6-year-old Boutte girl battles challenges after abuse

At six years old, Damani Spears is bubbly and charismatic. She will go up to new people and ask, “Do you want to be my friend?” She loves to sing and dance. She has also lived a nightmare. “She’s dealt with more in six years than I have in 73,” said Spears’ great-grandmother Artemise Jones of Boutte. In October of 2021, Spears suffered third degree burns, the result of severe abuse: scalding hot water was poured on her, and her organs began to fail. “She was in renal failure,” said Jones. “She was about to die. At first, (the

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Parish firefighters raise concerns over budget strains, staffing issues

When St. Charles Parish officials recently announced it would be reducing residents’ tax rates by approximately 5.3 mills, the news of tax reduction was welcome for most except for local area firefighters, who expressed concerns this year in council meetings on how their fire services budgets might be affected.

While parish officials assured local governmental departments dependent on millage income their budgets would see increases rather than decreases from new industrial tax revenue, fire services’ budget concerns remained. Strained by funding issues brought on by inflation, equipment cost replacement and staffing problems, St. Charles Parish area fire service members discussed their concerns with the Herald Guide this week.

Like many other local businesses and governmental entities, St. Charles Parish firefighters say some of their greatest hurdles in the current environment stems from staffing.

Recruiting new volunteers to run local fire departments has become more difficult in recent years for St. Charles Parish fire services,

so much so that the Hahnville Volunteer Fire Department has recently resorted to filling spots previously manned by volunteers with paid positions.

“Our biggest challenges are recruitment and retention of volunteers,” Armond Bourque, St. Charles Firemen’s Association president, a local 30-year firefighting veteran, said. “We have seen over the last 15-20 years a drop in volunteers with both parents now working to make ends meet.”

Lack of adequate funding for paid positions has also been a source of continued struggle

Crawfish and Chill to spice up Luling with second location

Marrero-based seafood restaurant Crawfish and Chill recently announced it planned to open a second location at 13899 River Road in Luling at the site of the former Sushi Café Japanese Restaurant, with an estimated opening date sometime around January 2024.

The new dine-in and carry out family-style restaurant will feature a similar menu as its sister Marrero location, offering fresh boiled seafood, fried seafood items, along with sandwiches, burgers and a number of entrée items. Co-owner Steve Allan, who has managed other local hospitality-related businesses for around five years, said the restaurant has a wide array of menu items, appealing to many different palates.

Their new restaurant will offer “crawfish, seafood balls, corn, potatoes, sausage, lobsters, crabs, blue crabs,” Allan said, as he quickly rattled off several of the restaurant’s popular menu items. “We also have pasta, wings, fish, shrimp, po’boys, shrimp and fish baskets.”

Co-owner Amin Thavata, 30,

also operates the hotel next door to the new location, and plans for this restaurant to be an complimentary addition to his burgeoning hospitality business.

Crawfish and Chill’s owners plan to open seven days per week similar to its Marrero location, with more specifics on operating hours to follow closer to opening. Allan said the new Luling location is part of the restaurant’s expansion plan, which has the

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St. Charles Parish voters invited to VFW-sponsored political forum ahead of October election

The Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post 3750 West St. Charles announced this week it will host a Community Open Forum event featuring many of this year’s St. Charles Parish political candidates at its location on 140 Angus Drive in Luling Tuesday, Sept. 26, with doors opening at 6 p.m.

Admission is free to the public, with organizers offering the event to registered St. Charles Parish voters as a way for locals to hear from most of the local political candidates ahead of the upcoming October election. The forum will begin 30 minutes after doors open.

“We’ve got a lot of races this year, and a lot of [this year’s] candidates will be there,” Bobby Lovergne, VFW Post 3750 Commander, said. “So, bring your questions and get them answered before the election starts.”

As in the past two Community Open Forums the VFW Post 3750 has sponsored, political candidates will each be given a set time to speak on their platform, later followed by question-and-answer periods where residents can submit questions to be answered by the candidates. To avoid redundancy, this year residents

will be asked to submit their questions via written form to an event moderator, who will then compile questions and pass them along to the candidates to be answered.

