Mason Kiley died a hero. In many ways, he always did his very best to live as one as well.

The 14-year-old Bayou Gauche resident passed away Sunday night at 6:59 p.m., due to injuries suffered after falling from a golf cart on Easter.

Unbeknownst to even his immediate family, Kiley registered to be an organ donor,

Sharon Orlando and her Destrehan home were facing a looming hazard and threat, but a helping hand from her community have her safe and sound.

Four towering, dead trees loomed over Orlando's Murray Hill Drive home, threatening to fall upon not only her residence but also posing risk to the streets and the nearby EMS station. While the trees were on her property, the 81-year-old widow was financially unable to solve the problem and have the trees – and danger they posed - removed.

District III Councilman Walter Pilie became aware of the problem and sought to help matters for Orlando.

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Not much can be done to control hog population on private land near Highway 90

A few months after a Hahnville man was killed in a car crash that was caused by an animal in the road, several residents have expressed concern after seeing hogs nearby the roadway in the same area.

Tyler Scott, 41, was driving a 2005 Ford Ranger west on Highway 90 approaching Pier 90 around 6:30 p.m. on Jan. 23 when the accident took place. Scott's vehicle struck a large animal in the roadway, causing Scott to lose control of his truck and travel across the median into the eastbound lanes, where he struck two other vehicles.

Despite being property restrained, Scott suffered life-threatening injuries and passed away after arriving at a local hospital. The drivers of the other vehicles suffered serious injuries, but survived the crash.

Jacob Pucheu, a spokesman for Louisiana State Police Troop B, said he



was not sure what type of animal caused the crash and that the matter is still under investigation.

However, several residents took to social media recently to say that they have seen a high number of hogs near the

Highway 90 roadway.

Dr. Jim LaCour, state vet for the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, said there are one million hogs located in the state and that liberalized hunting and trapping, along with some

aerial control on public lands, are utilized to try to control the population.

However, if the hogs reside on a private land that borders the highway, not much can be done.

"Louisiana is a landowner's-rights state," he said. "(There can be) no control of feral hogs without the landowner's permission."

LaCour added that feral hogs cross paved roadways "fairly infrequently" as opposed to other animals, like deer.

"But they do occasionally cross and are sometimes scared into crossing," he added. "Reduction of feral hogs on properties adjacent to public roads or good woven-wire fencing near the roadways are about all that can be done."

and his wishes were honored: as of Monday, recipients had already been found for his heart, both lungs, both kidneys and his liver – meaning Kiley will save lives.

“We are completely crushed,” said Tomilee Reilly, Kiley’s aunt and the sister of his mother Missie Duraparu. “But we find peace knowing that through Mason’s death, he was able to save the lives of others through organ donation.”

The St. Charles Parish community rallied around Kiley and his family after the accident.

Kiley was airlifted to Children’s Hospital after falling from a golf cart and hitting his head on the ground. The fall caused brain trauma and Kiley underwent brain surgery to remove blood and pressure on his brain.

After surviving this surgery, he was placed in PICU in critical care. Kiley’s family was told that the brain damage suffered from the brain bleed, the pressure on the brain stem, and a stroke he had prior to the surgery would be irreversible.

He was unresponsive, not breathing on his own and not making any purposeful movements. He remained in hospital care until his passing.

Prior to his passing, Reilly called the

tragic accident devastating for their family, and said they were leaning heavily on their faith to get them through an extremely difficult time.

“(The family) has been overwhelmed by the love and support of the entire St. Charles community and beyond,” said

Reilly. “(The Durapaus) remain steadfast in their love of the Lord, inspired by Mason’s own faith.”

Durapau has been a pediatric critical care nurse for over a decade, with much of her time spent in the very same unit her son received care in.

Reilly said Kiley, who was a student at J.B. Martin Middle School, was extremely active in his church, participating in youth group and leading monthly bible lessons for the youngest members of his family’s church.

“He loved the Lord with all his heart ... from a young age, Mason had an incredibly strong relationship with Jesus,” Reilly said.

Even at that young age, Kiley had clear intentions about what he wanted to do

in life: his aim was to become a preacher.

He was also a true Louisiana boy in that he was a football fanatic.

“(He wanted to be) a preacher – and a member of the NFL Hall of Fame,” Reilly said. “Second to God, this boy loved football.”

Kiley also had a special ability about him to connect with others.

“He was a sweet and loving kid who has a way of making you feel seen and loved. He’s never met a stranger and would talk your ear off, given the chance,” Reilly said.

He and his family have been known as helpers, through and through, and many in the community stepped forward to return the favor. Maria Tarver, a close friend of Durapau and her husband Marty, created a GoFundMe page (titled Miracle for Mason) to help offset the costs of Kiley’s medical care, a page that more than 400 people made donations to.

“They are way too humble to ask for help financially, but I feel like with no work and medical expenses and such a large family, any contribution would be such a blessing to the family during this extremely long road they have ahead of them,” Tarver said. “(The Durapaus) always give their time and heart to those they know.”

about and pursued through the parish Risk Management Office ... (nothing could be done) because the trees were on private property, not in the servitude of Murray Hill Drive,” said Pilie. “So, I reached out to every group I could think of ... I’d heard about the trees for many months.”

He also reached out to Travis Davis and his business, A+ Reliable Tree Service, who Pilie had worked with following Hurricane Ida. Davis, of Destrehan, wanted to help and offered his services to remove all four trees, completely free of charge. That eliminated the immediate threat.

Pilie said the initiative was further bolstered by contributions from Labor of Love at St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Church, which connected Pilie with Orlando to engage the necessary services, and Courtney Saucier of SCP Community Services, who arranged for the disposal of the trees.

“The removal needed to happen,” said

Pilie, who noted Labor of Love had also helped Orlando by rebuilding her front steps last summer.

He described it as a feel-good situation to be able to help Orlando, who is known to help others as well – she cooks and prepares food for the needy as a volunteer.

“It just made me want to think of every angle possible to help her ... it took a lot of collaboration, but we got it done,” Pilie said. “Everyone involved played a part in turning a potential tragedy into a testament to community success.”

Orlando was overwhelmed by the support of so many people and called it a miracle.

“It was a true team effort,” Pilie said. “It demonstrates our collective capacity to make meaningful changes when we unite in support of one another—particularly in helping our seniors, who have given so much to shape our community. I am deeply honored to facilitate such acts of kindness and community care.”

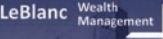
skills by preparing and serving breakfast.

