Portraying Captain Hook in her school's performance of Peter Pan, Lyla Morel brought the character to life.

Getting to the stage, however, took perseverance. It was no guarantee for the R.J. Vial Elementary School student, who suffered an unexpected and rare health setback leading into the play.

On Oct. 22, Morel's mother Britt brought her to the family's pediatrician for evaluation, after the 10-year-old – she'll turn 11 in a few days – began feeling upper abdominal pain. Tests revealed she was suffering from chronic pancreatitis, that a mass had formed in her pancreas and that she had blocked, atrophied bile ducts.

The great and relieving news was that the mass wasn't cancerous. The situation as it was, however, still loomed. Morel had a significant road to recovery

Ardean Miller-Marbley kept the secret for almost an entire year, and when she saw it come to fruition, she couldn't help but let a few tears out.

Parish council debates fees for public record requests

At its Oct. 20 meeting, the parish council voted 7-1 to table an ordinance that would charge residents fees for copies of electronic records they receive through public record requests.

The ordinance, which was introduced by Parish President Matthew Jewell at the council's Oct. 6 meeting, would add a fee of 50 cents per page for electronic copies of public records. Photocopies of records would increase from 25 cents per page to 50 cents a page.

Councilmember Walter Pilié said in the meeting that he was taken aback

when he read the ordinance. "Basically, this has a chilling effect on getting public records from the parish," he said.

Parish families form homeschool co-op, offer variety of classes

Art, crocheting, woodworking, entrepreneurship 101, French, theology and sewing are just a few of the classes the Father's House Co-Op in Des Allemands offers to homeschool students in the parish.

Anthea Comardelle, a Hahnville High School graduate and former teacher, started the co-op last year with six families. It now has 24 families and 43 students.

"To see my children and other children learn and grow in the truth of how valuable and how treasured they are is absolutely priceless," Comardelle said. "I am honored and in awe that I get to be a part of it."

The co-op is a group of families with diverse backgrounds, Comardelle said.

"We want to make it always a place for anyone and everyone," she said. "The main goal is for kids to know how loved they are and within that we are going to teach things like graphic design, crochet. We want to build their sweet hearts up."

One of the ways the co-op came together was that Comardelle's son, Levi, said he missed P.E. class. Comardelle decided to teach the class and asked others if they wanted to join. When other parents offered to teach additional classes, the co-op was born.

Each semester, the co-op offers various courses for one hour twice a week. Prices start at \$250. Parents teach the courses.

"It's very organic – we kind of flow with whatever parents want to teach each

semester," Comardelle said. "The kids get to pick what they are interested in."

The co-op is supplemental to the student's homeschool education. The students get certificates after completing each course.

Therapy clinic for kids with autism is first in parish

Sunflower Blossom Therapies on River Oaks Drive in Luling will soon provide a lifeline for families in the parish who often travel to New Orleans or Baton Rouge for Applied Behavior Analysis therapy, an intervention for children with autism and other related developmental needs.

The clinic is owned by Destrehan resident Heather Guillot, a board-certified behavior analyst with over 10 years of experience in ABA therapy. She moved to the parish six years ago and her husband, Logan, is a Destrehan native.

Guillot said she saw a true need for families to have access to individualized, ethical care without having to drive long distances or sit on long waitlists.

"I've long dreamed of bringing high-quality, compassionate ABA services closer to home here in St. Charles Parish," Guillot said. "Opening [the clinic] has been one of the most rewarding and challenging experiences of my life."

Guillot expects the clinic to open in December after a two-year process that included filing legal paperwork, creating a business plan, finding the right location, designing the clinic space and handling credentialing and insurance.

"The process was truly a labor of love," Guillot said. "There were days it felt like every step forward came with two unexpected hurdles, but that made every milestone even more meaningful."

The amount of community support Guillot received kept her motivated.

"Parents, teachers and even other small business owners have reached out with encouragement and excitement," she said. "It reminded me why I started this in the first place: to serve families,

build relationships and create a space where children can truly bloom."

Guillot's journey to ABA therapy started with a passion for music. As a student at Cabrini High School in New Orleans, Guillot read about a music therapist in the novel "Sing Your Home" by Jodi Picoult.

"I had never even heard of [a music therapist] before," Guillot said. "I was instantly intrigued. I loved music, and I loved helping people, but I couldn't imagine a career that combined both of those passions. It felt like everything I had been searching for suddenly came together."

After Guillot graduated with a bachelor's in music therapy and psychology at Loyola University New Orleans in 2019, she earned her master's in psychology with a specialization in ABA at Capella University. For the last four years, she has worked as a board-certified behavior

analyst. She is also a board-certified music therapist. If it works for the child, she will often combine the two therapies.

