Parish high schools earn top rankings in math, science

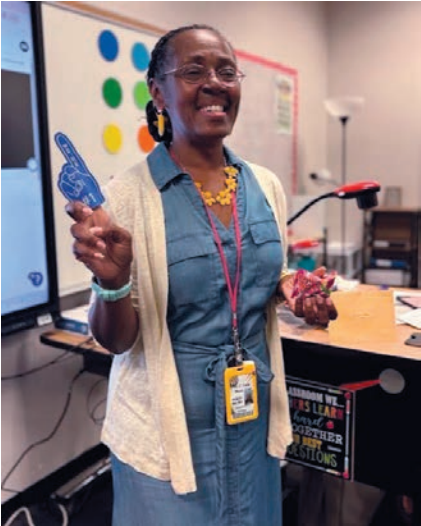

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St. Charles Parish high school students ranked No. 1 in the state in Algebra 1 and ranked No. 3 statewide in Geometry and Biology.

On other assessments, including English I, English II and U.S. history, parish students ranked in the state’s top 10.

The results are from the most recent Louisiana Educational Assessment Program assessments.

Regina McMillan, a spokesperson for the district, said the scores reflect purposeful planning, strong instruction and hard work on the part of teachers, school leaders and students.

For parents grieving a child, local support group offers understanding and hope

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There have been times over the past two years when someone would ask Missie Durapau how she’s doing, and her answer would come with a moment of hesitation. “Sometimes, I’d like to respond, ‘do you really want to know? How much time do you have?’” said Durapau. A little more than two years ago, Durapau lost her son, Mason, who passed away following a tragic accident on Easter Sunday of 2024. The Bayou Gauche woman said that in many ways, the second year without Mason was even more difficult than the first.

One thing that’s helped her push onward and through it has been a support group for bereaved parents Durapau and her husband Marty began last year. August 30 will mark the one-year anniversary of the New Orleans chapter of While We’re Waiting Support Group for parents grieving the loss of a child of any age or how long ago the death occurred. “It could be a month ago or 30 years ago,” said Durapau. “(The ministry that began While We’re Waiting) is based out of Arkansas but they’re

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Local model aircraft club invites new members to take flight

The Spillway Radio Control Club is offering a \$25 membership rate for the remainder of 2026, giving newcomers a chance to join the 51-year-old St. Charles Parish organization at a reduced cost.

Mark Rabito, president of the club, said members of the club are enthusiastic and passionate about model aircraft. Members fly radio-controlled airplanes, jets and helicopters at the Bonnet Carré Spillway throughout the year.

The club now has 55 members and membership has been growing, Rabito said.

“I believe the word is out that we have one of the most desirable radio control fields in the state,” he said.

The club’s members have 24/7 access to the wide grass field, which Rabito said is typically more forgiving than concrete and asphalt runways.

Members fly electric and turbine jets; electric, gas and nitro airplanes; and electric, gas and turbine helicopters.

Experience is not required to get involved. Rabito said the club can train newcomers how to fly radio-controlled aircraft, and someone does not need to own an aircraft before attending a

“I’ll be happy to answer their questions and get them signed up – it’s not complicated,” he said.

meeting or event.

“Come as you are,” he said. “We’d be pleased to answer any questions. I think we have some of the friendliest, knowledgeable club members who are always willing to converse and inform the public about our hobby.”

Rabito also said anyone who can demonstrate competency in flying model aircraft is welcome to become a member.

Members fly throughout the week when weather is reasonable and winds are moderate, and the club tries to hold meetings quarterly.

The club is also making improvements to its field. Members built a new shelter on the east end of the runway and are preparing to build another shelter on the west side.

Rabito said one of his favorite parts of the club is being able to enjoy the hobby with other enthusiasts.

“How can you beat being in a beautiful place, surrounded by enthusiastic friends, enjoying a challenging and



rewarding hobby?” he said.

The group is preparing for an Oct. 3 fly-in that invites radio-control pilots from around the state and members of the local community to the field.

“The fly-in is a great way to share flying with your fellow pilot enthusiasts, see all types of aircraft, encourage interest in the hobby, and enjoy great food, drink and music,” Rabito said.

after a more than year-long battle with cancer.

Jackson was working out in February of last year when he felt a sharp pain in his triceps. On May 6, 2025, he was diagnosed with Ewing Sarcoma, a rare and aggressive bone cancer that primarily affects children and young adults. The exact cause of the illness is unknown.

Hahnville head football coach Greg Boyne said the news of Jackson's passing was emotional at HHS.

"You're never ready for that news. It was a gut punch," said Boyne. "By the time we got most of our older kids (on the team) in the afternoon, they all knew. The biggest thing for us, as coaches, was just to be there for them ... guys were emotional. We had lightning, so we were inside the film room ... they kind of just turned around and talked, and I think they needed that. We (coaches) even kind of left the room and gave them a chance to talk. Just them being together, an extremely strong, tight-knit senior class, and Patrick was one of them. He's missed."

Boyne said Jackson always set a positive example for his teammates.

"He was a hardworking, humble kid. A quiet kid," Boyne said. "But he was confident and he was smart ... you could see how much the other kids really loved and respected him."

Hahnville senior quarterback Landen Teague said Jackson was a true leader.

"He was one of the hardest workers on our team," said Teague. "And he's a guy where you could talk to him if you had anything going on, about anything at all. He was always joking around. And he really loved football."

Jackson took his battle head on. "It was in his character - nothing's too big," Teague said. "He's going to fight it out, always."



Even before his diagnosis, he was known for his strength and determination. It showed in how he played the sport he loved.

"He was a very physical kid," said Boyne. "He had that chip on his shoulder ... he wasn't the biggest kid, and undersized high school kids have been told their whole life that they're small. He played with a chip. But he was as strong as any kid in our program, even as a 10th grader. His numbers were out of this world in the weight room."

He also knew the game, and knew



it well. The son of former West St. John star running back Patrick Jackson, the younger Jackson followed in his father's footsteps to play the running back position. Boyne said he was always quick to answer questions about plays, protections and situational adjustments. He had a strong understanding of the game and a desire to constantly improve. Boyne said that even as a young sophomore, Jackson was usually the first to watch film that was posted, and if it wasn't posted by a certain time, he was quick to ask when it would be.

"He had this appetite and desire to get to a different level. It's how he carried himself," Boyne said.

Said Teague of Jackson's competitiveness, "It's always, he has to win. There's no losing with him."

He also wanted to raise his teammates along with him.

"He was never afraid to speak up or speak his mind," Boyne said. "He had that strong work ethic and he was confident in his ability and probably even more in his knowledge of the game. He knew how things were supposed to be, so if he saw something, he'd tell Fabian (Celestine, Jackson's fellow running back) something, he'd tell the offensive line something. He wasn't shy about telling an older kid if he thought they were doing something wrong."

Celestine and Jackson were very close. Both were coached by Jackson's father growing up, and the two were friendly – but fierce – competitors for reps in the Hahnville backfield.

"He was an amazing person," Celestine said. "He was smart. He was a really good friend ... I'd call him and we'd just talk about life, football,

all of the stuff we wanted to do in life." This season, Celestine, the Tigers' starting running back, plans to give up his No. 1 jersey to wear No. 23 – Jackson's number – in his friend and teammate's honor.