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Tigers surge past Destrehan for district championship

Theriot goes complete game, freshmen step up in victory; rematch scheduled for today

Simply put, Talan Theriot did exactly what Hahnville has come to expect from him: deliver when it matters.

“He’s our alpha,” said Hahnville head baseball coach Jared Vial.

And the alpha’s fingerprints were all over the Tigers 7-1 rivalry victory at Destrehan Tuesday, a win that sealed the District 7-5A championship for HHS. Theriot drove in two runs and scored another while earning the victory on the mound, pitching a complete game as he limited Destrehan to four hits and one run.

“He’s our guy,” said Vial, the Tigers’ second-year head coach who earned his first district championship with the win. “When he gets the ball, it’s really a matter of when he wants to come out, because he’s a hard guy to take the ball from – especially in these games.

“It’s what he does. You just give him the ball and tell him, ‘Go do what you do.’”

Theriot concurred. “Absolutely,” Theriot said on his determination to go the distance. “There was no doubt in my mind – I was going to give them everything I had. And what I had, it may not have been my best stuff, but it was everything I had.”

Theriot said it was important to be able to bring the district crown back to Hahnville.

“Around here, winning district is the expectation,” Theriot said. “The last couple of years (Destrehan) took it from us. We’ve got to continue to feed off of this (going forward) and continue to bring it back.”

The senior came through, but there is also ample youth on the Hahnville roster and in a high-pressure game, that can be a factor – it was indeed the case, but in a very positive way for the Tigers. Freshmen Landen Teague (2-for-3, two RBIs, run, double and triple), Koa Romero (2-for-4, two RBIs, double) and Kaleb Guarisco (2-for-4, RBI, run) had long before announced their arrival for the now-district champion Tigers, but proved the spotlight was not too bright for them in their rivalry debut.

It was little wonder the “he’s a freshman!” chants from the Tiger dugout made a few appearances Tuesday.

“It’s what this rivalry’s about – I was proud of our guys for being able to handle the roller-coaster, because that’s what this game is,” said Vial. “(On the freshmen specifically) I knew they could handle this. I had to tell Romero on third base, ‘You’re made for this level,’ no matter if you’re a freshman or not. They’re made for this level – and they played well tonight.”

The game represented the ninth consecutive win for Hahnville (19-9, 6-0). As of Tuesday night, the Tigers were ranked No. 13 in Division I non-select power points (via GeauxPreps.com), which would have HHS in line to host in the opening round of the playoffs.

The 7-5A title was in the balance in this game: Destrehan entered with just one district loss, Hahnville with none. While Thursday brings a rematch between the teams, this time at Hahnville, it will be a non-district matchup as 7-5A teams match up against each district opponent just once in official league play. Thursday’s game will, however, potentially carry great importance in seeding – and of course, local bragging rights, as always.

Hahnville landed the first blow in this one, scoring a run in the third inning on a Theriot sacrifice fly. Leading up to the RBI, Beau Parker doubled and Koen Donnaud bunted Parker over; an error allowed Parker to reach third.

In the bottom of the third, Destrehan answered when Jayse DeGruy grounded into a potential double play ball, but an error on the throw to first gave Shane Lee an opening to score. Lee and Jonah Haslauer each singled earlier in the inning.

Hahnville finishes unbeaten in District 7-5A, look to shake off late losses as playoffs begin

Hahnville endured a bit of a bumpy landing to finish the regular season, but the Lady Tigers nonetheless are returning to the playoffs – and for the 16th straight year, doing so as a district champion. The Tigers went unbeaten in District 7-5A this season, sealing that honor officially with a 14-4 win over Terrebonne to end March.

HHS went 1-3 over its final four games, each non-district, with a 9-7 win over Ponchatoula and losses to Walker, 6-4, Mt. Carmel, 13-3 and Pineville, 16-7.

That left Hahnville in the lower half of the top 32 teams – roughly about 19 as power points and bracket positions were being finalized this week for the playoffs. The sure thing is that Hahnville yet again will return to the postseason, but will open on the road in the first round.

A traditional softball power like Hahnville figures to represent something of an uncomfortable draw for one higher seed this week.

“I don’t think we’re a typical 18 or 19 seed,” said Schulz. “We’ve slipped up and lost some games we shouldn’t have lost. Can’t go back and replay them – it is what it is. But you’ve got your home game and now you’ve got Hahnville coming in ... I mean, I wouldn’t want (to be in that position.)”

At the same time, Schulz said while the ultimate goal is still in reach, the team was pushing to reach the top 16 and to notch a 20-win season. The second of those goals is still possible for the 18-14 Tigers, it will have to coincide with the playoff run the team is hoping to kick-start this week.

“We’re not where we want to be ... we lost a few games we shouldn’t have lost that kept us out of the top 16,” Schulz said. “But you can’t go back and change

it, only look forward and play the hand you’re dealt.”

The brackets were to be announced Wednesday after press time, but it was known the Tigers will play their opening round game on the road by Saturday, the deadline for all first round games to be completed.

“We’ve played well at times and we’ve played bad at times,” Schulz said. “But in this division, I think anyone in the top 20 can pull an upset or two and make that run to Sulphur. It’s just how this division is.”

While HHS did drop 3 of 4 to end the regular season, the one win was

Kloe White struck out 12 on the mound on the way to victory. She allowed five earned runs on 11 hits. She went the full 11 innings for the complete game.

“Kloe pitched a tremendous game,” said Schulz. “She was just on. 12 strikeouts and just four walks and going the full distance. She had a stellar night for us.”

In the 6-4, eight-inning loss to Walker, Bertrand was 1-for-3 with a run scored and RBI. Brianna Keller was 1-for-3 with two RBIs.

White, Jenna Cancienne and Emersen Tregre combined to pitch the eight innings for the Tigers.

“Walker’s always a scrappy team and they don’t give you anything easy,” Schulz said. “We beat them earlier this season and I think they carried that with them a little bit here.”

Schulz said the biggest key for his team as the playoffs begin is to tighten up its defense for what HHS hopes is the next several games.

“We’re pitch really well, we hit really well and then we’ll have that one bad inning that we don’t recover from. We have the staff

and the lineup to get it done,” Schulz said. “We have to play solid defense.”

“We’ll be well-rested, our last game was on Saturday. We’ve had a very good week of practice so far, staying in our routine and keeping our minds right.”

Bertrand is starting to hit the ball especially well of late, heating up at the right time of year.

“I can’t say she was in a slump, because she’s only struck out four or five times this year,” Schulz said. “But now she’s getting those timely hits, some really big hits for us ... this lineup is just hard to pitch to.”

