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Luling restaurant Santos closes doors for good

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Luling restaurant Santos closed its doors permanently after the last customer was served on Valentine’s Day.

“Due to a pending sale of the building where Santos is located and changing market conditions, the Sophisticated Hospitality Group has decided not to reopen Santos in another location and instead focus on their operations of Cloud9 Restaurant inside Cypress Lakes Country Club and Sophisticated Southern Plates, their growing catering and special events business,” a press release issued last week stated.



“Since so much love was poured into the creation of Santos, we thought it would be appropriate for Valentine’s Day to be our last shift to serve the food and atmosphere you’ve come to enjoy and love,” Executive Chef Natasha Clement said. “I learned so much through this process and look forward to the next exciting chapter for my passion for food.”

Santos opened in August 2021 just nine days before Hurricane Ida brought devastation to St. Charles Parish. The restaurant reopened a month after the storm - without internet, displaced staff, and broken supply lines for their products.

“It is no secret that I love both Louisiana and Latin America, and what we created at Santos was a perfect blend of two amazing food cultures that allowed us to take the customer on a trip through each dish serving Louisiana roots, Latin attitude,” Buddy Boe, managing partner of Sophisticated Hospitality Group, said.

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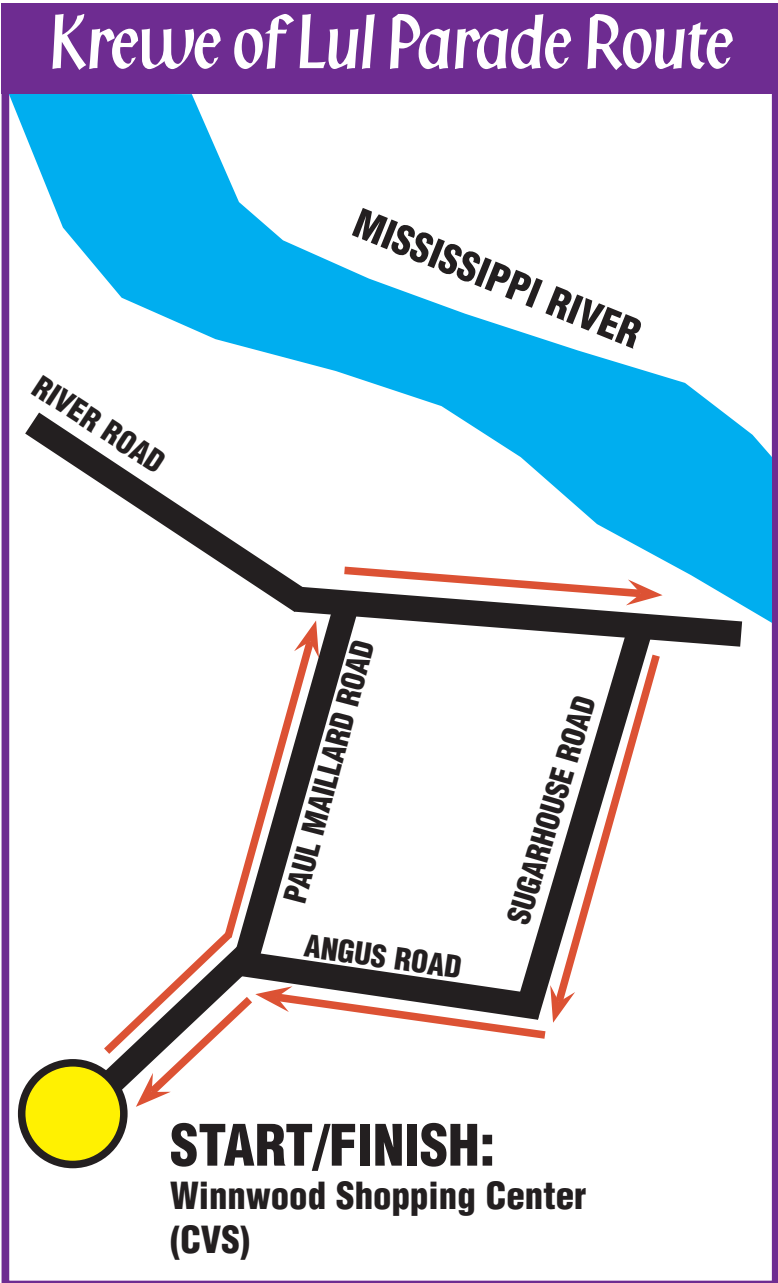

Ayo's sister returned to Des Allemands after she moved away herself years ago, and Ayo has regularly returned to enjoy the parade from her sister's home on the parade route.