"For some children, music is the bridge that opens the door to communication, engagement and emotional regulation," she said. "I might use rhythm and melody to teach turn-taking, imitation or joint attention, or use preferred songs as reinforcers to increase participation."

Guillot said ABA therapy is moving in a new direction.

"Some call ABA traumatic and say that we force kids to do things, but that is very old school ABA," Guillot said. "ABA is really focusing on what the child is doing. It's a very play-based approach. I'll model for them the appropriate behaviors that communicate what they need or want before they engage in those challenging behaviors. Because once they engage in those challenging behaviors, you've kind of lost the battle."

Guillot said sometimes the stigma of an autism diagnosis prevents families from seeking early intervention. But she wants parents to know they are not alone.

"I think early intervention is what could really help these kids navigate that communication aspect," Guillot said. "That way we can avoid those challenging behaviors that they end up learning. We see the whole child, not a diagnosis."

Guillot said she has worked with older autistic children, and she provides therapy for children ages 2 to 18. The clinic now has spots for up to 16 children, but Guillot said the clinic will grow as more of the clinic's registered behavior technicians become board-certified behavior analysts.

The clinic also practices safety-care, a behavior management training program designed to ensure the safety and dignity of clients and staff.

"All of our team members are trained in proactive strategies to prevent challenging behaviors, de-escalation techniques and safe responses if a crisis ever occurs," Guillot said. "It's not about physical intervention. It's about understanding why behaviors happen, responding calmly and protecting everyone's well-being."

The most important thing Guillot wants families to feel when they walk into the clinic is hope.

"My vision is to build a space filled with warmth, collaboration and growth; where children can flourish," Guillot said. "My hope is that Sunflower Blossom Therapies becomes a place where families truly feel supported, understood and valued. I want it to be more than just a clinic."

She wants Sunflower Blossom Therapies to become like a second home for families navigating the challenges of autism, and, long term, Guillot hopes to expand services to include community programs, parent workshops and events that bring everyone together.

"St. Charles Parish and the rest of the river parishes deserve accessible, high-quality ABA services, and I'm so proud to be part of making that happen," she said.

ahead, and in the short term, a play she badly wanted to perform in.

"We were kind of blindsided at first when we received the news, then everything kind of moved quickly," said Britt. "We really thought her symptoms were something she could work through, and we didn't even consider that it could get so bad, so fast that Tuesday's show wasn't even going to be a possibility. Sunday evening was when she kind of took a turn for the worse and we ended up in Children's Hospital."

The idea that she'd be sidelined was heartbreaking for Britt and husband Taylor, who knew how much it meant to

their daughter.

"We didn't see how it would even be possible," Britt said. "I felt kind of uncomfortable even mentioning something like that to her doctors – we didn't want to create any kind of wishful thinking. Her health was so much more important for her than getting to that show."

But Lyla was still hopeful, even while on IVs and taking pain medication.

"She was like, just get me there," said Taylor. "I'm ready to go, I'm ready to perform. And the nurses would come in and say 'oh, you're going to be in a play?' And I hoped, maybe they know something more than I do, because I'm pretty much a realist and thinking this isn't going to happen ... it's midnight on Monday morning, and no way do we think within 24 hours, she'll be well enough to leave the hospital."

But indeed, Lyla was discharged under strict instructions, making it on stage and pushing through her situation to make her performance count.

"She's a quick learner and she was ready," said Britt. "She pulled some strength. We prayed together about it ... she just loves it and wanted to be up there so much. And it was pretty amazing for her theater teacher (Megan West) and principal (Christina Mullins). They worked super closely with us."

"Ms. West was constantly updating

surgery. Two stints were placed, but the blockages were not able to be removed as the stones proved too large and jagged to remove without potentially damaging her bile ducts.

The Morels were told her case is a very rare one.

"Her surgeon will be presenting her case at a conference he's attending next week to seek ideas for her treatment going forward. He said he's never seen a child with this many stones or stones this large," Britt said. "He said he's done thousands of pancreatic surgeries on children and this one is top three in his entire career."

Her case is so unique, in fact, that her surgeon was set to present the case at a conference this week to seek ideas on her treatment going forward.

While the family waits for the next step, Lyla is doing her best to improve matters.

"She's super aware," Taylor said. "She's very conscious about what she eats now. She knows what can cause it to feel worse. It was hard for her to come to terms that her diet was going to have to change significantly."

Lyla has good days and bad days, and the bad days can be painful.

"We don't know exactly how long this is going to take, but we know that it has to get done soon," said Taylor.

with us and at no point did she ever say she was considering pulling Lyla. It was 1 o'clock in the afternoon and she was still in the hospital, and she says we are believing that Lyla is going to be here today. That means so much to us, because in many cases a director isn't going to take that risk."