Celestine said he learned a lot from his friend and teammate.

"He taught me that there are times to play around, but then you get serious when it's time to be serious," Celestine said.

Boyne said as a player, Jackson responded to setbacks by working harder rather than complaining. When he desired more reps, he simply asked what he needed to do to earn them. If he fumbled, he'd put it behind him and get right back to work.

Hahnville senior wide receiver Aaron Williams said Jackson was like a big brother to him.

"He was always that same guy ... he's joking around, but you know he's going to get his word done," said Williams. "That was in the classroom, too."

Williams said that whenever Jackson arrived at practice to support the team, it meant everything to he and his teammates.

"He was like family to us," Williams said. "It meant a lot, because we knew what he was going through. Even when he was going to treatment, it showed us how blessed we were as a team to be able to do this. We're holding ourselves to a high standard, because he was a high standard person."

"Even in the tough times, he always had a smile on his face. He brought positivity on and off the field."

Jackson's way of living, more than anything, is what Boyne believes is his legacy within the Tiger program.

"When something goes wrong, if you're having a bad day, you ask 'how would Patrick handle this?'" Boyne said. "You want to be like Patrick."

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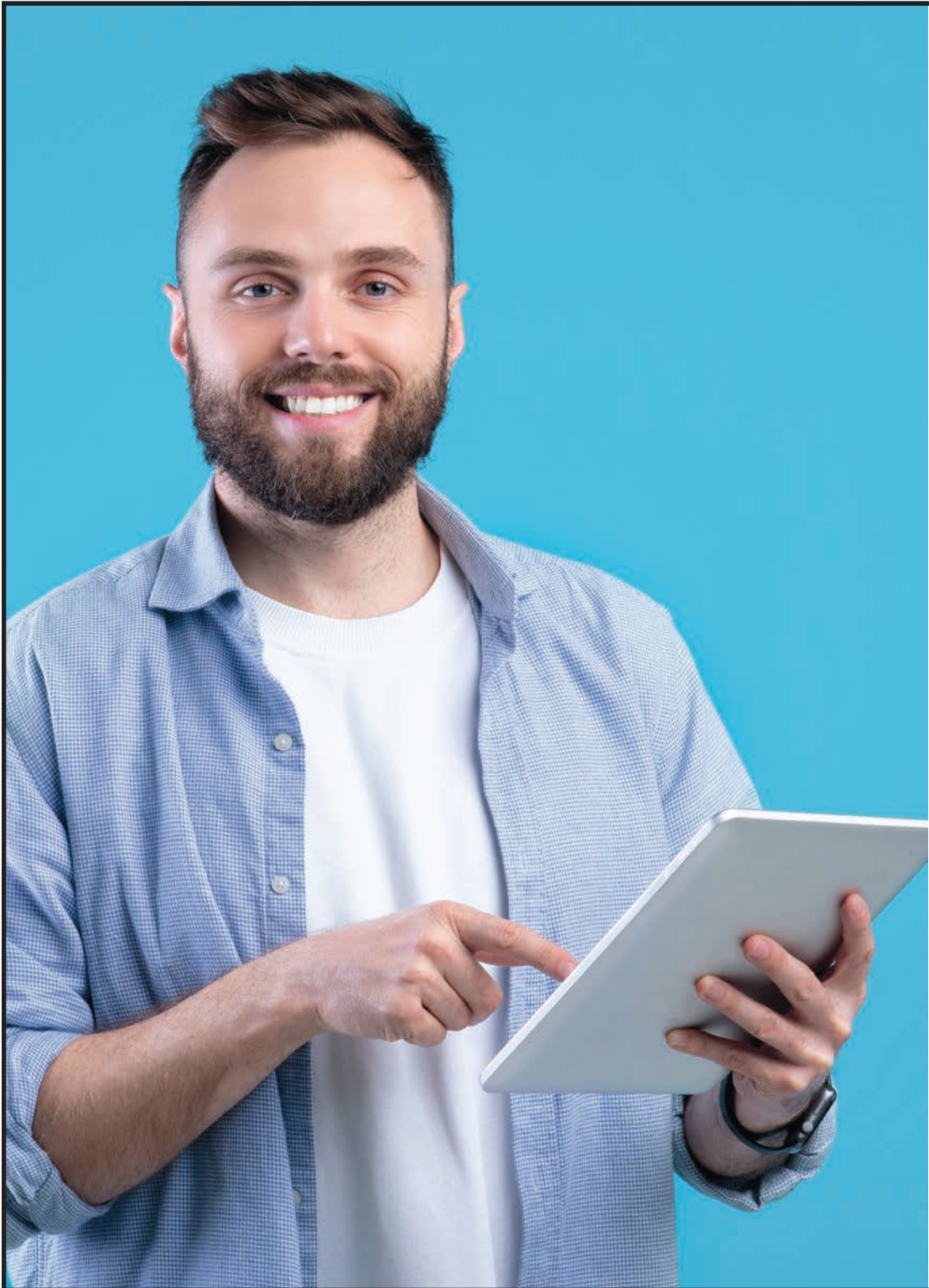

“They demonstrate that the strategies we have put in place are working and making a difference,” McMillan said. “Most importantly, it means more of our students are demonstrating the knowledge and skills they need to be prepared for what comes next.”

At the high school level, LEAP assessments are given across seven courses: English I, English II, Algebra 1, Geometry, Biology, Civics, and U.S. History. The assessments measure how well students mastered the knowledge and skills expected in each course. A score of Mastery or above indicates that a student is on track for college and career readiness.

Across all high school LEAP assessments, the percentage of district students scoring Mastery or above increased from 45 percent in 2025 to 48 percent in 2026.

McMillan said both Hahnville and Destrehan students saw year-over-year growth in the percentage of students scoring Mastery or above. Destrehan High School scores increased by five percentage points and Hahnville High School scores increased by three percentage points.

District leaders tied the strong high school performance to several initiatives. To help students who

scored below Basic on LEAP tests, the district placed two certified teachers in designated classes and provided students with additional instruction throughout the year.

McMillan said the district had data from previous years that suggested co-teaching would be effective for students who needed extra support.

“Based on that data, we decided to expand this approach,” she said. “Having an additional teacher in the classroom creates more opportunities for one-on-one and small-group instruction and allows teachers to

provide more targeted support.”

Teachers also continue to operate Professional Learning Communities to pinpoint individual learning needs and develop specific learning targets.

“That process allows teachers to respond to what students need throughout the year rather than waiting until the end of a course to identify gaps,” McMillan said.

Trista Brazan, communications manager for UWSC, said she hopes residents leave each session with practical skills, valuable knowledge and greater confidence to help their businesses and careers thrive.

“We believe that lasting change comes not only from providing assistance, but also from empowering individuals with the knowledge, skills, and resources they need to help themselves and build a stronger financial future,” she said.

The Lunch and Learn Series is made up of 90-minute, standalone sessions that cover topics like writing a business plan, hiring staff, budgeting and

marketing.

Brazan said she is especially excited about the marketing session.

“We’ve heard from many small business owners who are so focused on the day-to-day demands of running their businesses that they don’t always have the time or opportunity to learn how to grow them,” she said. “We hope this session gives them practical tools and strategies they can put to work right away.”