The score remained tied at one run apiece until the fifth inning, where the Tigers broke things open. Chase Morales drew a leadoff walk, then Beau Parker was hit by a pitch to put two on with no outs. Donnaud bunted both over, then Theriot singled to center to plate the go-ahead run. Guarisco followed with a single to right to make it 3-1, then Teague tripled to right field to make it a 5-1 game.

The Tigers didn’t look back from there. Theriot kept Destrehan’s chances to rally at a minimum and Koa Romero’s

two-run double in the seventh gave HHS an extra cushion.

DeGruy took the loss on the mound for Destrehan, allowing four earned runs on seven hits. He struck out five.

Hahnville finished with 10 hits to Destrehan’s four.

Despite the loss, Destrehan (17-11, 5-1) has won five of its last seven games. Destrehan head coach Chris Mire, however, said the Wildcats are not playing nearly their best ball right now, and that the Wildcats need to shift gears now if the team is going to reach its postseason

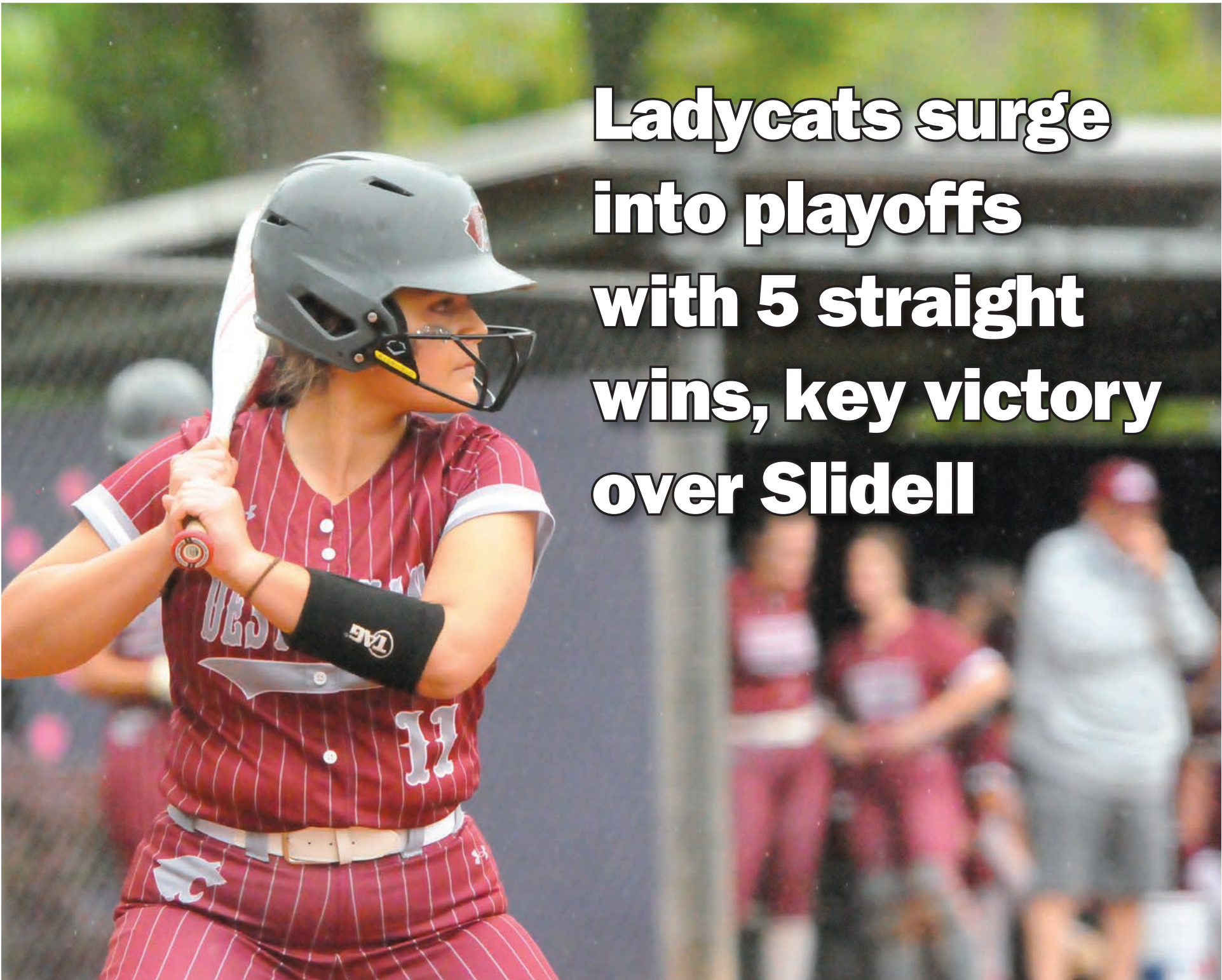
goals. DHS was ranked 19th in the Div. I non-select power point rankings as of Tuesday night, which would be just outside of range for teams that would host in round one.

Ladycats surge into playoffs with 5 straight wins, key victory over Slidell

Destrehan scored a significant victory Monday as it defeated Slidell, 5-2, in a matchup of highly ranked teams in Division I non-select jockeying for playoff positioning.

Slidell (22-7) entered the game ranked eighth while Destrehan (24-7) was at 12 in power point rankings and each team represented an opportunity to the other to garner a move up the ranks. They effectively swapped positions after the Ladycats' victory, with DHS moving to ninth and Slidell to 13th.

"That's a very good team and it's a very good win for us. It was their senior day and they were looking to potentially move up to 6 and a bye if they beat us ... this was a playoff atmosphere," said Destrehan head softball coach Craig Perrier. "A lot of my starters haven't faced the high school playoffs, and these are the types of teams you're going to be facing. You have to be mentally prepared."

Perrier said that while the Wildcats committed a couple of errors on the day, the focus was on point, team-wide.

"Our girls were battling and battling at the plate," Perrier said. "Even if it was a strikeout, we made them work ... we stayed focused the entire game."

Jolie Lozano earned the win in a complete game effort. She held the Tigers to two runs on seven hits and struck out four.

"We saw a different Jolie Lozano," Perrier said of her performance. "I've seen the fire in her eyes and that focus to go get it before. But (against Slidell) you

could just see how zeroed in she was. She was not going to get beat. She challenged them and she competed."

At the plate, Ava Burkett led DHS, going 2-for-3 with a run scored and a double. Makayla Thomas, Rylie Staton and Victoria Morrow each drove in runs.

