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Toys for Tots coordinator says storage space is desperately needed

Last year 11,639 Christmas toys were distributed to St. Charles Parish children in the aftermath of Hurricane Ida. The first shipment of toys that will be handed out this year was delivered last week, and Toys for Tots Area Coordinator Devona L’Herisse said there’s just one problem – she has nowhere to store them.

Another issue, she said, is that there are thousands of more toys coming in.

“Our main struggle this year is finding a donated warehouse,” L’Herisse said. “In the past we used storage units.”

The lack of storage units left available after Hurricane Ida is one reason a warehouse is needed. Another reason is that last year the toy giveaway was opened up to every child in St. Charles Parish and not just families who qualified as low-income. L’Herisse said that decision was made because so many children lost their belongings in the hurricane.

This year’s toy giveaway, also open to every

child, will once again be held in conjunction with St. Charles Parish government at the Edward Dufresne Center in Luling. This year L’Herisse is also partnering with the St. John the Baptist Parish Sheriff’s Office to distribute toys to that community.

“Between St. John and St. Charles I’m hoping to collect 50,000 toys,” she said.

L’Herisse has participated with Toys for Tots for the past nine years, and said she always finds it rewarding. This month her main goal is to find a warehouse and to spread the word about the 2022 Toys for Tots campaign to local businesses who may be interested in housing collection bins to accept toy donations.

“I love my community,” she said. “I grew up in St. Charles Parish, and the community puts a lot into our kids. So many kids are still struggling. I feel like these are our kids, and I want

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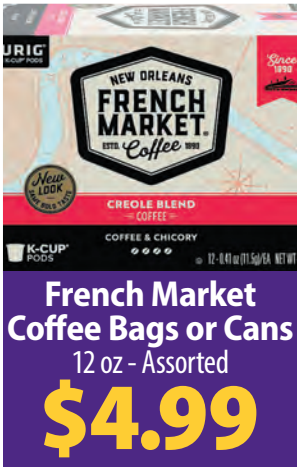
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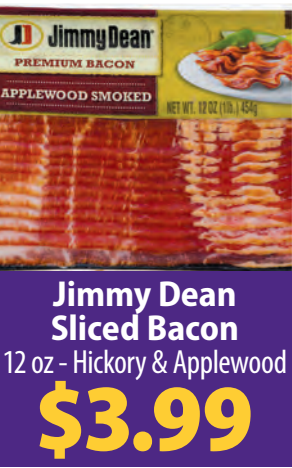
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After long road, Destrehan alum finally getting to showcase talent with Tigers

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After shedding a tackle in the backfield and driving through contact, John Emery Jr. finished his 20-yard touchdown run against Auburn in style, showing the world a glimpse of the Destrehan High alum and former 5-star prospect’s vast potential.

Just as he shed tackles and left defenders behind in his wake, he no doubt hopes to – finally, once and for all – shed the difficulties and adversity that had left him sidelined for more than a season.

Entering the 2021 season, Emery was ready to showcase his talents as LSU’s projected starting running back, after tallying 451 yards and three touchdowns in his second season of action as

a Tiger. There was plenty of excitement surrounding the 5’11, 220-pound rusher as he entered his junior season, but that came to a halt after the NCAA intervened with a ruling that stunned the Tiger faithful: Emery was deemed academically ineligible and would not be permitted to play for LSU for the entirety of the 2021 season.

LSU pursued an academic waiver for Emery on the basis of extenuating hardship and circumstances. He’d lost his grandmother to a battle with cancer and several family members had reportedly had to battle

Lafon Performing Arts Center Director Chris Aucoin-Melohn said the show’s

music, puppetry and charismatic leading role are sure to delight the audience.

“The show has a lovely theme that runs through it of being a good person and spreading positivity everywhere you go,” he said. “We hope it will inspire our young audiences and their families to perform acts of kindness and be thoughtful as they interact with the world around them.”

"Alternate," in many areas on the game, is close enough to "exact," and not just in the game's namesake. The game takes players through some very recognizable areas for locals, like Apple Street and Airline Highway within the game's namesake, but also areas in New Orleans, Metairie and Kenner – the Esplanade Mall, while not named, stands as a notable landmark in the latter as the "Promenade Mall."

“People reach out and talk about the landscapes they’re recognizing in the game,” said Yuts, the creator of the Norco game. “It does get rather strange toward the end and it’s pretty interesting to hear them talk about that as well. But it’s a short game. The learning curve is very shallow and I think it’s been kind of a quick and easy way of generating conversation and interaction with people.”

This all started almost 15 years ago. Yuts (a pseudonym he goes by derived from a nickname for his grandfather), now 36, said the genesis actually stems from “a world history project” with a close friend. After Hurricane Katrina, the



two were doing archival research about different Louisiana industries. Through that, the two recorded numerous conversations with locals about their lives and the region they live in.

“We drew from that quite a bit,” Yuts said. “We were shooting videos, writing essays, experimenting with different mediums. So, I know how to code a bit. And I put together a little side-scroller game in JavaScript. That kind of ended up being the springboard.”

For many St. Charles Parish residents, topics the game tackles will no doubt be relatable. Flooding and environmental precarity are among the issues touched upon.

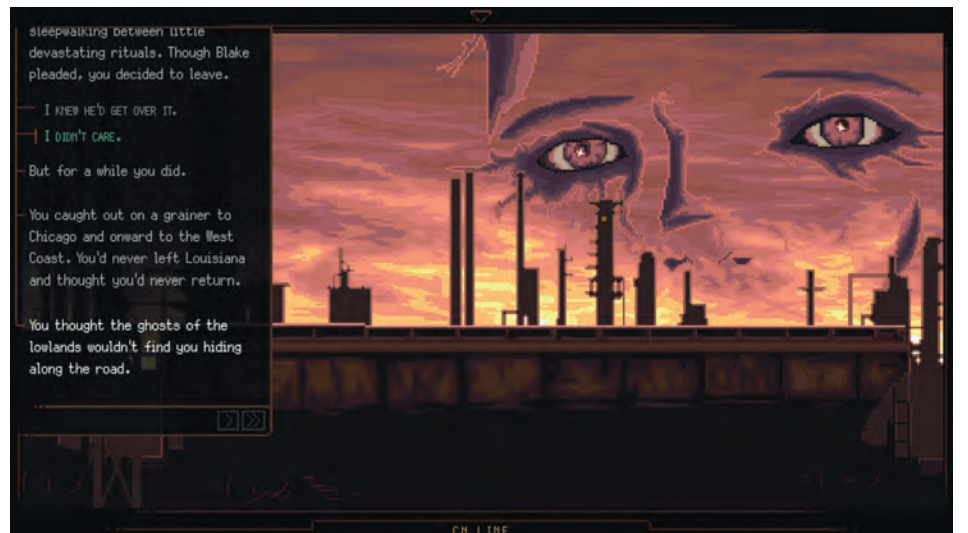
“For a lot of people, those are things that have affected them pretty deeply,”

Yuts said. "People have written some personal responses that are extremely moving. And that's been something that will stick with me for the rest of my life."

