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ULM to name baseball stadium after longtime head coach, Norco native

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Arm troubles ended the collegiate career of former LSU pitcher Lou St. Amant in the 1960s, but he wasn't done in the game of baseball – far, far from it.

St. Amant, a Destrehan High School alumnus, became an icon at the University of Louisiana-Monroe, where he served as the school's head baseball coach for 18 seasons and brought tremendous success to his alma mater. So much success, in fact, that the school recently approved the renaming of ULM's baseball field in his honor, "Lou St. Amant Field."

The honor is a very special one for the

longtime skipper.

"I'm so humbled by the fact the school would do that for me," said St. Amant. "I was shocked ... it's a gigantic honor. Not many get to have that happen to them in their lifetime."

St. Amant graduated from the school and joined the program as coach when ULM was named Northeast Louisiana University (the switch to ULM came in 1999).

St. Amant spent 18 seasons as the head coach of the NLU baseball team, picking up

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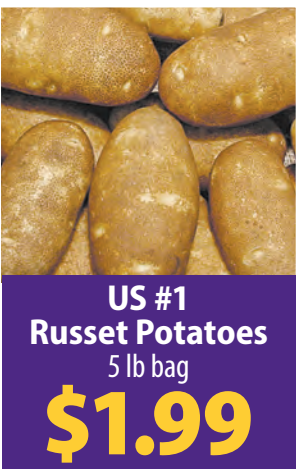

preparations for the surgery that were unavailable in Honduras, his surgery took place on Sept. 9

Stephanie Berault, executive director of HeartGift Louisiana, said cardiac surgeons at Children’s Hospital were able to successfully repair a condition that Noath had called ventricular septal defect.

“He is doing great,” she said. “Grandma Lourdes is here with him. She is also his primary caregiver. She searched for years trying to find help. Every single time a mission group would come to Honduras, she would show up to try and get Noath on the list. It took a TV interview seen by a Rotary group from New York to connect her to us ... her prayers were answered.”

Lourdes agreed.

“I don’t have the words to express how grateful I am,” she said.

The surgery was fully underwritten by donations.

HeartGift Louisiana sponsors young heart patients from around the world for surgery at Children’s from countries without adequate medical care to treat the condition. Noath is the 75th child that HeartGift Louisiana has sponsored for surgery at Children’s Hospital. He recuperated with the Urroz family before returning home to Honduras last week.

Xenia, who is also from Honduras, said she first found out about HeartGift years ago when she met the director.

“We’ve been friends ever since,” she said. “I always told her that one day I would help her, and she would include me in all of the emails of the children that were coming.”

Xenia saw the email about Noath when she was on a trip to Honduras, and she said she knew immediately that she wanted to help.

“He’s from Honduras, and I’m from Honduras,” she said. “I knew I would love to do this now, especially now since I’m an empty nester.”

Xenia said she would love to bring awareness to the HeartGift process and get more people involved in volunteering their homes.

“It’s been wonderful, because we’ve gotten to see basically a miracle,” she said. “This little boy ... when he had the surgery he was all hooked up to machines and couldn’t walk ... and within four days he was up and running. Our experience with this organization has been wonderful. We loved it. I feel like Noath’s grandmother was brave to come to a country she didn’t know and to come to a stranger’s house. We got to witness a miracle.”

Jamil said he was also extremely grateful for the experience of hosting Noath and Lourdes.

“Good things you don’t see them that often, but

this has just been a tremendous experience,” Jamil said. “Not just for us, but for Noath. The facilitators of the surgery ... they really saved somebody’s life. The organization did a tremendous job.”

to benefit Norco infant Blakely “Baby Bee” Estevez who was battling cancer (and has since gone into remission). Enjoying those outings, Dunn joined the cabbage ball league for the Club 99ers, a team sponsored by Club 99 bar in Norco.

Her message? You can be a grandmother like her and still drive home runs.

“I’m just trying to get a little healthy,” said Dunn. “I want people to know that just because you’re over 50, you don’t have to stop being active. I’m the oldest person out here, and I’m having a great time.

“I see people walking out there at the Bridge Park, but it’s fun to do something else as far as exercising. We all cheer each other on and we have a lot of team spirit among us.”

Dunn plays on a team with her son Jeremiah and his wife Tiffany.



“It’s a great family activity,” she said. “There’s another husband and wife that play on the team with us as well.”

This is the first season of the league that Dunn and her teammates have been able to participate in. The team entered the league last year, but Hurricane Ida foiled those plans.

“We got maybe one game into it,” Dunn said.

They’re a few games in this time around. Dunn said it will likely take a little while before the team starts to win consistently, as much of the competition has been practicing and playing together for some time now.

