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## Norco woman battles cancer, advocates others 'listen to' their bodies

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When Heather Barber moved to Destrehan and began working with Ochsner a little over a year ago, she had a notable adjustment to make to a new job and a new city all at once. Samantha Worley was there for Barber to lean on.

"She became my work sister," Barber said. "We'd just met and we connected immediately. She meant so much to me as I was navigating a new workplace ... I knew I could trust her and always knew she'd be there for me."

That made it incredibly jarring for Barber, however, when she learned from her supervisor that Worley was diagnosed with Stage 3 colon cancer.

"The first word out of my mouth wasn't pretty," Barber

said. "You hear cancer and the first thing you think is that they're going to die. It's scary and there are a lot of emotions."

Worley, a Norco resident, had noted consistent abdominal pain in the days leading to her diagnosis. Barber said Worley was planning a trip with her husband, but wanted to see a doctor to determine what was causing her discomfort before departing.

"She'd be at work, in the most terrible pain," Barber said.

At Stage 3, colon cancer has spread to lymph nodes but not to distant body parts, and it is curable. But it's a difficult fight and an exceptionally taxing one. Worley is approximately

## New safety measures implemented by school district in wake of shooting incident near Hahnville game

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An October incident that saw Hahnville's district football game at Thibodaux cancelled due to gunfire heard near the stadium has inspired changes to the St. Charles Parish school district's safety protocols for school events.

The policy changes are as follows:

- Any child not currently attending high school must be accompanied by an adult for admittance to any event hosted by a school, the school system,



or the Lafon Arts Center. This applies to all students in pre-kindergarten through 8th grade and children not yet enrolled in school.

- Any high school student must present their school ID if using a student

# Special Education students run commercial kitchen at Destrehan High

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Destrehan High School's (DHS) Wildcat Kitchen offers local Special Education students a taste of work in the hospitality industry, putting them inside the program's own working commercial-grade kitchen.

Run by DHS Special Education teacher Lauren LeJeune as part of a vocational foods program, the Wildcat Kitchen class was originally begun by longtime DHS educator Linda Taylor, whom LeJeune took over the program from following Taylor's

retirement. Beginning with just a single burner stovetop appliance, the program has grown into utilizing a full commercial kitchen loaded with appliances found in most modern restaurants. The Wildcat Kitchen features a walk-in cooler, walk-in freezer and a large restaurant-grade multi-burner range among other pieces of restaurant equipment.

"This class allows [students] to get real-world skills when

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## St. Charles Parish prepares for runoff elections

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One local elected position and one St. Charles-St. John area state representative position will be decided in the upcoming Saturday, Nov. 18 election ballot, along with several statewide elected positions and state constitutional amendments.

The St. Charles Parish councilmember District V position, which is attached to four different voting precincts within St. Charles Parish, will be decided later this month in a runoff between Michelle O’Daniels, registered Republican, and Ryant Price, registered Democrat. O’Daniels earned a spot on the November runoff ballot by garnering 48.6 percent of votes in October’s election, while Price did the same after receiving 38.2 percent. The two candidates are seeking to replace the District V seat soon to be vacated by current Councilmember Marilyn Bellock.

The State Representative position for the 57th Representative District will also be decided later this month, a race whittled down to either Sylvia Taylor, registered Democrat, or Russell “Russ” Wise, who is unaffiliated with any political party. The 57th District had a higher number of candidates run for the position in October in comparison to other local races, with eight different candidates initially running.

Taylor made the November ballot cut with 17.4 percent of the vote, while Wise garnered a close 15.9 percent of the vote, amounting to just a 149-vote difference. Both candidates are newcomers to the Louisiana House of Representatives, seeking to replace term-limited Representative Randall Gaines, elected in 2012.

The 57th District encompasses an area that includes parts of St. John the Baptist Parish - most notably featuring Laplace - as well as key areas in St. Charles Parish including Boutte, Hahnville and Killona.

The runoff elections are a result of Louisiana’s “jungle primary” system, which requires runoffs in races having three or more candidates after any single candidate does not earn over 50 percent of the vote in the primary election.

In addition to the two local position runoff elections, St. Charles Parish voters will also help decide a few November statewide runoff races, including races for secretary of state, attorney general

and treasurer.

Nov. 18 will further give St. Charles Parish voters a hand in deciding four proposed state constitutional amendments. Amendment issues being put before voters for consideration include a measure amending the timing constraints of the governor’s veto authority, inactive special use funding issues, authority for parishes to offer ad valorem tax exemptions for qualified first responders, and legislative authority to use \$250 million from the state’s Revenue Stabilization Trust Fund for decreasing state budget deficits.

October’s ballot saw all prior state amendments pass with an overwhelming majority.

Election officials are hopeful for a better turnout in November versus October’s low Louisiana voter turnout, which attracted just 36 percent of around 3 million registered Louisiana voters to polls. The low October turnout was one of the lowest levels in recent history, comparable as far back to 2011, when former Governor Bobby Jindal faced re-election.

## Thumbs up to Dyno Nobel’s boiler project amid emissions concerns

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In a vote of four to one, Jefferson Parish’s Planning Advisory Board (PAB) voted Thursday, Nov. 2 to approve explosives maker Dyno Nobel’s special permitted use request to construct a new boiler for its ammonia plant within the 800-acre Cornerstone Chemical Complex in Waggaman.