That faith, as well as Lyla's, was rewarded.

Still, she has a road to recovery before her. On Oct. 31, Lyla underwent

thanks to a mother and father who she said have sacrificed so much for their children.

"I watched them work so hard," the New Sarpy native said. "And I've always wanted to put them up on a pedestal and give them their flowers to let them know I appreciate everything they have done, all the struggles and sacrifices they have made for myself and my sisters to have a good life. And I just thought, what better way to honor them than by putting them on the display."

In December of last year, Miller-Marbley had her parents participate in a photo shoot, though they did not know that one of those photos would be used for the display.

"We reached out to Sam's headquarters and asked if they would back us with this, and they said 'Absolutely,'" Miller-Marbley said.

The reveal came early last month at Sam's Club in Kenner. Miller-Marbley's parents accompanied her to this year's launch event, which included a gift wrap challenge for customers. The display was unveiled and Miller-Marbley got to tell the attendees what her parents mean to her – and, of course, in the process letting her parents know as well.

"They cried, I cried ... there was not a dry eye in sight," Miller-Marbley said. "It was so hard to keep the secret. Now, people are walking up to them and telling them they saw them on the display."

"I just saw (the display) and thought, this is beautiful. This is everything I hoped it would be. And they're on a platform they deserve to be on. My dad doesn't cry, but he couldn't hold it in."

There are actually quite a few locals who will

recognize either or both when they come across the display. Kenneth Miller spent 30 years working for St. Charles Parish, while Doreen Miller works in the St. Charles Parish school system.

"It's like my mom said, 'Wow, look at us – a custodian and a parish worker. And here we are,'" Miller-Marbley said.

Her mother also recently had the perfect opportunity showcase it.

"Someone they said they had been trying to find this wrapping paper and they showed her, and she said, 'that's my daughter's wrapping paper,'" Miller-Marbley said. "She pulled up the display to show her and said, 'This is me, right here' and put her and my dad on the

display ... it's been kind of amazing seeing other people giving them love, telling them they saw them."

Miller-Marbley said she watched her mother and father push through adversity and fatigue, year after year, for their children.

"I know they were tired, and they kept pushing," said Miller-Marbley. "They didn't give up because they had their kids and they wanted to give us the best life possible. And that's always inspired me to push. I knew their blood lived in me and that I had that strength to tap into, that strength they had. It's one of the things that kept me going. To be able to honor them, it made me feel on top of the world."

She remembers her father driving her mother to work each day on a moped.

"She worked at the airport and he'd drive her on that moped, making sure she got there," said Miller-Marbley.

Miller-Marbley created Mah Melanin with a desire to offer products that beautifully and accurately represent melanated people. Her line of products includes home décor, apparel, totes, blankets and more. Her Santa gift wrap features an African American Santa named Ken after several beloved men in her family, including her father. She also has a Mrs. Claus character, which was created in honor of her mother.

The business, which Miller-Marbley calls the realization of a dream, continues expanding. This Friday at AMC Theater in Elmwood, Mah Melanin will collaborate with the film Unexpected Christmas for a red carpet event that includes a cast member Q&A.

Pilié said in the meeting that, before he was elected to the council, he filed several public record requests. He estimated that under the new, proposed fee schedule one of those requests would have cost about \$800 because it was 1,599 pages.

"I have an opinion that when people are going to go look for documents and they get the price they would shy away from it," he said.

Councilmember Michelle O'Daniels also voiced concern for the public's right to access public records.

"My concern lies mostly with the charge of 50 cents a page for electronic records, which I really cannot support at this time," she said in the meeting. "I think there has got to be a better way to level this out between the cost incurred by the parish as well as the public interest."

O'Daniel said the ordinance could be discussed further in a legislative committee meeting open to the public.

In defense of the ordinance, Jewell argued that fulfilling public records requests often involves numerous employees working to redact and process records. He said sometimes these requests take weeks, or even months, to fill.

"I think the public should have access to these documents, but at the end of the day this is a very small number of people generating an inordinate amount of work for the parish," he said. "And all [the ordinance] is seeking to do is to recoup some of that money."

Jewell also noted that when employees spend time on public records requests, they are not spending time on projects important to the parish. Companies, banks, law firms and news organizations – not just parish residents – file public



record requests, Jewell said.

"I've got a long history with public record requests," he said at the meeting. "When I worked at the department of energy one of my jobs was to review public record requests that were sent in from all across the country. One of the things that was abundantly clear then and it is now, working in St. Charles Parish government because we see it every day, is that these public records requests have a cost to the parish."