Destrehan trailed for much of the day but turned things around in the clutch. Victoria Morrow tied things up in the sixth inning with her RBI double that made it 2-2.

In the seventh, Lozano, Burkett and Gracie Bourgeois each singled, back-to-back-to-back to lead off the inning.

Thomas drew a walk to force in the go-ahead run, then Staton did the same. Kylie Burford scored on an error to make it 5-2 and round out the scoring.

With the cancellation of a game scheduled against East Ascension Tuesday, the Slidell win was the final game of the regular season – a regular season Destrehan finished riding a tidal wave of momentum. After the Wildcats absorbed their most lopsided loss of the season last week, a 13-1 loss to Haynes, Destrehan took the performance as a wake-up call.

DHS went into its tournament over the weekend and swept four games, outscoring its competition 60 runs to 9: 15-0 over John Ehret, 12-6 over Fisher, 18-3 over Cabrini and 15-0 over Covenant Christian. Slidell was Destrehan's fifth straight win and its ninth of its last 10 games.

"That (Haynes) game was the first time I felt we came out completely flat.

Before the game, I was nervous because you could see it. We were sluggish and we didn't play our best. We got away from the things that made us successful," Perrier said.

The Wildcats recommitted to those things leading into their tournament, and it showed in a big way.

"I think that Haynes game was a huge wakeup call. We got back to work and the kids responded," Perrier said.

Bourgeois has been particularly on fire of late. She was selected as the

GeauxPreps.com Softball Player of the Week after she went 14-for-15 (.933) with six doubles, 10 RBIs and five stolen bases.

"She works her tail off on her swing," said Perrier. "She's one where if you pitch her batting practice and you tell her she's got 10 swings, you end up with 50. She's tough on herself. She made adjustments and it's really clicked for her."

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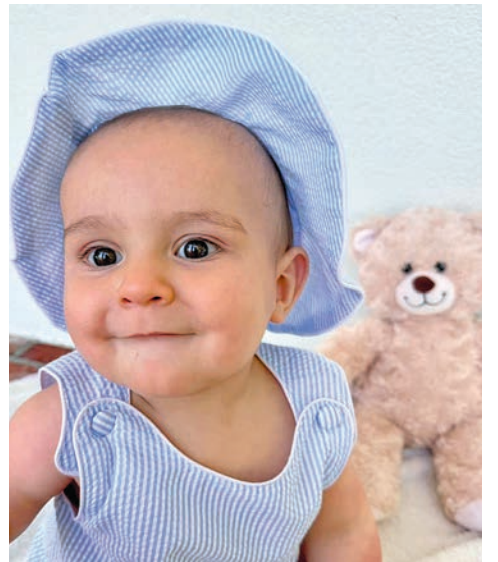

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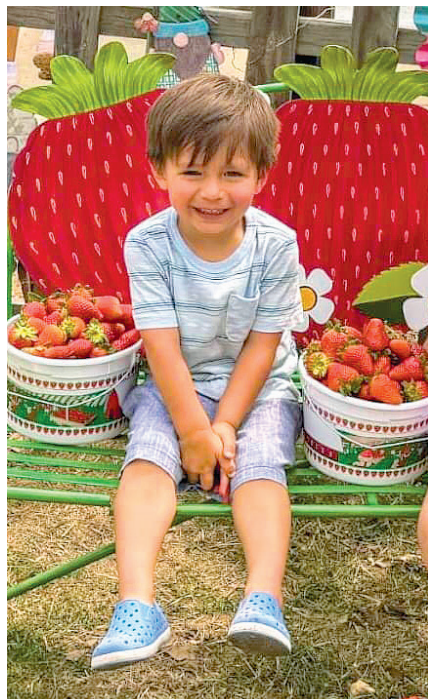

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to purchase the truck began with a conversation with Patrick Beard, who is a member of both Shell Norco’s Emergency Response Team and the Luling Volunteer Fire Department. Beard was asked about ways in which Shell could support the NVFD and make a real difference in the community.

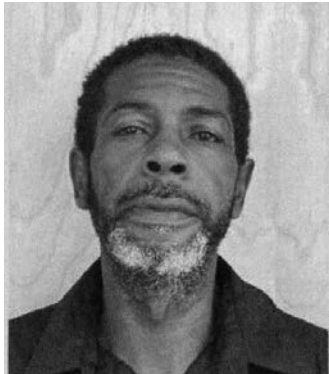

Special Provisions., (a) and (b), to increase the contract fee threshold amount for consulting engineers and architectural services handled administratively to \$50,000.00 and to revise the required notice to the Parish Council of the award of contracts handled administratively.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 93-2-20 was adopted on February 15, 1993, by the St. Charles Parish Council, establishing the Qualification Based Selection procedures for the procurement of architects and engineers; and,
WHEREAS, the procedure originally required that projects of less than \$10,000.00 would be handled administratively; and,

WHEREAS, subsequently on April 6, 1998, Ordinance 98-4-3 amended Section 2-12 of the Code of Ordinances to provide that projects less than \$20,000.00 would be handled administratively; and,

WHEREAS, the cost of consulting engineers and architectural services has increased in the nearly 25 years since the contract fee threshold was last increased; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance 00-6-1 was adopted on June 5, 2000, by the St. Charles Parish Council, to require notice to the Parish Council of the award of any Administrative contracts; and,

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Parish Council to increase the contract fee threshold amount for consulting engineers and architectural services handled administratively to \$50,000.00 and to revise the required notice to the Parish Council to require that a copy of any such contract be forwarded to the Council Secretary upon execution by the Parish President.

THE ST. CHARLES PARISH COUNCIL HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION I. That the St. Charles Parish Code of Ordinances, Chapter 2, Administration, Article I. In General, Section 2-12. I. (a) be hereby amended with new text underlined and deleted text in ~~strike~~through for clarity.

Sec. 2-12. Procedures for the procurement of architects and engineers.

I. *Special Provisions.*

(a) Any contract for consulting engineers or architectural services involving the public works, sewerage, or waterworks department of any St. Charles Parish government office, agency, commission or special district an office or department of St. Charles Parish which would result in a fee in the amount of ~~twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00)~~ fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) or more shall be awarded by ordinance of the parish council based on the recommendation of the parish president. Any such ~~project contract~~ resulting in a fee of less than the ~~twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00)~~ fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) threshold shall be handled administratively by the appropriate department, ~~in its sole discretion, from utilizing this selection process whenever it is deemed appropriate, office or department and executed by the parish president. A report listing all contracts for consulting engineers or architectural services handled administratively shall be forwarded to the parish council monthly. Five (5) days after execution of any administrative contract, notice regarding award of this contract shall be forwarded to the district councilman and councilmen at large. A copy of any such contract shall be forwarded to the council secretary upon execution.~~

SECTION II. That Chapter 2, Administration, Article I. In General, Section 2-12, I. (b) be deleted in its entirety as shown below in ~~strike~~through for clarity.

