Fundraiser benefits parish deputy hospitalized with heart failure

The Fraternal Order of Police-St. Charles Lodge is holding a fundraiser Saturday, Oct. 11 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. to benefit Deputy Nick Lege and his family. Lege, a 17-year deputy, is battling heart failure linked to a genetic condition. Last month, he was transported to a hospital in North Carolina to await a heart and liver transplant.

Saturday's fundraiser will take place in the parking lot by St. Charles Parish Sheriff's Office training building at 220 Judge Edward Dufresne Parkway in Luling. Plates by Big Al's Seafood will be available for \$10. All proceeds will go to the Lege family. Jambalaya and white beans or shrimp and catfish plates will be served.

Arielle Lege, Nick's wife, has stayed by Nick's side, living in the ICU and rarely leaving the room. She has left the hospital only twice since they arrived on Sept. 5.

"I don't want Nick to wake up to strangers," Arielle, who also works for the sheriff's office, said. "He's been through so much. I just kind of want

Tutoring center offers free, low-cost services to parish students

It started in 2018 with just one tutor. Now, the St. Charles Tutoring Lab offers peer tutoring for all grades across all subject areas, support for college-level coursework and ACT prep. There are 10 tutors, including both peer tutors and teacher tutors. The lab currently serves about 20 students with dozens of students across the parish using the lab each year.

The lab, which partners with United Way of St. Charles Parish, also offers free tutoring for students at Luling Elementary, St. Rose Elementary and R.K. Smith Middle School.

STEM fair returns to library after two-year hiatus

The STEM fair will return to the library Oct. 16 at the West Regional Library in Luling from 5 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.

The library last hosted the STEM fair in 2022, said Lauren Campo Pitz, the assistant director at the St. Charles Parish Library.

“There was no real reason that we did not have a STEM fair the past couple of years,” Pitz said. “Time just got away from us.”

But this year, Entergy reached out to the library to ask about returning the fair.

“We said yes with no hesitation,” Pitz said.

Entergy’s Waterford 3, a nuclear plant in Killona, has partnered with the library for the STEM fair since 2018, when 350 people attended the fair. The

Students from across St. Charles Parish gathered in Luling Tuesday to sharpen and show off their artistic skills, while becoming part of a bit of history.

The talented art students were part of a workshop connected to the Trailblazer Memorial Project, ultimately the creation of a permanent public art installation to honor the 43 students who integrated St. Charles Parish Public Schools in 1965. The

Hahnville ROTC gesture ‘very, very moving’ for Air Force veteran

It may have seemed like a simple gesture, but to George Guhman it meant the world.

“I’m very sentimental,” Guhman said.

The Hahnville JROTC helped bring that emotion to the forefront. The cadets folded and presented with dignity the flag of Guhman’s grandfather, the late Manuel P. Guhman, a World War I veteran. Sgt. Richard Lochren, Hahnville’s Air Force JROTC instructor, called the ceremony a proud and emotional moment for everyone in attendance.

Guhman, who is a veteran of the Air Force that served from 1961 to 1965, said the cadets went above and beyond any expectations he had and said their gesture was kind and impactful.

“It was very, very moving to me,” said Guhman. “I didn’t expect this, but it did happen and I’m very happy they did this.”

Guhman, 84, has had the flag for many years.

“I just wanted it tightened up,” he said. “I went to the police

Bible Center Church reopens years after Hurricane Ida damaged building

Four years after Hurricane Ida severely damaged its building on Barton Avenue, the Bible Center Church in Luling will hold a Welcome Back service Sunday, Oct. 12 at 10:45 a.m.

Dr. John Brannen, a longtime member of the church, said everyone who helped the church rebuild, all former and current members of the church, and anyone with an interest in joining the church are invited to the celebration.

The church spent most of the last three years meeting at Valero Community College in Boutte while its building on Barton Avenue underwent major reconstruction, including roof replacement and building code upgrades.

"The people of BCC, which is what the real 'church' consists of – not the buildings, per se – are so excited to be back home in their own church campus facilities," Dr. Brannen said. "We are looking forward to thanking everyone involved in getting the church back home and rejoicing with us in this 'come-back' story."

