A tearful V.J. St. Pierre bared his soul for the many gathered for a momentous occasion last week in Luling.

“I never thought I’d live to see this,” St. Pierre said, “but I’m standing here ... I’m very proud, and I’m overwhelmed.”

The former St. Charles Parish President and Vietnam veteran saw a dream come to life as parish leadership and residents celebrated the opening of its Veterans Memorial Plaza at the Edward A. Dufresne Community Center. The plaza will serve as a host

for all Veterans Day ceremonies and other tributes to the Armed Forces in the parish and honors living veterans, those who have passed and the families of veterans.

The plaza represents the culmination of a project that has been in the works through three parish administrations, starting with that of St. Pierre who felt strongly that St. Charles Parish needed a place where people

Lakewood Elementary School’s music department – the largest elementary music department of St. Charles Parish Public Schools – is gearing up to host its first music gala at Grand Ridge Golf Club later this month.

The effort is being organized by Lakewood band director Monica Monti and choir director Brian Martinez.

“We were sitting down planning our year out at the beginning of the school year and really needed a fundraiser,” Monti said, adding that fundraising efforts have been non-existent for the past few years because of COVID and Hurricane Ida. “We were spitballing ideas and I said, ‘What if we have a party? What if we do a gala and have sponsors and it would be something fun for everybody?’”

The idea took shape, and ticket sales are now open for the April 29 event.

“Everyone that I have talked to has been excited about it,” Monti said. “We need to upgrade and get new instruments. When I got here in 2014 we had

about 70 kids in band and now we’re at over 200.”

Monti said the funds raised will also help the band attend more competitions and buy more equipment needed for the music classroom.

“We try to keep the band and choir affordable for any student who is interested to be able to participate,” she said.

“We’re looking forward to a fun night and to raise some money for our kids.”

Ama woman establishes foundation, set to host autism acceptance event at bridge park

Very early in her journey as the mother of a child with autism, Precious Singleton Alexander made a vow to herself to make a difference for families experiencing the same trials and tribulations shared by she and her then 3-year-old son Rio.

Two years later, Alexander has done just that – not only recognized for her efforts, but preparing to host the first annual Autism Awareness and Acceptance Bubbles and Balloon Bash on April 30.

The event, held under the banner of Alexander’s Chosen Ones Foundation, will be free for all to enjoy at the West Bank Bridge Park, from 2 p.m.-5 p.m. The Chosen Ones Foundation’s purpose is to raise public awareness, acceptance, inclusion and increase advocacy efforts concerning Autism Spectrum Disorder in the community. The event is for all ages to attend.

The foundation was recognized last month by the St. Charles Parish Council, who made a proclamation highlighting autism awareness and acceptance.

While this month’s event will mark the first official foundation event, Singleton hosted the event on a smaller scale last year. That event was put together quickly and without much fanfare, but from that test-run Singleton hopes she can provide the potential launching pad for a regular event that can make a positive difference for children with autism – as well as their parents.

“With my baby and I, me being new to the diagnosis, I asked myself, ‘How can I advocate for my child and children like him?’” said Alexander. “So let me pray on it. Let me manifest, before I make any plans. I gave it to the universe, I gave it to God, and boom, it hit me.”

She determined she would create an event for children, teens and adults on the spectrum to come together in a fun, safe environment, while parents could likewise unite and network with one another.

“It’s something where we can meet

each other, talk, vent, share ideas, whatever anyone needs,” Alexander said. “To come together as one. We’re all learning. I’m still learning. This is to raise more awareness, and here we are today.”

Last year’s event saw the children blow bubbles – and chase them, of course – while playing together and enjoying the day outside.

Singleton did not have the Bridge Park last year – she’s putting the extra space to very good use in adding several other activities and avenues for fun. There will be a bounce house, sensory tables, a miniature train ride, a gaming truck, informational booths, entertainment, snowballs and food for all.

Singleton said when she learned of Rio’s diagnosis, it didn’t come as a shock. “At age 2, 2 and a half, I started to see the signs and traits, the characteristics of being on the spectrum,” she said. “I noticed how he was playing with certain toys, not making eye contact ... I did the research, put it all in and what do you know, they popped up as the symptoms. So, when the diagnosis came back, it wasn’t a surprise.”

