written request of the Issuer, be invested in accordance with the provisions of the laws of the State of Louisiana, in which event all income derived from such investments shall be added only to the Sinking Fund.

SECTION 10. **Application of Proceeds.** The Executive Officers are hereby empowered, authorized and directed to do any and all things necessary and incidental to carry out all of the provisions of this Resolution, to cause the necessary Bonds to be printed, to issue, execute and seal the Bonds, and to effect delivery thereof as hereinafter provided. Except as may be otherwise set forth in the Bond Purchase Agreement, the proceeds derived from the sale of the Bonds, except accrued interest, if any, shall be deposited by the Issuer in a special fund, which may be a separate bank account, to be known as the "Series 2022 Bonds Construction Fund" and shall be used solely for the purpose of (i) financing capital expenditures for school purposes for the District, including constructing, acquiring and/or improving schools and related facilities, together with equipment and furnishings therefor, title to which shall be in the public, and (ii) paying the costs of issuance of the Bonds.

SECTION 11. **Bonds Legal Obligations.** The Bonds shall constitute legal, binding and valid obligations of the Issuer and shall be the only representations of the indebtedness as herein authorized and created.

SECTION 12. **Resolution a Contract.** The provisions of this Resolution shall constitute a contract between the Issuer, or its successor, and the Owner or Owners from time to time of the Bonds and any such Owner or Owners may at law or in equity, by suit, action, mandamus or other

proceedings, enforce and compel the performance of all duties required to be performed by this Governing Authority or the Issuer as a result of issuing the Bonds.

No material modification or amendment of this Resolution, or of any resolution amendatory hereof or supplemental hereto, may be made without the consent in writing of the Owners of two-thirds (2/3) of the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds then outstanding; provided, however, that no modification or amendment shall permit a change in the maturity or redemption provisions of the Bonds, or a reduction in the rate of interest thereon, or in the amount of the principal obligation thereof, or affecting the obligation of the Issuer to pay the principal of and the interest on the Bonds as the same shall come due from the taxes pledged and dedicated to the payment thereof by this Resolution, or reduce the percentage of the Owners required to consent to any material modification or amendment of this Resolution, without the consent of all of the Owners of the Bonds.

SECTION 14. **Severability; Application of Subsequently Enacted Laws.** In case any one or more of the provisions of this Resolution or of the Bonds shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions of this Resolution or of the Bonds, but this Resolution and the Bonds shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provisions had not been contained therein. Any constitutional or statutory provisions enacted after the date of this Resolution which validate or make legal any provision of this Resolution and/or the Bonds which would not otherwise be valid or legal, shall be deemed to apply to this Resolution and to the Bonds.

SECTION 15. **Recital of Regularity.** This Governing Authority having investigated the regularity of the proceedings had in connection with the Bonds herein authorized and having determined the same to be regular, the Bonds shall contain the following recital, to-wit:

"It is certified that this Bond is authorized by and is issued in conformity with the requirements of the Constitution and statutes of the State of Louisiana."

SECTION 16. **Effect of Registration.** The Issuer, the Paying Agent, and any agent of either of them may treat the Owner in whose name any Bond is registered as the Owner of such Bond for the purpose of receiving payment of the principal of and interest on such Bond and for all other purposes whatsoever, and to the extent permitted by law, neither the Issuer, the Paying Agent, nor any agent of either of them shall be affected by notice to the contrary.

SECTION 17. **Notices to Owners.** Wherever this Resolution provides for notice to Owners of Bonds of any event, such notice shall be sufficiently given (unless otherwise herein expressly provided) in writing and mailed, first-class postage prepaid, to each Owner of such Bonds, at the address of such Owner as it appears in the Bond Register. In any case where notice to Owners of Bonds is given by mail, neither the failure to mail such notice to any particular Owner of Bonds, nor any defect in any notice so mailed, shall affect the sufficiency of such notice with respect to all other Bonds. Where this Resolution provides for notice in any manner, such notice may be waived in writing by the Owner or Owners entitled to receive such notice, either before or after the event, and such waiver shall be the equivalent of such notice. Waivers of notice by Owners shall be filed with the Paying Agent, but such filing shall not be a condition precedent to the validity of any action taken in reliance upon such waiver.