During the council discussion, Jewell said that he feels the ordinance is not out of step with similar ordinances in other parishes and in St. Charles Parish: the sheriff's office charges \$1 per page for copies. The school system charges 25 cents for electronic or paper copies of public records. This month, West Baton Rouge Parish Council voted unanimously to charge a fee of \$1 per page for the first 25 pages of a public records request and 50 cents for pages 26-500.

"When you have people who are requesting every document – and it's thousands and thousands of pages – that we have to go through and redact and process, I think it's fair that there be some sort of cost incurred and that the public isn't subsidizing the work of our employees to fulfill a small number

of requests that generate a very large amount of work," Jewell said during council discussion.

The custodian of public records in St. Charles Parish is the parish council secretary. The secretary can deny a records request that would "substantially disrupt required government operations," but only after making reasonable attempts to narrow the request.

The Louisiana Public Records Law grants any person the right to examine and obtain copies of public documents held by the state and government agencies. There is no cost to examine a public record, but parish governments can charge a reasonable fee for copies. The law also does not allow agencies to charge for the time spent

reviewing or examining records to determine if they are subject to disclosure.

The intent of public records laws is to ensure transparency and accountability in government. It allows the public to monitor government agencies.

Last year, the Louisiana Illuminator argued in a lawsuit that Lake Charles' fee of 50 cents for electronic copies of public records was unreasonable and violated state law. The news organization argued the only fee for electronic records should be a CD, stick drive or storage device, which costs between \$2 and \$10.

The Illuminator dropped its lawsuit after it received the public records it requested. Lake Charles no longer charges a fee for electronic documents. Its prices for digital records are \$35 for a DVD and \$25 for a jump drive, according to the Illuminator.

would ever leave her teaching career – which she loved – and homeschool her children, she would tell you that thought had never entered her mind.

“But that’s just how good God is,” Comardelle said. “He directs us onto paths that are so amazing, we couldn’t have gotten there ourselves even if we tried.”

The decision to homeschool Levi, 11, and Jeremiah, 4, was a leap of faith that Comardelle took in 2023. She also homeschools another student at her home.

“I left a job that I loved because I knew [God] was telling me to homeschool,” she said. “He wanted me trust him that, although I was surrendering a career, what he was going to give would be so much more.”



For Comardelle, homeschooling allows her the freedom to take her kids sailing on a Wednesday and to support their interests and skills.

“I see a whole bunch of confidence [in my kids],” she said. “I see new interest. Fishing and hunting and being outdoors – my oldest was never really into that until we started homeschooling.”

One day, she was driving with Levi when he told

her, “I love my life.”

“My heart melted,” Comardelle said. “This is what every parent longs to hear their children say. Life is supposed to be filled with joy, and I am so thankful that at his age his heart is so full. He can look forward to what each day brings and life for him is filled with enjoyment and purpose.”

But Comardelle stressed that all families have different paths.

“In no way do we dishonor the amazing schoolteachers in the school system,” she said. “We honor those we can’t homeschool.”

Comardelle’s husband of 14 years, Cody, teaches at John Curtis Christian School.

Families interested in joining the co-op can visit the Father’s House Co-Op Facebook group to get a glimpse of the culture and see upcoming registration dates.

In addition to the supplemental classes, the co-op also

“It’s a morning full of pancakes, Christmas music, Christmas list making, ornament crafts, a photo booth, and more,” Comardelle said.

victory over Evangel in the state championship game.

That team was coached by Lou Valdin and featured stars like Darius Reynaud, who rushed for 184 yards and three touchdowns in that title game. In Robicheaux’s first year on the call, Hahnville also had LaRon Landry patrolling on defense. Both players would go on to the NFL.

“They had some really good players and teams coming through,” said Robicheaux. “Those games, those athletes the community produced, and the ones the state produced, and you got to call their names out there on the field.”

His brother Kevin was an assistant coach with the football team as well as the school’s girls basketball head coach. Meanwhile, Willie Wise was Robicheaux’s junior high coach, and the then-athletic director asked Kevin if his brother might be interested in calling the action on Fridays.

“I was helping out the team before I started announcing. I had some free time, and I wanted to help out my brother. I tried it out and here we are 24 years later,” said Robicheaux. “I’ve enjoyed it.”

The irony of it was Robicheaux never considered himself much of a public speaker.

“I’m not,” Robicheaux said, noting even today it’s not his specialty. “But you never want to say no to a challenge. I almost don’t want to say challenge, but it’s not something I felt I was natural at. But it was like, hey, have some fun with this. Willie asked Kevin and I didn’t want to back out of an opportunity. The third PA announcer for the Hahnville football program, so it honestly was an honor.

“In those days, they had the horns and speakers on top of the press box. The parish definitely stepped it up since then,” he added with a laugh. “It’s a fun gig.”