The decision on the new boiler amendment had been postponed in both September and October’s Planning Advisory Board meetings before finally being approved in last week’s meeting. The special use permit amendment will now be placed before the Jefferson Parish Council for final approval on Dec. 6.

The Cornerstone Chemical Complex sits immediately east of the St. Charles and Jefferson Parish line.

The approval of the Jefferson Parish PAB zoning request did not come without controversy. Jefferson Parish officials acknowledged the special use construction permit was approved with the public knowledge that the boilers had already been constructed by Dyno Nobel earlier this year.

Reports earlier this year

surrounding Louisiana Department of Environmental Air Quality (LDEQ) air permits with the proposed boilers indicated use of the boilers were likely to bring an expected increase in the facility’s current sulfur dioxide and nitrogen oxide emissions by approximately 25 percent, which some local activists raised alarms over.

Dyno Nobel was fined last month by the LDEQ after it was disclosed the company Dyno Nobel had already built its new \$27 million boilers at its Waggaman ammonia plant without the proper air permits. The fine LDEQ officials settled on, just \$1,725, was considered by some Jefferson Parish area politicians and local environmental activists to be an understated response.

“The penalty is not sufficient to discourage and prevent other applicants from building now and paying a small penalty later,” River Ridge resident Lisa Karlin, a member of the local Harahan/River Ridge Air Quality group, wrote in a letter to state regulators in response to the fine.

## I-10 interchange named for lifelong parish resident

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Sen. Gary Smith recalls his grandfather, the late Henry Smith Jr., as someone who could always envision how things could be improved for the better.

“People would say he’s such an optimist, he thought yesterday was going to get better,” Smith said. “He was always pushing for positive change, whether in business or in politics, to improve conditions for citizens.”

Henry was a representative of St. Charles Parish on the New Orleans Aviation Board for 26 years. He was also the longest serving member of the aviation board and took a special interest in its construction committee – he was a contractor by trade, so it was a natural fit.

His positive contributions in those regards inspired state lawmakers to

name the I-10/Loyola Drive interchange in Kenner in his honor. It was officially dedicated in a special ceremony on Oct. 27, with several local and statewide leaders on hand to speak on the occasion.

The \$125.6 million I-10/Loyola Drive Interchange Improvement Project is aimed at improving interstate, local and Louis Armstrong International Airport traffic flow through the Kenner area. The project includes two airport flyover ramps with direct access to I-10, widening of the interstate with auxiliary lanes between Williams Drive and Loyola Blvd., and the construction of Louisiana’s first DDI (diverging diamond interchange). Both flyover ramps

halfway through chemotherapy treatments for the illness.

“The physical aspect of it all is something I know she’s really struggling with right now,” Barber said. “But she stays positive. It’s honestly crazy how positive she’s been through it all. I don’t think I could handle this like she has.”

That’s representative of Worley’s personality, Barber said, and it’s part of what made Barber’s natural instinct to want to help Worley.

“She won’t ask for a dime – she wants to help other people but she’s one that never wants to ask for help,” Barber said.

Barber’s answer was to set up a GoFundMe page (titled Sam’s Medical Funds) to raise money to help offset Worley’s surgery, chemotherapy treatment, doctor’s visits, and specialty appointments. Insurance offsets some of the cost, but conversely Worley has been unable to work during her battle with the illness.

“I told her I can’t take your pain or discomfort away and I can’t wear your shoes, but I can do something to help,” Barber said.

The cause resonated with people quickly, and within a day

several donations were made to help Worley in her recovery – approximately \$1,000 was raised in the first day the page was up.

“She walks into a building and lights up the room. She just never lets anything bother her,” Barber said. “I don’t think Sam realizes the impact she has on people. She’s very humble and is that friend who will do anything for you ... she’s the one who’ll handle it behind closed doors and other people never know about it.”

Worley said part of what’s helped her maintain her positive outlook has been her support system, including Barber and Worley’s husband - “He’s been there 100 percent of the way for me,” she noted.

Worley also said she hopes her story will inspire others to listen to their bodies and seek answers quickly – the fact she did so when she did may ultimately prove to be a life-saving decision.

“I got checked at a young age even though I had no history,” Worley said. “Dr. Johnston and Dr. Griffin have been amazing with me and I’m looking forward to the next few years with them.”

ticket for entry to any event hosted by a school, the school system, or the Lafon Arts Center.

- Metal detectors and/or handheld security wands may be utilized at any event hosted by a school, the school system, or the Lafon Arts Center.
- A stricter bag protocol will now apply to all events hosted by a school, the school system, or the Lafon Arts Center including events such as Grandparents’ Day, concerts, athletic competitions, etc. Allowed bags include bags smaller than 4 x 6½ inches and clear bags between 4 x 6½ inches and 12 x 12 inches. Any bag larger than 12 x 12 inches is not allowed. (Exceptions may be allowed for diaper and/or medical bags.) All bags are subject to search.

The new policy went into effect on Oct. 12.

St. Charles Parish administrator of safety, security and emergency preparedness Kade Rogers said that these measures were being discussed even before the Thibodaux incident - earlier on that day, in fact, official recommendations were made to implement stricter bag protocols and metal detectors/handheld wands at selected events.