Participants will receive a free meal at each session and can enter a raffle for gift cards. The sessions will focus on practical job-readiness skills while helping participants develop basic business

plans and marketing strategies.

The lunch series is a partnership between UWSC and the Catholic Charities Archdiocese of New Orleans. The organizations announced their joint Workforce Development and Small Business Training Initiative, which is aimed at equipping parish residents with the tools, knowledge and confidence needed to secure employment and build sustainable income through entrepreneurship.

Brazan said the Lunch and Learn Series was inspired by the United Way’s

mission to create greater financial stability within the community.

“We want to reach the small business owner who may be running a one- or two-person operation and give them access to practical guidance on budgeting, marketing, growth planning and more,” she said. “Our goal is to provide them with tools they can use to strengthen their businesses, plan for the future and ultimately prosper.”

Two years ago, she completed a mural at the West Bank Bridge Park when it was being remodeled.

And, most recently, Allen left her creative mark at St. Charles Parish Hospital, where she completed her latest mural for the hospital's emergency room.

The mural showcases the bright and scenic landscape of St. Charles Parish complete with the Hale Boggs Bridge, a barge moving through the Mississippi River beneath, pelicans flying through the sky, cypress trees and wildlife.

Allen noted the project took approximately 200 hours to complete, including the preparation of a framed platform for the mural and installation. Because of space limitations and the desire to keep from disrupting the ER's workers, Allen and her husband Tim constructed the mural on a platform built from two mahogany veneer panels.

The opportunity arose when hospital representatives reached out to Allen, who they knew from her involvement with the St. Charles Parish Art Guild

– the guild exhibits artwork at the hospital through a rotating exhibition. While discussions began last August, approval was not finalized until May.

The hospital provided a reference image and collaborated with Allen to visualize what would be the final product, in this case a river-themed scene.

Allen said she usually works in oils, but used acrylic paint for the hospital mural as it was more practical for the task at hand. Because of the coverage of acrylic, virtually everything required two coats. Once finished, she applied a sealer to protect it from everyday wear and give it a finished sheen.

Because the ER area has no windows and relies on artificial lighting, Allen made the mural very colorful and vibrant to help brighten the space.

Allen says that she hopes it will, at least in a small way, brighten the day a bit for those who see it.

“A lot of people work there and then all of the people who go to the ER ... I'm hoping when they look up and see it, it'll

make them smile,” Allen said.

“I'm very thankful that this is what I get to do and that I can share it with people, and that it can make other people so happy.”

She doesn't remember a time in her life that she wasn't connected with art in some way. As far back as she can recall, she was drawing. She moved into acrylics and eventually oils and charcoal. After retiring from teaching, she took classes at the New Orleans Academy of Fine Arts to continue to refine her skills.

And continuing to refine and improve, Allen says, is forever an ongoing process. “You never really stop learning,” said Allen. “There's always something more to learn. I still study, I still practice.”

Allen said she's always got something going on at her studio.

“I can't imagine not having a project underway,” she said. “This is such a part of me ... I've always got something in the works. I have an exhibition coming up in October. I've been commissioned to do paintings. I always have a class to

prepare for or a workshop upcoming ... I just know I could not be without it. It's part of who I am.”

Being an artist can be a solitary experience, especially when working on a significant project. In this case, day after day, Allen saw the mural progressing at her home, largely without outside feedback.

But after installing the mural at the hospital, she got that feedback.

“I was very happy that they were pleased with it,” said Allen. “The people at the hospital were so nice, appreciative and supportive. And they were excited to get this mural – it's not something you think about during the entire creative process, but once you get there and you hear them tell you how it brightens up their space ... it just really makes my heart happy.”

nationwide now, and we started a local chapter.

The group has grown over the past year, with between seven and 13 parents attending each meeting.

“It's big enough to hear several different perspectives but still small enough to be able to get to know each other and talk about our children,” said Durapau. “We've had some parents who have come every month, and some who have come once or twice. But we're able to stay in touch.”

Durapau said it's been helpful for her to be able to talk and share about her son. Likewise, it's a place where she

feels she, nor the other parents, have to “put on a mask.” The grief can come in waves, she said, and can crash in out of nowhere.

“It doesn't have to be an anniversary or a special day. Sometimes, you just wake up and feel like, OK, today's just going to be a hard grief day. And you grin and bear it,” said Durapau. “And (in the group), you don't have to put on that mask.”

The group is Christian-based and each meeting includes a devotional, but Durapau stressed that this is a group for everyone – parents of any faith or no faith are welcome and nobody is

pressured to participate religiously.

Durapau said there's a unique understanding among bereaved parents, and they can know they need not worry about being judged because everyone understands the experience firsthand.

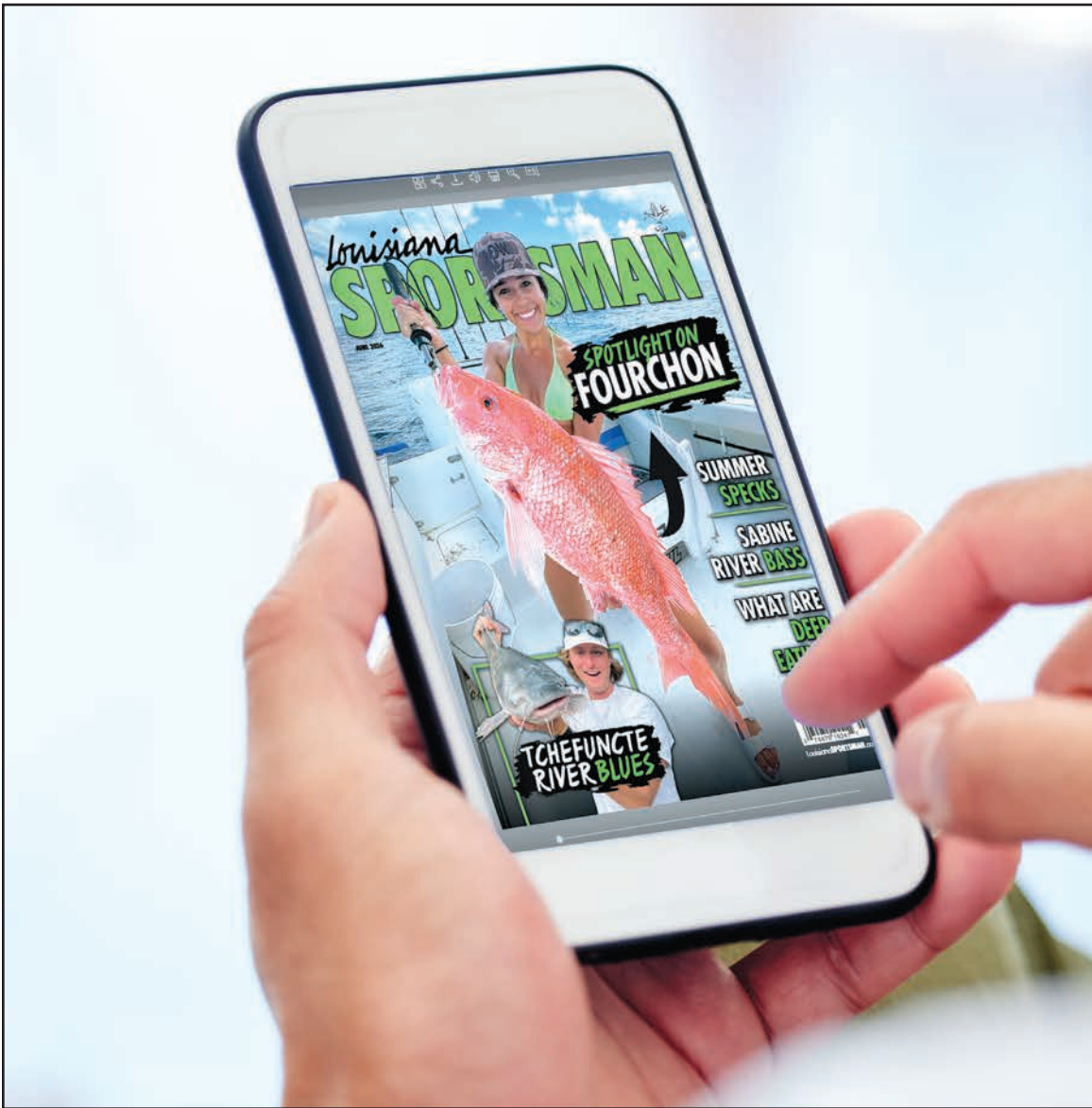
“It's a special bond,” she said. “You're never going to say anything where people are going to think, oh, they're stuck ... we're never going to get over losing our child. We're going to grieve our children until we die. There's no timeline on grief. But this helps. It helps me learn how to carry the grief a little better.”