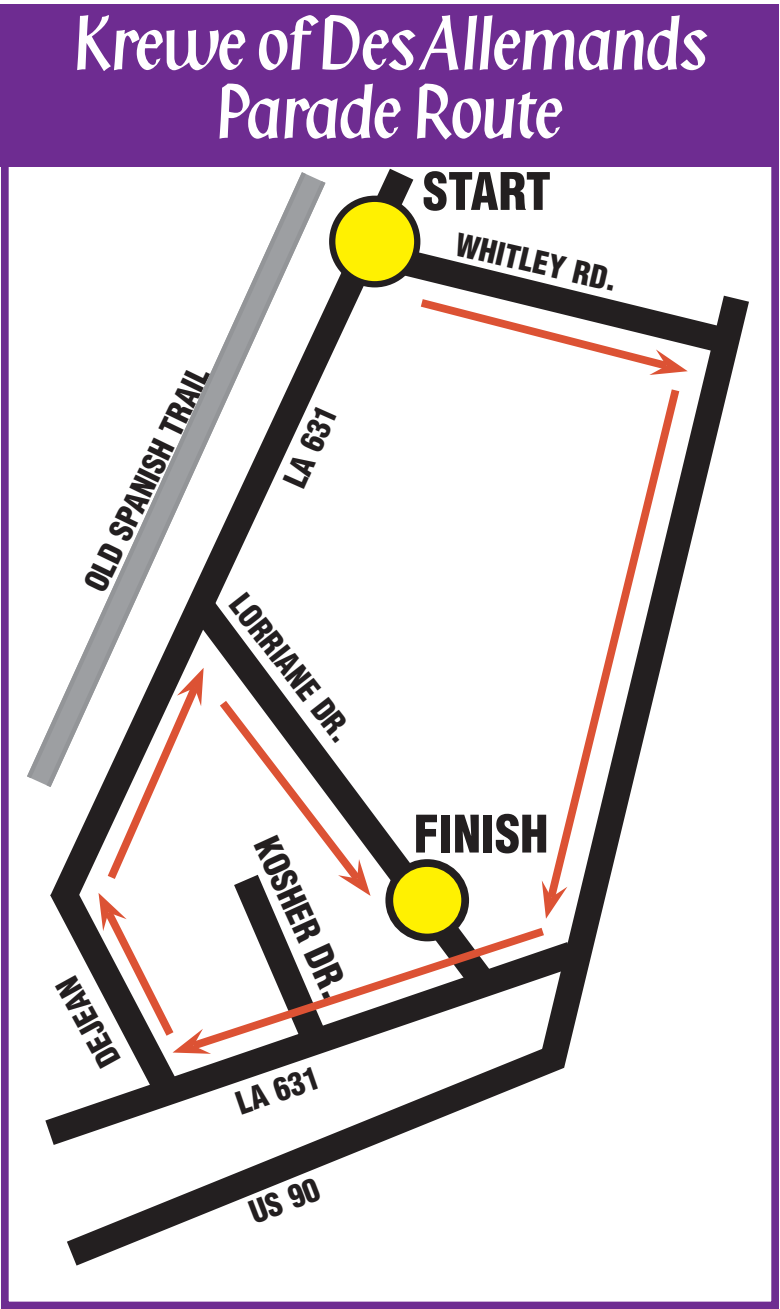
"It's just always such a great gathering of family and friends," Ayo said. "Honored and proud."

Luling’s Mardi Gras parade is set for Feb. 18 at noon. Beginning at Winnwood Shopping Center, the parade route will turn onto Paul Maillard Road, take a right onto River Road, a right onto Sugarhouse Road, another right onto Angus Road and circle back to the same shopping center.

Krewe of Lul parade organizer Debbie Dufresne Vial said this year’s parade is dedicated in memory of Charles “Chuck” Oubre III.

Per Krewe of Lul tradition, there is no parade theme. Each float will have its own theme and throws.

Beth Landry has been involved in the parade for the past six years.

“I’m one of the newer captains and I help with planning the balls and the parade,” she said, adding that this year the Hahnville High School ROTC, cheerleaders, dance team and band will all take part in the parade as they have traditionally. “We have dance teams that come from near and far to be in our parade. It’s known as a family and community environment.”

