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Playground at Rathborne Park remains closed after repair delays

More than two months after vandals forced the closure of the Rathborne Park playground, repairs remain on hold because persistent summer rain has prevented contractors from fixing the damaged rubber surface.

Francesca Blanchard, a parish spokesperson, said the contractor needs three consecutive days of dry weather to complete the repairs.

“We know this closure has been frustrating for residents who love Rathborne Park, and we appreciate everyone’s patience,” she said.

Blanchard said the parish cannot provide a firm reopening date for the playground at this time.

She said the situation is a reminder that vandalism has real consequences for the community.

“This not only caused damage to one of our public parks but also prevents residents from safely enjoying amenities they help support,” she said. “We look forward to reopening Rathborne Park as soon as repairs are completed.”

Residents first noticed barricades around the playground in early May. The Parks and Recreation Department said they will be removed once the repairs are finished.

Residents are encouraged to use the playgrounds at Monsanto Park and West Bank Bridge Park until repairs are completed.

The repair work comes amid a string of vandalism incidents at Rathborne Park in recent months.

On May 5, the Parks and Recreation Department posted a photo online of vandalism in the park’s restroom. Photos showed a toilet paper dispenser ripped from the wall and dirt in the sink. The vandalism occurred a week after the restroom was professionally cleaned. The park’s restroom was also vandalized in December, with Silly String covering the walls and restroom stalls.

In April, a visitor at Rathborne Park discovered feces smeared on the walls, toilet and urinal, along with damage to the vents in the men’s restroom.

The Parks and Recreation Department said it’s working to install more surveillance cameras.

In a statement, the department said vandalism impacts the entire community.

“It takes away from the safe, clean spaces we work hard to provide for our residents,” the statement read. “We ask everyone to take pride in our parks and help us keep them clean, safe and enjoyable for all. If you see something, say something.”

Although the playground remains closed, the rest of Rathborne Park is open to visitors.

Life Church Academy

Boutte daycare, preschool closing after 45 years

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Life Church Academy recently announced that it will be closing its doors this summer after more than four decades.

The Boutte childcare center and preschool posted a message through its online portal to parents conveying that it would be closing on July 31. The end of the school year brought LCA’s 45th year to a close.

“We regret to inform you that during a church board meeting held on April 16, 2026, the board decided to close Life Church Academy due to funding issues,” the message stated. “As a result, Life Church Academy will close on July 31, 2026 and will not operate during the 2026-27 school year.”

Formerly known as Boutte Christian Academy, LCA began as a Mother’s Day Out program in 1980. Its founding came with its sponsoring church, Life Church. A Mother’s Day Out is a part-time childcare service, usually lasting just a few hours a day and allowing parents to run errands, attend appointments, or take a break while toddlers enjoy structured play, socializing, and

early learning. Faced with the desire to make more choices available for students, Boutte Christian Academy began operating as an elementary school in the 1980s. The school grew into a Type III childcare center for ages 1 to 3 and a state-approved elementary and junior high school (pre-K to eighth grade). It started from parents who kept asking for ways to keep their children in this learning environment. Over its final years, the center served students from infant to four years old.

the Neocatechumenal Way this week. All will go through the journey carrying virtually nothing with them – no phones, very few personal belongings, and the three St. Charles Borromeo visitors had not even a change of clothes with them.

“There are a couple dozen walking in the New Orleans area. Some of them were dropped off on the Northshore. These three began in Reserve,” said Craig Howat of the St. Charles Borromeo Pastoral Council. “We didn’t know anything about it. At about 8:30 at night, they come knocking at the door. We gave them some food and some water.”

When Howat asked where they were staying, they responded they were planning to sleep under the nearby oak trees.

“I’m thinking, man, they’re not cutting any corners, they’re pretty serious about it,” said Howat.

The parishioners arranged with pastor Father Cletus Orji to make the youth center available for them to sleep in.

“They’re basically relying on the hospitality of strangers as they go around sharing their faith,” Howat said.

Howat said some clothing and other items were offered, but that the trio accepted very little.

“They didn’t even have a pillow,” Howat said.

Santiago studies medicine at the University of St. Thomas in Houston, Texas. Allen studies kinesiology in Laredo, Texas and Daven is a seminarian at the Catholic Diocese of Dallas.