That’s OK, she said, because the bottom line is having a good time.

“I keep things fun and light out there,” Dunn said. “I tell them, ‘Look at this old lady getting on base.’ I just try to do silly stuff to make them laugh.”

The other focus is, of course, working toward a healthier life. To that end, she can already feel the effects.

“I have a lot more energy,” Dunn said. “Now that I’ve been riding bikes and playing cabbage ball, I’m getting out more and I don’t have any aches and pains. I feel a lot better. It does so much for you physically and mentally.”

Some parents bring their children out to watch them play in the games.

“It sets a good example,” Dunn said. “It’s good for kids to see their parents being active.”

Dunn is more physically active these days, but she’s no stranger to staying busy. She’s a published writer who has penned three children’s books, including “Grandma’s Hands,” which was released in October of last year.

She hopes to see a few more grandmothers and grandfathers out on the diamond with her in the future.

“Diabetes, health problems, I know those things affect a lot of people in the African-American community,” Dunn said. “It’s something where you can help yourself by staying fit.”

414 career victories, and was instrumental in both the initial construction of the baseball facility in 1983 and the turf and Stadium Club renovation project, which culminated prior to the 2022 season.

There were several high points in St. Amant’s career. His first feat came in his initial season as head coach. After spending two years as an assistant, the 1970 NLU graduate took over in 1976 and led Northeast to a 20-13 record, halting a string of four consecutive losing seasons.

His first victory as a head coach came in his very first game, 6-2 over Northwestern State.

“We had tryouts,” St. Amant recalled. “I kept about 11 guys off of fall tryouts, and four ended up playing and helped us immensely. We had a few pretty good hitters, including an All-American, and we had good pitching. I was always one to play for a run early and let your pitching do the rest. We were in about 16 one-run games that year and we let the pitchers go to work.”

Northeast Louisiana was an NCAA Division I independent when the Norco

native took over. St. Amant’s first three seasons were as an independent before NLU joined the Trans America Athletic Conference in 1979. The best finish for NLU in the TAAC was a tie for first in the West Division during the 1982 season.

Northeast joined the Southland Conference in 1983 and made a sudden impact. St. Amant led the Indians to their first conference title in any major men’s sport in the SLC. The Indians also advanced to the NCAA playoffs for the first time. They had previously played in the NAIA playoffs four times, reaching

the 1970 World Series, before becoming an NCAA member.

“The year before I came, we hadn’t had a winning season. Two years before, they had to go get guys out the dorm to finish,” St. Amant said.

“My proudest thing, though, is that we had about a 92 percent graduation rate. We won a couple of championships there, and we had four or five guys go on to the big leagues.”

He made Monroe his home when he took the job, and he’s been there ever since.

“I’ve had chances to leave, but my wife and I decided to stay here because we believe in the school,” St. Amant said.

Prepping at Destrehan High School, St. Amant was an outstanding high school player who continued his career at LSU. Difficulties with his pitching arm ended his career at LSU. After leaving LSU, St. Amant started his teaching and coaching career at schools in south Louisiana. He spent time at Sacred Heart School in Norco (1960-64), St. Charles Boromeo in Destrehan (1964-66 and 1967-68) and St. Joan of Arc School in LaPlace (1966-67)

before joining Northeast as an assistant coach.

After his graduation in 1970, St. Amant returned to the high school ranks. His greatest success came during five years as athletic director and head football coach at Litcher High School, where he posted a 44-13 record, including LHSAA Class 3A state championship and runner-up teams. His 1975 squad went undefeated at 13-0-1 in taking the Class 3A title.

“It was five years where my wife and I were treated greatly and received wonderfully by that community,” St. Amant said. “We were 3-6-1 in our first year and we went on to win 41 games over the next four years. Everybody got behind the program, we had such great support from the people there.”

That got the attention of his collegiate alma mater, and he’d soon receive a job offer.

Returning to NLU in January of 1976, he was also an assistant football coach, but dropped those duties in 1979 to devote all of his time to baseball.