Registration or sign up for the group is not required. Meeting schedules are

Durapau says other parents in the group serve as an inspiration for her.

“To see them getting through it, it makes me say, OK, I can get through it, too,” she said.

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Friendship bracelets, handmade stickers, 3D pen art custom and color bookmarks are a few of the crafts teens can create during the library’s Maker Mayhem program every Tuesday from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. at the Makerspace in the West Regional Library in Luling.

Makerspace Coordinator Gina Kissee said the program is designed for teens to try new crafts and explore the Makerspace, a craft room with a variety of tools, including heat presses, sewing machines, a sublimation printer and more.

“The activities available each week are not the only projects teens can work on in the Makerspace,” Kissee said. “They’re just an opportunity to get started learning about our tools and how they work.”

The library started the program during the summer to encourage teens to visit the Makerspace, which opened in June 2025.

“The Makerspace is a great resource for school and personal projects, and we want the teens in the community to feel welcome to visit and utilize the space alongside other patrons,” Kissee said.

Maker Mayhem is held during the Makerspace’s open hours, so other family members, parents and guardians are welcome to watch, join in or work on projects in the space, Kissee said.

Kissee said no experience is required to visit the Makerspace and staff members are available to assist with projects whenever the space is open.

“Some skills may require more time to learn than others, but everyone is welcome to join at any time,” she said.

Each week, Maker Mayhem features different Makerspace tools. Teens have used the sewing machines, Cricut vinyl cutter, sticker maker, and 3D pens.

“There are opportunities to learn new skills each week, from hand embroidery to machine sewing,” Kissee said. “Our hope is that teens will find crafts and projects that are interesting to them, and that they will continue visiting the library to work on their own projects in the future.”

HHS alum Byrd races to accolades for Georgia State

Took runner-up finish in the Sun Belt Conference's 400 meter conference championship meet

Kevell Byrd left Dillard University with nine school records and made an immediate impact once she arrived at Georgia State.

The former Hahnville track star was the Sun Belt Conference runner up in the 400-meter event, securing her personal best time of 52.81 to do it at the conference's track and field championship meet this year. She also qualified for the NCAA East Regional in the 200 and 400 events.

She competed in 11 meets during her Georgia State debut season.

Byrd won two championships at the Emory Dooley Elite meet, earning first in the 100 and 200-meter events. She ran a personal best time of 11.85 in the 100. That followed up on her championship at the University of South Alabama Invite, where she won the 200-meter while finishing third in the 60-meter.

Competing at Dillard from 2021 to 2024, Byrd earned NAIA All-American status. She finished as national runner up in the 200 and 400-meter events and was a four-time HBCU MVP (formerly the Gulf Coast Athletic Conference). Byrd won 16 individual championships at Dillard, was part of eight team champions and earned NAIA Academic All-American status eight times.

She was named the NAIA indoor track and field Champion of Character in 2025 and the HBCU Made Excellence Track Athlete of the Year 2024. All of that followed an immediate impact at the school after she earned LSWA Freshman of the Year status on the 2022 All-Louisiana Track and Field Team. Her very first year at Dillard saw her break several school records, securing top marks in the indoor 200 and 400-meter events, as well as the indoor 60 meters.

Byrd left Hahnville as the record-holder in the 200-meter event and was part of the school's record-setting 4x100 squad.

In 2022, she returned to her one-time home track at Tiger Stadium and won Track MVP as Dillard won the GCAC Championship, which was its first conference title in 11 years. She won three individual events and was part of two winning relay squads.

"I've been on this track a million times," Byrd said after that event. "I ran it for four years and I'm very comfortable there. I'm wearing Dillard colors, but I know this track like the back of my hand."

Bills duo, Jags receiver among strong targets for fantasy

Another NFL season is upon us, and with it another round of fantasy drafts.

Some quick overall thoughts on the league landscape – I think we’re going to see production continue to funnel through running backs, as we’ve largely seen for the past two years as teams continue to counter the two-high safety, limit the pass focus its defenses have largely adopted. Teams drafted a ton of tight ends following the success the Rams had loading the field with them a year ago.

Funny enough, the following list of guys I’m looking to draft is fairly heavy at the OTHER positions. I think production at QB and WR might continue to wane a bit, so it’s important to find some difference makers there. But you’re going to want to take runners early and often as you/if you mix these guys in.

DJ Moore, WR, Bills. I think we’ll see a lot of attention go to A.J. Brown getting to play with possibly the best passer he’s had. And Brown is a very, very good pick. But a little later on, and a bit more under the radar, Moore is in the same boat.

Caleb Williams made a big leap last season. And Moore, as a rookie, played with Cam Newton. But Josh Allen might just be what Moore has waited his entire career for. And I don’t necessarily expect the Bills to be as run-oriented as they were last year, which brings us to ...

Josh Allen, QB, Bills. He’s the consensus No. 1 QB. I’m not breaking new ground here. But Josh Allen, historically, is a ... ahem ... statistical MONSTER when the Bills are pushed by their opposition. And their schedule this year – the Lions. The Chargers. The Rams. The Ravens. The Chiefs. The Packers. The Ravens. The Bears. The Broncos.

He’s going to have to put on the Superman cape for a few of these games. And new head coach Joe Brady – we remember him – may not necessarily bring in the same run-first philosophy he had last season under Sean McDermott. Even

if he does, he may not be able to stick to it against some of these teams. Could be a massive season for Allen. You’ll need to draft him relatively high, but I think it may be worth it.

Parker Washington, WR, Jaguars – Jaguar Smith-Njigba. OK, maybe that’s a bit lofty. Still, following Travis Hunter’s injury, the Jaguars ramped up Washington’s workload and he delivered in a huge way and finished the season with games of 145, 115, 87 and 107 yards, the last of which came in the playoffs (which wouldn’t have helped your team last season, but a great sign for this upcoming year). He racked up 26 receptions over those four games. The slot role in Jags’ head coach Liam Coen’s offense is historically a very strong one for statistics. When he was OC for the Jaguars in 2024, Chris Godwin was dominant in the same spot before a midseason injury ended his year.