Norco was released on Steam in March to great praise from game critics. Los Angeles Times called it the best video game released in the early part of 2022, and the game continues to gain momentum as it finds a wider audience. It has earned scores of 9.25 out of 10 from

Game Informer and 94 out of 100 by PC Gamer. In 2021, before its formal release, the game won the inaugural Tribeca Games Award at the Tribeca Film Festival. In 2022, Norco won the Long Feature award at the Berlin A MAZE festival.

"We've been really appreciative of the reception," Yuts said. "We've been hearing so many good things. It's a pretty niche genre, but it seems like more and more people have been playing it, more people than I was expecting. And a lot of people from the region have been playing as well, which has been great to hear."

COVID-19. Emery was reportedly an honor student prior to the situation.

That waiver was denied, as were multiple appeals. Making matters worse, the NCAA ruled prior to the 2022 season that Emery would be sidelined for the first two games of LSU’s schedule, including a nationally televised showcase game against Florida State.

But he’s finally back on the field. He returned officially on Sept. 17, rushing for 32 yards on 11 carries in SEC action against Mississippi State, as well as two receptions for 15 yards, A week later against New Mexico, he rushed for five yards a carry with nine attempts for 45 yards. The Auburn game saw him at his peak so far this season, with 81 yards and a touchdown on nine touches.

LSU head coach Brian Kelly was impressed by what Emery showed against Auburn, noting after the game that the back will continue to get better and better with more reps.

“That physical run was amazing, right?” Kelly said. “I think we still have to settle him down in the passing game ... he had the nice catch obviously up the sideline, the soft hands. He needs to play with that kind of calmness in the passing game. He got a little antsy when he dropped it. But he’s coming along. We can see it coming. And he’ll get the reps in and settle in nicely.”

Emery’s touches were limited, as were the backfield’s



as a whole, in LSU’s game Saturday against No. 8 Tennessee – the Vols scored 20 first quarter points and LSU was forced to mostly abandon the running game for the remainder of the afternoon.

Kelly said the team had a plan for Emery throughout the summer and that the two-game extension of his absence did not leave him on the outside looking in at any point.

“It’s been a long run for John in terms of getting a chance to get out and play for LSU,” Kelly said. “He’s worked hard to get back into this position. And now he gets an opportunity ... he’s been out for a while ... he will be part of the mix. Make no mistake about it – we’ve seen his capabilities in camp. We’ve kept him active within our rotation. He’s ready to play. We did that with our mind’s eye toward SEC competition. So, we’re

excited to have him back.”

Emery left Destrehan as a 5-star prospect, one of the most sought-after rushers in the nation. He was the highest rated senior running back in the country by ESPN.com and was named to the Class 5A All-State first team after helping to lead his team to the state semifinal round in 2018.

He posted a monster senior season at DHS. Emery rushed for 1,683 yards and 26 touchdowns on 218 carries and added 20 receptions, 281 yards and two touchdowns to his total as well. That production came in spite of Destrehan’s ability to rest him in several games it had well in hand early.

As Emery closed his senior year at Destrehan, Stephen Robicheaux, who coached Emery in all four years of the latter’s prep career, said his star rusher was a fighter.

“He’s a versatile kid who can run, make all the moves and catch the ball out of the backfield. He’s a real smooth guy that’s a truly good back,” said former Destrehan head coach Stephen Robicheaux, who coached Emery through all four years of the latter’s high school career. “He fights and fights and fights. I’ll take him any day. I want him on my team any day.”

LSU returns to action Saturday at 6 p.m. as the Tigers travel to face the Florida Gators.

they became pen pals.

“We had similar things that were happening in regards with biddy basketball, and similar backgrounds because both dads were coaches,” Adams said. “We stayed in touch for a few years - at least two or three years. We were pen pals and used to see each other all the time at basketball tournaments.”

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Tradition abounds as Tigers visit Lutch​er for non-district showdown

Hahnville, Lutch​er have combined for 14 state championships

1949. 1968. 1972. 1975. 1978. 1983. 1992. 1994. 2003 – times two. 2006. 2008. 2015. 2016.

Those 13 years equated to 14 state championships between Lutch​er and Hahnville, including a 2003 that saw both schools win in their respective classifications. These are two of

Louisiana's most storied programs, and they square off at the Dog Yard on Friday night as Lutch​er hosts Hahnville in a battle of River Parish – and state – powers.

The competitors don't share a district – this week each has a bye in their respective leagues. That made this game a natural fit for both teams, said Hahnville head coach Daniel Luquet.

“Coach (Dwain) Jenkins and I have been friends for a long time,” said Luquet. “We've played one another when I was (head coach) at Woodlawn. We both had mid-district byes and we each wanted a playoff type of game, a playoff atmosphere before the final part of the season, so this worked out.”

Lutch​er reached the Class 3A quarterfinal round last season and entered 2022 with high expectations under head coach Dwain Jenkins. The Bulldogs have indeed proven tough to beat, with just one loss thus far this season – a 21-20 loss to defending Division III state champion St. Charles Catholic.

Otherwise, Lutch​er (5-1) has been dominant, with wins of 26, 31, 35, 56 and 35 points.

Leading the Bulldogs' offense is quarterback D'Wanye Winfield, both a threat to pass and run – he's already pushed

past the 1,000-yard mark both as a passer and on the ground, with 1,035 yards as a rusher and 1,095 as a passer. He's also accounted for 34 total touchdowns thus far, with 18 on the ground and 14 through the air.

“We have to stop him from running the football,” said Luquet. “He's really become a better passer this year, but so much of what they do throwing the football is based on how much damage they do in the running game. Teams have to load the box. He's a big, physical kid and you've got to gang-tackle him. And when you do that, he can make the throws, he'll have one-on-one matchups on the outside and the guys who can convert on those. We'll have to be really sound up front and on the back end.”