Howat said the idea behind the pilgrimage for the men is to emulate the simplicity and humility associated with St. Francis of Assisi, living without comforts, possessions or certainty, trusting God and the generosity of others while sharing their faith.

“You’re embracing a simple life,” Howat said. “You’re trying to be humble. You have nothing.”

The Neocatechumenal Way was born in 1964 in the towns of Palomeras Altas,



near Madrid, Spain. It is a post-baptismal itinerary of Christian Catholic formation at the service of the bishops and the parish priests. It does this by forming small communities that come from all parts of society, single, married, young and old, that are a representation of the universal church. The communities walk together in a way of faith, reliving little by little their baptismal promises.

The trio noted Monday night that St. Mark Catholic Church in Ama was the next stop on their list for Tuesday.

“And I don’t even know how you’d get across the bridge – if you’re going to walk it, the police are going to stop you,” said

Howat. “I told them, look, in the morning I’ll come pick you up and I’ll get you there.”

From there, the three planned to visit Holy Family Catholic Church and St. Anthony of Padua in Luling Tuesday before venturing into Metairie.

Howat said the trio conveyed they’ll be on their journey until Sunday, when it will be time to return home.

It’s quite the departure from the conveniences of day-to-day life people have grown accustomed to in 2026.

“That kind of simplicity in this day and age is a big task,” Howat said. “I teach high school seniors, and asking them to

give up just their phone for two-and-a-half hours is tough for them, much less seven days.

“For me, New Orleans, we’ve been through a French government, a Spanish government, a French government again and now our American government, but in New Orleans the one thing that’s kind of been the same is our Catholic faith. It’s a part of our traditions and a part of our heritage. It’s a part of who we are. So, for these guys, it just shows the bigger side of the church and it’s kind of a beautiful thing.”

all ages enjoying the water.

“We hope the time before weigh-in just looks like connection and us loving on the fisherman who are such a big part of Des Allemands,” she said.

She said she hopes the event allows people to step onto the church property and feel what so many others do.

“We want to create an opportunity where we have the chance to look our neighbors in the face and tell them we love them,” she said. “That we are happy they are a part of our community; that they belong and have purpose. We want the fishing tournament to be a success, but we really want connection with people we hope will return in October and spend the weekend with us.”

The church’s October fall fest will include hayrides, food and vendor booths.

“Our church offers so much beautiful property,” she said. “A fall fest was a long time coming.”

Church member Ludy Dufrenes is the lead organizer of the event.

Curole-Jimenez said the Father’s House’s mission is to reach those who are lost, wandering or have not found their way.

“We desire to show love to those who feel unlovable



and to stoop low like Jesus—entering the trenches with those in darkness,” she said. “We seek to mirror Christ in truth and in love, letting both guide every step we take.”

The church, located at 16976 US 90, offers Sunday morning services, weekly men’s and women’s groups, youth gatherings, homeschool chapel and a recovery house on church grounds.

“At the heart of everything we do is a desire for people to come to know Jesus and experience His love in a real and personal way,” Curole-Jimenez said. “Our hope is to create a community where people can belong, grow and encounter the transforming love of Christ, even if that comes through fishing tournaments and a fall fest.”

Henry’s case, he created a miniature city scene that was literally “wired,” using clear plexiglass so the electrical wiring could be seen.

The display featured a spinning Mardi Gras float, LED lighting, 3D-printed balconies and doors, a revolving door, paper-mache figures on the float and music built into the float. Henry taught himself how to wire the LED lights. The project took approximately three months to complete.

He qualified for the national competition by finishing as runner-up in Beta’s state 3D design competition.

The National Beta Club hosts national conventions each summer for the Elementary, Junior, and Senior levels. State conventions are held for members and sponsors in eighteen states. At the conventions, members participate in various academic and talent competitions, including academic tests, performing arts, S.T.E.M. competitions, and visual arts.

Henry said it was exciting to hear the announcement that he’d won, but he said he enjoyed seeing the impressive creations of other qualifiers just about as much.

“That was really cool to see all of the different designs and types of projects

a viewing period where all attending the convention can observe each of the projects up close.