The church holds a special meaning for Dr. Brannen, who joined in 1971 when the group would meet at Mimosa Park Elementary School. He met his wife at BCC and all four of his children were baptized there.

"You could say that it is a big deal and a great blessing for me to return to my home, my church home," he said.

Dr. Brannen said that BCC consists of people from many church backgrounds, including Bible Church, Baptist and Catholic faiths, among others.

"BCC's focus is on teaching the Bible from cover to cover – as the name Bible Center Church indicates," Dr. Brannen said. "At the same time, the people of

BCC want to be encouraging to all who attend, to worship God and to lift each other up through good times and bad."

BCC welcomed a new pastor in May after former Pastor Gary McCall retired after 30 years of service. Pastor Dale Gooding of South Carolina and his wife, Wendy, joined the church in May.

"Pastor Dale is a great teacher and leader and is passionate about the vision and opportunity for BCC to serve the spiritual needs of the East and West banks of St Charles Parish," Dr. Brannen said.

In his first sermon at the church on June 8, Pastor Gooding said he discussed the Bible's teachings on the importance of the local church.

"Churches are an intimate part of a Christian's life, even the facility," Gooding said. "I mean, the people are the church, but the building gathers those people. And so, after a while, you have a sense of community and belonging. It's like going home."

Gooding, a veteran who has a master's degree in ministry from Bob Jones University, spent 17 years pastoring in

South Carolina and four years pastoring in Michigan. He and his wife also served short term missions in Panama, St. Lucia and Ghana, and West Africa.

The church's worship services at 10:45 a.m. on Sundays start with song and prayer, followed by a sermon. The services close with a song and prayer.

"First century Christian churches did exactly that," Gooding said. "There wasn't a lot of pomp and circumstance and exaltation of men and things like that. It was basically getting together and praying and preaching. So, we follow that model."

Gooding said his philosophy of ministry rests on exaltation, edification, education and evangelism.

"The church comes together as a group of people who are, to put it in simple terms, saved sinners, and we worship God first and foremost," Gooding said.

Edification is about encouraging one another and building on another up. Education is learning and teaching the Bible in a responsible way, and evangelism is about sharing the gospel with the world, Gooding said.

"The church is a gathering place for believing people within the community, but then secondarily, it becomes a beacon of light for people outside the church," Gooding said.

He said he wanted the community to know that Bible Center Church will offer a responsible understanding of the Bible

"We're going to teach it to them, so we want to share the gospel with people," Gooding said. "And then we want to disciple people. So that's our two primary focal points: evangelism and discipleship."

be that comfort for him. I want to be the one that he sees so at least he's not scared, not alone."

Arielle had hoped that Nick's transfer to Duke hospital would be the starting line of his recovery and improvement. But he has experienced several setbacks since his arrival. On Tuesday, he underwent tracheotomy surgery, which doctors hope will help his lungs and body heal enough for a dual transplant. Before the surgery, Nick had undergone several intubations because his oxygen levels declined rapidly.

The day of the tracheotomy surgery was also Arielle and Nick's 14th wedding anniversary.

"We can celebrate later," Arielle said of their anniversary. "You really learn what's important in life when something like this happens."

The couple share a son, 10-year-old Garin, who is currently staying with family and friends in St. Charles Parish while Arielle tends to Nick. One of the hardest

moments so far was when Arielle and Nick had to say goodbye to Garin after his recent visit to North Carolina.

"Not knowing when the next time was going to be, when I would see him again, was hard," Arielle said. "Because you live in a life of just uncertainty for everything."

Doctors don't know when Nick will be ready for a transplant. Arielle has prepared herself for at least two or three months of waiting.

"There's that fear that I'm either leaving this hospital with him having a new heart and a new life, or I'm going back home as a widow with a ten-year-old," Arielle said.

Arielle is trying to hold it together for Nick and her son, but she is also juggling the job of updating friends and family on Nick's care, communicating with various teams of doctors and making tough medical choices when Nick can't consent – like getting the tracheotomy.

"I'm very concerned, did I make the right decision?" Arielle said. "Would he consider this suffering? But ultimately his goal was transplant and he's been through so much."