During last year’s event, Singleton said she “didn’t want this to end” referencing the day’s festivities, noting that for families of someone with autism, life is affected each day.

“It’s been quite a ride. And just to know that it’s going to continue until he’s an adult, I’m trying to prepare myself mentally for that long haul,” Alexander said. “It’s been tough, but rewarding. He’s teaching me a lot, teaching me about patience, teaching me to be humble and to have compassion.”

25-year law enforcement veteran promoted to captain

Darren Gros of the St. Charles Parish Sheriff’s Office was recently promoted to the rank of captain, and the 25-year veteran of law enforcement says he was driven to join law enforcement from a young age.

“My dad is a retired New Orleans firefighter,” Gros said. “I also have many family members who served and still do serve in the military. Having grown up in that environment, I was driven to join law enforcement. Being able to help people you don’t know when they are experiencing a problem that needs immediate attention is rewarding.”

Gros has spent the majority of his law enforcement career - 17 years – here in St. Charles Parish with the sheriff’s office. Gros is currently assigned to the St. Charles Parish Regional P.O.S.T. Academy as the director of training.

“As the academy director, I am responsible for the facilitation of all state mandated recruit training for our academy cadets,” he said. “In this capacity, I am also responsible for accurate reporting of the cadets’ progress throughout the academy and up to and including their certification to the Louisiana POST Council. On any given day, the director of training addresses the needs of each individual officer in many fashions ... this can be a range of items such as addressing a training request to oversight of our firing range and in-house training to serving as the agency liaison to the Louisiana Commission in Law Enforcement.”

Gros said training involves numerous, motivated individuals skilled in various aspects of law enforcement.

“Besides the training staff, we have numerous adjunct instructors who perform flawlessly whether they

instruct on investigations, weapons, or law,” he said. “We are fortunate in the fact that our instructors have and maintain several certifications that benefit our employees who then take that out into the field to serve the public very efficiently.”

Gros’ previous assignments include corrections, patrol, master field training officer, investigations, and training. Gros was previously promoted to detective in the criminal investigations bureau – special operations division. During Gros’ time in the detective bureau, he was promoted to detective sergeant.

In 2014, Gros was transferred to the training division. He was later promoted to lieutenant/assistant director of training where he remained until recently being promoted to captain in the training division.

“My favorite thing about my job is seeing officers I have had a part in training in a recruit academy flourishing in their professional and personal lives,” Gros said.

Luling man sentenced to 5 years for possession of child pornography

A 22-year-old Luling resident will spend 60 months in prison after previously pleading guilty to a one-count indictment charging him with possession of images and videos depicting the sexual exploitation of children under the age of twelve years old.

Dominic Romano was sentenced on March 30 by United States District Judge Barry W. Ashe. Ashe also ordered Romano to serve a 10-year period of supervised release and pay a mandatory \$100 special assessment fee.

According to court documents, an investigation began in 2020 after the FBI received a tip from another law enforcement agency that Romano had accessed an online bulletin board.

The bulletin board, according to court documents, had an explicit focus on the advertisement, distribution, and facilitation of sharing child abuse material. The board also contained sections and forums cataloged

by the age of the victims and the nature of the violence inflicted on them.

The FBI executed a search warrant of Romano’s residence on May 7, 2020. A forensic review revealed that Romano had knowingly used several of the electronic devices seized during the search warrant to search for, download, and save images and videos of child sexual abuse material.

In total, at least 2,589 images and 62 videos depicting the sexual exploitation of children were found on Romano’s seized devices - these images and videos included children less than three years old. Romano was also in possession of an instruction manual on how to successfully victimize “very young girls” without being caught.

A hearing on July 6, 2023, has been scheduled to determine the amount of restitution Romano must pay to the victims of his offense.

were filming a part of a movie,” said Shea Majoria, Majoria’s co-owners. “They’re going to be around the parish until Saturday, I believe, doing different shots for different things. It was nice, they hired some local deputies to keep everything situated. It went really smooth.”

Majoria also noted the crew was tight-lipped as to the movie’s title.

There are four film projects noted to be filming or in pre-production to be filmed this month in the greater New Orleans area.