Colston Loveland, TE, Bears. Like Washington, Loveland found his groove late in the season. Unlike Washington, Loveland comes with high NFL Draft pedigree after being chosen 10th in 2025. He was targeted 48 times over his final four games, including two playoff contests, and topped 90 yards three times. Like the Washington shout, this is also tied to the head coach – Ben Johnson is another play-caller who feeds the slot a ton. Loveland’s a tight end, but effectively served the same role. Note: it’s possible Luther Burden could slide into this spot. I like Loveland, but both are good picks.

Jordan Mason, RB, Vikings. This is really simply a play on a team I like to surprise this season. The Vikings added Kyler Murray at quarterback and I get the feeling we’re going to see a very run heavy offense with Murray keeping the chains moving with his own stellar scrambling ability. Mason will share carries, but ultimately I think he’s the goal line hammer and the guy who they’d like to punish defenses with in the fourth. He should also go later in your draft.

Christian Watson, WR, Green Bay. There is a huge, huge season in Watson somewhere. We saw a glimpse of it in

his rookie year. We saw flashes of it last season. The Packers have loved rotating wide receivers, but they let go of Romeo Doubs and Dontayvion Wicks – which is great news for Watson, as well as Jayden Reed and Matthew Golden. Any of these guys makes for a strong pick, but Watson is my favorite of the three.

Kyren Williams and Blake Corum, RBs, LA Rams – The Rams added Myles Garrett and will likely bring back Aaron Donald to their defensive line. They’re everyone’s favorites to win the Super Bowl. Their quarterback is 38 and just got his MVP.

This team is going to run the football. Relentlessly.

Williams likely slips in drafts this year due to Corum’s presence. He’s going to lose work. But he also could lead the NFL in touchdowns and won’t cost you a first or second round pick. Corum, meanwhile, should play a good bit – maybe not enough early to be more than bye week filler, but were Williams to miss time, Corum could win you the league.

Baker Mayfield and Emeka Egbuka, Tampa Bay, QB and WR. I liked this better before Egbuka came up with a toe injury. So, keep an eye on that. Both of these guys were playing hurt last season. You can’t run on Tampa and Tampa can’t stop you from passing. So, if health permits, these guys could be in shootouts for much of the year.

Malik Willis, QB, Miami. Willis played

pretty great ball for Green Bay during fill-in starts the past couple of years. Miami’s expected to be a poor team this season and I won’t dispute it. But running quarterbacks score points and Willis can rack up rushing yards as well as anyone at the position.

Travis Etienne, RB, Saints. He’s the type of running back pick I love to make – long speed and ability to break things open with a 60-yard touchdown run. Before last season, Kellen Moore reportedly said that ideally, he’d love for his team to be the Indiana Pacers of the NFL. That means running a high pace and getting tons of plays off. My one area of concern with Etienne – I could easily see Alvin Kamara working in a ton at the goal line. But ultimately it’s not enough to scare me off.

Kenneth Walker, RB, Chiefs. Just a quick shout to Walker, who will almost certainly cost a pick somewhere in the top 20. Patrick Mahomes is coming off of injury and Walker reportedly didn’t love losing as many touches as he did to Zach Charbonnet last season. Not hard to imagine he sought a place that would feed him the ball until he burps, and the Chiefs would likely love him to take as much pressure off Mahomes as possible until their star QB is back in form.

Reason for Change Order:

1. Add Work Items:

a. Contractor needed to raise the center line of the RAS pipe from elevation 19.56' to elevation 21.21' to avoid conflict with the existing wheel on each basin. Change Order cost total is \$16,429.32. Contract included an allowance of \$10,000 for the relocation of infrastructure items and was utilized within this change resulting in a total change of \$6,429.32.

b. Per St. Charles Parish request, pipe supports were changed to stainless steel.

c. Upon excavation, it was discovered the electrical duct bank is in the way of installing the 18" RAS pipe at Basin #1. The duct bank is about 5' below grade. Contractor was directed to install a 90 above the duct bank and run over to where we need to tie in and 90 down to the tie in location. Additional piping was needed as well.

d. Upon draining Basin #2, it was discovered the bridge supports were damaged. Contractor was directed to repair/replace the damaged supports.

e. Blower manufacturer recommended additional supports at the blower discharge which was not part of the original scope. The Parish agreed that the additional support was beneficial.

f. Contractor needed to raise the center line of the RAS pipe to avoid a conflict with the existing wheel on each basin.

g. Upon excavation, a concrete obstruction was discovered at our tie point causing the tie point to be at a different location resulting in additional materials and labor.

Owner and Contractor, in consideration of premises and the mutual covenants; consideration and agreement herein contained, agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1

STATEMENT OF WORK

1.01 Contractor shall furnish all labor and materials and perform the work required to build, construct and complete in a thorough and workmanlike manner in connection with the following:

Project Number: N/A

1.02 The abovementioned work shall be completed in strict accordance with Contract Documents prepared by: Grace Hebert Curtis Architects, LLC

1.03 It is recognized by the parties herein that said Contract Documents including by way of example and not of limitation, the Drawings and Specifications dated April 17, 2026, the General Conditions, Supplementary Conditions (if applicable), impose duties and obligations upon the parties herein, and said parties thereby agree that they shall be bound by said duties and obligations. For these purposes, all of the provisions contained in the aforementioned Contract Documents are incorporated herein by reference with the same force and effect as though said Contract Documents were herein set out in full.

1.04 The Work is generally described as follows: construction of a new 12,485 square foot library in Hahnville

ARTICLE 2

ARCHITECT

2.01 The Project has been designed by Grace Hebert Curtis Architects, LLC who is hereinafter called "Architect" and who will assume all duties and responsibilities and have the rights and authority assigned to Architect in the Contract Documents in connection with completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

ARTICLE 3

CONTRACT TIME

3.01 The Contractor shall complete the Work under the Contract within 365 calendar days from the date stated in the Notice to Proceed.

ARTICLE 4

LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

4.01 Owner and Contractor recognize that the Owner will suffer direct financial loss if Work is not completed within the Contract Time specified plus any extensions thereof allowed in accordance with these General Conditions of this Contract, and therefore, time is of the essence. They also recognize the delays, expense and difficulties involved in proving in a

legal preceeding the actual loss suffered by Owner if the Work is not completed on time. Accordingly, instead of requiring any such proof, Contractor and Surety agree to forfeit and pay Owner Five Hundred dollars \$500.00 per day as Liquidated Damages for delay (but not as a penalty). Such Liquidated Damages will be assessed for each calendar day that expires after the Contract Time. This amount represents a reasonable estimate of Owner's expenses for extended delays and the costs associated therein. This provision shall be effective between the parties ipso facto and without demand or putting in default, it being specifically agreed that the Contractor by his mere failure to complete the work on or before the date specified shall be deemed in default.