Arielle sends updates to family and friends on social media. Nick has three adult children from a previous marriage, and Arielle emails updates to Nick's son, who is currently in the Navy. Nick's twin daughters visited him in the hospital in late September.

Nick's health issues began in 2016, a year after Garin was born. It took years for doctors to get a genetic test, which showed that Nick had a genetic condition linked to heart failure.

"I feel if we would have had that sooner, we would have known how it would progress, because it's a very fast progression, it's not a normal progression," Arielle said.

Arielle's focus now is on Nick's health, but she is also

preparing for difficult financial decisions. After a transplant, doctors require that patients live 30 minutes or less from a hospital for at least the first 30 days. Arielle and Nick recently built their dream home in St. Charles Parish and Arielle hopes to keep it. Large medical bills are on the horizon.

"The fundraiser will be helpful just because we don't know how long we will be [in North Carolina]," Arielle said. "We would also ask for prayers."

She said she is thankful for the St. Charles Parish community.

"It's a wonderful, wonderful parish," she said. "They have been so supportive."

returned and her fight is once again ongoing.

Thus, this year's step aerobics night will not only be aimed at spreading cancer awareness, but also toward honoring Sanchez for her positive impact at Destrehan and providing a lift in her battle.

The event will take place Oct. 21 from 6 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. at the Destrehan High gym and its theme is "Give Cancer the Boot."

"We started this as an outreach for our students to give back to the community and spread awareness," said Lynette Matthews, a teacher and track and field coach at Destrehan who was among those originating the event. "Three of the four who were diagnosed were in my department, and all four were diagnosed around the same time."

Sanchez has worked at Destrehan for 20 years – in every way, she's part of the Wildcat family.

"She's basically the mother of Destrehan High School," Matthews said. "She takes care of pretty much everybody, faculty and students included, with anything they need. She's just a phenomenal person."

"We have a teacher's lounge that she furnished herself with all the amenities. You'd think you were in a 5-star hotel with everything she's supplied for the teachers. And every quarter she puts on a teacher's luncheon and usually it's out of her pocket – she treats us like royalty. She loves to just sit and watch people enjoy what she's prepared for them. And it's just phenomenal. And then as far as students, she's purchased P.E. uniforms for them, school uniforms."

And she's always got snacks at the ready.

"They come in and ask, 'Oh, Ms. Paula, do you have any snacks? And she has a whole snack cabinet – if you're hungry, she's got something for you,'" Matthews said. "Just an amazing person."

Matthews said the event is free of charge and everyone is welcome to attend – no sign-up is required.

"We're just going to display some things that we do in

our physical education department as it relates to step aerobics, just basically encouraging healthy lifestyles as a prevention of cancer and also as an aid in the treatment as well," Matthews said. "Because the healthier you are, it helps you through that treatment just a little bit better."

T-Shirts are made for the theme of each event and this year they are being sold to raise funds to help Sanchez offset some of her medical expenses.

Group and class routines will be showcased and there will be a guest speaker and presentation. There will also be a poetry reading toward the night's theme. And in the event's tradition, the night will conclude with a balloon release celebrating cancer survivors, supporting those battling now and remembering loved ones lost.

"Students are going to be performing their various routines that they learned in the class and that they kind of self-choreographed," said Matthews. "And we're



going to allow those in the audience to join in on any of those routines if they feel like they can keep up. We'll show them how to do it and then they can engage in it. It's going to be a fun atmosphere."

Johnel Bryant Robinson, who earned her doctorate in education leadership, opened the lab with the mission of providing students in St. Charles Parish with affordable, high-quality tutoring that is accessible to all families.

"We believe that personalized tutoring should not be out of reach – it should be available to anyone who desires academic support aligned with today's school curriculum," Robinson said.

The lab meets students at parish libraries in Destrehan and Luling and offers virtual tutoring. Teacher tutors serve as mentors for the lab's peer tutors while also supporting students directly when requested. The peer teachers are high school students, many of

whom are involved in the Educators Rising program at the St. Charles Parish School's Satellite Center.

"These students are recommended by teachers, counselors and administrators and they work hand-in-hand with families to provide strong academic support," Robinson said.