“And then the events of Friday came ... we had sent out a survey to stakeholders throughout the district and we received an overwhelming response,” Rogers said. “71 percent of our stakeholders said they’d like to see metal detectors at our events. We want to make sure we’re as proactive as possible. With the board’s support, we were able to move pretty swiftly on putting those measures in place.”

Rogers said that a number of incidents over the past year throughout the state informed

these decisions.

According to the Lafourche Parish Sheriff’s Office, several shots were reportedly fired near Thibodaux High School on Oct. 6, preceding the cancellation of that night’s Hahnville-Thibodaux game. Police said there were no injuries to anyone at the football game related to the reported shots.

Hahnville led Thibodaux 20-12 with 9:05 remaining in the third quarter. Thibodaux had just scored a touchdown and was lining up for an extra point when officials called for the teams and spectators to leave the field as a safety precaution. Once police secured the area around the stadium, people began to return home.

According to a school official, multiple options were discussed to see what could be done to resume the game, but it was ultimately cancelled.

Thibodaux police officials said officers heard five to six gunshots coming from outside the west side of the football stadium.

In mid-October, a 13-year-old was arrested and charged with multiple felony charges, including aggravated assault with a firearm, in connection with the shooting incident.

According to Thibodaux police, the shooting stemmed from a physical confrontation between two groups of teens near the stadium. After that fight, one group left the scene but was soon joined by the 13-year-old shooting suspect – who was not involved in the fight.

The second group was leaving the stadium when police say the suspect fired shots in the direction of its members.

similar mergers.

The result of the local church merger will create a new church at the site of the current St. John the Baptist church in Paradis, which will later be renamed in March of next year, while St. Gertrude will be closed. The newly merged Paradis church formed from the two churches is expected to part with each of its current two pastors in favor of a new pastor, further emphasizing the creation of a new church. The changes are expected to begin on July 1, 2024.

“These are difficult and painful decisions for everyone involved,” Aymond said in his recent letter. “When I returned home to New Orleans in 2009, I never imagined I would be in the situation of having to merge parishes. This is something we must do for the good of the local church, and something that is being done in Catholic dioceses around the country.”

The coming 2024 closure of St. Gertrude Catholic Church will mark the end of a St. Charles Parish area church that was officially recognized by the diocese

as a parish in June 1955. St. Gertrude’s grounds have served as the home of the Catfish Festival since 1975, an event originally conceived as the church’s primary annual fundraiser. The church can trace its local roots in Des Allemands to as far back as 1901, when a small Des Allemands-area chapel was first established at the site of the church’s present-day cemetery.

The archbishop cited numerous financial reasons for the merger announcement, including damages from hurricanes and flooding many local area churches have faced, inflation, property insurance costs and the COVID pandemic.

The two churches were among 16 Catholic church parishes throughout the region that will undergo mergers or significant geographical changes or moves. The announcement comes following a planning and review process that first began over a year ago within the Archdiocese of New Orleans.

Aymond, in another letter released in early September, alluded to the Archdiocese administration’s

growing desire to reduce its local footprint and sell off some of its real estate assets in the face of increasing financial challenges.

“Soaring insurance rates and costly maintenance have impacted our ability to maintain appropriately the over 1,400 pieces of property and remain good stewards of our resources,” Aymond said.

While not directly addressing its ongoing legal struggles in the October letter, the Archdiocese of New Orleans has experienced additional financial difficulties as of late, most notably filing for reorganization under Chapter 11 in May of 2020 as a result of sexual abuse allegations. Aymond disclosed in September sexual abuse allegations that initially numbered only 30 filed against the Archdiocese in court now number over 500 claims.

“This has been a much longer, complicated, and costly process than anyone could have predicted,” Aymond said of the Archdiocese’s current legal circumstances.