While he’s been a constant for the fans, the fans have likewise been a constant for him.

“You have fans on both sides, Hahnville, Destrehan, or whoever it is on a Friday night, and they’re all out there and proud of their kids. You want to provide a good environment for both sides, when those kids and those coaches are doing everything they can to put a good product on the field.”

Perrin said she was surprised when she heard she was selected as Principal of the Year.

"But I was very proud to celebrate my school and our hard work," Perrin said. "My mind immediately went to being excited to share this recognition with my assistant principal, faculty and staff. I thought about how to share it with them."

Perrin contributes her success as principal to being faithful, believing in education, sharing a collective vision with her staff and having a growth mindset.

Wildcats eye outright district crown

Destrehan faces Thibodaux with 8-5A title on the line; Dabney's 230-yard, 7 TD night leads way in win over Hahnville

A lot of things are different this time around as Destrehan hosts Thibodaux Friday night with the District 8-5A championship on the line.

In their 2024 meeting, Destrehan rolled over the Tigers 61-10.

That win was to seal a share of the District 8-5A championship for Destrehan. A win this time would secure an unbeaten, outright district title win for the Wildcats, who unlike last season are a perfect 5-0 in 8-5A play heading into the regular season's final week.

But the biggest difference from a year ago? This Thibodaux team has come a long way.

The Tigers had three consecutive 4-6 seasons heading into 2025, and has not had a winning season since 2019. Thibodaux secured that distinction by Week 7, and is 8-1 heading into Friday's game (4-1 in District 8-5A), its only loss coming to Hahnville this season.

Both Destrehan (7-2, 5-0) and Thibodaux knocked their respective rivals out of the district championship race last week. Destrehan defeated Hahnville 49-28 in the Battle on the River to hand the Tigers their second district loss. Likewise, Thibodaux beat Terrebonne 27-21 to set up a district championship game this week.

Destrehan can do no worse than tie for the district lead after this week; the Wildcats aren't interested in settling for that, of course.

"We've had some very competitive schedules, and the kids are kind of adapted to playing in this kind of environment," said Destrehan head coach Marcus Scott about playing for the district championship. "We look at it as a big game, but they're all big. Every game carries the same weight. It's an exciting time of year and you want to be playing your best."

Scott said that Thibodaux has found its identity.

"They're playing fast with a lot of energy," Scott said. "They've had an exciting season and certainly their success is well-deserved."

Former St. James and LSU quarterback Lowell Narcisse is in his first season as head coach of the Tigers. He guided Ascension Catholic to the state semifinals in his first season as a head coach last year.

Damien Robinson quarterbacked the Tigers, and Scott notes him as a quality player with several strong targets to throw to on the outside.

But the player riding the biggest momentum wave is running back Cemiyan Adams, who rushed for 250 yards and three touchdowns last week in the win over Terrebonne.

"He made some big, big runs in that game," Scott said.

"Their running game is good. It's hard to focus on just one guy, because all three of their receivers can make plays on the perimeter."

Scott said the offense has a much different look under Narcisse and his staff.

"They're doing a lot more in terms of motioning players and varying their formations," said Scott.

Defensively, Thibodaux has built a wall in the middle of its line. Jerimiah Jones and Kymari Carter set the tone on that side of the ball.

"Those two really jump off the screen on film," said Scott. "Big kids with a high motor. And then they have the ability to play man coverage in the secondary with the linebackers. They present some issues."

"(Jones and Carter) have speed and power. They get into the backfield and create all kinds of problems. And their two defensive ends are very athletic as well, coming off the edge."