Lovergne mentioned most of the candidates in this year’s contested races have already confirmed attendance, including Parish President Matthew Jewell and challenger Dwayne LaGrange, two of the Clerk of Court candidates including

incumbent Lance Marino and challenger Nicky Dufrene, along with many of the various council member and council-at-large candidates from across the parish. Seating capacity of the venue is around 220 with available seats offered on a first-come, first-served basis, while concessions will be sold via a refreshment stand.

“It’s free to attend,” Lovergne said. “It’s a community service, to give everyone a better picture of who they are voting for and why they are voting for them.”

different expressions and voices.

Bella’s face resembles that of a cat, and her expressions and overall personality have especially been a hit with children, said Little Tokyo Chef Mickey Negara.

“It entertains the kids – they really like it,” Negara said. “Having it here has helped a lot, especially when we’re short staffed.”

Bella is programmed to know where each table is in the restaurant. She ensures food, dishes, napkins and other items are delivered efficiently. Her voice calls the table number and its exact arrival to the destination. When it arrives, it prompts customers to remove their food by flashing the lights on the tray.

All of it serves to lighten the load for the restaurant’s employees – Bella is an addition, not a means for subtraction. The robot accompanies waitstaff to the table and together, they form an effective and more efficient team. Naturally, there are no sick days for Bella – she’s there rain or shine.

When the addition of Bella was suggested to the Little Tokyo team, they agreed to take a look at it. It wasn’t a

slam dunk at first – there was a question of whether the utility would be worth the price.

“We thought it was pretty neat, but maybe too much money,” Negara said.

But a trial run was offered for Bella to join the staff for a couple of days.

“We tried it out and didn’t want to let it go,” Negara said with a smile. “Yeah, let’s keep it.”

It also served to add a bit of unique flavor to the restaurant’s new location at 13299 US Hwy. 90 after moving from its previous building on Hwy. 90.

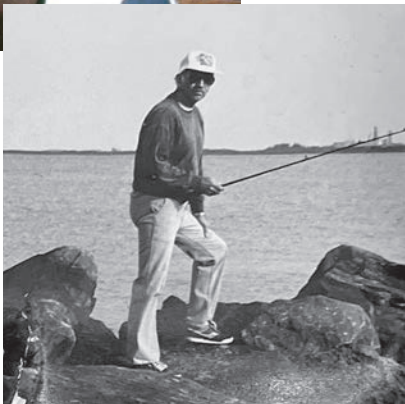

So, I said don’t worry about it, I’ll go take the picture and that was the first time I saw her.”

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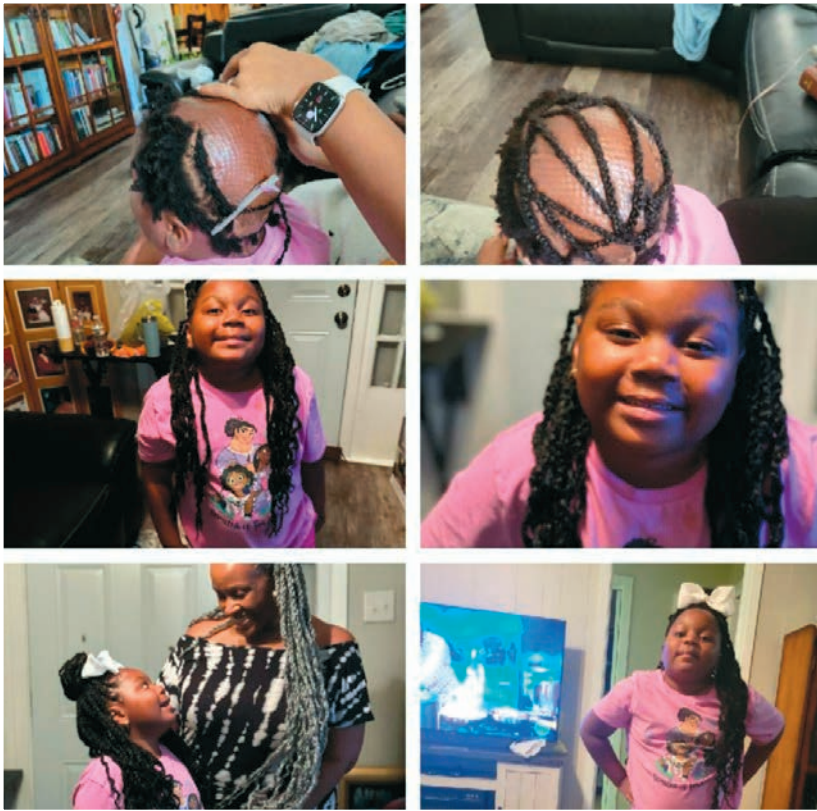