(b) ~~Any contract for consulting engineering or architectural services which would result in an engineering or architectural fee in an amount of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) or more shall be awarded by ordinance of the parish council.~~

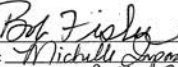

An ordinance approving and authorizing the execution of a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement between Bunge North America, Inc., Bunge Chevron AG Renewables LLC and the Parish of St. Charles providing for the construction of a road connecting Jonathan Street to Lorraine Street.

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 14(C) of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, as amended, (the "Constitution") provides that for a public purpose, political subdivisions may engage in cooperative endeavors with each other and with private associations, corporations, or individuals; and,

WHEREAS, Bunge North America, Inc., Bunge Chevron AG Renewables LLC (collectively, the "Companies") and the Parish of St. Charles (the "Parish") desire to cause the design, development, construction, expansion and/or extension of a road connecting Jonathan Street to Lorraine Street (the "Project"); and,

WHEREAS, the construction of the Project is expected to yield significant advantages for the Parish, as it will, among other benefits, provide the Parish with a newly constructed road in the right of way for Noel Street and a connector road to Lorraine Street between Noel Street and Jean Street; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Louisiana Revised Statute R.S. 48:701 a parish governing authority is authorized to revoke the dedication of all roads, streets, and alleyways when the roads, streets and alleyways have been abandoned or are no longer needed for public purpose; and,

WHEREAS, the St. Charles Parish Code of Ordinances requires that the Parish Council, the governing authority of the Parish, adopt an ordinance in order for any property owned by the Parish to be abandoned; and,

WHEREAS, the Parish has agreed to revoke, abandon or cause the abandonment of Jonathan Street due to its current state of deterioration and disrepair, limited use, anticipated maintenance costs required to bring Jonathan Street up to minimum standards of the Parish, and interest in availing itself of the benefits of the Project; and,

WHEREAS, the Parish desires to enter into a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement (the "CEA") with the Companies to define the respective rights, duties, responsibilities and obligations of the Companies and the Parish with respect to the Project; and,

WHEREAS, the Parish expects to receive real and substantial benefits under the CEA in return for the obligations of the Parish thereunder; and,

WHEREAS, the Parish desires to enter into the CEA under the Constitution and other relevant constitutional and statutory authority, all to provide for the construction, expansion and/or extension of the Project.

THE ST. CHARLES PARISH COUNCIL HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION I. That a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement between Bunge North America, Inc., Bunge Chevron AG Renewables LLC and the Parish of St. Charles, relative to the design, development, construction, donation and/or dedication of Noel Street and a connector road to Lorraine Street between Noel Street and Jean Street is hereby authorized and approved.

SECTION II. That the Parish President is hereby authorized to execute the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement on behalf of the Parish of St. Charles, along with any such other agreements and instruments as the Parish President deems necessary to carry out the intent of this ordinance.

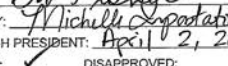

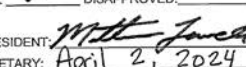

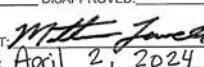

COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR AGREEMENT

This COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR AGREEMENT (this “*Agreement*”) is dated as of _____, 2024 by and between BUNGE NORTH AMERICA, INC., a New York corporation authorized to and doing business in the State of Louisiana (“*BNA*”), BUNGE CHEVRON AG RENEWABLES LLC, a Delaware limited liability company authorized to and doing business in the State of Louisiana (“*BCAR*”) and together with BNA sometimes collectively referred to as the “*Companies*”) and the PARISH OF ST. CHARLES, State of Louisiana (the “*Parish*”), a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana (the “*State*”). BNA, BCAR and the Parish are sometimes hereinafter referred to individually as a “*Party*” and together as the “*Parties*.”

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 14(C) of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, as amended, (the “*Constitution*”) provides that for a public purpose, political subdivisions may engage in cooperative endeavors with each other and with private associations, corporations, or individuals;

WHEREAS, the Companies and the Parish desire to enter into this Agreement in order to cause the design, development, construction, expansion and/or extension of roads connecting Jonathan Street to Lorraine Street (the “*Project*”) and to set forth various obligations of the Parties related to the Project;

WHEREAS, the construction of the Project is expected to yield significant advantages for the Parish, as it will, among other benefits, provide the Parish with a newly constructed road in the right of way for Noel Street and facilitate connectivity between the Noel Street right-of-way and Lorraine Street;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Louisiana Revised Statute R.S. 48:701 a parish governing authority is authorized to revoke the dedication of all roads, streets, and alleyways when the roads, streets and alleyways have been abandoned or are no longer needed for public purpose;

WHEREAS, the St. Charles Parish Code of Ordinances requires that the Parish Council, the governing authority of the Parish, adopt an ordinance in order for any property owned by the Parish to be abandoned;

WHEREAS, the Parish has agreed to revoke, abandon or cause the abandonment of a portion of Jonathan Street due to its current state of deterioration and disrepair, limited use; anticipated maintenance costs required to bring Jonathan Street up to minimum standards of the Parish, and interest in availing itself of the benefits of the Project;

WHEREAS, upon their completion the Parish has agreed to accept the dedication of roads and to further accept title to certain roadbeds, as more fully set forth by this Agreement;

WHEREAS, the Parish expects to receive real and substantial benefits under this Agreement in exchange for the obligations incurred by the Parish hereunder; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into this Agreement under the Constitution and other relevant constitutional and statutory authority, all to provide for the construction, expansion and/or extension of the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits hereby conferred and other good and valuable consideration, the Companies and the Parish hereby covenant and agree with each other as follows:

ARTICLE 1
DEFINITIONS; INTERPRETATION

Section 1.1 Definitions. As used herein and unless specifically defined in the text of this Agreement, the capitalized terms used herein shall have the meanings set forth this Section 1.1 unless the context otherwise requires, and such meanings shall be equally applicable to both singular and plural forms of the terms herein defined.

“*Act*” means Article VII, Section 14(C) of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, as amended, and other constitutional and statutory authority.