ARTICLE 5

CONTRACT PRICE

- 5.01 The Owner will pay and the Contractor will accept in full consideration for the performance of the Contract the sum of:
- a) (\$9,040,972.00) Nine Million Forty Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy-Two Dollars based on unit prices specified within this contract document. Contract price is firm and subject only to modification by written Change Order agreed to and signed by both parties and the Architect and approved by the St. Charles Parish Council.
- b) \$1,500,000.00 of the above amount was allocated in a previous Contract, Ordinance No. 25-6-3 as approved and adopted by the St. Charles Parish Council on June 2, 2025. Therefore, invoices moving forward for the total Contract Price of \$9,040,972.00 will show a previously paid amount as issued and completed by Task Order #1, referenced in Article 8 of this document.

ARTICLE 6

PAYMENT PROCEDURES

- 6.01 Contractor shall submit Applications for Payment to the Architect in accordance with Article 15 of the General Conditions. Applications for Payment will be processed by Architect as provided in the General Conditions.
- 6.02 Progress Payments. Progress payments will be based upon estimated quantities of contract unit price items or upon estimated percentages of completion of the schedule of lump sum values of labor and materials incorporated into the Work or suitably stored, on the last day of each month or other mutually agreed regular monthly date ending the progress payment period, less retainage.
- 6.03 Application for Payment Form. The form of the Application for Payment must be suitable to the Owner. The Owner reserves the right to withhold payment until the form of Application for Payment is deemed acceptable by the Owner.
- 6.04 Retainage. Per Paragraph 15.01.D retainage shall be withheld and payments will be made by the Owner in the payment amount of:
- a) Ninety percent (90%) of the approved payment applications for projects with contract of less than \$500,000.00; or
- b) Ninety-five percent (95%) of the approved payment applications for projects with contract prices of \$500,000.01 or greater.
- 6.05 The normal retainage shall not be due the Contractor until after Substantial Completion and expiration of the forty-five (45) day lien period and submission to the Architect of a clear lien certificate and invoice for retainage.
- 6.06 Final Payment. Upon the final completion of all Work, the Contractor may request a final inspection and may make a final Application for Payment as provided by Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions.
- 6.07 Final Acceptance. When Final Acceptance is granted by the Owner, the Owner shall file the certificate with the Recorder of Mortgages for St. Charles Parish.
- 6.08 At the expiration of the lien period the Contractor shall obtain a certificate from the Recorder of Mortgages of the Parish of St. Charles that the Contract is clear of any liens or privileges, and said certificate shall be presented to the Owner for final payment and release of retainage, less any such sums as may be lawfully withheld under the Contract.
- 6.09 Claims. Pursuant to La. R.S. 38:2242, when the Owner receives any claim of nonpayment arising out of the Contract, the Owner shall deduct such claim from the Contract Sum. The Contractor, or any interested party, may deposit security, in accordance with La. R.S. 38:2242.2, guaranteeing payment of the claim with the Recorder of Mortgages for St. Charles Parish. When the Owner receives original proof of such guarantee from the Recorder of Mortgages, the claim deduction will be added back to the Contract Sum.

ARTICLE 7

CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIONS

- 7.01 In order to induce Owner to enter into this Agreement, Contractor makes the following representations:
- 7.02 Contractor has familiarized itself with the nature and extent of the Contract Documents, Work, site, locality, and all local conditions and laws and regulations that in any manner may affect cost, progress, performance or finishing of the Work.
- 7.03 Contractor has studied carefully all reports of explorations and tests of subsurface physical conditions and drawings of physical conditions as provided in the General Conditions.
- 7.04 Contractor has obtained and carefully studied (or assumed responsibility for obtaining and carefully studying) all such examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, reports and studies (in addition to or to supplement those referred to in Paragraph 2 above) which pertain to the subsurface or physical conditions at or contiguous to the site or which otherwise may affect the cost, progress, performance or furnishing of the Work as Contractor considers necessary for the performance or furnishing of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Time and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract Documents. SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and effective as of by and between ST. CHARLES PARISH acting herein by and through its President, who is duly authorized to act on behalf of said Parish, hereinafter called the OWNER, and ARCCO COMPANY SERVICES, INC., a corporation and/or limited liability company acting herein by and through its Contracting Officer, hereinafter called CONTRACTOR. Whereas the Owner desires to employ a Contractor consulting firm to perform consulting work and services for Wastewater Generator Preventative Maintenance 2026, Parish Project No. S260701 as described in Ordinance No. 26-8-7 which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

1.0 GENERAL TERMS

The Owner agrees to employ the Contractor and the Contractor agrees to perform work services required for the project described above. Contractor will conform to the requirements of the Owner and to the standards of the agencies participating with the Owner in the Project. The Contractor will coordinate all work between the Owner and all participating agencies and regulating agencies, if needed. Written authorization to begin different phases of the project will be given to the Contractor by the Owner. The Owner may terminate the Contract by written notification and without cause per Section 11.0 during any phase of the project.

This Agreement shall be effective for a period of two (2) years beginning August 1, 2026, and can be extended by written mutual agreement of both parties for an additional one (1) year (twelve months) term.

The Contractor shall at all times during this Agreement maintain all applicable valid Louisiana contracting licenses necessary for performance of the work and services.

All work shall be under the direction of the Owner, and all plans, specifications, etc. shall be submitted to the Owner and all approvals and administration of this contract shall be through the Owner.

2.0 PROJECT

2.3 Contractor shall perform all scope of services and work in accordance with the Schedule as defined in Attachment "B" hereto unless otherwise mutually agreed upon by the parties in writing.

2.4 The Contractor agrees to comply with all Federal, State, and Local Laws and Ordinances applicable to the scope of services and work or in entering any other agreement with any another party to complete the work.

3.0 SERVICES OF CONTRACTOR

3.1 Contractor shall provide Owner professional work and services in all phases of the Project to which this Agreement applies and as hereinafter provided to properly plan and execute the work on the project(s) assigned to the Contractor.

3.2 Services provided by the Contractor shall be performed in accordance with generally accepted professional practice at the time and the place where the services are rendered.

3.3 Contractor shall obtain from Owner authorization to proceed in writing for each phase of the Project if applicable.

3.4 Contractor shall provide work and services to complete the project, including all necessary services described herein or usually implied as a prerequisite for the performance of the services whether or not specifically mentioned in this agreement, including attendance by the Contractor at project conferences and public hearings.

4.0 OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

4.1 Documents including but not limited to plans, specifications, maps, basic survey notes, sketches, charts, computations and all other data prepared or obtained under the terms of this authorization shall become the property of the Owner and shall be made available for Owner's inspection at any time during the Project and, shall be delivered to the Owner prior to termination or final completion of the Contract.

4.2 Contractor may retain a set of documents for its files.

4.3 Reuse of Documents. Any reuse of documents or materials without written authorization or adaptation by Contractor to the specific purpose intended will be at Owner's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Contractor or to Contractor's independent professional associates, subcontractors, and representatives.

4.4 No materials, to include but not limited to reports, maps or other documents produced as a result of this Contract, in whole or in part, shall be available to Contractor for copyright purposes. Any such materials produced as a result of this Contract that might be subject to copyright shall be the property of the Owner and all such rights shall belong to the Owner, and the Owner shall be sole and exclusive entity who may exercise such rights.

5.0 SUPPLEMENTARY SERVICES

The Contractor shall provide, when requested in writing by the Owner, supplementary services not included in the basic work and services.

The compensation to the Contractor for the supplemental services, when performed by the Contractor, shall be in the form of a lump sum, billable hours, or "not to exceed" hourly rate which is mutually agreeable to the Owner and the Contractor in writing.