doctors) didn't realize she had been burned – they were focused on trying to save her life from organ failure. They didn't realize until they shaved her hair that she had third degree burns on her head and down her back.

"It's unthinkable to do that to a little girl ... I just thank God she's still living."

Jones, who now serves as Spears' guardian, said her granddaughter's physical recovery has gone well. But Jones said mentally, there are many hurdles that Spears encounters daily, and a primary focus has been finding her granddaughter the help she needs to deal with the emotional toll left upon her.

"She has good days and bad days. She has anger from it all, and also from being apart

from her mother, her sister and her brother – she's missing them. She's having nightmares and flashbacks of what was done to her. It's a lot for a 6-year-old to deal with. I've been trying to find the right mental health for her," Jones said.

Jones has been paying for Spears' mental therapy out of pocket, which hasn't been easy financially on a fixed income.

Furthermore, she's trying to find the right fit

for Spears' needs when it comes to that counseling.

"What we have is not sufficient – she's dealing with a lot, and it's not a textbook kind of situation," Jones said. "She's not the normal 6-year-old. A lot of professionals, they're dealing with what they know and what they're experienced with ... she's a traumatized, abused 6-year-old who's waking up in the middle of the night, having nightmares and flashbacks. I just want to find the right help for her."

Spears is faced with multiple surgeries, mental health counseling, keloid complications, and a life-long process in helping her to feel confident when she looks in the mirror.

Nikki Brown and Ny Brown of Destrehan have set up a GoFundMe page (titled 5-year-old suffers 3rd degree burns) to raise money to help offset these day-to-day costs. More than \$6K has been donated so far.

As much as anything, Jones said, suggestions of where to turn to find the best possible help for Spears would be helpful.

Nikki Brown echoed that in comments relayed through the fundraiser page.

"We are extremely proud of all of her progress but there is so much more that she will have to endure as she gets older," Brown said.

"We would really love to create a village for her in every area of hardship so that she has the best chance at having a close to normal life after all of the trauma she has endured ... No amount of prayer, sharing, and giving is too small to make an impact if there are any professionals of expertise in the areas that anyone would think beneficial to creating the best chance at a marvelous life - please don't hesitate to reach out to us."

for St. Charles Parish firefighters, an issue fire officials said has made it difficult for St. Charles Parish to compete with other nearby fire departments for qualified personnel.

“Due to lack of funding for career personnel, [we] cannot offer any type of benefits such as firefighter state pension or health insurance, only a paycheck,” Britton Allshouse, assistant fire chief, Hahnville VFD, said. “Constant turn-over rate due to this and lack of 24-sev-

[only to later have them] leave and go somewhere else.”

Just as inflation has affected most areas of the economy, inflation has hit St. Charles Parish firefighters in the equipment department particularly hard. Members of the Hahnville Fire Department say they currently have two fire units in service well beyond the National Fire Protection Association’s recommended 150,000-mile, 15-year lifespan, with one unit aged 32 years old and another unit aged at 28 years old.

Replacement of those units has been delayed in large part due to high replacement costs.

“Currently there is a two-year lead time for fire trucks after an order is placed, and around a 36 percent increase from past budget,” Allshouse said.

The cost of specialized firefighting personal protection equipment, which must be replaced every 10 years, has also gone up dramatically and is now double its previous cost, Allshouse said.

While much of the fire department’s funding troubles may have to be tackled by parish government leaders, Chief

Matthew Allshouse offered department consolidation as a possible solution that could help alleviate at least a portion of St. Charles Parish’s fire department staffing and resource woes.