New this year to the parade, she added, will be a Jeep club that is riding in 25 jeeps in the processional.

Dance teams, show cars, a horse-riding group, representatives from local fire departments, the St. Charles Parish Sheriff’s Office and EMS will also be riding, as will be Parish President Matt Jewell. There will also be several festival queens as part of the day’s event. St. Charles Parish Hospital’s Mr. Peanut truck will once again be collecting jars of peanut butter to donate for food bank distribution, and parade goers are asked to bring jars of peanut butter to donate.

Landry said another addition the parade tradition this year was that all current and past Krewe of Lul royalty and captains were gifted flags by the organization to hang at their homes.

“It’s neat to look around the neighborhoods and see all the flags,” she said.

know how people really missed the parade when we couldn’t have it,” said Mitzi Petit, who helps organize the Des Allemands parade annually.

At 1 p.m. this Sunday, Des Allemands rolls again. Petit estimates 10 to 12 floats will be a part of the action again, along with the local school bands, dance teams and ROTC, fire trucks and more.

“I don’t have a complete count as far as floats, but we’re probably looking at 10 to 12 ... we’re not the biggest parade, but I think we’re the ‘funnest,’” Petit said with a laugh.

The route begins on Whitley Road before traveling up to U.S. Highway 90, turning into the town’s business district, heading down Dejean Street toward Old Spanish Trail and then backing up Lorraine Drive to the highway.

“Our royalty, we were very excited to ask them,” Petit said. “Our King and Queen are from the Lafourche side of Des Allemands. They’re very excited, working on throws and they had a great time at the dance. Our Grand Marshals no longer live here, but they grew up here and have been huge supporters of our parade for a long time. We’re excited to see how excited they are.”

As in years past, St. Charles Parish Hospital will be collecting peanut butter and cash along the parade route. Everything collected will be donated to St. Charles Social Concerns to stock their pantry. The tradition now spans more than 30 years.

This will be the parade’s 68th year, and Petit said it doesn’t get old – not for her, nor the tight-knit community that comes out en masse to celebrate Mardi



Gras together each year.

“We’ve been going for a long time,” Petit said. “When we see how much people enjoy it and look forward to it, it just makes us feel good and want to keep doing it.”

HHS Hi-Steppers dance team takes first place, two third place honors at national competition.

Only days after the Hahnville Hi-Steppers captured national championship glory, sophomore Ashlyn Rogers said it still felt surreal.

“It’s more than we could have ever dreamed of,” said Rogers, a lieutenant with the dance squad

that cemented itself as truly elite last weekend with a first-place finish in the Small Varsity Team Performance category at the Dance Team Union National Championship competition.

“It was a lot of hard work, dedicated hours and blood, sweat and tears,” Rogers said. “We



had support from our amazing sponsors, our families, our administrators ... I don’t know that it’s fully sunk in yet.”

The team also took third in the Small Spirit Showdown and third in the Large Varsity Kick competitions, making for a trio of top three finishes among a field of the

best dance squads in the country. Those categories also were the lone three Hahnville competed in – meaning the Hi-Steppers excelled in everything they put their eyes on at the championship event.

The championship victory makes it

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back-to-back years for St. Charles Parish teams to take home national crowns. After the Destrehan Desty Darlings dance squad pulled it off a year ago.

- coaching-wise, this was a notable family affair.

It is the first state championship for Kiley Voges as a head coach in just her first full season with the Hi-Steppers, after taking the helm of the team just

after competition season began last season. The last name might sound familiar, as her mother Micque is the longtime coach of the Destrehan dance program and led the Destys to their first national championship win as a program.

Micque assisted her daughter and the team this year on their journey and said she couldn't be prouder of her daughter - or the group of dancers

who she says made a full commitment to accomplishing something special.

“We're really excited for those girls,” Micque said. “Basically, they just decided they were ready to commit to nationals, and at that point they had auditions, hired a choreographer and the girls committed to the extra practices during the week, on the weekends, during holidays – and they just bonded as a team. They put forth the effort to make an impact at nationals, and you can see the result.”

Much as was the case for the Destys last year coming off of Hurricane Ida, it was no sure thing that the Hi-Steppers were going to aim to compete at nationals.