6.0 DEFECTIVE WORK

During such visits and on the basis of such observations, Owner may disapprove of or reject Contractor's work while it is in progress if Contractor believes that such work will not produce a completed Project that conforms generally to the scope of work and services.

7.0 NOTICE TO PROCEED

The Owner shall notify the Contractor in writing to undertake the services stated in this Agreement, and the Contractor shall commence the services within ten (10) days after receipt of such notification.

If the Owner desires to divide the Project into various parts, a Notice to Proceed shall be issued for each part, and the Owner and the Contractor shall mutually agree upon the period of time within which services for each part of the Project shall be performed.

The Contractor will be given time extensions for delays beyond their control or for those caused by tardy approvals of work in progress by various official agencies, but no additional compensation shall be allowed for such delays.

8.0 PAYMENTS

8.1 Owner shall pay Contractor for the performance of work and services as outlined in Attachment "C" to this Agreement.

8.2 If the Project, or any portion thereof, is not completed for any reason, the final fee for consulting work and services shall be negotiated between Owner and Contractor. If the final fee for work and services is not mutually agreed upon, either party may elect in writing to submit the dispute to mediation. If mediation is not mutually agreed upon, written notice will be submitted to the other party of the intent to submit the dispute to the 29th Judicial District Court of St. Charles Parish, State of Louisiana.

8.3 If authorized in writing by Owner, for the performance of, or for obtaining from others Additional Services which are not considered normal or customary consulting, the Owner shall pay Contractor based on monthly invoices submitted by the Contractor, within sixty (60) days of receipt of Contractor's invoice. Contractor shall provide written notice to Owner when no services or work have been performed during a given month.

8.4 The following documentation shall be required for payment to Contractor and shall be attached to the monthly invoice.

a. A copy of the Owner's written authorization to perform the service.

b. Timesheets for all hours invoiced.

c. Invoice copies, logs or other substantiation of non-salary expenses.

8.5 For Additional Authorized Services that Contractor acquires from subcontractors and/or subcontractors, Owner shall pay Contractor a fixed sum previously agreed upon by Owner and Contractor, such sum to be established in each case when the scope of the work involved has been determined and before any of the Additional Services are provided. The use of subcontractors and/or subcontractors shall be subject to the provisions set forth in this Agreement. The following documentation shall be required for payment to Contractor and shall be attached to the monthly invoice:

a. A copy of the Owner's written consent for the subcontractor and/or subcontractor to perform the service stating the Owner's and Contractor's agreed upon fixed sum established for the service performed.

b. Evidence that the subcontractor and/or subcontractor is insured as required by this Agreement.

8.6 For *Additional Services* described in Section 5, Owner shall pay Contractor for the fee negotiated at the time the work is assigned by the method stipulated in the contract amendment.

9.0 BUDGET LIMITATIONS

The construction budget for this Project shall be determined by the Owner, and the Contractor shall be advised of the budget limitation in writing by the Owner and the Contractor shall indicate his acceptance of same in writing to the Owner. Any subsequent budget revisions shall be confirmed in writing.

10.0 FUNDS

No work shall be authorized until funds are established for each individual task.

11.0 TERMINATION OR SUSPENSION

11.1 This Agreement may be terminated for any reason by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice.

11.2 The Contractor, upon receipt of such notice, shall immediately discontinue all services in connection with the performance of this Agreement and shall proceed to cancel promptly all existing orders and contracts insofar as such orders or contracts are chargeable to this Agreement.

11.3 The Contractor shall, as soon as practicable after receipt of notice of termination, submit a statement showing in detail the services performed and payments received under this Agreement to the date of termination.

11.4 The Owner shall then pay the Contractor promptly that portion of the prescribed fee to which both parties agree.

11.5 Contractor fully acknowledges that no payment will be made for any work performed or expenses incurred after receipt of the termination by either party unless mutually agreed upon in writing.

11.6 Failure to meet agreed delivery dates or authorized extensions are considered substantial failures and breach of this contractual agreement by Contractor.

12.0 INSURANCE

12.1 The Contractor shall secure and maintain at his expense such insurance that will protect him and the Owner, from claims under Workmen's Compensation Acts and from claims for bodily injury, death or property damage which may arise from performance of services under this Agreement. Insurance for bodily injury or death shall be in the unencumbered amount of \$1,000,000.00 for one person and not less than \$1,000,000.00 for all injuries and/or deaths resulting from any one occurrence.

The insurance for property damage shall be in the unencumbered amount of \$1,000,000.00 for each accident and not less than \$1,000,000.00 aggregate.

12.2 The Contractor shall also secure and maintain at his expense professional liability insurance in the unencumbered sum of \$1,000,000.00.

12.3 All certificates of insurance SHALL BE FURNISHED TO THE OWNER and shall provide that insurance shall not be cancelled without ten (10) days prior written notice to the Owner. The Owner may examine the policies.

12.4 Contractor shall include all subcontractors and/or subcontractors as insured under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates for each. All coverages for subcontractors and/or subconsultants shall be subject to all the requirements stated herein.

12.5 CONTRACTOR shall secure and maintain at its expense Comprehensive Automobile Liability - Bodily Injury Liability \$1,000,000.00 each person: \$1,000,000.00 each occurrence. Property Damage Liability \$1,000,000.00 each occurrence. The Comprehensive Automobile Liability policy must have coverage for loading and unloading and must include owned, hired and leased autos.

12.6 St Charles Parish shall be named as an additional insured on general liability insurance policies.

12.7 For all purposes under Louisiana law, the principals of this Contract shall be recognized as the statutory employer of all contract employees as provided in LSA-R.S. 23:1061.

12.8 Insurance policies shall be endorsed to provide for a waiver of subrogation in favor of St. Charles Parish for worker's compensation policies. The certificate of insurance shall reference the waiver of subrogation endorsement.

12.9 The Worker's Compensation Policy Territory Coverage must include Louisiana.

13.0 INDEMNIFICATION

Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the Owner, its employees, agents and representatives, against any and all claims, demands, suits or judgments for sums of money to any party for loss of life or injury or damages to person or property growing out of, resulting from or by any reason of any negligent act by the Contractor, its employees, agents, servants or representatives, while engaged upon or in connection with the services required or performed hereunder.

14.0 WARRANTY

14.1 Contractor warrants that it will perform its design services with the degree of skill and to the standard of care required of the consulting profession to meet all Federal, State and Local requirements.

14.2 If Consulting Services for project designed by Contractor does not meet those requirements noted herein above, then to the extent that this occurs as a direct result of Contractor's failure to meet the standard of care in its design services, Contractor will indemnify the Parish for Contractor's share of the costs incurred to bring Consulting Services for project to the limitations mandated.

14.3 The obligations expressed in Section 14 above in no way limit the Contractor's obligations expressed elsewhere in this Contract.

15.0 EXCLUSIVE JURISDICTION AND VENUE

For all claims arising out of or related to this agreement, CONTRACTOR hereby consents and yields to the exclusive jurisdiction and venue of the Twenty-Ninth Judicial District Court for the Parish of St. Charles, State of Louisiana, and expressly waives any (a) pleas of jurisdiction based upon Contractor's residence and (b) right of removal to Federal Court based upon diversity of citizenship.