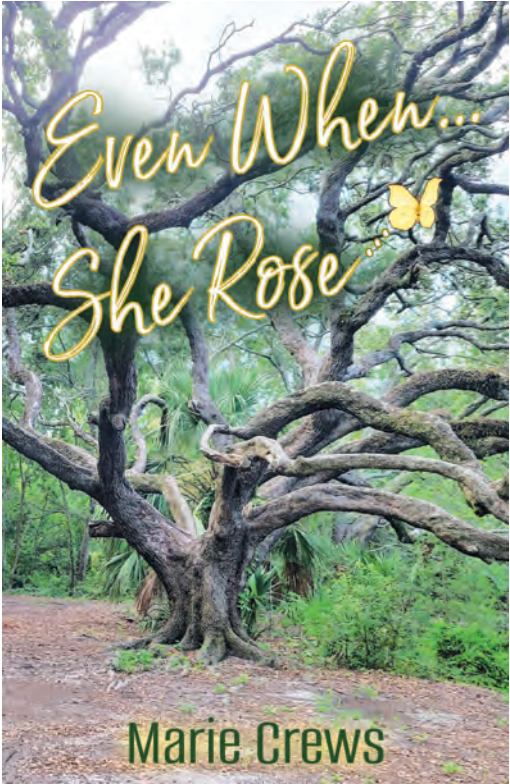
“What I didn’t know then, was how my life would unfold or that it would be thirty-five years before I would be called to share my truth with the world,” she said. “If this novel brings hope to even

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Top-ranked Wildcats host Central Lafourche for homecoming

Destrehan has allowed just one touchdown all season after 47-0 shutout of Bourgeois

Destrehan head coach Marcus Scott has been involved with plenty of successful teams both as a player and as a coach on the high school and college level.

But when it comes to the start to this football season for his No. 1 ranked Destrehan Wildcats, he admits this is some uncharted territory.

"I'd have to say, probably not," Scott said when asked if he'd experienced a start to the season like this before.

In what's become something of a weekly tally, Destrehan has outscored its opponents 211-11 over the first five games of the year on the way to a 5-0 start, including last week's 47-0 win at H.L. Bourgeois. DHS has scored no less than 41 points in any game this season and it's allowed just one touchdown to be scored.

"Probably not," Scott said when asked if he'd been part of quite such a dominating start. "Credit to the assistant coaches who have done a good job of preparing these kids and keeping them focused each week on improving and growing. It all starts with a group of seniors that have been in a lot of big games, who have seen a lot of snaps and big moments. They set the pace for us."

The Wildcats have maintained an eye on their goal of a state championship, but Scott said a large focus has been on making sure the team understands the smaller steps it takes to get there along the way – too much attention cannot be paid to games in November and

December that it detracts from what the team must do today, tomorrow and each day thereafter.

"You have to lay a lot of groundwork to put yourself in that kind of position," Scott said. "We still have a long way to go

and a lot of improvement to make to just be focused on one goal down the line. You hear it all the time, but it's truly one game at a time and focusing on getting better each day."

This Friday, Destrehan (5-0, 2-0) hosts Central Lafourche for its homecoming game. Central is 1-4 this season, including an 0-1 mark in District 7-5A. Last week, Central fell 40-7 to Terrebonne. It's lone win this season came in Week 3, 26-19 over South Lafourche.

"They'll work a lot of two-back looks, and they'll use the fullback in the passing game out in the flat," Scott said. "They'll attack with singleback stuff as well. They try to keep you off balance."

Defensively, Central brings back five starters from a year ago, including middle linebacker Kendall Liner as one of the team's standouts. The secondary is an experienced group for a team that looks to make the offense slowly work up the field.

Longtime defensive coordinator Shelly Vedros is in his first year as the Trojans' head coach. He guides a team led offensively by running back Ceontray Raymond and receiver Porter Zeringue.

"They come out and try to keep everything in front," Scott said. "They don't want to give up many big plays, they play a lot of two-high safety, keep it in front of them and make the tackle."

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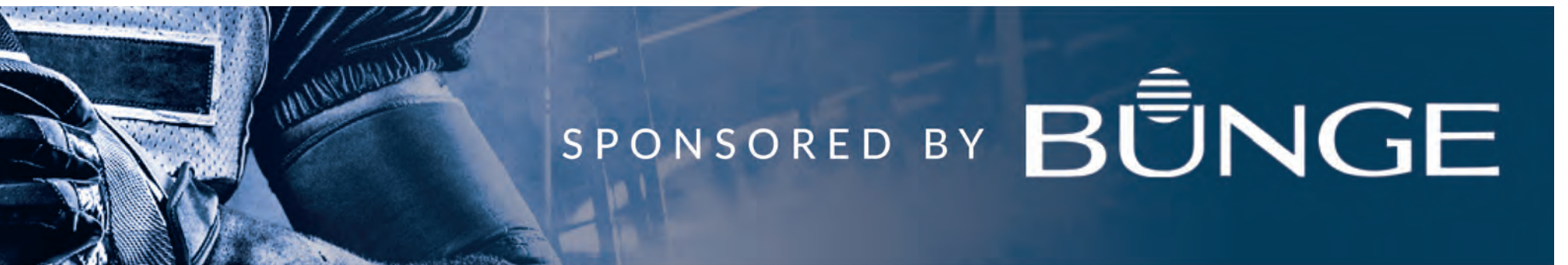

Tigers looking to find form for stretch run

Thibodaux visits Tiger Stadium for District 7-5A battle

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At 2-3 and winless through two games of District 7-5A play, Hahnville will be hungry for a win this Friday night at home against Thibodaux.