SECTION 18. **Cancellation of Bonds.** All Bonds surrendered for payment, redemption, transfer, exchange or replacement, if surrendered to the Paying Agent, shall be promptly canceled by it and, if surrendered to the Issuer, shall be delivered to the Paying Agent and, if not already canceled, shall be promptly canceled by the Paying Agent. The Issuer may at any time deliver to the Paying Agent for cancellation any Bonds previously registered and delivered which the Issuer may have acquired in any manner whatsoever, and all Bonds so delivered shall be promptly canceled by the Paying Agent. All canceled Bonds held by the Paying Agent shall be disposed of as directed in writing by the Issuer.

While the Bonds are held in the Book-Entry System they need not be physically presented to the Trustee on the Redemption Date. The transfer of beneficial interest will be affected in accordance with procedures of the Depository Trust Company.

SECTION 19. **Mutilated, Destroyed, Lost or Stolen Bonds.** If (1) any mutilated Bond is surrendered to the Paying Agent, or the Issuer and the Paying Agent receive evidence to their satisfaction of the destruction, loss or theft of any Bond, and (2) there is delivered to the Issuer and the Paying Agent such security or indemnity as may be required by them to save each of them harmless, then, in the absence of notice to the Issuer or the Paying Agent that such Bond has been acquired by a bona fide purchaser, the Issuer shall execute, and upon its request the Paying Agent shall register and deliver, in exchange for or in lieu of any such mutilated, destroyed, lost, or stolen Bond, a new Bond of the same maturity and of like tenor, interest rate and principal amount, bearing a number not contemporaneously outstanding. In case any such mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen Bond has become or is about to become due and payable, the Issuer in its discretion may, instead of issuing a new Bond, pay such Bond. Upon the issuance of any new Bond under this Section, the Issuer may require the payment by the Owner of a sum sufficient to cover any tax or other governmental charge that may be imposed in relation thereto and any other expenses (including the fees and expenses of the Paying Agent) connected therewith. Every new Bond issued pursuant to this Section in lieu of any mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen Bond shall constitute a replacement of the prior obligation of the Issuer, whether or not the mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen Bond shall be at any time enforceable by anyone and shall be entitled to all the benefits of this Resolution equally and ratably with all other Outstanding Bonds. Any additional procedures set forth in the Agreement, authorized in this Resolution, shall also be available with respect to mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen Bonds. The provisions of this Section are exclusive and shall preclude (to the extent lawful) all other rights and remedies with respect to

the replacement and payment of mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen Bonds.

SECTION 20. **Discharge of Resolution; Defeasance.** If the Issuer shall pay or cause to be paid, or there shall otherwise be paid to the Owners, the principal of and interest on the Bonds, at the times and in the manner stipulated in this Resolution, then the pledge of any money, securities, and funds pledged under this Resolution and all covenants, agreements, and other obligations of the Issuer to the Owners of the Bonds shall thereupon cease, terminate, and become void and be discharged and satisfied, and the Paying Agent shall pay over or deliver all money held by it under this Resolution to the Issuer.

Bonds or interest installments for the payment or redemption of which money shall have been set aside and shall be held in trust (through deposit by the Issuer of funds for such payment or redemption or otherwise) at the maturity or redemption date thereof shall be deemed to have been paid within the meaning and with the effect expressed above in this Section, if they have been defeased pursuant to Louisiana law.

SECTION 21. **Successor Paying Agent; Paying Agent Agreement.** The Issuer will at all times maintain a Paying Agent meeting the qualifications hereinafter described for the performance of the duties hereunder for the Bonds. The designation of the initial Paying Agent in this Resolution is hereby confirmed and approved. The Issuer reserves the right to appoint a successor Paying Agent by (a) filing with the Person then performing such function a certified copy of a resolution or ordinance giving notice of the termination of the Agreement and appointing a successor and (b) causing notice to be given to each Owner. Every Paying Agent appointed hereunder shall at all times be a bank organized and doing business under the laws of the United States of America or of any state, authorized under such laws to serve as Paying Agent, and subject to supervision or examination by Federal or State authority. The Executive Officers are hereby authorized and directed to execute an appropriate Agreement with the Paying Agent for and on behalf of the Issuer in such form as may be satisfactory to said officers, the signatures of said officers on such Agreement to be conclusive evidence of the due exercise of the authority granted hereunder.