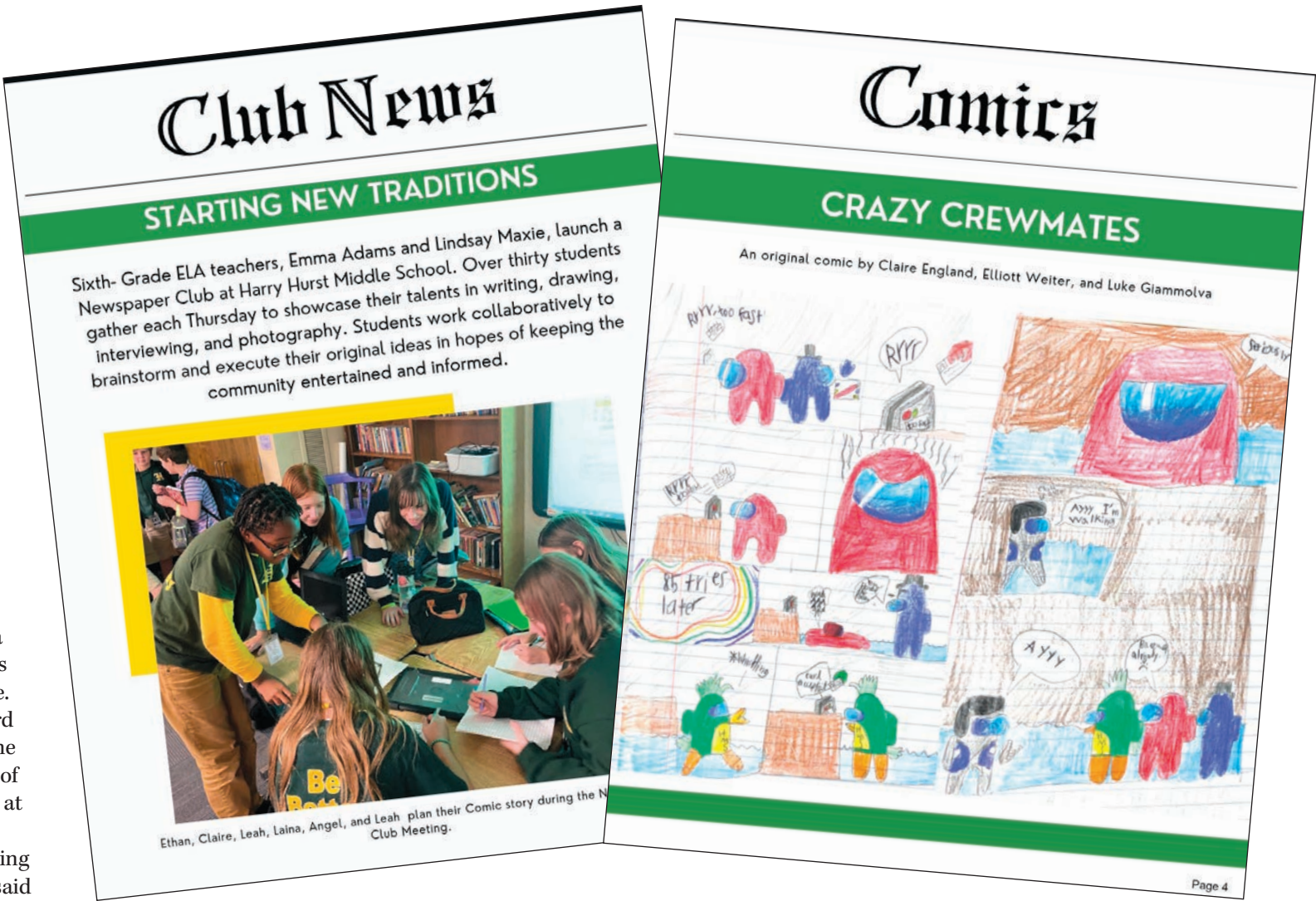

That’s a student in a different grade – when can I meet them, what advisory are they in? That’s difficult at first, but each week they’re getting better and better at making those plans.”

Some students aren’t able to attend the weekly meetings due to other extracurricular activities but contribute writing and artwork. Students with the paper have noted the importance of teamwork to the exercise – if someone who usually attends or has a role in putting the paper together is unable to in a given week, others step forward to pick up the slack.



Each student has different reasoning for wanting to join the club. One felt it would be great to have their work featured in something that would be seen throughout the school. Another thought it would be a chance to meet people and make friends. Another joined to be a photographer, but added she enjoyed the process of how four or so ideas for what could be in the paper blossomed to 11 – and counting.

All of it means what was to be a monthly newsletter has become a weekly newspaper – and a platform for a very talented group.

it comes to working in a commercial kitchen,” LeJeune said. “For those students who are able, they’re leaving with Serve Safe food handler certifications... that certification really does help them when they go out to get a job, because it’s one more thing that they have to add to their resume.”

Students choose and put together menu options, purchase and manage food inventory, determine food costs and how to price their menu items, prepare and cook meals, and gain experience serving DHS faculty and staff. The Wildcat Kitchen even has its own banquet room, where the class hosts events for DHS employees who regularly enjoy their food.

“They’re learning how to communicate with guests, how to serve guests, and how to anticipate the needs of those guests as they’re sitting there [in the banquet room],” LeJeune said of the program’s objectives.

Several of the program’s graduates have been able to apply the skills learned in the program and obtain jobs in the

hospitality industry working at local area restaurants in various capacities.

LeJeune’s Wildcat Kitchen class, which typically has around six students, enjoys coming up with a wide variety of menu items for guests, from pasta and salad dishes to shrimp or chicken entrees - and especially dessert items.

“The dessert, that’s their favorite part,” LeJeune chuckled. “They love figuring out desserts, because they know that at the end of it, if they make a couple extra, they eat it.”

The class regularly experiments with new menu items, often opting for made-from-scratch ingredients in order to produce a better-tasting product.

“We’ve been doing breakfast a lot lately, and we were trying to find biscuits that we liked, and not caring for the store-bought ones, so one thing led to another - and we

decided we were going to start making fresh biscuits in the morning,” LeJeune said.

Certain teachers were hand-picked by students in the Wildcat Kitchen class as their official biscuit taste-tasters – which later prompted numerous emails of praise.

“I got a bunch of emails back, saying how excited the teachers were that they

got chosen to be their student taste-tester, and how amazing the biscuits were... their hard work really shows,” LeJeune commented.

LeJeune said she hopes to one day be able to grow the Wildcat Kitchen program from a kitchen operation into a completely student-run restaurant open inside DHS, where students are responsible for the entire operation with teacher supervision.