The offensive line is anchored by 6'2, 310-pound Donovan Arbuthnot. He and his teammates pave the way for Winfield and

running back Trenton Chaney to produce.

Tylin Johnson is a dangerous threat at wide receiver, a 6'2, 180-pound pass-catcher who will put pressure on Hahnville.

“(Chaney) is really, really good. Their receivers are all guys who can make plays,” Luquet said. “They'll get into some heavy packages. Double tight, try to create gaps

and running lanes for those guys.”

Defensively, Brock Louque is a playmaker at safety. Louque leaves his calling card on the field game in and game out as a hard-hitting defender. Lutch​er's linebackers are experienced, including

junior Kai Brown and Colin Roques. Dale Smith is long and rangy at end.

“(Louque) isn't afraid to come up and make the tackle,” said Luquet. “He's a physical kid, a prototypical Lutch​er player. He doesn't jump out at you in size or stature, but he is a flat out football player ... I really like their front three. (Smith) is big and physical. He really stands out on tape.”

BLAST FROM THE PAST: It's been over a decade since Hahnville and Lutch​er have faced off with one another, the last matchup coming in 2010.

That year, Coach Tim Detillier's Bulldogs earned a 42-28 victory over Coach Lou Valdin's Tigers.

It was a back and forth shootout, with Lutch​er running back Daniel Taylor emerging the night's star, with a pair of touchdown passes to his name. Jarvis Landry forced a fumble on a Hahnville interception return for one of the night's pivotal plays, ultimately scoring on the play.

Hahnville lost quarterback Brian Ensminger for

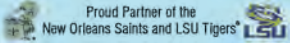

After a very successful homecoming game that saw Destrehan defeat visiting Central Lafourche 49-0, unbeaten Destrehan will get back on the bus and hit the road this Friday to face an improving Terrebonne squad.

Destrehan (6-0, 3-0) remains in the No. 1 spot in the weekly Class 5A poll and has still yet to give up a second touchdown to the opposition, with just Ehret reaching paydirt through six games in 2022.

The Tigers (3-3, 2-0) have been on an upswing this season under first-year head coach Tyler Lewis, after Terrebonne went 1-7 a year ago. This year’s group has played each of its first six opponents tough regardless of final result. Terrebonne is hoping to continue a push to return to the postseason after what’s been only a one-year absence: prior to 2021, the Tigers had been to the playoffs in five consecutive seasons.

Terrebonne lost its last game 39-29 to Ellender, but has won two of its past three outings, including a 40-7 win over Central Lafourche and a 22-17 victory over H.L. Bourgeois.

Terrebonne’s attack is triggered by a dangerous quarterback in Kyrin Robinson. Robinson brings speed to the position and can take off and run with the best of them. Downfield, Kylan Billiot presents a tough matchup at 6’4

and 180 pounds, as does Quincey McKay at 6’2 and 192 pounds.

“(Robinson) is a really good player,” said Destrehan head coach Marcus Scott. “He’s got two good wide receivers on the outside, two big kids that catch it well. He’s mobile and he can make big plays downfield with his arm or with his legs ... Billiot really stands out when you watch him. We know McKay is a good player as well. He’s a big downfield

target.”

Sophomore Jayce Johnson is young, but has been a phenom for the Tigers. In the Tigers’ star running back’s first three games of action this season saw him pile up more than 500 total yards and six touchdowns on just over 50 touches.

“He’s more than capable of making big plays,” said Scott.

Terrebonne’s offensive line brings size and experience. The Tigers operate

primarily out of the spread.

Defensively, the tandem of Talan Bigham and Julian Bigham present a unique challenge to navigate. Both come in at 6’3 and 349 pounds, making runs up the middle a far less inviting prospect. The secondary is a big strength for the Tigers, with four starters returning from a year ago, including safeties Jhalil Matthews and Gregory Harding.

Scott said Terrebonne’s improvement is a credit to Lewis, who helped West St. John win state championships both as a player and an assistant coach.

“He’s doing a very good job with those guys. You can see they play with heart and great effort,” Scott said. “You can certainly see the results of the hard work they put in.”

AN UNEXPECTED RETURNMAN – Destrehan is firmly established as one of the state’s best special teams units, with punt returner Daniel Blood one of Louisiana’s most dangerous weapons – he’s returned three punts for scores this season, adding to an impressive career total.

But defensive end Kolaj Cobbins got in on the action on Friday, when a punt was deflected straight up into the air and into the junior’s ready and waiting hands. Cobbins wasn’t about to let this chance go to waste and tore through some prospective Central Lafourche tacklers for a 38-yard punt return touchdown.

While Blood might not exactly have to worry about his job security in the role, Cobbins earned quite the ovation from his teammates as the 6’4, 205-pound returner found yet another way to show off his considerable gifts.

“Ideally, we want to get away from that ball in that situation, a partially blocked ball,” Scott said. “But it came right to him, right in his hands. He made quite an athletic play.”

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and effective as of the _____ day of _____, 2022 by and between ST. CHARLES PARISH acting herein by and through its President, who is duly authorized to act on behalf of said Parish, hereinafter called the OWNER, and PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING CONSULTANTS CORPORATION, a corporation acting herein by and through its Contracting Officer, hereinafter called CONSULTANT. Whereas the Owner desires to employ a professional consulting firm to perform consulting work and services for PHASE 3 WATER LINE REPLACEMENT IN BONNET CARRE SPILLWAY Project No. WWKS 105 as described in Ordinance No. 22-10-1 which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

1.0 GENERAL TERMS

The Owner agrees to employ the Consultant and the Consultant agrees to perform professional services required for the project described above. Consultant will conform to the requirements of the Owner and to the standards of the agencies participating with the Owner in the Project. The Consultant will coordinate all work between the Owner and all participating agencies and regulating agencies, if needed. Written authorization to begin different phases of the project will be given to the Consultant by the Owner, including Conceptual, Preliminary Design, Final Design, Bidding Assistance and Construction and Services. The Owner may terminate the Contract by written notification and without cause per Section 11.0 during any phase of the project.

The Consultant shall at all times during this Agreement maintain a valid Louisiana Consulting License and any other applicable licenses necessary for performance of the Project.

All work shall be under the direction of the Owner, and all plans, specifications, etc. shall be submitted to the Owner and all approvals and administration of this contract shall be through the Owner.