SECTION 22. **Arbitrage.** The Issuer covenants and agrees that, to the extent permitted by the laws of the State of Louisiana, it will comply with the requirements of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and any amendment thereto (the "Code") in order to establish, maintain and preserve the exclusion from "gross income" of interest on the Bonds under the Code. The Issuer further covenants and agrees that it will not take any action, fail to take any action, or permit any action within its control to be taken, or permit at any time or times any of the proceeds of the Bonds or any other funds of the Issuer to be used directly or indirectly in any manner, the effect of which would be to cause the Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" or would result in the inclusion of the interest on any of the Bonds in gross income under the Code, including, without limitation, (i) the failure to comply with the limitation on investment of Bond proceeds or (ii) the failure to pay any required rebate of arbitrage earnings to the United States of America or (iii) the use of the proceeds of the Bonds in a manner which would cause the Bonds to be "private activity bonds."

The Executive Officers are hereby empowered, authorized and directed to take any and all action and to execute and deliver any instrument, document or certificate necessary to effectuate the purposes of this Section.

SECTION 23. **Not Qualified Tax-Exempt Obligations.** The Bonds are not designated as a "qualified tax-exempt obligations" within the meaning of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code.

SECTION 24. **Publication.** A copy of this Resolution shall be published immediately after its adoption in one (1) issue of the official journal of the Issuer.

SECTION 25. **Sale of Bonds.** The Bonds are hereby authorized to be sold to the Underwriter, and the Executive Officers, or either of them, are hereby authorized to execute the Bond Purchase Agreement, provided that the sale of the Bonds is within the parameters set forth in this Resolution. The Bond Purchase Agreement may provide for the purchase of bond insurance in the event an Executive Officer, on behalf of the Issuer, finds and determines that the purchase of such bond insurance will be of benefit. In such event, the Executive Officers, or either of them, are hereby authorized to execute all documents and agreements necessary and appropriate in connection with obtaining and securing the bond insurance. After their execution and authentication by the Paying Agent, the Bonds shall be delivered to the Underwriter or their agents or assigns, upon receipt by the Issuer of the agreed purchase price.

The Bond Purchase Agreement shall be in substantially the presented at this meeting with such changes as may be approved by the Executive Officers signing the Bond Purchase Agreement, their execution being conclusive evidence of their approval of such changes. The Executive Officers are each hereby empowered to deliver or cause to be executed and delivered all documents required to be executed on behalf of the Issuer or deemed by them necessary or advisable to implement this Resolution or to facilitate the sale of the Bonds.

SECTION 26. **Preliminary Official Statement.** The Executive Officers and other officials of the Issuer shall prepare a Preliminary Official Statement pertaining to the Bonds, which is hereby approved for use by the Underwriter in connection with the sale of the Bonds.

SECTION 27. **Continuing Disclosure.** The Executive Officers or either of them are hereby empowered and directed to execute an appropriate Continuing Disclosure Certificate (substantially in the form set forth in the official statement issued in connection with the sale and issuance of the Bonds) pursuant to SEC Rule 15c2-12(b)(5).

SECTION 28. **Section Headings.** The headings of the various sections hereof are inserted for convenience of reference only and shall not control or affect the meaning or construction of any of the provisions hereof.

SECTION 29. **Appointment of Municipal Advisor.** The Issuer hereby retains Argent

Advisors, Inc., of Ruston, Louisiana, to act as its Municipal Advisor ("MA") pursuant to the provisions of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act and the rules promulgated thereunder by the Securities and Exchange Commission. The Issuer hereby acknowledges that it is represented by the MA and will rely upon the advice of the MA with respect to the Bonds. The fee to be paid the MA shall be payable solely from the proceeds of the Bonds when and if issued, and the amount thereof shall be subject to the approval of the State Bond Commission.

SECTION 30. **Appointment of Underwriter.** Crews & Associates, of Little Rock, Arkansas, is hereby appointed as investment banker/underwriter in connection with the issuance and sale of all or any portion of the Bonds, any compensation to be subsequently approved by the Issuer by execution of the Bond Purchase Agreement and to be paid from the proceeds of the Bonds and contingent upon the issuance of the Bonds; provided that no compensation shall be due to said investment banker/underwriter unless the Bonds are sold and delivered.