16.0 COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL AND STATE LAWS

CONTRACTOR further agrees to comply with all federal and state laws, including those identified in Attachment "D" (if applicable).

17.0 CERTIFICATION OF COMPLIANCE WITH LA R.S. 38:2216.1 & 39:1602.2

In accordance with La R.S. 38:2216.1 and 39:1602.2, Contractor agrees that it does not have a practice, policy, guidance, or directive that discriminates against a firearm entity or firearm trade association based solely on the entity's or association's status as a firearm entity or firearm trade association. Further, Contractor agrees that it will not discriminate against a firearm entity or firearm trade association during the term of the contract based solely on the entity's or association's status as a firearm entity or firearm trade association.

18.0 OTHER

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties. There are no understandings, agreements, or representations, oral or written, not specified within this Agreement. This Agreement may not be modified, supplemented or amended in any manner, except by written agreement signed by both parties.

CONTRACT

This agreement entered into this 12th day of August, 2026, by Pintail Contracting Services, LLC hereinafter called the "Contractor", whose business address is 3589 River Road, Luling, LA 70070, and the St. Charles Parish, hereinafter called the "Owner".

Owner and Contractor, in consideration of premises and the mutual covenants; consideration and agreement herein contained, agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1

STATEMENT OF WORK

1.01 Contractor shall furnish all labor and materials and perform the work required to build, construct and complete in a thorough and workmanlike manner in connection with the following:

Project Name: Ama Park Renovations Project Number: RECAPR25

1.02 The abovementioned work shall be completed in strict accordance with Contract Documents prepared by: Quality Engineering and Surveying

1.03 It is recognized by the parties herein that said Contract Documents including by way of example and not of limitation, the Drawings and Specifications dated May 7th 2026, Addenda number(s) 1, the Instruction to Bidders, Supplemental Instructions to Bidders, Louisiana Uniform Public Works Bid Form, General Conditions, Supplementary Conditions (if applicable), any Addenda thereto, impose duties and obligations upon the parties herein, and said parties hereby agree that they shall be bound by said duties and obligations. For these purposes, all of the provisions contained in the aforementioned Contract Documents are incorporated herein by reference with the same force and effect as though said Contract Documents were herein set out in full.

1.04 The Work is generally described as follows: Ama Park Renovations include a New Basketball Court and a shade cover, New Restroom Building, New Parking lot, New Playground, sports field lighting, batting cage and updated existing pavilion.

ARTICLE 2

ENGINEER

2.01 The Project has been designed by Quality Engineering and Survey who is hereinafter called "Engineer" and who will assume all duties and responsibilities and have the rights and authority assigned to Engineer in the Contract Documents in connection with completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

ARTICLE 3

CONTRACT TIME

3.01 The Contractor shall complete the Work under the Contract within 240 calendar days from the date stated in the Notice to Proceed.

ARTICLE 4

LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

4.01 Owner and Contractor recognize that the Owner will suffer direct financial loss if Work is not completed within the Contract Time specified plus any extensions thereof allowed in accordance with these General Conditions of this Contract, and therefore, time is of the essence. They also recognize the delays, expense and difficulties involved in proving in a legal proceeding the actual loss suffered by Owner if the Work is not completed on time. Accordingly, instead of requiring any such proof, Contractor and Surety agree to forfeit and pay Owner Five Hundred dollars \$500 per day as Liquidated Damages for delay (but not as a penalty). Such Liquidated Damages will be assessed for each calendar day that expires after the Contract Time. This amount represents a reasonable estimate of Owner's expenses for extended delays and the costs associated therein. This provision shall be effective between the parties ipso facto and without demand or putting in default, it being specifically agreed that the Contractor by his mere failure to complete the work on or before the date specified shall be deemed in default.

ARTICLE 5

CONTRACT PRICE

5.01 The Owner will pay and the Contractor will accept in full consideration for the performance of the Contract the sum of:

a) (\$1,208,100.00) One Million Two Hundred Eight Thousand One Hundred Dollars based on unit prices specified within this contract document. Contract price is firm and subject only to modification by written Change Order agreed to and signed by both parties and the Engineer and approved by the St. Charles Parish Council.

ARTICLE 6

PAYMENT PROCEDURES

6.01 Contractor shall submit Applications for Payment to the Engineer in accordance with Article 15 of the General Conditions. Applications for Payment will be processed by Engineer as provided in the General Conditions.

6.02 Progress Payments. Progress payments will be based upon estimated quantities of contract unit price items or upon estimated percentages of completion of the schedule of lump sum values of labor and materials incorporated into the Work or suitably stored, on the last day of each month or other mutually agreed regular monthly date ending the progress payment period, less retainage.

6.03 Application for Payment Form. The form of the Application for Payment must be suitable to the Owner. The Owner reserves the right to withhold payment until the form of Application for Payment is deemed acceptable by the Owner.

6.04 Retainage. Per Paragraph 15.01.D retainage shall be withheld and payments will be made by the Owner in the payment amount of:

a) Ninety percent (90%) of the approved payment applications for projects with contract of less than \$500,000.00; or
b) Ninety-five percent (95%) of the approved payment applications for projects with contract prices of \$500,000.01 or greater.

6.05 The normal retainage shall not be due the Contractor until after Substantial Completion and expiration of the forty-five (45) day lien period and submission to the Engineer of a clear lien certificate and invoice for retainage.

6.06 Final Payment. Upon the final completion of all Work, the Contractor may request a final inspection and may make a final Application for Payment as provided by Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions.

6.07 Final Acceptance. When Final Acceptance is granted by the Owner, the Owner shall file the certificate with the Recorder of Mortgages for St. Charles Parish.

6.08 At the expiration of the lien period the Contractor shall obtain a certificate from the Recorder of Mortgages of the Parish of St. Charles that the Contract is clear of any liens or privileges, and said certificate shall be presented to the Owner for final payment and release of retainage, less any such sums as may be lawfully withheld under the Contract.

6.09 Claims. Pursuant to La. R.S. 38:2242, when the Owner receives any claim of nonpayment arising out of the Contract, the Owner shall deduct such claim from the Contract Sum. The Contractor, or any interested party, may deposit security, in accordance with La. R.S. 38:2242.2, guaranteeing payment of the claim with the Recorder of Mortgages for St. Charles Parish. When the Owner receives original proof of such guarantee from the Recorder of Mortgages, the claim deduction will be added back to the Contract Sum.

ARTICLE 7

CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIONS

7.01 In order to induce Owner to enter into this Agreement, Contractor makes the following representations:

7.02 Contractor has familiarized itself with the nature and extent of the Contract Documents, Work, site, locality, and all local conditions and laws and regulations that in any manner may affect cost, progress, performance or finishing of the Work.

7.03 Contractor has studied carefully all reports of explorations and tests of subsurface physical conditions and drawings of physical conditions which are identified in the Information Available To Bidders and as provided in the General Conditions.

7.04 Contractor has obtained and carefully studied (or assumed responsibility for obtaining and carefully studying) all such examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, reports and studies (in addition to or to supplement those referred to in Paragraph 2 above) which pertain to the subsurface or physical conditions at or contiguous to the site or which otherwise may affect the cost, progress, performance or furnishing of the Work as Contractor considers necessary for the performance or furnishing of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Time and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract Documents.