2.0 PROJECT

2.1 The Owner hereby contracts with the CONSULTANT to perform all necessary professional services in connection with the project as defined as follows:

PHASE 3 WATER LINE REPLACEMENT IN BONNET CARRE SPILLWAY
Project No. WWKS 105

2.2 The Project consist of the scope of services and work as defined in Attachment "A" hereto.

2.3 Consultant shall perform all scope of services and work in accordance with the Schedule as defined in Attachment "B" hereto unless otherwise mutually agreed upon by the parties in writing.

2.4 The Consultant agrees to comply with all Federal, State, and Local Laws and Ordinances applicable to the scope of services and work or in entering any other agreement with any another party to complete the work.

3.0 SERVICES OF CONSULTANT

3.1 Consultant shall provide Owner professional work and services in all phases of the Project to which this Agreement applies and as hereinafter provided to properly plan and execute the work on the project(s) assigned to the Consultant. These services may include but may not be limited to serving as Owner's professional consulting representative for the Project, providing professional consultation and advice, and furnishing customary civil, surveying, geotechnical, structural, mechanical, electrical, instrumentation and control consulting services and construction consulting and inspection.

3.2 Services provided by the Consultant shall be performed in accordance with generally accepted professional consulting practice at the time and the place where the services are rendered.

3.3 Consultant shall obtain from Owner authorization to proceed in writing for each phase of the Project.

3.4 Consultant shall provide minutes of all meetings with St. Charles Parish regarding any phase of the Project.

3.5 Consultant shall provide work and services to complete the project, including all necessary services described herein or usually implied as a prerequisite for the performance of the services whether or not specifically mentioned in this agreement, including attendance by the Consultant at project conferences and public hearings.

3.6 The Phases of the Project, if applicable, are as defined in Attachment "A".

4.0 OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

4.1 Documents including but not limited to plans, specifications, maps, basic survey notes, sketches, charts, computations and all other data prepared or obtained under the terms of this authorization shall become the property of the Owner and shall be made available for Owner's inspection at any time during the Project and, shall be delivered to the Owner prior to termination or final completion of the Contract.

4.2 Consultant may retain a set of documents for its files.

4.3 Reuse of Documents. Any reuse of documents or materials without written authorization or adaptation by Consultant to the specific purpose intended will be at Owner's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Consultant or to Consultant's independent professional associates, subcontractors, and consultants.

4.4 No materials, to include but not limited to reports, maps or other documents produced as a result of this Contract, in whole or in part, shall be available to Consultant for copyright purposes. Any such materials produced as a result of this Contract that might be subject to copyright shall be the property of the Owner and all such rights shall belong to the Owner, and the Owner shall be sole and exclusive entity who may exercise such rights.

5.0 SUPPLEMENTARY SERVICES

The Consultant shall provide, when requested in writing by the Owner, supplementary services not included in the basic work and services.

The compensation to the Consultant for the supplemental services, when performed by the Consultant, shall be in the form of a lump sum, billable hours, or "not to exceed" hourly rate which is mutually agreeable to the Owner and the Consultant in writing.

Such supplementary services may include the following:

- A. Soil investigations
- B. Laboratory inspection of materials and equipment
- C. Right-of-Way, easement and property acquisition surveys, plats, maps and documents
- D. Any major revisions for which the Consultant is not responsible, that are authorized by the Owner after the completion and approval of either the preliminary or final plans and specifications
- E. Services concerning replacement of any work damaged by fire or other causes during construction
- F. Services made necessary by the default of the contractor in the performance of the construction contract
- G. Services as an expert witness in connection with court proceedings
- H. Traffic consulting if necessary
- I. Topographic Survey
- J. Preparation of Environmental Assessment documents and/or Environmental Permits
- K. If all or part of the work is to be financed by a Federal or State Grant, the Consultant shall assist the Owner in the preparation of the Grant application and with the Grant Administration, unless otherwise specifically agreed upon previously herein.

The Owner shall notify the Consultant in writing to undertake the services stated in this Agreement, and the Consultant shall commence the services within ten (10) days after receipt of such notification.

If the Owner desires to divide the Project into various parts, a Notice to Proceed shall be issued for each part, and the Owner and the Consultant shall mutually agree upon the period of time within which services for each part of the Project shall be performed.

The Consultant will be given time extensions for delays beyond their control or for those caused by tardy approvals of work in progress by various official agencies, but no additional compensation shall be allowed for such delays.

8.0 PAYMENTS

8.1 Owner shall pay Consultant for the performance of work and services as outlined in Attachment "C" to this Agreement.

8.2 Payment for Consultant work and services on projects that do not require construction services, such as feasibility studies or drainage studies, shall be made based upon Consultant's estimate of the proportion of the services actually completed at the time of billing and shall be made in partial payments at monthly intervals.

8.3 If the Project, or any portion thereof, is not completed for any reason, the final fee for consulting work and services shall be negotiated between Owner and Contractor. If the final fee for work and services is not mutually agreed upon, either party may elect in writing to submit the dispute to mediation. If mediation is not mutually agreed upon, written notice will be submitted to the other party of the intent to submit the dispute to the 29th Judicial District Court of St. Charles Parish, State of Louisiana.

8.4 If authorized in writing by Owner, for the performance of, or for obtaining from others Additional Services which are not considered normal or customary consulting, the Owner shall pay Consultant based on monthly invoices submitted by the Consultant, within sixty (60) days of receipt of Consultant's invoice. Consultant shall provide written notice to Owner when no services or work have been performed during a given month.

8.5 For Additional Authorized Services provided by the Consultant such as, but not limited to, wetlands permitting, land and right-of-way acquisition, surveying, NPDES and LADEQ permit renewal or acquisition work, etc. Owner shall pay Consultant based on an agreed upon hourly rate(s) between the Owner and Consultant. Payment shall be not-to-exceed based on hourly rates and actual hours worked.

8.6 The following documentation shall be required for payment to Consultant and shall be attached to the monthly invoice.

- a. A copy of the Owner's written authorization to perform the service.
- b. Timesheets for all hours invoiced.
- c. Invoice copies, logs or other substantiation of non-salary expenses.