Robinson said the lab also offers Mindful Moments sessions at \$25. These sessions are designed to help students build focus, manage stress and strengthen resilience.

"We know that success in school is about more than just academics – it's also about confidence, resilience and emotional well-being," Robinson said. "That's why we make it a priority to inspire and encourage both our students and our tutors."

The lab motivates students with inspirational bracelets with quotes like "press forward" and "the only limit is you."

"By focusing on both academics and mindset, we ensure that every student not only improves in their schoolwork but also builds the confidence to face challenges with positivity and determination," Robinson said.

Robinson said she wants parents to know that the lab's goal is not just to help with schoolwork, but to partner with families in creating long-term success.

"Whether through free services made possible by the United Way or affordable paid sessions, we are here to meet families where they are and give students the tools to thrive," she said.

2019 STEM fair was even bigger with 470 people in attendance.

“We combined our resources and expertise and came up with an event that highlighted various STEM fields, Pitz said. “We had hands-on science activities all over the library, so everyone was able to spread out and explore.”

The Waterford 3 plant, which will celebrate its 40th anniversary in St. Charles Parish this year, has been a longtime partner with the library, helping to support the summer reading programs and storytimes.

This year’s fair will incorporate the library’s planetarium and makerspace. Attendees will explore the library and participate in a variety of hands-on science activities led by Entergy volunteers and library staff.

“We want everyone to know that there will be activities for all ages, so everyone is invited to come out,” Pitz said. “It will be a great way for kids to get exposed to science in a low-pressure, fun environment.”

Registration for the event is not required. The event is free and open to the public.

department; they didn’t know how to do it. And then someone at Dot’s (Diner) mentioned they’re in ROTC, and I said I’ll go over and try it.”

He spoke with Lochren and they set up a meeting a few days later.

“I thought they’d take the flag, unfold it, fold it up, put it in the triangle case and give it back to me. They did a lot more than that,” Guhman said. “I had no idea if (the flag was going to fall apart of not – it’s been folded for many years, since 1955. And they did it ceremoniously ... it meant a lot to me.”

The cadets presented Guhman with an 8x10 picture frame with his name and his grandfather’s name displayed on it.

Guhman’s grandfather passed away when the former was just 11 years old. The two men hail from a military family. Guhman’s father, younger brother and uncle all served in addition to his grandfather.

Guhman spent two years in California and two years in Germany during his time with the Air Force. He served during

the Cuban Missile Crisis.

“Very few people realize that was the closest this country ever came to World War III,” said Guhman. “Thankfully, it didn’t happen.”

His grandfather’s flag – a 48-star flag – serves as a proud representation of the family’s service.

and contributed to what will be a lasting community memorial. Bas-relief a sculptural technique where figures or designs are carved or molded to project only slightly from a flat background, but no part is completely detached from the supporting surface.

The workshop was held over three sessions for high school, middle school and elementary school students.

“I thought it was really important for them to go through that process because of STEM ... if they can connect what they’re doing in the classroom, building with their hands and contributing to the community, I think that’s a wonderful thing,” Monk said. “We look at the past, we have our trailblazers, but then these kids are the future. They connect to this and they’re going to one day be adults, come past this (memorial) and say, ‘Wow, I was a part of that.’”

In 2022, the school system debuted

the documentary Trailblazers, which highlighted the experiences of African-American students who volunteered to attend previously all-white schools in St. Charles Parish during desegregation in 1965.

Those students volunteered to be the first to integrate in the midst of the civil rights movement.

Ulysses Frontha, a longtime Destrehan High School teacher and one of the 43 original trailblazers as a student, approached School Board Member Ellis Alexander several years ago with the idea of recognizing the first African-American students who volunteered to attend previously all-white schools in St. Charles Parish.

Alexander requested a school system committee to be formed to develop plans for a celebration, but the celebration was delayed by several years due to Covid and Hurricane Ida. The committee

determined a video was needed to be able to tell the stories of these students – a documentary which current and future students and the general public would be able to view and learn from regarding the school system’s past and how it has led the system to where it is today.

The documentary, produced by Mason Dauphin, was nominated for a regional Emmy by the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences.