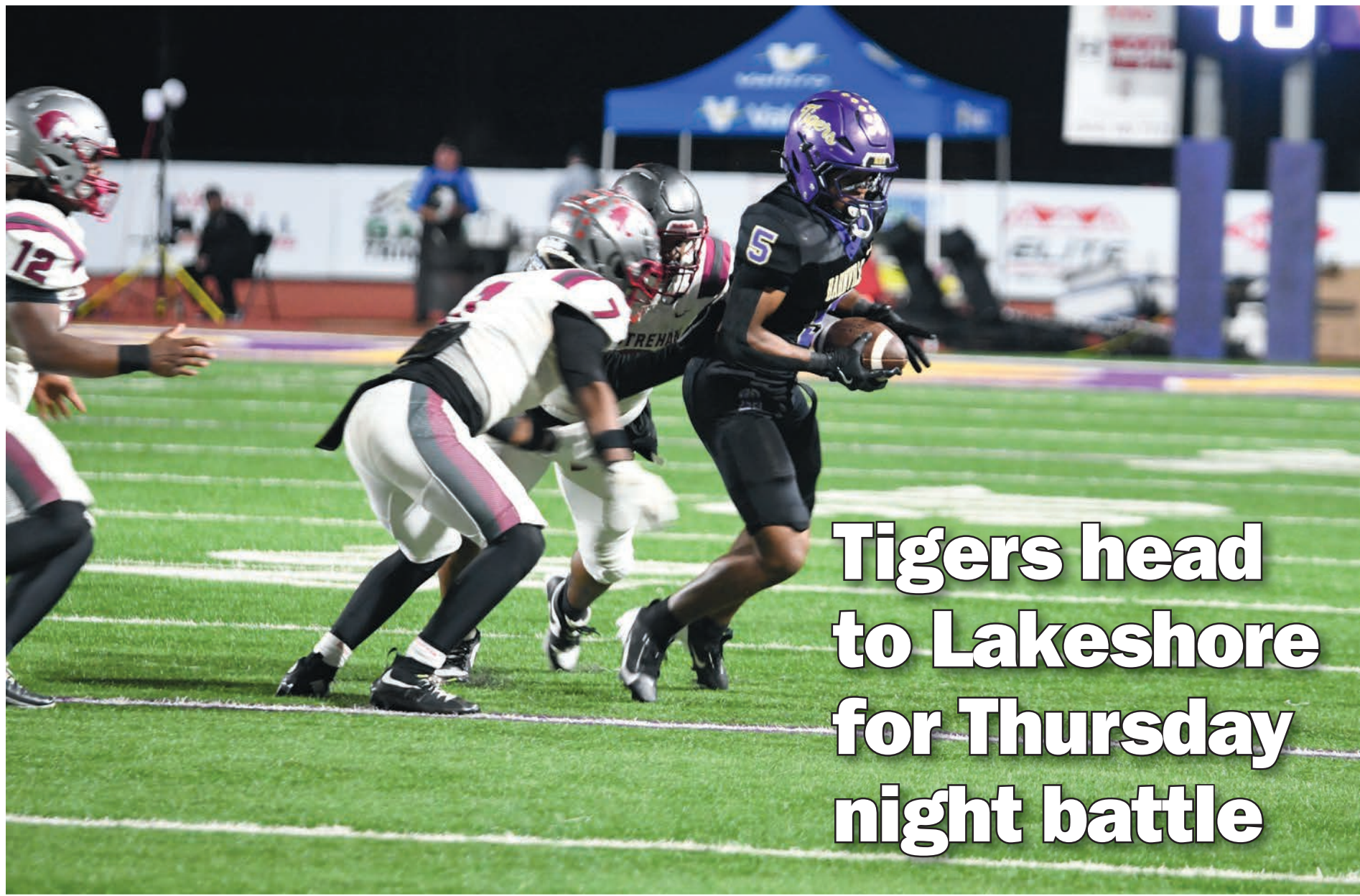
Scott said the Thibodaux defense is much more of an aggressive, attacking unit this season.

Said Destrehan head coach Marcus Scott, "It's a tribute to (Dabney), it's quite an individual effort. But it's also a tribute to a lot of guys doing their jobs tonight. Whenever a night like this happens, it's a total team effort."

Hahnville likely would secure home field in round one with victory, but 8-1 Titans a challenge

With its district season finished, Hahnville heads to Lakeshore for a special Thursday night kickoff to wrap up the regular season.

Kickoff is tonight (Nov. 5) at 7 p.m.

Last season, Hahnville defeated Lakeshore at Tiger Stadium, 28-14. Lakeshore went 9-4 in 2024, reaching the Division II non-select quarterfinals where it lost a thriller, 41-40 against Franklinton. It represents another quality program and test for Hahnville as it hopes to ramp up just before the postseason.

This year, Lakeshore has taken another step forward under head coach Brent Indest, who is in his fourth season guiding the program. The Titans are 8-1.

Lakeshore will present quite a challenge for Hahnville this week. If the Tigers earn the win, however, it will potentially go a long way in terms of power points. Hahnville sits approximately at 15; it must remain top 16 for a home game. A win almost certainly secures a home date, and Hahnville head coach Greg Boyne said it's might even be possible to jump up into the top 10, or even 8, with a victory over a team with Lakeshore's

resume.

"This is a very, very good football team," said Hahnville head coach Greg Boyne. "They're very physical on both sides of the ball. They run the football and they make no secrets about it. They control the ball. They limit your possessions and they don't really turn it over. We'll find out a lot about ourselves this Thursday."

Hahnville (7-2, 4-2) knows firsthand how well the Titans can operate a ball-control attack. Last season HHS was limited to just six possessions. They made them count to the tune of 28 points, but Lakeshore can squeeze the life out of an opponent, as well as the clock.

That running game will send several different backs at the defense throughout the night. Lakeshore runs a shotgun-based option.