8.7 For Additional Authorized Services that Consultant acquires from subcontractors and/or subconsultants, Owner shall pay Consultant a fixed sum previously agreed upon by Owner and Consultant, such sum to be established in each case when the scope of the work involved has been determined and before any of the Additional Services are provided. The use of subcontractors and/or subconsultants shall be subject to the provisions set forth in this Agreement. The following documentation shall be required for payment to Consultant and shall be attached to the monthly invoice:

- a. A copy of the Owner's written consent for the subcontractor and/or subconsultant to perform the service stating the Owner's and Consultant's agreed upon fixed sum established for the service performed.
- b. Evidence that the subcontractor and/or subconsultant is insured as required by this Agreement.

8.8 For Supplementary Services described in Section 5, Owner shall pay Consultant for the fee negotiated at the time the work is assigned by the method stipulated in the contract amendment.

9.0 BUDGET LIMITATIONS

The construction budget for this Project shall be determined by the Owner, and the Consultant shall be advised of the budget limitation in writing by the Owner and the Consultant shall indicate his acceptance of same in writing to the Owner. Any subsequent budget revisions shall be confirmed in writing.

If, at the completion of the Preliminary or Design Phase, the Consultant does not concur with the construction budget, he shall so notify the Owner, and the Consultant and Owner shall mutually agree on a revised construction budget prior to any work on the Design Phase.

If no bid is received within the budget limitation and a redesign of the project if required by the Owner, such redesign shall be accomplished by the Consultant at no additional cost to the Owner, provided, however, if the receipt of bids is, for any reason, delayed beyond a period of six (6) months from the date of the completion of the Design Phase the amount stated as the construction budget shall be adjusted, immediately prior to the time bids are received, by use of a construction cost index acceptable to both parties of this agreement.

10.0 FUNDS

No work shall be authorized until funds are established for each individual task.

11.0 TERMINATION OR SUSPENSION

11.1 This Agreement may be terminated for any reason by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice.

11.2 The Consultant, upon receipt of such notice, shall immediately discontinue all services in connection with the performance of this Agreement and shall proceed to cancel promptly all existing orders and contracts insofar as such orders or contracts are chargeable to this Agreement.

11.3 The Consultant shall, as soon as practicable after receipt of notice of termination, submit a statement showing in detail the services performed and payments received under this Agreement to the date of termination.

11.4 The Owner shall then pay the Consultant promptly that portion of the prescribed fee to which both parties agree.

11.5 Consultant fully acknowledges that no payment will be made for any work performed or expenses incurred after receipt of the termination by either party unless mutually agreed upon in writing.

11.6 Failure to meet agreed delivery dates or authorized extensions are considered substantial failures and breach of this contractual agreement by Consultant.

11.7 This agreement shall automatically terminate upon satisfactory completion of all services and obligations described herein or three (3) years from the date of its execution, whichever event occurs first.

12.0 INSURANCE

12.1 The Consultant shall secure and maintain at his expense such insurance that will protect him and the Owner, from claims under Workmen's Compensation Acts and from claims for bodily injury, death or property damage which may arise from performance of services under this Agreement. Insurance for bodily injury or death shall be in the unencumbered amount of \$1,000,000.00 for one person and not less than \$1,000,000.00 for all injuries and/or deaths resulting from any one occurrence. The insurance for property damage shall be in the unencumbered amount of \$1,000,000.00 for each accident and not less than \$1,000,000.00 aggregate.

12.2 The CONSULTANT shall also secure and maintain at his expense professional liability insurance in the unencumbered sum of \$1,000,000.00.

12.3 All certificates of insurance SHALL BE FURNISHED TO THE OWNER and shall provide that insurance shall not be cancelled without ten (10) days prior written notice to the Owner. The Owner may examine the policies.

12.4 CONSULTANT shall include all subconsultants as insured under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates for each. All coverages for subconsultants shall be subject to all the requirements stated herein.

12.5 CONSULTANT shall secure and maintain at its expense Comprehensive Automobile Liability - Bodily Injury Liability \$1,000,000 each person; \$1,000,000 each occurrence. Property Damage Liability \$1,000,000 each occurrence. The Comprehensive Automobile Liability policy must have coverage for loading and unloading and must include owned, hired and leased autos.

12.6 St Charles Parish shall be named as an additional insured on general liability insurance policies.

12.7 For all purposes under Louisiana law, the principals of this Contract shall be recognized as the statutory employer of all contract employees as provided in LSA-R.S. 23:1061.

12.8 Insurance policies shall be endorsed to provide for a waiver of subrogation in favor of St. Charles Parish for worker's compensation policies. The certificate of insurance shall reference the waiver of subrogation endorsement.

12.9 The Worker's Compensation Policy Territory Coverage must include Louisiana.

13.0 INDEMNIFICATION

Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless the Owner, its employees, agents and representatives, against any and all claims, demands, suits or judgments for sums of money to any party for loss of life or injury or damages to person or property growing out of, resulting from or by any reason of any negligent act by the Consultant, its employees, agents, servants or representatives, while engaged upon or in connection with the services required or performed hereunder.

14.0 WARRANTY

14.1 Consultant warrants that it will perform its design services with the degree of skill and to the standard of care required of the consulting profession to meet all Federal, State and Local requirements.

14.2 If Consulting Services for project designed by Consultant does not meet those requirements noted herein above, then to the extent that this occurs as a direct result of Consultant's failure to meet the standard of care in its design services, Consultant will indemnify the Parish for Consultant's share of the costs incurred to bring Consulting Services for project to the limitations mandated.

14.3 The obligations expressed in Section 14 above in no way limit the Consultant's obligations expressed elsewhere in this Contract.

15.0 EXCLUSIVE JURISDICTION AND VENUE

For all claims arising out of or related to this agreement, CONSULTANT hereby consents and yields to the exclusive jurisdiction and venue of the Twenty-Ninth Judicial District Court for the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana, and expressly waives any (a) pleas of jurisdiction based upon Consultant's residence and (b) right of removal to Federal Court based upon diversity of citizenship.

16.0 COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL AND STATE LAWS

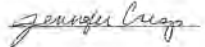

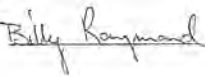

PHASE 3 WATER LINE REPLACEMENT IN BONNET CARRE SPILLWAY

Project Scope:

The project consists of designing an eight (8) inch directionally drilled HDPE water line for approximately 3,800 linear feet with all appurtenances including all necessary permitting geotechnical testing and an estimated two (2) months of inspection.