In 1965, St. Charles Parish Public Schools became one of the first five school systems in Louisiana to voluntarily begin desegregation through the Freedom of Choice Plan. This plan allowed African-American students to transfer to previously all-white schools within the parish.

“The monument is going to celebrate the bravery of those 43 students,” said Regina McMillan, SCPPS Director of

Public Information. “They weren’t forced to, they stepped up and volunteered.”

They truly inspired others to follow in their footsteps. Approximately 43 students throughout the parish transferred schools in the middle of the 1965-1966 school year, and that number more than doubled to 112 students in the following school year.

The project is scheduled to be completed by early 2026. McMillan noted that during the annual Martin Luther King Day march down River Road, one of the stops is traditionally at the central office, and the memorial could add to the experience.

Hahnville hosts undefeated Thibodaux for Homecoming

Former St. James star turning around THS in 1st year as coach; Hahnville finds spark from sophomore

While it's Homecoming week for Hahnville, it's also in a way a homecoming for Thibodaux head coach Lowell Narcisse, who is no stranger to the River Parishes.

During his playing days, Narcisse led St. James to a state final appearance and left the school as a four-star recruit. Narcisse heads over from Ascension Catholic, where he guided the Bulldogs to the Division IV Select state semifinals and an 11-2 record in his first and only season as head coach there.

He and Thibodaux (5-0, 2-0) visit Tiger Stadium in Boutte this Friday night to take on Hahnville (4-1, 1-1).

Thibodaux went 4-6 last season, but under Narcisse, the turnaround is well underway – Thibodaux already has more wins than last season to go with an undefeated record. THS reached the playoffs before bowing out in round one to Mandeville, 31-18.

Hahnville defeated Thibodaux 45-21 last year at THS.

HHS head coach Greg Boyne said that it's clear on film that Narcisse has the program heading in the right direction.

"You can tell right away they're playing with a lot of energy, discipline and they've got the kids buying into the system on both sides of the ball," said Boyne. "He played for Coach (Dwain) Jenkins and Coach (Robert) Valdez and those are guys who have historically built winning programs, so he knows the right way to do it. And you can see they're doing a lot right to be where they are."

Boyne said Thibodaux isn't a team built around a few superstars - it's more of an ensemble.

"The quarterback does a good job of running the offense and the skill guys are very athletic. They're not overly big. They remind me of us in a lot of ways," Boyne said. "Multiple on offense, they bounce between tempos, use motion a lot and they run from a ton of formations."

Damien Robinson keys the offense at quarterback in his first season as starter. He accounted for five touchdowns in a decisive win over Assumption. Cemiyan Adams has had some explosive games at running

back – he scored four times in a blowout win over L.B. Landry in Week 2. Adams has played well in the stead of Amari Griffin, who entered the season as starter before being injured. Thibodaux operates behind an offensive line that brings some size.

Defensively, Thibodaux mixes up coverages on the back end and Boyne said it does some things Hahnville hasn't seen a lot of before.

"They'll run some split coverages – one side of the field might be man, the other zone. It's a challenge for sure," Boyne said.

Jeremiah Jones is among the most experienced players on the defensive side and the defensive tackle helps key things up front.

Thibodaux hasn't been tested as Hahnville has at times this season, but has been dominant in all five of its wins over South Lafourche, Central Lafourche, Assumption, Landry and its most recent win, a 25-6 victory over East St. John last week.

Notably, the Thibodaux defense has allowed just 39 combined points in 2025, and just 12 over the past three weeks; Hahnville, meanwhile, has topped that total three times in games thus far.

HOMECOMING – Beyond just the homecoming festivities, Boyne said it's simply good to have his team set to play back on its home field after two weeks on the road.

He's confident his team will handle any potential distractions that come with the week's celebration.

"It's a pretty good time for us because Thibodaux's a team that demands the kids' attention and the coaches' attention. We want the kids to enjoy the week and all the festivities, but I don't think they'll get too caught up in it. We have the motorcade (Wednesday) and after that a lot is kind of out the way," Boyne said.

EMERGING WEAPON – Jackson Porter's done a bit of everything for Hahnville this season, but Friday was the first game he primarily focused on one position – running back.