"They rotate about six guys," Boyne said. "They have probably eight to 10 guys who play both ways, so I think it's to give them a break. (Hahnville defensive coordinator Malter Scobel) said that there are eight different guys at any time could play running back or wing. Their offense is a little different ... similar to what E.D. White

does, but from the shotgun in this case."

Boyne called Indest "one of the top coaches in the state."

"He's had success everywhere he's been," Boyne said. "They're disciplined. Not overly huge at any position, but really good at what they do."

Quarterback Brody Loudermilk is experienced and will be leading his offense against the Tigers for the second time.

"He's very athletic. He's probably the fastest kid on the team," Boyne said. "He also plays some defense, so you know he's tough. I want to say he even returned kicks and punts last year. He's an athlete. He does a really good job with the option scheme, being deceptive with the ball."

His top receiver is Kyle Gegenheimer, the Titans' biggest downfield threat.

Defensively, Issiah Koontz plays noseguard and Boyne said he presents a challenging matchup, as does



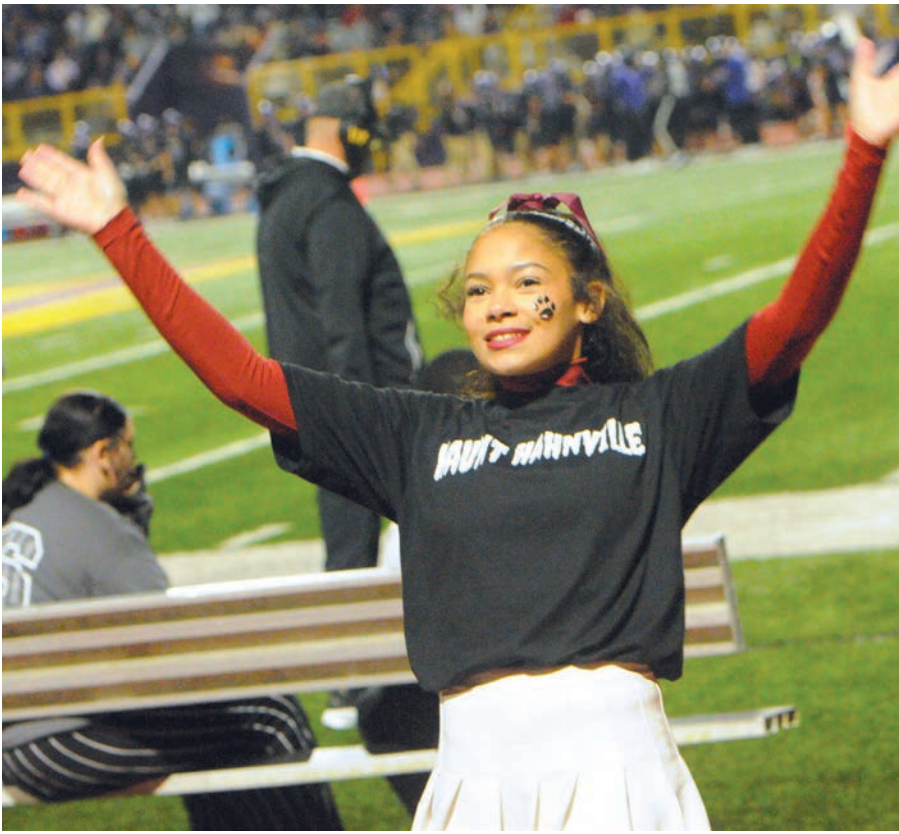

Lady Tigers' season ends at Chapelle

Hahnville's season came to a close Tuesday night at Chapelle as the Chipmunks earned a 25-20, 25-10, 25-10 victory in a Division I opening round playoff matchup.

Chapelle, the No. 10 seed in Division I, advanced to round two to face the winner of a matchup between No. 7 Byrd and No. 26 West Monroe (that game was set to be played Wednesday after press time).

Hahnville earned the No. 23 seed in a season the Lady Tigers wrapped up with an 18-24 record. It began the season as a young and largely inexperienced team, with most of its starting lineup from 2024's state quarterfinalist graduated.

But the Tigers played their best volleyball down the stretch, closing the regular season with a 7 wins in 11 matches and

securing the District 7-I championship.

"I think we saw a lot of growth in our level of play throughout the season, both individually and collectively," said Hahnville head coach Mendi LeBoeuf. "It's a process. We had a lot of kids on the court who had zero varsity playing experience. I think Jada (Moore) and Maci (Hollingsworth) did a great job of leading and teaching them how to elevate their level of play."

Tuesday's game was a rematch for the two teams, after Chapelle defeated HHS 25-22, 25-21, 25-20 on Sept. 25.