Basic Services:

A. Preliminary Design Phase: Coordinate all topographic surveys and other investigations as may be required to prepare construction plans. Investigations and/or surveys shall locate existing utilities (private and public) affected by the project and shall locate and define such utilities sufficiently to enable proper plans to be made to modify such utilities to fit the project. Prepare a program of borings and other soil investigations that may be required for proper design. Plot information obtained from surveyor on proper plan. Prepare preliminary layouts and sketches as required to develop design criteria. Prepare a preliminary cost estimate outlining all expected items of work and current unit prices for these items.

B. Detailed Design Phase: Prepare engineered plans and specifications showing the extension of 3800' of 8" water main in the Bonnet Carre Spillway. Fuse the new 8" water main to the existing 8" water main located near the Kugler cemetery on the east side of the Bonnet Carre Spillway. Bolt the new 8" water main at the Bonnet Carre Spillway's west end of the project to the existing valve.

The plans shall be developed in accordance with St. Charles Parish Department of Waterworks Plans and Specifications. The plans shall meet the minimum standard required by DHH for permitting. Coordinate and provide applications for approval as necessary with the United States Department of the Army Corps of Engineers, New Orleans District.

Submit the engineered plans to the Parish for review and approval.

Plans will be prepared on the 22" x 34" media. CONSULTANT will utilize the EJCDC Standard General Conditions of the Construction Contract and associated documents for the preparation of specifications. Technical specifications will be CONSULTANT's standard format as modified to meet local preferences and conditions.

C. Bid Phase: For this task CONSULTANT will assist Owner in obtaining bids for the project in accordance with State Bid Law requirements. CONSULTANT will prepare contract documents, assist the Owner in advertising for bids, conduct a pre-bid conference, issue addenda as necessary, attend the bid opening, and prepare a recommendation to award for the Owner as part of this phase. In general services provided during the bid phase will be performed in accordance with the EJCDC Standard Agreement between Owner and Engineer and the requirements of Louisiana Bid Law.

D. Construction Administration: Following the acceptance of bids CONSULTANT will provide construction-phase services for the construction of the project, generally in accordance with the services defined EJCDC Standard Agreement between Owner and Engineer. Tasks undertaken during this phase including submittal reviews, evaluation of "or-equal proposals", responses to RFI's, and review of payment applications. PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and effective as of the day of , 2022 by and between ST. CHARLES PARISH acting herein by and through its President, who is duly authorized to act on behalf of said Parish, hereinafter called the OWNER, and **Danny J. Hebert, P.E., L.L.C., d.b.a. Civil & Environmental Consulting Engineers**, a corporation acting herein by and through its Contracting Officer, hereinafter called CONSULTANT. Whereas the Owner desires to employ a professional consulting firm to perform consulting work and services for **LA 18 Cast Iron Water Main Replacement, Phase III** Project No. WWKS 113 as described in Ordinance No. **22-10-2** which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

1.0 GENERAL TERMS

The Owner agrees to employ the Consultant and the Consultant agrees to perform professional services required for the project described above. Consultant will conform to the requirements of the Owner and to the standards of the agencies participating with the Owner in the Project. 3.2 Services provided by the Consultant shall be performed in accordance with generally accepted professional consulting practice at the time and the place where the services are rendered.

3.3 Consultant shall obtain from Owner authorization to proceed in writing for each phase of the Project.

3.4 Consultant shall provide minutes of all meetings with St. Charles Parish regarding any phase of the Project.

3.5 Consultant shall provide work and services to complete the project, including all necessary services described herein or usually implied as a prerequisite for the performance of the services whether or not specifically mentioned in this agreement, including attendance by the Consultant at project conferences and public hearings.

3.6 The Phases of the Project, if applicable, are as defined in Attachment "A".

4.0 OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

4.1 Documents including but not limited to plans, specifications, maps, basic survey notes, sketches, charts, computations and all other data prepared or obtained under the terms of this authorization shall become the property of the Owner and shall be made available for Owner's inspection at any time during the Project and, shall be delivered to the Owner prior to termination or final completion of the Contract.

4.2 Consultant may retain a set of documents for its files.

4.3 Reuse of Documents. Any reuse of documents or materials without written authorization or adaptation by Consultant to the specific purpose intended will be at Owner's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Consultant or to Consultant's independent professional associates, subcontractors, and consultants.

4.4 No materials, to include but not limited to reports, maps or other documents produced as a result of this Contract, in whole or in part, shall be available to Consultant for copyright purposes. Any such materials produced as a result of this Contract that might be subject to copyright shall be the property of the Owner and all such rights shall belong to the Owner, and the Owner shall be sole and exclusive entity who may exercise such rights.

5.0 SUPPLEMENTARY SERVICES

The Consultant shall provide, when requested in writing by the Owner, supplementary services not included in the basic work and services.

The compensation to the Consultant for the supplemental services, when performed by the Consultant, shall be in the form of a lump sum, billable hours, or "not to exceed" hourly rate which is mutually agreeable to the Owner and the Consultant in writing.

Such supplementary services may include the following:

A. Soil Investigations
B. Laboratory inspection of materials and equipment
C. Right-of-Way, easement and property acquisition surveys, plats, maps and documents
D. Any major revisions for which the Consultant is not responsible, that are authorized by the Owner after the completion and approval of either the preliminary or final plans and specifications
E. Services concerning replacement of any work damaged by fire or other causes during construction
F. Services made necessary by the default of the contractor in the performance of the construction contract
G. Services as an expert witness in connection with court proceedings
H. Traffic consulting if necessary
I. Topographic Survey
J. Preparation of Environmental Assessment documents and/or Environmental Permits
K. If all or part of the work is to be financed by a Federal or State Grant, the Consultant shall assist the Owner in the preparation of the Grant application and with the Grant Administration, unless otherwise specifically agreed upon previously herein.

6.0 DEFECTIVE WORK

During such visits and on the basis of such observations, Consultant may disapprove of or reject Contractor's work while it is in progress if Consultant believes that such work will not produce a completed Project that conforms generally to the Contract Documents or that it will prejudice the integrity of the design concept of the Project as reflected in the Contract Documents

7.0 NOTICE TO PROCEED

The Owner shall notify the Consultant in writing to undertake the services stated in this Agreement, and the Consultant shall commence the services within ten (10) days after receipt of such notification.

If the Owner desires to divide the Project into various parts, a Notice to Proceed shall be issued for each part, and the Owner and the Consultant shall mutually agree upon the period of time within which services for each part of the Project shall be performed.