“*Agreement*” means this Cooperative Endeavor Agreement dated as of _____, 2024 between the Companies and the Parish, as the same may be supplemented or amended from time to time.

“*Completion Date*” means the date upon which the Project is completed in accordance with Parish standards for public roads and ownership of Noel Street and the Connector Road (defined below) is accepted by the Parish.

“*Completion Deadline*” means the Completion Date or 5:00 pm central time on January 31, 2025 whichever is first to occur, but with allowances for delay(s) due to permitting, weather, labor, supplier and force majeure events.

“*Constitution*” means the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, as amended.

“*Companies*” means Bunge North America, Inc., a New York corporation authorized to and doing business in the State of Louisiana and Bunge Chevron AG Renewables LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, their affiliates, successors and assigns and any surviving, resulting, or transferee corporation, company, partnership, or individual.

“*Effective Date*” means the date of this Agreement.

“*Parish*” means the Parish of St. Charles, Louisiana, including without limitation the St. Charles Parish Council, along with the agencies, boards and departments forming the Parish governmental structure.

“*Project*” means design, development, construction, expansion and/or extension of streets as described in Exhibit A attached hereto, in accordance with standards applicable to construction of roads set forth in ordinances and regulations of the Parish applicable as of the Effective Date.

“*Resub Plat*” means the Plat Showing Resubdivision dated February 5, 2024 and prepared by Michael Blanchard of Acadia Land Surveying, a copy of which is attached to the Agreement as Exhibit B.

“*State*” means the State of Louisiana.

“*Term*” shall have the meaning assigned to such term in Section 2.1(a) hereof.

ARTICLE 2
TERMS; EFFECTIVE DATE;
COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR REPRESENTATIONS

Section 2.1 Term.

(a) *Term*. The term of this Agreement shall commence upon the execution of this Agreement by all Parties hereto and shall continue until the Completion Date (the “*Term*”).

(b) *Termination of Obligations*. At the expiration or sooner termination of the Term, all obligations of the Parties hereunder shall terminate unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Parties.

ARTICLE 3
REPRESENTATIONS AND COVENANTS OF THE PARTIES

Section 3.1 Representations and Covenants of the Companies. The Companies hereby represent, covenant, and agree as follows:

(a) BNA is a corporation, duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York and in good standing under the laws of the State of New York, has full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and any other document to which it is a party and to carry out its obligations hereunder and thereunder, and has duly authorized the execution and delivery of this Agreement and all other documents contemplated hereby and thereby.

(b) BCAR is a limited liability company, duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Delaware and in good standing under the laws of the State of Delaware, has full power and authority to enter into this Agreement and any other document to which it is a party and to carry out its obligations hereunder and thereunder, and has duly authorized the execution and delivery of this Agreement and all other documents contemplated hereby and thereby.

(c) BCAR shall make a good faith effort to obtain all necessary approvals required from federal, state, and local governmental agencies in connection with the construction of the Project.

(d) To the best of the Companies’ knowledge, there is no action, suit, proceeding, or investigation at law or in equity before or by any court, public board, or body pending or threatened against the Companies or, to the best knowledge of the Companies, any basis therefore, wherein an unfavorable decision, ruling, or finding would adversely affect the transactions contemplated hereby or which in any way would adversely affect, as respects the Companies, the validity of this Agreement or any agreement or instrument to which the Companies are a party that is used or contemplated for use in the consummation of the transactions contemplated hereby.

Section 3.2 Representations and Covenants of the Parish. The Parish hereby represents, covenants, and agrees as follows:

(a) The Parish has the authority to enter into this Agreement and all other documents contemplated hereby and to carry out the terms hereof.

(b) The Parish has taken or caused to be taken or will take and/or cause to be taken all necessary and proper action to authorize the execution, issuance, and delivery of and the performance of its

obligations under this Agreement and any and all instruments and documents required to be executed or delivered pursuant hereto or in connection herewith.

(c) There is no action, suit, investigation, or proceeding pending of which the Parish has been served notice, or to its best knowledge, threatened, against the Parish, before any court, arbitrator, or administrative or governmental body, or insurance underwriting agency which could reasonably be expected to materially adversely affect the ability of the Parish to comply with its obligations hereunder or in connection with the transactions contemplated hereby.

ARTICLE 4
OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARTIES

Section 4.1 Obligations of the Companies. In return for the Parish’s obligations hereunder, the Companies hereby agree to undertake the following obligations:

(a) As soon as reasonably possible following the Completion Date, BCAR (or, if applicable, the Companies) shall convey or dedicate to the Parish:

(i) the road constructed in the Noel Street right of way; and

(ii) Parcel D as shown on the Resub Plat along with the road constructed thereon to connect Noel Street to Jean Street (“*Connector Road*”), provided, however, BCAR may acquire Parcel D from BNA prior to the Completion Date.

(b) BCAR shall be solely responsible for all aspects of the construction of the Project, including but not limited to design, right-of-way acquisition, engineering, construction and testing. The design plans will be approved by the Parish’s Public Works Engineering Department prior to the start of construction. Width and specifications for the construction of roads and turns between Lorraine Street and Jonathan Street shall be subject to the mutual consent of BCAR and Parish, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed. The construction of the Project is conditioned on BCAR receiving all necessary federal, state, and local permits. The Project shall be designed and constructed pursuant to and in accordance with Parish standards for road construction. The Project shall not include any future maintenance, repair, replacement, upgrade, or changes to those improvements following acceptance by the Parish, except to the extent of any warranty required by the St. Charles Parish Code of Ordinances as of the Effective Date.

(c) By separate agreements, the Companies shall grant a right of access within the same or similar boundaries to Jonathan Street (“*Access Area*”), provided that upon completion of the Project use of the Access Area shall be for limited vehicular passage and access. The Access Area shall be a private right of access granted by separate agreements to G.H.F., L.L.C., St. Charles Parish, and Entergy Louisiana, LLC, their successors and assigns.

(d) Upon completion of the Project, BCAR (or, if applicable, the Companies) shall dedicate or cause the conveyance or dedication to the Parish of Parcel D and the roads constructed as part of the Project.

(e) BCAR shall indemnify the Parish from and against all claims arising out of performance of work on the Project by BCAR, its agents, contractors, representatives and employees.

Section 4.2 Obligations of the Parish. The Parish hereby agrees to undertake the following obligations:

(a) The Parish shall adopt an ordinance to declare Jonathan Street as abandoned, citing its current state of deterioration and disrepair, limited use, and the alternative to Jonathan Street to be established by the completion of the Project by the Company as the reason it no longer fulfills a public purpose.