SECTION 31. **Effective Date.** This Resolution shall become effective immediately.

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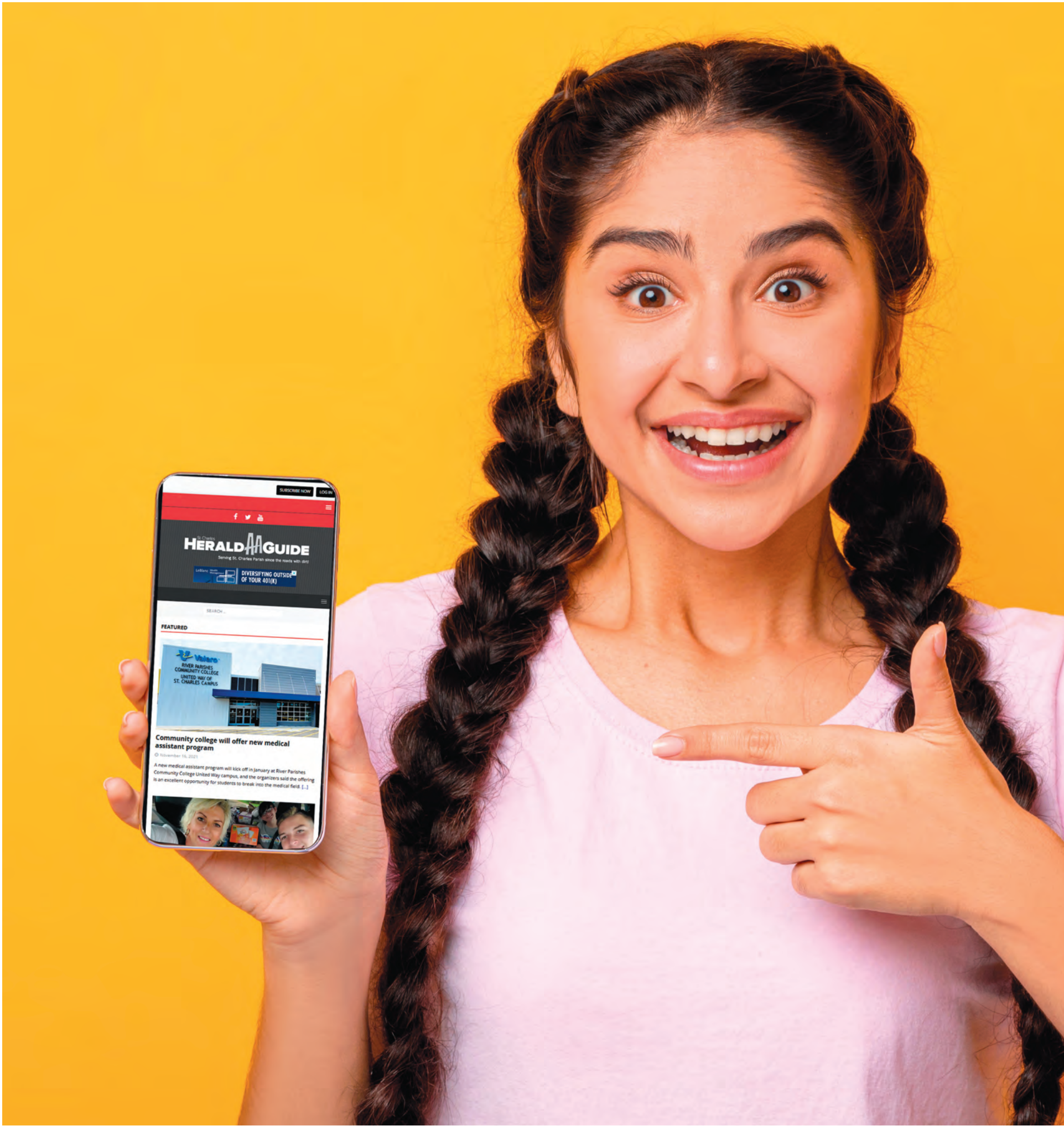


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
