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Perfection DHS student gets 36 on ACT

When Destrehan High School junior Ava Rockefeller went online to check her ACT score, she didn't expect much – she felt like the testing day wasn't her best effort.

That thought was one of the few things Rockefeller's had wrong recently, as it turns out.

The test score she discovered waiting for her was a 36 – the highest composite score one can reach, and one attained by just 1 percent of all students.

The ACT composite score is an average of one's four section scores for English, math, reading and science. Thirty-six is the highest number that can be reached in each subject – essentially, it's a perfect score.

Rockefeller didn't see it coming. "I thought I would do really bad on it," she said. "I really wasn't expecting anything great."

In fact, while e-mails had gone out to students to inform them of their score, she hadn't received one. She went to check online because she was a bit bored – and found welcome news, to say the least.

"My dad wants to tell everyone all about it," Rockefeller said of her proud papa. "He always finds a way to fit that in."

This wasn't her first high score. As a seventh grader, she scored a 23. And on a more recent attempt, she hit another exceptional mark of 34.

"I never expected to move up from that ... it's a pretty cool feeling," she said.

Rockefeller credited the teachers who guided her through ACT preparation since her freshman year.

"All that instructional time for all

As a part of the nationwide event, Ellen joined more than 40 other people across the country who have been impacted by lung cancer to ask lawmakers to support \$51 billion in research funding for the National Institutes of Health (NIH),

A toddler with local ties is one step closer to a cure after battling a rare medical condition.

Joshua "Miller" Gamberi Jr. was diagnosed in November with a severe combined immunodeficiency known as MHC Class II deficiency or Bare Lymphocyte Class II. Just seven months old at the time, Gamberi became one of less than 200 people worldwide to be diagnosed with the extremely rare condition.

Ali Fonseca, who lives in Luling, is a cousin to Gamberi's mother. She said the family was told by doctors that the only permanent treatment for the baby was a bone marrow transplant, with

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St. Charles Borromeo to break ground on plaza that will tell 300-year-old story of church

St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Church’s tri-centennial celebration will continue Saturday at 3 p.m. at a special unveiling and ground-breaking ceremony.

Mary Schmidt is a SCB historical committee member who has been working on events to celebrate the 300th year of the church. She said on Saturday the church will break ground on a commemorative memorial called Ascension Plaza - a permanent structure built to tell the story of 300 years of the Catholic church on the German Coast, the churches built there, the 38 pastors who have lead the church, the timeline that captures the church’s history, and the importance of the Mississippi River.

“We are a proud parish because as we are deeply diving into our history for this year ... there were so many times our parish really should have just ceased to exist,” she said, explaining that early on in the creation of the church parish the church withstood settlers who died, hurricanes, fires, and disagreements between a bishop and trustees. “Here we are now a thriving and vibrant parish ... clearly the hand of God is there ... no doubt.”

Schmidt said that now in its 300th year, the church gets to create what will become our history going forward.

“Fr. Mixie has approved a tricentennial commemorative memorial to represent our first 300 years, built to last the next 300,” she said. “Parishioner architect, John Campo, designed the monument to be built just inside the cemetery entrance on the exact spot the red church oak stood before it split in half and fell. This permanent structure will represent 300 years of the Catholic church.”

The plaza’s construction is set to be finished

in November, just in time for the large tricentennial event being planned.

Attendees of Saturday’s ceremony will also see the unveiling and dedication of an installation of Father Paret’s watercolors around the Little Red Church replica.

Paret was the pastor of the Little Red Church for 21 years before, during, and after the Civil War. He captured life at the time through journaling and painting watercolor landscapes. In 1987, 53 of Paret’s watercolors were discovered — still bound in their original sketchbook — among his personal effects. A book, Plantations by the River published by LSU Press, contains 28 of those watercolors.

Schmidt said it is difficult to overstate the historical significance of Paret’s sketchbook of landscape watercolors to the history of St.

Service industry workers hard to find, local businesses say

While the unemployment rate in St. Charles Parish holds steady at the lowest number in years, local business owners and managers say they continue to have trouble finding people to work at their establishments.

Recent data from the Louisiana Department of Labor shows that the unemployment rate for the month of January 2023 was 3.2 percent. The rate was identical to 2022's overall unemployment rate in the parish.

That percentage dropped a miniscule amount to 3.1 percent in February.

In contrast, the overall unemployment rate in St. Charles Parish for 2019 was 4.1 percent. Unemployment in the parish climbed to 8.4 percent in 2020, and in 2021 the rate dropped to 5.5 percent.