(b) Upon request of BCAR, the Parish will cooperate in good faith toward the issuance of any permits for the Project that are under the jurisdiction of the Parish.

(c) The Parish shall have the opportunity to inspect the Project while under construction. The Parish shall accept the Project upon its completion pursuant to the terms of the permit issued for the Project.

(d) The execution of this Agreement shall not constitute an acceptance by the Parish of any road improvements. The Parish shall take ownership of Noel Street and the Connector Road, and be responsible for their repair and maintenance upon the Parish accepting the Project as substantially complete, which roads will be constructed in accordance with Parish standards. In addition to accepting Noel Street and the Connector Road, the Parish shall accept title to Parcel D upon the dedication and/or the donation of Parcel D to the Parish.

ARTICLE 5
DEFAULT AND REMEDIES

Section 5.1 Default. An “Event of Default” under this Agreement shall occur if any party hereunder shall fail to perform any of the obligations required in this Agreement and if such event shall continue for ninety (90) days after the non-defaulting party shall have given the defaulting party notice specifying such failure and demanding that the same be cured. If, by reason of the nature thereof, such failure cannot with due diligence be wholly cured within such ninety (90) day period, such cure period may be extended for such period as may be necessary to complete the curing of the same with the agreement of the other party.

Section 5.2 Remedies. Upon a default under Section 5.1, each party may proceed to protect and enforce its rights by suits in equity or at law, whether for the specific performance of any obligation, covenant or agreement contained in this Agreement or aid of the execution of any power herein granted, or for the enforcement of any other appropriate legal or equitable remedy, as it shall deem most effectual to protect and enforce the obligations of the other hereunder, except for consequential damages, including, but not limited to, loss of sales, income or profit, which shall not be recoverable by a party from the others.

ARTICLE 6
MISCELLANEOUS

Section 6.1 Relationship of the Parties. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement, nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to constitute either Party a partner, agent, or legal representative of the other Party or to create any fiduciary relationship between the Parties.

Section 6.2 Amendments. Neither this Agreement nor any provision hereof may be changed, modified, amended, or waived except by written agreement duly executed by all Parties.

Section 6.3 Notices. Any notices or communications required or permitted hereunder shall be in writing and shall be sufficiently given if sent by registered or certified mail return receipt requested, postage prepaid, by nationally recognized overnight delivery service, signature required upon signed receipt or by facsimile transmission to the following:

Changes in the respective addresses to which such notices may be directed may be made from time to time by any Party by written notice to the other Party. Notices and communications given by mail hereunder shall be deemed to have been given five (5) days after the date of dispatch; all other notices shall be deemed to have been given upon receipt.

Section 6.4 Entire Agreement. This Agreement, together with the exhibits attached hereto, constitutes the entire agreement of the Parties hereby and supersedes any and all prior oral or written agreements, understandings, proposals, representations or warranties relating to this Agreement.

Section 6.5 Further Assurances. Each Party agrees to execute and deliver any instruments and to perform any acts as may be necessary or reasonably requested by the other Party in order to give full effect to this Agreement.

Section 6.6 No Third Party Beneficiaries. Unless specifically set forth herein, neither Party to this Agreement shall have any obligation to any third party as a result of this Agreement.

Section 6.7 Successors and Assigns. This Agreement shall extend to, be binding upon, and inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto, their respective legal representatives, successors and assigns.

Section 6.8 Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between Parties and all Parties represent that no oral or conflicting written representations have been made. No amendment or modification to this Agreement shall be enforceable unless reduced to writing and executed by all Parties. This Agreement shall not impact any rights enforceable by a third party (other than a permitted successor or assignee bound to this Agreement). Waiver by a Party of any default shall not be construed as a waiver of any other default.

Section 6.9 Validity and Enforceability. If any provision of this Agreement is found to be invalid, void or unenforceable by any court having jurisdiction, the Parties shall use commercially

reasonable efforts to promptly modify this Agreement to give effect to the original intention of the Parties. All other provisions shall remain in effect.

Section 6.10 Applicable Law. This Agreement and the rights and duties of the Parties hereunder shall be governed by and construed, enforced and performed in accordance with the laws of the State of Louisiana, without regard to principles of conflicts of law. To the extent enforceable at such time, each Party waives its respective right to any jury trial with respect to any litigation arising under or in connection with the Agreement.

Section 6.11 Venue. The Parties agree that the sole and proper venue for any legal proceedings arising hereunder shall be the 29th Judicial District Court, St. Charles Parish, Louisiana.

Section 6.12 Further Agreements. The Parties covenant and agree that they will execute such other and further agreements or documents as are or may become necessary or convenient to effectuate and carry out the purpose of this Agreement.

Section 6.13 Rules of Interpretation. Unless the context clearly indicates to the contrary, the following rules shall apply to the interpretation and construction of this Agreement:

(a) Words importing the singular number shall include the plural number and vice versa.

(b) All references herein to particular articles or sections are references to articles or sections of this Agreement.

(c) The captions and headings herein are solely for the convenience of references and shall not constitute part of this Agreement, nor shall they affect its meaning, construction, or effect.

(d) The terms "hereby," "hereof," "hereto," "herein," "hereinbelow," "hereunder" or any similar terms as used in this Agreement refer to the Agreement in its entirety and not the particular article or section of this Agreement in which they appear, and the term "hereafter" means after and the term "heretofore" means before the date of execution of this Agreement.

Section 6.14 Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument. A facsimile or similar transmission of a counterpart signed by a Party hereto, or a copy of a counterpart signed by a Party hereto, will be regarded as an original signed by such Party for the purposes hereof.