“Thousands of children were able to go and view ... it was really cool to see them all stopping to look at his project,” said Henry’s mother Michelle.

Added Henry, “And the music (from the float) was so loud, you could hear it from across the room.”

The journey seems to be as rewarding as the result for Henry.

“I just really like building things,” he said.

Michelle said Henry is already planning for next year’s Beta convention.

No matter what that may bring, she couldn’t be prouder than she is of her son today.

“We knew all the hours and hours he put into the project,” Michelle said. “Blood, sweat and tears, and the times he got frustrated but kept going. It was really nice to see him be so successful.”



that people made,” Henry said.

But placing in the top 10, of course, was a special feeling for him.

“It made me very proud of myself,” Henry said. “And of all of the hard work I put into it.”

The actual judging of his project, he said, was a bit nerve-wracking.

“Very nervous,” he said. “There was one thing we were concerned about, mainly that the battery wouldn’t die.”

The battery did its job – and the judges were impressed.

The National Beta Convention took place in Nashville, Tenn. at the Gaylord Opryland Resort and Convention Center. Henry said he enjoyed the trip. He also wasn’t aware it was in the cards until after his second place finish at state.

“We didn’t know about nationals at all until then,” Henry said.

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Obituaries

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Havard

Guy Havard, 88, passed from this world into the arms of his Savior on the afternoon of July 2, at Ochsner Medical Center New Orleans, following a stroke.

Mr. Havard, lately a resident of Luling, was born in Baton Rouge and grew up in Melville, where his mother and the members of the First Baptist Church planted the seeds of his lifelong Christian faith.

At 16, he joined the Otter Lake Hunting Club just south of town, and he later served as its president for several years. Mr. Havard was also an avid fisherman throughout his life; his favorite hymn was “How Great Thou Art,” and this choice reflected his deep appreciation for the natural world and all God’s creatures.

Mr. Havard attended McNeese State University on a track scholarship. During his time there, he set a record, which still stands to this day, and his team won the 1958 Gulf States Conference Track & Field Championship. For many years, he enjoyed reminiscing with old friends at track team reunions.

While in college, Mr. Havard continued to court his high school sweetheart, Lucy Stockman, and they married 68 years ago, in a ceremony officiated by his father-in-law, the late Rev. Alvin Stockman, Sr.

In 1960, Mr. Havard was ordained a deacon in his home church. He often filled the pulpit for out-of-town ministers and once he served as interim pastor for Bayou des Glaises Baptist Church. Years later, due to his active preaching schedule, he was licensed to the gospel ministry by Rev. Calvin Cantrell.

Mr. Havard taught ninth-grade general science, mathematics, physical education, and drivers’ education for 20 years in Krotz Springs and Melville, in addition to coaching baseball, football, basketball, and track at Melville. For the remainder of his life, many of his former students affectionately called him “Coach Guy.”

After he retired from teaching, Mr. Havard had another career in security at the Roy O. Martin OSB Plant & Sawmill in Le Moyen. Throughout this “second act,” he continued working with young athletes. For 33 years, he umpired baseball for St. Landry Parish Schools and for the American Legion’s youth league.

After he and his wife retired from the sawmill, where Mrs. Havard worked in human resources, they moved to Central and joined Greenwell Springs Baptist Church. Mr. Havard continued serving as a deacon there; he loved volunteering at Vacation Bible School, and he took an active role in building the church’s new sanctuary.

In 2021, Mr. and Mrs. Havard moved to Luling, to be closer to their great-grandchildren, and after this move, they joined West St. Charles Baptist Church, where Mr. Havard was an honorary deacon. In his final years, he continued to follow LSU sports closely, as he had always done. His boisterous cheering and hollering could be heard way out in the yard, and his family always knew purple-and-gold gifts would be a hit.

Mr. Havard was preceded in death by his parents, Guy Monroe Havard and Annie George Havard; by his half-sister, Clara Louise Havard Walker; by his paternal grandparents, James M. Havard and Irene Griffin Havard; by his maternal grandparents, William C. George, Sr., and Mae Spurlock George; and by his step-grandmother, Bessie Stagg George.