“Kiley believed in her team – she really wanted them to be there, and she pushed nationals,” Micque said. “We talked to the parents, and they were on board ... and this group was simply special. It was a sisterhood. If one person isn't committed all the way, you won't

achieve a goal. They all stuck together.”

The team's motto this year was “One step at a time,” a play on the team's name as well as a nod to the day-to-day work and commitment that can add up to big things.

With that commitment came confidence.

“I think we had a pretty good idea of what we were walking in there with,” said Rogers. “As far as the competition itself, in our first nationals we had no clue what to expect. But we were hoping our hard work would pay off, which it did.

“We felt like we had so

much energy. We felt sure of ourselves, just really together.”

Still, nothing prepares you totally for the moment.

“We were crying tears of joy,” Rogers said. “It was amazing.”

DHS alum Jefferson is NFL's Offensive Player of the Year

Destrehan High School's own Justin Jefferson has quickly ascended to the NFL's elite tier of players - and now he's adding hardware to cement it.

The Minnesota Vikings' wide receiver captured the NFL's Offensive Player of the Year honor this week, as besting a strong crop of finalists that include Super Bowl starting quarterbacks Patrick Mahomes and Jalen Hurts of the Kansas City Chiefs and Philadelphia Eagles, respectively, and Tyreek Hill of the Miami Dolphins.

Jefferson entered the 2022-23 season as the player with the most receiving yards through his first two seasons in NFL history. All he did was follow up on that with his very best season yet: his 128 receptions for 1,809 yards set new franchise record marks for Minnesota Vikings team that has seen all-time greats like Randy Moss and Cris Carter come through the ranks. He scored nine touchdowns this season, with eight coming through the air and one on a run.

Jefferson received 35 first-place votes and 192 points, finishing ahead of the runner-up Mahomes' 10 first-place votes and 75 points.

In addition to the OPOY honor, Jefferson's 4th and 18 reception that was key in Minnesota's 33-30 upset over the Buffalo Bills was voted the NFL's Best Moment of the Year. Jefferson was also named a unanimous first team All-Pro.

He had 10 100 yard games this season, including a franchise record 223 yards in a victory over the Detroit Lions. His play helped Minnesota to a 13-4 record this season, tied for the third-best mark among NFL teams.

“Each year we invite all of our clients and all of the other non-profits in the parish who work with people with special needs to come to the Mardi Gras celebration,” Brantley said. “We have a second line, cake walk, a shoebox floats contest, karaoke, and dancing. Clients are also able to vote on a king and queen and duke and princess that day. It’s a lot of fun.”

Brantley said Hahnville High School band director Eric Gueniot and his students come and provide the second line band each year, and that the event couldn’t take place without continued support from the community.

Community support is also crucial to the success of the Arc’s Throw Me Something Mister Store, Brantley added. The store was originally located in Luling but is now at 36 Apple Street in Norco. The store was started as a bead recycling program in 2009 to expand job opportunities for Arc of St. Charles clients.

“Individuals with special needs acquire important job training skills as they organize and package donated Mardi Gras beads for resale,” Brantley said. “Many of these beads are purchased in 30-pound sacks to be used in local parades. This year the store sold out in record time, and the donations of beads helps secure paid jobs for with individuals with special needs in our community.”

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How Risks and Signs of a Heart Attack Differ in Men and Women

From cold sweats and extreme fatigue to neck and back pain, heart attack symptoms can sometimes appear differently in men and women.

A heart attack occurs when blood flow to the heart becomes blocked or impeded. According to the American Heart Association, the most common general warning signs of a heart attack are chest discomfort, shortness of breath, cold sweats, extreme fatigue, and discomfort in the upper body. While both men and women may experience these symptoms during a myocardial infarction (heart attack), there are some differences between the sexes that are important to recognize.

Heart disease is the leading cause of death for men in the United States, accounting for approximately one in every four male deaths. On average, men experience heart attacks earlier in life than women do – the average age for a first-time heart attack in men is 64, while for women the average age for a first-time event is 72.

Signs and symptoms of a heart attack for males include an unpleasant or uncomfortable pressure or fullness in the chest area, as well as shortness of breath which may or may not be accompanied by chest pain. Changes in the extremities such as pain, tingling, numbness, coldness and weakness in the arms and legs are other common signs of a heart event.

Smoking, obesity, diabetes, high cholesterol and high blood pressure are all major heart disease risk factors, while patients who have a history of heart disease in their families are at a more



severe risk. It's important to note that 50% of men who die suddenly from a coronary event have demonstrated no prior symptoms of heart disease. It's important to discuss any potential risk factors with your doctor and visit a cardiologist if you have a family history of heart trouble.