Ramzi Emad, who manages Royal Greek & Lebanese Café in Destrehan,

Hahnville native enjoys role in White House

Thea Johnson Williams' morning commute may look similar to millions of other people's, but it ends at one of the most recognizable places in the world – the White House.

Williams, a Hahnville native, currently serves as the deputy director of Legislative Affairs at the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy. In this role she is responsible for the office's legislative strategies that support the benefits of science and technology to advance energy securities, environmental quality, and public health.

She said the job is two things – both a dream and a product of a lot of hard work.

Williams joined the Executive Office of the President after serving in several senior level positions in the environmental arena. These roles included congressional liaison on environmental research and science policy, special assistant to the deputy director of the National Superfund Program, and environmental health scientist developing the science to support environmental regulations at the United States Environmental Protection Agency in D.C. She earned undergraduate and graduate degrees from Xavier and Tulane before later earning a law degree.

"I always tell the story about how my grandfather died of lymphoma," she said. "Being from Cancer Alley, I always kind of felt a personal charge that what I did for work should benefit the people of that area in terms of that there is safe air, a safe environment, safe water, and safe land to live."

Williams' current job keeps her far away from St. Charles Parish most of the time, but she said she visits the area about four or five times a year.

"I miss everything about St. Charles Parish," she said. "I miss the people. I miss my friends. I miss my family. My husband always tells me that he thinks I turn into a different person when the plane lands in Louisiana."

Williams said her parents, Dr. Frank Johnson and Shirline Smith Johnson, are proud of her in her White House role – even though she hid it from them for a while.

"I held it a little close for a while, but then I needed security clearance for the White House," she said, explaining that when security clearance is needed an investigation is usually launched and close family members are contacted. "That's

those years and leading up to it definitely helped a ton,” she said. “And besides the actual subjects, you have to learn to do well with time.”

Indeed, with a timed test, finding the right answers is just part of the equation – finding them quickly is just as vital.



“You learn different strategies. Reading passages in a different order or in a way that works better for you ... different things work for different people depending on how you test,” Rockefeller said.

Practice makes perfect, of course – literally, in this case.

“We practiced multiple times a week,” she said.

This time brought even a bit of a curveball in that the test was taken online, whereas she was used to the traditional method.

“I had to edit a few of my strategies, especially on the math section,” Rockefeller said. “English and reading I got through quickly, but math and science I felt like I kind of had to rush through.”

Rockefeller is planning on applying to Rice where she would like to study architecture. She also has interest in Georgia Tech, Louisiana Tech and Virginia Tech – one would think the interest will be quite mutual given her academic and testing accomplishments.

Architecture is something that’s caught her interest for awhile.

“I’ve been in talented art and I’m in AP art now,” she said. “And I’ve always been pretty good at math. So it combines those two areas. Plus, outside of school, I’m

always noticing different pieces of architecture. I think it’s something I’d enjoy.”

She serves as secretary of the National Honor Society at Destrehan and president of the school’s film club.

\$11.6 billion in funding for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and to support and protect Medicaid.

“Late in 2013, 930 miles apart, I sat on the other line of a phone call with my mom that changed our lives,” Siedel said. “My mom had just been diagnosed with stage 4 lung cancer. I sat there that night, on the phone with her, trying to calm her down, to think positive. We were going to fight.”

“During the next year, we laughed, we cried, we fought over silly things. She moved in with my then fiancé (and now husband) and myself, and we resumed a normal life. The staff at the hospital helped us apply



for healthcare coverage, which was the only way she was able to afford the very expensive lung cancer treatments. That coverage gave us an additional seven months of a normal-ish life.”

Those seven months came in addition to an initial prognosis of six months to live, and after battling out of a coma that she’d fallen into just as Siedel moved back to Louisiana from Chicago. Siedel called the extra time she was given with her mother “amazing” and something she is truly grateful for.

“Then one day, it wasn’t normal. She went quickly, which when we look back at things, was better than any other alternative. In the end, she knew we were there, saw a picture of her grandsons, felt us hold her hand. We had gotten a full year together,” Siedel said.

Following her mother’s death, emotions began flooding in.

“There are so many things that she isn’t going to be here for - my wedding, watching her grand kids grow up, holding my hand as I give birth. And every day I wish I had more time – more time to laugh, cry, fight, hold her, hug her, kiss her,” Siedel said. “So that is why I feel it so necessary to (participate in) Advocacy Day. I am her voice and that of thousands of others who can’t be here with us. I am her legacy, and I will be an advocate and champion every day so that, hopefully, another family doesn’t have to experience that loss.”