The Consultant will be given time extensions for delays beyond their control or for those caused by tardy approvals of work in progress by various official agencies, but no additional compensation shall be allowed for such delays.

8.0 PAYMENTS

8.1 Owner shall pay Consultant for the performance of work and services as outlined in Attachment "C" to this Agreement.

8.2 Consultant's standard payment terms are Net Sixty (60) days of receipt of the invoice. Owner shall make payment in the form of a Check or ACH. If applicable; Owner's ACH Form shall be sent to pmonculity@hebertengineering.com and dhebert@hebertengineering.com. Check payments should be made payable to "Danny J. Hebert, P.E., LLC" and mailed to: Danny J. Hebert, P.E., LLC, Civil & Environmental Consulting Engineers, 14433 River Road, Hahnville, LA 70057. Checks should reference the invoice number. Owner acknowledges that the rates listed on the Rate Schedule shall automatically be updated on an annual basis and are subject to change at any time due to economic conditions.

8.3 Payment for Consultant work and services on projects that do not require construction services, such as feasibility studies or drainage studies, shall be made based upon Consultant's estimate of the proportion of the services actually completed at the time of billing and shall be made in partial payments at monthly intervals.

8.4 If the Project, or any portion thereof, is not completed for any reason, the final fee for consulting work and services shall be negotiated between Owner and Contractor. If the final fee for work and services is not mutually agreed upon, either party may elect in writing to submit the dispute to mediation. If mediation is not mutually agreed upon, written notice will be submitted to the other party of the intent to submit the dispute to the 29th Judicial District Court of St. Charles Parish, State of Louisiana.

8.5 If authorized in writing by Owner, for the performance of, or for obtaining from others Additional Services which are not considered normal or customary consulting, the Owner shall pay Consultant based on monthly invoices submitted by the Consultant, within sixty (60) days of receipt of Consultant's invoice. Consultant shall provide written notice to Owner when no services or work have been performed during a given month.

8.6 For Additional Authorized Services provided by the Consultant such as, but not limited to, wetlands permitting, land and right-of-way acquisition, surveying, NPDES and LADEQ permit renewal or acquisition work, etc. Owner shall pay Consultant based on an agreed upon hourly rate(s) between the Owner and Consultant. Payment shall be not-to-exceed based on hourly rates and actual hours worked.

8.7 The following documentation shall be required for payment to Consultant and shall be attached to the monthly invoice in accordance with Attachment "C".

a. A copy of the Owner's written authorization to perform the service.
b. Timesheets for all hours invoiced, if applicable.
c. Invoice copies, logs or other substantiation of non-salary expenses, if applicable.
d. An invoice showing percent complete of Attachment "C" items.

8.8 For Additional Authorized Services that Consultant acquires from subcontractors and/or subconsultants, Owner shall pay Consultant a fixed sum previously agreed upon by Owner and Consultant, such sum to be established in each case when the scope of the work involved has been determined and before any of the Additional Services are provided. The use of subcontractors and/or subconsultants shall be subject to the provisions set forth in this Agreement. The following documentation shall be required for payment to Consultant and shall be attached to the monthly invoice:

a. A copy of the Owner's written consent for the subcontractor and/or subconsultant to perform the service stating the Owner's and Consultant's agreed upon fixed sum established for the service performed.
b. Evidence that the subcontractor and/or subconsultant is insured as required by this Agreement.

8.9 For Supplementary Services described in Section 5, Owner shall pay Consultant for the fee negotiated at the time the work is assigned by the method stipulated in the contract amendment.

9.0 BUDGET LIMITATIONS

The construction budget for this Project shall be determined by the Owner, and the Consultant shall be advised of the budget limitation in writing by the Owner and the Consultant shall indicate his acceptance of same in writing to the Owner. Any subsequent budget revisions shall be confirmed in writing.

If, at the completion of the Preliminary or Design Phase, the Consultant does not concur with the construction budget, he shall so notify the Owner, and the Consultant and Owner shall mutually agree on a revised construction budget prior to any work on the Design Phase.

If no bid is received within the budget limitation and a redesign of the project if required by the Owner, such redesign shall be accomplished by the Consultant at no additional cost to the Owner, provided, however, if the receipt of bids is, for any reason, delayed beyond a period of six (6) months from the date of the completion of the Design Phase the amount stated as the construction budget shall be adjusted, immediately prior to the time bids are received, by use of a construction cost index acceptable to both parties of this agreement.

10.0 FUNDS

No work shall be authorized until funds are established for each individual task.

11.0 TERMINATION OR SUSPENSION

11.1 This Agreement may be terminated for any reason by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice.

11.2 The Consultant, upon receipt of such notice, shall immediately discontinue all services in connection with the performance of this Agreement and shall proceed to cancel promptly all existing orders and contracts insofar as such orders or contracts are chargeable to this Agreement.

11.3 The Consultant shall, as soon as practicable after receipt of notice of termination, submit a statement showing in detail the services performed and payments received under this Agreement to the date of termination.

11.4 The Owner shall then pay the Consultant promptly that portion of the prescribed fee to which both parties agree.

11.5 Consultant fully acknowledges that no payment will be made for any work performed or expenses incurred after receipt of the termination by either party unless mutually agreed upon in writing.

11.6 Failure to meet agreed delivery dates or authorized extensions are considered substantial failures and breach of this contractual agreement by Consultant.

11.7 This agreement shall automatically terminate upon satisfactory completion of all services and obligations described herein or three (3) years from the date of its execution, which ever event occurs first.

12.0 INSURANCE

12.1 The Consultant shall secure and maintain at his expense such insurance that will protect him and the Owner, from claims under Workmen's Compensation Acts and from claims for bodily injury, death or property damage which may arise from performance of services under this Agreement. Insurance for bodily injury or death shall be in the unencumbered amount of \$1,000,000.00 for one person and not less than \$1,000,000.00 for all injuries and/or deaths resulting from any one occurrence. The insurance for property damage shall be in the unencumbered amount of \$1,000,000.00 for each accident and not less than \$1,000,000.00 aggregate.

12.2 The CONSULTANT shall also secure and maintain at his expense professional liability insurance in the unencumbered sum of \$1,000,000.00.

12.3 All certificates of insurance SHALL BE FURNISHED TO THE OWNER and shall provide that insurance shall not be cancelled without ten (10) days prior written notice to the Owner. The Owner may examine the policies.