Similarly, to men, heart disease is the leading cause of death in women in the United States. Roughly one in six women over the age of 20 have coronary heart disease, and two-thirds of women who die suddenly from coronary heart disease have no previous symptoms. These are just a few of the reasons why it is important to understand the different ways that heart attacks manifest themselves between the genders.

Women who are undergoing a heart attack may experience nausea and vomiting, as well as neck, jaw, and throat pain. Pain radiating from the upper abdomen or the back are other symptoms that something may be wrong. These symptoms may appear at both times of rest and times of activity, and the longer the patient goes without treatment the worse the damage can be.

Women and men should have their blood pressure and cholesterol numbers checked on a regular basis and should also discuss any potential risk factors with their doctor or cardiologist. Although women experience unusual symptoms more than men, such as neck pain and fatigue, chest pain or pressure in the chest is still the most common presenting symptom.

The good news for both men and women is there are certain controllable steps everyone can take to manage their risk of heart disease. Up to 80% percent of heart attacks can be prevented by controlling modifiable risk factors. The primary ways that patients can control their heart health include quitting smoking, getting regular exercise – aim for at least 30 minutes of activity each day, eating heart-healthy foods like lean meats and whole grains and managing cholesterol levels, reducing stress wherever it is possible, limiting alcohol intake which can damage the heart and maintaining a healthy weight.

CONTRACT

This agreement entered into this 7th day of February, 2023, by Pedal Valves, Inc., hereinafter called the "Contractor", whose business address is 13825 River Road, Luling, LA 70070, and the St. Charles Parish, hereinafter called the "Owner".

Owner and Contractor, in consideration of premises and the mutual covenants; consideration and agreement herein contained, agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1

STATEMENT OF WORK

- 1.01 Contractor shall furnish all labor and materials and perform the work required to build, construct and complete in a thorough and workmanlike manner in connection with the following:

Project Name: Automated Water Meter Reading Installation Program Project Number: WWKS 106
- 1.02 The abovementioned work shall be completed in strict accordance with Contract Documents prepared by: All South Consulting Engineers, LLC
- 1.03 It is recognized by the parties herein that said Contract Documents including by way of example and not of limitation, the Drawings and Specifications dated 10/17/2022, Addenda number(s) 1 & 2, the Instruction to Bidders, Supplemental Instructions to Bidders, Louisiana Uniform Public Works Bid Form, General Conditions, Supplementary Conditions (if applicable), any Addenda thereto, impose duties and obligations upon the parties herein, and said parties thereby agree that they shall be bound by said duties and obligations. For these purposes, all of the provisions contained in the aforementioned Contract Documents are incorporated herein by reference with the same force and effect as though said Contract Documents were herein set out in full.
- 1.04 The Work is generally described as follows: water meter replacements throughout St Charles Parish

ARTICLE 2

ENGINEER

- 2.01 The Project has been designed by All South Consulting Engineers, LLC who is hereinafter called "Engineer" and who will assume all duties and responsibilities and have the rights and authority assigned to Engineer in the Contract Documents in connection with completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

ARTICLE 3

CONTRACT TIME

- 3.01 The Contractor shall complete the Work under the Contract within 300 calendar days. The calendar days are divided into 3 individual Notice to Proceeds (NTP), which gives 100 calendar days per NTP. NTPs will be given in the anticipated time frame shown in Appendix B, Exhibit A of the specifications.

ARTICLE 4

LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

- 4.01 Owner and Contractor recognize that the Owner will suffer direct financial loss if Work is not completed within the Contract Time specified plus any extensions thereof allowed in accordance with these General Conditions of this Contract, and therefore, time is of the essence. They also recognize the delays, expense and difficulties involved in proving in a legal proceeding the actual loss suffered by Owner if the Work is not completed on time. Accordingly, instead of requiring any such proof, Contractor and Surety agree to forfeit and pay Owner Two Hundred dollars \$ 200.00 per day as Liquidated Damages for delay (but not as a penalty). Such Liquidated Damages will be assessed for each calendar day that expires after the Contract Time. This amount represents a reasonable estimate of Owner's expenses for extended delays and the costs associated therein. This provision shall be effective between the parties ipso facto and without demand or putting in default, it being specifically agreed that the Contractor by his mere failure to complete the work on or before the date specified shall be deemed in default.