Siedel has also lost two friends to lung cancer since her mother’s passing, both in their 30s, and two other family members have also been diagnosed, further fortifying her drive to be an advocate.

“It’s the No. 1 killer of both men and women – lung cancer,” Siedel said.

During Advocacy Day, Siedel met with representatives

from Sen. Bill Cassidy’s, Sen. John Neely Kennedy’s and Rep. Troy Carter’s offices to share her personal experience with lung cancer and explain why investments in public health, research funding and quality and affordable healthcare are important to her.

There’s always strength in numbers – and personal stories and accounts, Siedel believes, goes much further than showing statistics alone.

“Anyone can show a graph, but when you put a face to a problem, it makes people think, ‘Hey, she looks like my cousin, or my aunt, or your mom looks like my mom,’ and you can relate. It gives a human side of an issue that’s so broad in our country”

The American Lung Association launched LUNG FORCE Advocacy Day in 2016 to ask members of Congress to support robust, sustainable and predictable federal funding increases for lung cancer research, prevention and quality and affordable healthcare. As a part of Advocacy Day, LUNG FORCE Heroes have succeeded in helping increase NIH lung cancer research funding by over 115 percent. Since 2016, more than 50 new therapies have been approved by the FDA to treat lung cancer—giving more hope to those impacted by this disease. In 2022, Heroes successfully urged Congress to extend funding for tax credits so more than three million Americans were able to keep affordable healthcare coverage through the federal and state marketplaces.

that a transplant will cure him,” Fonseca said. “He had his first transplant on Valentine’s Day, and then the day after the whole family came down with COVID. Doctors now believe the medicine they gave him for COVID canceled out the transplant.”

Gamberi received a second transplant at the end of March.

“Everything seems to be going in the right direction now,” Fonseca said.

Fonseca works at The Basketry in Luling, where a blood drive was held Saturday in Gamberi’s honor.

“I’ve been there for about eight years, and as soon as they announced that the new transplant was coming and that there was a need for blood the first thing I thought of is that our community in St. Charles Parish always rallies around

people,” Fonseca said, adding that everyone at The Basketry was on board to help make the blood drive a success.

The drive included raffles to incentivize participation, and Fonseca said any collections not used by Gamberi would be given to someone else.

“There’s a ton of people who need blood,” she said. “Anything to help him and others and bring people together is what I’m all about.”

Gamberi’s journey can be followed on a Facebook page titled “Miller’s Match.” Gamberi, who lives on the Northshore, just turned one.

Fonseca said anyone between the ages of 18-40 who would be willing to sign up to be a blood marrow donor for Gamberi – or whoever they may match with - can text MILLERSMATCH to 61474.

perfect fit ... you get to tell the story and talk about it and write about it and interview lots of people.”

While his assignment at KALB will start with him creating more general news pieces, Vedros said he would love to eventually cross over into sports reporting and broadcasting.

how the cat got out of the bag ... but they’re proud. Every day is an awesome experience you walk onto the White House campus.”

Williams is a product of Killona Elementary School, Lakewood Jr. High, and Hahnville High School. She said one of the things that impacted her life’s journey the most is something right here in St. Charles Parish.

“It’s small but I think it’s big,” she explained. “I never went to daycare in the summer. My grandmother watched us while my parents worked. They had the St. Charles Parish bookmobile that would come every other week and I became an avid reader and an avid learner. I still read way more than I watch TV ... significantly more. I think that shaped me.”

Williams said she hopes her life’s journey can serve as an important example.

“I think my whole White House experience ... just the fact that I am here ... it just proves that it’s an achievable goal,” she said. “It brings that ‘can do’ spirit. I’m just a regular person. It goes to show that you don’t have to be from expansive means to achieve things and be a part of something larger than yourself and bring good to the American people.”

Lady Tigers fall in dramatic playoff slugfest, 10-9

Hahnville, Ponchatoula combine for six home runs, HHS nearly rallied from 8-0 deficit

The ball launched off the bat of Lauren Crochet, rocketing toward the center-field wall, and a comeback that seemed almost unthinkable just two innings earlier was on the verge of completion for the Hahnville Lady Tigers.

But the ball came up just short, caught at the warning track by Ponchatoula, and one out later the Green Wave had survived a furious comeback.

No. 17 Ponchatoula earned a 10-9 victory at No. 16 Hahnville in Monday's Division I non-select playoff matchup, advancing to round two to face off with No. 1 St. Amant.

