The filing reflects an earned return on common equity ("EROE") for the 2022 Evaluation Period/Test Year of 8.33%, which is below the approved FRP midpoint and, without consideration of the cap, would result in an increase to Base Rider FRP Revenue of approximately \$70.7 million. However, after application of the cap approved LPSC Order No. U-35566, Base Rider FRP Revenues are only being increased by \$4.9 million. After accounting for all components of FRP Revenue, including amounts inside the bandwidth and subject to the cap as well as amounts which are adjusted outside of the bandwidth, the net increase is \$85.2 million.