“I think that is the end goal of any program like this, when you want that level of independence, and reach that capability to go in and have a hand in all parts of it – serving the food, cooking dinner, being one-on-one with guests,” LeJeune said.

Despite Dyno Nobel admitting to state regulators in a letter dated March 17 to prematurely building the boiler without proper air permits, Dyno Nobel nor LDEQ appeared to mention the boiler had already been built when regulators held a meeting on March 21 to gather public input on the proposed air permit.

In a later statement, management at Dyno Nobel said the pre-mature construction was an oversight. A subsequent review conducted by LDEQ found no evidence Dyno Nobel attempted to conceal the violation.

“Dyno Nobel regrets the oversight and has improved project management processes to ensure future LDEQ permitting experiences meet all requirements,” a Dyno Nobel spokesperson said in an official company statement reported last month.

According to its website, Dyno Nobel is an international company with 32 manufacturing facilities on three continents. It markets itself as a global leader in the commercial explosives industry, and currently employs over 3,770 employees worldwide.

have been named for Henry Smith, marked by a sign with Henry A. Smith Memorial Road emblazoned.

Gary Smith said it’s a fitting gesture given what his grandfather stood for, and that he and his family were honored by it.

“He loved the area – he was a lifelong resident of St. Charles Parish, and he was so proud to be from this region,” Smith said. “At the previous (airport) facility, he worked hard to make sure people’s experience with the airport was positive. I think he’d be pretty proud of the fact, just as we are, that this new fly-over that’s going to really improve traffic conditions at the airport would be named in his honor.”

Smith said the flow of traffic to and from the airport should be notably improved via the project improvements.

“They’ll be able to get to and from the airport without having to go through those intersections ... instead of having the red lights and congestion, you’ll be able to have people moving in a more fluid manner right there,” Smith said.

Henry passed away in 2011. He is the founder of the St. Rose-based Magnolia Companies. His position

with the Aviation Board saw him work with five different St. Charles Parish President and New Orleans Mayor administrations.

“It says a lot that he was able to work across all those administrations and not only continue to be reappointed to his position, but also to get so many things accomplished,” Smith said.

He also took his role as a

representative of his home parish very seriously.

“One of his proudest tasks at the airport was making sure St. Charles Parish citizens were employed and could benefit from the airport from an economic standpoint,” Smith said. “He pushed to get St. Charles Parish officers working on airport detail, for St. Charles people to work there as vendors, taxi drivers ... anything to enhance things for local residents.”

For Smith, his time as a state senator is winding down after six terms and 24 years. He said it was a special day for him to be able to give remarks at the ceremony as one of the last official duties of his tenure – fitting in many ways as he calls his grandfather one of his greatest political mentors and influences.

“It was also special to have my family there ... my dad has served on the Aviation Board since my grandfather’s passing, for the past 12 years, representing St. Charles Parish and continuing that tradition. It was special for all of us and I was honored that I was invited to speak.”





# Tigers win in opening round, fall in five sets in second

No. 8 seeded Tigers conclude strong season

Hahnville dominated the second set and kept its momentum rolling in the third. Fontainebleau's adjustments in the middle of the fourth set proved to be the difference as it sealed the match with wins in the last two sets.

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# Perfect 10: Destrehan completes unbeaten regular season, earns bye

Wildcats will face winner of Belle Chasse and Parkway in round two

It’s another perfect regular season for Destrehan.

The Wildcats earned a 38-12 victory at Thibodaux Friday night to secure a 10-0 regular season. That propelled DHS to the No. 3 seed in Division I and - for the second straight year - an opening round bye. DHS will face the winner of No. 14 Belle Chasse and No. 19 Parkway in the second round.

Destrehan (10-0, 6-0) led by 17-0 at halftime. A key play in how the game

unfolded from there came on a strip by Kolaj Cobbins and a 40-yard scoop and score by Arrington Adams, helping to break the game open.

Thibodaux (4-5, 3-2) was coming off of its biggest win of the season as it upend-ed Terrebonne in Week 9.

Shane Ward was the centerpiece of-fensively for Destrehan, carrying 27 times for 153 yards and a touchdown. Anthony Robinson and Jackson Fields also scored on the ground on a night the Wildcats’ passing attack was held in check with just 72 yards through the air.

The ground game was not limit-ed whatsoever, though, as Destrehan mauled its way to 252 yards rushing.

The Wildcats have a state champi-onship on their mind, but have already

begun piling accolades. Last week, DHS sealed a fourth consecutive District 7-5A championship. Friday’s win was Destrehan’s 24th in a row, extending the longest streak in the state. This is Destrehan’s third consecutive perfect regular season – the team’s last loss in a non-playoff game came in the first game of 2020, head coach Marcus Scott’s very first game with the team.

“I’m so proud of everyone here,” Scott said. “We have an incredible group of coaches and players here who work

extremely hard week in and week out at improving every game. You never take it for granted.”

Scott said this week the Wildcats were able to find success attacking the inte-rior of the Thibodaux defense with the running game and establish a physical tone.