“Within the fire service we need to look at combining resources and combining districts where it makes sense,” Matthew Allshouse suggested. “We have nine different [fire] districts operating as nine different businesses.”

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Hahnville returns home for 1st game of year at Tiger Stadium

Tigers, Panthers each in search of first victory

As often is the case with younger football teams, when Hahnville takes the field at Tiger Stadium Friday night to battle Northshore the focus will largely be on putting several different elements together for the first time.

In Week 1 of the season, Hahnville was able to move the football – but turnovers and penalties plagued the Tigers in a 41-21 loss to Newman. Likewise, in Week 2, Mandeville won by a significant margin, 31-5, but this time Hahnville cleaned up the mistakes – just three penalties and no turnovers. Instead, a 2-for-16 third down conversion rate plagued the team while Mandeville won the battle of field position in the kicking game.

But there are reasons for optimism – specifically this week. The Tigers (0-2) will play their first game of the season at home, set to take the field at Tiger Stadium after consecutive weeks on the road.

Sometimes, that home crowd is just the spark a young group of players need to get going.

“We’re excited to be home,” Hahnville head coach Daniel Luquet said. “We’ve learned

a lot on the road over the past two weeks, but at the same time a lot of things need to be cleaned up. We’re excited for the atmosphere and I’m looking forward to seeing a lot of our

guys have their first chance ever to play under the lights of Tiger Stadium on Friday night.

Like Hahnville, Northshore (0-2) saw a large senior class of departing players from its 2022 starting lineup and will be seeking its first win of the season. The Panthers lost games to Dutchtown, 35-16, and Salmen, 10-3, in Weeks 1 and 2. The Salmen game represented a rematch of the 2022 playoffs that saw Northshore defeat SHS 21-14 to advance.

Last season, Northshore went 8-4, earning the No. 13 seed. It ultimately fell in round two to fourth-seeded Southside in the Division I non-select state playoffs.

When Hahnville and Northshore met last season, it was a defensive battle, a 17-10 Hahnville win in Week 3 of 2022.

“They’re trying to find their footing, like us,” said Luquet. “They’re going to bring some good competition. We’ve got to worry about ourselves, though, and the things we need to get

better at. We need to put things together in all phases, play assignment football, start fast, finish fast and play physical. Some things aren’t going to go in our favor and when that happens, we have to rally together.”

Quarterback Donovan Weilbaeher, running back Brice Cherry and Kohen Rowbatham and wide receiver T.J. Coleman are among the Panthers’ key playmakers on offense.

“(Weilbaeher) is back for them from last year. He’s not afraid to push the ball downfield and he can run a bit,” Luquet said.

Linebacker Jackson Fugate and defensive lineman Shaun Collins are among those who key the Northshore defense.

Destrehan to host talented East Ascension

Spartans played Zachary, West Monroe prior to Wildcats matchup; DHS win streak up to 16

As Destrehan prepares to face East Ascension this Friday night, visitors to Wildcat Stadium shouldn't mistake EA's winless record through two weeks for weakness – knowing head coach Marcus Scott and his staff, the Wildcats surely won't.

The Spartans are nothing if not brave when it comes to schedule making. This matchup with Destrehan follows EA's games against Zachary in Week 1 and West Monroe in Week 2, 24-7 and 34-20 losses, respectively. Destrehan represents the third Spartan opponent ranked in the Top 10 of Class 5A.

The fact EA held its own at times during those matchups – or was willing to schedule them at all as part of an All-Star cast of pre-district foes – indicates a very formidable foe is headed to Destrehan this week.

"They're well coached and physical," said Destrehan head coach Marcus Scott. "There's a lot of size on their offensive line, a lot of size on their front seven and their whole secondary is strong. They've got talented guys and they know exactly how to use them."

Like last week, when Scott's team faced an Ehret squad guided by many of the coaches that were on his staff during his tenure at Ehret, Scott knows his counterpart at East Ascension well: EA

head coach Darnell Lee and Scott were teammates at McNeese State, playing in the same secondary for the Cowboys.

"We go way back," Scott said. "He played at East Ascension too, and he was a great player there. He knows what it takes to field a good defense. I know he'll have that team ready."