"Tough one ... that's a tough one," said Hahnville head coach Todd Schulz. "It's like I told them, there aren't a lot of words for it ... we just didn't get it done today. It wasn't our time."

The game was an offensive showcase, with a combined six home runs between the two teams. Ponchatoula led 10-3 entering the bottom of the 6th inning, but a pair of three-run bombs by Brianna Keller and Karli Bourg over the next two innings cut the seven-run Wave lead to just one.

Keller finished the day with a 2-for-3, two run, three RBI line while Bourg went 3-for-4 with two runs and three RBIs for Hahnville (17-14). Brazzi Jacob ignited the Tiger offense, which struggled early, with her own three-run home run. She went 2-for-4 with two runs and three RBIs as well.

But their power was matched by the Ponchatoula trio of Abby Dagro, Rae'el Wheat and Christina Curtis, each of whom homered in the game. Wheat went 2-for-4 with three RBIs and two runs. Dagro was 2-for-4 with three RBIs and a run, while Curtis went 1-for-4 with two RBIs and a run scored.

normal ... we're just trying to go gap to gap. It's how you be successful in softball, baseball too, but especially softball – move the ball gap to gap. Top to bottom, we don't have a weak spot in our lineup ... you either have speed or you have pop. Our girls have been shining," said Ponchatoula head softball coach Jeremy Harper.

In the fifth inning, it seemed that Ponchatoula might finish the matter early by a 10-run rule – the Wave posted a dominant start to the game and led 8-0 after the top of the fifth inning, the two of those runs coming on Wheat's two-run shot to left field.

Hahnville wasn't about to let its season end without a fight. Keller singled to lead off the bottom of the fifth, while Adeline Bertrand doubled to set the table for Jacob, who blasted a ball to center that left the yard and put HHS on the board, making it 8-3.

Ponchatoula came through for what ultimately became a critical answer. Brianna Chavarria singled to lead off the sixth, then with one out, Curtis socked

a home run to center that pushed Ponchatoula ahead 10-3.

Bourg and Amberly Dempster led off the next inning with back-to-back singles, and with one out Keller drove the ball out the park for Hahnville's second home run of the day, making it 10-6.

Hahnville's Kloe White retired the side in order in the top of the seventh, including two strikeouts, giving the Tigers one last chance – and the crowd a thrilling ending.

The Tigers had one out when Jacob singled to get things started. Jenna Cancienne was hit by a pitch, then Bourg slammed a home run to left that brought the crowd to its feet.

Schulz said as the game went on, the Tigers were more and more aggressive early in the count and it paid dividends.

"I think we started picking up on the change ... she would get ahead on that. We capitalized on it and got some big hits," he said. "We just needed one more."

Dempster reached on an error, bringing the game-winning run to the plate. Crochet made strong contact and

nearly lifted it out – but ultimately, reliever Grace Schwaibold notched the day's final two outs to earn the save.

All season, after wins and after losses, Schulz comes to a familiar note about his players – he was proud to have a team of fighters. Though it came in a loss, Monday's game showed the truth in that belief.

"I think the score speaks for itself – to be down 10-3 entering the sixth and to end 10-9, it goes to show," Schulz said. "The energy in the dugout was there all day, even from the girls who don't get as much playing time, they just bring the energy. We feed off it."

"This game is so much more than softball. It's nice when you have seniors who are going to go on and play college ball, but at the end of the day, you want them to leave as better people. And the core we have ... this is my class, the group that came in as little biddy freshmen when I arrived here. They've grown up into women ... I'm proud and I think the sky is the limit for them, because they're going to become something big."

The Tigers rallied from a 2-0 deficit after coming back from losing 1-0 in its previous clash with DHS. “This team is relentless,” said Hahnville head coach Jared Vial. “They take things day by day, game by game, inning by inning, and days like this are a testament to their hard work.”

Indeed just as, Destrehan had two days earlier, it took an early lead. This time, Brady Mire, Shane Lee and Walker Dew each got

the fourth on Morales’ solo home run to center, cutting Destrehan’s lead to 2-1.

The Tigers tied the game in the top of the fifth after Truman Moyer doubled home Bennett Naquin.

Then in the sixth, Morales and Rosales drilled back to back doubles, the second plating the go-ahead run to make it a 3-2 HHS lead.

“I was looking first pitch, anything down the middle,” Rosales said on his go-ahead double. “I got what I was looking for ... we’re going into the playoffs pretty hyped.