Destrehan earned a bye week last season, and that was a precursor to the team’s four postseason wins and a state championship. Scott said whether the bye week proves helpful or not comes

down to how the team handles it. That doesn’t mean, however, that there’s a comfort level with the bye sim-ply because the bye worked out a year ago. “This is a different team,” Scott said. “We’ve had a lot of success this season, but at the same time we replaced quite a few starters. You can’t assume one group is going to react like the last group. So, we’ll see how that unfolds going into the next game.”

## Ladycats wrap season in round one

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Destrehan traveled to face a tough Chapelle team for a round one road date in the Division I volleyball playoffs, where the Wildcats’ season came to a close.

Chapelle captured a 25-13, 25-9, 25-20 sweep of a Wildcats team that re-turned to the playoffs this season after a retooling campaign a season ago. No. 11 Chapelle (21-18) advanced to round two to face Northshore, where it won in a tough 5-game match to qualify for the state semifinals.

Destrehan, the No. 22 seed in Division I, had an upset on its mind and en-tered as a dangerous low seed for the Chipmunks. The Wildcats defeated Chapelle in a September 30 match at the CCA tournament, sweeping the best of three encounter.

For Chapelle, Haley Bellande made nine kills. Isabella McCann had eight and Ava Kirsch seven.

Despite the loss, the season was a strong one for Destrehan. The Ladycats doubled their win total of 11 from 2022 and highlighted the year with a 12-match winning streak that saw the team drop just one set throughout that run.

“That win streak was great for pro-gram morale,” said Giambrone. “The kids accomplished a lot this year. They worked hard in the classroom, on and off the court and had a great time together as friends. I’m very proud of them.”

The team will lose nine seniors go-ing into next season, but Giambrone said there is excitement about a talent-ed group of underclassmen who will be

# Tigers eliminated at Terrebonne

HHS playoff streak comes to end, THS running attack proved difference

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Hahnville arrived at Terrebonne with sealing a playoff spot on its mind, but Terrebonne and standout rusher Jayce Johnson had other ideas.

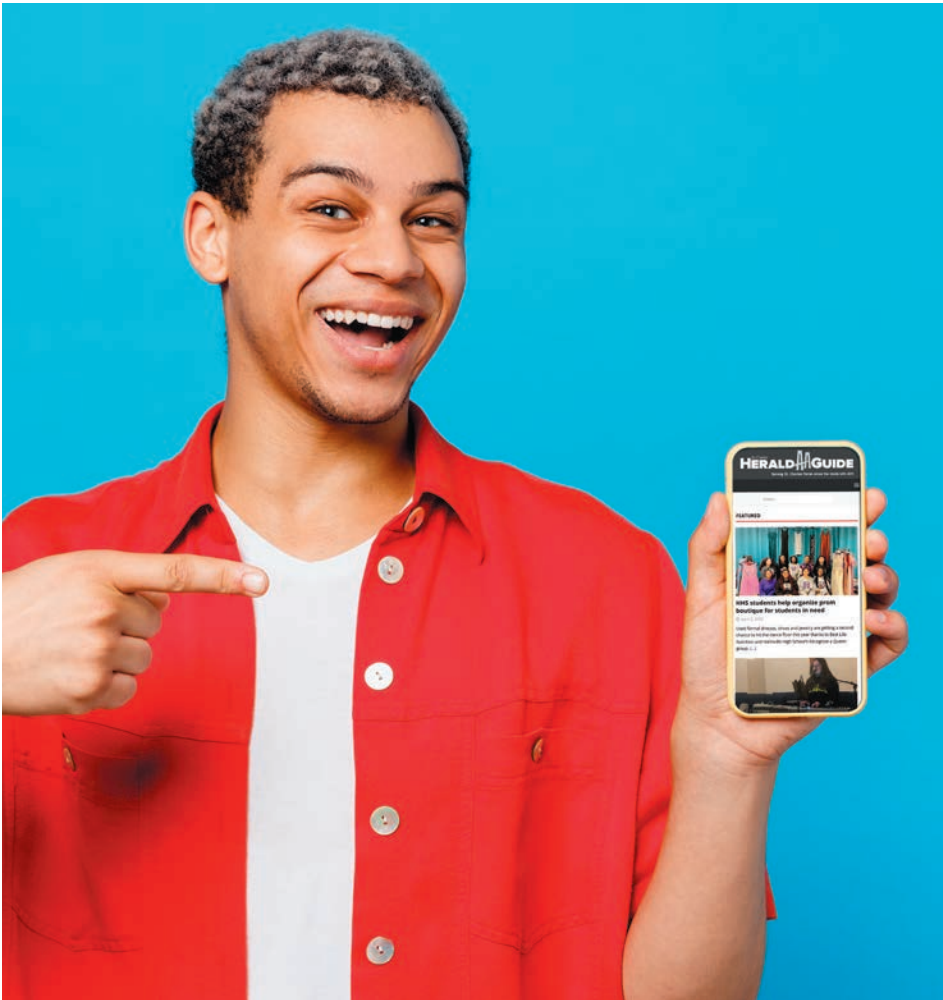
Johnson scored five times and posted a dominating effort overall on the ground as Terrebonne ended Hahnville's season, 45-28 in the final game of the regular season.