Home Movies is the title of a feature film that was slated to begin filming Monday, according to the website FilmNewOrleans.org. That film’s production is slated to run through May 12. A clue toward that being what was filmed at Majoria’s Monday might have been nearby parking signs for crew under the initials “HM.” Very little has been written about the project online.

Faces of Death is a remake of a 1978 horror film that was a hit at the box office, grossing \$35 million worldwide. The remake stars Barbie Ferrara of Euphoria fame and Dacre Montgomery of Stranger Things. The film will serve as a total reboot of the controversial movie series that consisted of several sequels. Reports have been that the project began filming in the past week and LouisianaEntertainment.gov

notes it as one that was to begin filming this month in the New Orleans area.

In the original Faces of Death film, a narrator presents the viewer with a variety of footage showing different gruesome ways of dying from a variety of sources. Some of the most iconic scenes were faked for the film, while most of the film is pre-existing video footage of real deaths or the aftermath of death.

Five Nights at Freddy’s reportedly began filming last month and is to film through April in the area according to LouisianaEntertainment.gov. That is a supernatural horror film directed by Emma Tammi and the plot is adapted from the video game of the same name. The plot of the film surrounds Mike Schmidt, a troubled security guard who starts a night-time job at Freddy Fazbear’s Pizza, a family entertainment center, where he discovers its four animatronic mascots move and kill anyone that is still there after midnight.

Finally, Cash Out 2 was scheduled to begin filming in the New Orleans area Monday, like Home Movies, according to FilmNewOrleans.org. The first Cash Out was a project that starred John Travolta and was directed by Randall Emmitt, though it has yet to be officially released.

around the idea in December of opening up the food truck.

“Right before Christmas we started talking about it,” she said. “Brock and his dad were doing catering jobs here and there and the idea came to us to get the truck so that they can expand and eventually get a restaurant. In January we started the process of opening the truck. We really tried to push and get open for the big crawfish weekend of Easter.”

Dardar said the truck will focus on offering live and boiled crabs, shrimp, and crawfish. Boiled sides and sauce will also be sold.

“The plan is to eventually open a restaurant in St. Charles Parish, but to keep the truck for

catering,” she said. “Our first day open was Good Friday, and it was a good first day for us. We’re super excited ... we’re ready. We’re taking the truck as a learning experience so we can expand to the restaurant.”

Boot T’s Seafood truck is located at 14252 Hwy 90 in Boutte. could gather, honor and remember its many great veterans.

“People would ask me, ‘VJ., why is this so important?’ It’s so important for many reasons,” he said. “It’s a tribute for the many men and women who served our country. It’s a recognition of their sacrifice and dedication and a symbol of our appreciation. It serves as a reminder that we must never forget the cost of war and that our freedom has been hard won and at great cost. And it serves as a source of inspiration for future generations.”

He recalled that when the first Veterans Appreciation Day of his tenure was held, only 10 people attended. But on this day, numerous residents – including veterans of all military branches were on hand to show support. Parish President Matthew Jewell introduced several guest speakers prior to the day’s ribbon cutting. The U.S. Marine Corps Band played the U.S. Armed Forces Medley as veterans of each branch stood to receive recognition.

Jewell said this day was a very proud one for St. Charles Parish. He quoted John F. Kennedy who once said, “As we express our gratitude, we must never forget that the highest appreciation is not to utter words, but to live by them.”

“Today, we are not just uttering words of gratitude. We are living by our commitment to the veterans of St. Charles Parish and we’ve created a place to memorialize those who laid down their lives to preserve our freedoms,” Jewell said, also calling the memorial plaza “a testament to their unwavering commitment and a way for us to honor our veterans and remember their service.”

The venue honors five branches of the Armed Forces with granite statues. It houses just the second Gold Star Families Memorial Monument in the state of Louisiana, providing a place of permanence for Gold Star Families to gather.

The term Gold Star family is a modern reference that comes from the Service Flag. These flags or banners were first flown by families during World War I. The flag included a blue star for every immediate family member serving in the armed forces of the United States, during any period of war or hostilities in which the armed forces of the United States were engaged. If that loved one died, the blue star was replaced by a gold star. This allowed members of the community to know the price that the family had paid in the cause of freedom.

Gold Star Spouses Day is recognized every April 5 – fittingly, the day of the memorial plaza ribbon cutting.