He took to it well. Running as the second back behind

Fabian Celestine, Porter rushed five times for 85 yards and a touchdown, putting his wealth of athleticism on display that made the Tiger coaches so excited about what he could bring in his sophomore season.


"He's very talented," said Boyne. "A three-sport kid, and honestly if he were able to he'd be four – football, basketball, baseball and he would have run track," said Boyne. "It's rare, if not impossible these days. He's a tremendous basketball player. And football-wise, we thought so much of him – he can play linebacker, he can play down safety, he can play running back, H-back, be on kickoff returns."

Boyne said the responsibilities on his plate were a lot to ask of a young player, however, and the decision was made to allow him to focus on running back.

"(Defensive coordinator Malter Scobel) didn't want to give him up at linebacker because he has a high ceiling. But he understood," said Boyne. "I talked to Jackson and he was very confident in his ability to play running back. He's always played on the offensive side, be it quarterback, running back, so he was very comfortable."

HAHNVILLE 48, BOURGEOIS 7 - Fabian Celestine tallied 200 total yards and scored three times to lead Hahnville in a rout.

Landen Teague was sharp, completing 10-of-15 passes to six different receivers for 195 yards and a touchdown, that scoring pass to Aaron Williams. Teague was not intercepted – and still has not been this season – and added a rushing touchdown. Kevias Singleton led the way for the receivers with three receptions for 73 yards. Kaden Bran, Lance Marshall and Bennett Naquin also caught passes on the night. Jackson Porter rushed for 82 yards and a touchdown on five carries.