"We played hard. We played hard ... second half, their running back was the best player on the field tonight. He had five touchdowns, probably rushed for about 300 yards. We couldn't tackle him, we couldn't get him to the ground," said Hahnville head coach Daniel Luquet. "Offensively, we didn't have as many possessions in the second half to get what we needed, just three possessions ... it's tough. It's tough – our guys played hard, but at the end of the day, we've

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got to get the running back to the ground."

The loss brings to an end what was a 23-year streak of Hahnville post-season appearances. Hahnville finished with a record of 3-6 (2-3 in District 7-5A) and an unofficial final power points rank of 30 overall. Prior to 2022, that rank would have placed Hahnville in the field, but last year saw a change to the play-off structure with the top 4 schools in Division I non-select receiving a bye and just 28 teams earning their way into the postseason.

It was a closer game than the final score indicated for the majority of the night, but that five-touchdown stat line was every bit indicative of how Terrebonne controlled the night's action with its rushing attack. THS (7-3, 4-2) led by 10 with just over eight minutes left.

The turning point of the night, however, arguably came through the air.

Hahnville began the second half with a strong offensive drive to take the lead on a Calvin Smith plunge at the goal line, HHS jumping ahead 27-24. Smith extended the drive earlier after Luquet called for a fake punt that worked to perfection, Smith powering for

yardage and a first down on the play.

On the next drive, Cameron Darensbourg dropped Johnson for a loss on first down and it appeared Hahnville might be ready to take control. But on the next play Johnson got loose for a first down. And on the play after that, Terrebonne quarterback Quincy Adams uncorked

down the field on the back of Johnson. Inside the 10, HHS' Nizair Miller made a tackle for loss, but Terrebonne followed up with two more Johnson runs, the second a touchdown off of a fake QB sprint out that pushed the lead to 10.

Hahnville needed an answer, but couldn't find one. Terrebonne forced Hahnville's hand

a deep ball to Kylan Billiot – the 6'4 LSU commitment ripped down the contested catch and ran the rest of the way for a 45-yard touchdown that put Terrebonne back ahead, 31-28.

Hahnville's next drive began with a holding penalty, but Ryan Gregson's pass to Calvin Smith resulted in a long catch and run that had Hahnville in business.

HHS got into the red zone, but Terrebonne's defense stiffened. Hahnville was forced to settle for a field goal attempt on fourth down and 4 to go – the field goal sailed wide right and the score remained 31-28.

Terrebonne drove

on fourth and long deep inside HHS' own territory, and Hahnville punted with 8:15 left to play.

Terrebonne cemented the game on the next drive, its rushing attack grinding all but the final 1:17 of play off the clock – Johnson capped the drive with his fifth and final touchdown run of the night.

"He's their best player, and we knew that coming in," said Luquet. "I thought their offensive line played exceptionally well. Kudos to them and to Coach Lewis. You don't rush for five touchdowns if those five guys up front don't do their jobs, and they controlled the line of scrimmage on offense."



# Sheriff’s Office, schools team up to help guide female students through mentorships

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The St. Charles Parish Sheriff’s Office along with two local area St. Charles Parish Public schools recently announced a new pilot program called the BOSS Up Initiative, which aims to help guide local female students through positive mentorships.

Using 30-to-45-minute sessions scheduled throughout the school year, the program aims to work primarily with young female students facing difficulties and demonstrate to teachers in various ways they may need positive mentorship in their lives. Instructors and mentors work and engage with the students on a closer level than is usually possible in a larger classroom setting, discussing life skill topics like decision making, goal setting, social wellness among others.

LeNeshia Markey, 7th grade teacher at Albert Cammon Middle School, has volunteered in other local mentoring programs and was recently chosen to work with the Sheriff’s Office in helping develop the program.

“There is always the promise that they can change,” Markey said of students enrolled in the program. “They can always turn around if there is some kind of intervention of someone that will stand in the gap on their behalf and show them a different way,”

Albert Cammon Middle School will be the first to participate in the program, incorporating a group of female students selected from Grades 5th to 8th grade into the program’s first wave of student enrollees. The BOSS Up Initiative has already begun offering sessions for students, but the program is still considered to be in the planning stages as organizers look to add more features and interactive experiences for students.

“The program focuses on helping these girls develop better decision-making strategies, social-emotional wellness, teaching about financial literacy and awareness,” Lt. Roanne Sampson, Juvenile Programs Commander, explained. “We are also hoping to help these girls become better leaders in their school and community, more career focused by setting goals, creating affirmation boards and introducing them to other professionals.”

Local developers of the program, including Sgt. Keysla Perilloux with the St. Charles Parish Sheriff’s Office, are currently planning outside school activities, social gatherings, educational field trips as well as activities with local seniors to help engage students.

“I am excited to offer the BOSS Up Initiative pilot program to girls at Albert Cammon Middle and St. Rose Elementary Schools,” Sheriff Greg Champagne said recently. “Lt. Sampson and Sgt. Perilloux continue to make me proud with their dedication to the youth of St. Charles Parish. They are helping to prepare our future leaders.”

After having watched the progress of some of her students enrolled in the program, Markey said she can already see positive results in some students.

“We want to show them we care,” Markey said. “This is what we’re doing to make sure that our kids know that we care for them, care about them...giving them the tools and the techniques that when they leave the school building, they know how to make decisions that are going to be in the best interest of themselves.”