The family of Lance Cpl. Lyndon Hue of Des Allemands was one of the major contributors to making the plaza a reality. Hue, a Marine Corps. veteran, was killed in the terrorist bombing in Beirut on Oct. 23, 1983. Hue’s sister, Jill Stoltz, was among the featured guest speakers on the day. Hue was one of eight siblings and he and Stoltz’s family was a military one, with their father a Korean War veteran as well.

“I can’t even tell you how overwhelmed and honored I am and what this means to us as a family,” she said. “The value of this tribute is priceless ... for us, the house we grew up in ... it no longer exists, it’s a lot in Des Allemands. This is our legacy ... our way of paying it forward.”

Also among guest speakers were parish Councilwoman Marilyn Bellock and Councilman Nicky Dufrene. Bellock is a Coast Guard veteran while Dufresne served in the Army and is a Desert Storm and Desert Shield veteran.

“(Members of the military) represent every corner of our country and every shade of humanity, all forged into one common service ... myself being a veteran, I thank you from the bottom of my heart,” Bellock said.

Dufrene spotlighted families of veterans.

“To me, we need to be proud of and celebrate veteran families. When you’re in the military, you know where you are at night, you know where you’re sleeping, but (family members) don’t,” he said.

When St. Pierre stepped before the microphone, he gave a heartfelt speech that few, if anyone, will soon forget.

A Purple Heart recipient, St. Pierre recollected the emotional time he experienced when visiting the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C. and finding the names of his fellow platoon members on the wall. St. Pierre was shot and wounded on May 14, 1968, a day three soldiers close with him

were killed.

“I realized that only through the grace of God that my name isn’t on that wall,” St. Pierre said.

He said he cried through memories that flooded back of his fellow soldiers and, while doing so, was comforted by a woman who approached him.

“I felt a hand on my shoulder and she told me, ‘it’s OK. It’s OK. I understand,’” St. Pierre said, noting he realized when he looked for her a few minutes later to thank her, she was nowhere to be found.

“When I looked back, I realized ... that was an angel that God sent me to get through that moment,” he said.

“We don’t go to war because we love to fight. (Soldiers) go for something greater than themselves and because they want to protect their nation.”

Gros previously served with the SCPSP’s special response team and currently serves on the agency’s honor guard. Gros serves on numerous committees within the department, and Sheriff Greg Champagne said Gros has been instrumental in securing past grant funding for agency project purchases.

With his career spanning decades, Gros has seen many things change and evolve in his profession.

“From an enforcement and training point of view, technology has drastically changed our approach to policing and training,” he said. “On the policing side for example, we now have the benefit of body cameras, in-car cameras, and in-car computers that all provide the

individual officers’ ability to provide a faster and more efficient means to serve the public, evidence documentation, and digital analysis that assists in the resolutions of calls for service.”

On the training side, Gros said law enforcement can use technological advances to help shape future training programs to address the needs of today’s modern officers.

Tigers rally past Wildcats

Theriot, Harding waged pitcher's duel in rivalry classic

A tense pitcher's duel came down to the final at-bat of the day Tuesday – one wouldn't expect or hope for anything less in the heated Hahnville/Destrehan rivalry.

Sam Simoneaux scored the game-winning run on a wild pitch to walk it off for Hahnville, which captured a 2-1 victory over the visiting Wildcats. Simoneaux singled to lead off the bottom of the seventh, reached second on a misplayed ball and was bunted over to third by Jake Risinger to set up the winning run.

The opportunity was there in large part via a sterling game on the mound from Talan Theriot, who struck out 11 batters against just one walk. He allowed one unearned run on five hits.

It was just enough to survive a very strong game by Destrehan's starter, Brycen Harding, who struck out eight and walked none in 5.1 innings. He allowed one earned run on five hits.

"Brycen Harding pitched a helluva game," said HHS head coach Jared Vial, who was an assistant coach with Destrehan prior to taking the helm at

HHS. It's a unique experience for me – I've gotten to coach every kid who stepped on the field today. Seeing Brycen do what he did is a testament to his hard work. As for Talan, it's exactly what he's done all year. He laid it all on the line for Hahnville High School today. The success he had comes as no surprise at all."