He is survived by his wife, Lucy Havard; his daughter, Kim Havard; grandchildren, Sarah and Strother Sacra, all of Luling, and Janae and Tessa Howe of State College, Pennsylvania. He is also survived by his great-grandchildren, Lily Sacra and Eli Sacra, also of Luling.

A celebration of Mr. Havard’s life will be held at West St. Charles Baptist Church, 13099 U.S. Highway 90 in Boutte, on Saturday, July 11, with visitation at 9:00 and services at 11:00. Reverend Ryan Ogborn will preside, assisted by Rev. Thomas Hines of Hope Church in Destrehan. Arrangements are being handled by Alexander Funeral Home.

In accordance with his wishes, Mr. Havard’s family will scatter his ashes near one of his favorite fishing spots.

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Registration opens for three-day puppet building workshop at library

Registration is now open for the library's three-day Project Puppet workshop for teens ages 13 to 17, which begins July 20.

The workshop will take place at the library's Makerspace in the West Regional Library.

Makerspace Coordinator Gina Kisse said during the workshop, participants will learn how to use sewing machines and 3D modeling to create hand puppets based on their own designs.

“They will also learn about the art of storytelling through puppetry and will develop brief presentations to accompany their custom creations,” she said.

Kissee said puppet-making is a great way to practice new skills while getting creative.

“We specifically created a teen workshop this summer to encourage teens to visit the Makerspace and explore new ways to create and learn at the library,” she said.

The Makerspace craft room, which opened last summer, features pin-back button makers, a sublimation printer, heat presses, sewing machines, an electric fabric cutter and a Cricut vinyl and paper cutter.

The room also has two 3D printers and a laser engraver, which staff will operate to assist patrons with projects.

Kissee said the library sees about 30 to 40 visitors to the Makerspace each week during the school year. Visitation doubled in June, however, because of the library's summer reading program.

"Patrons visit the Makerspace to try out new crafts, learn about the Makerspace tools, and work on their own projects," she said. "Every day in the Makerspace is unique."

She said the space's 3D printing service has grown in popularity. Patrons can request 3D prints from the Makerspace through the library's website, then pick up their print from any St. Charles Parish Library branch.

"Our patrons seem to enjoy all of the different projects they can complete with help from the Makerspace, and we are so excited to provide so many unique opportunities for creativity and learning at the library," Kisse said.

Participants in the Project Puppet workshop will showcase their creations during a public presentation July 25 at 1 p.m. The event will also serve as an opportunity for other library patrons to create and play with simple puppets using Makerspace tools.

"While registration is required for the puppet building workshop, the Puppet Players Present is open to everyone," Kissee said.



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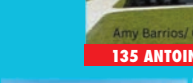

Changes in FRP Revenue include a reduction in credits flowing through the Tax Adjustment Mechanism, additions to transmission and distribution plant in service reflected through the Transmission Recovery Mechanism and Distribution Recovery Mechanism, respectively, and a decrease in credits flowing through the MISO Cost Recovery Mechanism. These changes result in a net increase in FRP Revenue of \$226 million.

The 2026-2027 application for Free/Reduced Price Meals is available online at www.MySchoolApps.com. Applying online is the fastest and most efficient way to apply for meal benefits. However, paper meal applications may be obtained from the school cafeteria or the Child Nutrition Department. To apply for free or reduced price meals, households should fill out only **one application for the household**. Complete either a paper application or an on-line application, but not both. Paper applications are available at each school. Completed paper applications should be returned to: St. Charles Parish Public Schools, Child Nutrition Department, 13855 River Road, Luling, LA 70070. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year. The information provided by the household is confidential; it will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility. Information may be verified at any time during the school year by school or other program officials.

All children in households with any household member receiving benefits under Assistance Programs (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Family Independence Temporary Assistance Program (FITAP) or Food Distribution Programs on Indian Reservations (FDP/IR)) are eligible for free meals. For school officials to determine eligibility, each household that is now receiving benefits from Assistance Programs must provide the case number of a household member as well as the signature of an adult household member.

All other households must provide the following information on the application: names of all household members; the amount of income (before deductions for taxes, Social Security, etc.) that each household member receives; how often the person receives the income; where it is from, such as wages, retirement, or welfare; the signature of an adult household member certifying that the information provided is correct; and the last four digits of the social security number of the adult household member who signed the application, or a statement that the household member does not possess one.