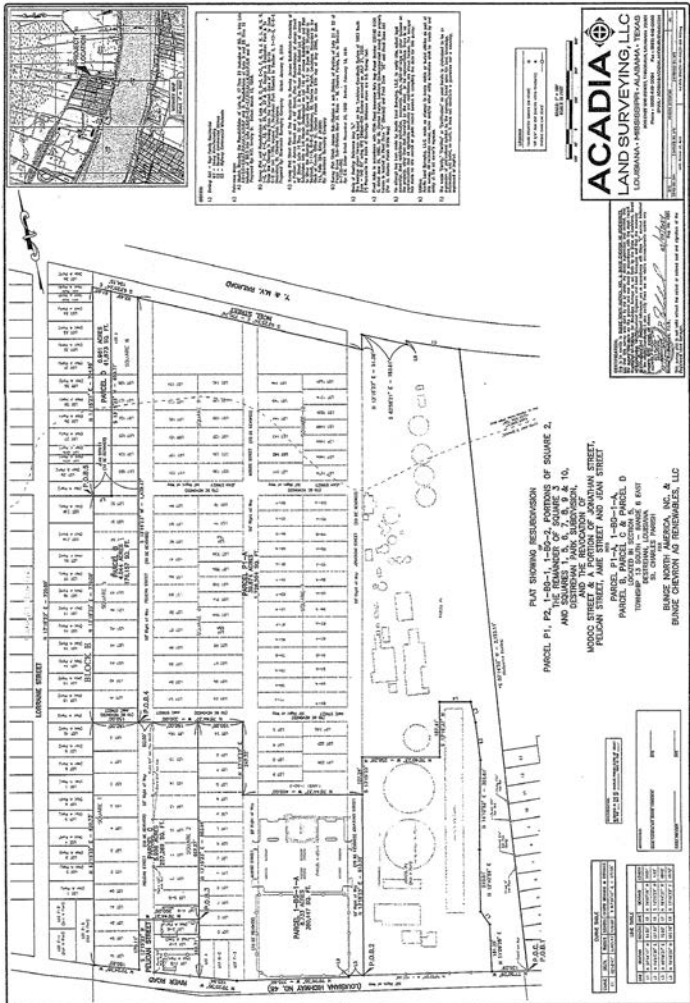

Box 302, Hahnville, LA 70057; authorized pursuant to Ordinance No. 24-4-3 adopted by St. Charles Parish Council on the 1st day of April, 2024, a certified copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof;

APPEARER declared unto me, Notary, as follows:

In the dedication contained in the plat map for the Destrehan Park Subdivision (that plat map being made by Hotard & Webb, Civil Engineers on November 23, 1951, approved and accepted by the Police Jury of St. Charles Parish, and filed in the public records of the Clerk of Court of St. Charles Parish) (the "Destrehan Park Plat Map"), the roadbeds and streets in the Destrehan Park Subdivision, including Jonathan Street (depicted on the Destrehan Park Plat Map as "Destrehan Street"), Modoc Street, Pelican Street (depicted on the Destrehan Park Plat Map as "St. Charles Street"), Amie Street, and Jean Street were dedicated to and accepted by St. Charles Parish as public streets bearing the dimensions set out on the Destrehan Park Plat Map.

Since the dedication and construction of the streets in the Destrehan Park Subdivision and until recently, Jonathan Street, Modoc Street, Pelican Street, Amie Street, and Jean Street have been used and maintained by St. Charles Parish as public streets. Due to a change in the use of the property adjacent thereto, Jonathan Street (that portion depicted on the attached Plan of Revocation), Modoc Street (in its entirety), Pelican Street (that portion depicted on the attached Plan of Revocation), Amie Street (that portion depicted on the attached Plan of Revocation), and Jean Street (that portion depicted on the attached Plan of Revocation) no longer serve a public function and are no longer needed for public use.

The landowners adjoining these streets and portions thereof are as follows (the "Adjoining Landowners"): Bunge Chevron Ag Renewables LLC and Bunge North America, Inc.

Because these streets no longer serve a public function, the Adjoining Landowners have requested and the Parish of St. Charles has agreed to revoke the dedication of and abandon all of its rights, title, and interests in and to Jonathan Street (that portion depicted on the attached Plan of Revocation), Modoc Street (in its entirety), Pelican Street (that portion depicted on the attached Plan of Revocation), Amie Street (that portion depicted on the attached Plan of Revocation), and Jean Street (that portion depicted on the attached Plan of Revocation).

By operation of law, upon the revocation of these streets, ownership of the property underlying the right-of-way for these streets will transfer to the adjacent landowners. The property is depicted on the attached Plan of Revocation, by Acadia Land Surveying, LLC (the "Revocation Plat") and the attached Plan of Resubdivision, by Acadia Land Surveying, LLC (the "Resubdivision Plat").

Without any warranty whatsoever, but with full substitution and subrogation in and to all the rights and actions of warranty which it has or may have, the said St. Charles Parish does hereby convey, transfer, assign, set over, abandon and quitclaim all of its rights, title and interests, and further waives and releases in favor of the Adjoining Landowners all rights to use the surface of the property associated with oil, gas, and other minerals and for any and all related mineral operations and production, in and to Jonathan Street (that portion depicted on the attached Plan of Revocation), Modoc Street (in its entirety), Pelican Street (that portion depicted on the attached Plan of Revocation), Amie Street (that portion depicted on the attached Plan of Revocation), Jean Street (that portion depicted on the attached Plan of Revocation) and, for avoidance of doubt, the land covered by and embraced in the streets, as follows, in accordance with and as directed by the provisions of La. Ordinance No. 23-3-6 to rescind Ordinance No. 23-3-6 and to approve a purchase and/or expropriation of a 1,482 sq. ft. perpetual sewer servitude, a 2,223 sq. ft. temporary construction servitude, and a 1,767 sq. ft. perpetual access servitude over property owned by John T. Lambert, Jr. and Michael C. Melancon designated as Lot 1A of the John Lambert Tract for the St. Rose Sewer Network Upgrade Project.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 23-3-6 adopted on March 27, 2023, by the St. Charles Parish Council, which approved the purchase and/or expropriation of a 1,482 sq. ft. perpetual sewer servitude and a 2,223 sq. ft. temporary construction servitude over property owned by John T. Lambert, Jr. and Michael C. Melancon in the not-to-exceed appraised value of \$813.28, and authorized the Parish President to execute any and all documents necessary to complete said purchase and/or expropriation on behalf of St. Charles Parish; and,

WHEREAS, the servitude agreement was revised to include the required perpetual access servitude and thus Ordinance No. 23-3-6 needs to be rescinded; and,

WHEREAS, St. Charles Parish is undertaking an upgrade to the St. Rose Sewer Network; and,
WHEREAS, the St. Rose Sewer Network has a history of problems related to deficiencies in the network; and,
WHEREAS, the proposed sewer network upgrade requires the acquisition of a temporary construction servitude, a perpetual sewer servitude, and a perpetual access servitude over Lot 1A of the John Lambert Tract, Sections 41 and 43, Township 12 South, Range 9 East, St. Charles Parish, Louisiana to construct, operate, and maintain a sewer line; and,
WHEREAS, the sewer network upgrade project and the acquisition of the hereinafter described servitudes are in the public's best interest and is in satisfaction of a public need; and,