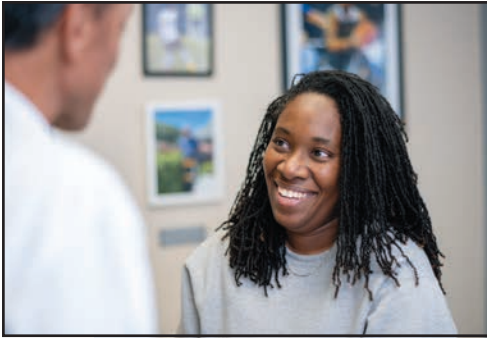

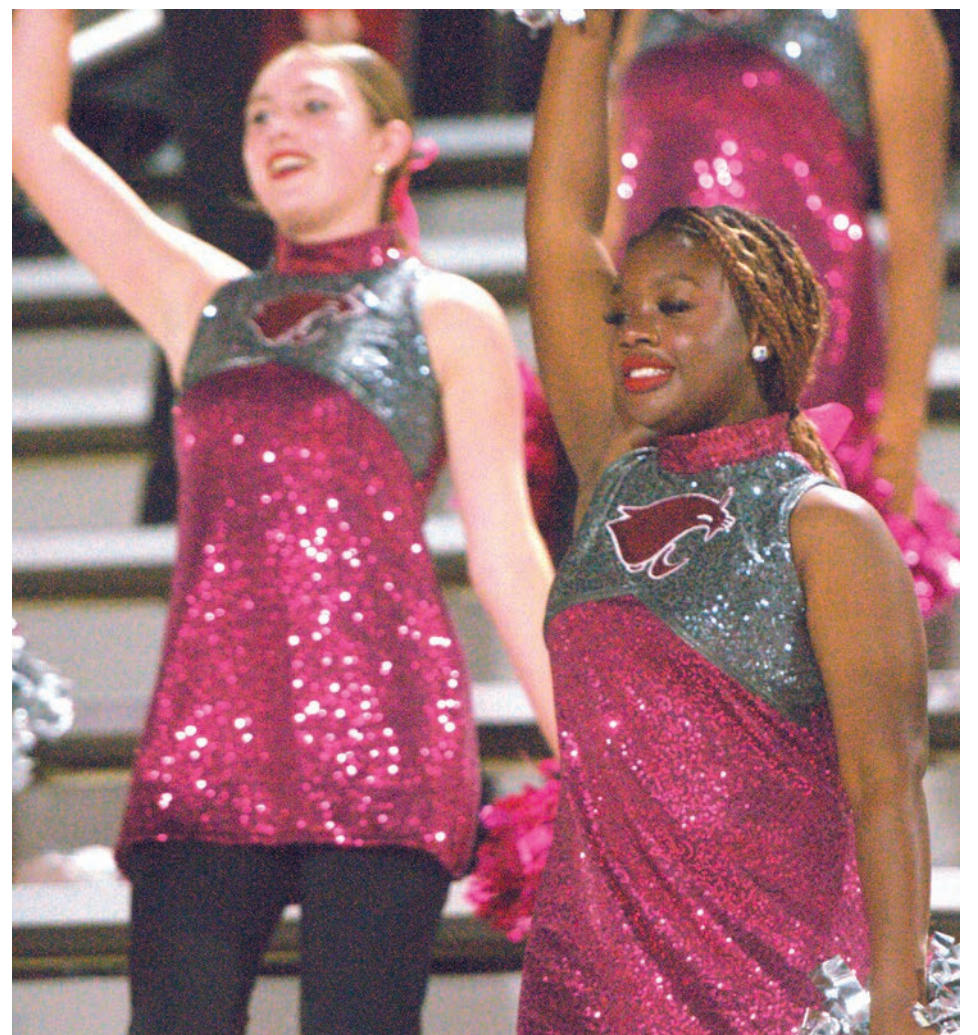
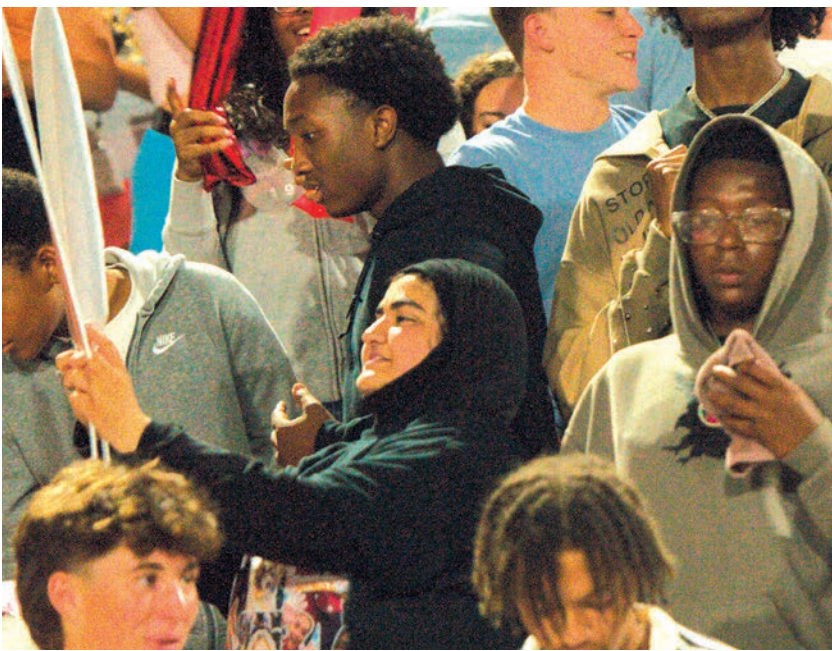

Destrehan looks to follow up on Terrebonne win as H.L. Bourgeois visits

Wildcats locked up Tigers in second half to earn win

Coming off a major win over previously undefeated Terrebonne, Destrehan returns home Friday night to take on H.L. Bourgeois.

Bourgeois went 5-6 a year ago in a season that saw the Braves take a big step forward after some down years. The Braves reached the playoffs and played a tough game at Hahnville before bowing out.

The Wildcats (3-2, 2-0) dominated the matchup between the teams last season, capturing a 33-7 win.

Bourgeois is 3-2 (0-2 in District 8-5A) thus far this season following a 42-7 loss to Hahnville last week. Head coach Sterling Washington's team won three in a row after dropping a 45-40 opener to Ascension Catholic. Since then, the Braves defeated Assumption 29-26 – on a goal line stand to end the game – Central Catholic 34-14 and Patterson, 47-40 before falling at home to Hahnville last week.

"It's obvious those guys are playing well. They're coming off a playoff appearance last season, so they're starting to prepare to win. They're prepared for their opponents and they go out and play hard – and that shows up on film," said Destrehan head coach Marcus Scott. "Coach Washington and his staff have done an outstanding job."