EA went 5-5 last regular season to earn the No. 15 seed in Division I non-select, posting a dominant 37-0 win over West Ouachita before bowing out in round two to Neville, 31-9.

The Spartans stumbled early and surged late, going 1-4 through the first half of the regular season, 4-1 thereafter. Destrehan delivered a knockout blow in the first half of its 2022 game at EA, an eventual 42-2 win, and the Spartans will no doubt be looking for a measure of payback this time around.

East Ascension (0-2) rallied last week after falling behind early by two touchdowns, trailing 20-13 to West Monroe after a Hudson Browning to Nigel Murphy touchdown pass just before halftime. But two unanswered fourth quarter touchdowns – including a defensive score – gave West Monroe the advantage for good.

Browning is East Ascension's first year starting quarterback. Brennon Thompson brings a great deal of speed to the wide receiver position. Tajh Washington is a powerful running back and he has a huge offensive line to pave

the way for him, with five players all over 290 pounds. Highlighting that bunch is left tackle Brysten Martinez, a 6-foot-5, 308-pound sophomore who is one of the most sought-after recruits in the nation.

"Some kids are just big – he's the total package," said Scott. "Big, athletic ... you watch him move around, come off the ball and drive block people. He's

really impressive to watch. He's one of the premier players in his class and in the nation."

Defensively, DB Thompson and DE Joseph Hodby are two-way players that bring speed and power. Defensive tackle Kelvin Gray leads the defensive front and is one of the team's cornerstone players in general.

Late fee deadline to enter the tournament will be Friday Sept. 15. The Captain’s Meeting – a pre-tournament general meeting open to the public - will take place Thursday, Sept. 21 at 6 p.m. at the Holiday Inn Express on 110 James Drive East in St. Rose.

Currently operating under new ownership, King Kat has run tournaments all over the United States for over 20 years with a focus specifically on catfish. Backed by national sponsors like Johnny Morris’ Bass Pro Shops and Cornfield Fishing Gear, King Kat’s current 2023 tournament lineup features around 23 different tournaments in locations like Weldon, Ill., Dayton, Tenn., Hickory, N.C. and Ridgeland, Miss.

“It’s all about catfish – the blue catfish, the flathead catfish and the channel

Tournament participants can qualify at the event for the right to later compete in King Kat’s national tournament which features a \$50,000 boat prize.

Unlike typical bass or crappie tournaments where teams often consist of just two fishermen in one bass boat, the King Kat Tournament Trail is known for attracting traveling family teams. A typical King Kat Tournament Trail team might consist of a grandfather, father and son, or a husband, wife and kids, all in the same boat, Peavy explained.

“We have a lot of locals that fish our events, but we also have between 15 to 18 teams that travel with us wherever we go across the United States,” said Peavy. “So, we do have some teams that - pretty much all they do - is catfish.”

Another feature of King Kat’s tournament is its companion Kids Fishing Rodeo, to be held at the Bonnet Carre Spillway at 101 Lower Guide Levee Road in Norco on Saturday, Sept. 23. The rodeo is geared for kids 15 and under, who can register for free starting at 8:15 a.m. that day, with fishing to take place between 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. Participants and their parents or guardians should bring their own fishing equipment to the event.

“We’re going to give away a bunch of rods and reels, bibles, shirts - all kinds of stuff,” Peavy said. “It’s not a tournament, it’s just something where we want the kids to come out and enjoy and get outdoors.”

Despite Lac Des Allemands being previously declared by the Louisiana Legislature as both the “Catfish Capital of the World” and later the “Catfish Capital of the Universe,” this will be King Kat’s first time hosting its catfish-centered fishing event in the Des Allemands area. After reminding Peavy of Des Allemands’ nicknames indicating catfish world dominance, the tournament official did not miss a beat in his response.

“We got some anglers that’s going to be there in two weeks, that’s going to be able to tell y’all whether that’s the truth or not,” Peavy said thru his native Carolina accent, with a chuckle.

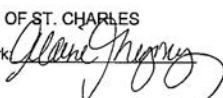

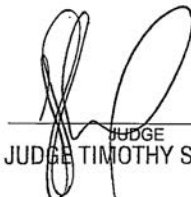