**REMOVAL OF WEEDS, GRASS & OTHER NOXIOUS MATTER**  
If the following violations are not rectified within (5) days of this published notice, the parish will proceed in bringing the properties listed in compliance with Chapter 16, Article III Sec. 16-24 through Sec. 16-28. (As amended). The fee for performing these services shall be at a rate of 0.037 per square foot of the lot cleaned. The contractor’s fee for performing these services shall be at the rate of 0.029 per square foot of the lot cleaned. In the event a mini-clean up is required prior to performing the above services, a fee of \$58.61 per mini clean up plus actual disposal fees will be assessed, not to exceed then (10) mini-cleanups per property in violation. On property where trash and/or debris accumulation is such that it requires heavy equipment, bulldozer, front-end loaders, etc. a fee of forty-three dollars and eighty six cents (\$43.96) per cubic yard will be assessed. An administration fee of \$36.63 may be assessed on each invoice. The fees in this section shall be increased or decreased on February first of each year by a change in CIP applicable to the US cities average group, all urban consumers, all items published by the US Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics, for the preceding twelve-month period ending each November. The change shall become effective beginning with the period ending November 30, 2000. The department of finance shall notify the department of planning and zoning in writing annually of the revised fees.

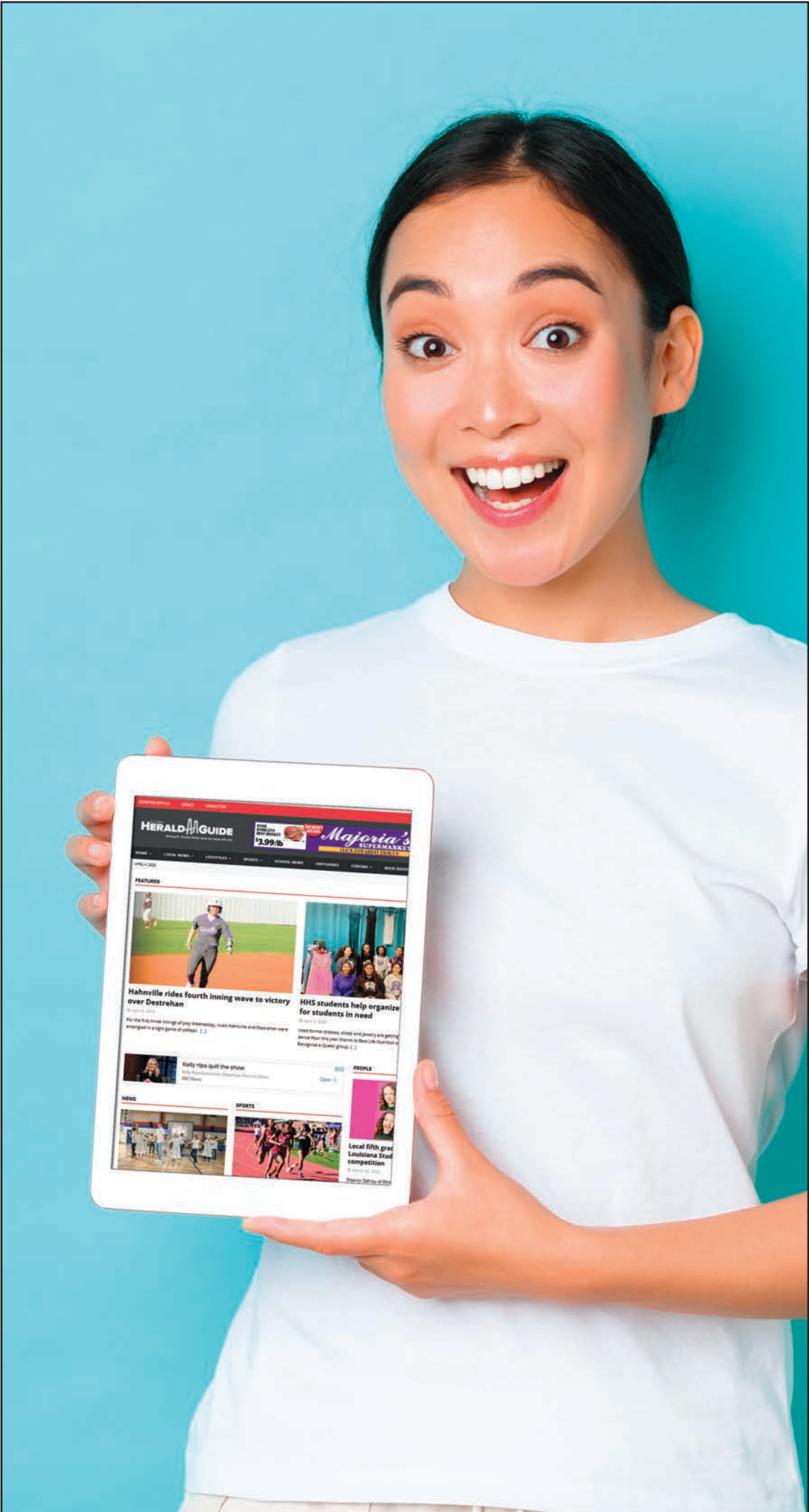