Children categorized as foster, homeless, runaway, migrant, or enrolled in state-funded Head Start or Even Start programs, if **known**, are automatically eligible for free meals. School officials will determine eligibility for free meals based on documentation obtained directly from the program office and notify the household of their eligibility for benefits. The household must notify the school if it chooses to decline benefits. The household **should complete an application if they are not notified of free meal eligibility by September 8, 2026**.

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size increases, the household should contact the school. Such changes may make the children of the household eligible for meal benefits.

Under the provisions of the free and reduced price policy, Jenny DeRoche, Child Nutrition Director, will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent or guardian is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he/she may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis. If the parent wishes to make a formal appeal, he may make either an oral or written response to the following: Steven Gutierrez, Director of Child Welfare and Attendance, 13855 River Road, Luling, LA 70070, (985) 785-3120.

I. Capital Improvements Committee

K. Boudreaux called the Capital Improvements Committee to order.

A. St. Charles Parish Public Schools Middle School Auxiliary Gyms and Fitness Rooms Project Change Order Number One
Assistant Superintendent of Operations John Rome, Jr. presented the item to the Board.

The total credit for all changes is a decrease in cost of \$49,348.68. Zero (0) days will be added to the contract as a result of this change. Approval of this change order will allow the District to make the necessary modifications to the existing contract.

Discussions were held on which schools this covers and the cost of permit fees. This item will be on the June 23, 2026, Board meeting agenda.

B. St. Charles Parish School Board Elementary Schools Auxiliary Gyms Change Order Number One (Includes Restrooms, Water Stations and Storage)
Assistant Superintendent of Operations John Rome, Jr., and Michael Tabb with Murray Architects presented the item to the Board.

The total credit for all changes is a decrease in cost of \$109,737.31. Zero (0) days will be added to the contract as a result of this change. Approval of this change order will allow the District to make the necessary modifications to the existing contract.

II. Personnel & Policy Committee

E. Alexander called the Personnel & Policy Committee to order.

A. Employee Discount and Financial Wellness Programs Update
Executive Director of Human Resources Teresa Brown presented the item to the Board.

St. Charles Parish Public Schools currently offers Access Perks and Smart Dollar as supplemental employee benefit programs designed to support employee financial wellness and provide access to discounts and savings opportunities. While both programs provide value to participating employees, they are discretionary expenditures that are not directly tied to the District's core priorities of staffing, instruction, compliance, or student services. As part of the District's ongoing efforts to align resources with current financial and operational opportunities, the Administration has reviewed these programs and is recommending their discontinuation.

Discussions were held on the item format, savings information presented and number of employees utilizing the program. This item will be on the June 23, 2026, Board meeting agenda.

B. Ochsner Digital Medicine Renewal
Executive Director of Human Resources Teresa Brown presented the item to the Board.

Ochsner Digital Medicine is an employee wellness initiative that provides remote monitoring and clinical support for employees with chronic conditions such as hypertension and Type 2 diabetes. The program has demonstrated strong participation and measurable improvements in disease management, with outcomes exceeding national benchmarks. By helping employees better manage chronic conditions, the program supports improved health outcomes and may help reduce overall medical costs and claims. The administration recommends renewing the program for one year using available UMR wellness credits to offset program costs.

Discussions were held on the wellness credit options, carry-over clarification, and contract end dates. This item will be on the June 23, 2026, Board meeting agenda.

C. Personnel Items
Executive Director of Human Resources Teresa Brown presented the item to the Board.

Staffing management is necessary to maintain the effective functioning of St. Charles Parish Public Schools. The Human Resources Department provides a staffing update monthly to the Board.

D. Revisions to Board Policy and Procedure 3.01 - Budget Annual Operating Budget - First Reading
Chief Financial Officer Adam Neighbors presented the item to the Board.

Upon review of Board Policy and Procedure 3.01 - Budget Annual Operating Budget, revisions are required to clarify the provisions regarding compliance with budget statutory guidelines.

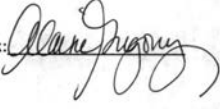