For Hahnville (18-11), the win was huge for momentum in more than one

way. It represented not only a win over an archrival and a 20-plus win team for power points and playoff positioning, but Destrehan entered the game scalding hot: Hahnville's win snapped what was an 11-game Destrehan winning streak.

"Destrehan's a great team," Vial said. "We looked at this as a must win, and that we needed to tackle this game head

on. Our guys went out with something to prove. We had a good team meeting before this game and talked about where we want to set the bar for our program. This is a program that can compete for a state championship – it's getting them into that mindset that they can do it."

That said, Destrehan (21-9) will maintain at least a share of the District 7-5A championship and may finish alone in first place if Thibodaux defeats co-leader Central Lafourche Thursday. The Wildcats have won 14 of 18 and the four losses have each come by just one run.

While the Tigers and Wildcats rematch today (Thursday, April 13), Tuesday's game was the only game to count in the district standings, with today's matchup strictly for power points – and a lot of pride.

Hahnville has also generated a world of momentum of late, winners of eight of their last 10.

Aidan Machado led the HHS offense, going 3-for-3 with a run scored. Jaden Rosales went 2-for-3 with a game-tying RBI.

Mimosa celebrates 54th anniversary

The Mimosa Swim and Racquet Club will celebrate its 54 th anniversary this year as it launches its spring 2023 membership drive.

Membership is available to St. Charles Parish families looking for an affordable way to beat the heat at the club’s pool facilities, , located on 502 River Oaks Drive in Luling, this summer and fall.

As the oldest remaining swim club in the parish, the nonprofit organization is

operated just as it was five decades ago, still volunteer funded and led.

Membership in the club includes access to its signature L-shaped Olympic style swimming pool, diving area, kiddie pool, concession stand, tennis courts, special events and family activities, along with its own swimming team – the Mimosa Dolphins. The pool also serves as the official Hahnville High School swim team practice facility.

“I love the Mimosa Swim and Racquet

Club – not only as president, but as a parent and community member,” said Mimosa president Alison Miller. “It’s a community in itself, and there’s nothing out there quite like it in St Charles Parish.”

The club offers swimming lessons to both members and non-members each swim season from

Red Cross-certified lifeguards, as well as swimming lane hours for members that want to get in a morning swim. Mimosa Swim and Racquet Club features movie night events throughout the summer.

“The Mimosa Swim Club gives St. Charles Parish kids somewhere to go during the summer to be with their friends,” Miller said of the organization she now leads. “They’re going to have fun, and they’re going to learn how to swim well in a safe environment, tucked away in our little corner at the end of River Oaks Drive in Luling.”

For older adults in their golden years looking to stay in shape, the club supplies a low-impact water aerobics program run by aerobics instructor and charter member Regina Allemand.

“It’s good for the joints, and you don’t really sweat unless it gets really, really hot, Allemand joked, speaking of the regular water aerobics class she teaches. “It’s good exercise and good fun.”

Founded in the spring of 1969, the Mimosa Swim and Racquet Club was the brainchild of a core group of Luling

residents living in the Mimosa neighborhood. The founding members saw a need for St. Charles Parish children and families in the area to have their own local pool to cool off in during the hottest Louisiana months of the year. Going door to door, the group raised funds to start and build the club from individual families in the area. Each member becomes a stock-holding owner after joining.

“There were several families within a three-block radius that decided to try and get this going, and Mrs. Stern, who owned a mom and pop convenience store at the front of River Oaks Drive, donated the land to us to have a place to swim and play tennis,” Allemand said. “My parents were member number three on the club’s stock certificates.”

Allemand, 62, grew up on River Oaks Drive, where the Mimosa Swim and Racquet Club is located. She has served in multiple positions at the club over the years, working as a lifeguard during her teenage years, then later serving as both a board member and president of the club.