12.4 CONSULTANT shall include all subconsultants as insured under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates for each. All coverages for subconsultants shall be subject to all the requirements stated herein.

12.5 CONSULTANT shall secure and maintain at its expense Comprehensive Automobile Liability - Bodily Injury Liability \$1,000,000 each person: \$1,000,000 each occurrence, Property Damage Liability \$1,000,000 each occurrence. The Comprehensive Automobile Liability policy must have coverage for loading and unloading and must include owned, hired and leased autos.

12.6 St Charles Parish shall be named as an additional insured on general liability insurance policies.

12.7 For all purposes under Louisiana law, the principals of this Contract shall be recognized as the statutory employer of all contract employees as provided in LSA-R.S. 23:1061.

12.8 Insurance policies shall be endorsed to provide for a waiver of subrogation in favor of St. Charles Parish for worker's compensation policies. The certificate of insurance shall reference the waiver of subrogation endorsement.

12.9 The Worker's Compensation Policy Territory Coverage must include Louisiana.

13.0 INDEMNIFICATION

Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless the Owner, its employees, agents and representatives, against any and all claims, demands, suits or judgments for sums of money to any party for loss of life or injury or damages to person or property growing out of, resulting from or by any reason of any negligent act by the Consultant, its employees,

agents, servants or representatives, while engaged upon or in connection with the services required or performed hereunder.

14.0 WARRANTY

- 14.1 Consultant warrants that it will perform its design services with the degree of skill and to the standard of care required of the consulting profession to meet all Federal, State and Local requirements.
- 14.2 If Consulting Services for project designed by Consultant does not meet those requirements noted herein above, then to the extent that this occurs as a direct result of Consultant's failure to meet the standard of care in its design services, Consultant will indemnify the Parish for Consultant's share of the costs incurred to bring Consulting Services for project to the limitations mandated.
- 14.3 The obligations expressed in Section 14 above in no way limit the Consultant's obligations expressed elsewhere in this Contract.

15.0 EXCLUSIVE JURISDICTION AND VENUE

For all claims arising out of or related to this agreement, CONSULTANT hereby consents and yields to the exclusive jurisdiction and venue of the Twenty-Ninth Judicial District Court for the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana, and expressly waives any (a) pleas of jurisdiction based upon Consultant's residence and (b) right of removal to Federal Court based upon diversity of citizenship.

16.0 COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL AND STATE LAWS

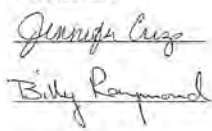

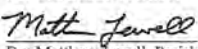

Project Scope:

CONSULTANT shall perform the scope of services described in the following paragraphs.

Topographic Surveying Services: A topographic survey will be conducted as a part of the preliminary design phase to ascertain the location of all existing improvements and utilities and to determine the existing roadway shoulder profile and characteristics. CONSULTANT shall use a licensed professional surveyor to provide surveying services for the project. Their scope of work shall be similar to the topo provided in Phase II Water Main Replacement Project and will include establishing baselines and temporary benchmarks along the approximate 4,800 linear feet of the project corridor, a topographic survey of existing manmade and natural features, and identifying all above-ground and identifiable subsurface utilities, including contacting Louisiana One Call. Surveyor will provide descriptions, locations, depths and sizes of pipes that may be present within the project. Along the roadways, surveyor will obtain spot elevations at 100-foot intervals within the survey area and along ditches at 50-foot intervals. Surveyor will locate all apparent rights-of-way.

Permitting Services: Provide additional services required to prepare and submit permit applications for LA 18 Cast Iron Water Main Replacement, Phase III, including Louisiana Department of Transportation (LADOTD), OCPR, Department of Natural Resources (DNR), and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (COE) permit applications, along with a request for a "Letter of No Objection" from the Lafourche Levee District. The permitting services are to be an amount lump sum \$12,000.00 plus reimbursables.

Preliminary Design: During this phase, CONSULTANT will prepare a 30-percent design memorandum which will demonstrate the proposed water utility profile and typical section. This submittal will include a preliminary existing and proposed waterline layout map. Also, this submittal will include 30-percent level technical specifications (without front-end documents and a 30-percent level cost opinion all summarized in a preliminary design memorandum. Design services will be as generally defined by the EJCDC Standard Agreement between Owner and CONSULTANT.

Detailed Design Phase: Pending acceptance of the preliminary design memorandum, the CONSULTANT will proceed to full design of the proposed waterline and ancillary improvements. This will be divided into 65-percent and 95-percent final design submittals. Each submittal will consist of plan drawings, specifications, and a cost opinion. Following the acceptance of these submittals, CONSULTANT will proceed to a 100-percent submittal which will constitute the construction documents for the project. Design services will be as generally defined by the EJCDC Standard Agreement between Owner and CONSULTANT.

Plans will be prepared on the 22" x 34" media. CONSULTANT will utilize the EJCDC Standard General Conditions of the Construction Contract and associated documents for the preparation of specifications. Technical specifications will be CONSULTANT's standard format as modified to meet local preferences and conditions.

Bid Phase: For this task CONSULTANT will assist Owner in obtaining bids for the project in accordance with State Bid Law requirements. CONSULTANT will prepare contract documents, assist the Owner in advertising for bids, conduct a pre-bid conference, issue addenda as necessary, attend the bid opening, and prepare a recommendation to award for the Owner as part of this phase. In general services provided during the bid phase will be performed in accordance with the EJCDC Standard Agreement between Owner and Engineer and the requirements of Louisiana Bid Law.

Construction Administration: Following the acceptance of bids CONSULTANT will provide construction-phase services for the construction of the project, generally in accordance with the services defined EJCDC Standard Agreement between Owner and Engineer. Tasks undertaken during this phase including submittal reviews, evaluation of "or-equal proposals", responses to RFI's, and review of payment applications. CONSULTANT will prepare and provide record drawings to Owner for the project in accordance with the EJCDC Standard Agreement between Owner and Engineer.

Resident Project Representative: CONSULTANT will use an experienced Resident Inspector on staff that will be available to be onsite for the duration of construction should be Owner request this service. The inspector will provide detailed descriptions and photos of construction progress to Owner per Owner's delivery schedule. Resident Inspection Services will be performed per the EJCDC's "Duties, Responsibilities and Limitations of Authority of the Resident Project Representative".

Record Drawings: CONSULTANT will prepare and provide record drawings to OWNER for the project as both a hard copy (22" x 34") and pdf on an usb drive.
