The selection of USI Insurance Services provides the District with high quality services. A discussion was held.

1.03 Approval of Group Life Insurance Broker

The Risk Management and Insurance Committee reviewed and evaluated statements of qualifications based upon the criteria set forth in the Request for Qualifications. The selection of USI Insurance Services provides the District with high quality services. A discussion was held.

1.04 Renewal of Short-Term Disability, Long-Term Disability, and Group Life Insurance

Director of Risk Management & Benefits Darinisha Giles presented item 1.04. Currently, Vova provides short term disability, long term disability, and group life insurance plans for the employees of the district. The plans are in effect until May 1, 2023. The renewal of the current plan would result in an increase in benefits. Jesse Babin and David Babin with USI presented information on the group life, short-term disability and long-term disability insurance renewal and a discussion was held about the vendors and the amounts of the proposals from each. Note that short-term, long-term and life insurance are quoted as package proposals and these proposal rates are guaranteed for three years. Hartford is the general consensus for approval.

1.05 Renewal of the Medicare Advantage Plan from Humana

Director of Risk Management & Benefits Darinisha Giles presented item 1.05. On September 1, 2008, the Board first offered retirees with Medicare the option of continuing traditional Medicare or converting to a private, fee-for-service plan offered by Humana. Currently, 679 out of 1,081 eligible retirees have chosen to switch to the Medicare Advantage Plan. This reflects no increase from the prior year. Humana submitted a renewal for January 1, 2023, that continues existing coverage at a 0% increase. By offering the Medicare Advantage Plan, the District gives retirees an alternative to traditional Medicare while decreasing the District's cost for health insurance. Jesse Babin and David Babin with USI presented information on the renewal of the Medicare Advantage Plan including the vendors who have submitted proposals to provide the insurance coverage. Note: This discount would be in effect for 3-1/2 years. Humana will be the provider recommendation.

1.06 Renewal of Health Insurance Plan

Director of Risk Management & Benefits Darinisha Giles presented item 1.06. Currently, Humana provides health insurance plans for the employees and retirees of the District. The plans are in effect until May 1, 2023. The renewal of the current plan would result in an increase. Jesse Babin and David Babin with USI presented information on the renewal of the health insurance plan and upcoming rate increases. A discussion was held regarding the effect of the rate increase on employees and prescriptions and the effects on employees of switching to a closed formulary. A representative from Humana, Candace, was present to answer any questions regarding the prescription plan. Consensus to make the closed formulary a part of the health insurance renewal plan. Also discussed how the cost will be split with employees - option 2 is the consensus. David Babin with USI presented information on an optional program that can be offered to employees within our system that have chronic condition that can potentially drive down costs for health care. Rachel Malalbano with Ochsner was in the audience to help discuss the program they offer to assist with chronic conditions. Final discussion was regarding biometric screenings. This will be the final year for on-site screenings.

A discussion was held. S. Cody requested historical data between the Board and employees when rate increases were present. This agenda item will be on the February 8, 2023 Board Meeting Agenda.

Kindergarten Registration - Kindergarten registration for St. Charles Parish Public Schools is now open! Children who will be five years old by September 30, 2023 are eligible to register for kindergarten. Parents/guardians can currently register using the link under District News on the St. Charles Parish Public Schools website or may do so in person at the school in their attendance zone from March 6th - 10th from 9:30 AM to 12:30 PM. Students registering online or in-person by March 10 will be administered the Kindergarten Screener at an assigned time later in the spring. Children currently enrolled in a St. Charles Parish Public School's Pre-K or Head Start Program do not need to register for kindergarten since they are already enrolled in the school system.

PreK Registration - All families interested in the pre-kindergarten programs offered in St. Charles Parish can begin the application process soon, too! Families must complete the St. Charles Parish Early Childhood Community Network Coordinated Application either online or by completing the paper application. The online link can be accessed under District News on the St. Charles Parish Public Schools website. Paper applications may be picked up at Career Early Learning Center, East Bank Head Start, all elementary schools and the School Board Office. The registration window opens on February 13 and the first round of student selections will begin after March 17, 2023. Students who will be 3 by September 30th or 4 by September 30th are eligible to participate in the St. Charles Parish Public Schools Head Start & Four Year Old Programs. Eligibility and placements are based on age, residential area and income and are not awarded on a first-come, first-served basis. Free transportation is provided for students enrolled in the 4 year old program. Applications are taken throughout the school year to ensure all seats are filled within the schools and Head Start sites.

Testing - The computer-based format of the ACT will be administered on March 7, 2023 to all 11th graders and some seniors. All 10th graders will take the Pre-ACT on the same day, March 7. Students not taking either of these tests will participate in asynchronous learning on this day. Additional information relative to ACT testing and asynchronous learning will be shared by both HIS and DHS. Please contact your child's school for additional information.