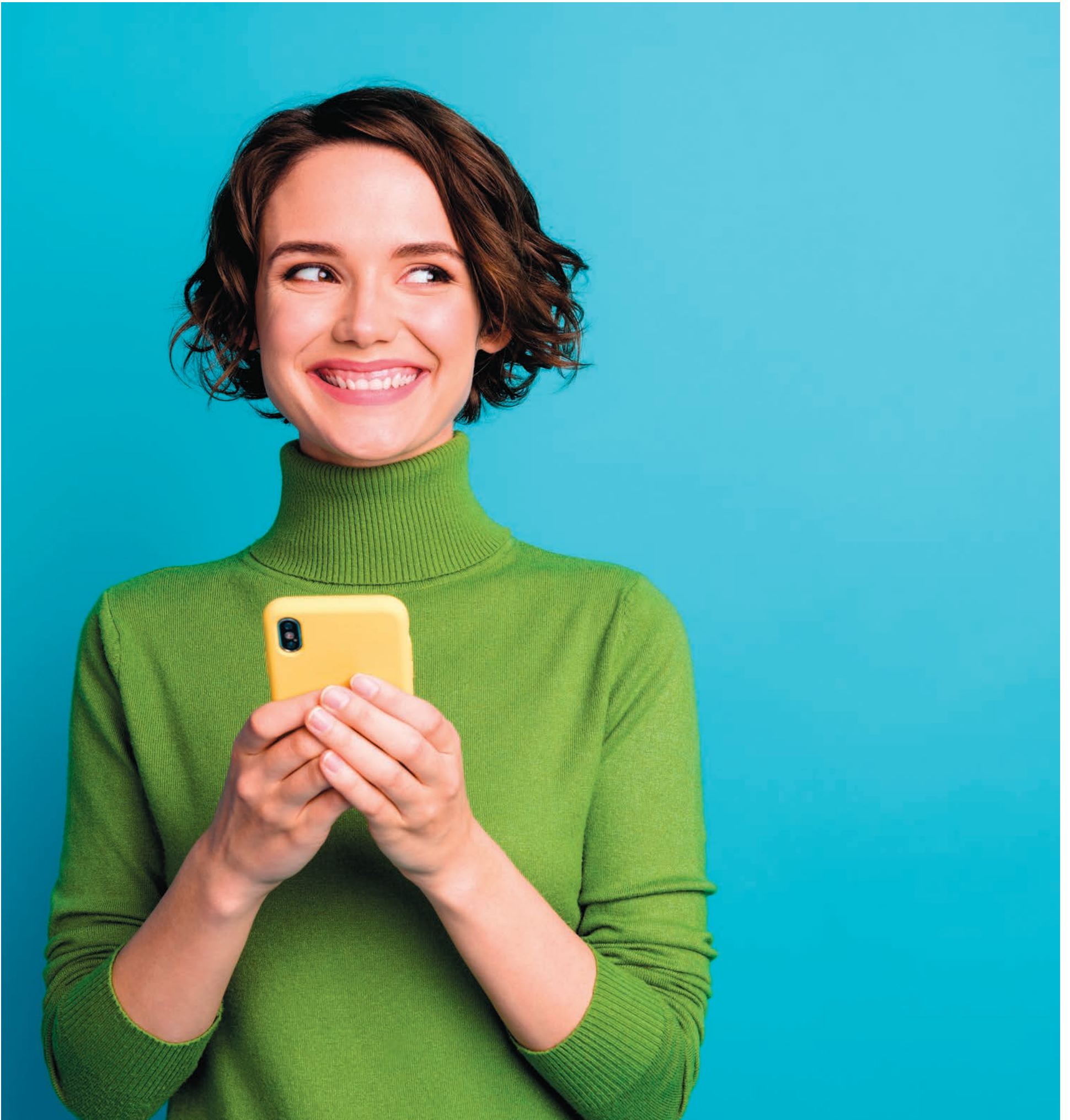

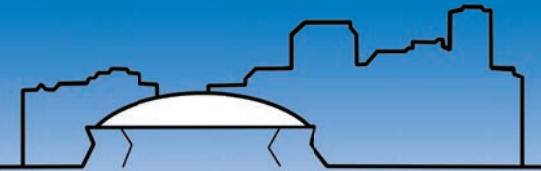

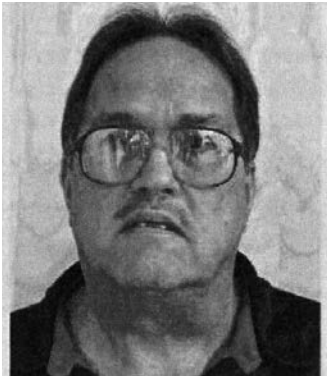