It's a team that can put up points – the offense is doing what it's been tasked to do since the offseason, as the majority of the Braves' starting defensive unit from 2024 were lost to graduation. It starts with running back Kadar Mitchell, who can create an explosive play on a moment's notice. Mitchell scored twice, including on a 92-yard run, in the season opener and hasn't looked back since. He garnered 200 yards and scored five times in the team's win over Patterson.

"He's somebody who can run away from you and he's elusive ... certainly a difference-maker," said Scott. "It seems like we've gone against a good running back every week and he's another impact player there."

Logan Renfro is the leader in the huddle at quarterback, a very productive player that can hurt a defense multiple ways. He had a big game in the team's win over Central Catholic, throwing three touchdown passes and running in another score. Dereck Celestine is

among his favorite targets and is a player who shifts between running back and wide receiver as the Braves hunt for matchups.

"They challenge you deep in the passing game. They have athletes who can go out and make those plays. Combined with the run game, they present issues," said Scott. "(Renfro's) production kind of speaks for itself."

Defensively, Bourgeois brings a tall and athletic secondary and plays a lot of zone, looking to make the opposition march downfield without making a mistake.

"They have real good team speed and those guys all run to the ball and make plays. It's something they coach and the kids go out and execute."

MAKING STOPS – Sophomore B.J. Reed was injured to start the season, but he's wasted no time making an impact upon his return. Against Terrebonne Friday, Reed made 13 tackles.

"He was out early, but he's starting to get healthy and you can see the production," said Scott. "He plays hard and he's a playmaker for us. The more reps he can get the better off we'll be in the long run."

DESTREHAN 41, TERREBONNE 28 – Malachi Dabney rushed for 145 yards and scored four touchdowns, Jackson Fields threw three touchdown passes and the Destrehan defense locked things down in the second half as the Wildcats ended Terrebonne's unbeaten streak with a 41-28 victory at Wildcat Stadium.

"We worked together and made sure we fixed our mistakes," said Dabney. "I'm just thankful for my linemen. Every time I made a big run it was because of them, my other teammates and my coaching staff."

Jabari Mack added seven catches for 116 yards and a touchdown through the air for the Wildcats.

Last season, Terrebonne defeated Destrehan at Terrebonne – that was the Wildcats' first district loss in five years. DHS was well-motivated to avenge that loss.

"It was certainly something we reminded the kids about," said Destrehan head coach Marcus Scott. "We knew this was going to be tough. Coach (Tyler) Lewis has done such a tremendous job preparing those kids, so we really had to come out and put on a strong performance."

The first half of this game was a track meet, but Destrehan's defense stepped up in a huge way from there, holding what's been a scalding hot Terrebonne (4-1, 1-1) offense this season to just 7 points in the second half.

It started with a 3-and-out forced by DHS (3-2, 2-0) to start the half. With the score tied 21-21, the Wildcats went to work on offense. Big runs by Jackson Fields and Malachi Dabney set up a 1-yard touchdown run by Dabney to make it 27-21 – the point after failed, and the lead remained six.

Another stop by the Wildcats came after linebacker Tony Crump identified a screen on third down and made an open field tackle to force another Tigers punt.

Fields and his receivers converted a pair of third downs on the next drive – one to Jaylan Ash and the other to Jabari Mack, who lost his footing but hauled it in from a seated position.

In many ways, this was Mack's drive – he caught another pass for 7-yards, but broke a tackle and made it into a 15-yard gain. He capped the drive by hauling in a touchdown pass from Fields that made it a 34-21 lead.

Terrebonne's defense stepped up big for a 4th quarter stop, forcing a Destrehan punt and earning a chance to take the lead with a touchdown. But on a third down that the Tigers had to have, Frank Harding Jr. intercepted Oliver on a throw downfield with 3:39 left.

"Frank made an outstanding play," said Scott. "He was in good position. They converted some third downs on us, with (Oliver) being as elusive as he is. We had to put some personnel on the field, get into dime and nickel in some obvious passing situations, and do what we had to so we could get off the field. It was an outstanding play by Frank."

Destrehan drove down to answer, with Malachi Dabney punching it in from 2-yards out to make it a 14-7 lead.