But the Tigers' record belies how well the team has played at many points through the first half of the season. Hahnville's losses have come to a trio of teams sporting a combined 14-1 win-loss record in 4-1 Newman, 5-0 Destrehan and 5-0 East St. John, and last week's 33-24 loss to ESJ showed equal parts how far the Tigers have come thus far and where there is still much progress to be made.

"Last week, I thought we threw the ball a little better than we have in the past," said Hahnville head coach Daniel Luquet. "Ryan (Gregson) did a good job of finding our receivers for some good

gains. Our offensive line continues to get better. Our running backs, you know these are guys we really lean on, but I thought that wasn't the best game they've had ... the one thing we talk about on both sides of the ball is being more physical. And there are times in games that we take punches, but don't punch back. And when we finally do sometimes, it's too late."

Luquet said penalties have been a problem that's made life difficult and short-circuited too many drives. This is a Tigers' team that has to find a way to sustain drives more consistently, lest the team's defense be forced to play too many snaps and fatigue as games progress, a problem that's manifested in each of the past two weeks.

"Penalties killed us. We're not good enough to go play a first and 22, or a third and 15 ... we need to get into manageable third down situations, third and

3 or 4. Against East St. John, we didn't play as well as we needed to in the first half. We left our defense on the field too long and when you get into the 4th quarter, where they make a long drive that puts us away, (the number of defensive snaps) hurts you."

In recent history, this is the time of year Hahnville starts to get hot. Former HHS coach Nick Saltaformaggio's Hahnville teams typically ended seasons on a roll, and Luquet's Tigers have been much the same - last season, HHS won five games in a row to close the regular season.

Thibodaux comes into Friday night's game with a 1-4 record, 0-1 in District 7-5A. Last week, the Tigers suffered a 45-21 loss to E.D. White. Thibodaux's lone district battle thus far resulted in a 57-26 loss to East St. John.

Ean Rodrigue was an All-District 7-5A selection as an athlete last season, while running back Demarcus Singleton is a dangerous weapon out in space.

"(Singleton) wasn't on the team last year. I believe he and his family moved due to Ida, and they're back now. He's a very good player and they move him all over the place, so you have to be aware of him. (Rodrigue) is a two-year starter who can take off and run and beat you with his arm. Their wide receivers make plays and do a good job filling each of their respective roles ... they've scored a lot of points this year and they've done it against some really good teams."

Defensively, Thibodaux likes to mix things up.

"They'll run three man, four man fronts and they'll bring pressure," Luquet said. "They do a good job playing complementary football between their offense and defense. They don't have that one standout player, but collectively they play really good team defense and they fly to the ball. It's a young team that's getting better every week, so it'll be a good test for us."

EARLY START – For a historic 5A power like Hahnville, it can be a tough road to crack significant playing time as a sophomore, but Calvin Smith has the skills that's made it a reality.

Smith is second on the Tigers in rushing yardage with 239 on 53 carries (to Joshua Joseph's team-high 322 yards)

and leads the team in touchdowns with six. He's also shown he can do damage when called upon in the receiving game, adding 75 yards on three catches.

"Calvin got some valuable experience last year as a freshman," said Luquet. "The spotlight isn't too big for him. He's a two-sport athlete in basketball and football, and I think when you play multiple sports, that makes you a better player."

Luquet said the 198-pound rusher is a standout in the weight room and his instincts are strong at a young age.

"He's fast, he's powerful and he runs behind his pads. He understands the blocking aspect of the sport. If you can block and you can run, you're going to get on the field. He's a prototypical three-down back."

But part of what makes Smith, as well as fellow rushers Joshua Joseph and Chase Brooks so effective, is each brings fresh legs to the equation with no one back having to carry the full load.

"Each guy gets about 15 carries, and those are fresh carries," Luquet said. "That makes each guy all that much more dangerous."

Tigers move to 19-8 behind Mott's big night

Leboeuf said the sophomore is athletic with the ability to hit the ball hard. But where she's come the furthest, the coach continued, is in knowing when to apply that hard-hitting skill.

"She's learning to control it within the system ... before she was hitting a lot of balls out, now she's making better choices as to what she can hit hard, what she can really swing at, and it's had a dramatic effect on her efficiency,"