But DHS was certainly going to fight to make it a reality. Bradly Hubbard drew a leadoff walk. Chauvin got two straight

outs, but then hit Shane Lee with a pitch to bring the tying run to the plate. But Chauvin got Walker Dew to flyout to end the game.

“We talked (on the mound) about staying composed in the moment,” Chauvin said. “I think I probably got a little too excited at times today, but it was a lot of fun.”

Just as Talan Theriot had thrown a gem in Hahnville’s 2-1 win over Destrehan, Chauvin

showed why he’s a big game pitcher.

“He’s an ace. The bottom line is we’ve got 1A and 1B,” Vial said. “The state doesn’t know Chauvin and that game shows what he’s capable of. He’s worked hard all year and deserves it.”

Hahnville (19-11) has won nine of its last 11 as it turns its attention to the playoffs.

Destrehan (23-11) entered last week with 11 straight victories, but Hahnville was ready to end the run. Destrehan coach Chris Mire said that while it’s tough to lose to a rival, the team could not afford to allow its play to fall off with the playoffs impending.

“It doesn’t hurt more because it’s Hahnville. It hurts because we’re not playing the quality of baseball we need to play. Every game is a learning experience, so do we just flush this? No, that’s not what we need to do. We need to look in the mirror and we need to examine why we’re not getting the job done ... this game

doesn’t affect what we want to do in the playoffs, but how we play certainly will. And we played less than our best, when you do that you’re subject to lose.”

The win propelled Hahnville into the host role for the opening round of the playoffs, as the No. 16 seeded Tigers host No. 17 Fontainebleau for a three-game series. HHS will host game one today (April 20) at 4 p.m., while on Saturday the teams will play a double-header in the best of three - game two set for 1 p.m. and game three (if necessary) set for 4 p.m.

Destrehan, which despite the losses to HHS clinched the District 7-5A championship, earned the No. 14 seed and will host No. 19 Ruston.

DHS - which earned back to back wins over Northlake Christian to bounce back and cap the regular season, will host game one at 4 p.m. Friday, game two at 11 a.m. Saturday and game three (if necessary) at 2 p.m. Saturday.

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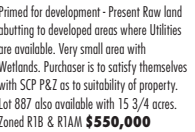
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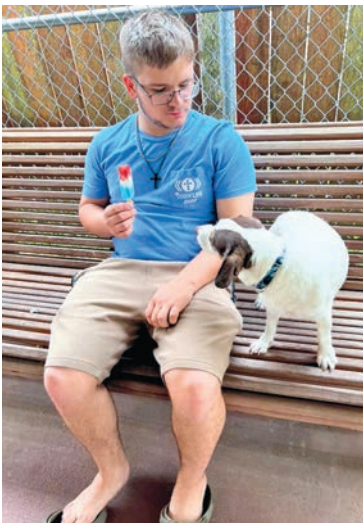

gardeners should pick a location that gets direct sun for most of the day, as those conditions will trigger heavier bloom in April.

“Pick a place that can stay moist for most of the year, and a spot that will allow the plant to spread,” he said. “Soil high in organic matter and nutrient availability will also encourage heavier flowering. Plant potted irises and rhizomes just below the soil surface in your desired location and keep them watered during their active growing season. Take note that irises will spread in the direction they face.”

LoCoco said planters should apply a two-inch layer of mulch to plants to prevent sun-scalding and help keep moisture in.

“Typically, water is plentiful during this time of the year and that is what makes them such a great candidate for our gardens,” he said. “Fertilize your Louisiana irises with an all-purpose fertilizer between September and February. Follow the label recommendations for application rates.”

The LSU AgCenter Extension Office of St. Charles is offering a Louisiana Master Gardener course to residents of St. Charles, St. James, and St. John the Baptist parishes this fall. The course will run for 12 weeks and cover essential gardening information and provide participants with volunteer opportunities to master their skills.

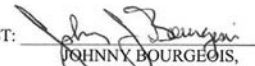

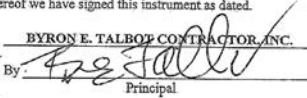

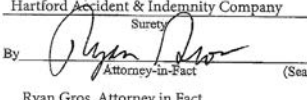

Request for Qualifications/Proposals: The Port of South Louisiana (“POSL”) is currently seeking architectural and engineering services for an anticipated capital project H₂Public Private Partnerships Hydrogen Fueling Barge (“H₂P3”). The Port of South Louisiana (POSL) is a political subdivision of the state of Louisiana.