Hollingsworth had 11 kills and seven digs for Hahnville. Moore had six kills and a block. Sophia Hotard had seven digs, Addison Orgeron and Cambri Garcia six each and Abigail Hotard five.

The experienced Chipmunks were a

tough playoff draw, but also presented a valuable learning experience for a Tigers team that will be bringing back several starters next season.

"They play a cohesive game," said LeBoeuf. "They hit the ball hard but they also hit around the block. They'll change the tempo of the ball and they control it well. They pass well and defend well – so they present a lot of challenges."

"We have a couple of sophomores, two freshmen on the court. So, I think considering so much newness, to have a playoff game under our belt, to be successful in district this year and win some games, I think that's major."

Hollingsworth recently passed a significant milestone with 1,000 career kills – one made all the more impressive by the fact she's only a junior.

LeBoeuf said Hollingsworth finished the season strong.

"I thought she played well tonight," said LeBoeuf. "She led us in kills and passed the ball well out of serve receive."

Moore, Addison Orgeron, Cambri Garcia, Ellie Martin and Breanna Muller finished their careers with Hahnville as a senior class that was part of a program that won its district crown in all four years of their prep career.

"Knowing how much of our lineup was going to be new, they understood their leadership was going to be important," said LeBoeuf. "All of them, whether they started or not, did a good job setting the standard of what practice looks like, how we work, how we relate, and they did a really good job of conveying that to our younger players."

"(Dabney) got into a rhythm and it was one of those special nights."

He's had quite a few of those. Against Capt. Shreve, he garnered 300 total yards to go with six touchdowns. Over the past three weeks, Dabney's scored 15 times.

Hahnville head coach Greg Boyne said Destrehan dominated the line of scrimmage on both sides of the ball. Destrehan rushed for 359 yards on the evening.

Another big part of that number was Jackson Fields, who rushed for 75 yards on 11 carries and kept several drives alive by converting first downs on scrambles.

"That was huge," said Scott. "Jackson's played in a lot of big games, and he knows if they take away the read that he has the green light to take off. It adds another element to the offense. He's always had that ability, he's just doing it a little bit more now."

DESTREHAN 49, HAHNVILLE 28 - Hahnville was in striking distance

for most of the night, but could not find a way to get over the hump.

Destrehan led 20-14 at halftime and got a big stop to begin the third quarter. Hahnville drove into DHS territory and faced a 4th down and short. The Wildcats stopped Landen Teague on a quarterback keeper short of the first down marker and earned a turnover on downs.

Fields bought time – and more downs – with his legs all night and converted on a key third down before Dabney capped the ensuing Wildcats' drive from 1-yard out. A Fields 2-point pass to Bruce Walker made it 28-14.

Hahnville answered on its next drive when Fabian Celestine scored on a 24-yard touchdown run to pull the Tigers within a score again.

On the first play of the fourth quarter, Destrehan's Ryan Montegue blocked the ensuing punt and sent the DHS side of the stadium into elation. Dabney punched it in to make it 35-21.

"On the sidelines, it was, 'Get the ball back, get the ball back,'" said Montegue. "We got a stop on third down. That inside punt (rush) wasn't working, so I'm gonna go outside. I went outside, they didn't pick up, and it was a go. It was a way to lift my team and my coaches."

The Tigers weren't going to tap out by any means, and HHS fired back on Teague's touchdown pass to Michael Propps, making it 35-28.

Dabney was too much, though, and immediately issued Destrehan's response in the form of a 72-yard touchdown run to push the lead back to two scores.

Destrehan's Cameron Florent and Damien Richard intercepted Teague, the quarterback's only two interceptions of the year.

Hahnville's Al'Jarreau Walker returned a kickoff for a touchdown in the first quarter. Teague and Kevias Singleton also connected for a late-second quarter touchdown.

defensive end Dayton McGee. Beau Bernard is strong at outside linebacker. And Boyne said the secondary, collectively, is a quality unit.

"They do a really good job of tackling," Boyne said. "They like to play a Cover 4 or quarters coverage. They give you the underneath stuff and then rally to the ball to tackle. And they force turnovers. I think their last two or three opponents had three turnovers, four turnovers each."

"They put pressure on you by limiting the number of times you have the ball, and they create extra possessions for themselves."

Boyne said while the Tigers were disappointed with the loss to Destrehan last week, the players did not let the intensity dip at practice.

"Guys are out there flying around," Boyne said. "Guys are obviously disappointed, but I think they're at the point they know we have to move on. Lakeshore is 8-1. We're trying to create a culture where, yes you want to win every game, but if you don't you move on to the next one."

With the games against Destrehan and Lakeshore leading in to the postseason, it provides a rapid acclimation to playoff-level intensity for the Tigers.