ARTICLE 5

CONTRACT PRICE

- 5.01 The Owner will pay and the Contractor will accept in full consideration for the performance of the Contract the sum of:

a) (\$687,155.00) Six hundred eighty-seven thousand one hundred fifty-five Dollars based on unit prices specified within this contract document. Contract price is firm and subject only to modification by written Change Order agreed to and signed by both parties and the Engineer and approved by the St. Charles Parish Council.

ARTICLE 6

PAYMENT PROCEDURES

- 6.01 Contractor shall submit Applications for Payment to the Engineer in accordance with Article 15 of the General Conditions. Applications for Payment will be processed by Engineer as provided in the General Conditions.
- 6.02 Progress Payments. Progress payments will be based upon estimated quantities of contract unit price items or upon estimated percentages of completion of the schedule of lump sum values of labor and materials incorporated into the Work or suitably stored, on the last day of each month or other mutually agreed regular monthly date ending the progress payment period, less retainage.
- 6.03 Application for Payment Form. The form of the Application for Payment must be suitable to the Owner. The Owner reserves the right to withhold payment until the form of Application for Payment is deemed acceptable by the Owner.
- 6.04 Retainage. Per Paragraph 15.01.D retainage shall be withheld and payments will be made by the Owner in the payment amount of:

a) Ninety percent (90%) of the approved payment applications for projects with contract of less than \$500,000.00; or

b) Ninety-five percent (95%) of the approved payment applications for projects with contract prices of \$500,000.01 or greater.
- 6.05 The normal retainage shall not be due the Contractor until after Substantial Completion and expiration of the forty-five (45) day lien period and submission to the Engineer of a clear lien certificate and invoice for retainage.
- 6.06 Final Payment. Upon the final completion of all Work, the Contractor may request a final inspection and may make a final Application for Payment as provided by Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions.
- 6.07 Final Acceptance. When Final Acceptance is granted by the Owner, the Owner shall file the certificate with the Recorder of Mortgages for St. Charles Parish.
- 6.08 At the expiration of the lien period the Contractor shall obtain a certificate from the Recorder of Mortgages of the Parish of St. Charles that the Contract is clear of any liens or privileges and said certificate shall be presented to the Owner for final payment and release of retainage, less any such sums as may be lawfully withheld under the Contract.
- 6.09 Claims. Pursuant to La. R.S. 38:2242, when the Owner receives any claim of nonpayment arising out of the Contract, the Owner shall deduct such claim from the Contract Sum. The Contractor, or any interested party, may deposit security, in accordance with La. R.S. 38:2242.2, guaranteeing payment of the claim with the Recorder of Mortgages for St. Charles Parish. When the Owner receives original proof of such guarantee from the Recorder of Mortgages, the claim deduction will be added back to the Contract Sum.

ARTICLE 7

CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIONS

- 7.01 In order to induce Owner to enter into this Agreement, Contractor makes the following representations:
- 7.02 Contractor has familiarized itself with the nature and extent of the Contract Documents, Work, site, locality, and all local conditions and laws and regulations that in any manner may affect cost, progress, performance or finishing of the Work.
- 7.03 Contractor has studied carefully all reports of explorations and tests of subsurface physical conditions and drawings of physical conditions which are identified in the Information Available To Bidders and as provided in the General Conditions.
- 7.04 Contractor has obtained and carefully studied (or assumed responsibility for obtaining and carefully studying) all such examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, reports and studies (in addition to or to supplement those referred to in Paragraph 2 above) which pertain to the subsurface or physical conditions at or contiguous to the site or which otherwise may affect the cost, progress, performance or furnishing of the Work as Contractor considers necessary for the performance or furnishing of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Time and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract Documents. In exercising its responsibility with respect to subsurface conditions and physical conditions at the site, Contractor has or will obtain or perform at no additional cost to the Owner such additional examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, reports, studies, or similar information or data as may be required by Contractor for such purposes.

ARTICLE 8

- 8.01 The following Contract Documents, which comprise the entire Agreement between Owner and Contractor, are all hereby made a part of that Agreement to the same extent as if incorporated herein in full:

k) Supplementary Conditions (if applicable for compliance purposes) (Section 0800)

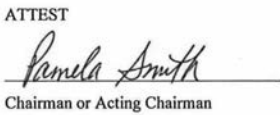
